THIS WEEK

For the second year in a row, the Owls have been crowned American Athletic Conference East Division champs after their 37-10 victory over ECU. Temple (9-3, 7-1) will head to Annapolis to take on Navy (9-2, 7-1) in the American Athletic Conference Championship Game. The matchup is scheduled for Saturday, December 3, at 12:00 p.m. and will air nationally on ABC, as well as 97.5 The Fanatic, Temple football's flagship radio station. Temple is riding a six-game win streak and has beaten its opponents by an average margin of 19.5 points during that streak. QB Phillip Walker continues to lead the team down the stretch of the season. He now has 19 total TDs and 2,700 passing yards which is third all-time among Owl quarterbacks for a single season. The two-headed attack of Temple RBs Jahad Thomas and Ryquell Armstead continues to shine as they now have combined for 31 total touchdowns this season. The defense builds on its stellar play allowing only 273.4 YPG, which is third behind only Alabama and Michigan. Standout performances were turned in by DL Haason Reddick who has 21.5 TFLs this season and DL Praise Martin-Oguke who has had 6.0 sacks in the last six games. The secondary is also allowing just 145.8 passing yards per game which is second in the nation behind only Michigan. The Owls' defense will have its hands full against a Navy offense that averages 342.0 YPG which is second nationally.

LAST WEEK

Temple returned to Lincoln Financial Field for its final regular season matchup, facing off against East Carolina with a trip to the American Athletic Conference title game hanging in the balance. Senior QB Phillip Walker and Co. came through, plundering the Pirates in a 37-10 victory. The four-year starter at quarterback had a strong game, hitting 12-of-20 for 158 yards and breaking the 10,000-yard passing mark, a first for any Temple signal caller. Helping out Walker in the air raid was junior WR Adonis Jennings, who grabbed six receptions for a career-high 100 yards. In another brilliant performance, senior RB Jahad Thomas notched 152 yards on 24 carries for two touchdowns, making it now nine of his 10 games with two endzone appearances. The defense as a whole dominated, as has been the usual lately, holding the powerful ECU air raid to just 225 total yards. Senior DL Praise Martin-Oguke earned the matchup's only turnover, as he forced a fumble during a sack of Pirate QB Gardner Minchew and ended up recovering the ball himself.

LAST TIME

The Owls came up short against the Midshipmen, 31-24, in 2014. Great performances by active players were turned in by QB Phillip Walker who threw for 240 yards and two touchdowns. DL Sharif Finch had four tackles and a fumble recovery for a touchdown to start the game. TE Romond Deloatch also caught the first touchdown of his career and Austin Jones hit a 28-yard field goal.

LAST YEAR'S CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Temple fell short in last year's conference championship game to Houston, 24-13. Active players who had a good game included Phillip Walker who threw for 287 yards and a score. It was a matchup of the conference's top offense (Houston) against the stingiest defense. Houston came away with 339 total yards. Three current players who had 5-or-more tackles included Avery Williams (7), Haason Reddick (5) and Nate L. Smith (5).

UP NEXT

Temple will find out on Sunday (12/4) which bowl they will play in later this month. This will be the first time that Temple will play in bowl games in back-to-back seasons.

TEAM

REIGNING THE EAST

Once again, the Temple Owls are champions of the American Athletic Conference East Division, and will play for the conference championship. This is the first time in program history the Owls have claimed back-to-back regular season conference championship crowns and also the first time Temple will be playing for back-to-back conference crowns. The Owls are 9-3 this year and all of their losses have come to bowl-eligible teams (Army - 6 wins, #7 Penn State - 10 wins, Memphis - 8 wins).

WE'RE STREAKING TO THE SHIP

After starting the season 3-3, Temple is now on a six-game win streak, which is the 10th longest active streak in the nation and the longest active winning streak in the conference. During this win streak, the Owls have been averaging 31.6 points and outscoring their opponents by an average margin of 19.5 points.

AND THAT'S A PERFECT NOVEMBER

With the recent win vs. ECU, the Owls have now managed to finish the month of November with a perfect 3-0 record. That marks the second time in five years the Owls have finished a month with a perfect record. Last September, 2015, the Owls had a perfect month where they started the season with a perfect 3-0 record.

CONFERENCE REIGNING

Since 2014, Matt Rhule has led the Owls to an 18-6 conference record. With a win vs. ECU last Saturday, they are the only team in the conference to have a six-game win streak in each of the last two seasons. The win also gave Temple its second consecutive American Athletic East Crown, making it the only team in the conference to play in the championship game twice.

CRAB CAKES AND OWLS

Seven members of the current Owls' squad are from the state of Maryland, which is the fourth-most populated state that Owl players originate from. Members of the team from Maryland include senior LB Avery Williams, who is currently third on the team in tackles (55) and redshirt senior DB Nate Harriston who has started every game at corner this season. Other Owls from the state of Maryland include redshirt junior OL Cole Boozer, redshirt freshman DL DeAndre Kelly, freshman LB William Kwenkeu, freshman DL Quincy Roche and redshirt freshman WR Cortrelle Simpson.

TIME TO PLAY US IN THE AMERICAN

Overall, Temple's all-time record has not been great against Navy, as the Midshipmen have won six out of the 11 meetings between the two programs. However, this is the first time the two have played as American Athletic Conference foes. Since 2015 when Navy joined the American, the Owls have held a 14-2 conference record, which is tied with Navy for the best regular season conference record during that span. Navy is the only American Conference team Temple has yet to square off against in conference play.

LEAVING HIS MARK

With 27 wins in four seasons as head coach, Matt Rhule has more average wins per season (6.75) than any coach in school history. He tied Al Golden for No. 6 on Temple's all-time wins list and also tied Temple's all-time winningest coach and College Football Hall of Famer Wayne Hardin for most wins through his first four seasons at Temple.

GRADUATES

In a recent poll that surveyed how many graduates each FBS school had on its roster, Temple finished tied for third with five other schools having 11 graduates on the team. The list of graduates include TE Romond Deloatch, DL Avery Ellis, DB Nate Hairston, DB Khiry Lucas, LB Stephaun Marshall, OL Brendan McGowan, DL Praise Martin-Oguie, TE Jake O'Donnell, OL Adrian Sullivan, TE Colin Thompson, and LB Avery Williams. They will be joined by another 15 in December: LB Jarred Alwan, OL Cole Boozer, OL Brian Carter, OL Dion Dawkins, DL Sharif Finch, DB Artrel Foster, WR Keith Kirkwood, DL Haason Reddick, DL Avere Robinson, DB Nate L. Smith, WR Willie Smith, RB Jahad Thomas, QB Phillip Walker, and student coaches Rob Dvoracek, and Damiere Shaw.

CLASS OF 2016

Temple's senior class now has 27 wins in the last 3+ seasons. That ranks sixth all-time in school history over a four-year span. However, with two games remaining, this year's class has a chance to move into third all-time [31 wins (2011), 30 (2012), 28 (1931, 1974, 1975), 27 (1930, 1973, 1976)]. The group reached the six-win plateau and became bowl eligible for the third season in a row (and will play in back-to-back bowl games for the first time in school history). It is just the fifth time that a Temple team has won 6+ games in three consecutive seasons (1927-31, 1934-36, 1973-75, and 2009-2011). In the past two seasons, Temple has won 19 games, marking the best two-year stretch in Temple history.

PLAYING WITH THE LEAD AND NEVER LETTING GO

During its last five games, Temple has outscored its opponents 169-53. During those games the Owls have had the lead for 236:18 minutes, equivalent to 79 percent of the time during those games. The Owls never trailed in three of the games, against Cincinnati, UConn and Tulane, and only fell behind for 10:48 vs South Florida and 2:14 vs ECU.

CALL IT DESTINY

It has been well documented that Temple's senior QB Phillip Walker and RB Jahad Thomas have been teammates from their time together at Elizabeth (N.J.) High School. Their four years at Temple have had a remarkable parallel to their time at Elizabeth.

OWL SCHOLARS

In an effort to recognize the outstanding academic accomplishments of Temple University's student-athletes, Temple Athletics introduced the Owl Scholars Program in the Fall of 2016. Through team apparel, student-athletes on all of Temple's 19 sports regularly have the opportunity to wear items that represent their athletic lives while on campus or in the classroom; the Owl Scholars Program aims to accomplish the reverse - provide an easily identifiable symbol of academic success for student-athletes to wear on their respective field or court of competition.

The Owl Scholars Patch has been designed to pay homage to the rich history of the Temple Owls, while invoking images of the infamous speech of Temple Uni-

versity's founder Russell Conwell, Acres of Diamonds. The three stars above the regal owl symbolize the three different ways a student-athlete can earn the honor of having the patch included on their uniform/game warm-up:

- completion of a Temple University degree prior to the beginning of the start of the season
- earning a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 prior to the beginning of the start of the season
- earning a 3.0 semester grade point average in the previous semester

42 Football players are wearing the patch this season.



OFFENSE

THOMAS REIGNS KING OF FBS

Senior RB Jahad Thomas has had two touchdowns in nine out of his 10 games this season. He is the only player to score two touchdowns in nine games this season. Thomas now ranks tied for 11th in the FBS in total TDs with 18. Only Jeremy McNichols and Dalvin Cook have had more TDs than Thomas since the start of 2015.

WALKING LIKE SUPERMAN

Quarterback Phillip Walker has set the Temple career marks for attempts (1,385), completions (805), touchdowns (71), yards (10,074) and wins by a starting quarterback (27). He is also pushing into the NCAA record books as he now ranks seventh all-time among active NCAA players in total offense (10,901). He continues to make great strides this year and tied the program record by throwing for 445 passing yards in a single game (at Memphis). He also had a game-winning 70-yard drive at UCF, capped off by an 8-yard touchdown pass to Keith Kirkwood with one second remaining. He is Temple's only quarterback to throw for 10,000+ passing yards in his career.

MULTIPLES OF FIVE

Jahad Thomas, who wears jersey #5, has had nine games with multiple touchdowns in 2016. His streak of six straight games with two touchdowns was the longest in the country. Last season, Thomas had seven games with multiple TDs, including a three-TD game vs. UCF. Thomas is the only active player in the AAC with multiple 100-yard rushing (9) and receiving games (2) in his career.

AND THAT'S A FIRST DOWN

For the season, the Owls have converted 257 first downs. Jahad Thomas leads the team in total and rushing first downs with 53 (39 rushing and 14 receiving). Ventell Bryant leads the team lead in receiving first downs with 32.

HISTORY BOOKS

Senior running back Jahad Thomas' stellar play has him rising within Temple's all-time record books. He has set the school record for consecutive games with two or more touchdowns with six. Also, he is third all-time in total touchdowns (38), third in rushing touchdowns (29), and sixth in total rushing yards (2,502). He is also third all-time in all-purpose yards for the Owls with 4,630.

BREAKING OUT THE BIG PLAYS

Through 12 games this season, the Temple offense has been impressively opportunistic, compiling 120 "big" plays from scrimmage (defined as more than 10 yards rushing or 20 yards receiving). Meanwhile, during that same span, the defense has proven its stinginess, giving up just 69 "big" plays. During the Owls' six-game win streak, they have outdone their opponents in "big" plays 74-31, which helped the team outscore their opponents early and often. Senior RB Jahad Thomas leads the team in "big" plays with 31 on the season in just 10 games.

OFFENSIVE LINE UNITY

During the season, four out of the 10 Temple players that have started every game for the Owls have come from the offensive line (Dion Dawkins, Brendan McGowan, Adrian Sullivan and Leon Johnson). In fact, besides the Charlotte game this year, LG Jovahn Fair joined those four in the starting lineup. The cohesion of this group has helped Ryquell Armstead and Jahad Thomas rush for a combined 1,698 and 25 touchdowns on the season, making them the only running back duo to each rush for 800+ yards and 12-or-more TDs.

TOTE THE RYQ

To keep star RB Jahad Thomas fresh this season, head coach Matt Rhule planned a more steady rotation which includes help from RB Ryquell Armstead. During the game vs. USF, Armstead had a career-high 210 rushing yards and two scores. One of those two scores came on a 76-yard run, which was his career-long and the team best this season. Through 12 games this season, Armstead leads the team with 13 rushing touchdowns.

TWO OF A KIND

Temple is one of just four schools to have a pair of teammates, and one of three schools to have a pair of running backs rush for 12+ scores this season (USF's Flowers is a QB).

STAR TRACK FEATURING CAPTAIN KIRK

Through 12 games, however, this year's Owls have been stellar, out-pacing last season's standouts in both total yards and receiving touchdowns. To the credit of QB Phillip Walker, though, the distribution around the receiving corps has remained notably similar.

CHERISHED POSSESSIONS

For the season, senior quarterback Phillip Walker has led the Owls to 66 scores on 143 drives (44.1%) with 48 touchdowns on those possessions (31.6%). Overall, Temple has had 152 possessions with 67 scores including 48 TDs.

YO ADRIAN

When asked for the biggest surprise this season, both head coach Matt Rhule and offensive coordinator Glenn Thomas have repeatedly responded with OL Adrian Sullivan. The redshirt junior, who entered camp in August working with the third unit, has worked his way into the starting lineup and has been solid at right guard.

BIG MAC

Anyone who has followed Temple football for the past few seasons knows that replacing Kyle Friend was going to be a difficult task. Redshirt senior Brendan McGowan, who filled in for Friend while he missed four games due to injury a year ago, has been an anchor in the middle of an improving O-line. A heady veteran who already holds a finance degree, McGowan is a trusted voice making the line calls while the guard spots have been breaking in youthful talent.

DOUBLE D

Dion Dawkins has been protecting QB Phillip Walker's blindside from the left tackle spot for four seasons. The senior has had eye-popping performances this season, helping in the pass game and opening huge holes with pancake blocks to open up running lanes for RBs Jahad Thomas and Ryquell Armstead.

COMING OUT OF THE WOODWORK

The second half of the season, sophomore WR Ventell Bryant has really stepped up and become the top receiver for QB Phillip Walker. In just seven games this season, Bryant has caught 38 passes for 697 yards (leads the team) and three scores. He also has 32 receiving first downs, which is a team best. The Florida native was second on the team in receptions (39) and yards (579) last season.

DEFENSE

ABOVE AND BEYOND

After finishing first in nearly every major defensive category for the conference a year ago, Temple statistically has excelled beyond last season's unit despite the loss of the 2015 Bednarik and Nagurski Award winner Tyler Matakevich. Major defensive categories that this year's squad leads over last season's include total defense (273.4 to 337.0 yards allowed per game), and passing yards allowed (145.8 to 209.1). They also have a lead in scoring defense, as this year's team currently surrenders just 17.8 points per game, compared to last year's team that gave up an impressive 20.1 points per game.

SNOW PATROL

Phil Snow has proven he is one of the most formidable defensive coordinators in the country and a candidate for the Broyles Award. Now in his fourth season with the Owls, the team has steadily improved its defense each year under Snow's guidance, especially last season. In 2015, he led the Owls to a #1 rank in almost every single defensive category in the AAC, fourth nationally in scoring defense, and tied for first nationally in fumble recoveries (19). Snow has his defense only allowing an average 273.4 yards per game which is first in the conference and third in the nation only behind Alabama and Michigan. Temple's defense leads the conference in scoring defense (17.8/PPG), total yards (273.4/YPG), passing yards (145.8/YPG) and ranks third in sacks (34) and second in third down conversions (33.3), and second in rushing yards (127.7/YPG).

THE THREE AMIGOS

With the return of Jarred Alwan to the starting lineup during the past four games, the defensive front seven now features a trio of seniors within the linebacker corps. Over the course of the past six victories, the three have combined for 71 total tackles, with Stephoun Marshall leading the defense against USF and UConn while Avery Williams took over against Cincinnati and ECU. For the year, Marshall has been especially impressive, generating 53 total tackles which is second on the team despite only playing 11 of the 12 matchups thus far. As a group, the trio have commanded serious respect both on and off the field, serving as captains during multiple games this season.

AIN'T NOTHING

This year, the Owls have three shutouts, which is the most for the program since 1945. Before this year, the Owls have only had three total shutouts in the last five seasons. Two of those shutouts came in back-to-back games on the road, which Temple has not done since 1937. It has helped the defense rank third in the country, giving up 273.4 yards per game only behind Alabama and Michigan.

3-AND-OUT

Temple's defense is among the best at getting opponents off the field. In 136 drives, the defense has forced the offense back to the sidelines without a first down on 59 of those possessions (42.9%). Only Alabama (74) Clemson (68), Michigan (66), Houston (65), Boston College (63), UCF (63), Ohio State (61) and Tulsa (60) have had more 3-and-outs.

Haason Reddick has been a terror to opposing offenses. The redshirt senior had 5.0 TFLs at Memphis tying the conference mark for a single game. This season he has an NCAA-best 21.5 tackles for loss and 45.0 for his career, which is second all-time among Temple players. He has the third-most ever by a player in the American Athletic Conference. ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE

Senior RB Jahad Thomas has now scored a pair of TDs in 9 of 10 games played this season.

Ryquell Armstead (23-842-13TDs) and Jahad Thomas (181-856-12TDs) power the Owls' running game, boasts one of three running back duos in FBS to rush for 12-or-more TDs each. Temple has one of five sets of teammates in FBS to rush for 800-or-more yards each.

Thomas is also among the Owls' top receivers with 20 catches for 402 yards and a team-high five TDs. Thomas adds 14.4-yards per punt return making the Owls one of the best unit's in the country. His 141.3 all-purpose yards per game are among the best in the FBS (18th).

NO FLY ZONE

This year, the Owls' pass defense is giving up just 145.8 yards per game which currently ranks second in the nation only to Michigan. A big part of that has to do with the spectacular play of the secondary, which now has a total of seven interceptions in 12 games. Opposing quarterbacks struggle finding the open receiver, as they average a 109.08 passing efficiency rating, which is 13th in the nation and second in the conference.

UNDISPUTED CHAMP

The nickname "Champ" belongs to all-conference safety Sean Chandler. One of three Owls to start in every game last year, he has quickly become one of the most important players on Temple's roster. In fact, he was moved from corner to safety this off-season to take advantage of his play-making skills. He's also earned the respect of his teammates as being the first freshman ever to be given one of the prestigious single digit numbers, awarded to Temple's nine toughest players each season. This season Chandler has 36 tackles in just eight games which is 6th on the team, and recorded a fumble recovery at Tulane.

THE SIZE OF THE FIGHT IN THE DOG

DL Michael Dogbe has been one of the most pleasant surprises for the Owls this season. The redshirt sophomore had a streak of starting seven games at DT, and has provided much needed production for a DL unit that has lost senior Sharif Finch and sophomore Julian Taylor to season ending injuries. This season, Dogbe recorded his first sack vs. SMU and a career-high in tackles (7) and TFLs (3.0) at Memphis. Dogbe is currently tied for fifth on the team in TFLs (5.0).

SAFETY FIRST

One of the key factors on the Owls' defense this year has been the play of sophomore DB Delvon Randall. Stepping up for the injured junior Sean Chandler, who was out for four games this year, Randall now ranks fourth on the team in tackles (53) and leads the team in interceptions with three. He leads the Owls with five takeaways, each leading to a Temple score (4 TDs, 1 FG). With five takeaways (3 INTs and 2 FRs), Randall ranks second in the AAC behind only SMU's Horace Richardson.

SPECIAL TEAMS

BLOCK PARTY

On the strength of an FBS high five blocked punts in 2015, Temple has been among the best in blocking kicks during the Matt Rhule era. Thanks to Praise Martin Oguike's NCAA-best five blocked FG/PAT, Avery Ellis' two blocked punts this season, and Sharif Finch's five blocked punts, Temple is tied for the most blocked kicks since 2013.

BOOM SHAKA-LAKA

Freshman kicker Aaron Boumerhi is 9-for-10 on field goals to start his career. In the game vs. USF he had 14 points, which is a season-best for any Owl this year. The freshman is filling in for junior Austin Jones, who was sidelined for the year with an ACL injury. Boumerhi connected on 32- and 47-yard attempts in the third quarter in the game at UCF, to help the Owls cut the lead to 25-20. Boumerhi's field goal of 47 yards is the season-long for the Owls.

BIG FOOT

This season, Austin Jones is 10-of-12 for field goals while Aaron Boumerhi is 9-of-10. With a combined 19-of-22, Temple's kickers would rank at the top of the conference in FG percentage. However, neither Jones nor Boumerhi have played in enough games to be ranked. Their 103 combined points would rank third in the conference.

GENERAL

SUPER BOWL CHAMPIONS

Super Bowl 50 saw the Denver Broncos defeat the Carolina Panthers 24-10 in a low scoring battle. A huge key to the success of the Broncos that day was the kicking of Brandon McManus, who went 3/3 on field goals and tacked on one extra point. He also happens to be a proud Temple grad. Like McManus, Temple has a number of alumni who have experienced success on the NFL's biggest stage. Out of the 21 times that an alum from Temple has played in the Super Bowl, 16 of them happen to be on the winning team. Notable names include former Ravens' RB Bernard Pierce (2012), former Patriots/Colts DL Dan Klecko (2003-04,2006) and former Redskins' DB Todd Bowles (1987), who is now a head coach for the New York Jets. Former Owls head coach Bruce Arians was also an offensive coordinator for the Steelers in 2009, helping head coach Mike Tomlin win his first Super Bowl that year.

NFL IRONMAN

A recent survey was taken among all of the FBS College Football SIDs, about current employees in FBS college football right now with 20+ years of NFL non-playing experience. Tied for first with UCLA head coach Jim Mora was Temple's head athletic trainer Al Bellamy, with 25 years of NFL experience. Bellamy, who is going into his fourth season here at Temple, started off in 1988 as an athletic training assistant with the Washington Redskins and was part of the staff that won Super Bowl XXVI. After his time in Washington, he moved to get a head athletic training position with the Detroit Lions, where he stayed with the team for 12 years.

WE'RE MOVIN' ON UP

The Owls saw seven players go to the pros after a very successful 2015 season. Three of those players (CB Tavon Young, DL Matt Ioannidis, and LB Tyler Matakevich) were drafted in rounds 4-7 and are on the active roster for their respective teams. Other free agent pickups in the NFL from the 2015 squad include OLs Kyle Friend and Shahbaz Ahmed, and WRs Robby Anderson and Brandon Shippen. Anderson made the Jets opening day roster.

TEMPLE AT A GLANCE...

Temple is in the 4th largest media market in the country, with over 2.9 million TV homes according to Nielsen ratings. The designated market area (DMA) is 7.6 million.

Temple is located in a region of 6.53 million people, and is only 95 miles from NYC and 120 miles from Washington DC. In fact, more than 40% of the US population is within a days drive from Philadelphia.

Temple is the 26th largest public University in the country with over 38,000 students founded in 1884 and has 404 academic programs including 5 professional schools of law, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy and podiatry.

Temple is a Research I institution, a Carnegie Classification in 2015 as the highest level and ranked by US News and World Report at 115 (6th) with an overall graduation rate of 70%, and has a full time retention rate for undergraduate students at 89%.

Temple is one of 11 institutions in the country with multi-year APR scores of 970 or greater for all teams including a 2015 multi-years APR score of 971.

Temple has over 300,000 alumni around the world including over 170,000 alumni that live in the Philadelphia DMA.

Temple's athletic department has 19 sports and 500 student athletes.

Temple has been bowl eligible 5 out of the last 7 years and finished 10-4 last year, winning the AAC East Division and being ranked in the Top 25 for several weeks.

Temple posted the largest attendance gain during the 2015 season, playing in front of an average home crowd of 44,159, an increase of 20,789 per game. This excitement led ESPN to bring their popular pregame show, College Game Day, to Philadelphia.

The Temple game played against Notre Dame had a 3.9 national rating and an 18.1 local rating. It was ABC's highest ranking game ever in the Philadelphia area which is impactful given Philadelphia is the 4th largest media market in the country.

Out of the 10 football games televised on ABC/ESPN locally, Temple had over 14.8 million viewers in the Philadelphia market. (There is not data available for the remaining two games televised on CBSN).

Temple's athletic facilities are among the finest in the country. The football team plays its games in the NFL stadium operated by the Philadelphia Eagles and there are ongoing discussions to build an on campus football stadium as well. The basketball area is a state-of-the-art facility with a capacity crowd of 10,000. Over the last four years Temple has spent over \$50 million for athletics multi-purpose facilities with all the athletic facilities being state-of-the-art.

The University itself has over \$400 million planned for capital projects over the next five years including a \$170 million state-of-the-art library.

The men's basketball team is led by the AAC Coach of the Year, Fran Dunphy, and is the reigning AAC regular season basketball champions. The basketball program is the 5th winningest program in the history of college basketball.

QUARTERBACKS

The unit is headed once again by Glenn Thomas, who came to the Owls after a successful seven-year run with the Atlanta Falcons. This season, he adds the responsibility of offensive coordinator after the departure of Marcus Satterfield to become head coach at Tennessee Tech.

Thomas is credited with the continued development of senior QB **Phillip Walker**. The unquestioned team leader burst on the scene with 20 touchdowns and over 2,000 passing yards in just seven starts as a true freshman in 2013 before leveling off in 2014. Under Thomas' guidance, he continued to mature into a certified field general. This season, he has 18 passing touchdowns and 2,700 yards and has led the Owls to a 9-3 record on the year. He has already set the Temple career marks for attempts (1,385), completions (785), touchdowns (71), yards (10,074) and wins by a starting quarterback (26). He also became the first Temple QB to throw for 2,000+ yards in four seasons and to reach 10,000 in his career.

Logan Marchi spent his freshman year redshirting and is now is the backup quarterback on the Owls roster. Last season's #2 quarterback was redshirt-sophomore **Frank Nutile**. He is the third string quarterback this year.

The 2016 recruiting class sees the addition of **Anthony Russo** (Philadelphia/Archbishop Wood).

RUNNING BACKS

Leading the running backs this season is Chris Wiesehan, who coached Temple's offensive line for the previous two seasons.

Jahad Thomas, a first-team all-conference player a year ago, returns for his senior season and in the last two seasons has scored 37 touchdowns. This year he has scored a pair of TDs in the first six games he played in and has done this in nine out of his ten games. His streak set the school record for consecutive games with two or more touchdowns. Also, he is third all-time in total touchdowns (38), third in rushing touchdowns (29), and sixth in total rushing yards (2,502). He is also third all-time in all-purpose yards for the Owls with 4,630.

Last season, two true freshmen had limited opportunities to run the ball but showed they had what it takes to succeed. **Ryquell Armstead** emerged from the start of camp to earn a role spotting Thomas. This season he has 842 yards and leads the team in rushing scores with 13. During the game vs. USF, Armstead had a career-high 210 rushing yard and two scores. One of those two scores came on a 76-yard run, which was his career-long and the team-best this season.

Isaiah Wright, seen action at WR, RB, punt returner, and also at QB in Wildcat formations. He is the team's third leading rusher with 235 yards on 41 carries and scored the first touchdown of his career at Tulane.

Jager Gardner has shined when given the chance for the Owls this season and has two rushing TDs.

David Hood became a trusted part of the offense this year before being sidelined by injury. He has seen action in nine games this season and 16 carries for 87 yards on the year.

The 2016 recruiting class sees the addition of **Tyliek Raynor** (Philadelphia, Pa. / Imhotep). **Jonny Forrest** (New Rochelle (N.Y.) High) has been added as a walk-on.

The fullback position is manned by two converted linebackers who each walked on to the squad in 2014. Redshirt junior **Nick Sharga** has seen action at fullback in 2016. He earned the respect of his peers, being given a single-digit jersey (#4) for his toughness. Redshirt freshman **Rob Ritrovato** was converted to fullback after contributing on special teams as a true freshman in 2014.

WIDE RECEIVERS

Frisman Jackson coaches the wide receivers for the second straight year. He is the first to hold that position for two consecutive seasons since 2007-09 (Kevin Gilbride Jr.).

Gone from a year ago are three of the top four receivers: Robby Anderson (70-939-7TDs), John Christopher

(20-208), and Brandon Shippen (20-288-1). All three were seniors.

Redshirt sophomore **Ventell Bryant** an emerging star, returns. This season, he has 38 receptions in just nine games which leads the team. He also leads the team in receiving first downs with 32, and in receiving yards with 697.

Two receivers who redshirted last season are making big contributions in 2016. Redshirt junior **Keith Kirkwood**, who transferred from Hawaii in 2014, has shown flashes of brilliance and is becoming more consistent and is second the team this season in reception (31) and in yards (469). Redshirt sophomore **Brodrick Yancy** is proving to be a tough slot receiver and has 24 receptions on the year.

Redshirt sophomore **Adonis Jennings** transferred to Temple in 2015 after his freshman campaign at Pitt. The Sicklerville, N.J., native and Timber Creek product enjoyed his return home and so far this season has contributed with 19 receptions on 316 yards and two touchdowns.

Marshall Ellick continues to improve. He played in five games a year ago, posting 12 receptions on the year for 141 yards.

Redshirt sophomores **Willie Smith** and **John Ruza**, along with redshirt freshman **Travon Williams** and **Correlle Simpson** add depth.

The 2016 recruiting class sees the additions of **Fredie Johnson** [North Fort Myers (Fla.) High], **Randle Jones** [North Miami Beach (Fla.) High], **Branden Mack** (Wyncote, Pa. / Cheltenham), and (West Hartford, Conn. / Kingswood-Oxford). **Justin Bishop** (Somers Point, NJ / Mainland) was added as a walk-on.

OFFENSIVE LINE

The offensive line is under new leadership both on and off the field. George DeLeone, a 46-year coaching veteran, returns for his second tour of duty coaching Temple's offensive line. He was the teams' offensive coordinator in 2006-07 and tutored the offensive line in 2007. On the field, the unit is without the leadership of center Kyle Friend, who graduated. Friend, a three-time captain, was the cornerstone of the offensive line for the previous three seasons.



Inheriting the baton is senior left tackle **Dion Dawkins**. Dawkins had started 38 games in his four-year career and earned fourth team All-America honors from Phil Steele following the 2015 campaign.

Temple has three other linemen with starting experience from a year ago. Redshirt senior **Brendan McGowan** has started 29 games over the past four seasons. This season he has started in all 12 games for the Owls. The big surprise has been the development of RG **Adrian Sullivan**. Sullivan began the summer with the third unit but emerged as the starting right guard and has started all 12 games this season. Redshirt junior **Leon Johnson** has started all 12 games this season. At right tackle, **Jovahn Fair** has started in 11 out of the 12 games for the Owls this year and has seen action in every game.

Brian Carter has seen action in every game this season and adds much needed depth to a Owls team. Freshman **Matt Hennessy** has made a contribution to the unit and made his first start vs. Charlotte.

In the past few seasons under head coach Matt Rhule, Temple has looked to develop offensive linemen in one of two ways – convert from defense to offense or recruit-redshirt-develop. Redshirt-junior **Cole Boozer** has made the transition from tight end to defensive line to offensive line. Redshirt junior **Semaj Reed** and redshirt sophomores **James McHale**, **Jaelin Robinson** and **Aaron Ruff**, and redshirt freshmen **Benson Israel** have all been recruited to play offensive line for Temple. With the graduation of Friend, Shahbaz Ahmed and Eric Lofton,

Two walk-ons continue to develop. **Nick Apostolu** and **Gordon Thomas** were added in 2014 Thomas saw action in three games last season.

The 2016 recruiting class sees the additions of **Darrian Bryant** (Philadelphia, Pa. / Chestnut Hill Academy), **Dan Drewes** [Dunmore (Pa.) High], **Brendan Clark** (Father Judge / Philadelphia, Pa.), and **Vincent Picozzi** (Collegeville, Pa. / Lansdale Catholic) have been added as a walk-ons.

TIGHT ENDS & FULLBACKS

Ed Foley begins his fourth season as Temple's tight ends coach and his second as the special teams coordinator.

Redshirt senior **Colin Thompson** is finally fully recovered from foot injuries that hampered him at Florida and brought the Doylestown, Pa., native back home. Entering his third and final season for Temple, Thompson has been a major force in the improved run game and has made contributions in the passing attack and scored his first career touchdown vs. Cincinnati.

Redshirt senior **Romond Deloatch** continues to improve as a receiver, evident by his performance this year, as he had 17 receptions for 238 yards and scored his first touchdown of the season at UConn. He has also seen some action the defensive line and is third on the team in sacks with (4.0).

Chris Myarick is a redshirt sophomore and former walk-on. He has seen action in every game this season a recorded his first career reception at Penn State.

Like Thompson, **Jake O'Donnell** is a graduate student from Doylestown who has transferred from a Florida school. O'Donnell has spent the past four years at Miami and joined the Owls in 2016 for his final year of eligibility.

The 2015 recruiting class brought in **Patrick Anderson** and **Jake Robinson** who spent the season redshirting. Joining the squad as walk-ons last year was **Domenic Nigrelli**.

The 2016 recruiting class sees the additions of **Steve Petrick** (North Huntingdon, Pa. / Norwin), **Taiyir Wilson** (Schwenksville, Pa. / Perkiomen Valley / Fork Union), and **Kenny Yeboah** (Allentown, Pa. / Parkland Senior).

DEFENSIVE LINE

Once again, **Elijah Robinson** leads the "Wild Boyz," the nickname for Temple's defensive line. Despite the losses of Matt Ioannidis, Hershey Walton and Nate D. Smith, the defensive line remains deep and talented.

The end position has three players who each spent at least one season as a starter.

Redshirt senior **Haason Reddick** started opposite Smith last season and was the unit's most productive player. This season, he has (21.5) TFLs which leads the nation and 9.5

sacks which is second in the conference. He is currently leads the team with 57 total tackles. **Praise Martin-Oguike**, also a redshirt senior, emerged as a play-maker in 2014. He has a NCAA leading 5 blocked kicks throughout his four-year career. His 11 forced fumbles he has had throughout the course of his career is tied for the second most among active NCAA players. He has also had 6.0 sacks in his last six games. Senior **Sharif Finch** has been hampered by knee injuries, but has played through them to contribute 78 tackles, 4.5 TFLs, 5.0 sacks, and 2 interceptions over the past three seasons. After four games in 2016, Finch was forced to shut it down due to his knees

Joining them on the outside are redshirt senior **Avery Ellis** and junior **Jacob Martin**. Both have played in over 35 games over the past four seasons and have provided quality snaps on defense while being core special teams players. **Romond Deloatch** has also contributed with 4.0 sacks this season.

The anchor on the inside is senior **Averee Robinson**. Robinson is one of ten current Owls to start every game this season.

Redshirt sophomores **Freddie Booth-Lloyd** and **Michael Dogbe** provide some experience. Booth-Lloyd combines size and quickness making him difficult to block. This season, Dogbe recorded his first sack vs. SMU and a career-high in tackles (7), and TFL (3.0) at Memphis. Dogbe is currently tied for fifth on the team in TFLs (5.0).

The Owls redshirted three defensive linemen last season. Two recruits - **DeAndre Kelly**, and **Dana Levine** - and walk-on **Jeromy Reichner**. All spent the year getting bigger and stronger under the eye of the strength and conditioning coaches.

Added to the mix is redshirt sophomore transfer **Hez Trahan**. A Philadelphia native, Trahan redshirted at Pitt in 2014 after a stellar career at Roman Catholic. He sat out in 2015 before enrolling at Temple.

The 2016 recruiting class sees the additions of **Dan Archibong** (Springfield (Pa.) High], **Karamo Dioubate** (Philadelphia / Prep Charter), **Quincy Roche** (Randallstown, Md. / New Town), **Chris Tucker** (Jackson, Tenn. / Trinity Christian Academy), and **Greg Webb** [Sicklerville, N.J. / Timber Creek / Hutchinson (Kan.) CC].

LINEBACKERS

At the linebacker position, Mike Siravo will be responsible for finding a replacement for Temple's all-time leading tackler Tyler Matakovich. The starters all have experience, but the depth is still unproven.

Redshirt seniors **Stephaun Marshall** (11 starts) this season is tied for second on the team in tackles with **Avery Williams**, who has started in all 12 games this season. Marshall is coming off a career-high in tackles, interceptions and forced fumbles in 2015. Williams had his best season as a tackler and added his first career interception in 2015.

Jared Folks has started five games at MLB for the Owls. So far this season, Folks has had 31 tackles and an interception. Also seeing time at middle linebacker is senior **Jarred Alwan**. He adds much needed experience to the unit providing seven starts and 31 tackles this season.

The linebacking unit has been injected with added speed from a few young play-makers. Redshirt freshman **Chapelle Russell** and true freshmen **Shaun Bradley** and **William Kwenkeu** have been seeing increased plays on defense and have become the core members of the special teams.

Over the past two seasons, the Owls have recruited a few players who have redshirted while learning their craft and building their strength. **Jeremiah Atoki** and **Daishaun Grimes** (2015 class) are primed to make significant contributions in 2016.

Todd Jones and **Chris Smith** are talented walk-ons who have earned playing time on special teams. **Zach Mesday** walked on in 2014 and has spent the better part of the past two seasons rehabbing an injury. **Kevin DeCaesar** and **Mike DiFrancesco** joined the team as walk-ons in 2015 and continue to develop.

Besides Bradley and Kwenkeu, the 2016 recruiting class sees the addition of **Isaiah Graham-Mobley** (King of Prussia, Pa. / Upper Merion), **Julian Mahan** (Sicklerville, N.J. / Timber Creek) was added as a walk-on.

CORNERBACKS

Fran Brown once again tutors the defensive backs. Like the other levels of the defense, Brown is tasked with replacing a player (Tavon Young) now in the NFL. He is also without all-conference talent Sean Chandler who moved to safety. Redshirt senior **Nate Hairston** and redshirt junior **Artrel Foster** gave the Owls valuable snaps in the secondary last season, whether

spotting Young (who nursed an injury) or adding nickel coverage. Hairston was in just his first full season on defense after being converted from wide receiver. Harriston has started in every game for the Owls so far this season while Atrell has started in 10 games and seen playing time in every single game.

Redshirt sophomore **Derrek Thomas** is making the conversion from wide receiver, and has seen a lot of playing time this year. He leads all cornerbacks in tackles with 27.

The Owls were expecting big things from **Kareem Ali**. A four-star recruit, Ali redshirted in 2015 and suffered a arm injury in game 2.

Junior **Cequan Jefferson** is a talented athlete who has contributed on special teams while improving in the secondary.

The 2016 recruiting class sees the additions of **Kimere Brown** (Penns Grove (N.J.) High), **Linwood Crump** (South Amboy, N.J. / Piscataway / Sayerville), and **Kareem Gauden** (Jersey City, N.J. / Lincoln).

SAFETIES

Leading the safeties is defensive coordinator Phil Snow, a 40-year coaching veteran. The position group lost three players to graduation - Alex Wells, Will Hayes and Boye Aromire.

Junior **Sean Chandler** made the switch from cornerback to safety in the off-season. Last season, he led all Owl defensive backs with 65 tackles, 5.5 TFLs, 1.0 sacks, a team-high four interceptions and 10 pass break ups. Chandler finished the year as a second team All-American Athletic Conference choice. His play-making ability has spurred the switch from corner to safety this season. An injury vs. Charlotte forced him out of the lineup for four game. He reentered the starting lineup in game 9 vs. Cincinnati and had a fumble recovery at Tulane.

Delvon Randall has started every game for the Owls this season at strong safety and is fourth on the team in tackles (53). He leads all Owls with five takeaways this season which each resulted in scores (4 TDs, 1 FG). One returner with starting experience is redshirt senior **Nate L. Smith**. Smith has seen a lot of action throughout the season so far and started three of the games for injured safety Sean Chandler. So far this season, Smith has 34 tackles and a interception returned for 27 yards.

Redshirt sophomore **Jyquis Thomas** was among the Owls top special teams players last season and will be given an opportunity to play in the secondary in 2016.

Redshirt senior **Khiry Lucas** was hurt during the 2014 season and spent 2015 rehabilitating. He earned his degree but has a year of eligibility remaining.

The 2016 recruiting class sees the additions of **Keyvone Bruton** (Norfolk, Va. / Lake Taylor), **Sam Franklin** (Crystal River, Fla. / Citrus / East Coast Prep), **Amir Tyler** (Lakewood (N.J.) High), and **Benny Walls** (Cinnaminson, N.J. / St. Joe's Prep).

SPECIAL TEAMS

Junior **Austin Jones** set the school record last season in field goals made (23) and points by a kicker (113). In fact, he had the same number of field goals and FG percentage as Memphis' Jake Elliott, who was the unanimous all-conference selection. He set the school mark with 19 consecutive FG's made before missing on a 43 yard attempt at Memphis. Later that game he suffered an ACL injury that will sideline him for the remainder of the year.

True freshman walk on **Aaron Bomerhi** (Philipsburg, Pa. / Philipsburg-Osceola) was pressed into action and is 9-for-10 on field goals this year.

A third specialist who earned a spot as a walk-on in 2014 is punter **Alex Starzyk**. The strong-legged junior improved his punting average by four yards from 2014 with a 42.4-yard average in 2015. This season, he has had 44 punts for a average of 39.5 yards, and has put 17 punts inside the 20. His longest punt of the season is 55 yards which he has done twice, and he has not had one of his punts blocked yet.

Redshirt junior LS **Josh Lang** and a few new walk-ons continue to push the incumbents. **Dan McDonald** (Warrington, Pa. / Archbishop Wood) were added as walk-ons this spring.

The kicking game benefits from a steady combination of long snapper **Corey Lerch** and holder **Tom Bradway**. Lerch has held down that spot since joining the team as a walk-on in 2014. Bradway has been holding in every game during the 2016 season.

They did just that, allowing only points in all of 2014. That adjustment, overall improved play of the defense, helped the Owls to a 6-6 record.

On June 25, 2015, Rhule was rewarded with a four-year contract extension that will keep him on the Temple sidelines through the 2021 season. Temple's Director of Athletics Dr. Patrick Kraft announced, "Matt Rhule is one of the best young coaches in college football and we are excited that he will be at the helm of Temple Football through at least 2021. Matt has the program heading in the right direction, especially as we enter a very promising season on the gridiron, and we are confident that he is the right person to take the program to even greater heights."

And take the program to greater heights he did. In 2015, Rhule has led his team to a 10-win regular season and an American Athletic Conference East division trophy. For the first time in 73 years, the Owls beat Penn State, started the season a program-best 7-0, and were ranked in the Top 25 for the first time in 36 seasons. Ten of his players earned all-conference honors and senior linebacker Tyler Matakevich won the Bednarik and Nagurski Awards while also being named a finalist for the Lott IMPACT and Senior CLASS Awards.

That success prompted another commitment from Temple University following the season. Said then-University President Dr. Neil Theobald, "Matt's commitment to our student-athletes on and off the field, as well as the program's substantial improvement each season, has more than justified my confidence in him. He works tirelessly for the betterment of our players, our football program, and our university."

Added Kraft, "Matt is one of the top coaches in college football and has been responsible for making Temple a national program. He is an even better person off the field; a true leader who instills character and values in the men under his charge."

The State College, PA, native and a former player at Penn State has 18 years of collegiate coaching experience, including nine seasons at Temple, and seven bowl game appearances -- three with the Owls -- on his resume.

Rhule joined the Giants in the spring of 2012. He worked closely with Pat Flaherty, who has been the offensive line coach since 2004. They finished the 2012 campaign at 9-7, second in the NFC East, and averaged 355 yards of offense per game. Four New York players, including guard Chris Snee, were selected to the Pro Bowl.

During his previous tenure at Temple, Rhule's role changed several times. In spring 2012, he was promoted to co-offensive coordinator after serving as the assistant offensive coordinator and tight ends coach as well as the recruiting coordinator under Steve Addazio in 2011. Temple's 2012 recruiting class was ranked #1 in the Mid-American Conference and helped lay the foundation for the program's transition to the Big East Conference.

Under Al Golden, Rhule was promoted to offensive coordinator in the spring of 2008. He also coached the TU quarterbacks. He coached the defensive line in 2006 and served as the quarterbacks coach and recruiting coordinator during the 2006 and 2007 seasons. For three consecutive years, Temple's recruiting class was ranked #1 in the MAC [2006, 2007, 2008].

In 2011, the Owls went 9-4 and played in the fourth bowl game in school history, the

On December 17, 2012, Matt Rhule (pronounced RULE) returned to North Broad Street to take the helm as head coach of the Temple Owls. Following six seasons as one of Al Golden's top assistants, he joined the New York Giants as the assistant offensive line coach in 2012. He is now in his fourth year as the 26th Owls head coach and 10th on the Temple campus.

Prior to the start of his first season in charge, he offered that his squad would produce an exciting brand of football and they would improve as the season progressed. Rhule delivered on those promises as the 2013 Owls produced nearly 400 yards per game of offense (the second best total in an 0-6 start to the season, the troops team never trailed at the start of the of the season. Gildan New Mexico Bowl, where they crushed Wyoming, 37-15 -- Temple's first postseason victory since the 1979 Garden State Bowl. Rhule mentored two-time first-team All-MAC selection TE Evan Rodriguez. For the second time in Rhule's tenure, the Owls set the Temple single-season rushing yardage record and rushing touchdowns records behind the explosive efforts of All-MAC junior running backs Bernard Pierce and Matt Brown.

In 2010, Rhule helped guide the team to an 8-4 regular-season record, and the Owls recorded back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1978-79, including their first win over a BCS team. The Owls recorded the largest margin of victory (42 points against Buffalo) in a MAC game. A school record six offensive players earned All-MAC honors, including repeat first-team honorees OL Colin Madison, OL Darius Morris, and RB Bernard Pierce as well as first-time honoree TE Evan Rodriguez.

In 2009, Rhule's offense helped TU win a single-season record nine consecutive games en route to a 9-4 overall record and first-place tie in the MAC East. Under Rhule's guidance, the Owls set the Temple single-season rushing yardage record. A school record five offensive players were named All-MAC, including three on the team. All-American Bernard Pierce rushed his way into the

Temple record book, re-writing all records for a rookie en route to 2009 MAC Freshman of the Year honors.

In 2008, Rhule took the reins as offensive coordinator, helping the Owls to their most wins in nearly two decades. The Owls outscored their opponents for the season for the first time since 1990. Rhule coached All-MAC honorees C Alex Derenthal and school record holder WR Bruce Francis, while QB Adam DiMichele set the school record for passing touchdowns with six in the 55-52 win over Eastern Michigan. Francis set the school records for career receiving touchdowns (23) and consecutive games with a reception (38).

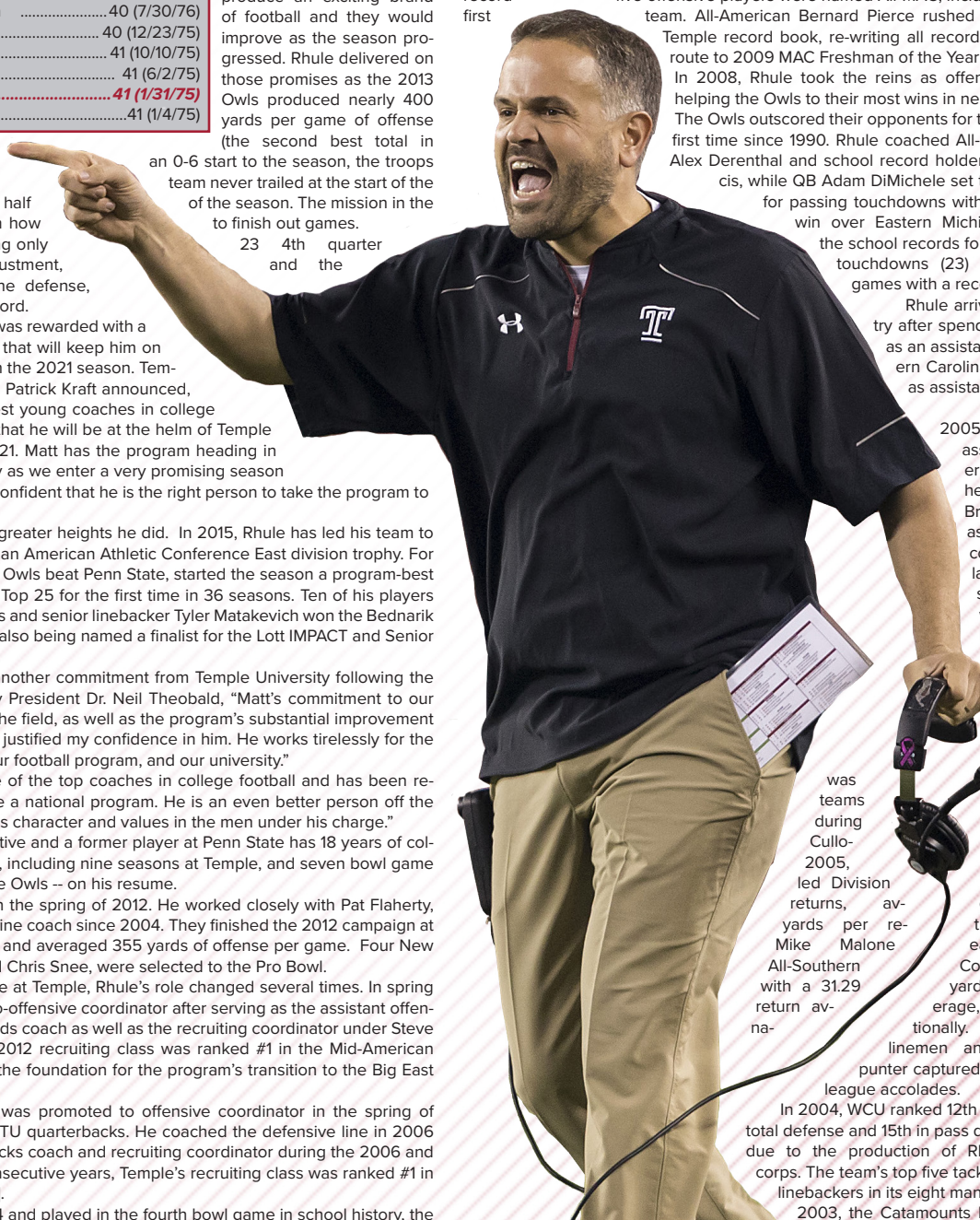
Rhule arrived in Owl Country after spending four seasons as an assistant coach at Western Carolina, including three as assistant head coach.

From 2002 to 2005, Rhule was an assistant at Western Carolina under head coach Kent Briggs, serving as assistant head coach during his last three seasons. In 2005, he was offensive line coach and run game coordinator after directing the linebackers his first three years, Rhule special coordinator his tenure in whee (NC). In the Catamounts I-AA in kickoff erage 27.44 turn. Sophomore earned first team Conference honors yards per kickoff erage, ranking second tionally. Two offensive linemen and the team's punter captured second team all-league accolades.

In 2004, WCU ranked 12th nationally in total defense and 15th in pass defense, largely due to the production of Rhule's linebacker corps. The team's top five tacklers were linebackers in its eight man front scheme. In 2003, the Catamounts led the SoCon in

rush defense for the first time in school history.

Rhule arrived at Western Carolina after serving as assistant defensive line coach at UCLA in 2001. He assisted in coaching five Bruins that earned All PAC-10 honors as the team posted a 7-4 record under head coach Bob Toledo.

From 1999 to 2000, Rhule served as an assistant coach at Mid-American Conference member Buffalo, directing the Bulls defensive line in 2000 and working as assistant defensive line coach in 1999. In 2000, the team's sack total increased from 12 to 27 utilizing a 3-4 alignment. Buffalo also earned its first two Division I-A victories that season.

Rhule began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Penn State in the spring of 1998 before working at Albright College in Reading, Pa., for the 1998 season. At Albright, he coached the linebackers in a 4-3 scheme and

recruited western and central Pennsylvania.

Rhule played four seasons at linebacker with the Nittany Lions under Joe Paterno. A three-time Penn State Scholar-Athlete, he earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in 1997. He received his undergraduate degree in political science before earning his master's degree in educational psychology from Buffalo in 2003.

Born January 31, 1975, he spent his childhood in New York City before moving to State College, Pa. as a teenager.

He is married to the former Julie Nibert. The couple has a son, Bryant (11), and daughters, Vivienne (3) and Leona (1).

ARMY RUNS OVER TEMPLE FOR UPSET VICTORY

PHILADELPHIA - Army utilized its famed triple option running attack to march up and down the field to upset the Temple Owls, 28-13, in the season opener for both teams Friday night in front of 34,005 fans at Lincoln Financial Field. The Black Knights accumulated 329 rushing yards on 67 carries with fullback Andy Davidson leading the way with 121 yards and two TDs.

Temple struggled throughout the game to find any offensive rhythm, with the defense unable to slow down the Army ground game. The Army offense controlled the line-of-scrimmage and dominated the time-of-possession in both halves.

Head coach Matt Rhule reiterated the Owls mistakes following the loss, targeting turnovers, quarterback protection and red zone efficiency.

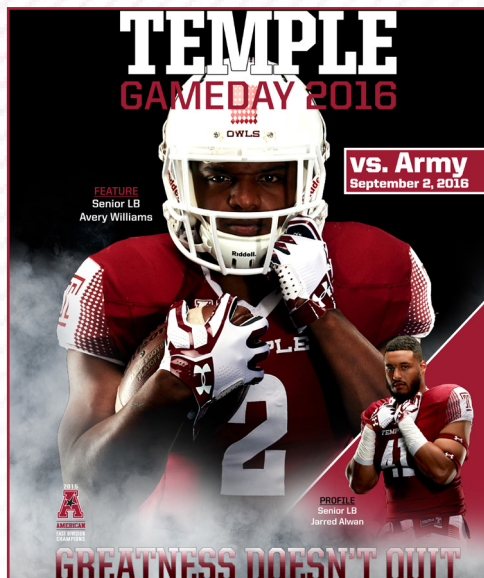
"We looked good early on at times, but when times got hard we couldn't react," Rhule said. "That is not the team that we want to have. I thought defensively, we couldn't stop Army. Offensively, we couldn't capitalize. We got the ball in the red zone three times and could not produce. We had three turnovers, Army had none. We could not protect the quarterback. That's on me. We have three losses in a row and we have to do something, quickly, to get ourselves back on track."

Senior QB Phillip Walker and the offense found no movement through the air or on the ground in the second half, scoring just a field goal. However, the four-year starter was able to break the school record for career passing yards in the contest.

On the day, Walker compiled a solid 168 yards on 12 completions through the air, throwing three costly interceptions with no scores. The senior snapped former QB Henry Burris' record of 7,495 passing yards on Temple's opening drive of the second half, finding Keith Kirkwood on a short checkdown pass in the right sideline for 14 yards. He now has 7,541 passing yards for his Owl career.

Meanwhile, RB Ryquell Armstead shouldered the load for the running back corps, racking up career-high 79 yards on 16 carries with one touchdown. The sophomore's strong performance gives the backfield some much-needed depth, as the Owls' usual starter Jahad Thomas sat out with a hand injury.

The scoring came slowly throughout, with Armstead's only touchdown starting things off early in the second quarter. Army quickly matched the following series behind the efforts of QB Ahmad Bradshaw, who snuck his way into the endzone utilizing the Black Knights' rarely



seen triple option offense.

Despite the Temple offense consistently working its way up and down the field, the Owls struggled finishing drives, owing its slim 10-7 halftime lead to excellent field position granted by a senior DL Sharif Finch blocked punt, the fifth of his career.

The second half seemed to continue a similar story as the Owl defense surrendered an opening 77-yard drive and their lead to the Black Knights, capped by Davidson's surge passed the goal line.

Even with junior PK Austin Jones' field goal closing the gap, Army continued to manhandle the Owl defensive front, methodically converting positive gains for its third touchdown of the game.

The Black Knight defense followed suit on the ensuing drive, shutting down Walker for a quick three-and-out.

The Owls had a chance in the final minutes as Army, leading 21-13, missed a field goal with 3:41. Temple took possession on its own 30-yard line, but Walker was picked off two plays later by Kenneth Brinson. The Black Knights then iced the game on a 17-yard TD run by Davidson with 2:28 on the clock. Walker tossed his final interception of the night on the final drive.

Defensively, impressive individual performances by senior linebackers Avery Williams (career-high 12 tackles) and Jarred Alwan (9 tackles), not to mention senior cornerback Sean Chandler (10 tackles), failed to slow the Army triple-option onslaught. For the Black Knights, Davidson and Bradshaw led the way, combining for 185 yards on 38 carries with three touchdowns.

TEMPLE GETS BACK TO WINNING WAYS WITH 38-0 SHUTOUT OVER STONY BROOK

PHILADELPHIA – Under a blazing mid-September heat with 22,296 fans packing the stands, the Temple Owls secured their initial win of the season over visiting FCS-member Stony Brook, 38-0, Saturday afternoon at Lincoln Financial Field.

Despite the high score-line, the Temple defense proved the most impressive component for the Owls, holding the Seawolves to just 133 yards with no scores. Throughout the first half, Stony Brook only saw the Temple side of the 50-yard line on one possession. That came after a tipped-pass interception at midfield.

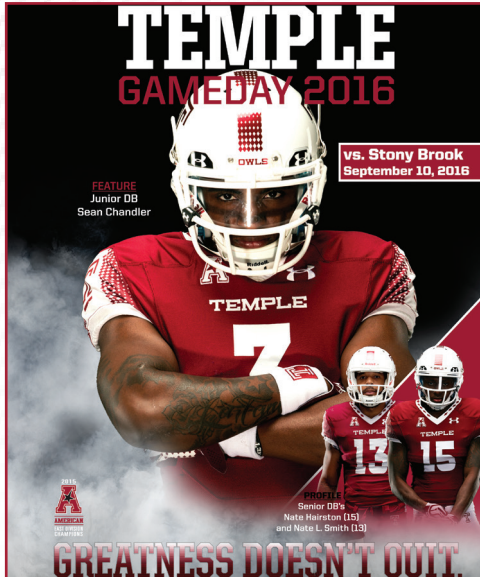
The early dominance by the defense helped the group reassert its identity, a self-proclaimed aggression and hyperactivity. The consistent pressure and blitz-prone front seven made Stony Brook visibly uncomfortable, forcing four turnovers, three sacks and nine tackles-for-loss. On the day, the Seawolves finished a dismal 0-for-13 on third down conversions.

Head coach Matt Rhule discussed his pride regarding how Temple competed during the shutout, noting the “energy” and “juice” the Owls had against the Seawolves despite a full week of grueling practice and, not to forget, last Friday’s loss to Army still fresh in many players’ minds.

“I’m really proud of our team over the last eight days, some real key leadership,” Rhule said. “It was a really, really hard work. We were not a fresh team out there today. We worked this week. I thought you saw, hopefully, a team that played with a lot of energy, a lot of juice, and did enough to win the football game, and to get a shutout on defense is always special.”

Meanwhile, the defensive energy bled its way into the offensive huddle, as senior QB Phillip Walker guided his squad on multiple scoring drives throughout both halves. Walker, who snapped the school record for career passing yards last week against Army, completed a nearly flawless game, throwing 11-of-23 for three scores with the lone interception.

Under Walker’s direction, the offense either reached or began in the redzone five consecutive times after a stalled first possession, scoring touchdowns on four of those occasions. The third quarter proved similar as each of the first two drives saw the scoreboard change in Temple’s favor, including a 26-yard strike to junior WR Keith Kirkwood, all before the senior sat out the final period.



On the receiving end of the senior’s passes were a number of wideouts; none, however, posted a game near Kirkwood, who pulled in a career-high two touchdowns on four receptions for 54 yards. Kirkwood’s standout display was supplemented by a first for sophomore WR Broderick Yancy, who grabbed his initial career score on 15-yard pass in the back of the end zone late in the second quarter.

The Owl offensive engine hit on all cylinders from the get-go, pounding the Stony Brook front all while utilizing a slew of ball carriers for 177 yards on 39 carries for two touchdowns. Sophomore RB Ryquell Armstead saw the most action, generating consistent positive yardage with 48 yards on 14 carries.

A pair of freshmen each made an impact rushing for the Owls, as WR Isaiah Wright made his debut with seven notable touches (42 yards) at tailback while WR Cortelle Simpson notched two end-around sweeps for 40 yards.

The special teams saw a milestone crossed during the victory, as junior PK Austin Jones’ sole field goal midway through the second half jumped him into sixth all-time on Temple’s career scoring list, surpassing Cap Poklemba’s 190 points from the 1999-02 seasons. Further, P Alex Starzyk showcased his coffin corner skills on two of his four punts against Stony Brook, watching the ball downed at the one-yard line on both kicks.

As for Temple head coach Matt Rhule, the shutout of the Seawolves marks the second of his Owl career, the last of which came against fellow FCS-member Delaware State by a 59-0 mark in 2014.

PENN STATE OUTLASTS TEMPLE FOR 34-27 WIN

STATE COLLEGE – Despite a resilient defensive effort and a late offensive surge, Temple fell short in its first road challenge, suffering a close 34-27 loss at the hands of rival Penn State in front of a crowd of 100,420 at Beaver Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

The Owls, who battled from behind throughout the entire matchup, closed the score to within a single possession on their final drive, but an inopportune turnover snuffed out the possibility for the comeback.

Throughout the first few drives, quick strikes from both quarterbacks signaled a shootout between the Pennsylvania rivals was underway, but a combination of defensive pressure and constant penalties soon slowed down both offenses.

Senior QB Phillip Walker and his unit struggled in the first half, but managed to put together multiple scoring possessions in the second, compiling 286 passing yards on 25-of-34 with a rushing touchdown and interception.

The early Owls' spark came behind the efforts of red-shirt senior WR Romond Deloatch, who grabbed a career-long 67-yard reception on the initial play of the second drive. With the defense reeling, Temple set up RB Jahad Thomas with his first carry and touchdown of the season on an eight-yard sweep a play later.

The rushing score moved Thomas up to fifth all-time on Temple's career touchdown list, a boost for the senior after sitting out the first two games of the year with a hand injury. He finished the day with 14 carries for 52 yards with two touchdowns along with six receptions for 48 yards.

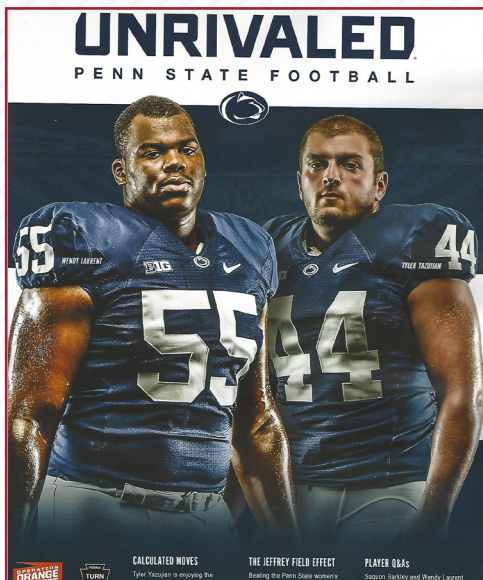
The Penn State offense similarly gave Temple early issues, finding the endzone on two of its first three possessions and jumping out to a quick seven-point lead. Nittany Lion QB Trace McSorley opened the scoring on Penn State's second drive, finding a wide-open WR Chris Godwin on a deep 52-yard bomb down midfield.

Even with a timely turnover deep in Owl territory to start the second quarter, the defense continued to struggle containing McSorley, watching the sophomore expand the Nittany Lion edge to 21-7 with his first rushing touchdown of the year. Redshirt senior Praise Martin-Oguike forced the Penn State fumble inside the Temple red zone.

Two consecutive unproductive Temple drives plagued the defensive stamina late during the first half, as Penn State's offense continued to dominate overall snaps (43-25) and time-of-possession (17:32-12:26). The Owls were held to a trio of three-and-outs versus Penn State's zero in the initial two quarters, constantly forcing the defense to take the field with little to no rest.

With just 38 seconds remaining and the ball spotted on the Owl 20-yard line, though, Walker and the offense suddenly sprang to life. An up-tempo six-play, 52-yard possession allowed junior PK Austin Jones to close the half-time deficit, drilling a 45-yard field goal with relative ease.

Sophomore DB Delvon Randall snared an interception off McSorley inside the Nittany Lion red zone late in the



third quarter, electrifying a period that had only seen a Penn State field goal thus far. The turnover spurred the Owls' offense, which capped the short scoring drive with Walker leaping into the endzone on a fourth-and-goal conversion.

The shift in momentum jumpstarted the exhausted defense, bending under another McSorley air raid, but again allowing only a field goal, giving Penn State a 27-17 advantage early in the fourth quarter. The stalled drive, one of many throughout the game, came due to the efforts of redshirt senior Haason Reddick, who concluded the match with seven total tackles and a career-high three tackles-for-loss.

A stalled drive on the ensuing Temple possession was quickly rectified on special teams, as punter Alex Staryzk's line drive ricocheted off a Nittany Lion blocker, bounced down to the Penn State one-yard line and was promptly recovered by the Owls.

Thomas, once again, came through on a sweep play in the red zone, striding in for a touchdown on a third-and-goal to cut the lead down to a field goal margin midway through the final period.

Penn State star RB Saquon Barkley, who had been relatively contained up until this point, responded in kind just three plays later, outpacing defenders on a 55-yard burst up the middle to restore the 10-point Nittany Lion edge. The Owls pushed back to within a possession courtesy of a second Jones field goal, this time from 34 yards out, sailed through the uprights with just 2:10 remaining.

After a failed onside kick and Penn State three-and-out, Temple managed to take over deep in their own territory. On the second play of the possession, though, Walker took a shot while in his throwing motion, resulting in a game-ending Nittany Lion interception.

**TEMPLE WINS SEVENTH STRAIGHT HOMECOMING
GAME WITH 48-20 VICTORY OVER CHARLOTTE**

PHILADELPHIA — Temple recovered quickly from a slow start in its Homecoming matchup against Charlotte, posting its second victory of the season with a dominant 48-20 decision over the 49ers in front of 27,786 fans Saturday afternoon at Lincoln Financial Field.

A trio of Owl big plays highlighted the first half, as senior offensive stars QB Phillip Walker and RB Jahad Thomas created points both through the air and on the ground, building a comfortable 31-7 halftime lead.

Temple head coach Matt Rhule discussed how his offense was able to rattle the 49er defense with an up-tempo speed and few big plays downfield, finally finding a rhythm early in the second quarter with Walker under center.

"We kind of came out no huddle early and tried to open them up a little bit, just tire them out," Rhule said. "I think we just kind of settled down on offense, got into a rhythm and I think what you're seeing is when we are able to get our quarterback into a rhythm, he's playing pretty well."

After opening the game with a long drive capped by junior Austin Jones' 36-yard field goal, Temple sputtered until the initial play of the second quarter. On a brilliantly faked play-action pass, Walker threw a rope to junior WR Adonis Jennings down the left sideline for a 51-yard score, reclaiming the lead for good.

From that point on the offensive floodgates remained permanently open for the Owls, as the Charlotte defense watched Walker and company become increasingly more effective.

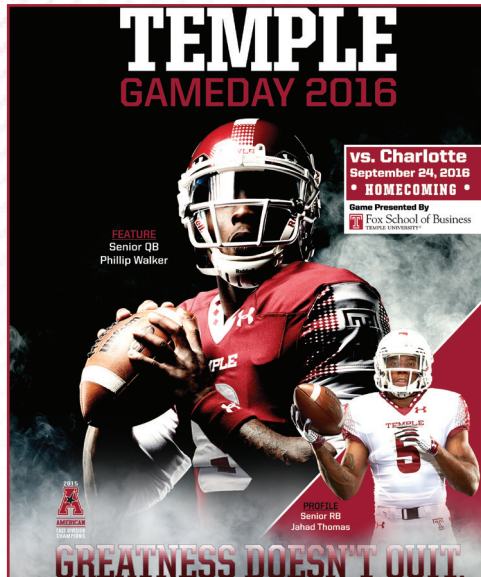
Next up, a fumble recovery by senior DE Praise Martin-Oguike — returned 20 yards by the hulking defensive lineman — was promptly converted into touchdown on a Thomas 13-yard dance into the endzone.

Walker stepped up on the Owls' ensuing drive, dropping a 40-yard dime to WR Brodrick Yancy, who then proceeded to break a tackle and stride in for the second score of his young career. The sophomore wide-out topped his previous career mark for receiving yards, snaring four receptions for a team-best 70 yards.

Another sophomore, this time RB Ryquell Armstead, grabbed the spotlight in Temple's final possession of the half, punching in a touchdown of his own a one-yard dive at the goal line.

As for the defense, a lone scoring drive in the first quarter sullied their near-perfect first half performance. Senior signal-digit linebackers Avery Williams and Stephann Marshall led the way with five tackles each while Martin-Oguike earned the lone turnover.

The third quarter sang the same tune as the 28-point second for Temple offensively, as two consecutive



methodical drives finished with rushing scores to start the period. Both Thomas and Armstead each secured their second endzone appearance, making sharp cuts for one-yard touchdowns.

Leading 45-14 late in the quarter, redshirt freshman reserve QB Logan Marchi replaced Walker as the signal caller for the Owls. The young quarterback proceeded to manufacture a drive deep into 49er territory, setting up Jones' second field goal of the game, this time a 31-yarder.

On the day, Walker finished an impressive 15-of-26 for 268 passing yards and two touchdowns, adding two rushes for 18 yards on the ground. Thomas sup-

plemented the offensive effort in multiple ways, earning a team-best 15 carries for 70 yards and two scores along with three receptions for 49 yards through the air.

The two touchdowns for the senior running back marked the 23rd and 24th of his storied career with the Owls, jumping him to third all-time in program history.

An imposing defensive effort throughout the game was capped on Charlotte's final possession, as the Owls' second-string unit held its ground inside the Temple 10-yard line and forced a turnover-on-downs. Ultimately, the 49ers proficiency on offense — 429 total yards — was never converted into consistent scoring, as the Temple bend-don't-break mantle held firm.

As for Rhule, the fourth-year head coach remains undefeated in Homecoming matchups with the Owls, improving Temple's streak to eight straight.

OWLS OPEN CONFERENCE PLAY WITH STRONG WIN OVER SMU

PHILADELPHIA — Aiming to make a splash in the American Conference debut, the Temple offensive and defensive fronts gave no ground as they guided the Owls into the win column, knocking off visiting SMU in a 45-20 thrashing on Saturday afternoon at Lincoln Financial Field. A combination of consistent quarterback pressure and a punishing ground attack proved the difference for the Owls in the victory, surging past the Mustangs in decisive fashion.

With the game teetering on the brink of a Temple blowout midway through the second quarter, senior DE Haason Reddick saw his opportunity to put away the victory on an SMU third-and-6.

Blowing by the right tackle, Reddick smashed into Mustang QB Ben Hicks full force, triggering a fumble that was promptly palmed by fellow senior Romond Deloatch and corralled into the endzone.

The touchdown extended the Owl lead to a commanding 28 points, a margin that was narrowly slimmed throughout the remainder of the matchup. The advantage forced SMU into panic mode early, an edge for the high-energy Temple defensive front.

The critical victory marks the first in the Owls' defense of last season's Eastern Division Title, as they improve to 3-2 (1-0 American) on the year. The Mustangs, meanwhile, fall to 2-3 (0-1 American) and turn their attention to a Tulsa road trip next weekend.

A rocky start for Temple — highlighted by senior QB Phillip Walker throwing a pick-six — was quickly remedied by, surprisingly enough, punter Alex Starzyk. After Temple's second drive stalled three snaps in, the junior drove a kick into the back of an SMU blocker, allowing Reddick to recover the live ball.

Seven plays later, senior RB Jahad Thomas burst through a truck-sized hole for an untouched 12-yard touchdown run, knotting the score at 7-7. From that point on, the Owls' offense never looked back, surgically picking apart the Mustang defense.

The ensuing Temple possession lasted just a single play, as Walker redeemed his opening gaffe with a 42-yard connection to now-healthy sophomore WR Ventell Bryant for the duo's first score of the season. The touchdown gave the Owls a 14-7 lead, an advantage they did not relinquish.

Walker's early struggles were short-lived, as the senior wrapped up the win with 124 yards passing on 7-of-18 and his lone touchdown to Bryant. The receiving corps saw a plethora of distribution from the signal caller as well, with three wideouts topping 30 yards, the best of which came from junior Keith Kirkwood (41 yards on three receptions).

A second sophomore, this time RB Ryquell Armstead, crossed the goal line next for the Owls following a few back-and-forth punts, punching it in after a 34-yard Walker-to-Deloatch toss set Temple up at the one-yard line. To cap the offense's first half, Thomas made his second endzone appearance of the day minutes into the sec-



ond quarter, breaking off a 15-yard rush for the score.

For the game, the senior tailback finished with 16 carries for 80 yards and two touchdowns, jumping him into sole possession of third place on Temple's all-time career scoring list (26 touchdowns).

The real story of the half, though, proved the stout defensive performance, giving up just 100 yards and a lone, late touchdown to a statistically high-powered Mustang offense. Along with the forced fumble, the stingy unit also grabbed two interceptions — by senior DB Nate L. Smith and sophomore LB Jared Folks, respectively — as sophomore DB Delvon Randall led the team in tackles (5).

As exciting and point-happy as the first half was for both teams, the final two quarters proved conflictly quiet. The third saw only an Austin Jones' field goal for Temple, pushing the lead to a comfortable 38-14, before the Mustangs added only their second offensive score of the game on a 14-yard pass to open the final period.

With SMU finally showing some life, the Owls decided to answer with vigor on their ensuing drive. Once again, the ground game came through as Armstead shrugged off defenders in a 37-yard sprint into the endzone.

The sophomore impressed throughout the game, particularly during the final two quarters, finishing with a career-best 159 yards on 15 rushes for two scores of his own.

A defensive stand inside the ten-yard line helped close out the victory, as SMU failed to convert four straight snaps deep in the red zone. Randall concluded the game with a career-best double-digit tackle mark (10) while both Smith and redshirt freshman LB Chapelle Russell added seven tackles each.

TEMPLE SINGS MEMPHIS BLUES AFTER TIGERS COME BACK FOR 34-27 WIN

MEMPHIS – Under the hostile lights of the Liberty Bowl and fighting a crowd 34,743 strong, Temple struggled to overcome the obstacles of a tough road venue as fellow American Conference foe Memphis outpaced the Owls in a 34-27 shootout.

After winning two straight, the Owls' defense of last season's Eastern Division title took a hit as the team drops to 1-1 in conference play and 3-3 overall. Memphis, meanwhile, bounces back after a close loss last week to No. 14 Ole Miss, surging to a 1-0 American record and a 4-1 mark for the year.

In a true "tale of two halves" game, Temple jumped out to a commanding 13-3 lead in the first half only to surrender that edge over the course of the final two quarters. The Owls started the game with serious energy and poise on both sides of the ball, but a few big plays by the Tigers buried Temple down the stretch.

The third quarter flipped the game for the Owls, as the team watched their 13-3 advantage evaporate into a 20-13 deficit, with both of Memphis' touchdowns coming over a 51-second span in the final two minutes of the period.

The first was the result of Tigers' RB Doroland Dorceus, who broke off a 71-yard dash up the middle, while the second came on a tipped pass turned pick-six by Memphis LB Genard Avery two plays later.

The final quarter, even with some positive results, failed to change the game's eventual outcome, as senior QB Phillip Walker threw his second interception of the night, ending the Owls' hopes of a comeback.

After Memphis RB Darrell Henderson capped a seven-play drive with a 28-yard scoring rush to kickoff the period, Walker found fellow senior RB Jahad Thomas on a 61-yard touchdown pass to narrow the lead to just one possession. Memphis immediately responded on the ensuing kickoff, taking it 95 yards to the house as the Tigers tried keep the Owls at arms length.

Temple set itself up again to close the gap a drive later as Walker connected with Thomas for the duo's second score, this time on a nine-yard screen, cutting the deficit again to just seven. A running into the punter penalty cut the Owls' last chance drive down to just 50 seconds, and the late interception sealed the loss.

On the day, though, Walker finished with career highs across the board, posting a school record in passing attempts (59) while tying in completions (36) and passing yards (445). He joins Henry Burris (445 yards vs. Pitt, 1996) as the only Owl signal-callers to pass for more than 400 yards in a game. Thomas impressed as well, grabbing six receptions for 121 yards and two touch-



downs along with 37 yards on the ground. It marked his fourth straight game with two touchdowns.

And while the second half looked like a shootout, the first half played out much more like a defensive struggle.

A pair of field goals from 31 and 23 yards out, respectively, from junior K Austin Jones gave Temple an early lead. Late in the first half following a gusty fourth-and-three conversion on Walker toss to senior TE Colin Thompson, sophomore RB Ryquell Armstead punched in the game's opening touchdown from two yards out.

The true story of the first half for the Owls, though, came on the defensive side of the ball.

Led by a suffocating defensive line, the Owls contained the high-octane Memphis offense to just a late field goal and 111 total yards. Tigers' QB Riley Ferguson was visibly uncomfortable throughout both quarters, overthrowing videoouts and struggling to find space in a tight pocket.

Ferguson and his offense were able to regroup during halftime, generating over double their initial production. However, two non-offensive touchdowns for the Tigers saved their lead late as both the kickoff return and the pick-six shifted momentum towards Memphis.

Redshirt senior DL Haasan Reddick led the Owls' defense with 11 tackles, including four for a loss, and two sacks.

SCORE TO ERASE 18-POINT DEFICIT**

ORLANDO — Despite trailing for the entirety of the game, Temple battled back to stun UCF on the road with a last second touchdown, stealing a 26-25 victory over the Knights Saturday evening at Bright House Networks Stadium.

Down five with just 32 seconds remaining, senior QB Phillip Walker orchestrated a four-play, 70-yard drive to bring the Owls back from the brink, capped by a dramatic eight-yard touchdown pass to red-shirt junior WR Keith Kirkwood.

Walker threw four consecutive passes on the game-winning possession, the first three to redshirt sophomore WR Ventell Bryant for 20, 16 and 26 yards apiece. The final pass came over-the-top to Kirkwood as the Knight defense anticipated a spike with under 10 seconds left, leaving the junior to make a leaping grab near the back edge of the end zone.

For the game, Walker finished 12-of-24 passing with 167 yards, two touchdowns and one interception. The receiving corps continued to flourish, as Bryant and Kirkwood combined for 113 yards on seven receptions with the lone score.

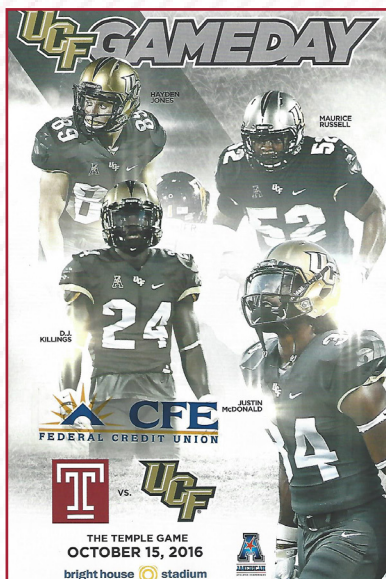
A quick start by both offensive units mellowed out as the first two quarters progressed, with Central Florida taking control in front of its home crowd. The Knights opened the game with a drive that culminated on a 55-yard pass down the left sideline for a touchdown.

On the ensuing drive, though, Walker gave Temple a spark, crafting a response to the early UCF score.

Under pressure and back-peddling, Walker slipped a screen past two charging defensive linemen to waiting senior RB Jahad Thomas, who then proceeded to weave his way 28 yards past would-be tacklers into the end zone.

A number of big plays plagued the Owl defense throughout the first half, as UCF scored on the aforementioned 55-pass and 63-yard sprint early in the second quarter, building a commanding 25-7 advantage.

Temple chipped away at the lead minutes before halftime, utilizing its powerful run game and a drive-capping seven-yard rush by Thomas to close the gap to 25-14. With the ground touchdown, his second of the day, Thomas claimed the NCAA active title for consecutive games with two-or-more scores, now stretched to five straight on the season.



The senior finished the day with a team-high 120 yards on 27 carries for one touchdown on the ground along with three receptions for 33 yards and a score.

A few key defensive stops helped along the way as well, shutting down the Knights on two consecutive possessions after the 63-yard burst. The Owl front seven proved particularly potent in containing UCF late, generating seven sacks — two from senior DL Haason Reddick — on freshman QB McKenzie Milton.

The third quarter saw some dominant ground-and-pound play from Temple, as the Owls opened the period with a sustained 14-play, 61-yard drive capped by freshman PK Aaron Bouserhi's first career field goal, a short 32-yarder.

The following possession saw a similar result, as the run-centric offense pushed the ball down deep into UCF territory before Bouserhi once again drilled his attempt, this time a tough 47-yard kick. The Owls finished the quarter with an impressive time-of-possession, owning the ball for 11:18 of the 15:00 minutes.

The defense continued to make plays into the fourth quarter, as redshirt senior CB Nate Hairston intercepted Milton just as UCF seemed to be gaining some semblance of momentum. After two Owl turnovers-on-downs, Temple continued to dominate defensively, holding the Knights to back-to-back three-and-outs trailing by only five points.

TEMPLE TAKES DIVISION LEAD WITH 46-30 WIN OVER PRESEASON FAVORITE USF

PHILADELPHIA — Facing off against a rolling South Florida squad undefeated in American Athletic play, Temple continued to prove its resolve in the 46-30 dismantling of the visiting Bulls, surging to the top of the East Division in front of 25,950 Friday night at Lincoln Financial Field.

The Owls, lacking in an offensive identity following a tough road loss to Memphis two weeks ago, found comfort behind a powerful ground game against USF. The unit leaned heavily on sophomore RB Ryquell Armstead, who generated a career-high 210 yards on 20 carries for two touchdowns for the evening.

Armstead even found himself inserted into the school record books, as his high-production now stands as 14th on the all-time single game list for rushing yards. He is also just the 10th player to rush for 200 yards in a game.

With the victory, Temple improves to a noteworthy 5-3 (3-1 American), earning the Eastern tiebreaker over former division leader USF (6-2, 3-1 American). Further, from a revenge perspective, the Owls' triumph over the Bulls reversed the result from last season's game, where USF knocked off an undefeated Temple program on its turf.

The Temple offense exploded out of the gate, compiling a 14-play, eight-minute opening drive nearly pacing the length of the field before settling for a 22-yard field goal from freshman kicker Aaron Bouserhi. The three-point lead marked only the second time this season, not to mention in consecutive weeks, Temple generated points on its initial possession of the game.

USF then put together a scoring drive of its own late in the first quarter, wrapped up with 27-yard bomb into the end zone from QB Quinton Flowers.

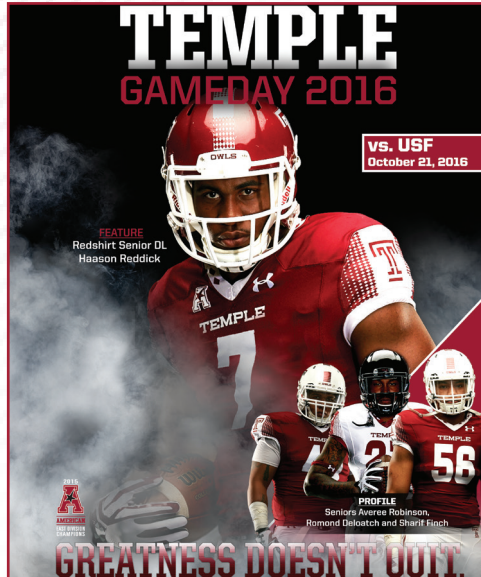
The Temple offense once again responded. The unit marched 75 yards over 15 plays and another eight minutes, chipping off gains behind power rushing and accurate short-yardage tosses from senior QB Phillip Walker.

Set up at the one-yard-line, though, the Owls were not to be denied an end zone appearance this time around. On a seemingly doomed rollout toward the right sideline, Walker twisted 180 degrees to throw back across his body to the opposite pylon, finding wide-open fellow senior TE Colin Thompson for the first receiving touchdown of his career.

The Bulls saw fit to retake the lead off another long pass from Flowers, a 31-yarder sailing over the secondary. A play later, though, the situation turned sour for USF as Temple senior DE Praise Martin-Oguike swung the momentum back in the Owls' favor, notching the fifth blocked kick of his career.

And then, for the first time of the game, the Temple offense decided to move with some urgency. On what looked to be another simple hand-off up the middle quickly transformed into a team season-long 76-yard dash by Armstead, a single-play career best from the sophomore playmaker.

The two-play scoring drive took just one minute, the notable exception during the half as Temple controlled the ball for a stunning 21:44 to South Florida's 8:16. Each of the Bulls' scoring possessions, though, concluded on a major passing play, a weakness that continues to



haunt the Owl defense.

The initial two quarters managed to compose a dramatic finish, as four plays from Walker and the offense set up a Bouserhi 35-yarder. Sophomore WR Ventell Bryant grabbed a crucial reception with eight seconds remaining on the possession, his final of five catches for a career-best of 115 receiving yards.

The second half, however, saw the surge in Temple confidence dissipate over the first seven minutes, as Flowers led USF to 10 straight points on two consecutive drives. The junior quarterback capped the final possession himself, striding into the end zone on a zone-read to open up a three-point advantage.

Three snaps into the ensuing Temple possession, however, and Armstead took the deficit into his own hands yet again, breaking off a 42-yard footrace for his second score of the game. With a new energy to feed off, the defensive front-seven choked the Bull offense to a three-and-out behind relentless pursuit and an athletic pass deflection from sophomore S Delvon Randall.

The ensuing punt continued to drain the spirit from the Bull sideline, as redshirt senior DE Avery Ellis got his hand on the kick. The Temple offense — with field position at the 20-yard-line — broke the goal line two plays later off two touches from senior RB Jahad Thomas.

The two teams traded touchdowns in the final 8:42, the final of which came from Thomas on a three-yard sweep after a Temple interception. With the score, Thomas, who finished with 16 carries for 56 yards, continued his NCAA-best streak of consecutive games with two or more touchdowns (6).

A prime-time defensive performance was fittingly capped with a safety off senior TE Romond Deloatch's sack of back-up USF QB Brett Kean, as the group finished with a combined four on the day.

WITH SOUND WIN OVER CONFERENCE FOE**

PHILADELPHIA — Utilizing a devastating ground game highlighted by senior RB Jahad Thomas and his big-play ability, Temple routed visiting American Athletic foe Cincinnati in a 34-13 dismantling, to the delight of 29,763 fans Saturday evening at Lincoln Financial Field.

The all-around victory was generated off critical snaps within each facet of the matchup; however, a bonanza of special teams plays, including a blocked punt and muffed kickoff return, wrecked havoc on the Cincinnati baseline energy.

With the win, Temple moves to a commanding 6-3 (4-1 American), making the team bowl bound in back-to-back years for the first time in school history. Cincinnati, meanwhile, falls to a 4-4 (1-4 American) mark on the season.

Facing a Bearcat offense averaging over 400 yards per game, the Temple defense stepped up early to force a quick three-and-out. The momentum carried through to the special teams on the ensuing punt, as redshirt senior DL Avery Ellis blocked the kick, his second in two games.

Under direction from senior QB Phillip Walker, the Owls' offense rolled down inside the ten-yard line, only to settle for a short 26-yard field goal from K Aaron Boumerhi. The freshman has been perfect on field goal attempts since replacing junior Austin Jones three games ago, the latter of which is sidelined due to a season-ending injury on a kickoff against Memphis.

When Walker and his unit took over two drives later after a Cincinnati fumble, the group was not to be denied the end zone this time around. With just four plays, Temple covered 55 yards for the touchdown, a majority of which came on a 40-yard scoring toss from Walker to junior Adonis Jennings down the left sideline.

The senior quarterback concluded the evening with no turnovers and two passing touchdowns, throwing 12-of-19 for 199 yards through the air.

The Bearcats, led by QB Gunner Kiel, responded on their first play of the second quarter, scoring on a short, four-yard lob to the back-left corner of the end zone.

Fighting a swing in momentum towards Cincinnati, the Owls' offense broke through behind the efforts of senior RB Jahad Thomas, who gashed the Bearcats with a 56-yard cut up the left sideline. Walker and redshirt sophomore WR Ventell Bryant cleaned up the drive two plays later, connecting on a 28-yard post route at the goal line.



Thomas put together another strong performance despite never finding the end zone himself, ending his NCAA-best streak of consecutive games with two or more touchdowns. On the day, he finished with a team-best 151 yards on 17 carries.

Kiel sought to keep the gap at a one-score margin, compiling a ten-play possession and his second touchdown pass of the day — this time a 10-yard crossing route — for the Bearcats. Despite the narrowing lead, Temple maintained a 17-13 advantage heading into the locker room.

The second half, however, proved wildly different from the offensive-centric first, as the Owls' defense held Cincinnati to zero points in the third quarter. Meanwhile, Walker chewed up clock as

he guided the offense on an impressive 15-play drive for a second Boumerhi field goal, this time from 27 yards out.

Eventually, just as the final period began, Temple was able to secure solid footing as sophomore RB Ryquell Armstead punched in two scores on near-consecutive snaps, the first from three-yards out and the second a six-yard grind into the end zone. The highly productive back up finished with 18 carries for 61 yards and the two touchdowns.

The momentum created by Armstead's initial score essentially buried Cincinnati on the ensuing kickoff, as Boumerhi's squib kick slipped through the hands of a returner, before junior Cequan Jefferson dove in for the recovery at the 18-yard line. In decisive fashion, the sophomore tailback would score just four plays later.

OFFENSE RACES TO QUICK SCORES AND DEFENSE SHUTS OUT HUSKIES

EAST HARTFORD — Behind a two-dimensional offensive game plan and a staunch defensive front unwilling to break, Temple took to the road to shutout regional rival and East Division foe UConn 21-0 Friday evening at Pratt & Whitney Stadium.

The Owls utilized a balanced offense, compiling 218 yards on the ground along with 215 yards through the air, to work the clock and generate three early scores. The defense, however, clamped down on a sputtering Husky offense, forcing numerous three-and-outs and holding the unit to just 158 total yards.

The shutout marked the first for the program over an FBS opponent since October 15, 2011, when the Owls held Buffalo scoreless in a 34-0 victory.

With the victory, Temple improves to 7-3 (5-1 American), good for first in the East Division and a guaranteed bowl invite. UConn, on the other hand, falls to 3-7 (1-6 American), essentially eliminating the program from postseason eligibility.

Facing the top run defense in the conference, senior QB Phillip Walker and the Owls took the air for an early statement score after a quick three-and-out by the Huskies. Throwing three times in a five-play, 74-yard drive, Walker capped the possession with a 23-yard rope to fellow senior RB Jahad Thomas, who pulled in the catch before falling into the end zone.

The ensuing Temple possession saw similar results, as Walker first completed a 44-yard toss to sophomore WR Ventell Bryant before dropping in another touchdown to Thomas, this time a short touch pass in the flats at the goal line.

For the game, Walker finished 12-of-18 through the air for 215 yards and three touchdowns, throwing two interceptions. Thomas, meanwhile, led the team in all-purpose yards, earning 17 carries for 83 yards while grabbing four receptions for 73 yards and two touchdowns.

As UConn took over for the third time having just run six total plays, the Huskies finally managed to find some semblance of rhythm. Driving down inside the Owl redzone, the unit finally stalled and was forced to



attempt a 35-yard field goal, one that was promptly blocked by senior DL Praise Martin-Oguke.

With momentum firmly in Temple's corner following the block, the Owls exploited the faltering Husky defense, turning to their strength: power rushing. Highlighted by the one-two punch of Thomas and sophomore RB Ryquell Armstead, Temple pounded out 59 yards on the ground before turning to Walker to close out the unit's third-straight scoring possession.

The senior proceeded to work in his third touchdown pass of the match-up, finding TE Romond Deloatch on an 18-yard fade up the left centerline. For Deloatch, the score marked his first on offense this season, as the senior who moonlights at defensive end scooped a fumble into the end zone against SMU earlier this year.

While the Temple defense continued to hold UConn scoreless throughout the second quarter, the Owls' offense finally slowed down. The group's best drive of the period — a 10-play, 54-yard possession — ended abruptly at the goal line, as Husky defender Obi Melifonwu intercepted a pass intended for Bryant.

The second half told a similar story for both squads, as the UConn offense was consistently smothered by the staunch Temple defensive front. Offensively, the Owls were able to move the ball but struggled to build on the 21-0 lead, their best opportunity ending in another Melifonwu pick, this time in the back of the end zone.

A bright spot for the offense, however, came from Armstead, who picked up a team-best 133 yards on the ground behind 20 carries. Combined with Thomas, the two backs pounded the UConn defense, grinding the clock and churning out yardage.

**TEMPLE RECORDS SECOND STRAIGHT
 SHUTOUT ON THE ROAD**

NEW ORLEANS — With senior QB Phillip Walker breaking off serious yardage through the air to supplement a smothering defensive effort, Temple continued to control its own conference destiny in a solid 31-0 shutout victory over Tulane Saturday afternoon at Yulman Stadium.

With the win, the Owls improve to 8-3 (6-1 American) on the season, good for first in the East Division with just one game remaining. Paired with the 21-0 victory two weeks ago over UConn, blanking the Green Wave marked the first back-to-back shutout wins since October 2011 when Temple did the same to Ball State and Buffalo. The Owls now have not been scored upon for 10 straight quarters.

Choked up early in the ground game by a relentless Green Wave defensive front, Temple turned to Walker and the Owls' air raid for production. The four-year starter found his stride quickly, hitting 10-of-22 for 223 yards in the first half alone.

The senior's primary target throughout the match-up: sophomore WR Ventell Bryant, who grabbed nine receptions for a career-best 168 yards and one touchdown. On multiple occasions, Bryant pulled in passes over 20-yards, including one that set up the opening two-yard score for senior RB Jahad Thomas.

Meanwhile, the usually potent rushing attack suffered despite persistent attempts against the Tulane defense, even faltering at the goal line during a fourth-down try early in the second quarter.

Even though the offense struggled moving the ball with consistency during the first half, the Owls' defense remained as resilient as ever. The unit pressured Tulane into uncomfortable situations drive after drive, forcing seven three-and-outs in addition to the shutout on the scoreboard.

The second half saw similar results, particularly from the defensive side of the ball. However, the offense woke



up as Walker manufactured a number of scoring possessions during the final two quarters.

First, the senior quarterback led a 73-yard, 14-play drive that culminated with a 12-yard toss to Bryant for a touchdown. A quick three-and-out from the defense allowed the momentum to stick with the Owls, and the offense capitalized.

In a much shorter five-play possession, two critical pass plays helped put Temple into the end zone. Freshman Isaiah Wright started things off two snaps in, grabbing a 30-yard pass up the centerline before a screen to Thomas saw the senior weave 42-yards for his second score.

Lastly, midway through the final period, the Owls' ground game finally found its footing, as a slew of ball carriers

picked up 84 yards on a 10-play drive. Wright capped the grind-it-out possession with authority, bursting through the Tulane center for a 22-yard touchdown.

Walker was able to close the game 18-for-33 through the air for 337 yards and two scores. After weeks of utilizing what seemed-to-be an unstoppable ground game, the senior quarterback proved the Owls are as much a threat when he drops back to throw as when he hands the ball off.

OWLS WRAP UP AMERICAN CONFERENCE
EAST DIVISION CROWN WITH SIXTH STRAIGHT VICTORY

PHILADELPHIA — In need of a victory to advance to the American Conference Championship for the second straight season, senior QB Phillip Walker and the Temple offense outpaced the potent East Carolina air raid to seal the East Division behind a 37-10 mark Saturday evening at Lincoln Financial Field.

With their sixth straight win, the Owls improve to 9-3 (7-1 American) on the season, locking up the title of East Division Champions on the way. With USF knocking off rival UCF, 48-31, earlier on Saturday, a victory over the Pirates was required to finish atop the hotly contested division.

The first half featured a quick start from both offenses, as East Carolina snapped the Owl defense's 10-quarter scoreless streak on the game's opening possession. Primarily due to the efforts of QB Gardner Minshew, the Pirates orchestrated an 11-play drive capped with a 13-yard touchdown pass, showing little fear in facing off against the conference's top passing defense.

Walker and the offense responded immediately on the ensuing drive, however, as sophomore RB Ryquell Armstead punched in a two-yard score after a perfectly placed 44-yard toss to junior WR Adonis Jennings, who had a career-high 100 yards on six receptions, set up the Owls in the red zone.

A slew of defensive stands from both squads ratcheted down the excitement throughout the remainder of the first quarter and well into the second. With just 2:04 remaining in the half, though, Armstead notched his second touchdown of the game — this time from one-yard out — to close out a 68-yard, 12-play possession.

During that drive, Walker earned himself another place in the school record books, breaking the 10,000-yard passing mark on a short six-yard out route, a first for any Temple quarterback. The senior would conclude his final home game with the Owls a statistically strong 12-of-20 for 158 yards and no touchdowns, ending his career in Lincoln Financial Field the essence of a true game manager.

The Temple defense continued to dominate the point-of-attack after a deep kickoff return by East Carolina, as senior DL Praise Martin-Oguike broke through the offensive front to force a fumble during a sack of Minchew, recovering the ball in the process.



The Owls' offense capitalized in decisive fashion over the course of two plays, both courtesy of senior RB Jahad Thomas. First, the elusive tailback turned what looked to be a dead-end sweep into a 28-yard scramble before forcing his way into the endzone on a three-yard rush up the Pirate center, securing a 21-7 lead for Temple entering halftime.

On the evening, Thomas would rack up a team-best 155 yards on 24 carries for two scores, balancing out the precise passing attack Walker consistently imposed upon the East Carolina defense.

The scoring would not continue until late in the third quarter, as once again the Temple ground game paid dividends with a three-yard

Thomas rush for the score. With the touchdown, the senior running back has now notched a pair of end-zone appearances in nine of his 10 games this season.

The final period saw only a pair of field goals, one from each team, before sophomore RB Jager Gardner put an exclamation point on the win with an untouched 14-yard touchdown sprint. It was the fifth rushing score on the night for the Owls.

As for the Temple defense, the unit wrapped up another stellar performance, allowing just 225 total yards with the only serious blemish coming on the matchup's opening drive, garnering a single turnover as well.
