- Temple has two losses in its last three games, coming against the teams picked to finish first and second in the BIG EAST Conference this year.
- Most recently, the Owls suffered a heartbreaking, 9-8 overtime loss to UConn on April 13, making a secondhalf comeback after trailing 4-1 at halftime.
- The Owls' other recent one-goal loss came at #2 Florida in their BIG EAST opener on April 2. It was an extremely tight game throughout, and Temple fell short by a score of 10-9. Two of the Owls' four losses have come to teams ranked in the IWLCA Top 20 (also #16 Louisville, 8-5 on Feb. 12).
- In between those two narrow losses, the Owls' defense held Vanderbilt to just three goals in a 7-3 home win on April 9. Temple held the Commodores without a single goal for over 50 minutes to end the game.
- The Owls won seven in a row early in the season, their longest win streak in 14 years, before falling 10-4 to Delaware on March 16.
- In its final non-conference game on March 26, Temple recorded an 18-3 blowout win against Cal. Three Owls recorded hat tricks in the win, led by senior Megan Tiernan with three goals and an assist.
- Senior goalkeeper Jaqi Kakalecik, who has played every minute in the cage this season for Temple, has been named the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week twice this season. Her goals-against average of 6.42 ranks fourth among all players in NCAA Division I, while her save percentage of .512 ranks 10th nationally.
- Temple has won six games by 10 or more goals. The Owls' 19-goal effort in a 19-9 win at UMBC was the most since a 19-3 win over Cincinnati in 2014.
- Seniors Rachel Schwaab and Megan Tiernan have combined for an impressive 71 total points this season, leading the way for the Owls' offense. Schwaab has tallied 24 goals and 14 assists, while Tiernan has 22 goals and 11 assists.
- Temple and <u>Kakalecik</u> have held opponents to just 6.42 goals per game, ranking third among all teams in NCAA Division I. The Owls' 12.38 goals per game rank 23rd in the nation, while their scoring margin of 5.92 ranks eighth.
- Tiernan has notched five hat tricks already this season, while Schwaab has three. Senior Kirstie Connor ranks third on the team with 18 goals after recording a hat trick against Florida and another goal vs. Vanderbilt. Senior <u>Brenda McDermott</u> and junior <u>Morgan Glassford</u> are fourth and fifth in scoring with 17 and 16 goals, respectively, but McDermott's 13 assists give her 30 points to rank third on the team.
- Glassford, twice named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll already this season, has recorded 59 draw controls to lead the Owls and rank second all-time in a single season at Temple. Her 4.54 draws per game lead all players in the BIG EAST and rank 14th in the country.
- Senior midfielder Nicole Tiernan was a unanimous selection to the 2016 Preseason All-BIG EAST Team. The Owls were picked to finish sixth of eight teams in the conference in the preseason poll.
- The Owls are looking to make their first appearance in the BIG EAST Tournament since joining the league as an associate member in 2014. The four-team tournament will be hosted by Georgetown in Washington, D.C. on May 5 and 7.
- The Owls lead Marquette 2-0 in the all-time series, with wins in each of the last two seasons. Nicole Barretta scored three goals and tallied two assists in last year's 11-7 win over the Golden Eagles at home.

TEMPLE LACROSSE

LAST TIME OUT: UCONN 9, TEMPLE 8 (OT)

- After coming back from a three-goal halftime deficit to tie the score three times in regulation, Temple suffered a heartbreaking, 9-8 loss to UConn in overtime on April 13 at Geasey Field.
- The Huskies' Alyson Fazio scored her first goal of the game with 1:24 left in overtime to keep UConn undefeated in BIG EAST play at 4-o.
- Senior goalkeeper Jaqi Kakalecik played an outstanding game for the Owls, tying her career high with 13 saves. The Huskies' Shannon Nee also stopped 13 shots, including eight in the first half as UConn held Temple to a single goal.
- Seniors Brenda McDermott, Rachel Schwaab and Megan Pinkerton all scored twice for the Owls, with McDermott and Schwaab also recording one assist apiece.
- UConn's Alexandra Crofts scored the Huskies' first three goals of the game in the opening 12 minutes, and Grace Nolan added a fourth goal just before the midway point of the half. Pinkerton scored the lone goal for the Owls in that stretch on a free position opportunity just over six minutes in.
- The teams battled to a scoreless final 16 minutes of the half, and Temple went into halftime down 4-1.
- The Owls turned things around quickly in the second half, starting with a free position goal by McDermott in the third minute. Nicole Tiernan scored just a minute later to pull Temple within one at 4-3.
- UConn scored two of the next three, broken up by a Morgan Glassford goal, and the Huskies led 6-4 with 22:26 remaining. In the span of just 18 seconds, McDermott and Pinkerton both scored to tie the game at 6-6 with 21:13 left.
- The teams traded goals the rest of the way, with Schwaab scoring both of her goals to tie the game at 7-7 and 8-8 as the Owls were forced to come from behind the entire way. Temple's last goal came with 8:07 remaining in regulation. A free position shot went wide for the Owls with just over a minute left, and UConn had a chance to end the game before overtime. Kakalecik made her third save of the final eight minutes with just 12 seconds left, and Temple's defense held strong to keep UConn scoreless.
- The Huskies won both draw controls in overtime, and Temple was never able to gain possession. The Owls thwarted two shots in the first three minutes before the teams switched ends, but UConn gained the second draw and scored on its first shot of the second three minutes.
- In addition to her career-tying 13 saves, Kakalecik caused three turnovers and picked up two ground balls. Seniors Maddie McTigue and Megan Tiernan were both credited with two caused turnovers apiece, and UConn finished with 15 turnovers to Temple's 10.

Head Coach Bonnie Rosen on the UConn Game

"That's who we are. That was an important test for us, to see how we could (rebound after halftime). It was just a matter of trusting and settling down, and hopefully that's what we learned today."

"As any competitive athlete does, they move right into 'I could have done better,' but that's one of my jobs as a coach to make sure they know what they're doing well. This has been a team that's bounced back from any adversity we've faced so far this season. I'm really confident that after we're hard on ourselves, we'll get back to work and believe in ourselves again too."

"Sudden death overtime was a new experience for our team, and I was really confident we were going to get a chance to win the game. That starts with having to get draw controls, and that was a little bit of a surprise that we didn't come up with draw controls in the end because that's been something we've been able to count on for the most part. But it was a great game and I'm really glad we gave ourselves a chance to win."

Hanging With the Best

Temple's results against top teams this season have been a stark contrast to the Owls' scores against the same top teams a year ago. After losing by 14 goals to nationally ranked Florida in 2015, Temple nearly pulled off the upset a couple weeks ago before falling by just a single goal, 10-9 in Gainesville on April 2. The Owls didn't fare much better against UConn last season, losing 18-6. This year, Temple took the Huskies to overtime before falling 9-8 on April 13.

Florida and UConn were picked to finish first and second in the BIG EAST this season, respectively, while Temple was picked to finish sixth.

Couldn't Draw it Up Any Better

Junior Morgan Glassford has corralled 59 draw controls this season, already ranking second all-time in program history for a single season. She needs just five more to tie for first place. Glassford's 4.54 draw controls per game lead all players in the BIG EAST and rank 14th in NCAA Division I. In an 18-3 win over Cal on March 26, Glassford recorded a career-high 10 draw controls for the Owls.

Most Double Digit Wins in 14 Years

Temple has defeated six opponents this season by 10 or more goals, the Owls' most double-digit victories in 14 years. No Temple team had more than two double-digit wins in a season since 2004, and the last time a team had more than six was when the 2002 Owls took down seven opponents by 10 or more goals.

Dominant Senior Class

The Owls' success this season is thanks in large part to a talented, veteran and huge senior class. Temple boasts 13 seniors on its roster of 31, with 11 of those being consistent figures in the starting lineup. Six of the Owls' top seven scorers are seniors, and the defense is also anchored by five seniors including a fifth-year in goalkeeper Jaqi Kakalecik.

Temple in the National Stats

Senior goalkeeper Jaqi Kakalecik currently ranks fourth among all players in NCAA Division I with a goals against average of 6.42, while her save percentage of .512 ranks 10th nationally. Junior midfielder Morgan Glassford ranks 14th in the nation with 4.54 draw controls per game.

As a team, Temple ranks third among all teams in NCAA Division I in scoring defense at 6.42 goals per game, while the Owls' scoring margin of 5.92 ranks eighth.
