HEADLINES

- The Owls are 9-5 overall but are coming off back-to-back losses against UConn and at Marquette.
- Temple has three losses in its last four games, with two of those coming against the teams picked to finish first and second in the BIG EAST Conference this year (Florida and UConn).
- Most recently, the Owls lost 12-10 at Marquette on April 16, surrendering an 8-5 halftime lead. The Golden Eagles opened the second half on a 7-0 run for a 12-8 lead, and Temple was only able to get two back in the final minutes of the game.
- The Owls' other game last week was a heartbreaking, 9-8 overtime loss to UConn on April 13. Temple made a second-half comeback after trailing 4-1 at halftime, but UConn controlled both draws in overtime.
- The Owls' other recent one-goal loss came at #2 Florida in their BIG EAST opener on April 2. It was an extremely tight game throughout, and Temple fell short by a score of 10-9. Two of the Owls' five losses have come to teams ranked in the IWLC A Top 20 (also #16 Louisville, 8-5 on Feb. 12).
- Temple earned its lone BIG EAST win so far on April 9 in a 7-3 defeat of Vanderbilt. Temple held the Commodores without a single goal for over 50 minutes to end the game.
- The Owls won seven in a row early in the season, their longest win streak in 14 years, before falling 10-4 to Delaware on March 16.
- In its final non-conference game on March 26, Temple recorded an 18-3 blowout win against Cal. Three Owls recorded hat tricks in the win, led by senior Megan Tiernan with three goals and an assist.
- Senior goalkeeper Jaqi Kakalecik, who has played every minute in the cage this season for Temple, has been named the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week twice this season. Her goals-against average of 6.82 ranks seventh among all players in NCAA Division I, while her save percentage of .492 ranks 14th nationally.
- Temple has won six games by 10 or more goals. The Owls' 19-goal effort in a 19-9 win at UMBC was the most since a 19-3 win over Cincinnati in 2014.
- Seniors Rachel Schwaab and Megan Tiernan have combined for an impressive 74 total points this season, leading the way for the Owls' offense. Schwaab has tallied 26 goals and 14 assists, while Tiernan has 22 goals and 12 assists.
- Temple and Kakalecik have held opponents to just 6.86 goals per game, ranking ninth among all teams in NCAA Division I.
- Tiernan has notched five hat tricks already this season, while Schwaab has three. Seniors Kirstie Connor and Brenda McDermott along with junior Morgan Glassford are all tied for third on the team with 18 goals apiece. McDermott's 15 assists lead the team and give her 33 points to rank third on the team.
- Glassford, twice named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll already this season, has recorded 62 draw controls to lead the Owls and rank second all-time in a single season at Temple. Her 4.43 draws per game lead all players in the BIG EAST and rank 16th in the country.
- Senior midfielder Nicole Tiernan was a unanimous selection to the 2016 Preseason All-BIG EAST Team. The Owls were picked to finish sixth of eight teams in the conference in the preseason poll. Tiernan leads the team in caused turnovers (16) and ranks second in ground balls (21) and sixth in goals (16).
- The Owls are looking to make their first appearance in the BIG EAST Tournament since joining the league as an associate member in 2014. The four-team tournament will be hosted by Georgetown in Washington, D.C. on May 5 and 7.
- The Owls lead Villanova 8-1 in the all-time series, losing for the first time by a narrow score of 9-7 last season. Temple beat the Wildcats 12-10 in 2014.

TEMPLE LACROSSE

LAST TIME OUT: MARQUETTE 12, TEMPLE 10

- After a three-goal halftime lead, Temple fell victim to a huge run by Marquette in the second half and the Owls' late comeback attempt fell short in a 12-10 loss.
- The Golden Eagles (5-9, 2-2) ran off seven straight goals in the second period before Temple (9-5, 1-3) was able to score a pair in the final minutes.
- Senior Nicole Tiernan notched her first hat trick of the season for the Owls, while senior Rachel Schwaab and junior Morgan Glassford scored two goals apiece. Senior Brenda McDermott added two assists to a goal for the day. Allison Lane, Amanda Bochniak and Julianna Shearer all recorded a hat trick for the Golden Eagles with three goals apiece.
- Temple trailed 3-0 after six and a half minutes to start the game, but made a quick recovery. The Owls scored the next three to tie it up, including two goals just 14 seconds apart. After briefly trailing 4-3, Temple scored four in a row and five of the last six goals in the half.
- Senior Carly Demato got the 4-0 run started by converting on a free position opportunity at 10:56, and Nicole Tiernan did the same at 7:10. Senior Megan Tiernan assisted on a Glassford goal with 4:29 remaining, and Nicole Tiernan completed her hat trick with 4:11 left in the half to give Temple a 7-4 lead.
- Both teams scored once in the final three minutes of the first half, and the Owls took an 8-5 lead into the break.
- Turnovers were extremely costly for the Owls in the second half. Temple turned the ball over 13 times in the second half compared to seven turnovers by the Golden Eagles, negating the Owls' 7-3 advantage in draw controls. Marquette scored the first of its seven straight goals just over three minutes in, and completed the run with just 5:34 remaining.
- Senior Avery Longstaff finally broke Temple's drought thanks to a pass from McDermott with 4:12 left, and Schwaab was able to add one more with just under two minutes remaining. Senior Kara Stroup corralled the final draw control, but all four of the Owls' last four shots in the game were either blocked or wide.

Head Coach Bonnie Rosen on the Marquette Game

"We just didn't play a very good game today. I think we had some lapses in our transition defense and lapses in our defensive end. We made a lot of unforced turnovers offensively in transitioning the ball. The inability to keep the game simple really hurt us today."

"We have to decide that we're going to do the little things instead of just trying to win games. Our players tried hard but didn't play smart...We gave Marquette too many options to get on a run. When we decided to go after it in the last three minutes we looked a lot better. We're still learning how to finish a season strong, but we need to remember you do that one game at a time and one play at a time."

Hanging With the Best

Temple's results against top teams this season have been a stark contrast to the Owls' scores against the same top teams a year ago. After losing by 14 goals to nationally ranked Florida in 2015, Temple nearly pulled off the upset a couple weeks ago before falling by just a single goal, 10-9 in Gainesville on April 2. The Owls didn't fare much better against UConn last season, losing 18-6. This year, Temple took the Huskies to overtime before falling 9-8 on April 13.

Florida and UConn were picked to finish first and second in the BIG EAST this season, respectively, while Temple was picked to finish sixth.

Couldn't Draw it Up Any Better

Junior Morgan Glassford has corralled 62 draw controls this season, already ranking second all-time in program history for a single season. She needs just two more to tie for first place. Glassford's 4.43 draw controls per game lead all players in the BIG EAST and rank 16th in NCAA Division I. In an 18-3 win over Cal on March 26, Glassford recorded a career-high 10 draw controls for the Owls.

Most Double Digit Wins in 14 Years

Temple has defeated six opponents this season by 10 or more goals, the Owls' most double-digit victories in 14 years. No Temple team had more than two double-digit wins in a season since 2004, and the last time a team had more than six was when the 2002 Owls took down seven opponents by 10 or more goals.

Dominant Senior Class

The Owls' success this season is thanks in large part to a talented, veteran and huge senior class. Temple boasts 13 seniors on its roster of 31, with 11 of those being consistent figures in the starting lineup. Six of the Owls' top seven scorers are seniors, and the defense is also anchored by five seniors including a fifth-year in goalkeeper Jaqi Kakalecik.

Temple in the National Stats

Senior goalkeeper Jaqi Kakalecik currently ranks seventh among all players in NCAA Division I with a goals against average of 6.82, while her save percentage of .492 ranks 14th nationally. Junior midfielder Morgan Glassford ranks 16th in the nation with 4.43 draw controls per game.

As a team, Temple ranks ninth among all teams in NCAA Division I in scoring defense at 6.86 goals per game, while the Owls' scoring margin of 5.36 ranks 13th.
