HEADLINES

 The Owls are 11-5 overall and are coming off back-to-back wins last week that allowed them to keep their BIG EAST Conference Tournament hopes alive.

- Temple must defeat Georgetown in order to earn a spot in the four-team BIG EAST Tournament, set for May 5 and 7 in Washington, D.C. (hosted by Georgetown).

 • Senior <u>Brenda McDermott</u> was named the BIG EAST Attacker of the Week after two outstanding perform-
- ances last week...She totaled a league-best 11 points, notching hat tricks with three goals in both games...She added two assists to her three goals in a 10-7 win at Villanova, and added three assists to three goals in a 10-4 win vs. Cincinnati
- The victory over Cincinnati marked the 150th career win for Temple head coach Bonnie Rosen (10 years at UConn, 10 years at Temple).
- Prior to the Villanova win, Temple suffered back-to-back losses against UConn (in OT) and at Marquette. In the 12-10 loss to Marquette, the Owls surrendered an 8-5 halftime lead after the Golden Eagles opened the second half on a 7-0 run.
- The Owls' other recent loss was a heartbreaking, 9-8 overtime loss to UConn on April 13. Temple made a second-half comeback after trailing 4-1 at halftime, but UConn controlled both draws in overtime.
- When Temple played #2 Florida in its BIG EAST opener on April 2, it was an extremely tight game throughout and the Owls just fell short by a score of 10-9. Two of the Owls' five losses have come to teams ranked in the IWLCA Top 20 (also #16 Louisville, 8-5 on Feb. 12).
- Temple earned a 7-3 win over Vanderbilt on April 9, holding the Commodores without a single goal for over 50 minutes to end the game.
- The Owls won seven in a row early in the season, their longest win streak in 14 years, before falling 10-4 to Delaware on March 16.
- Senior goalkeeper <u>laqi Kakalecik</u>, who has played every minute in the cage this season for Temple, has been named the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week twice this season. Her goals-against average of 6.66 ranks seventh among all players in NCAA Division I, while her save percentage of .486 ranks 18th nationally.
- On April 26, Kakalecik was named the PNC Female Scholar Athlete of the Year at Temple's annual Celebration of Champions. She has a 3.86 GPA as a biochemistry major, and will attend Temple Medical School in the fall.
- Temple has won six games by 10 or more goals. The Owls' 19-goal effort in a 19-9 win at UMBC was the most since a 19-3 win over Cincinnati in 2014.
- Seniors Rachel Schwaab and McDermott have combined for an impressive 87 total points this season, leading the way for the Owls' offense. Schwaab has tallied 29 goals and 14 assists, while McDermott has a team-best 20 assists to go with 24 goals. Senior <u>Megan Tiernan</u> is third on the team in points with 36, scoring 24 goals and adding 12 assists.
- Tiernan has notched five hat tricks already this season, while McDermott has four and Schwaab has three. • Junior Morgan Glassford, twice named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll already this season, has recorded
- 67 draw controls to lead the Owls and rank first all-time in a single season at Temple. Her 4.19 draws per game lead all players in the BIG EAST and rank 19th in the country.
- Senior midfielder <u>Nicole Tiernan</u> was a unanimous selection to the 2016 Preseason All-BIG EAST Team. The Owls were picked to finish sixth of eight teams in the conference in the preseason poll. Tiernan leads the team in caused turnovers (17), is tied for first in ground balls (25) and ranks sixth in goals (17).
- The Owls are looking to make their first appearance in the BIG EAST Tournament since joining the league as an associate member in 2014.
- The Owls lead Georgetown 4-3 in the all-time series, but have lost on the road in each of the last two seasons. Georgetown edged Temple 13-12 last season, and the Owls lost 13-6 the year before.

LAST TIME OUT: TEMPLE 10, CINCINNATI 4

- With her second hat trick in a row along with three assists, senior Brenda McDermott led Temple to a 10-4 win over Cincinnati (4-12, 0-6) on Saturday afternoon, April 23. The Owls (11-5, 3-3), who celebrated their 13 seniors prior to the game, keep their hopes alive for the BIG EAST Conference Tournament.
- Temple's lead was down to just two midway through the second half, but the Owls closed out the game on a 4-o run.
- McDermott scored three of the Owls' first four goals in the game, completing her hat trick with 11:16 remaining in the first half and giving Temple a 4-1 lead at that point. Also scoring in the opening run was senior Nicole Tiernan, whose goal was assisted by McDermott.
- Junior Carly Demato added one more for Temple with 1:14 remaining in the half, sending the Owls into the break with a 5-1 lead.
- The Bearcats got two back in the first five minutes of the second half, with Megan Bell and Skylar DeLemos scoring back-to-back goals within 13 seconds of each other, but Cincinnati would get just one more goal the rest of the way.
- Demato notched her second unassisted goal at 19:47 of the second half, and Cincinnati scored its final goal four minutes later. From there, it was all Temple the rest of the way.
- Seniors Megan Pinkerton and Kirstie Connor both scored on McDermott assists in a two-minute stretch for an 8-4 lead at 8:49. Senior Rachel Schwaab made it 9-4 with 4:29 left, and senior Avery Longstaff scored on a Brooke Williams assist with 3:51 to go for the final tally of 10-4.
- Temple out-shot Cincinnati 25-8 in the game, and got 12 draw controls to the Bearcats' four. Junior Morgan Glassford corralled three of those draws, and is now alone atop the all-time single season draws list in program history with 67 draw controls. Senior Summer Jaros also tallied three draws along with a ground ball for the Owls.
- In the cage, senior goalkeeper Jaqi Kakalecik stopped three Cincinnati shots. The Bearcats' Meg Gulmi finished with eight saves on the afternoon.

Temple Head Coach Bonnie Rosen on the Cincinnati Game

"We've been battling the past couple games, dealing with the runs teams make on us. I think we've gotten a little better each game. Today we just said 'no, we get this done right now.' We talked all week about focusing on the little things and the things you can control, and I was really happy with how people responded and came up with the small things...it allowed us to finish the game strong."

"To have 13 seniors all playing except for Kathryn Skahan, who is out with an ACL tear and is just as much a part of the team from the sideline, is a thrill as a coach. For that group to get on the field and help us get this game in the books, along with the rest of the team joining in, is just a wonderful story."

Senior Day

Last Saturday, the Temple lacrosse program honored a large and extremely talented group of student-athletes as the Owls celebrated Senior Day. This 13-member senior class has been a part of 36 wins over their four years at Temple. The numbers they've compiled are staggering, including 366 goals, 118 assists, 484 total points, 528 ground balls, 458 draw controls, 329 caused turnovers and 297 saves. They have competed for two years in the highly-competitive BIG EAST Conference, finishing sixth last year and in a tie for fourth the year before. Their non-conference results have been even more impressive, as the Owls have gone 16-3 in non-league games over the last two seasons. Between the 13 seniors they have earned a total of four All-BIG EAST Awards in 2014 and 2015, and three Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team Awards in 2013. The group has earned seven IWLCA Academic Honor Roll awards, and three Philadelphia Inquirer Academic All-Area Team awards.

Milestone for Rosen

Temple's win last Saturday against Cincinnati marked the 150th career victory for Temple head coach Bonnie Rosen. She has compiled 82 wins over 10 seasons at Temple, and had won 68 games in her 10 seasons at the University of Connecticut.

Couldn't Draw it Up Any Better

Junior Morgan Glassford has corralled 67 draw controls this season to rank first all-time in program history for a single season. Glassford's 4.19 draw controls per game lead all players in the BIG EAST and rank 19th in NCAA Division I. In an 18-3 win over Cal on March 26, Glassford recorded a career-high 10 draw controls for the Owls.

Most Double Digit Wins in 14 Years

Temple has defeated six opponents this season by 10 or more goals, the Owls' most double-digit victories in 14 years. No Temple team had more than two double-digit wins in a season since 2004, and the last time

a team had more than six was when the 2002 Owls took down seven opponents by 10 or more goals.

Temple in the National Stats

Senior goalkeeper Jaqi Kakalecik currently ranks seventh among all players in NCAA Division I with a goals against average of 6.66, while her save percentage of .486 ranks 18th nationally. Junior midfielder Morgan Glassford ranks 19th in the nation with 4.19 draw controls per game.
