- » Temple has won back-to-back games, getting its first road win of the conference season by holding off Tulane for a 79-71 victory on Jan. 31 and then topping USF at home by a score of 83-74 on Feb. 5.
- » Four players reached double figures in scoring at Tulane, led by freshman Quinton Rose with 18 points and a career-high nine rebounds, while five players scored in double digits vs. USF led by senior Daniel Dingle with a career-tying 22 points.
- » Dingle, who hit a career-best 6-of-7 three-pointers vs. USF, has reached double figures in scoring in 12 of the last 14 games.

 » Temple had its best first half of the season and best in a number of years vs. USF, shooting a season-best 62.1 percent from the
- field. The Owls' 46 points were the most in a first half since 2012, with their 23-point lead being the most since 2010.

 » The Owls started 1-6 in league play but have now won three of their last four, starting with a 77-66 home win over Memphis on
- » The Owls started 1-6 in league play but have now won three of their last four, starting with a 77-66 home win over Memphis on Jan. 25. With a game-high 22 points vs. Memphis, sophomore Shizz Alston, Jr. hit the 20-point mark for a third game in a row and became the Owls' leading scorer this season, now with 14.0 ppg (eighth in the conference).
- » Alston scored a career-high 25 points in back-to-back games vs. Tulsa (Jan. 14) and at #20/20 Cincinnati (Jan. 18).
- » Overall, Temple is 12-1 when scoring at least 70 points, and just 1-10 when they fail to reach that plateau.
- » Temple celebrating Hooter the Owl's birthday on Feb. 5, and remained undefeated all-time with a record of 12-0 since the first time the Owls celebrated their mascot's birthday in the 2005-06 season.
- » The Owls' have faced American rival Cincinnati twice to make it five games this season against nationally ranked opponents. Temple is 2-3 against Top 25 opponents in 2016-17 and will face at least one more in #25/RV SMU on Feb. 9.
- » The Owls were picked to finish sixth of 11 teams for the third straight season, but have consistently improved upon that pick each year, last year winning the conference's regular-season title with a record of 14-4.
- » Temple's home win on Dec. 3, a 70-62 decision vs. Penn, was also its 200th win all-time at the Liacouras Center. The arena, home of Temple Basketball since 1997, is celebrating its 20th season in 2016-17.
- » The Owls erased an 18-point second-half deficit in an 89-86 upset of #25/RV Florida State on Thanksgiving Day behind a career-high 26 points from freshman Quinton Rose and a career-high 22 points from Alston.
- » One day later, Temple earned the NIT Season Tip-Off title with an 81-77 upset of #19/17 West Virginia in the championship game. Four players scored in double figures, led by Enechionyia's double-double of 22 points and 12 rebounds.
- » The Owls have now defeated at least one Top 25 team for 10 straight seasons.

TEMPLE VS. SMU

100/

- » Temple and SMU are meeting for the 10th time with SMU holding a slim, 5-4 edge in the all-time series.
- » The Mustangs won the first meeting of the season just over a month ago, 79-65 in Dallas on Jan. 4.
- » The Owls were the first team to defeat SMU in 2015-16 after an 18-0 start for the No. 8 Mustangs. Temple pulled off the upset at home on Jan. 24, winning 89-80. It was the only meeting between the two teams last season.
- » SMU took three meetings from Temple in 2014-15, winning both in the regular season and taking the Owls out of the American Athletic Conference Tournament in the semifinals. The Mustangs won 60-55 at Temple on Jan. 14 and 67-58 at home on Feb. 19, before winning 69-56 in the tournament. Temple let double-digit leads slip away in all three contests.
- » Prior to meeting as American opponents in 2013-14, the most recent meeting was in 1955-56 when the Owls beat the Mustangs 90-81 in the NCAA Final Four third-place game.
- The first meeting between the teams was in 1937-38, with Temple earning a 53-41 win at the Philadelphia Arena.
- Fran Dunphy faced SMU three times while at Penn, winning in 1989-90 and 1990-91 and losing once in 1995-96.

LAST MEETING: SMU 79, TEMPLE 65 (JAN. 4, 2017 @ SMU)

- » Despite a strong second half, another slow start was too hard to overcome for Temple in a 79-65 loss at SMU. The Owls narrowed a one-time 21-point deficit to nine points in the final minutes, but could come no closer in their third straight loss to open American Athletic Conference play.
- » SMU caught fire down the stretch of the first half, hitting 12 of 19 shots after making just two of its first 11. The Mustangs' largest lead (21 points) came in the opening period, but they again led by 20 with 13 minutes left before the Owls chipped away.
- » Shizz Alston, Jr. and Quinton Rose came up big in the second half with 13 points and 12 points, respectively, in helping the Owls get back in the game. Rose went 5-of-9 from the field (6-of-11 overall) with all five of those buckets coming on the fast break as he recorded a career-high five steals. His final layup put Temple within nine at 1:53, but the Owls could not connect on any of their final five attempts.
- » Tying for team-high scoring honors were Alston and Obi Enechionyia with 16 points apiece, while Rose finished with 14. Enechionyia was back in form after struggling in recent games, playing all 40 minutes and hitting 4-of-9 from long range. Damion Moore led Temple with a career-high seven rebounds, while Alani Moore II led all players with five assists for the Owls.
- » Four players reached double figures for SMU, led by Semi Ojeleye with 19 points and nine rebounds.
- » Temple hit its first three shots of the first half and jumped out to an 8-2 lead as the Mustangs struggled at the start. Enenchionyia's second trey put the Owls up 11-6 at 13:40 of the first half, but it was all SMU from there.
- » The Owls went cold as SMU used runs of 11-0 and 13-0 to show their dominance the rest of the way. The Mustangs' second big run of the first half included three consecutive shots from behind the arc. Temple made just three field goals in the final nine minutes, missing seven in a row before hitting its final two shots in the period.
- » SMU had matched its largest lead of 21 points with 23 seconds remaining, but Enechionyia drained his third three-pointer of the half in the final seconds to make it an 18-point game at the break, 40-22.
- » The Owls turned things around early in the second half, making four three's in a 14-7 run that cut SMU's lead to 11, 47-36 at 16:39.
- » Foul trouble on Temple and solid free-throw shooting for SMU helped the Mustangs go back up by 20 points at the 13-minute mark, but it would be their largest lead the rest of the way. The Owls put together bursts of offense on a couple occasions that kept them within striking distance, and they came within 10 three times before finally getting the margin to single digits in the final minutes.
- » After Rose made it a nine-point game, three Mustangs in a row made just one of two free throws, but Temple missed its final five attempts from the field to end its comeback hopes.

IN ELITE COMPANY

1,883 TEMPLE VICTORIES RANKS 5TH ALL-TIME

Temple's 75-57 victory over Bowling Green on Dec. 31, 2012 put the Owls in elite company. They joined Kentucky, North Carolina, Kansas, Duke and Syracuse with 1,800 wins. Temple Basketball owns a 121-year won-loss record of 1,883-1,047. The Owls' history also includes:

- 50 postseason appearances (32 NCAAs, 18 NITs)
- 2 Final Fours (1956 and 1958) under Harry "The Chief" Litwack
- 5 regional finals in the last 27 years under John Chaney (1988, 1991, 1993, 1999 and 2001)
- 2 NIT Championships (1938 and 1969)
- 2 Naismith Basketball Association Hall of Fame Coaches in Litwack and Chaney.

LAST TIME OUT: TEMPLE 83, USF 74 (FEB. 5, 2017)

- » Thanks to its best first half of the season, Temple had enough cushion to withstand a late USF run and win 83-74 on Hooter the Owl's birthday. Temple remains undefeated on its mascot's special day at 12-0 all-time. Daniel Dingle scored 11 points in each half to tie his career high with 22 overall, also hitting a career-high 6-of-7 three-pointers.
- » Temple built its lead to as many as 27 points early in the second half, allowing the Owls to hold off the Bulls despite a 15-3 USF run later in the game. Nine points was as close as the Bulls could get, a deficit they matched four times in the final two minutes.
- » Dingle led five players who scored in double figures for Temple. Shizz Alston, Jr. scored 14 points while tying his career high with seven assists, and Ernest Aflakpui also scored 14 points (a career high) while pulling down a game-best seven rebounds. Both Obi Enechionyia and Alani Moore II scored 10 points apiece. As a team, the Owls matched their season high with 12 three-pointers.
- » The Owls set the tone early on, jumping out to a 9-0 lead and staying in command the entire first half. They hit eight three-pointers in the period, shooting 50 percent from long range, while also shooting a season-best 62 percent and scoring a season-high 46 points.
- » All eight players on the court scored for Temple in the opening half, led by Dingle with 11 points. Dingle, Alston and Moore all hit multiple trevs, with Dingle making 3-of-4 from long range.
- » USF cut a 15-point Temple lead down to eight with 7:26 remaining, but Dingle then hit back-to-back three-pointers and the Owls led by at least 10 the rest of the way. The Bulls' last points of the period were scored with 5:34 remaining, and Temple got scoring from four different players as the Owls closed out with a 13-0 run to lead 46-23 at the break.
- » Over a minute and 20 second span early in the second half, all five of Temple's points were Aflakpui free throws. He gave the Owls their largest lead of 27 points, 54-27 with 17 minutes left. The lead remained at 20 points or more until USF made up a lot of ground with a 15-3 run from 9:42 to 6:09, coming within 11 points at 68-57.
- » Dingle's sixth three-pointer stopped the run at 5:04, and the teams traded points the rest of the way. Over the final minute and 24 seconds, Alston hit 6-of-6 free throws to keep USF from coming within fewer than nine points.
- » USF's Geno Thorpe was the game's leading scorer with 25 points as he hit 11-of-19 from the field. Thorpe scored 21 of his points in an impressive last 10 minutes.

TEMPLE MEN'S BASKETBALL

Magic Number 70

The numbers don't lie - Temple almost always wins when it can reach the 70-point mark. So far this season, the Owls are 12-1 when scoring at least 70 points, failing only to win at that plateau in their most recent 81-74 loss at #20/20 Cincinnati on Jan. 18. When scoring below 60 points, the Owls' record is 0-5, and they have only once scored below 70 points and won (68-63 victory vs. NJIT on Dec. 17). Shooting at least 40 percent from the field has also been a benchmark, as the Owls are 12-4 when reaching it and just 1-7 when they don't.

Streaking Shizz

After starting the season by hitting just two of his first 18 shots from three-point range, Shizz Alston, Jr. has been very impressive from beyond the arc. Starting with a four-of-eight perfomance from three-point range in the Owls' upset of then-No. 25 Florida State, he has had 13 more games with multiple three-pointers including five games with four or more treys. Over one four-game stretch from 12/3 to 12/13, Alston connected on 9-of-16 3-pointers (.563).

On Jan. 14 vs. Tulsa, Alston hit a career-high five three-pointers, scoring a career-high 25 points on 10-of-20 shooting from the field including 5-of-13 from long range. He matched that effort in the very next game, going 5-of-10 from long range on his way to a second-straight 25-point performance. Alston recorded his third-straight 20-plus point effort in a win vs. Memphis on Jan. 25, hitting 4-of-8 three-pointers on his way to a game-high 22 points. Alston is now the Owls' leading scorer with 14.0 points per game, ranking eighth in the American Athletic Conference.

Sophomore Sensation

Shizz Alston, Jr. is clearly having a tremendous season. One of the most improved players in the conference, Alston is on pace to do something only Mark Macon has achieved. That is to lead Temple in points, assists and steals per game as a sophomore. Macon, who is arguably one of the greatest players in school history, accomplished this trifecta in 1988-89.

Long Range Leaders

With 8.9 three-pointers made per game, Temple leads all teams in the league this season. The Owls have been shooting the long ball especially well of late, making 10 or more three-pointers in six of the last nine games. Temple has made a season-high 12 three-pointers three times (vs. GW/at Cincinnati/vs. USF). Leading the charge are junior Obi Enechionyia (54 three-pointers), sophomore Shizz Alston, Jr. (49 three-pointers) and senior Daniel Dingle (45 three-pointers), who hit 6-of-7 in the USF win.

On the Marl

Senior Mark Williams has been a role player throughout his career at Temple, but has come off the bench to make a big impact in four recent games for the Owls. Williams scored 13 points on 6-of-8 shooting along with pulling down six boards in Temple's win vs. East Carolina on Jan. 7. Four days later at UConn, he connected on 4-of-6 shots including 2-of-3 from long range and finished with 10 points. The games were the first back-to-back double figure scoring contests for Williams in his career. On his birthday (Jan. 25), Williams scored a season-high 15 points including 10 in the final six minutes to help Temple beat Memphis. In Temple's win at Tulane on Jan. 31, Williams made 6-of-10 field goals and finished with 13 points.

Hooter the Owl's Birthday

The annual celebration of Temple mascot Hooter the Owl's birthday was this past Sunday when the Owls hosted USF. Temple continued its undefeated streak on Hooter's birthday and is now 12-0 all-time since the first celebration during the 2005-06 season.

Temple vs. the Polls

For the first time ever in the regular season, Temple defeated back-to-back Top 25 opponents on Nov. 24 and 25 in the NIT Season Tip-Off in Brooklyn. The Owls came back from an 18-point second-half deficit to defeat No. 25/RV Florida State on Thanksgiving Day, and then claimed the tournament title with an 89-86 win against No. 19/17 West Virginia a day later.

Just once before in program history had the Owls taken down back-to-back ranked opponents, doing so in NCAA Tournament play in 2001 when they followed up a first-round win vs. No. 18 Texas (79-65) with a second-round win against No. 8 Florida (75-54).

Temple has now defeated a Top 25 opponent for 10 straight seasons. Last year's Temple team had three regular-season wins over Top 25 teams, the most since 1999-00. The 2015-16 season also marked the first since 1998 that the Owls had beaten two Top 25 opponents on the road. The Owls faced a total of seven Top 25 opponents (including two No. 1 teams) in 2015-16. They have played four ranked teams in a total of five games in the 2016-17 season, going 2-3 in those contests. The Owls will face at least one more Top 25 team when they host #25/RV SMU on Feb. 9.

Home Sweet Home

The Liacouras Center has proven to be a tremendous home court advantage. Since the arena opened its doors in 1997, the Owls have posted a 205-66 (.756) all-time record, and set the record for wins in a single season with 16 in 2014-15.

Last season, the Owls reached the 10-win mark for the eighth time in nine years. Temple is 111-28 (.799) at home since the start of the 2007-08 campaign. To the right is a list of 10-win seasons in the building (bold under Dunphy).

First-Half Domination

Temple's first half in a win vs. USF on Feb. 5 was one for the books. The Owls' 46 points were their most in a first half in five years, since Temple scored 47 first-half points against Xavier on Feb. 11, 2012. The Owls' 23-point halftime lead on USF was its largest in over six years, since they held a 25-point (40-15) lead on Akron at halftime of a contest on Dec. 12, 2010. Temple shot 62.1 percent in the first half vs. USF (18-of-29), its best first-half percentage this season and best since 2013-14.

Autism Awareness

Temple's coaching staff wore blue puzzle piece lapel pins at Sunday's USF game to celebrate the NCAA's 4th Annual Coaches Powering Forward for Autism to benefit Autism Speaks. Spearheaded by NCAA basketball coaches Pat Skerry and Tom Herrion, the program provides coaches, their teams, schools and fans with opportunities to raise awareness and advocate for the needs of people affected by autism. Last season, more than 250 coaches and broadcasters wore the pins. This season, they hope to have over 325 coaches, broadcasters and officials participating including many women's programs.

MLK Day: Giving Back

As it does every year, the Temple men's basketball team gave back to the community in observance of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day on Monday. This year, head coach Fran Dunphy and his players participated in a vision board project for the children in the community surrounding Beckett Life Center, located a few blocks from campus. At the end of the glitter-filled project, the players and the children, ages five through eight, enjoyed a pizza lunch and held a brief dance party.

Early Conference Struggles

Temple began American Athletic Conference play with three consecutive losses including two low-scoring efforts before winning its fourth league game against East Carolina. The Owls shot a season low 26.7 percent from the field in a 56-50 loss to No. 23/23 Cincinnati on Dec. 28 at home, and posted their worst second-half numbers of the season as well, scoring 24 points on 8-of-31 shooting (25.8 percent). The bad luck continued in the first half of Temple's next game at UCF on Dec. 31, as the Owls played one of their worst first halves in years, scoring just 11 points on 4-of-29 (13.8 percent) shooting. Temple rebounded well in the second half for 42 points on 45.7 percent shooting, but was unable to dig itself out of a season-high 27-point halftime deficit.

The Owls' first half at SMU on Jan. 4 was similar, as they found themselves in an 18-point hole at the break after scoring just 22 points. Despite nearly doubling that scoring output in the second half, Temple was unable to get within fewer than nine of the Mustangs. It was a first-half struggle yet again for Temple in a 73-59 loss at UConn on Jan. 11, as the Owls missed 12 straight shots in the opening period and went down 22-9 early on.

Holiday Freebies

In its last two games before the holiday break, both wins, the Owls went an impressive 43-of-48 from the free-throw line (89.6 percent). After hitting 15-of-18 free throws in a win vs. NJIT on Dec. 17, Temple followed it up with its best performance from the stripe in four years, making 28-of-30 free throws (93.3 percent) in a win vs. Yale on Dec. 22. The last time the Owls did better than 93 percent was when they hit a perfect 10-of-10 free throws against St. Bonaventure on Jan. 19, 2013. Freshman Alani Moore II led the way in the Yale win, making his first 10 free throws before finishing at 10-for-11. Senior Daniel Dingle was perfect at the line, going 9-for-9. Sophomore Shizz Alston, Jr. was 6-for-6 against NJIT and 5-for-6 vs. Yale.

NIT Season Tip-Off Champions

Temple won the 2016 NIT Season Tip-Off in dramatic fashion, toppling back-to-back Top 25 opponents at Brooklyn's Barclays Center over the Thanksgiving holiday. The Owls made their sixth trip to the preseason NIT this season, tying for third among all Division I programs. Temple is now 12-5 overall in preseason NIT games, including a 4-0 mark to capture the 1986 title.

The regular season tournament title was the first for the Owls since 1998-99 when they went 2-0 at Madison Square Garden against Georgetown and Wake Forest to win the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.

Temple Wins 200th Game at Liacouras Center

In winning its fifth straight game on Dec. 3 against Penn, Temple also earned its 200th all-time victory at the Liacouras Center. The arena is celebrating its 20th season, since opening as the Apollo of Temple in 1997. Temple has posted a 204-66 (.756) record at the Liacouras Center, and sported a record 25-game win streak from Jan. 6, 2010 thru Dec. 28, 2011.

Six Scorers

Temple had six players score in double figures in its season-opening 97-92 OT win over La Salle (Nov. 11). Daniel Dingle led the way with 21 points. Obi Enechionyia (20), Shizz Alston, Jr. (14), Ernest Aflakpui (12), Quinton Rose (12) and Mark Williams (10) also tallied double digits. The last time a Temple team had six players score 10 or more points was Jan. 9, 2002 in an 85-48 win over Duquesne at the Liacouras Center. Lynn Greer led the way with 22 points with Brian Polk (14), Alex Wesby (13), Nile Murry (12), Kevin Lyde (11) and David Hawkins (10) joining him in double figures.

The Force is With Obi

Junior Obi Enechionyia has reached double figures in scoring in 18 of 24 games this season, and ranks second on the team and 13th in the league with 13.7 ppg. He also ranks among the conference leaders in blocks (5th, 1.7 bpg), three-pointers made per game (5th, 2.3), three-point percentage (11th, .378) and rebounds (17th, 6.0 rpg). He has scored 20 or more points five times, including two career-tying games of 26 points (at UMass on Nov. 17, at Saint Joseph's on Nov. 30).

Stealing from Demons

In Temple's 74-65 win vs. DePaul on Dec. 10 in the Hoophall Miami Invitational, the Owls recorded 11 total steals, the most for the program in over three years. The last time Temple tallied more than 10 steals was in a 12-steal effort vs. Texas in an 81-80 loss at the Wells Fargo Center on Dec. 7, 2013. Leading the way with a huge number vs. DePaul was senior point guard Josh Brown, whose seven steals were a career high and the most for a Temple player since a seven-steal effort by Will Cummings against SMU in February of 2015.

Over 24 games this season, sophomore Shizz Alston, Jr. has proven adept at getting the ball where he wants it. With a team-leading 98 assists to just 34 turnovers, Alston has a 2.9 assist/turnover ratio to rank second in the American Athletic Conference and rank 28h in the nation. If the season ended now, Alston would be sixth all-time on Temple's single-season list for A/TO ratio. Temple Athletics Hall of Famer Pepe Sanchez holds the single-season record for A/TO ratio at 3.86 in 1999-2000.

Howard Evans (1986-89) is the Owls' all-time career leader in A/TO ratio at 3.12. Also on that list is Levan Alston (1994-96), Shizz's father, in ninth place with a ratio of 1.88. With 117 assists to 44 turnovers in 55 games played so far in his career, Shizz Alston would be just behind Evans on the list with an A/TO ratio of 2.66.

Quinton Rose Named American Rookie of the Week for a Third Time

For the third time this season, Temple freshman Quinton Rose was named the American Athletic Conference Rookie of the Week for men's basketball on Jan. 9. Rose also earned the honor twice in November after an impressive start to his debut season. Coming off the bench for back-to-back 14-point efforts, Rose helped Temple to a 1-1 record from Jan. 2-8 including its first conference win against East Carolina on Jan. 7. He added a career-high five steals to his 14 points at SMU earlier in the week, and two more steals in the ECU win. Rose was nearly perfect against the Pirates, hitting 6-of-7 field goals and his only free throw attempt in just 18 minutes of action. For the week, Rose shot 66.7 percent from the field (12-of-18).

Rose averaged 19 points per game in Temple's back-to-back wins over Top 25 opponents Florida State and West Virginia to earn his second conference honor, scoring a career- and game-high 26 points in the Florida State victory. He hit 16-of-19 free throws for the week (.842), coming off the bench in both games but averaging 29 minutes played. Rose's first honor came back on Nov. 14 after he scored 12 points in the Owls' season-opening win vs. La Salle.

Rookie of the Week Honors for Alani Moore II

On Dec. 26, freshman Alani Moore II was named the American Athletic Conference Rookie of the Week. Temple has earned the honor four times this season, with freshman Quinton Rose having been selected three times. Moore scored a career- and gamehigh 26 points in a win against Yale on Dec. 22, hitting his first four three-point attempts (4-of-8 overall) and his first 10 free-throw attempts (10-of-11 overall). He finished 6-of-12 from the field overall, and tied his season-high for minutes played with 37.

20th Anniversary Season for the Liacouras Center

The Liacouras Center, home of Temple Basketball since 1997, is celebrating its 20th season during the Owls' 2016-17 schedule. The arena, originally named the Apollo of Temple, opened on December 9, 1997 when Temple, under the direction of Hall of Fame coach John Chaney, stunned #18 Fresno State, coached by Jerry Tarkanian, 76-61. That win was the first of 14 victories over nationally-ranked programs in the venue.

Rededicated on February 13, 2000, and named in honor of former Temple President, the late Peter J. Liacouras, The Liacouras Center has hosted the 2004 NCAA Women's Basketball First and Second Rounds, the 2005 NCAA Women's Basketball East Regional, and seven NIT games in its history.

Fran Dunphy Earns Second Straight American Coach of the Year Honor

Temple head coach Fran Dunphy was announced as the American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year on March 10, 2016, earning the honor for a second year in a row. Picked sixth in the conference's preseason coaches' poll, Dunphy guided Temple to its eighth 20-win season in his 10-year tenure and the Owls' third regular season conference championship during that span. Dunphy has earned four such honors while at Temple, twice being named the Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year (2010, 2012).

Extra Honors for Ob

Junior Obi Enechionyia was named Player of the Week by the American Conference, Philadelphia Big 5 and NCAA.com on Nov. 28. The NIT Season Tip-Off Tournament MVP, Enechionyia averaged 19 points, 10 rebounds and 5.5 blocks in leading the Owls to consecutive wins over ranked opponents. He shot 15-of-26 from the field (.577) and 7-of-10 from three-point range. Enechionyia also blocked a career-high six shots vs. #25 Florida State, and played 78 of possible 80 minutes over the two games.

Mascot Double Trouble: Hooter and Stella

Temple Athletics has both a traditional and a live mascot cheering on its teams, as Hooter the Owl and Stella can both often be found on the sidelines. To honor Temple's beginning as a night school for ambitious young people, the nocturnal owl was adopted as its mascot. The owl represents wisdom and knowledge and is known for being perceptive, resourceful and courageous. Hooter the Owl is a part of Temple's Spirit Squad, making appearances games, alumni events and more. Each February, mascots from all over the city of Philadelphia come to Temple to celebrate Hooter's birthday at a home basketball game, which will take place this season on Saturday, Feb. 25 against Tulane.

Stella, a great horned owl, began her career as Temple's live mascot in 2013. Though she's small—just 2 feet tall and only 3 pounds—Stella is a mighty predator, with an impressive 60-inch wingspan and talons capable of crushing prey with 28 pounds of force per square inch. She currently resides in the Elmwood Park Zoo in Norristown, Pa., where she also is a wildlife conservation teacher. Stella originally hails from Washington state. Her favorite foods include rodents, rabbits and snakes.

Second-Half Explosion

In Temple's come-from-behind, 89-86 win against #25/RV Florida State on Nov. 24, the Owls scored a whopping 58 points in the second half. That total is the most in any half of basketball for Temple in nearly three years, since a 61-point second-half performance in a 101-65 win at LIU Brooklyn on Dec. 21, 2013.

Handle With Care

Temple has proven adept at handling the ball in each of the last two seasons, ranking in the top 10 nationally in fewest turnovers. In 2015-16, Temple ranked second in the nation in fewest turnovers overall at 305, and ranked third in the nation with just 9.2 turnovers per game. During the 2014-15 season, the Owls led the league and ranked eighth among all Division I teams at the end of the season with 9.5 turnovers per game. So far in 2016-17, the Owls are averaging 11.7 turnovers per game. Temple led the nation in fewest turnovers 11 times under Hall of Fame head coach John Chaney. (n.b. - NCAA records only date back to the 1993 season).

One of 25 active NCAA Division I coaches with 500 victories, Fran Dunphy is in his 11th season at the helm of the Temple men's basketball program in 2016-17. The all-time winningest coach in Philadelphia Big 5 history, Dunphy is also just the fifth coach

to win 200 games at two different Division I programs while also taking both schools to six or more NCAA Tournaments. He has joined Lou Henson (New Mexico, Illinois), Rick Pitino (Kentucky, Louisville), Eddie Sutton (Arkansas, Oklahoma State) and Roy Williams (Kansas, North Carolina) in this elite club.

A part of Big 5 Basketball for the last six decades, Dunphy starred at La Salle as a player (1967-70) and served on the Explorer staff as an assistant coach before embarking on a 17-year stint as the head coach of the Penn Quakers (1989-06). He became the first person to serve as the head men's basketball coach at two Philadelphia Big 5 institutions when he took over the reins of the Temple program from Hall of Fame coach John Chaney on April 10, 2006.

All he has done at Temple is win. Having earned back-to-back American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year honors in 2014-15 and 2015-16, Dunphy ranks third on the school's all-time coaching win list with a 227-131 record while guiding the Owls to seven NCAA Tournaments, five conference titles and a trip to the 2015 NIT Semifinals in his 10 years at the helm. His Temple teams have defeated seven Top 10 teams in his tenure and have appeared in the Top 25 during 24 weeks.

Dunphy recorded his historic 500th coaching win in impeccable fashion during the 2014-15 season by knocking off Memphis, 80-75, in the American Athletic Conference Quarterfinal round on March 13. His overall record stands at 537-294 which includes 17 20-win seasons, 16 NCAA Tournament appearances, 14 conference championships, eight Big 5 titles and one NIT trip.

Named Philadelphia Big 5 Coach of the Year in four of his 10 seasons at Temple, Dunphy led his second Owl squad on a late-season run to the Atlantic 10 Championship. He guided the Cherry and White to a 21-13 overall mark in 2007-08, including a second place A-10 regular season finish with an 11-5 conference record. He followed that by directing his charges in 2008-09 to a 22-12 record, 11-5 in league play, and another conference championship.

The 2009-10 season is one that will go down as one of the best in Temple lore. Picked tied for fifth in the A-10 preseason poll, Dunphy motivated his charges to their first A-10 regular season title (9th overall) since 2002 with a 14-2 record. The 2010 A-10 and NABC District Coach of the Year brought the Owls back into the national spotlight with the program's first national ranking since 2001, with the team staying in the polls for 13 consecutive weeks. His Owls would go on to become just the second A-10 team to win three consecutive conference championships while also posting just the fifth perfect Philadelphia Big 5 season in the program's history.

The number one accomplishment achieved by the 2009-10 Temple team, that finished the season with a #12 ranking in the Associated Press poll, was its 29 victories (against six defeats), which ranks third in the school's history.

In 2010-11, Dunphy led the Owls to a 26-8 record, including another 14-2 mark in A-10 play, and a fourth straight trip to the NCAA Tournament. This time the Owls, the 7-seed

in West Region, defeated 10th-seeded Penn State, 66-64, in the second round for the program's first NCAA win since 2001. The Cherry and White game second-seeded San Diego State all they could handle in the next game before falling to the #5/6-ranked Aztecs, 71-64, in double-overtime.

It was a great season for Temple as the Owls were ranked among the nation's Top 25 for eight weeks during the season, climbing as high as #19 in the January 10 Associated Press poll. The Owls also overcame mid-February injuries to two starters, closing the season with seven wins in their final 10 games. The only losses in that stretch came to NCAA Sweet 16 participants Duke, Richmond and San Diego State.

In 2011-12, despite losing projected starter Scootie Randall for the season and center Micheal Eric for 13 games, Dunphy guided his charges to a 24-8 mark and the program's first outright A10 regular season title since 1989-90. The Owls finished 13-3 in league play and Dunphy earned his second A10 Coach of the Year honor for his efforts. Temple defeated #3/3 Duke to mark its fourth straight season with a win over a Top 10 opponent, and later cracked the national polls for the third straight year.

Temple, which also shared the Big 5 title, earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament for the second straight season, and was the fifth-seed in the NCAA Midwest Region.

In 2012-13, Dunphy again guided the Owls to another 20-plus win campaign with the Cherry and White becoming one of eight teams to compete in the last six straight NCAA Tournaments. Temple also knocked off a Top 10 team, this time #3/3 Syracuse, 83-79, at Madison Square Garden (12/22/12) to extend its current nation's best record to five straight seasons of defeating a Top 10 foe while being unranked at the time.

Temple would finish the campaign with a 24-10 record, advancing to the third round of the NCAA Tournament before narrowly falling to top-ranked Indiana, 58-52. The Owls capped their final season in the Atlantic 10 Conference with a thrilling 84-76 win over #19/21 VCU on CBS to finish tied for third in the league with an 11-5 record.

The program struggled in 2013-14, its first season in the American Athletic Conference. In a classic rebuilding year, the Owls posted a 9-22 record. The Cherry and White did continue its streak of wins over a nationally-ranked program to seven with a 71-64 upset over #23 SMU.

In 2014-15, Dunphy led his team to the best turnaround among all Division I teams, posting 17 more wins than the previous season to finish at 26-11 overall and 13-5 in the conference. A signature win over #10 Kansas was among the total as the Owls posted a 77-52 victory over the Jayhawks at the Wells Fargo Center (12/22).

The Owls finished the regular season 23-10, but were surprisingly left out of the NCAA Tournament. As the #1 overall seed in the NIT, Dunphy, in his time coaching in the tournament, guided Temple to wins over Bucknell, George Washington and Louisiana Tech to reach the semifinals, before falling to Miami at Madison Square Garden.

Dunphy was named American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year, marking his third conference coach of the year honor (A-10: 2010, 2012). He also joined Chaney (516) as one of only two coaches to win 500 or more games at Big 5 schools

Defying expectations yet again in 2015-16, the Owls were picked to finish sixth in The American but instead Dunphy led his team to a 14-4 record and an American Athletic Conference Regular Season Championship. Temple fell to conference tournament champion UConn in the semifinals, but was awarded a 10 seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Owls took seventh-seeded lowa to overtime before falling 72-

70 in their NCAA First Round game. Dunphy was named the American's Coach of the Year for a second year in a row, as well as the NABC District Coach of the Year.

One of the most respected coaches in the nation, Dunphy has coached eight Conference Players of the Year, three Conference Rookies of the Year, five perfect Conference seasons and 54 All-Conference honorees.

Prior to joining Penn's coaching staff, Dunphy served as an assistant under Speedy Morris at his alma mater, La Salle University (1985-86 through 1987-88). The Philadelphia native's coaching career began at the United States Military Academy (1971-72), where he served as an assistant under head coach Dan Dougherty. In 1975, he became head coach of his high school alma mater, Malvern Prep. He remained there until becoming Lefty Ervin's assistant at La Salle University (1979-80).

The following year, Dunphy joined current Maryland head coach Gary Williams' staff at American University. He served as an assistant two seasons under Williams, and the final three years under Ed Tapscott, the former head coach of the NBA's Washington Wizards (2008-09). He returned to La Salle in 1985, serving one more season under Ervin and assisting Morris for two seasons. He left La Salle to become Tom Schneider's assistant at Penn in 1988.

In 1989, Dunphy was named the 16th head coach at Penn. He would compile a 310-163 overall record in his 17-year career. His Quaker teams won an unprecedented 48 straight Ivy League games and four league titles from 1992 through 1996. His 1993-94 team posted a 25-3 record and earned a Number 25 ranking in the CNN/USA Today Coaches' Poll, the program's first such ranking since the 1978-79 campaign. That year also included a 90-80 first round upset of sixth-seed Nebraska in the NCAA Tournament.

In his last eight seasons at Penn, Dunphy guided the Quakers to six Ivy League titles and a 93-19 league record. From 1999-2001, he led Penn to 25 straight league wins, including a perfect 14-0 mark in 1999-2000. In 2001-02, Dunphy's Quakers posted a 25-7 record and won the school's first outright city-series title with a perfect 4-0 mark since 1973-74.

A full-time educator on and off the court, Dunphy is in his eighth year teaching in Temple's prestigious Fox School of Business. He is team-teaching an honors course with Dr. Lynne Anderson, entitled, Management, Theory & Practice: From the Locker Room to the Board Room. He previously had served as a lecturer in the Wharton Executive Education program and in the management department of the Wharton School.

Dunphy is one of the leaders in the local Coaches vs. Cancer campaign and was named to the National Council of Coaches vs. Cancer. He was also honored as the 2002 National Coaches vs. Cancer Coach of the Year for his service and tireless dedication to those in need. On September 23, 2008, he joined four other coaches to speak to legislators on Capitol Hill on the need for more funding for cancer research.

The Owl mentor also devotes time to Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Greater Philadelphia's Board of Directors, and his Penn and Temple teams have participated in the Big Brothers/Big Sisters program each year. He is also a member of the Philadelphia CYO Hall of Fame.

A 1970 La Salle graduate with a degree in marketing, Dunphy was an outstanding player under Explorers' head coach Tom Gola. As a junior, he helped the Explorers to a 23-1 record. He served as a co-captain his senior year when he averaged 18.6 ppg and led the team in assists, while also being named the MVP of the annual Quaker City Basketball Tournament. In 1979, he earned a Master's degree in counseling and human relations from Villanova University.

Dunphy and his wife, Ree, reside in Villanova, Pa., with their son, J.P. $\,$

Mr. Big Five

Temple head coach Fran Dunphy is synonymous with the Philadelphia Big 5. Dunphy, who lived his first 10 years in Southwest Philadelphia before moving to nearby Drexel Hill, Pa., starred at La Salle from 1967 through 1970. He would later serve as an assistant at his alma mater (1979-80; 1985-88) before taking the assistant coaching job at Penn for the 1988-89 season. After one season he would take over as the Quakers head coach, compiling a 310-163 record in 17 seasons. He is now in his 11th season at Temple. He received a master's degree in counseling from Villanova, and currently resides in Villanova, Pa.

A Man For All Causes

Dunphy has been a major contributor of his time and energy to the American Cancer Society through Coaches vs. Cancer. He has spearheaded the local efforts of the six DI coaches that have led to raising over \$1 million to benefit the American Cancer Society. Named the Coaches vs. Cancer National Coach of the Year for his efforts, Dunphy has helped to steer events in the area such as the Coaches vs. Cancer Golf Outing; the Coaches vs. Cancer BasketBall; coordinated open practices with the six area teams and holding a March Madness Breakfast to raise awareness for the cause. He was honored in 2008 as a local hero by Bank of America for his role with Coaches vs. Cancer.

Another cause that Dunphy champions is Big Brothers/Big Sisters. The Owl coach devotes his time to Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Greater Philadelphia by serving on the organziation's Board of Trustees. His Penn teams participated in Big Brothers/Big Sisters programs each year during his tenure at the school. His Temple teams have been actively participating in the program the past three seasons.

Dunphy is also a member of the Philadelphia CYO Hall of Fame.

Moving Up

With a win vs. Tulsa on Feb. 4, 2016, Fran Dunphy earned his 206th victory at Temple and moved into third place on the all-time Temple coaching win list, surpassing James Usilton, Sr. (205, '26-39). Hall of Fame coach John Chaney (516, '82-06) tops the list followed by fellow Hall of Famer Harry Litwack (373, '52-73). Dunphy is now 227-131 ('06-present).

A-10 Success

Under Dunphy, the Owls won the outright A-10 regular season title in 2011-12 for the first time since 1989-90. During Temple's years in the A-10 under Dunphy, the Owls went 80-32 in A-10 play and won three A-10 Championships (2008, 2009, 2010)

Fran Dunphy Participating in the 2017 Infiniti Coaches Charity Challenge

Temple's head men's basketball coach Fran Dunphy is not only a champion on the court but also in the community. The 2002 Coaches vs. Cancer National Coach of the Year gives his time and effort to many charities so it comes as no surprise that he was one of 48 coaches selected to compete in the 2017 Infiniti Coaches Charity Challenge.

Infiniti announced on Jan. 2 that it will once again sponsor the "Infiniti Coaches' Charity Challenge" as part of its partnership with the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), the NCAA and ESPN. Now in its sixth year, the program consists of 48 NCAA® Division I men's basketball coaches competing for fan votes in a four-round contest that helps raise money for charities of the coaches' choice.

Infiniti, an official corporate partner of the NCAA, has pledged to make donations throughout the competition totaling over \$345,000. The farther the coaches advance in the competition, the more money is raised for their respective charities. The winning coach will receive \$100,000 to benefit his charity of choice. Beginning January 2, fans will decide who the winner is over a 10 week period, casting votes on a custom online microsite at www.espn.com/infiniti. Voters can cast one vote per day for a coach's charity.

The first round of voting takes place January 2 and runs through January 22, with half of the coaches advancing to a second round, held between January 23 and February 12. From February 13 to February 26, the 16 advancing coaches from round two will compete in a third round where only four coaches advance to the final, fourth round. From February 27 to March 12, fans can vote for one coach per day with the top vote-getting coach and charity announced on March 12, 2017.

Lynn Greer Having a Hall of Fame Year

Temple men's basketball great Lynn Greer (1997-2002) was inducted into the Temple Athletics Hall of Fame in September, 2016, and will be inducted into the Philadelphia Big 5 Hall of Fame in April, 2017. Greer ended his career as the program's second all-time leading scorer with 2,099 points. The 6-1 guard turned in one of the best offensive season ever in Temple men's basketball history as a senior in 2001-02. That year he averaged 23.2 points, scoring 719 points (3rd on the TU single-season list), while earning first team all-conference, all-district and Philadelphia Big 5 Most Valuable Player honors. The Philadelphia native (Engineering and Science HS) also set still-standing school records for single-season three-point accuracy (.472) and career free throw percentage (.852). Temple's all-time leader in games played (137), Greer was a member of four NCAA teams, including two Elite Eight trips (1999, 2001), and one NIT Final Four (2002) in his career. Upon graduation, he played one season in the NBA and went on to a 12-year professional career overseas.

Temple Football Champions

With a 34-10 win against Navy in the American Athletic Conference Football Championship on Dec. 3, Temple football earned its first-ever conference championship and became Temple's first team tournament champion in The American since the league formed in 2013-14. The Owls, currently ranked 24th in the AP Poll, finished at 10-4 overall with a 34-26 loss to Wake Forest in the Military Bowl on Dec. 27.

Temple Picked to Finish Sixth in the American Athletic Conference

For the third straight season, Temple was picked to finish sixth in the annual American Athletic Conference men's basketball poll. Temple fans are hoping that the Owls again prove this ranking wrong. In 2015-16, the team won the American Athletic Conference with a 14-4 league record while the previous season, also picked sixth, Temple tied for third with a 13-5 conference mark. In a very tight poll, Cincinnati was the preseason favorite to win The American, earning six of the 11 first-place votes and 95 points. UConn was picked to finish second with five first-place votes. With 95 points, the Huskies were just one point behind the Bearcats. SMU was next with 76 points, followed by Houston (75), Memphis (63), Temple (56), East Carolina (39), UCF (37), Tulsa (34), USF (25) and Tulane (11).

Career Night in Season-Opening Overtime Win

Temple's 97-92 season-opening, overtime win against La Salle was thanks to double-digit scoring performances by six players and a number of career-bests. Leading the way was senior Daniel Dingle with a then-career-high 21 points along with a career-high three steals and a career-tying five assists. Junior Obi Enechionyia added a career-high 14 rebounds to 20 points, while sophomore Ernest Aflakpui scored a career-high 12 points and tied his career high with 10 boards. Sophomore Shizz Alston, Jr. put up then-career-highs of 14 points, six rebounds, six assists and three steals.

Two true freshmen combined for 20 points, with Quinton Rose coming off the bench for 12 points and Alani Moore II scoring eight. Temple's 97 points were its most in close to three years, since a 101-65 win at LIU Brooklyn on Dec. 21, 2013.

Going OT

Temple is 59-49 all-time in overtime games and 17-6 in head coach Fran Dunphy's 11 seasons at the helm. The Owls' OT win over La Salle on Nov. 11 was their first overtime game in a season opener (fourth overall) since a 73-67 victory over Penn at the Palestra on Nov. 14, 2011. It was also the ninth time the two Big 5 rivals have played an overtime game. La Salle now ties Saint Joseph's as Temple's most frequent overtime opponent. Temple is 6-3 all-time against La Salle in overtime games.

Mastering the Classroom

Redshirt senior Daniel Dingle not only excels on the court, but in the classroom. The Bronx native earned his bachelor's degree in Adult and Organizational Development in December, 2015, and is now working on his master's degree in Educational Leadership this year. Many other Temple players have taken graduate level courses during Temple coach Fran Dunphy's tenure. Jimmy McDonnell, the 2014 American Athletic Conference Scholar Athlete of the Year, earned his master's degree in Engineering Management while still a member of the Temple men's basketball team in 2015. Dion Dacons returned to Temple and earned his master's degree in 2008 while serving as a graduate manager, and current graduate manager Luis Guzman is on track to complete his work on his master's degree in 2017. T.J. DiLeo finished his master's degree in the fall of 2013.

John Baum Inducted into Mid-Atlantic Conference Hall of Fame

John Baum, one of Temple's all-time great men's basketball players and currently its radio color analyst, was inducted into the Middle Atlantic Conference (MAC) Hall of Fame in May. Baum was part of the 20-member class, featuring male and female student-athletes from all sports teams sponsored by the league. A three-time all-Philadelphia Big 5 selection, Baum is one of five Temple players to score over 1,000 points and grab 1,000 rebounds. He tallied 1,544 points, currently 14th on the school's all-time list, with his 17.9 scoring average ranking sixth. His 1,042 rebounds stood as the school record for 42 years until Lavoy Allen, currently with the NBA's Indiana Pacers, eclipsed the mark in 2011. Playing only three seasons, Baum compiled a 12.1 rebound average, good for third best in school annals.

TEMPLE MEN'S BASKETBALL

For Three

Temple has made at least one three-pointer in 697 consecutive games. The last time the Owls did not make a three-pointer in a game was February 1, 1996. Temple missed all 16 three-point attempts that day in dropping a 59-35 decision to #1 UMass at McGonigle Hall. In 2015-16, Temple led the American Athletic Conference with 7.7 three-pointers made per game.

On the Radio

For the 16th straight year, Temple men's basketball is being broadcast live on 1210 AM WPHT. All the Owls' games will be carried on the radio with Harry Donahue handling play-by-play and John Baum providing color commentary.

Dunphy Names Captains for the 2016-17 Season

Head coach Fran Dunphy named seniors Josh Brown, Daniel Dingle and Mark Williams the captains for the 2016-17 season. "These young men have been with the program their entire careers and each provides a different leadership style that will bode well for our success," said Dunphy, the American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year the last two seasons. "They are all quality individuals who lead by example, on and off the court."

Brown was the starting point guard on last year's American Athletic Conference regular season championship team. His 161 assists last season rank 10th on Temple's all-time single season list while his 3.5 assist-to-turnover ratio topped the conference and ranked 10th nationally. Dingle, a redshirt senior guard/forward, started 13 games down the stretch for the Owls last season. He averaged 4.4 points and 2.8 rebounds while playing 20.8 minutes per game. Williams, one of the team's top front court reserves the last three seasons, has provided a consistent presence off the bench with a 3.8 scoring average over 92 career games.

Men's Basketball Earns 2015-16 American Conference Team Academic Excellence Award

In July, Commissioner Mike Aresco announced the 21 teams recognized with 2015-16 Team Academic Excellence Awards for having the highest collective grade-point averages in each conference sport. Temple men's basketball finished the year with the highest GPA among the conference's 11 teams, and the Owls' volleyball team was also honored.

The selections are made by the conference's Academic Affairs Committee. The winners were chosen based on the 2015-16 gradepoint average of each student-athlete who appeared on an institution's roster as of the last contest of the championship segment in each conference-sponsored sport.

The list of award winners includes six teams that won regular-season or conference championship titles in 2015-16, including both of last year's regular-season champions in basketball. UConn's women's basketball team, which won its fourth straight NCAA championship in an undefeated season, earned the honor, as did Temple's men's basketball team.

The Battle of Broadcasters

During last season's Temple road game at USF, there was a historic event going on simultaneously on the University's main campus. The "Battle of Broadcasters," a contest to pick two Chinese students to be Mandarin-language broadcasters for Owls' men's basketball games, came to a conclusion. The contest involved the five finalists each getting a shot at providing play-by-play and analysis of the Temple-USF game in Mandarin. The winners, listed below, did their first audio broadcast in Mandarin for the Tulsa game on Feb. 4, 2016 and continue to do broadcasts and highlight videos for Temple games.

Meet the "Battle of the Broadcasters" winners:

James Yuan, Fox School of Business '19

Went to high school in California and Connecticut. Played varsity basketball in high school—was only Chinese player in league. Lived with high-school coach who taught him ins-and-outs of NCAA sports. Emcees Chinese Student Scholars Association events. Wanted to win the contest to help other Chinese students understand sport's rules.

Javi Yuan, School of Media and Communication '19

Wants to be a sportscaster—calls it his dream. Provides commentary on Chinese game-streaming website; has 2,000 followers. Played high-school basketball.

Comeback Kids

Three times last season and once already this season, Temple was down by 10 or more points in the second half and came back to win the game. All three games last season occurred in the month of February, starting with the Owls' first meeting against Tulsa at home on Feb. 4. They trailed by 12 with 10 minutes remaining before coming back to win 83-79 in overtime. One week later, Temple again trailed by 12 at home against UConn before coming back to win 63-58 on Feb. 11. The third time the Owls achieved a big comeback was at Houston on Feb. 21. They were down by 10 at 11:05 of the second half and used a late push to win 69-66.

On Thanksgiving Day this season against No. 25 Florida State in the NIT Season Tip-Off, Temple trailed by 18 points in the second half before coming back to win 89-86.

2017 Gildan Charleston Classic Field Announced

The Gildan Charleston Classic has set the eight-team field, which includes Temple, for the 2017 tournament to be held Thursday, Friday and Sunday, Nov. 16, 17 and 19, at TD Arena in Charleston, S.C. The rest of the field includes Auburn, Clemson, Dayton, Hofstra, Indiana State, Old Dominion and Ohio. The Charleston Classic appearance will be the third for the Owls, who went 2-1 in both 2008-09 and again in 2012-13. Fellow 2017 participant Clemson beat Temple 76-72 in the championship game of the tournament in 2008, and Clemson also played in the championship game in 2013. Both Temple and Dayton were 2016 NCAA Tournament teams, with Dayton playing as a No. 7 seed and Temple as a No. 10 seed. Hofstra was a No. 5 seed in the 2016 NIT.

Patch of Honor

Four Temple men's basketball players, Ernest Aflakpui, Daniel Dingle, Obi Enechionyia and Ayan Nunez deCarvalho, will wear patches on their uniforms to signify academic success. Part of the newly-created Owl Scholar Program, the patches are adorned to the uniforms of all returning student-athletes who have completed a Temple degree program or who have achieved a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above before their season begins, and for those who earned a GPA of 3.0 or above from the previous semester. At the start of the 2016 fall semester, 250 Temple student-athletes (73% of those eligible for the program) had earned patches.

Trey Lowe to Redshirt the 2016-17 Season

Sophomore guard Trey Lowe will redshirt the 2016-17 season. He is in the process of rehabbing from injuries sustained in a car accident on Feb. 28, 2016. "After consultation with our medical team, Trey and his family, the decision has been made for Trey to redshirt the 2016-17 season," said head coach Fran Dunphy. "We all feel that this is in the best interest for Trey, as a person, a basketball player and a student. We feel at this time that concentrating on his rehabilitation this year will give him the best chance to come back strong and healthy for 2017-18. Trey will still be a big part of the team during this redshirt year, while continuing to work with our medical and strength team in preparation for his full return to action."

The 2015 first team all-State selection out of Ewing High played in the Owls' first 28 games, making five starts during the 2015-16 season. He was the Owls' sixth leading scorer at 4.8 points per game, and tallied a team and career high 21 points against #1 Villanova on Feb. 17.

20/20 Vision

Temple recorded its 36th 20-win season in 2015-16. It marked the eighth time (in 10 seasons) that head coach Fran Dunphy led the Owls to a 20-win campaign. From 2007-13 Temple recorded six straight 20-win seasons, tying the program record for consecutive 20-win seasons, set under Hall of Fame head coach John Chaney (1995-01). Chaney posted 15 20-win seasons (24 seasons) while fellow Hall of Fame coach Harry Litwack compiled eight (21 seasons).

Trey Lowe at the Learfield Intercollegiate Athletics Forum

Sophomore guard Trey Lowe took part in "The Student Athlete Perspective" panel at the Learfield Intercollegiate Athletics Forum on Wed., Dec. 7. The event took place at the Marriott Marquis in New York City and was part of a two-day forum on intercollegiate athletics. Lowe, who is redshirting this season while recovering from injuries suffered in a car accident last February, was one of five panelists. The purpose of the panel was to showcase student-athletes who represent the high levels of achievement, serving as an inspiration to future generations. Jack Ford, a former Yale football player and current legal analyst and correspondent for CBS News, served as the moderator.

Men's Basketball Announces High Profile Four-Star Recruiting Class

Four ESPN.com four-star men's basketball recruits signed National Letters of Intent to attend Temple. Justyn Hamilton, a 6-10, 190-pound power forward out of Independence High (Charlotte, N.C.), Nate Pierre-Louis, a 6-4, 185-pound shooting guard out of Roselle Catholic High (Jersey City, N.J.), J.P. Moorman, a 6-7, 205-pound small forward out of Greensboro Day School (N.C.) and De'Vondre Perry, a 6-6, 220-pound small forward out of Polytechnic Institute (Baltimore, Md.) make up arguably the highest profile class in Dunphy's 11-year tenure at the school.

"These are tremendous young men who we are happy to welcome to the Temple basketball family," said two-time American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year Fran Dunphy. "They fit into our program, not only for their basketball acumen, but because they possess outstanding character and come from great families."

A Southwestern 4A all-conference pick last season, Hamilton averaged 9.6 points, 8.3 rebounds, 4.5 blocks and 1.3 steals as a junior for Independence High. He led the Southwestern 4A in double-doubles with eight and his 130 blocked shots ranked third in the state. Hamilton was twice invited to USA Basketball camps in Colorado with some of the nation's best players in his age group.

After spending time at St. Peter's Prep and St. Benedict's, Pierre-Louis transferred to Roselle Catholic for his junior season (2015-16) where he averaged 13.5 points per game. This summer, playing for Sports U on the Under Armour Association circuit, he averaged 19.2 points, 4.6 rebounds and 2.4 assists per game, leading his team in all three statistical categories.

As a junior at Greensboro Day, Moorman was a first-team HSXtra All-Area selection for private schools. He averaged 13.6 points and 7.7 rebounds per game for Greensboro, which reached the NCISAA Class 3-A semifinals. He was named Most Valuable Player of the HAECO Invitational, where he led his team to the title. He was a key player on Greensboro Day's state championship team in 2015.

Last season, Perry, who transferred to Poly following his freshman season in Edenton (N.C.), averaged 20.4 points, 12 rebounds and 5.1 assists per game. The first-team All-Metro honors after leading the Engineers to their first Baltimore City Division I boys basketball championship in 2016. He also compiled 13 double-doubles as a junior to help the Engineers to a 20-win season.

Entire Temple Slate to be Broadcast on Television

For the first time in history, Temple will have its entire schedule broadcast on television in 2016-17. The Owls will have 19 games televised exclusively by ESPN Networks with an additional seven on CBS Sports Network, four on CSN/TCN and one on FS1.

Ring of Honor

Temple formed a Basketball Ring of Honor to honor the greatest players and staff in the long and storied history of the men's and women's basketball programs. During four home games this season, the men's basketball program honored the following former players and staff with special presentations during halftimes.

November 20: Meyer "Mike" Bloom ('38), Juan "Pepe" Sanchez ('00), Don Shields ('38) and Terence Stansbury ('84).

December 17: Bruce Drysdale ('62), Bill "Pickles" Kennedy ('60) and Jay Norman ('58).

January 7: John Baum ('69) and Jim Williams ('66).

January 14: Former assistant coach Jim Maloney, former Director of Basketball Operations John DiSangro and former basketball secretary Essie Davis.

Triple Threat

Over the first three games, junior Obi Enechionyia scored 20 or more points in each contest, including a career-tying 26 points at UMass on Nov. 17. The last time a Temple player scored 20 or more points in the opening three games of the season was way back in 1987-88 when then-freshman Mark Macon scored 22 points in his debut against UCLA (an 81-76 win for Temple), and followed it up with a 22-point effort against UMass and a 22-point performance against Saint Joseph's. Macon would go on to average 20.6 ppg for the season, earn All-America honors and lead the Owls to a 32-2 record and an appearance in the NCAA Elite Eight.

Making Turnovers for Sunday Brunch

In Temple's win against Manhattan on Sunday, Nov. 20, the Owls forced 22 turnovers off which they scored 26 points. Temple also posted a season-high 10 steals. The last time Temple forced at least 22 turnovers in a game was on March 11, 2011 in a win against La Salle at the Atlantic 10 Tournament.

All-Time Winningest Coach in Big 5 History

With Temple's win at UCF on Feb. 6, 2016, head coach Fran Dunphy surpassed former Owl coach John Chaney to become the all-time winningest coach in Philadelphia Big 5 history. Dunphy, who became the fifth coach to win 200 games at two schools while taking each to six NCAA Tournaments, is the one of nine coaches to have won 200 or more games at a Big 5 school since the city league was formed in 1955. Big 5 History

The Owls earned a share of their 27th Big 5 title in 2012-13, with that total (21 shared, six outright) leading the Big 5. Temple's 136-95 record in city series games ranks second, and the Owls have won four Big 5 titles in head coach Fran Dunphy's 11 seasons. After back-to-back seasons of finishing 2-2 in Big 5 play in 2014-15 and 2015-16, the Owls were runners-up this year with a record of 3-1. They won their season opener 97-92 vs. La Salle, got a 78-72 win at Saint Joseph's on Nov. 30 and a 70-62 victory over Penn at home on Dec. 3. No. 1/1 Villanova claimed its fourth straight city series title with a 78-57 win against Temple on Dec. 13.
