Game 1: Temple (0-0, 0-0) vs. Rutgers (0-0, 0-0)

Piscataway, N.J. | SHI Stadium | September 4, 2021

THIS WEEK

After a disappointing 2020 season, the Owls start this year's campaign with a trip across the Delaware River to take on the Rutgers Scarlet Knights. Kickoff is set for 12:00pm and will air on the Big Ten Network and 97.5 The Fanatic. The former American Athletic Conference foes will play for the first time since Rutgers transferred to the Big Ten.

This week marks the beginning of Rod Carey's third year at the helm for Temple. The Owls enter the season retaining 11 starters from last season, while welcoming in 11 transfers, nine from Power 5 schools. One of those transfers, quarterback D'Wan Mathis, transferred to Temple in December 2020 from Georgia, and was named the starting quarterback towards the end of spring practice. Among the returnees, four single-digit players: wide receivers Jadan Blue and Randle Jones, linebacker William Kwenkeu, and safety Amir Tyler come back for another season to lead the Owls. Two of the other single-digit players DT Daniel Archibong and WR Branden Mack departed for the NFL Draft. Blue and Jones will look to help fill the shoes of Mack with the help of Jose Barbon and Purdue transfer Amad Anderson Jr.

On the defensive side of the ball, incoming transfers on the defensive line Jerquavion Mahone and Will Rodgers can help fill the void left by Archibong. Safety DaeSean Winston returns for the Owls after opting-out of last season due to COVID-19 concerns, while transfers Keyshawn Paul (UConn) and Cameron Ruiz (Northwestern) can help man the secondary.

LAST SEASON

2020 was a season to forget for the Owls as Temple finished with a 1-6 record in a COVID-19 shortened season. While every team deals with injury problems throughout a season, Temple dealt with a special situation last year as the Cherry & White lost 215 man-games due to COVID protocol, injury, opt-out, transfer rules, or suspension. That averages out to over 30 participants per game. Temple played five different quarterbacks and 22 different players for the first time in their careers, which ranked fourth-most behind Army (25), Navy (25), and Air Force (24).

Wide receivers Blue and Mack continued to climb the Temple all-time receiving lists. Mack finished his career ranked sixth in receptions (131), seventh in yards (1,819), and fifth in touchdowns (15). Blue finished last season ranked third in receptions (139), and 17th in yards (1,477). Punter Adam Barry led the American Athletic Conference at season's end in punts inside the 20 with 17.

LAST TIME VS. RUTGERS

The last time that the Owls lined up against the Scarlet Knights was back on November 2, 2013 when Matt Rhule's squad fell by a score of 23-20. This was the last season that Rutgers played in the AAC before transferring to the Big Ten. The game was decided in the final minute as Rutgers QB Gary Nova hit WR Leonte Carroo for the game-winning touchdown. Late in the first quarter, now-Carolina Panthers teammates P.J. Walker and Robby Anderson linked up for a 26-yard touchdown. After exchanging scores across the next few quarters, Temple found themselves at the Rutgers 27-yard line leading 20-16 with under two minutes remaining. However, a failed fourth-down attempt gave the ball back to Rutgers who marched down the field for the game-winning touchdown.

UP NEXT

The Owls will be back in action next weekend when they travel to InfoCision Stadium to take on the Akron Zips. Kickoff will be at 3:30pm and will air on ESPN+.



This Week

FRIENDS TO FOES

This week, the Owls line up against some of their former friends as Rutgers cornerback Christian Braswell, defensive tackle Ifeanyi Majeh, and offensive lineman David Nwaogwugwu transferred to Rutgers from Temple during the offseason. Braswell, Majeh, and Nwaogwugwu played a total of 67 games for the Owls from 2018-20. In addition to the players, Temple's current Associate Special Team Coordinator Dan Sabock worked under Rutgers head coach Greg Schiano for two years (2010-11). Rutgers has some familiarity with Edberg-Olson Hall as Rutgers coaches Fran Brown and Jim Panagos worked at Temple for a combined eight years.

BATTLE OF THE DELAWARE RIVER

Temple will make the hour and a half drive across the Delaware River to SHI Stadium for the Battle of the Delaware River. The Owls have played against the Scarlet Knights 36 times dating back to 1948, with Rutgers leading the series 21-15. However, the battle goes far beyond the playing field as Temple has 22 current players from New Jersey, while Rutgers has 11 current players from Pennsylvania.

NEW TO THE NEST

This offseason, Temple welcomed 11 new transfers to the team, nine from Power 5 schools. The transfers are: Amad Anderson Jr. (Purdue), Ra'Von Bonner (Illinois), Iverson Clement (Florida), Luke Foster (Presbyterian), Xach Gill (North Carolina), Jerquavi-on Mahone (Kentucky), D'Wan Mathis (Georgia), Keyshawn Paul (UConn), Will Rodgers (Washington State), Cameron Ruiz (Northwestern), and Lancine Turay (North Carolina).

HEY, I KNOW YOU!

With the close proximity of Temple and Rutgers comes the obvious crossover between former high school teammates and coaches. Rutgers wide receiver Brandon Sanders played under Temple runnings back coach Gabe Infante for a few seasons at St. Joseph's Prep. Temple CB Nate Wyatt shared the sidelines with Rutgers' Jordan Kinsler and Brendan Shank at St. Joseph Metuchen, while Rutgers DB Alijah Clark and Temple SAF Corey Cuascut-Palmer manned the secondary together at Camden High School.

UGH... YOU AGAIN

This week's meeting between the Owls and the Scarlet Knights marks the 37th all-time meeting between the two sides. This game ties Rutgers with Syracuse as Temple's fourth-most frequent opponent behind Bucknell (45), Penn State (45), and Boston College (38).

GOOD TO BE BACK

The season opener against Rutgers signifies the first time that 11 players on Temple's team will have an opportunity to play in a competitive game since 2019. These players are: Ra'Von Bonner, Nazir Burnett, Shane Hogarth, Jeremy Jennings, Travon King, Ty Mason, Keyshawn Paul, Kwantel Raines, Mariano Valenti, DaeSean Winston, and Tyreke Young. Burnett, Raines, and Valenti were ineligible last year due to transfer rules, while the other eight athletes opted-out or had their season cancelled due to COVID-19.

THE SAY JAY KID



Jaidyn joined the team as the final recruit of the 2020 class by way of Team IMPACT, a non-profit organization that connects children facing serious and chronic illnesses with college athletic teams in a two-year therapeutic program. A Philadelphia native, Jaidyn currently attends Sankofa Freedom Charter School and has been attending virtual team meetings. In the Philadelphia area, Team IMPACT has matched 94 local kids with teams since 2011, and currently has 35 kids matched with teams at 20 colleges and universities, with almost 1,000 student-athletes currently supporting local children.

TEMPLE TUFF

The phrase "Temple Tuff" is synonymous with the fight and grit of Temple's football team. However, it was coined by legendary Temple basketball coach John Chaney whose teams also were noted for their hard-nosed, lunch-pail passion by which they played. An ever-present figure on Temple's campus, Chaney passed away on January 29, 2021.

SUPER SENIORS

This season, three Owls put a new meaning to the term "super senior" as Freddie Johnson, Randle Jones, and William Kwenkeu lace up their cleats for their sixth season. Temple has the second-most such players in the nation (Wake Forest). In total, these three players have played a combined 128 games for the Cherry & White.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND

This year for the first portion of fall training camp, head coach Rod Carey decided to bring the team up to SUNY-Maritime, a college in The Bronx, New York for practices. This is the first time during Carey's time at Temple that he has opted for a remote fall camp, citing an opportunity for team bonding and difficulties with last year's practice regulations due to COVID-19 as the reasons for the decision.

WINNING CULTURE

The Owls went 49-30 from 2014-2019 during which time they did not have a losing season. This marks the longest streak in Temple history. A streak that started with Matt Rhule and extended through Geoff Collins and Rod Carey.

WINNING IS CONTAGIOUS

It's safe to say that Temple football has gone through a resurgence since moving to the American Athletic Conference, and Rod Carey aims to continue that narrative. During his tenure as head coach at NIU, Carey amassed 60 wins from 2012-2019 with an average just over eight wins per season. In Carey's first season at Temple, the Owls went 8-5 and got to a bowl game for the fifth straight season, a school record.

GOING BOWLING

Temple football has been to eight bowl games in the program's history, including a streak of five in a row. The Owls were bowl eligible from 2014-19 under three different coaching staffs. This is the longest streak of bowl eligibility in program history.

UNITED NATIONS

Temple has eight countries represented on this year's roster: Sweden (Isaac Moore, Victor Stoffel), Cameroon (William Kwenkeu), Cuba (Jose Barbon), Liberia (Edward Saydee), Germany (Miles Zietek), Switzerland (Magnus Geers) Turks and Caicos (Yvandy Rigby), and the United States. Temple has the most foreign countries represented in the FBS.

HIGH SCHOOL SWEETHEARTS

Offensive coordinator Mike Uremovich and defensive coordinator Jeff Knowles go back way before either of them began coaching football. The two grew up together and were high school classmates and teammates at Providence Catholic High School in New Lenox, Illinois. The team went on to finish undefeated and win a state championship in 1994.

JUST DO IT.

In the summer of 2020, Temple Athletics signed a three-year deal with Nike which makes it the official outfitter of Temple Athletics. The agreement makes Nike the exclusive athletics footwear, apparel and accessories provider for the football team as well as the other 18 varsity sports.

Rod Carey

SMART, TOUGH, RELENTLESS

Carey, his staff, and the players abide by the mantra: Smart, Tough, Relentless. This attitude not only applies for their preparation and play on the field but in the classroom and in life. Carey wants all of his players to attack their goals on the field and in the classroom under the guidelines of the S.T.R. motto.

A-B-C, IT'S EASY AS 1-2-3

Last season, Rod Carey implemented the A B C system amongst the coaches and players, A-B-C standing for Alternate Ball Coach. Players of different ages, races, and majors were all assigned to a coach other than their position coaches. Players and coaches meet with each other to discuss different perspectives on topics and life in general.

MIDWEST TO THE MID-ATLANTIC

For his entire football career Rod Carey has called the Midwest home. Carey was born in Wisconsin and played center for the Indiana Hoosiers. He began his coaching career at the University of Minnesota and has coached in Wisconsin, Illinois, and North Dakota. Following a successful career in the Midwest, Carey has now made his mark in the Mid-Atlantic at Temple with an impressive first season.

MAC-DOMINATION

In 2012 two things happened, Temple departed the MAC Conference, and Rod Carey began his tenure as head coach at Northern Illinois. Because of the departure, Temple never got a taste of Carey's Huskies, but they were the top dogs in the MAC. Carey and company won four MAC West championships (2013-2015, 2018) and two MAC championships (2014 and 2018.) Carey was the offensive coordinator for the 2012 season when the Huskies won the MAC and was elevated to head coach before they played against Florida State in the Orange Bowl. He was the offensive line coach in the 2011 season when the Huskies won the MAC and had an 11-3 overall record winning the GoDaddy.com Bowl.

OWL SCHOLARS

In an effort to recognize the outstanding academic accomplishments of Temple University's student-athletes, Temple Athletics introduced the Owl Scholars Program in the Fall of 2016. Through team apparel, student-athletes on all of Temple's 19 sports regularly have the opportunity to wear items that represent their athletic lives while on campus or in the classroom; the Owl Scholars Program aims to accomplish the reverse - provide an easily identifiable symbol of academic success for student-athletes to wear on their respective field or court of competition.

The Owl Scholars Patch has been designed to pay homage to the rich history of the Temple

Owls, while invoking images of the infamous speech of Temple University's founder Russell Conwell, Acres of Diamonds. The three stars above the regal owl symbolize the three different ways a student-athlete can earn the honor of having the patch included on their uniform/game warm-up:

- 1) 3.0 semester GPA in previous term
- 2) 3.0 cumulative GPA prior to beginning of semester
- 3) Successfully completed his/her undergraduate degree at Temple

- ___ football players will wear the patch this season.



WATCH THE THRONE

This season, Carey and his staff created a leadership council for the players. The leadership council is used to serve as a medium between the players and coaches. The 14 players on the leadership council are: Nick Bags, Jadan Blue, Evan Boozer, Xach Gill, Randle Jones, Adam Klein, David Martin-Robinson, D'Wan Mathis, Re-al Mitchell, C.J. Perez, Wisdom Quarshie, George Reid, Amir Tyler and Kobe Wilson.

Offense

HE'S D'WAN

Quarterback D'Wan Mathis transferred to Temple in December 2020 after spending two seasons at Georgia under head coach Kirby Smart. During his time at Georgia, Mathis overcame emergency surgery to remove a brain cyst, and made his first collegiate start in the 2020 opener at Arkansas. Since transferring to Temple, Mathis was named the starter towards the end of spring practice.

JADAN IS GIVING THEM THE BLUES

Redshirt junior wide receiver Jadan Blue had a record-setting 2019 season tallying 95 catches for 1,067 yards and four touchdowns, which is statistically the best season in Temple history. The Maryland native followed up that performance with 41 catches and five touchdowns in only six games. This included a career day for Blue in which he caught 13 passes for 120 yards and three touchdowns at Memphis.

FAB FIVE

The Owls have one of the most experienced offensive lines in the FBS as Temple returns 127 starts which ranks seventh-most in the nation. Leading the line is right tackle Michael Niese with 33 career starts. Center C.J. Perez is next in line with 27 career starts, followed by right guard Adam Klein (26), left guard Joseph Hooper (20), and left tackle Isaac Moore (20). Klein and Perez received preseason All-AAC recognition, being named to Athlon's third and fourth teams, respectively.

MR. MARTIN-ROBINSON

David Martin-Robinson became the main tight end for the Owls in 2020. Martin-Robinson started last season off with a bang, catching five passes for 72 yards against Navy before finishing with 11 catches for 147 yards in just four games as the tight end was held out of three games due to COVID-19 protocols.

RE-AL DE-AL

Re-al Mitchell, who some may recognize from Netflix's hit reality show "QB1: Beyond The Lights," transferred to Temple last year from Iowa State. The 6-foot quarterback looked natural on camera, possibly thanks in part to his parents. His mother played "Blaze" in the TV show "American Gladiators" and his father was "Knightmare" in the TV show "Knights and Warriors." In addition to his play on the field, Mitchell has made a point to contribute off the field by volunteering over 35 hours of community service to different causes throughout the past year. Mitchell is currently on the AFCA Good Works Team, Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award, and the Wuerffel Trophy watch lists.

Defense

KNOWLES KNOWS DEFENSE

From the start, both the Temple defense and coordinator Jeff Knowles were on the same page in 2019, as the Owls finished the season ranked seventh in redzone defense. Even though 2020 was a down year for Temple, the defense still managed to lead the conference in fewest first downs allowed (150), which was 16 better than second-place Houston.

WILD BOYZ

Temple's defensive line has been dubbed with the nickname "Wild Boyz" over the past decade and the unit has lived up to the special billing. Two NFL first round draft choices - Muhammad Wilkerson (2011, NY Jets) and Haason Reddick (2016, Cardinals) - and a handful of other pro players have learned their trade at Temple. Six Wild Boyz are currently employed in the NFL: Daniel Archibong (Chicago), Michael Dogbe (Arizona), Matt Ioannidis (Washington), Jacob Martin (Houston), Haason Reddick (Carolina), and Quincy Roche (Pittsburgh). Transfers Will Rodgers and Manny Walker will look to lead a mixed group of experienced and younger players this season.

TYLER²

Safeties coach Tyler Yelk leads the unit for the second consecutive year this season. This marks the first time in Amir Tyler's six-year career that he has retained the same safeties coach for a second year. Arriving at Temple in January 2019, Yelk spent the first year working as a defensive analyst/outside linebackers coach before being moved to safeties in January 2020.

BUBO

A Bubo is a species of owl, considered as the biggest, strongest, and most ferocious. Brett Diersen leads the group for the second year. Former Owl and now Carolina Panthers safety Sam Franklin manned the starting position for the Owls in 2019. Last season, the Owls had a number of players fill his shoes. Now, West Virginia transfer Kwantel Raines hopes to solidify the position once again.

FOLLOWING FOOTSTEPS

Amir Tyler earned his single-digit number in fall camp last season, holding the same honor that his former roommates, Chapelle Russell and Shaun Bradley, once held. Tyler, who also attended the same high school as Russell, will try to follow in his footsteps once again by making it to the National Football League. The graduate will try to build off of a successful 2020 season which saw him record 33 tackles, 1.5 TFLs, and the game-winning final stop on a USF two-point attempt in last season's home opener.

Special Teams

SAY-BLOCK

Last season, Temple finished the year with one blocked kick in the shortened seven game season, marking the first time that a Rod Carey-led team has failed to record at least two blocked kicks since the 2014-15 season. Since 2014-15, Carey-led teams have accumulated 20 blocked kicks, and have recorded three or more in four of the last six seasons. Special Teams Coordinator Brett Diersen and Associate Special Teams Coordinator Dan Sabock looks to keep the streak alive this season.

PUNT, SNAP, AND KICK

The Owls returned both of their specialists from last season along with their long snapper Ronald Gaines. Punter Adam Barry and Gaines handle the punting duties, a unit that averaged 44.0 yards per punt last season which was good for third-best in the conference. Barry has received preseason All-AAC recognition, being named to Athlon's third-team and Phil Steele's fourth-team. Freshman kicker Rory Bell handles the field goals and kickoffs for the Owls.

Miscellaneous

PIPELINE TO THE PROS

In 2020, Rod Carey and his staff developed the 'Pro Series', a program reserved for players in their final year of eligibility who aspire to play in the NFL. The program has a variety of topics, specifically focusing on selecting agents, managing money, preparing for the business side of football, contracts, the scouting process, and expectations from the National Football League's Players Association and NFL scouts.

PREPARING OWLS FOR FLIGHT

While the COVID-19 pandemic wreaked havoc on "regular" football training for the 2020 season, Temple football found ways to be creative. The team held career roundtable discussions featuring former players to educate current players and to help them grow on and off the field. The discussions were designed to help guide the current student-athletes transition to college graduates.

THE SCRIPT - HALL OF FAME

The Script said it best back in their 2012 hit song "Hall of Fame" with the lyrics "Standin' in the Hall of Fame" when describing Temple's 2020 Hall of Fame class. Former Temple head coach Al Golden (2006-10) headlines the class with fellow former Owls Todd McNair (1985-88), Bob Mizia (1973-75), and Joe Morelli (1961-64).

HEAD COACH U

Temple is the only school in the country that can claim two of its former head coaches are now running NFL squads: Matt Rhule (Carolina) and Bruce Arians (Tampa Bay). Arians manned the helm for the Owls from 1983-1988 while Rhule was much more recent, coaching the team from 2013-2016. Including Rhule, Temple has placed five straight head coaches into higher paying jobs: Al Golden, Steve Addazio, Geoff Collins, and Manny Diaz. Ohio State's Ryan Day, one of the top FBS head coaches, was part of the Owls staff for the 2006 and 2012 seasons.

CHA-CHING

On July 1, 2021, the NCAA implemented legislation that gave college athletes the opportunity to sell the rights to their names, images, and likenesses for the first time. Temple football student-athletes have started to test the waters by partnering with various organizations.

UNITED WE STAND

With UConn's departure from the American Athletic Conference before the 2020 season, the conference now has 11 participating members. Because of the uneven number, the American Athletic Conference has decided to go away from the traditional two division format where the East and West winners play against each other at the end of the season. Instead, the top two teams in the whole conference will face off against each other for the Conference Championship.

DID YOU KNOW?

Temple holds an 84-year-old NCAA college football record? In 1937, Temple played in an NCAA-record four scoreless tie games in one season. No school has matched that since.

TEMPLE AT A GLANCE...

Temple is in the 4th largest media market in the country, with over 2.9 million TV homes according to Nielsen. The designated market area (DMA) is 7.6 million.

Temple is located in a region of 6.53 million people, and is only 95 miles from NYC and 120 miles from Washington, D.C. In fact, more than 40% of the US population is within a day's drive from Philadelphia.

Temple is the 26th largest public University in the country with over 41,000 students founded in 1884 and has 404 academic programs including five professional schools of law, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, and podiatry.

Temple is a Research I institution, a Carnegie Classification in 2015 as the highest level and ranked by US News and World Report at 115 (6th) with an overall graduation rate of 70%, and has a full time retention rate for undergraduate students at 89%.

Temple is one of 11 institutions in the country with multi-year APR scores of 970 or greater for all teams including a 2015 multi-years APR score of 971.

Temple has over 300,000 alumni around the world including over 170,000 alumni that live in the Philadelphia DMA.

Temple's athletic department has 19 sports and 500 student-athletes.

Temple has been bowl eligible nine out of the last 12 years. The Owls finished 10-4, won the AAC Eastern Division and were ranked in the Top 25 twice in the past five seasons. They won the AAC Championship in 2016 and the Gasparilla Bowl in 2017.

Temple posted the largest attendance gain during the 2015 season, playing in front of an average home crowd of 44,159, an increase of 20,789 per game. This excitement led ESPN to bring their popular pregame show, College Gameday, to Philadelphia.

The Temple game played against Notre Dame in 2015 had a 3.9 national rating and an 18.1 local rating. It was ABC's highest ranking game ever in the Philadelphia area which is impactful given the market is the 4th largest in the country.

Temple's athletic facilities are among the finest in the country. The football team plays its games in the NFL stadium operated by Super Bowl 52 Champion Philadelphia Eagles and there are ongoing discussions to build an on campus football stadium as well. The basketball arena is a state-of-the-art facility with a capacity crowd of 10,000. Over the last five years Temple has spent over \$50 million for athletics multipurpose facilities with all the athletic facilities being state-of-the-art.

The University itself has over \$400 million planned for capital projects over the next five years including a \$170 million state of the art library that opened last fall.

POSITION-BY-POSITION

QUARTERBACKS

Quarterbacks coach **Jake Landry** oversees the unit in his first season as the quarterbacks coach. Last season, the Owls passed for 1,466 yards and 11 touchdowns..

Redshirt freshman **D'Wan Mathis** was named the starter towards the end of spring camp. A transfer from Georgia, Mathis spent two years there under head coach Kirby Smart. Saw action in four games for the Bulldogs. Mathis missed his entire freshman season in 2019 after having a cyst removed from his brain.

Justin Lynch (Chicago, Ill. / Mount Carmel) was part of the 2021 recruiting class. Showed flashes in fall training camp with a few big plays, and earned the top backup position.

Redshirt sophomore **Re-al Mitchell** transferred to Temple in the summer of 2020 after appearing in five games at Iowa State under head coach Matt Campbell. Mitchell received his first career start against UCF, and played in two other games for the Owls last season, throwing for 238 yards and one touchdown to go along with 114 rushing yards.

Mariano Valenti transferred to Temple in the summer of 2020 from NIU, reuniting with the staff that recruited him out of high school. He was ineligible last season due to transfer rules.

Matt Duncan was part of the 2020 recruiting class. He saw his only collegiate action at UCF in 2020

Redshirt sophomore **T.J. Pergine** (Limerick, Pa. / Spring-Ford) joined the team as a walk-on in January after attending Millersville University as a freshman.

WIDE RECEIVERS

Pass game coordinator and wide receivers coach **Thad Ward** heads the unit in his third season at Temple. Ward coached the running backs at the University of Illinois before he arrived here. He also was a member of Carey's NIU staff from 2013-2015.

Jadan Blue is a redshirt junior who had one of the best receiving seasons in Temple history in 2019, catching 95 balls for 1,067 yards. Both numbers ranked first all-time in school history. Last season, Blue continued to climb up the all-time receiving lists, hauling in 41 passes for 381 yards and five touchdowns. Earned 2020 All-AAC Phil Steele fourth team recognition.

Graduate **Randle Jones** has proved to be a speedy deep threat who allows the Owls to take shots down field and extend drives. Set single-game career-high marks in receptions (12) and receiving yards (118) last season against Memphis.

Redshirt sophomore **Jose Barbon** rotated in behind a veteran receiving corps in his first two seasons, recording 26 catches for 250 yards in 18 games.

Kadas Reams and **Ronnie Stevenson** were part of the 2018 recruiting class and redshirted that year. Reams recorded his first career catch last season against SMU. Stevenson made his first career start and his first career reception at Tulane.

Redshirt sophomore **Jordan Smith** started to see more snaps on offense last season. Smith also sees action at tight end.

Redshirt sophomore **Amad Anderson Jr.** transferred to the Owls in December 2020 from Purdue University. At Purdue, Anderson caught 36 passes for 362 yards and three touchdowns in 17 games.

De'Von Fox was part of the 2019 recruiting class and redshirted. Last season, Fox made his first career catch and led the team in receptions (5) against SMU, while setting single-game career-highs in receptions and receiving yards (46).

Kwesi Evans was part of the 2019 recruiting class and red-

shirted. Played in five games last season, mostly on special teams.

Nazir Burnett transferred from Georgia Tech last season after redshirting. Opted out last season due to COVID-19 concerns.

Zae Baines was part of the 2020 recruiting class. Baines played in three games mostly on special teams. **Ryan Reeder** walked on to the team following 2019 camp and redshirted.

Jaden Coffen (Bowie, Md. / St. Albans) and **Malik Cooper** (Philadelphia, Pa. / St. Joseph's Prep) were part of the 2021 recruiting class.

John Adams (Deptford, N.J. / Deptford) joined the team as a walk-on in the summer.

RUNNING BACKS

Running backs coach **Gabe Infante** leads the backs in his third year on the job. Infante came from St. Joe's Prep where he had a tremendous amount of success leading local Philadelphia players to multiple state championships. Infante was named the 2018 NFL High School Coach of the Year.

Tayvon Ruley is a redshirt senior who worked as the team's starting running back for the majority of last season. Ruley earned a scholarship entering the 2020 season, and made his first career start against SMU while earning Offensive Player of the Game honors. Set career-highs in rushes (23) and rushing yards (90) at UCF.

Edward Saydee was part of the 2019 recruiting class and redshirted. Saw consistent game action on special teams and rotated in at running back a year ago. Set new single-game career highs in rushes (6) and rushing yards (31).

Redshirt sophomore **Kyle Dobbins** saw a career-high seven rushes vs. ECU. Set single-game career-highs in rushing yards (34) and longest rush (16) at UCF.

Senior **Ra'Von Bonner** transferred to the Owls in December 2020 from Illinois. During his time at Illinois, Bonner rushed for 822 yards and 10 touchdowns in three seasons. Opted out last season due to COVID-19 concerns.

Redshirt sophomore **Iverson Clement** transferred to Temple in January 2021 from Florida. Clement saw action over three seasons as a backup running back and special teamer at Florida under head coach Dan Mullen.

Redshirt freshman **Onasis Neely** set a career-high in carries (15) at ECU. Recorded his first career touchdown at UCF.

Trey Blair was a part of the 2020 recruiting class. Played in four games last season for the Owls rotating in on special teams as a safety. Moved to running back following spring practices.

Ali Barkley (Whitehall, Pa. / Whitehall) joined the team as a walk-on in January 2021.

TIGHT ENDS

The tight end group is coached by offensive coordinator **Mike Uremovich**. He came from Carey's NIU staff where he was the offensive coordinator for three seasons.

David Martin-Robinson only played in four games last season having missed three due to COVID-19 protocols. Caught 11 passes for 147 yards with a long of 35 yards.

Redshirt junior **Darius Pittman** transferred from Purdue before the beginning of last season. Pittman earned his first career start for the Owls against Memphis.

James Della Pesca was part of the 2020 recruiting class. Played in six games last season for the Owls, mostly on special teams.

OFFENSIVE LINE

For the third straight year the offensive line unit is mentored by **Joe Tripodi**. He coached the offensive line for nine seasons at NIU, the last six under Carey, before coming to Temple.

Redshirt senior **C.J. Perez** transferred to Temple in the summer from NIU, reuniting with the staff that recruited him at NIU.

Junior **Adam Klein** started every game for the Owls at right tackle in 2019. In 2020, Klein made the switch to right guard while also starting two games at left guard. In his freshman season, Klein was the only freshman in the country to start at right tackle for at least nine games on his way to ECAC Offensive Freshman of the Year.

Junior **Isaac Moore** started every game in 2019 at left tackle. After briefly losing his starting spot to open up the 2020 season, the 6-foot-7 tackle regained his spot by week three and started the remaining games.

Senior **Joseph Hooper** joined the program in the summer of 2019 as a transfer. Started at right guard in 2019 before coming into the 2020 season as the team's starting left guard.

Michael Niese transferred to the program in February of 2020 from Dayton. Earned the starting right tackle position prior to the season opener. Made his first start at left guard vs. ECU at the end of the season.

Wisdom Quarshie was a part of the 2019 recruiting class and redshirted. Quarshie made his first career start against ECU and played the majority of the game at UCF. Saw game action on the FG/PAT units all season long.

Luke Foster and **Richard Rodriguez** transferred to Temple in 2021 from Presbyterian and Iowa Central Community College, respectively.

AMERICAN BOWL LINEUP

American Athletic Conference teams are guaranteed at least seven bowl appearances annually as part of the conference's new postseason lineup, which begins with the 2020 season and is in place through 2025. The American, as it has done three times in the first five years of the current bowl cycle, will continue to send its champion to a New Year's Six bowl if that team finishes higher than the champions of four other conferences in the final College Football Playoff rankings. American Athletic Conference teams are also eligible for the College Football Playoff if they are among the top four teams in the final CFP rankings.

As part of the new bowl cycle, The American will annually send teams to the Military Bowl presented by Peraton against an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent, the Fenway Bowl in Boston, also against an ACC team, and a third annual spot which will alternate between the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl and the SoFi Hawaii Bowl. This season, the SoFi Hawaii Bowl will feature a team from the AAC against a team from the Mountain West.

Additionally, The American will annually have four appearances in a group of eight bowls. The American has extended its existing partnerships with the TicketSmarter Birmingham Bowl, the Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl, the RoofClaim.com Boca Raton Bowl, the Tropical Smoothie Cafe Frisco Bowl, the Cure Bowl, the Myrtle Beach Bowl, the New Mexico Bowl, and the SERVPRO First Responder Bowl.

Rod Carey, who served six years as the head coach at Northern Illinois University, was named Temple University's head football coach on January 11, 2019.

In his first season on North Broad Street, Carey led the Owls to an 8-5 record and a berth in the 2019 Military Bowl. That extended Temple's streak to five straight bowl games, the longest in school history. The eight wins tied Steve Addazio for the most wins by a first-year head coach in Temple history. In Carey's second season at the helm, the Owls finished with a 1-6 record in a COVID-19 shortened season.

Carey, who was named NIU's head coach in December 2012, coached the Huskies in six bowl games, including leading the Mid-American Conference power against Florida State in the 2013 Discover Orange Bowl. He compiled a 52-30 won-loss record at NIU with an impressive 38-10 record in conference play.

Under Carey, NIU was the dominant program in the MAC from 2013-16, winning four West Division titles and two MAC Championship games.

Carey guided NIU to a perfect 12-0 regular season record in his first full year at the helm (2013), with that Huskies' team spending nine weeks in the AP poll and rising as high as 16. He followed that year by guiding NIU to an 11-3 record in 2014, tying for the West Division title and winning the MAC Championship with a 51-17 victory over Bowling Green.

Three of the next four seasons saw Carey lead the Huskies to eight-win campaigns with his teams winning two more West Division titles. In 2018, the Huskies finished 8-6 overall, 6-2 in league play, and overcame a 29-10 third quarter deficit to defeat Buffalo, 30-29, in the MAC title game for its second conference championship under Carey.

Success has not just come in league play for Carey's teams as NIU posted a 4-2 mark against Big Ten opponents under his leadership. NIU's four wins during his tenure came against Iowa (2013), Purdue (2013), Northwestern (2014), and Nebraska (2017).

At NIU, Carey coached seven All-Americans, including defensive end Sutton Smith, who became the school's first two-time First Team All-American.



Carey rose quickly to the head coaching position upon his arrival on the NIU campus in 2011. After joining the staff as an offensive line coach, he added run game coordinator to his duties for the 2012 season and then became the offensive coordinator following the team's first game. Three months later, he was named the head coach.

Prior to his arrival at NIU, Carey served as the offensive line coach for three seasons (2008-10) at the University of North Dakota. His line paved the way for UND 1,000-yard rusher Josh Murray (1,146 yards) in 2008 and for the No. 2 running back in the Great West Conference a year later. The Fighting Sioux also passed for 2,000 yards in 2009.

In the shortest stint of his coaching career, Carey was the offensive line coach at Illinois State for the 2007 season. Prior to that, he served on the coaching staff at the University of Wisconsin-Stout for seven seasons (2000-06), where he was the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach.

A native of Wayzata, Minn., Carey began his collegiate coaching career at the University of Minnesota (1998-99) where he helped the Gophers to their first bowl game in over a decade with a trip to the 1999 Sun Bowl. Prior to UM, he spent four seasons in the high school ranks at his alma mater, Wayzata (Minn.) High School, from 1994-97.

A three-year starter at center for Indiana during his collegiate playing days (1990-93), Carey served as a team captain and won IU's Corby Davis Outstanding Offensive Player Award as a senior. He earned his bachelor's degree from Indiana in 1994.

Carey and his wife, Tonya, have two children, daughter Kennedy and son Charlie.
