Game 2: Temple (1-1, 0-0) vs. Rutgers (2-0, 0-0) Philadelphia, Pa. | Lincoln Financial Field | September 17, 2022

THIS WEEK

Temple continues their homestand against Rutgers for the Owls' homecoming game on Saturday, September 17. Kickoff is set for 2pm and the game will air on ESPN+ and 97.5 The Fanatic.

LAST WEEK

Temple defeated the Lafayette Leopards at Lincoln Financial Field, 30-14, marking the first win in the head coaching career of Stan Drayton. The story of the game was the debut of true freshman quarterback E.J. Warner, son of NFL Hall of Fame quarterback, Kurt Warner. Warner threw for 173 yards and two touchdowns, completing 74% of his passes. The Owls defense also had a big day, recording eight sacks. De'Von Fox wreaked havoc on special teams, blocking three punts (one shy of an NCAA record), which led to two touchdowns and a safety for the Owls.

LAST TIME VS. RUTGERS

The Cherry & White lost their first game of the season last year to Rutgers by a score of 61-14. Three turnovers in the first half put the Owls in a 19-point hole that they were unable to overcome. The Owls first possession of the game started from their own one-yard line which led to a safety a few plays later. The aforementioned turnovers gave Rutgers good field position throughout the rest of the first quarter which the Scarlet Knights were able to capitalize on to build a 26-0 lead. From there, the Owls bounced back to score 14 unanswered points to cut the deficit to 12 early in the third quarter. Shortly afterwards though, an injury to QB D'Wan Mathis sidelined him for the rest of the afternoon, and the Owls were unable to put more points on the board.

LAST TIME VS. RUTGERS @ LINCOLN FINANCIAL FIELD

The last time Temple and Rutgers played at Lincoln Financial Field was back in 2012. The #19 ranked Scarlet Knights scored on their first four possessions of the second half to comeback from a 10-0 halftime deficit and defeat the Owls, 35-10.

TEMPLE-RUTGERS HISTORY

The Scarlet Knight lead the all-time series 21-15, with Rutgers winning the last five match-ups dating back to 2003.

TEMPLE TUFF

While Klein and Moore have been awarded single digits, they will wear 74 and 63 respectively due to the NCAA prohibiting offensive linemen from wearing numbers outside of 50-79. This Week

AYE, AYE CAPTAIN

For the first time in over a decade, season long captains were voted on by the players. The captains for the 2022 season are DL Xach Gill, OL Adam Klein, LB Jordan Magee, TE David Martin-Robinson and DL Darian Varner.

BLOCK PARTY

Temple leads the nation in blocked punts (3), all coming by De'Von Fox against Lafayette, one shy of an NCAA record for most by a single player in a game.

SACK ATTACK

Temple is tied for third in the country for sacks as a team with 9. Leading the way for the Owls is OLB Layton Jordan with 2.5 sacks and DL Darian Varner with two sacks. Temple is top five in the country in both sacks (T-3rd) and tackles for loss (T-5th).

JUCO JAM

Temple features six former junior college players on their 2022 roster, with many receiving significant playing time: OL Richard Rodriguez, LB Jacob Hollins, OLB Tra Thomas, SAF Jalen Ware, SAF Elijah Deravil, and SAF Brenyen Scott.

FINDING PAYDIRT

Four players scored their first career touchdowns last week versus Lafayette: RB Darvon Hubbard, TE Jordan Smith, WR Ian Stewart, and QB E.J. Warner.

POWER 5 PIECES

All three of Temple's new coordinators this season have coaching experi-

ence at the Power 5 level. OC Danny Langsdorf has coached at Oregon State, Nebraska, Oregon, and Colorado. DC DJ Eliot has coached at Florida State, Kentucky, Colorado, and Kansas. STC Adam Scheier has coached at Wake Forest, Ohio State, Texas Tech, Mississippi, and Rutgers. **Temple is the only school in the AAC to have its three coordinators all hold their coordinator position at the Power 5 level.**

In addition to the coaches, 11 players who joined Temple via the portal this year have played at Power 5 schools (OL Peace Addo, DT Joseph Appiah Darkwa, CB Dominick Hill, LB Jacob Hollins, RB Darvon Hubbard, P Mackenzie Morgan, RB Jakari Norwood, QB Quincy Patterson, K Camden Price, WR Adonias Sanders, and WR Ian Stewart).

DON'T I KNOW YOU FROM SOMEWHERE?

Both head coaches, Stan Drayton and Greg Schiano, have coached at Ohio State before. Drayton was the wide receiver and running back coach from 2011-2014. Schiano was the defensive coordinator from 2016-18.

Temple special teams coordinator and tight ends coach Adam Scheier spent the previous two seasons as Rutgers' special teams coordinator. The Scarlet Knights ranked seventh in the ESPN Special Teams Efficiency Ratings in 2020 and improved to No. 4 in 2021.

Rutgers wide receivers coach Damiere Shaw attended Temple as a student, graduating in 2016. He eventually served as the wide receivers graduate assistant in 2016.

Temple's safeties coach Marvin Clecidor spent time as a graduate assistant in 2011 under current head coach Greg Schiano. The last year under his first stint with the team.

Rutgers CB Christian Braswell, DL Ifeanyi Majieh, and WR Sean Ryan all played for Temple.

Rutgers defensive back Todd Bowles Jr. is the son of Temple's former All-East defensive back Todd Bowles Sr. Bowles Sr. currently coaches for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Temple WR Malik Cooper played at St. Joseph's Prep in Philadelphia with Rutgers kicker Antonio Chadha and OL Brad Harris Jr.

Temple and Rutgers offensive linemen Wisdom Quarshie and J.D. Drenzo played at the same St. Joseph's high school in Hammonton, New Jersey.

Team

TEMPLE TUFF

The phrase "Temple Tuff" is synonymous with the fight and grit of Temple's football team. However, it was coined by legendary Temple basketball coach John Chaney whose teams also were noted for their hard-nosed, lunch-pail passion by which they played. An ever-present figure on Temple's campus, Chaney passed away on January 29, 2021.

WINNING CULTURE

The Owls went 49-30 from 2014-2019 during which time they did not have a losing season. That marked the longest streak in Temple history. A streak that started with Matt Rhule and extended through Geoff Collins and Rod Carey. Stan Drayton will look to build his own winning culture in his first season.

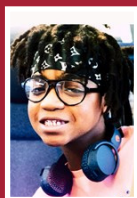
GOING BOWLING

Temple football has been to nine bowl games in the program's history, including a streak of five in a row. The Owls were bowl eligible from 2014-19 under three different coaching staffs. That was the longest streak of bowl eligibility in program history.

UNITED NATIONS

Temple has nine countries represented on this year's roster, the most foreign countries represented in the FBS. Australia (Mackenzie Morgan), Cuba (Jose Barbon), England (James Faminu), Germany (Joseph Appiah Darkwa), Liberia (Edward Saydee), Sweden (Isaac Moore, Victor Stoffel), Switzerland (Magnus Geers) Turks and Caicos (Yvandy Rigby), and the United States.

THE SAY JAY KID



Jaidyn joined the team as the final recruit of the 2020 class by way of Team IMPACT, a non-profit organization that connects children facing serious and chronic illnesses with college athletic teams in a two-year therapeutic program. A Philadelphia native, Jaidyn currently attends Sankofa Freedom Charter

School. In Pennsylvania, Team IMPACT has matched 102 local kids with teams since 2011, and currently has 42 kids matched with teams at 24 colleges and universities, with almost 1,000 student-athletes currently supporting local children.



JUST DO IT.

In the summer of 2020, Temple Athletics signed a three-year deal with Nike which makes it the official outfitter of Temple Athletics. The agreement makes Nike the exclusive athletics footwear, apparel and accessories provider for the football team as well as the other 18 varsity sports.

WELCOME TO THE NEST

LEADING LADIES

Two of the most important positions on Stan Drayton's staff are held by women. Tory Teykl serves as the Director of Football Operations, while Paige Shinberg serves as the Head Equipment Manager. Temple and New Mexico State are the only two FBS schools to have both a female Director of Football Operations and Equipment Manager. Temple is one of eight FBS schools that have a female DFO (Temple, Notre Dame, TCU, Kansas State, Maryland, Bowling Green, FAU, and New Mexico State), and one of four FBS schools that have a female equipment manager (Temple, New Mexico, Nevada, and New Mexico State).

Stan Drayton

STAN THE MAN

Stan Drayton, after serving as an assistant coach at the collegiate and NFL level for 28 years, became the 29th head coach in Temple history on December 15, 2021. Drayton's notable stops include Texas, Ohio State, Florida, Green Bay Packers, and Chicago Bears. He won national championships at Florida in 2006 and Ohio State in 2014.

PHILLY PHILLY

Drayton also has strong Philly roots. He attended and played at Allegheny College, located in Meadville. He has experience coaching at Penn and Villanova, as well. Drayton and his wife, Monique, also got married in Philadelphia.

WATCH THE THRONE

This season, Drayton instituted a leadership council for the players. The leadership council is used to serve as a medium between the players and coaches. The 13 players on the leadership council are: Amad Anderson Jr., Jose Barbon, Trey Blair, Xach Gill, Adam Klein, Jordan Magee, David Martin-Robinson, Jalen McMurray, Isaac Moore, Wisdom Quarshie, Mariano Valenti, Darian Varner, and DaeSean Winston.

CHASING GREATNESS

Stan Drayton has coached many NFL players during his career, including

OWL SCHOLARS

In an effort to recognize the outstanding academic accomplishments of Temple University's student-athletes, Temple Athletics introduced the Owl Scholars Program in the Fall of 2016. Through team apparel, student-athletes on all of Temple's 19 sports regularly have the opportunity to wear items that represent their athletic lives while on campus or in the classroom; the Owl Scholars Program aims to accomplish the reverse - provide an easily identifiable symbol of academic success for student-athletes to wear on their respective field or court of competition.

The Owl Scholars Patch has been designed to pay homage to the rich history of the Temple

Owls, while invoking images of the infamous speech of Temple University's founder Russell Conwell, Acres of Diamonds. The three stars above the regal owl symbolize the three different ways a student-athlete can earn the honor of having the patch included on their uniform/game warm-up:

- 1) 3.0 semester GPA in previous term
- 2) 3.0 cumulative GPA prior to beginning of semester
- 3) Successfully completed his/her undergraduate degree at Temple

- 51 football players will wear the patch this season.



Dallas Cowboys' RB Ezekiel Elliott and Philadelphia Eagles' RB Jordan Howard. One of his earliest and popular players is former Eagle Brian Westbrook, who he coached at Villanova.

BALANCING ACT

Drayton can never escape being around world class athletes. Both of his daughters, Amari and Anaya, are world class gymnasts, who train in Austin, Texas. Amari is a member of the U.S. National Team and will be attending LSU.

Offense

LANGS LOVES OFFENSE

Danny Langsdorf takes over as offensive coordinator and quarterback coach for Temple Football this season. He comes to Temple after serving two seasons as pass game coordinator and quarterback coach at Colorado. In 2021, the Buffaloes ranked first in the Pac-12, and third in the country, in red zone offense. Langsdorf has 25 years of experience on the collegiate and professional levels, all on the offensive side of the ball augmented by some extensive special teams coaching. He has 16 years of Power 5 conference experience, including 12 as an offensive coordinator.

FINGER LICKIN' GOOD

While he hasn't quite reached colonel status yet, wide receiver Adonias Sanders has made a quick impression on his coaches and teammates. So much so that he earned a coveted single-digit despite being with the team just two months. He's the first transfer to earn a single-digit in his first year since Rock Ya-Sin in 2018.

WARNER'S CORNER

True freshman, quarterback E.J. Warner made his collegiate debut against Lafayette in relief of D'Wan Mathis, and led the Owls to a victory, throwing for 173 yards and two touchdowns while completing 74% of his passes. Warner is the son of NFL Hall of Fame quarterback Kurt Warner.

WELCOME BACK

Chris Wiesehan rejoined the Temple Football staff in January 2022, as the Offensive Line Coach and Run Game Coordinator. This is Wiesehan's second stint with the Owls, as he previously served as an assistant coach under Matt Rhule and Geoff Collins from 2014-2018. Wiesehan spent three seasons as Georgia Tech's tight ends and tackles coach, as well as offensive special teams coordinator. One of the nation's most versatile offensive coaches, Wiesehan's 27 years of coaching includes experience at both the collegiate and professional levels. Prior to Georgia Tech, Wiesehan spent five seasons at Temple.

KLEIN'S LINE

Adam Klein, a graduate student, has started in 36 games for Temple over his career at left guard, right guard, and right tackle. This season, Klein returned to his customary right tackle spot.

BLAIR SWITCH PROJECT

Running back Trey Blair made the switch from safety in 2021 and has been productive as a runner. Also making the switch from the other side of the ball have been Iverson Clement (running back to cornerback in 2022), and Wisdom Quarshie (defensive line to offensive line in 2019).

Defense

D.J.'S DEFENSE

D.J. Eliot heads the defensive unit for the Owls this season being named both defensive coordinator and outside linebackers coach. He brings over 20 years of coaching experience to Stan Drayton's initial staff. Eliot's pedigree includes coaching stops at Kansas, Florida State, Miami, Colorado and Kentucky, as well as time with proven winners and program builders Jimbo Fisher and Mark Stoops. Additionally, Eliot is among a select group of defensive thought-leaders that regularly clinic around the principles of the 3-4 defense and simulated pressures.

JORDAN²

Linebackers Layton Jordan and Jordan Magee are two of the leaders for the Owls defense. Jordan leads Temple with 2.5 sacks and five tackles for loss, while Magee leads the team in total tackles with 16.

WILD BOYZ

Temple's defensive line has been dubbed with the nickname "Wild Boyz" over the past decade and the unit has lived up to the special billing. Two NFL first round draft choices - Muhammad Wilkerson (2011, NY Jets) and Haason Reddick (2016, Cardinals) - and a handful of other pro players have learned their trade at Temple. Five Wild Boyz are currently employed in the NFL: Michael Dogbe (Arizona), Arnold Ebiketie (Atlanta), Matt Ioannidis (Carolina), Jacob Martin (NY Jets), and Haason Reddick (Philadelphia).

Special Teams

ISN'T THAT SPECIAL

In 2021, Adam Scheier's Rutgers punt team led the nation with an NCAA single-season record 45.82 net punting average. Rutgers' kickoff coverage unit finished 17th in the nation allowing 17.58-yard per return. The Scarlet Knights punt block and return units were explosive ranked 25th in the nation allowing 2.93-yards per return while blocking one punt and returning another for a touchdown. Punter Adam Korsak was a finalist for the Ray Guy Award, second team All-American and first-team All-Big Ten. Long snapper Billy Taylor earned first-team All-Big Ten honors.

ANIMAL HOUSE

National Lampoon's Animal House movie was based on writer Chris Miller's fraternity experiences at Adam Scheier's alma mater Dartmouth College. It's title can also describe Scheier's residence. Due in part to his wife, Erica, being a veterinarian and his family's love of animals, the Scheier compound has nearly 20 animals. This menagerie includes dogs, cats, pigs, hedgehog, lizards, turtles, hamsters, rabbits, and birds. Most of the aforementioned critters have been named after players along Scheier's coaching journey.

What's In a Name

WHO'S YOUR DADDY?

The Owls' 2022 recruiting class included two players with prominent bloodlines. QB E.J. Warner's father, Kurt, is a pro football hall of famer, former NFL MVP, and played for 12 years in the league. OLB Jacob Porter's father, Joey, is a former all-pro linebacker who played 13 seasons in the NFL for Pittsburgh, Miami, and Arizona.

BOOZ BROS

Temple Football is a family, and quite literally for the Boozers. Cole was a three-time letterwinner having been part of the team from 2013-17. He now serves as a Graduate Assistant and works with the offensive line. Evan, a graduate student, is a veteran member of the defensive line. He played in seven games during the 2020 season, but missed all of the 2021 season due to injury.

SOUND FAMILIAR?

Temple fans might be caught off guard when they hear the names Quentin Rose and Zymir Cobbs. Both players are on the current roster but their names sound like former Owls. Quinton Rose was an all-conference basketball player from 2016-20, and Zamir Cobb was a record-holding wide receiver for the Owls from 2000-03.

PHILLY BASKETBALL ROYALTY

In a town that loves basketball, it couldn't hurt for your name to remind people of Philadelphia's basketball royalty. Temple's football team could dominate a 3-on-3 league with the likes of Allen Iverson (Clement), Kobe (Wilson) Bryant, and Ali (Charles) Barkley being coached by Herb (Jordan) Magee.

Miscellaneous

DIVERSITY UNIVERSITY

Temple is the **only** FBS school that has an African American president (Dr. Jason Wingard), athletic director (Arthur Johnson), football coach (Stan Drayton), and men's (Aaron McKie) and women's basketball coach (Diane Richardson).

PREPARING OWLS FOR FLIGHT

When the COVID-19 pandemic wreaked havoc on "regular" football training for the 2020 season, Temple football found ways to be creative. The team held career roundtable discussions featuring former players to educate current players and to help them grow on and off the field. The discussions were designed to help guide the current student-athletes transition to college graduates. Some of the notable speakers before the 2022 season were CEO of Campbell's Soup, Mark Clouse, former Owl and current Philadelphia Eagle, Haasan Reddick, and College Football Hall of Famer and former Temple running back, Paul Palmer.

HEAD COACH U

NFL head coaches, Matt Rhule (Carolina) and Todd Bowles (Tampa Bay) both used Temple as stepping stones on their path to the NFL. Bowles played for the Owls from 1981-1985, while Rhule was much more recent, coaching the team from 2013-2016. From 2010-2018, Temple placed five straight head coaches into higher paying jobs: Al Golden, Steve Addazio, Matt Rhule, Geoff Collins, and Manny Diaz. Ohio State's Ryan Day, one of the top FBS head coaches, was part of the Owls staff for the 2006 and 2012 seasons.

IN IT FOR THE LONG HAUL

47 players on Temple's roster are either true or redshirt freshmen, making up 42.7% of the entire team. Nearly half of the current roster have four seasons of eligibility remaining.

CHA-CHING

On July 1, 2021, the NCAA implemented legislation that gave college athletes the opportunity to sell the rights to their names, images, and likenesses for the first time. Temple football student-athletes have started to test the waters by partnering with various organizations.

CHANGE IS ON THE HORIZON

The AAC will welcome six new members starting in 2023: Charlotte, Florida Atlantic, North Texas, Rice, UAB, and UTSA. The additions come on the heels of Cincinnati, UCF, and Houston announcing that they would be leaving for the Big 12 in 2023. The changes will now mean three teams in the AAC are Owls (FAU, Rice, and Temple).

DID YOU KNOW?

Temple holds an 85-year-old NCAA college football record? In 1937, Temple played in an NCAA-record four scoreless tie games in one season. No school has matched that since.

TEMPLE AT A GLANCE...

Temple is in the 4th largest media market in the country, with over 2.9 million TV homes according to Nielsen. The designated market area (DMA) is 7.6 million.

Temple is located in a region of 6.53 million people, and is only 95 miles from NYC and 120 miles from Washington, D.C. In fact, more than 40% of the US population is within a day's drive from Philadelphia.

Temple is the 26th largest public University in the country with over 41,000 students founded in 1884 and has 404 academic programs including five professional schools of law, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, and podiatry.

Temple is a Research I institution, a Carnegie Classification in 2015 as the highest level and ranked by US News and World Report at 115 (6th) with an overall graduation rate of 70%, and has a full time retention rate for undergraduate students at 89%.

Temple is one of 11 institutions in the country with multi-year APR scores of 970 or greater for all teams including a 2015 multi-years APR score of 971.

Temple has over 300,000 alumni around the world including over 170,000 alumni that live in the Philadelphia DMA.

Temple's athletic department has 19 sports and 500 student-athletes.

Temple has been bowl eligible nine out of the last 12 years. The Owls finished 10-4, won the AAC Eastern Division and were ranked in the Top 25 twice in the past five seasons. They won the AAC Championship in 2016 and the Gasparilla Bowl in 2017.

Temple posted the largest attendance gain during the 2015 season, playing in front of an average home crowd of 44,159, an increase of 20,789 per game. This excitement led ESPN to bring their popular pregame show, College Gameday, to Philadelphia.

The Temple game played against Notre Dame in 2015 had a 3.9 national rating and an 18.1 local rating. It was ABC's highest ranking game ever in the Philadelphia area which is impactful given the market is the 4th largest in the country.

Temple's athletic facilities are among the finest in the country. The football team plays its games in the NFL stadium operated by Super Bowl 52 Champion Philadelphia Eagles and there are ongoing discussions to build an on campus football stadium as well. The basketball arena is a state-of-the-art facility with a capacity crowd of 10,000. Over the last five years Temple has spent over \$50 million for athletics multipurpose facilities with all the athletic facilities being state-of-the-art.

The University itself has over \$400 million planned for capital projects over the next five years including a \$170 million state of the art library that opened in 2020.

Temple had a school record four players get drafted into the NFL in 2020: Matt Hennessy (Falcons), Harrison Hand (Vikings), Shaun Bradley (Eagles), and Chapelle Russell (Buccaneers) with four more players getting signed as undrafted free agents. Temple is the only team outside of the Power 5 conferences to have multiple players drafted to the NFL from 2016-2020. In all, Temple has 23 current players in the NFL, the most of any school outside of the Power 5. 12 of the league's 32 teams will sport some Cherry and White this season. Furthermore, when adding coaches and team personnel into the equation, there are 78 people in the NFL with ties to Owl Nation.

Head Coach

Stan Drayton, who has won college national championships and coached at the NFL level during his 28-year career, returned to Philadelphia as the 29th head football coach of Temple University on December 15, 2021.

Drayton came to Temple from the University of Texas where he was the associate head coach and run game coordinator for both Tom Herman (2017-20) and Steve Sarkisian (2021). During his time with the Longhorns, Drayton guided the development of a trio of young running backs - Bijan Robinson, Roschon Johnson and Keaontay Ingram. All three made immediate impacts as true freshmen.

Robinson had breakout performances as the 2020 season progressed and tallied 703 rushing yards on just 86 carries to break the school's single-season yards per carry average record at 8.2. He amassed a team-high 915 all-purpose yards (703 rush/196 rec/16 KR) during the 2020 season, making him the first freshman to lead the Longhorns in all-purpose yards since Cedric Benson in 2001.

In year three at UT, Drayton was influential in the growth of Ingram, who totaled 1,095 yards from scrimmage (853 rush/242 rec). Ingram averaged 5.9 yards per carry - nearly a full yard better than his 2018 total (5.0 ypc). He also rushed for more than 100 yards on four occasions.

Drayton also oversaw Johnson's seamless transition from quarterback to running back as a true freshman, a move that took place just one week prior to the season opener versus Louisiana Tech. Under Drayton's eye, Johnson racked up 807 all-purpose yards (649 rush/158 rec) on 146 touches (123 rush/23 rec). He was the ninth true freshman in school history to rush for at least 600 yards. Johnson posted two 100-yard games (121 at WVU, 105 vs. TTU) and was twice named the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week in 2019.

In his second season, Drayton mentored two newcomers in graduate transfer Tre Watson and true freshman Keaontay Ingram. The duo combined for 1,494 rushing yards and six touchdowns on the ground, while adding 313 yards receiving with five more touchdowns.

Drayton led a young room of running backs during the 2017 season, as the Longhorns top two backs in 2017 were both true freshmen in Daniel Young and Toney Carter. Young started the final five games of the season, and rushed for 373 yards and three scores. He also caught 13 passes for 153 yards and a touchdown. Carter started two games in 2017 and rushed for 252 yards and three touchdowns. He caught six passes for 31 yards and a score. True sophomore Kyle Porter finished fourth on the team in rushing with 261 yards and four touchdowns.

Prior to Texas, Drayton coached at Ohio State where he won a BCS National Championship in 2014. He joined OSU as a wide receivers coach in 2011, before leading the running backs for the next three seasons. He had previously won a BCS National Championship (2006) while coaching running backs at Florida (2005-07, 2010).

Drayton spent four seasons (2011-14) at Ohio State, including the last two as assistant head coach on offense and running backs coach. In 2014, Drayton helped the Buckeyes win the National Championship as Ezekiel Elliott, who was a sophomore, finished third in the nation and second in single-season school history with 1,878 rushing yards.

Under Drayton's guidance, Elliott capped the 2014 season with three-straight 200-yard rushing games (tied for the most in single-season school history with Eddie George, 1995). Drayton's work with Elliott helped him to be named College Football Playoff National Championship Offensive MVP with 246 rushing yards (tied for third most in single-game school history) and four touchdowns on 36 carries against Oregon. Elliott was also named Offensive MVP of the Sugar Bowl (230 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries) versus Alabama.

In 2013, Drayton helped senior running back Carlos Hyde finish eighth in the nation with an average of 126.8 rushing yards per game (1,521 yards and 15 touchdowns on 208 carries in 12 contests). Hyde was named the Big Ten's Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year as his 1,521 rushing yards were eighth most in school history and his 7.3 yards per carry was the highest in single-season average in school history. Hyde's 246 yards at Illinois that season are tied for third most in single-game school history.

In his first season as Ohio State's running backs coach in 2012, Drayton guided the Buckeyes running backs to 1,536 yards, 21 touchdowns and an average of 5.44 yards per carry during the team's 12-0 campaign. He came to Ohio State in 2011 as the team's wide receivers coach.

During his college coaching career, Drayton has also served as running backs coach at Florida (2005-07, 2010), Syracuse (2009), Tennessee (2008), Mississippi State (2004), Bowling Green (2000, also serving as special teams coach), Villanova (1996-00), Pennsylvania (1995, assistant running backs/director of football operations) and his alma mater Allegheny (Pa.) College (1993). He has also served as a graduate assistant at Eastern Michigan (1994).

Prior to his time at Ohio State, Drayton spent the 2010 season as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Florida, his second stint at the school after serving as the Gators running backs coach from 2005-07. In 2006, Florida won the BCS National Championship as the Gators averaged 160 rushing yards per game. That season, running backs DeShawn Wynn and Kestahn Moore combined for 981 yards and an average of 5.0 yards per carry while losing only two fumbles. Wynn scored his 25th career rushing touchdown, which was the second-most in school history, against Ohio State in the title game. He went on to become a seventh-round draft pick by the Green Bay Packers in 2007.

At Mississippi State, Drayton helped guide Jerious Norwood to a 1,000-yard rushing season in 2004 before he went on to be chosen in the third round of the 2006 draft by the Atlanta Falcons. Another prominent pupil was Villanova two-time All-American Brian Westbrook, who became the first collegiate player on any level to record more than 1,000 yards both rushing and receiving in the same season. He was the winner of the 2001 Walter Payton Award as the Offensive Player of the Year in NCAA Division I-AA and was a third-round pick by the Philadelphia Eagles in the 2002 draft.

On the professional side, Drayton served as running backs coach for the Chicago Bears from 2015-16. He also served as offensive quality control coach/special teams of the Green Bay Packers (2001-03).

In 2016 under Drayton, Jordan Howard, a fifth-round pick out of Indiana, set the Bears single-season rookie rushing record with 1,313 yards, breaking the previous mark held by Matt Forte despite only having 12 carries in the team's first three games. It was also the second-best rushing total of any player in the NFL regular season, trailing only Ezekiel Elliott (1,631), who was coached by Drayton at Ohio State. Another of Drayton's Buckeye protégés, Carlos Hyde finished 14th in the league with 988 rushing yards. After working with Drayton, Elliott went on to be the fourth overall pick of the 2016 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys, while Hyde was a second-round selection by the San Francisco 49ers in 2014.

In 2015, the Bears rushing offense was 11th in the NFL averaging 115.9 yards per game, a 16-spot improvement from their ranking of 27th (90.1 ypg) a year prior to his arrival. Drayton helped running back Jeremy Langford, a fourth-round draft pick, finish fifth among all NFL rookies with seven touchdowns and ninth among rookies with 816 yards from scrimmage. Langford joined Pro Football Hall of Famers Walter Payton and Gale Sayers as the only Bears rookies since at least 1960 with a rushing touchdown in four-straight contests and, along with Payton and Sayers, the only rookies in franchise history to have 100 receiving yards, one rushing touchdown and one receiving touchdown in a single game.

The list of head coaches Drayton has worked under is a who's who of coaching. From his early years in Philadelphia with Penn's Al Bagnoli and Villanova's Andy Talley to successful college coaches such as Urban Meyer, Jim Tressel, Luke Fickell, Tom Herman, and Phil Fulmer, to the NFL's Mike Sherman and John Fox.

Drayton has always been a strong recruiter both in evaluating talent and getting the best players to join him. Among his most high-profile recruits, he is credited with bringing Cam Newton, Mike and Maurice Pouncey to Florida, Robinson to Texas, and he was responsible for bringing Westbrook to Villanova.

A three-time first-team All-America selection as a running back at Allegheny, Drayton is second in the school's record book for rushing (3,272 yards), rushing touchdowns (54) and scoring (336 points) and was a part of the 1990 Division III national championship team. He was also a two-time All-American in track, competing in the 100 and 200 meter dashes. A 1993 graduate with a bachelor's degree in English, Drayton was inducted into the Allegheny College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2005.

Drayton, a native of Cleveland, and his wife Monique, a native of Detroit, have two daughters, Amari and Anaya, who are both elite gymnasts. Amari is a member of the U.S. women's national gymnastics team.

QUARTERBACKS

Quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator **Danny Langsdorf** oversees the unit in his first season with the Owls. He comes to Temple by way of Colorado, where he served as the pass game coordinator and quarterbacks coach last season.

E.J. Warner (Brophy College Prep / Phoenix, AZ) was part of the 2022 recruiting class. He is the son of Pro Football HOFer Kurt Warner. Warner made his collegiate debut against Lafayette in relief of D'Wan Mathis, and led the Owls to a victory, throwing for 173 yards and two touchdowns while completing 74% of his passes.

Redshirt sophomore **D'Wan Mathis** is the incumbent having started seven games a year ago. A transfer from Georgia, Mathis spent two years there under head coach Kirby Smart. Mathis missed his entire freshman season in 2019 after having a cyst removed from his brain.

Late in the spring, the Owls added redshirt junior **Quincy Patterson**. Patterson spent three seasons at Virginia Tech (2018-2020) before spending the 2021 season at NDSU. He led the Bison to a 7-0 record before suffering an injury. The Bison finished 14-1 and won the FCS Championship.

Mariano Valenti transferred to Temple in the summer of 2020 from NIU, reuniting with the staff that recruited him out of high school. The redshirt sophomore played in three games in 2021.

Redshirt junior **T.J. Pergine** joined the team as a walk-on in 2020 after attending Millersville University as a freshman.

WIDE RECEIVERS

Pass game coordinator and wide receivers coach **Jafar Williams** heads the unit in his first season at Temple. The Philadelphia native joins the Owls after coaching wide receivers at Virginia Tech.

Graduate **Jose Barbon** has started 18 games over the past three seasons and averaged over 20 catches. He remains a holdover and former Geoff Collins recruit.

Another receiver with ties to Collins is redshirt senior **Adon-icas Sanders**, who transferred this summer from Georgia Tech. Sanders enters 2022 as the most accomplished receiver on the squad with 65 catches for 834 yards.

Redshirt junior **Amad Anderson Jr.** transferred to the Owls in December 2020 from Purdue. At Purdue, Anderson caught 36 passes for 362 yards and three touchdowns in 17 games. By season's end in 2021, he was the Owls starting wide receiver and primary kick and punt returner.

Another Big Ten transfer is **Ian Stewart** who came to Temple from Michigan State this summer. The redshirt sophomore is a big-bodied target who played some tight end with the Spartans.

Malik Cooper saw action as a true freshman at running back but has returned to his natural receiver position.

Kadas Reams (2018), **De'Von Fox** (2019), **Kwesi Evans** (2019), **Zae Baines** (2020), and **Jaden Coffen** (2021) are all recent recruits who have seen limited time on offense but have made contributions on special teams. Reams had a two touchdown game vs. Wagner (44 and 21 yards) in 2021.

Fox led the team in receptions (5) against SMU in 2020, while setting single-game career-highs in receptions and receiving yards (46). Fox blocked three punts against Lafayette, one shy of a single game NCAA record.

John Adams, **JaySun Carroll**, and **Bobby Salla** joined the team as walk-ons in 2021. **Shekuna Kamara** walked-on in the 2022 spring, while **Jordan Diaz** and **Elias Collins** walked-on in the 2022 summer.

RUNNING BACKS

Running backs coach **Preston Brown** leads the backs in his first year on the job. Brown served as the director of player personnel last season for Temple.

Adding experience and depth at running back was a priority in the offseason. Temple reached out to find two Power 5 talents with tread on their tires.

Redshirt sophomore **Darvon Hubbard** arrived from Texas A&M in January. He was able to learn the playbook throughout spring practice and looks to be an explosive inside runner.

Redshirt junior **Jakari Norwood** was a summer transfer from Illinois. He enters the season with 120 rushing yards on 27 carries in his career.

Edward Saydee started nine games and led the team in rushing (109-399-3TDs) in 2021.

Trey Blair was a part of the 2020 recruiting class and played safety his first season. Moved to running back following spring practices in 2021 and rose on the depth chart in the summer only to have most of his season cut short by injuries.

Redshirt sophomore **Onasis Neely** missed all of the 2019 and 2021 seasons due to injury. He played five games in 2020, rushing 20 times for 63 yards.

Ali Barkley and **Qwentin Rose** joined the team as a walk-ons in 2021.

TIGHT ENDS

The tight end group is coached by special teams coordinator **Adam Scheier**. He came from Rutgers where he was their special teams coordinator for two seasons.

OFFENSIVE LINE

Once again, the offensive line unit is mentored by **Chris Wiesehan**. He coached at Temple under Matt Rhule and Geoff Collins for five seasons before following Collins to Georgia Tech.

Ironically, he returns to coach two players who started as true freshmen for him in 2018 - **Adam Klein** and **Isaac Moore**. Both are working towards their master's degrees.

Klein enters 2022 having started 35 of his 40 games played since 2018. His flexibility is proven having been a starter at right tackle and both guard positions. In his freshman season, Klein was the only freshman in the country to start at right tackle for at least nine games on his way to ECAC Offensive Freshman of the Year. He served as team captain in 2021.

Moore enters 2022 as the most experienced player on the roster. He has played every game for Temple since the 2018 opener - 45 total, including 32 starts. The Sweden native is also one of the most active in community service - he is the Owls nominee for the William V. Campbell and Wuerffel Trophies and AFCA Good Works Team - having adopted Philadelphia as his hometown.

Redshirt sophomore **Wisdom Quarshie** is another experienced lineman who has played in 17 games since joining the Owls in 2019. He was originally recruited as a defensive tackle.

Luke Foster and **Richard Rodriguez** transferred to Temple in 2021 from Presbyterian and Iowa Central Community College, respectively.

Temple added **Peace Addo** and **James Faminu** via the transfer portal following spring practices. Addo, a redshirt junior, played in 17 games for Duke over the last four seasons. Faminu, a redshirt freshman, played in one game last season for Houston.

Recent recruits include: Redshirt sophomores **Jermaine Donaldson** and **Victor Stoffel** (2019); **Sam Davis**, **Bryce Thoman**, **Chevez Trask** (2020); **Keshaun Jones** and **Jimto Obidegwu** (2021). Davis, Jones and Trask are redshirt freshmen. Thoman and Obidegwu are sophomores having played in 11 and eight games, respectively, in 2021. Stoffel played 10 games a year ago, starting one.

Jon Fagley and **Ryan Williams** joined the team as walk-ons in the 2021 summer, while **Kevin Smithwick** walked-on in the 2022 summer.

Jackson Pruitt (Detroit, MI / Cass Tech) was part of the 2022 recruiting class.

DEFENSIVE LINE

Leading the defensive line in 2022 is **Antoine Smith** who arrived at Temple after coaching at Colorado State.

Redshirt senior **Xach Gill** transferred to the Owls in January 2021 from North Carolina. He missed the entire 2021 season with an injury but proved to be one of the locker rooms best leaders.

Jerquavion Mahone transferred to Temple in the summer of 2021 from Kentucky. He quickly became a force starting eight

games and playing all 12.

Lancine Turay transferred to the Owls in January 2021 from North Carolina but missed the entire season due to injury.

Dyshier Clary, **Demerick Morris** and **Darian Varner** were part of the 2020 recruiting class. All saw action over the past two seasons. Varner was among the team's leading sackers in 2021 with 3.0.

Jalen Satchell was part of the 2021 recruiting class and redshirted.

Graduate **Evan Booser** has been snake-bitten suffering season-long injuries in 2019 and 2021. He played all seven games in 2020 making four starts. His brother Cole, a former, Owl, is currently a graduate assistant coach with Temple's offensive line.

Jacoby Sharpe was part of the 2019 recruiting class. After redshirting and seeing limited action, he came on in 2021 playing eight games with three starts.

Redshirt junior **Joseph Appiah Darkwa** transferred this summer from Penn State. Originally from Germany, he continues to develop his knowledge of American football.

Zamar Grove [Irvington (NJ) High] and **Aaron Jones** (Waterbury, CT / Springfield Central) were part of the 2022 recruiting class.

Zymir Cobbs, a redshirt junior, was a standout high school player at Imhotep and returns to Philadelphia after a stint at Penn State.

OUTSIDE LINEBACKERS

The position is coached by **DJ Eliot** who also serves as the defensive coordinator. With the switch to a 3-4 front from the previous coaching regime, a few former defensive ends will transition to outside linebacker, a position called "Jack."

Among those DEs making the switch are: redshirt juniors **Layton Jordan** and **Sylvester Mathis**, and redshirt freshman **Balansama Kamara**. Jordan was part of the 2018 recruiting class and began his career as a linebacker before transitioning to defensive end. Like a fish in water, he has adjusted nicely recording 4.0 sacks in the spring game. Mathis joined the team as a walk-on in January 2021. Kamara was part of the 2021 recruiting class.

D.J. Woodbury was part of the 2020 recruiting class and played 11 games in 2021.

The Owls used every method available to add pieces to this group. The transfer portal provided sophomore **Tra Thomas** who arrives from Independence Community College where he made 58 tackles, 10.0 TFLs, 3.0 sacks, in 17 games. Traditional high school recruiting landed **Darrien Lewis** (Fort Washington, MD / St. Frances Academy) and **Jacob Porter** (Bradfordwoods, PA / North Allegheny).

The Inside linebackers are led by **Chris Woods**. Woods worked with Eliot at Kansas in 2020.

Redshirt sophomores **Jordan Magee** and **Yvandy Rigby** enter their fourth season in cherry and white. Magee started nine of 12 games a year ago and was the most productive

The 2022 recruiting class features incoming freshmen **London Hall** (Clearwater (FL) Central Catholic), **Antwone Santiago** (Meriden, CT / Platt), and **Corey Yeoman** (Atlantic City, NJ / Clearwater Academy). Yeoman was an early enrollee and played in the spring.

SAFETIES

The safeties are led by **Marvin Clecidor** who joined the staff following his two seasons at Western Michigan.

Graduate **DaeSean Winston** played a valuable role for the Owls from 2018-19, sat out in 2020 due to COVID, and missed most of 2021 due to injury. Enters 2022 with 39 career tackles in 26 games.

AMERICAN BOWL LINEUP

American Athletic Conference teams are guaranteed at least seven bowl appearances annually as part of the conference's new postseason lineup, which began with the 2020 season and is in place through 2025. The American, as it has done three times in the first five years of the current bowl cycle, will continue to send its champion to a New Year's Six bowl if that team finishes higher than the champions of four other conferences in the final College Football Playoff rankings. American Athletic Conference teams are also eligible for the College Football Playoff if they are among the top four teams in the final CFP rankings.

As part of the new bowl cycle, The American will annually send teams to the Military Bowl presented by Peraton against an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent, the Fenway Bowl in Boston, also against an ACC team, and a third annual spot which will alternate between the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl and the SoFi Hawaii Bowl. This season, the SoFi Hawaii Bowl will feature a team from the AAC against a team from the Mountain West.

Additionally, The American will annually have four appearances in a group of eight bowls. The American has extended its existing partnerships with the TicketSmarter Birmingham Bowl, the Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl, the RoofClaim.com Boca Raton Bowl, the Tropical Smoothie Cafe Frisco Bowl, the Cure Bowl, the Myrtle Beach Bowl, the New Mexico Bowl, and the SERVPRO First Responder Bowl.
