

## PACIFIC

*The following is a listing of every yard on the football field and a corresponding event during the 77-year history of Pacific football.*

### Goal Line

Willard Harrell began his assault on the 1973 NCAA all-purpose title with a 100-yard kickoff return at UTEP. Harrell's electric return helped throttle the Tigers to a 34-9 victory.

### 1-yard line

At U. of Chicago's Stagg Stadium in 1938, Amos Alonzo Stagg directed COP to a 32-0 upset. It was a grand victory for the Grand Old Man who was retired by Chicago six years earlier. Bob Kientz provided the feature play of the game when he snagged a Chicago pass two feet from his own goal line and scampered up the sideline 99 yards to score.

### 2-yard line

In a memorable goal line stand in 1972, Pacific held off Terry Metcalf and Long Beach State on four straight plays inside the Pacific 2-yard line. Less than 2:00 remained as the Tigers secured a 14-10 win.

### 3-yard line

Bruce Orvis returned a loose ball 97 yards during a 1947 Grape Bowl victory over Utah State. The return afforded COP a 14-0 lead and helped fuel the first bowl win in Tiger history.

### 4-yard line

One of Eddie LeBaron's most colorful plays came as a defensive back when the 16-year old freshman intercepted a Northwestern pass in 1946. The theft ended in a 96-yard return for TD, but not before laterals to Wayne Hardin and John Rohde.

### 5-yard line

The Tigers stuffed Arizona on three straight plays inside the 5-yard line, and the Wildcats missed an early FG attempt in 1993. It set an early tone as no. 13 Arizona narrowly escaped a Pacific upset, 16-13.

### 6-yard line

In a 31-0 rout of NE Louisiana in 1977, Bruce Gibson carried eight times for 46 yards, and went over the 1,000-yard mark, during a 94-yard scoring drive.

### 7-yard line

Richard Harris' fumble recovery at the Pacific 7 thwarted a UNLV scoring chance, and Troy Kopp led the Tigers on a 93-yard drive for an early 7-0 lead in 1990.

### 8-yard line

With no time remaining at New Mexico State in 1987, Ruben Harper returned an Aggie pass 92 yards for a TD and a 23-7 PACIFIC win. The result was Harper's fourth interception and honors as the *Sports Illustrated* Defensive Player of the Week.

### 9-yard line

Willard Harrell's 91-yard jaunt vs. Sacramento State highlighted an otherwise routine victory as Pacific outmanned the small college Hornets in the 1974 season opener in Stockton.

### 10-yard line

Herman Urenda's 90-yard kickoff return against San Jose St. in 1960 pulled the Tigers to a 14-14 tie midway through the second quarter. Pacific extended its win streak over SJSU to seven games.

### 11-yard line

Against Cal St. Fullerton in 1992, Ryan Benjamin secured the NCAA record for career all-purpose average. His 32-yard run from the Pacific 11 contributed to a 3rd quarter go-ahead touchdown. Benjamin ended his brilliant Pacific career with 237.8 all-purpose yards per game.

### 12-yard line

Eddie Macon's 88-yard punt return began what became a one-man show in a bitter 35-33 loss to Denver in 1951. He posted five TDs on the day, including a 68-yard run in the same quarter.

### 13-yard line

Johnny Podesto's 52-yard run from his own 13-yard line appeared to be the first score of the season against undefeated and 7th-ranked USC in 1943. He fell short however, as COP did, in what remains Pacific's only game in history between two Top 10 ranked teams. No. 6-ranked COP lost 6-0 in what one news service called the big game of the college football year.

### 14-yard line

With just seconds left to play and Pacific leading Utah St. 27-7 in 1952, Al Dattola took a reverse from Jim Conover and sped upfield for an 86-yard kickoff return and TD.

### 15-yard line

Perhaps the most famous and most dramatic play in Tiger history is the fabled "Hail Mary" pass from freshman Mike Pitz to senior Ron Woods at San Jose St. in 1983. After a disputed FG with 0:12 remaining, Pacific despair turned to instant jubilation on the final play from scrimmage when, with no time on the clock, Pitz hurled a desperation pass that was tipped by a pair of SJSU defenders into Woods' arms. He ran the rest of the way untouched for the longest pass play in Tiger history, and a miraculous 30-26 win.

### 16-yard line

An 84-yard fourth quarter punt return for TD by Bill Cornman helped demoralize Washington St. in 1969.

### 17-yard line

In a 49-13 drubbing of Hawaii in 1952, Phil Flock scored touchdown runs of 83 and 52 yards while stacking up 158 yards on just five carries.

### 18-yard line

Dewey Tompkins provided the Tigers' only scoring in a 14-7 loss at Purdue in 1955. Tompkins' stellar 81-yard gallop on a third quarter punt return is still the third-longest return in Tiger history.

### 19-yard line

Facing 3rd-and-8 from his own 19 and clinging to a precarious 21-14 lead, Craig Whelihan found freshman Greg Weston for a 37-yard gain en route to an eventual field goal and 24-14 lead. Weston's catch was the longest of '93 and ended a splendid season which saw him break freshman marks for catches and yards.

### 20-yard line

Hue Jackson connected on an 80-yard bomb for TD to wide receiver Booker Guyton in the 1986 Homecoming game with San Jose State. It was the 4th-longest pass in Pacific history.

### 21-yard line

Safety Mark Roberts returned an interception 79 yards for a Pacific score at San Jose St. in 1987.

### 22-yard line

In Pacific's 1958 win at Cal, Dick Bass staked the Tigers to a 14-12 lead with 1:33 in the third quarter with a 78-yard touchdown run. Pacific held on to win 24-20.

### 23-yard line

In 1952, in just the second meeting ever against Utah St., in which Aggie coach John Ronig had predicted Pacific to win by "40 to 50" points, halfback Hank Welch appeared to make Ronig a prophet by taking off on a 77-yard run from scrimmage for a 7-0 COP lead just two plays into the game. The Tigers still led just 7-0 at halftime, but later won 34-7.

### 24-yard line

A 76-yard run by Henry Wallace was Pacific's final score in a 26-13 win over San Jose St. in 1958.

### 25-yard line

Leading 12-8 against Hawaii in 1953, reserve QB Bill Jacobs launched a fourth quarter pass to Ken Buck who hauled in the aerial at the Rainbow 40. Buck scampered the remaining distance untouched for a Bengal tally, and sent COP onto a 26-8 victory over Hawaii.

### 26-yard line

Pacific's new-found passing game resulted in an electrifying 74-yard pitch-and-run TD play between Carlos Brown and Jackie Diggs against San Jose St. in 1973. The game resulted in a 21-21 tie.

### 27-yard line

After a Steve Spiro safety with just 1:00 remaining against Los Angeles St. in 1972, Willard Harrell returned the ensuing free kick 73 yards to punctuate Pacific's seventh consecutive win, the Tigers' longest streak since 1979. PACIFIC beat the Diablos 36-21 and Harrell's return remains one of the longest in school history.

### 28-yard line

A 1985 scoring parade with Fresno St. began for Pacific on a 72-yard pass connection from Greg Murphy to Gene Thomas. The pass play lifted Pacific to a 7-3 lead and an eventual 31-19 first half advantage in front of its home crowd. The teams combined for 975 yards in total offense as PCAA champ FSU outscored the Tigers 43-37 in Stockton.

### 29-yard line

QB Bill Strycula recorded the Tigers' longest run of 1976, and the longest ever by a Pacific QB, with a 71-yard TD jaunt against Long Beach State.

### 30-yard line

The longest pass play of 1981 featured a throw from Grayson Rogers and the lone reception of the season by sophomore Bill Wolsky, covering 70 yards against San Jose State. It was the final score of a 40-25 loss.

### 31-yard line

Grayson Rogers found speedy sophomore Gary Parcells for a 69-yard score at Aloha Stadium in 1981 against Hawaii. The touchdown handed Pacific a 7-0 lead en route to a 23-17 win in the final game of '81.

### 32-yard line

In a game mostly remembered for its offensive exploits, defensive back Troy Reeves sparked with a 68-yard interception return to give Pacific a whopping 61-37 lead at Cal St. Fullerton in 1990.

### 33-yard line

In what was the second of three straight PCAA cliffhangers, Kirby Warren bolted 67 yards up the right sideline to open the scoring against Fresno St. in 1982. FSU booted a 23-yard field goal with 4:13 to play to break a 27-27 tie and win the game.

### 34-yard line

Ignited by a Tommy Purvis interception return for a 66-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter, the Tigers scored 21 points in the final period to turn away Utah St., 33-7, for the first time in nine years.

### 35-yard line

Pacific blitzed New Mexico St. in 1990 with 564 passing yards including a 65-yard TD from Troy Kopp to Aaron Turner midway through the third period. It was Kopp's third of six TD passes on the day and raised the Tiger lead to 41-24.

### 36-yard line

Stifling humidity turned into a heavy downpour during warmups that dropped more than three inches of rain in less than three hours while Pacific sloshed its way to a 24-15 victory over Hawaii at Aloha Stadium. A key play in the game was Hue Jackson's 64-yard scoring pass to Gene Thomas in the third quarter, lifting the Tigers to a 24-6 advantage.

### 37-yard line

If Fresno St. started at its own 1-yard line in its 1973 game against Pacific, and added all its rushing and passing yards for the game, this is as far as the Bulldogs would have gotten. The Tigers held FSU to just 62 yards in total offense during a 42-0 romp.

### 38-yard line

After a lengthy delay at Stockton's airport while waiting for plane repairs — and arriving in El Paso just two hours before kickoff — the Tigers rode the electrifying exploits of sophomore Willard Harrell to their first victory of 1972, and the first of seven-in-a-row. Harrell scampered 62 yards for Pacific's first score en route to a 19-14 win at UTEP.

### 39-yard line

Against Nevada in 1949, halfback Eddie Macon took a pitch around right end and outran two Nevada defenders 61 yards to the goal. Pacific won the game 47-6.

### 40-yard line

Pacific downed the Spartans 24-7 in 1977 with the help of a 60-yard punt return by Joe Conron. It was the Tigers' first win against the Spartans since 1974, and the first at San Jose since 1967.

### 41-yard line

Trailing 35-34 to Portland St. on Homecoming 1990, and facing 3rd-and-10 from his own 41, Troy Kopp launched a game-winning pass to Aaron Turner for a 59-yard TD. The conversion by Brian Hilborn was good, and Pacific prevailed in a heart-stopper, 41-35.

### 42-yard line

Against San Diego St. in 1949, the man of the evening was Eddie Macon who highlighted the 62-14 win with a 58-yard punt return in the third quarter.

### 43-yard line

A third quarter, nine-play drive beginning at its own 47 broke a scoreless tie and sent Pacific on to a 13-7 win over San Jose St. in 1954.

### 44-yard line

Aaron Turner caught the first of three long-distance TDs with a 56-yard scoring pass from Dave Henigan at New Mexico St. in 1992. He also had TD catches of 30 and 69 yards. He ended with five catches for 170 yards while breaking the NCAA record for career TD receptions.

### 45-yard line

One of the most spectacular plays of 1984 came when junior cornerback Tommy Purvis swiped a pass and romped 55 yards untouched for a Pacific touchdown. It was the third of four Tiger touchdowns that quarter to mark the highest scoring third period (28) in Pacific history. The Tigers downed the Lumberjacks 38-28.

### 46-yard line

The elusive Willard Harrell sped 54 yards on the final play of the first half to stake Pacific to a 14-14 tie with San Jose St. in the 1972 Homecoming Game. He also had a 55-yard score during the first possession of the second half as Pacific downed the Spartans 38-28.

### 47-yard line

Dick Bass broke into the clear, faked a Cincinnati safety, and went all the way for a 53-yard score in 1956 to help Pacific to a 21-15 win over the Bearcats.

### 48-yard line

In the first of three consecutive wins over BYU, Dick Bass took a Herman Urenda lateral and got COP on the board early with a 52-yard run during the Tigers' first possession. COP led 8-0 and cruised to a 26-8 victory.

### 49-yard line

Against Utah St. in 1992, Ryan Benjamin's 51-yard run through tacklers and down the left sideline tied the game at 28 in the third period. In the final game of his career which saw him compile 239 rushing yards and 402 all-purpose yards, R.B. later tied the game again with a three-yard score. The Aggies' 40-yard FG with 0:18 to play overshadowed an unbelievable ending to a remarkable career.

### 50-yard line

Facing 4th and 12 from midfield in the 1949 win over Nevada, Eddie LeBaron gambled and it worked. He passed to John Rohde from punt formation who swiveled the remaining 40 yards into the end zone for a 28-0 halftime advantage.

## OPPONENT

### 49-yard line

The longest field goal in Pacific history? Stefan Schroeder 59-yard field goal vs. Colorado St. in 1968 was his third of the day and helped the Tigers to a 31-0 win — still one of Pacific's largest road wins ever against a Division I opponent.

### 48-yard line

At Cal St. Fullerton in the final game of 1985, senior Kurt Heinrich caught a 48-yard scoring pass from Hue Jackson to cut the Titan lead to 29-23 early in the third quarter.

### 47-yard line

Aaron Turner's second TD catch of the second quarter, a 47-yard pass from Troy Kopp, helped him tie a school record with four TD receptions at UNLV in 1991. Pacific cruised to a 44-23 victory at the Silver Bowl.

### 46-yard line

COP's eighth straight victory of 1949 came in a 45-0 drubbing of Fresno St.. "Bronco" Bruce Orvis' 46-yard jaunt made the score 33-0 on the final play of the third quarter.

### 45-yard line

Facing 4th-and-8 from the Sacramento St. 45-yard line, and Pacific punter Brian Jones in to punt, up-back Mike McMaster executed a perfectly-timed fake punt for a 45-yard TD run in 1988.

### 44-yard line

Leading 20-0 in COP's surprise smearing of Chicago in 1938, Tiger tackle Irvin Grubbs returned an interception unmolested for a 44-yard score midway through the fourth period. The Tigers' 32-0 win highlighted an emotional return to Chicago for Amos Alonzo Stagg.

### 43-yard line

The longest field goal in Stagg Memorial Stadium history? Ken Norgaard nailed a 63-yard first quarter attempt against Cal St. Fullerton in 1984.

### 42-yard line

Already boasting a 35-0 halftime lead over Fresno St. in 1973, L.J. Douglas intercepted a Bulldog pass and rambled 42 yards on the first possession of the second half. Pacific never looked back while burying the 'Dogs 42-13.

### 41-yard line

Senior quarterback Paul Berner found Lionel Manuel for a 41-yard score in the 1983 opener at Oregon. The score gave the Tigers a 14-0 lead and spurred Pacific to a 21-15 upset.

### 40-yard line

Most fans know of Bob Lee as the one-time QB who journeyed through 14 years in the NFL. But a kicker? Yes, including a then-school record kick of 50 yards against Colorado St. in 1967. Lee's kick remained a stadium record for Pacific kickers until 1984.

### 39-yard line

Truly one of the most exciting games ever played at Stagg Memorial Stadium, Pacific emerged the victor in a knock-down, drag-out slugfest with Fresno St. in 1987. Mark Gran's second field goal of the fourth quarter and third of the day, a 49-yarder with 4:16 remaining, provided the difference in a 23-22 Homecoming thriller.

### 38-yard line

The San Diego St. game of '91 will always be remembered for Marshall Faulk's NCAA record 386 yards rushing and seven touchdowns. But not to be outdone, Pacific's Ryan Benjamin rushed for 167 yards and two TDs, and caught five passes for 53 yards and another score. Benjamin's 38-yard run just into the fourth period helped bring Pacific back from a 40-21 deficit and to within six points before eventually falling at Jack Murphy Stadium.

### 37-yard line

At the Orange Bowl, Pacific's Randy Whited intercepted a pass at the Miami 37 to setup a Frank Alegre field goal and an early Tiger lead in 1977.

### 36-yard line

One of the finest days ever by a Pacific placekicker saw Scott Kinney tie a school record with four field goals against Utah St. in 1982. Kinney scored all 12 of Pacific's points and his 46-yarder with 1:26 to play in the first half handed the Tigers a 9-0 lead.

### 35-yard line

Defending NCAA all-purpose running champ Ryan Benjamin got a quick start in pursuing his second straight title. "The Ryan Express" burst past Fresno St. defenders for a 35-yard scoring run to tie the 1992 season opener at 14.

### 34-yard line

On COP's first possession of the 1948 Raisin Bowl against Wichita St., Eddie LeBaron found John Rohde for a 34-yard scoring pass. The score pulled the Tigers within 7-6 of the Shockers, on their way to a 26-14 win.

### 33-yard line

COP's third touchdown of the day against Cincinnati in 1949 was a 33-yard strike from Eddie LeBaron to John Rohde. The Tigers' 21-0 lead gave way to a 34-7 win and 518 yards in total offense.

### 32-yard line

John Derr's 42-yard fourth quarter FG, his second 42-yarder of the evening, lifted Pacific to a 26-25 win over Long Beach St. in 1989.

### 31-yard line

Pacific stormed back from a 16-0 deficit at San Jose St. in 1991 to knot the rival Spartans at 40-40 on a 31-yard third quarter scoring pass — and a subsequent two-point conversion — from Troy Kopp to Aaron Turner. The Spartans later prevailed, 64-47, in the largest combined score in Pacific history.

### 30-yard line

Making the first start of an all-star career, freshman Mike Merriweather recovered a Fresno St. fumble at the Bulldog 30-yard line. Five plays later, Pacific scored its go-ahead touchdown during a 27-7 Tiger victory in 1978.

### 29-yard line

Placekicker Scott Kinney booted three second half field goals — including a 39-yarder with 1:47 remaining — to help withstand a Hawaii rally in 1981.

### 28-yard line

A 38-yard field goal by freshman Jeff Council was his first of three on the day and gave Pacific a 3-0 lead at Iowa St. in 1979. What later transpired was a 24-7 rout of the Cyclones in what was Pacific's first ever win over a Big Eight school.

### 27-yard line

In 1979, freshman QB Sander Markel connected with TE Mike House from 27 yards out to give the Tigers their first lead, 24-17, against Cal Poly-SLO. It set the stage for Bob Toledo's first win as PACIFIC head coach.

### 26-yard line

Trailing 14-9 at San Jose St. in 1967, Bob Lee found Jack Morrison for a 26-yard score and the Tigers' first lead. Lee kicked the extra point himself and Pacific proceeded to outscore the Spartans 25-0 during the final quarter to clinch a 34-14 win.

### 25-yard line

Mitchell True's 25-yard TD run secured a 36-26 win over UC Davis in 1972, and helped cap one of the most memorable rushing days in Tiger history. Beginning with a 62-yard TD run in the second quarter, True eventually broke Pacific and PCAA records with 310 rushing yards on 37 carries. His yardage total was the national single game high for 1972, and catapulted True over the 1,000-yard mark on the final day of the season.

### 24-yard line

In Amos Alonzo Stagg's final college football game, vs. North Texas St. in the 1946 Optimist Bowl in Houston, the Tigers knotted the score 7-7 midway through the third period when tackle Art Brown recovered a fumble at the North Texas 24-yard line. Bruce Orvis threw to John Rohde for the tying score, but a missed extra point and an NTSU score gave the Eagles a 14-13 victory.

### 23-yard line

Jason Schouten's 33-yard fourth quarter field goal at San Jose St. in 1993 was the final score in a 24-20 victory, Pacific's first over the Spartans since 1983.

### 22-yard line

At Baton Rouge in 1972, #1 LSU was thwarted in its opening drive and forced to punt from its own 22-yard line. Steve Spiro's blocked punt was recovered by Ric Russell in the endzone for a Pacific lead just 1:50 into the game. Spiro's block was memorable, but LSU prevailed 31-13.

### 21-yard line

In a game featuring almost 900 total yards, it was the team that scored last that would prevail in this 1982 contest with UNLV. A time-consuming, 12-play, 68-yard drive resulted in Scott Kinney's decisive 31-yard field goal with 3:37 remaining, lifting Pacific to a 29-27 win.

### 20-yard line

Jason Edwards' 20-yard TD pass from Troy Kopp in 1991 was part of a Stagg Memorial Stadium record 63 points against Cal Poly-SLO.

### 19-yard line

Sophomore Jeff Council calmly booted a 29-yard field goal with three seconds left to lift Pacific to a 24-22 upset win over Washington St. in 1980, the Tigers' first win over a Pac-10 opponent since 1969.

### 18-yard line

Who would ever have known that this pass would be the first of an NCAA record 33 TD passes between Pacific QB Troy Kopp and WR Aaron Turner? Freshman Kopp connected with freshman Turner for an 18-yard second quarter score in a 1989 loss at San Jose St.

### 17-yard line

Freshman receiver Kurt Heinrich hauled-in a 17-yard pass from Harley Miller to score the winning touchdown, over Long Beach St. at Anaheim Stadium in 1981. Heinrich's score came with 1:17 remaining in the contest.

### 16-yard line

With his second interception for TD in two games, L.J. Douglas picked off a Hawaii pass and carried it 16 yards for the game-clinching TD with 4:55 left in the game in 1973. Pacific defeated the previously unbeaten and no. 2-ranked small college powerhouse Rainbows 28-3.

### 15-yard line

The first collegiate play for tailback Anthony Simien was a memorable one. Simien threw a 15-yard scoring pass to Ron Woods to lift Pacific to a 24-21 advantage at Northern Arizona in 1984. The play was Pacific's second of four TDs in the quarter.

### 14-yard line

Grayson Rogers' 14-yard pass to Paul Schreiner pushed the Tigers to a 14-7 halftime edge over UTEP in 1980. It was Rogers' second TD pass of the quarter and helped earn him PCAA offensive player of the week honors as Pacific downed the Miners 28-14.

### 13-yard line

A 23-yard field goal by Mark Gran gave Pacific an early lead during a 1987 loss to Long Beach St. Gran later kicked a 35-yarder for a 6-3 Pacific advantage, but LBSU scored a late touchdown to dampen Pacific's first-ever appearance on ESPN.

### 12-yard line

Two 12-yard scores by Al Namanny marked Pacific's Division I-A beginning in 1969. On the first possession of the season, Namanny scored on a 12-yard run for the Tigers' only TD in a 14-10 loss at UTEP. In the home opener against Western Michigan one week later, John Read found Namanny for a 12-yard score in the Tigers' first Division I triumph.

### 11-yard line

In what is arguably the biggest upset in Pacific history, Harley Miller found Paul Schreiner for an 11-yard score with 4:38 remaining to clinch the Tigers' 23-21 win over South Carolina in 1981.

### 10-yard line

Homecoming stars of 1991 were Troy Kopp and Aaron Turner after a 10-yard pass play with 0:05 remaining lifted Pacific to a 27-20 win over New Mexico St. It was their second TD of the day, and after flooding delayed the game for two hours, Pacific sloshed through swampy Stagg Stadium for a soggy, dramatic victory.

### 9-yard line

Pacific scored first in a 36-34 slugfest with Weber St. in 1985, but played catch up the rest of the way until Ken Norgaard's 19-yard field goal with 3:33 to play lifted the Tigers to a win.

### 8-yard line

Troy Kopp threw his 7th touchdown pass of the game at Cal St. Fullerton in 1990 on this 8-yard reception by Daryl Hobbs. Pacific won 56-28 with Kopp completing 31 of 52 passes for 515 yards and Pacific registering 747 yards in total offense.

### 7-yard line

In one of the more memorable upsets in Pacific football history, Tim Richardson caught a 7-yard touchdown pass from Hue Jackson to set the stage for a 24-20 win at Minnesota in 1986. Jackson hit Richardson for Pacific's third TD of the first half as the Tigers built a 21-7 lead at the intermission. It is Pacific's only win ever against a Big Ten opponent.

### 6-yard line

It wasn't dramatic, and it came during a 20-13 loss to Colorado St. in 1978, but Bruce Parker's six-yard pass to Paul Schreiner — Parker's 17th of the season — broke Eddie LeBaron's 31-year record for single season touchdown passes. Parker also broke Pacific's season record for pass completions.

### 5-yard line

Tom McCormick's second of three touchdowns, a third quarter five-yard run, staked College of the Pacific to a 20-0 lead in the 1953 Sun Bowl against Mississippi Southern. Pacific won 26-7 in its second straight New Year's Day bowl game.

### 4-yard line

Fullback Steve Michaels rushed for 109 yards and scored on a 4-yard run early in the third period to stake the Tigers to an 18-3 lead over UNLV in 1986. Pacific held off a late Rebel rally for a 21-15 victory.

### 3-yard line

Capping one of the most prolific single game efforts in Tiger history, Ryan Benjamin scored a 3-yard TD against Utah St. in 1992 to mark the last of his career. Leading a fierce comeback bid to tie the Aggies heading to the fourth period, R.B. had a 63-yard run even later to put Pacific in position for a game-winning field goal attempt. It missed and enabled USU to kick a game-winning FG.

### 2-yard line

The first player in NCAA history to lead the country in rushing, scoring, and total offense, Dick Bass scored the last of his school record six TDs with a two-yard run in the fourth quarter at San Diego St. in 1958. Pacific won 68-17 with Bass running for five TDs and catching a pass for another.

Halfback Bruce Orvis crashed over the goal line on a one-yard plunge that was all the scoring College of the Pacific would need as the Striped Cats defeated USF 7-6 in the 1949 season opener.

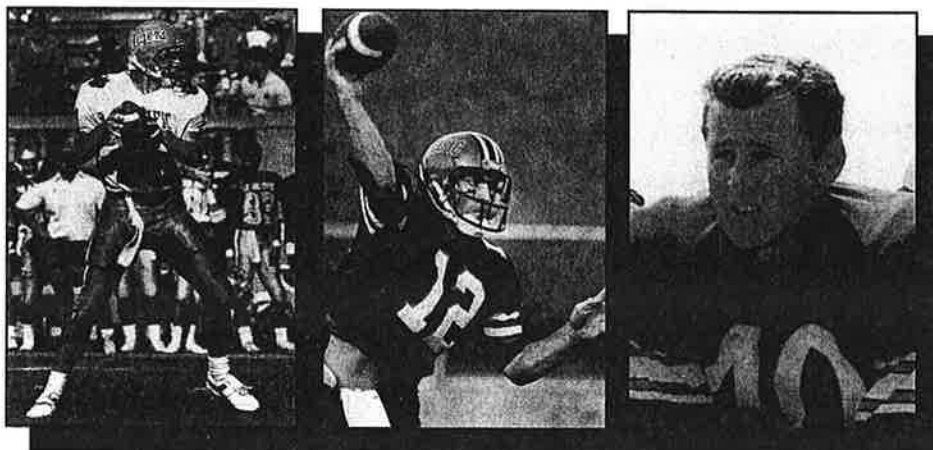
