VIKINGS OPEN BIG SKY SCHEDULE WITH MONTANA

Still seeking its initial victory of the season, the Portland State Viking football program opens its Big Sky Conference schedule with no less an opponent than Montana. The Vikings and Grizzlies will meet for the first time in two seasons when they kick it off at Hillsboro Stadium on Saturday at 2 p.m. The game has been moved to Hillsboro due to a scheduling conflict with the Portland Thorns soccer club at Providence Park.

PSU is 0-3 on the season, with losses to BYU, Oregon State and UC Davis. The Vikings come off a bye week.

Montana is 2-2 on the season, having beaten Valparaiso and Savannah State and lost to Washington in non-conference games. Last Saturday the Griz opened their conference schedule with a 48-41 home loss to 11th-ranked Eastern Washington. After leading 24-6 at halftime, Montana gave up 42 second-half points.

Portland State won the most recent meeting between the schools, 35-16, on Oct. 31, 2015 in Providence Park.

Montana leads the Big Sky series with Portland State, 15-3, including a 6-3 edge in Portland. The Grizzlies have played the Vikings twice previously in their alternate home of Hillsboro Stadium. Montana won both times, 33-21 in 2000, and 23-21 in 2010.

Over the next two weeks, the Vikings will hope to pull off the same double they achieved two seasons ago when they defeated both teams from the Treasure State. After playing Montana this week, the Vikings travel to Montana State for an Oct. 7 game. In 2015, PSU beat Montana State, 59-42, then Montana, 35-16. The Vikings have achieved that feat only one other time previously (1999).

But, in order to win both, you have to get the first one. That has the Vikings focusing on Montana this week.

Portland State alternates home/road over the next eight weeks as it plays its Big Sky Conference schedule. Opponents in order are: Montana, Montana State, Northern Arizona, Idaho State, North Dakota, Cal Poly, Weber State and Eastern Washington. The Vikings were picked to place ninth by the coaches and 10th by the media in the Big Sky's preseason polls. Montana was picked sixth among 13 teams in both polls.

STORYLINES

- Montana and Portland State have played only twice in the last four years due to the expanded Big Sky Conference.
- PSU has beaten Montana three times in its 18 Big Sky meetings. All three wins have come at Providence Park (1999, 2004, 2015).
- The Grizzlies have been nationally-ranked every season the Vikings have played them in Big Sky competition. The Vikings were nationally-ranked five times.
- Linebacker Josh Buss led the Big Sky Conference in tackles for loss last season with 20. Buss and fellow linebacker Connor Strahm were named All-Big Sky Conference last season, as was offensive lineman David Reese.
- Montana led the Big Sky in total defense (350.6 yards per game) and sacks (2.55 per game) in 2016.

SCOUTING THE GRIZZLIES

Montana has opened the season at 2-2, with a Big Sky Conference opening loss last Saturday to Eastern Washington, 48-41. The Grizzlies, under third-year Head Coach Bob Stitt, were 6-5 last season.

Despite the loss of starting quarterback Reese Phillips in game three, the Grizzlies offense is still a powerhouse. Redshirt freshman quarterback Gresch Jensen has taken over. He threw for 358 yards and two touchdowns against the Eagles.

Montana averages 450.0 yards and 37.2 points per game. Top receiver Jerry Louie-McGee leads the team with 17 receptions and 250 yards. Jeremy Calhoun is the leading rusher with 63 carries for 226 yards and three touchdowns.

The only weak spot to the offense so far this season has been taking care of the ball. The Grizzlies have committed nine turnovers leading to 42 opponent points.

Montana's defense has forced eight turnovers, leading to 35 points. However, the Griz have proven susceptible to the pass, allowing 332.2 yards per game. Overall, Montana gives up 456.8 yards and 34.2 points per game.

James Banks leads the team with 41 tackles. Linebacker Josh Buss, an All-Big Sky Conference linebacker last season, has 39 stops, three sacks and an interception.

Montana has 14 sacks through four games, led by defensive lineman Tucker Schye's four QB takedowns. Defensive back Ryan McKinley has six pass breakups.

LAST MEETING, Oct. 31, 2015: #12 Portland State 35, #17 Montana 16

It was all treats and no tricks for 12th-ranked Portland State as the Viking running game ground down 17th-ranked Montana on Halloween.

PSU rushed for 339 yards of its 460-yard total offense. Running back David Jones (165) and quarterback Alex Kuresa (119) both had big performances on a rainy afternoon. Kuresa ran for two touchdowns and threw for two more.

The defense played a huge role as well. Safety Patrick Onwuasor intercepted three passes in successive Montana possessions in the first quarter. That allowed the Vikings to get out to a lead they never relinquished. The Griz were held to 294 total yards on 83 plays. Onwuasor added eight tackles.

ON THIS DATE: Sept. 30, 2006

The Vikings last played on Sept. 30 in 2006. That game was also against Montana in Providence Park. The Grizzlies won 26-20 in a game that featured nine turnovers between the teams as neither offense was dominant. The loss ended a nine-game home winning streak for PSU, which was missing starting QB Sawyer Smith and starting RB Mu'Ammar Ali. The Vikings are 4-4 on Sept. 30, dating back to 1957 (previous game dates not available).

THE VIKINGS ON TELEVISION

PSU is scheduled to have six games televised this season (ESPN, Pac-12 Network, Root (2), Eleven Sports (2)). That ranks as the second-most games available locally in school history (there were nine in 2012). PSU is 22-42 all-time on television since joining Division I (1996). The Vikings are 14-15 at home and 8-27 on the road.

QUICK SNAPS

WINS, LOSSES, AND THE BIG SKY

- Portland State is 0-3 this season, 0-1 at home, 0-2 on the road.
- Portland State is playing its 25th season at the NCAA I FCS level (1978-80 (1-AA), 1996-2017). PSU is 126-145 in all games at the FCS/1-AA level.
- Now in its 22nd season since moving back to FCS and the Big Sky Conference (1996-2017), PSU is 107-131, 69-45 in home games, 38-86 on the road.
- As a member of the Big Sky Conference (1996-2017) PSU is 70-93 all-time in league games, 42-40 at home, 28-53 on the road.
- The Vikings have nine winning records in 21 years as a member of the Big Sky Conference.
- Bruce Barnum (2015-16, 8-8 Big Sky, 12-14 overall) is the Vikings fourth Head Coach in the Big Sky Conference era. Previous coaches were: Tim Walsh (1993-2006, 42-41/90-68 all-time); Jerry Glanville (2007-09, 7-17/9-24); and Nigel Burton (2010-15, 13-27/21-36).
- The Vikings have never won a Big Sky title, but have tied for second five times (four times under Walsh and in 2015 under Barnum). PSU has made two NCAA FCS playoff appearances (2000, 2015).
- PSU's best record ever at the FCS level was 9-3 in 2015 (4-2 at home, 5-1 on the road).

IT'S ABOUT THE WINS: Portland State went 9-2 in the regular season in 2015. Since that time, the Vikings are 3-12. Included was an NCAA playoff loss, four losses to FBS opponents, an overtime loss, and four losses by a touchdown or less.

LOOKING FOR BETTER STARTS: The Vikings have been outscored 24-6 in the first quarter and 45-12 in the first half of games so far this season. PSU has come back to win third quarters 27-20, and has lost fourth quarters 27-13.

TRUE FRESHMEN FEATURED ON 2017 VIKINGS: A total of 11 true freshmen have been a part of the active roster so far this season. Included are QB Jalani Eason, RB Antwone Williams, LB Dylan Hanley, S Anthony Adams, S Ryan Swanson, TE AJ Ruffin, RB Jason Talley, K Noah Brosio, P Hayden Cowden, DT Semise Kofe and LB Nicolas Ah Sam... Eason, Williams, Ruffin, Talley, Brosio, Hanley, Cowden and Kofe have all played.

- In all, PSU has played 26 underclassmen (true freshmen, redshirt freshmen, sophomores).
- Last season, Portland State played six true freshman on defense, in part due to numerous injuries. DE Kenton Bartlett, DT Anthony Del Toro, DT Sione Taumoe'anga, CB Montre Brown, LB Devin Thompson and DE Mason Vega all played... the Vikings also played true freshmen TE Charlie Taumoepeau and LS Riley Shackelford (who handled every special teams snap).

JUST CALL HIM MR. FIRST DOWN: SO TE Charlie Taumoepeau is the Vikings' leading receiver this season with 13 catches for 164 yards.

- Taumoepeau had career-highs of six receptions for 73 yards at BYU.
- All 13 of his receptions have been good for first downs. Four of those were third-down plays, and one was a fourth-down play.

OLD MAN RIVER KEEPS ON FLOWING: Head Coach Bruce Barnum likes to call SR WR Darnell Adams "Old Man River." Why? Well, Adams is in his sixth season at Portland State, and will turn 24 years old on Nov. 15. In the off-season Adams was granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA due to losing two seasons to injury (2013 - knee; 2016 - foot).

- Adams has eight catches for 99 yards and three touchdowns this season. He caught TDs of eight and 10 yards against UC Davis.
- Adams is PSU's career leader in receiving with 63 catches for 962 yards and 10 touchdowns in 37 career games played.

RUN, PASS, CATCH - JOSH KRAGHT DOING JOSH KRAGHT THINGS: SR WR/QB Josh Kraght began his Portland State career as a quarterback, earning three starts at the position as a freshman. However, the past two seasons he has played slot receiver and punt returner while remaining a backup QB. Kraght has played slot receiver again this year but has also seen time at quarterback in the past two games. In the fourth quarter against Oregon State

Bruce Barnum begins his third season as Portland State Head Football Coach and his eighth year overall with the program in 2017.

Barnum has the distinction of earning FCS National Coach of the Year and Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year in 2015 after leading PSU to its best season ever at the Division I level (9-3). The season included wins over FBS Washington State and North Texas, and five nationally-ranked FCS teams. The Vikings had their best season in Division I history (9-2) before losing to Northern Iowa 29-17 in the FCS Playoffs.

The Vikings were 3-8 in 2016, battling tough luck all season with a myriad of injuries and five close losses in the final moments of games.

In his two seasons as Head Coach, Barnum has molded the team in his image; tough, blue-collar and fundamentally-sound, instituting #BarneyBall.

Barnum spent his first five seasons at PSU as the Vikings' offensive coordinator. In his five seasons as offensive coordinator, the Vikings had tremendous success. In 2013, PSU set school-records for total offense (6,486 yards), offense per game (540.5), rushing offense (3,330 yards), rushing offense per game (277.5) and rushing touchdowns (36) while maintaining balance in the attack with 263.0 yards per game in the air, leading the nation in yards per completion (16.7). Portland State ranked third in the nation in total offense (first in the Big Sky) and third in rushing offense (second in the Big Sky). The Viking program has averaged 200+ rushing yards per game in all seven seasons that Barnum has been on the Park Blocks.

Though this is Barnum's first head coaching position, he has more than 25 years of coaching experience and 15 years as an offensive coordinator. Barnum is the 14th head coach in the 71-year history of Portland State football.

Kraght nearly led the Vikings to a win, scoring a go-ahead touchdown with 2:43 remaining on a five-yard run. For the game, he had three receptions for 82 yards and touchdowns of 42 and 37 yards. He added eight carries for 50 yards and a TD. And, he completed 4-9 passes for 59 yards. That's a total of 191 yards and three TDs.

- His line for 2017 includes five receptions for 106 yards and two touchdowns, nine rushing plays for 63 yards and a touchdown, and 5-13 passing for 75 yards. That is a total of 244 yards and three touchdowns so far this season.
- In 2016, Kraght led the team with 36 receptions for 518 yards and a touchdown. He had eight rushing plays for 47 yards and a touchdown, 11 punt returns for 64 yards, and completed 3-5 passes for 125 yards and a touchdown... for his career, Kraght has been a quadruple threat:
- He has completed 58-117 passes for 721 yards, three touchdowns and three interceptions.
- Kraght has rushed 62 times for 341 yards and four touchdowns.
- Kraght has 57 career receptions for 851 yards and four touchdowns.
- He has 28 punt returns for 153 yards.
- In total, he has accounted for 2,066 yards and 11 touchdowns.

DEFENSE HAS MADE GREAT STRIDES: Although the defense took a step back against UC Davis, it has shown improvement in 2017. The Vikings allowed only 20 points and 365 yards to BYU, then 35 points (though seven came on an interception return) and 389 yards to Oregon State. That is an average of 377 yards and 27.5 points per game against two FBS programs... UC Davis tacked 490 yards and 37 points on the Vikings, although 14 points came directly from punt blocks.

- PSU is currently allowing 414.7 yards and 30.7 points per game. Last year PSU gave up 39.5 points and 478 yards per game against all opponents.
- JR S Artuz Manning has a team-high 26 tackles this season. He had a game-high 10 tackles and a forced fumble at Oregon State, then nine stops against UC Davis.
- SR LB Beau Duronslet has 23 tackles this season. Duronslet is the Vikings' active career leader in tackles with 208. With an interception and a fumble recovery (both leading to Viking scores) against OSU, Duronslet now has five takeaways in his career. He was named Big Sky Defensive Player of the Week for Sept. 2.
- SR DE Davond Dade made four tackles, with two for losses, including a sack, a forced fumble and a quarterback hurry against BYU, earning Big Sky Conference Defensive Player of the Week honors.
- The Vikings have 12 pass breakups, including four by SR CB Donovan Olumba and three by SR CB Chris Seisay.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES:

- Portland State started three freshmen on special teams with P Hayden Cowden, PK Noah Brosio and KO Thomas Ciobanasiu in the first game. FR K Graycen Kennedy played at Oregon State, attempting a 46-yard game-tying field goal with three seconds left. It was wide right by only a few feet. He got the start at kicker against UC Davis.
- Cowden has averaged 44.1 yards on 15 punts. He had a 70-yarder against BYU and was named Big Sky Conference Special Teams Player of the Week.
- SR WR/KR Kahlil Dawson now ranks fourth all-time in kick return yards at Portland State with 1,291.
- The Vikings are still trying to solve some special teams woes with the young group of specialists. That includes three missed extra points, two missed field goals and two blocked punts.

arship at the team's first meeting on the eve of 2016's first football practice. He has the Arthur Dickson Memorial Scholarship.

- After walking on at Portland State last winter, SO TE Cameron Loos (New Mexico State transfer) and FR RB Jason Talley (Jesuit HS) were given scholarships after the completion of spring football.
- SR WRs Darnell Adams and De'Sean Parsons have already completed their degrees and graduated but have one year of eligibility remaining.
- SR WR Darnell Adams was granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA due to multiple season-ending injuries (2013 and 2016) that ended his seasons prematurely.
- Walk-on SR WR De'Sean Parsons played the past two seasons on the Viking basketball team. He was named third team All-Big Sky Conference in 2016-17 after leading the Vikings in scoring (14.3) and rebounding (6.2). The 6-7, 200-pounder will take a shot at the wide receiver position.
- Portland State has 10 players on the roster that were formerly members of FBS programs.
- SR DT Will Dawson cut his hair a week before he began practice at Portland... as a freshman in 2013. He has not cut it since.
- Portland State had a pair of former players meet in the Super Bowl for the first time in history in February 2014. TE Julius Thomas ('10, Denver) and DB DeShawn Shead ('11, Seattle) both played in Super Bowl XLVIII. Shead returned to the Super Bowl in 2015 with the Seahawks. He joins Clint Didier and Ted Popson as former Vikings with Super Bowl rings. Thomas was named a Pro Bowl tight end in 2013 and 2014. In the 2014 off-season, he signed the richest tight end contract in the NFL to play for the Jacksonville Jaguars. Thomas is now with Miami. Shead, a starting corner with the Seahawks in 2016, is currently recovering from an ACL injury.
- Other Vikings currently on NFL rosters are LB Patrick Onwuasor (Baltimore Ravens), CB Xavier Coleman (NY Jets), OL Cornelius Edison (Atlanta Falcons), and LS Kameron Canaday (Pittsburgh Steelers).

PRESEASON RECOGNITION: SR LT Randin Crecelius and SO DT Anthony Del Toro were selected to the preseason All-Big Sky Conference team, and named preseason All-Big Sky by College Sports Madness. Crecelius was named second team All-American on College Sports Madness' Preseason list as well... SR QB/WR Josh Kraght was named third team at wide receiver, as was SR RT Tyshon Mosley.

NEW STAFF: Portland State Head Coach Bruce Barnum has added Hansen Sekona, David Lose and Colin Fry to his coaching staff for 2017. Lose has been named the new defensive line coach after working the previous six seasons at Washington State. Sekona was a graduate assistant at Washington where he worked with the 2016 Pac-12 Champion Huskies. He became the new linebackers coach. Fry comes from Cal where he was a graduate assistant the past four seasons. He will be a defensive assistant for the Vikings.

VIKINGS NAME FOUR TEAM CAPTAINS: In a vote by the Viking players last week, four seniors were selected to be team captains for the 2017 season. They are: WR/QB Josh Kraght, WR Darnell Adams, DE Davond Dade, LB Beau Duronslet.

MOST DIFFICULT SCHEDULE IN THE BIG SKY? COULD BE THE VIKINGS

Based on this season's preseason polls (SEE PAGE 20), the Vikings have the most difficult conference schedule in the Big Sky (not to mention non-conference games with BYU and Oregon State). Using the poll rankings of each team, the Vikings face the most difficult combination of opponents (as a side note, PSU DOES play UC Davis, however it is a non-conference matchup). PSU plays all four of last season's FCS playoff teams: Eastern Washington, North Dakota, Cal Poly and Weber State.

In the hyper-competitive 13-team Big Sky Conference it is more about the teams you AVOID on your schedule in a given season than the teams you play. The teams with the easiest schedules (based on the rankings) are Northern Arizona and Cal Poly. Both of those schools avoid the top two in the rankings, defending co-champions Eastern Washington and North Dakota.

SCHEDULE NOTES

- Year in and year out Portland State football has one of the most challenging Football Championship Subdivision schedules in the country, and 2017 will be no different. The Vikings will open the season with a pair of FBS opponents sure to be popular with local fans, and conclude with four straight opponents who were participants in this year's FCS Playoffs.
- This is the eighth time that Portland State has played at least two FBS level programs in the same season (the Vikings played three in 2006).
- Portland State does not play a lower division school this season. The Vikings are 15-0 in games against lower division opponents since moving to Division I in 1996.
- Despite this being PSU's 71st season of football, the Vikings faced BYU for just the first time in history.
- PSU faces only five teams in 2017 that were on the schedule in 2016 (UC Davis, Idaho State, Cal Poly, Weber State, Eastern Washington). The Vikings went 2-3 against those teams.
- Due to the 13-team Big Sky Conference, Portland State plays four league teams it did not see in 2016: Montana, Montana State, Northern Arizona and North Dakota. The Vikings see three other opponents cycle off their schedule in 2017: Southern Utah, Northern Colorado and Sacramento State.
- The 2017 NCAA I FCS playoffs, which includes 24 teams, begin on Nov. 25.
- The University of Idaho will rejoin the Big Sky Conference as a football-playing member in 2018.

GET ON THE BUS: THE AMERICANA TOUR

Portland State Football Coach Bruce Barnum is renowned for taking his team on the bus to as many road games as possible. He calls it "The Americana Tour." It has made for some long bus rides, but Barnum often lets his team out to see the sights. He also feels it promotes team unity (and saves a few dollars in the budget). In the past two years, PSU has logged 9,300 bus miles.

Alas, this season's bus trips will be limited to just three, with drives to Oregon State, Idaho State and Eastern Washington. Portland State's trip to Corvallis was a mere 168 miles round trip.

- Coach Barnum led his first "Americana Tour" in 2015, which included bus rides to Pullman, WA, Pocatello, ID, San Luis Obispo, CA, and Cheney, WA. In all, the Vikings logged 4,394 bus miles and approximately 80 hours round trip to those four destinations (PSU also flew on two road trips). The Americana Tour included such things as dozens of on-bus movies, a stop to buy a lottery ticket on the way home from beating Washington State, a practice on Boise State's blue turf, a sight-seeing trip to Alcatraz (in which equipment manager Mike Haluska was left on the island... but soon retrieved), and a midnight McDonald's run at a lonely truck stop in eastern Oregon. In addition to the economy of the bus trips, Barnum contends the time together draws the Viking team closer.
- The 2016 Americana Tour included round trips to San Jose, Seattle and Sacramento (twice). There was also a return bus ride from Ogden, UT and a shorter trip from Las Vegas to Cedar City... the trip to San Jose was a total of 1,340 miles. It included a stop off at Oregon Wildlife Safari and the obligatory In-and-Out Burger visitation in Medford... on the trip to Southern Utah, PSU flew into Las Vegas, took in the Criss Angel Show at the Luxor Hotel and made another midnight In-and-Out run... while traveling to Weber State, PSU visited Temple Square and the Hogle Zoo... after a pair round trips to Sacramento (UC Davis and Sacramento State), PSU had accumulated 4,906 bus miles for the season.

2017 SEASON HIGHLIGHT REEL

TWO NAMED BIG SKY PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Defensive end Davond Dade and Punter Hayden Cowden each earned Big Sky Conference Player of the Week honors for their performance against BYU (8/26). Dade, a senior from Los Angeles, proved to be a harassing force on the Viking line all afternoon. He registered four tackles, two for losses and a sack, and a quarterback hurry. The sack produced a fumble, though the Vikings were unable to recover. PSU held BYU to 365 yards and 20 points, a vast improvement from last year's defense. Cowden, a true freshman from Twin Falls, ID, was playing in his first game as a Viking. He averaged 47.9 yards per punt on seven attempts, with a long of 70 yards. His punts were effective as BYU had -5 return yards on the day.

BIG PLAY BEAU IS BIG SKY POTW: Portland State senior linebacker Beau Duronslet was named the Big Sky Conference Defensive Player of the Week following his performance in a 35-32 loss at Oregon State on Sept. 2. Duronslet, from Portland's Central Catholic High School, made eight tackles in the game. He also intercepted a pass and recovered a fumble in the third quarter against the Beavers. Both takeaways led to touchdowns by the Viking offense. His performance was part of an excellent Viking effort that nearly scored a major upset.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT PORTLAND STATE AND VIKING FOOTBALL

Portland State University, located in Portland, OR, is the second-largest school in the state of Oregon with 29,057 students. It was founded in 1946 as Vanport College - a two-year institution.

Athletically, Portland State began as a junior college in 1946-47, but competed in the Oregon Collegiate Conference at the NAIA level from 1950 to 1964, winning three OCC football titles (1962, 1963, 1964). PSU became a four-year institution in 1955.

Portland State joined the NCAA in 1965 and competed at the College Division level (the forerunner of NCAA II). PSU was an NCAA 1-AA member from 1978-80, then moved back to Division II in 1981, where it competed through the 1995 season. The Vikings were members of the Western Football Conference from 1982 to 1992, winning six conference championships. PSU made eight NCAA II playoff appearances from 1987 to 1995.

In 1996, Portland State moved to the Big Sky Conference and up to the NCAA 1-AA (now FCS) level. The Vikings made their first playoff appearance at their current level in 2000. In 2015, Portland State had its best season ever at the Division I level, compiling a 9-3 record and reaching the NCAA playoffs. Portland State has nine winning records and a 68-87 conference record in 20 seasons in the Big Sky.

Portland State's football program has produced such legendary figures as Coach Mouse Davis, quarterbacks Neil Lomax and June Jones, Tom Oberg (the first Viking to play in the NFL), Coach Pokey Allen (who led the Vikings to two NCAA II National Championship appearances), and some 30 players who have appeared in the NFL.

In 2014, three former Vikings reached NFL Championship games: Julius Thomas with Denver, DeShawn Shead with Seattle and Jordan Senn with Carolina. Thomas and Shead went on to meet in Super Bowl XLVIII with their respective teams and Shead became a Super Bowl Champion - just the third former PSU Viking to do so (Clint Didier, Ted Popson). Shead made a return appearance to the Super Bowl in 2015, while Thomas was selected to his second Pro Bowl in as many years. He later signed a free agent contract with the Jacksonville Jaguars, making him the highest paid tight end in the NFL.

Portland State football plays at Providence Park, an off-campus stadium in downtown Portland that has a capacity of 18,627.

Provo, UT - Portland State took BYU to the fourth quarter of their season-opening game, leaving the 55,000 fans at Lavell Edwards Stadium with some doubt in their minds. But the Cougars hung on, tacking on two late field goals for a 20-6 win.

The Vikings knew they were up against one of the nation's top defenses - at least based on last season's results - and BYU defense lived up to expectations. The Vikings defense showed up as well and that's what made it a close game until the late-going.

"We executed the plan (today)," said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum. "We are young but I feel we really have a good football team. This team played a helluva game today and we are going win a lot of football games.

"I knew we had a young defense, but today they showed me they can fight. They showed me they are tough. That was my question (going in)."

Brigham Young out-gained the Vikings 365 yards to 220 overall on a 96-degree day. PSU's young defense showed tremendous growth over last year's team that allowed 478 yards per game.

Most of the first quarter was an exchange of punts. The Cougars finally broke through on a drive with a pair of big pass plays by quarterback Tanner Mangum. He hit Matt Bushman for a 36-yard gain, then Neil Pau'u for a 28-yard touchdown with 2:01 remaining in the quarter.

BYU scored again midway through the second quarter. Tailback Squally Canada scored on a one-yard touchdown run. It was the culmination of an eight-play, 66-yard drive for the Cougars and the Vikings trailed 14-0.

Portland State got on the board late in the half, going 17 plays and 87 yards for a score. Twice in the drive, freshman quarterback Jalani Eason completed passes on fourth down to keep the series alive. He threw his first college TD pass a moment later with a four-yarder to senior wide receiver Darnell Adams.

The defensive struggle continued through the third quarter as neither team could score. BYU finally got back to a two-score lead on a 27-yard field goal by Rhett Almond at the 13:22 mark of the fourth quarter. Still, trailing 17-6 with just under four minutes to play, the Vikings had a glimmer of hope. That is until Zayne Anderson intercepted Eason on a tipped ball at midfield.

The Cougars tacked on a late field goal for the final 20-6 score.

Eason completed 16-36 passes in his first career start. He had 134 yards, one touchdown and one interception. His main target was sophomore tight end Charlie Taumoepeau, who caught six balls for 73 yards.

Za'Quan Summers led the running game with 20 carries for 55 yards.

On defense, senior linebacker Beau Duronslet had 11 tackles. Senior safety Tyler Foreman made nine stops. Senior defensive end Davond Dade made four tackles, including a sack and forced a fumble.

For the Cougars, Mangum completed 16-27 passes for 194 yards and one TD. Fred Warner made 10 tackles on defense.

GAME NOTES: As a team, the Vikings broke up six passes, including three by Chris Seisay... the Vikings had eight true freshmen on the trip to BYU, five of whom played.

Corvallis, OR - Get the game to the fourth quarter... get it to the final play. Give yourselves a chance.

The Vikings did all of that on Saturday at Reser Stadium and nearly made history. But it was not as Oregon State held off Portland State's drive in the final seconds, winning 35-32, on a hot, steamy day.

Portland State controlled the line of scrimmage for most of the game, totaling 515 yards, including 291 rushing yards. Oregon State gained 389 yards, and the Viking defense did a good job of corraling star running back Ryan Nall, who managed just 59 yards on 16 carries.

But three turnovers and an inability to convert an extra point on their first two touchdowns proved costly for the Vikings. The Beavers only scored seven points of PSU's three mistakes, but one came in the red-zone on a handoff. A second costly error was failing to score any points on a first-and-goal situation from the OSU one-yard line in the second quarter.

To the Beavers' credit, trailing 32-28 inside the final three minutes, they were able to mount a go-ahead touchdown drive. Quarterback Jake Luton hit receiver Isaiah Hodges on a 17-yard touchdown pass with 1:08 to play. It was the culmination of a seven-play, 77-yard drive. OSU led 35-32.

The Vikings tried to counter in the closing seconds. With senior Josh Kraght at quarterback due to an injury to starter Jalani Eason, they almost pulled it off. Kraght led the previous scoring drive that put the Vikings ahead 32-28. He rushed five times for 26 yards and completed two passes for 30 yards in that series.

But now it was crunch time. Again Kraght was effective, gaining 24 yards on three carries and completing two more passes for 29 yards. That left the Vikings at the OSU 29-yard line with three seconds remaining. Due to PSU's early kicking difficulties, Head Coach Bruce Barnum went with a backup on a 46-yard field goal attempt to tie the game. Redshirt freshman Graycen Kennedy had the distance, but was wide right by a mere two feet. Oregon State won the game.

Still there was nothing for the Portland State players to hang their heads about, playing up against an FBS opponent from the Pac-12. The Vikings were better offensively than week one, and the defense again kept them in the game early, forcing four three-and-outs in the first half.

"They were tough, mentally and physically," said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum. "There was a lot of adversity out there with momentum changes, a couple turnovers. But the defense responded to that. And then the offense responds with some big plays and touchdowns drives. We played some good football. I was proud of the way they responded."

Senior linebacker Beau Duronslet was a key player for the Vikings, allowing PSU to turn a 14-6 halftime deficit into a lead in the third quarter. He made an interception that led to a 10-play scoring drive, trimming the deficit to 14-12. On OSU's next series, Duronslet recovered a fumble and the Vikings scored on the very next play, a 12-yard run by Eason. That had the Vikings up 20-14 midway through the third quarter.

Oregon State came back with two quick scores and led again, 28-20. Then Eason found Kraght, who was playing slot receiver, on a 37-yard touchdown pass. It was Kraght's second long TD reception of the game. With 2:43 remaining, Kraght's one-yard run had PSU up 32-28 and set up the thrilling closing moments.

For the game, Kraght caught three passes for 82 yards and two scores. He rushed nine times for 54 yards and a touchdown, and completed 4-9 passes for 59 yards. Kraght's play under pressure in the late-going was most impressive, considering he had not been taking snaps in practice for the past three weeks.

"He's a stud," said Barnum. "He was calm, cool. If it was a little shorter field (in the end), he may have found a way to win that game. We went to Josh knowing he would give us a chance to win the game. And he gave us a chance."

Eason was 11-18 passing for 164 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions before coming out early in the fourth quarter with injury. The freshman QB also had 11 carries for 95 yards and two scores.

Senior Za'Quan Summers led all players in rushing with 18 carries for 106 yards.

On defense, the Vikings were solid, holding a second straight FBS opponent under 400 yards. Safety Artuz Manning had a team-high 10 tackles and forced a fumble. Duronslet made eight stops and the two takeaways. Linebackers Sam Bodine and Kasun Jactett each made seven tackles.

GAME NOTES: Although just his sixth career game, Summers had his second 100-yard performance... tight end Charlie Taumoepeau had four receptions for 52 yards. He leads the team with 10 catches this season... the Vikings are now 0-5 all-time against the Beavers, 4-36 vs. FBS opponents.

UC DAVIS 37 PORTLAND STATE 14

Portland, OR - All the promise of two tough performances against FBS programs disappeared in a flurry of mistakes as Portland State fell 37-14 in its home opener against UC Davis at Providence Park Saturday.

The Vikings played both Brigham Young and Oregon State tough in their first two games, but against the Aggies Saturday they committed all the mistakes coaches hate to see: Two blocked punts, a fumble, missed blocking assignments and a critical personal foul that kept a UCD drive alive just when PSU didn't need it to happen.

"We got outplayed. We got whupped," said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum. "I don't think that is my football team (today) after what we saw in the prior two games... there was no rhythm, no energy, but UC Davis outplayed us."

UC Davis rose to 2-1 for the season. The Vikings dropped to 0-3 pending their Sept. 30 Big Sky Conference game against Montana at Hillsboro Stadium.

The problems started at the beginning. The Vikings ground their offensive gears all during the first half while the Aggies built a 17-0 lead and took control of the game.

Only a couple of red-zone stands stood between the Vikings and oblivion as the Aggies moved the ball up and down the field almost at will. The visitors rolled for 295 total yards, most conspicuously through the air as quarterback Jake Maier hit 13 of 19 passes for 195 yards.

The Vikings, in the meantime, used three different tailbacks and managed 116 rushing yards in the first two quarters — 36 on second-quarter cruise by quarterback Jalani Eason.

But PSU struggled when it was time to throw, hitting only 4 of 14 passes for a paltry 41 yards. The Vikings moved senior Josh Kraght in from wide receiver to quarterback for the last drive of the second quarter to try to get something going.

The Aggies drove all the way to the PSU 5 yard line on the opening possession of the game, but the Vikings stiffened and UC-Davis had to settle for a 22-yard field goal by Max O'Rourke. The Vikings turned the ball over on downs on their first possession and the Aggies pounded on the door once again, but PSU doused the drive on a fourth-down run that came up short at the Portland State 5.

The Vikings barely had time to exhale after the stand, though. They ran three plays out to their own 14 and set up to punt, but Ryan Parenteau broke through for a clean block of Hayden Cowden's kick. Darryl Graham picked it up with nobody around him at the PSU 9 and walked in for a touchdown that gave his team a 10-0 lead with a 1:44 left in the first period.

The two teams traded blows into the latter part of the second quarter before the Aggies struck for a third time. UCD pinned the Vikings back inside their own 10 yard line and got the ball at the PSU 49; from there, it took the Aggies just three plays.

The last of those was a sideline pass from Maier to Aaron Moore, who caught the ball at the 8 yard line, deked out two Vikings defenders and walked into the end zone with 3:36 left in the half. Portland State's only scoring chance died in the middle of the second quarter when Graycen Kennedy's 42-yard field goal attempt drifted a bit too far left.

The halftime break did the PSU offense some good. The Vikings took the opening kickoff of the third quarter 65 yards on a more-or-less straight line in 12 plays for a touchdown that closed the Aggie lead to 10.

Darnell Adams got the touchdown from the 8 yard line when he sliced across the middle and Eason hit him for the score.

The score got the Vikings on the board, but it didn't turn anything around. They held serve twice, but Parenteau struck for a second time late in the third period when he slithered in and blocked Cowden's punt again.

That set the Aggies up at the PSU 15, but the PSU defense rose up to stop them — almost. The Vikings stopped Namane Modise on a third-down run, but a Vikings defensive personal extended the drive. Three plays later the Aggies were in the end zone again on Maier's short pass to Ethan Hicks.

The Aggies scored twice more in the fourth quarter to establish a 37-7 lead and run away with the game.

Eason salvaged some dignity for PSU with a late 72-yard drive that ended with a 10-yard pass from Eason to Darnell Adams.

Davis ran up 490 total yards against the Vikings' defense. Maier wound up hitting 24 of 32 pass for 316 yards. The Vikings ran for 246 yards, but hit only 12 passes in 31 attempts for just 115 yards.

Freshman Jason Talley had a big day for the Vikings with 77 yards on 14 carries.
