VIKINGS GET THE JOB DONE AT HOME, NOW MUST PROVE SELVES ON THE ROAD

The Portland State will try to carry their recent success with them as they play away from home for the next two weeks. The Vikings, 4-3 overall, 2-1 in the Big Sky Conference, have won their last two and three of four overall. They are 4-0 at home including a 24-0 whitewashing of Idaho last Saturday at Hillsboro Stadium.

This week, the Vikings will look for their first road win of the season (0-3) as they play at Northern Colorado for the first time since 2015. The Bears are just 1-6 on the season, but their most recent home game was a victory over Idaho as well, 27-24. They have played five of seven games on the road so far.

Portland State beat Northern Colorado last year, 35-14, in the Vikings' final home game ever at Providence Park. A solid defensive performance in that one set the tone, however current Bears' quarterback Jacob Knipp was unable to play in the game due to injury. Knipp led a win over the Vikings as a freshman in 2015.

At 4-3, Portland State has already matched last year's win total (4-7). A win this week would get the Vikings to the most victories since the 2015 playoff season (9-3).

While Portland State's offense has proven to be balanced and highly productive, the defense has been grabbing a lot of headlines. The shutout over Idaho last Saturday was the first for PSU in a Big Sky Conference game since 2006 - a span of exactly 100 league games. The Vikings lead the Big Sky in total defense (324.4) and are fourth in scoring defense (23.3). Meanwhile, Northern Colorado ranks last in the Big Sky in scoring (16.0) and 12th in total offense (320.3).

PSU is currently tied for fourth in the 13-team Big Sky Conference at 2-1. Montana, Sacramento Staet and Weber State all sit at 2-0. Montana travels to Sacramento State this week. Although not ranked, Portland State received voting points in both the coaches and media national Top 25 polls this week.

Saturday's game at Northern Colorado kicks off at 1 p.m. MT/Noon PT. The game is televised on Eleven Sports (DirecTV Channel 623, AT&T Uverse Channel 1665, Verizon FiOS Channel 597, Google Fiber Channel 251) and Pluto TV Channel 541. Portland State live audio of the game can be found at www. GoViks.com/Watch.

STORYLINES

- Each team has had success at the opponents' home in this series. Among Big Sky Conference games, the series is tied 3-3 in Portland. The Vikings lead 3-1 in Greeley, although their last trip (2015) was a 35-32 loss
- Prior to PSU's 35-14 win last year, the previous seven meetings between the teams have been decided by seven points or less.
- Northern Colorado has five all-time wins in the series with the Vikings, but has never won by more than seven points. Other wins have come by a margin of one, five, four and three.
- Former Viking quarterback Neil Lomax set Portland State records for pass completions (44) and attempts (77) in a 1979 21-20 loss to the Bears. Lomax passed for 499 yards.

LAST MEETING, Oct. 13, 2018: Portland State 35, Northern Colorado 14

Davis Alexander scored on three touchdowns runs in just over 16 minutes and by halftime the Vikings led the Bears, 28-0, in PSU's final appearance at Providence Park.

Although the Northern Colorado offense passed for 351 yards, the Viking defense made three interceptions, two of which led to eventual PSU touchdowns. The Vikings also had 10 tackles for loss and five sacks in the game.

Portland State's big first-half lead led to a conservative approach the rest of the way and Northern Colorado out-gained the Vikings, 367-282. Alex Wesley caught 11 passes for 163 yards and a touchdown to lead the Bears. Montre Brown led the Vikings with eight tackles and had one of PSU's three picks.

SCOUTING THE BEARS

Northern Colorado is led by eighth-year Head Coach Earnest Collins, Jr. Collins is 27-68 all-time with the Bears, but holds a 3-2 advantage in games against Portland State.

This season Northern Colorado is 1-6 overall, 1-2 in the Big Sky, with the lone win over Idaho. A challenging slate has included five of seven on the road with games at San Jose State, Washington State, Sacramento State and Eastern Washington.

UNC averages 320.3 yards and 16.0 points per game on offense. While the running game has produced less than 100 yards per contest, quarterback Jacob Knipp has been effective, completing 59% of his passes for 1,447 yards, five touchdowns and only three interceptions.

Senior wideout Willie Fairman has led the receiving corps with 31 catches for 271 yards and two touchdowns. Senior tailback Milo Hall has 540 rushing yards and six touchdowns. He ranks fifth in the Big Sky in yards.

On defense, the Bears are giving up 39.6 points and 521.1 yards per game, both of which rank last in the Big Sky Conference. What Northern Colorado has done well is force turnovers, gathering seven interceptions and three fumbles from their opponents.

WINS, LOSSES, AND THE BIG SKY

- Portland State is 4-3, 4-0 at home, 0-3 on the road.
- 2019 is Portland State's 27th season at the NCAA I FCS level (1978-80 (1-AA), 1996-2018). PSU is 134-162 in all games at the FCS/1-AA level.
- PSU is competing in its 24th season since moving back to FCS and the Big Sky Conference (1996-2019). PSU is 115-149 in that span, 75-52 in home games, 40-97 on the road.
- As a member of the Big Sky Conference (1996-2019) PSU is 75-106 all-time in league games, 45-47 at home, 30-60 on the road.
- The Vikings have nine winning records in 23 previous years as a member of the Big Sky Conference.
- Bruce Barnum (2015-19, 13-22 Big Sky, 20-32 overall) is the Vikings fourth Head Coach in the Big Sky Conference era. Previous coaches were: Tim Walsh (1993-2006, 42-41/90-68 all-time); Jerry Glanville (2007-09, 7-17/9-24); and Nigel Burton (2010-15, 13-27/21-36).
- The Vikings have never won a Big Sky title, but have tied for second five times (four times under Walsh and in 2015 under Barnum). PSU has made two NCAA FCS playoff appearances (2000, 2015).
- PSU's best record ever at the FCS level was 9-3 in 2015 (4-2 at home, 5-1 on the road).

VIKING DEFENSE PITCHES A SHUTOUT AGAINST VANDALS

With the major league baseball playoffs in full swing, Portland State decided to join the fun and pitch a shutout – except on the football field. The Vikings used dominant defense to whitewash the Idaho Vandals, 24-0, last Saturday at Hillsboro Stadium. PSU shut out a Big Sky Conference team for the first time since Oct. 21, 2006, when PSU throttled Eastern Washington, 34-0. It was a span of exactly 100 Big Sky games since PSU's last shutout over a league opponent (Portland State has shut out two lower division teams since that time in 2011 and 2015). Idaho's defense was good as well and remarkably, the game was scoreless at halftime. But the Vikings took advantage of an early third-quarter turnover by the Vandals to get on the board. PSU's Cody Williams kicked a 38-yard field for a 3-0 lead. PSU's defense followed with a three-and-out stop of Idaho on the next series. That led to the first touchdown drive of the game on the longest offensive series of the day. The Vikings went 91 yards on eight plays, highlighted by a 29-yard run by quarterback Davis Alexander. Two plays later, the Viking QB dropped back to pass, saw nobody open, and took off. He weaved his way through the Vandal defense for a 21-yard scoring run and a 10-0 lead. Later, Alexander took the Vikings on a decisive 10-play, 80-yard march. The clincher was a 28-yard touchdown pass over the middle to Davis Koetter. PSU led 17-0 with 10:51 to play and the Vandals couldn't respond. PSU tacked on a late touchdown on a 21-yard pass from Alexander to Emmanuel Daiqbe. This one was all about the defense. Portland State, which leads the Big Sky in total defense, held Idaho to 236 yards of total offense and intercepted four passes. The Vikings had 10 tackles for loss, six sacks and broke up four passes. Sophomore safety Anthony Adams had a big day with five tackles, two interceptions and two pass breakups. Also getting picks were safety Sam Inos and cornerback Deon Crayon. Joseph, who got the start at rover in place of the injured Romeo Gunt, had a big day with a team-high six tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and was in on two sacks.

FLY SWATTER

SO S Anthony Adams had a game defensive backs dream about against Idaho. Adams intercepted two passes, batted a third into a teammate's hands for another pick, added a second pass breakup and made five tackles as the Vikings shut out the Vandals. That performance further enhanced Adams' 2019

- Adams has 11 pass breakups and three interceptions this season, both of which lead the Big Sky Conference. His 14 passes defended LEADS THE NATION.
- The 11 pass breakups already ranks sixth on the Portland State all-time season list. The record for a
- Adams has 18 career pass breakups in 18 games. He is already seventh all-time at PSU (record, 33).
- The Newberg native now has four career interceptions and five career takeaways.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

Portland State's defense accomplished a feat none had been able to over the past 13 seasons when it shut out Idaho, 24-0. It had been exactly 100 games since the last shutout of a Big Sky opponent (34-0 over Eastern Washington, Oct. 21, 2006 - PSU has shutouts of two lower division teams since that time in 2011 and 2015). The Vikings held Idaho to 236 total yards, had 10 tackles for loss, six sacks, four interceptions and broke up four passes. SO ROV David Joseph led the Vikings with six tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.

• The Vikings continue to lead the Big Sky Conference in fewest yards allowed (324.4) and rank fourth in



HEAD COACH <u>BRUCE BARNUM</u>



Bruce Barnum is in his fifth season as Portland State Head Football Coach and his 10th year overall with the program in 2019.

Barnum has the distinction of earning FCS National Coach of the Year and Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year in 2015 after leading PSU to its best season ever at

the Division I level (9-3). The season included wins over FBS Washington State and North Texas, and five nationally-ranked FCS teams. The Vikings had their best season in Division I history (9-2) before losing to Northern Iowa 29-17 in the FCS Playoffs.

In his time as Head Coach, Barnum has molded the team in his image; tough, blue-collar and fundamentally-sound, instituting #BarnyBall.

Barnum spent his first five seasons at PSU as the Vikings' offensive coordinator. In his five seasons as offensive coordinator, the Vikings had tremendous success. In 2013, PSU set school-records for total offense (6,486 yards), offense per game (540.5), rushing offense (3,330 yards), rushing offense per game (277.5) and rushing touchdowns (36) while maintaining balance in the attack with 263.0 yards per game in the air, leading the nation in yards per completion (16.7). Portland State ranked third in the nation in total offense (first in the Big Sky) and third in rushing offense (second in the Big Sky). The Viking program has averaged 200+ rushing yards per game in all seven seasons that Barnum has been on the Park Blocks.

Though this is Barnum's first head coaching position, he has more than 25 years of coaching experience and 15 years as an offensive coordinator. Barnum is the 14th head coach in the 72-year history of Portland State football.

points allowed (23.3). PSU is first in rushing defense (97.1), which also ranks 15th in the nation.

- PSU has 12 takeaways this season and a +5 turnover margin. The Vikings have 38 points off turnovers while opponents have just 14.
- In a win over Southern Utah on Oct. 5, PSU had a decisive four-TD stretch in the second quarter against the T-Birds. In that time, the defense limited the Thunderbirds to 10 plays, 29 yards and no first downs. In all, the defense had four three-and-outs and three forced turnovers in the game. SO DE Jake Porter made a career-high eight tackles against Southern Utah. JR LB Dylan Hanley had a career-high seven stops.
- The Vikings have held 10 of the last 16 opponents to 20 points or less. The have held four of seven opponents to 20 or less this season. Seven of the last 12 Division I opponents have scored 20 points or less.
- The Vikings have 52 tackles for loss, 19 sacks, 30 pass breakups and 12 takeaways in seven games this
- SR DE Shawn Richard (3.5) and SR DTs Anthony Del Toro (3) and Kenton Bartlett (3) lead the Vikings in sacks this season.
- SR ROV Romeo Gunt had a career-high 15 tackles fourth-most tackles in the nation for the weekend - in the game against Arkansas. Gunt was named Big Sky Conference Defensive Player of the Week... despite missing the Idaho game, he and JR S Sam Inos lead the Vikings with 34 tackles this season.
- Portland State set two new school records against Simon Fraser. The -65 rushing yards allowed broke the previous mark of -21 by Western Washington in 1981; the 20 tackles for loss broke a mark of 18 set against Humboldt State in 2013. Fifteen different players were involved in the TFLs. PSU made eight sacks, led by three from SR DT Kenton Bartlett, nine pass breakups and forced two fumbles. SO S Anthony Adams broke up four passes and blocked a field goal for good measure. The defense even scored a touchdown when FR LB David Joseph pounced on a fumble in the end zone. The ball had been knocked loose on a quarterback sack by SO LB Robert Holt.
- The Vikings held Simon Fraser to -23 total yards over the last three quarters of the game. The seven points allowed were the fewest since a 66-7 win over North Texas on Oct. 10, 2015 – 42 games prior.
- Eastern Oregon was allowed only 133 yards of total offense.

ALEXANDER STARTS TO ROLL UP THE NUMBERS

JR QB Davis Alexander is putting up pretty good numbers this season considering he didn't play more than three quarters in any of the first four games. Alexander has gone almost the entire way in the last three games.

- For the season, Alexander is 115-192 passing for 1,569 yards, 14 touchdowns and three interceptions.
- Alexander already has a career-high 14 touchdown passes and is completing a career-best 60% of his
- He leads the team with 68 rushes for 341 yards (456 positive yards) and three touchdowns.
- Alexander is on a strong four-game run, three of which have been Viking wins. He has accounted for 1,333 total yards (358.3) and 13 TDs over those four games... Alexander had 258 yards of total offense (167 passing, career-high 91 rushing), passed for two touchdowns and ran for a third in the win over Idaho... he was brilliant against Southern Utah, compiling 314 yards of total offense and accounting for three touchdowns. He completed 18-30 passes for 234 yards and two scores, and he rushed for 80 yards and a touchdown on seven carries... He had 340 yards of total offense (296 pass, 44 rush) and accounted for two touchdowns against Idaho State... Alexander passed for 366 yards and five touchdowns in the win over Eastern Oregon. The 366 yards were the most since his freshman season. The five TDs were the most by a Viking QB since Drew Hubel had five in a win over Eastern Washington in 2008.
- In 20 career starts, Alexander is 323-574 for 4,520 yards, 30 TDs and 12 interceptions... for his career (23 games), he is 331-587-13-4,588-30TD.
- Alexander has 224 career rushes for 885 yards and 17 TDs. He has 1,211 positive rushing yards.
- In all, Alexander is responsible for 47 career TDs.

THESE RECEIVERS ARE GROWING UP

An extraordinarily young receiving corps last season has grown up a lot in one year.

- SO WR Davis Koetter has 26 career receptions (team-high 22 this season) for 532 yards and seven touchdowns. He averages 20.5 yards per catch... this season, he has 22 receptions for 411 yards and five scores... he grabbed a career-high seven passes against Eastern Oregon... Koetter went for a career-high 108 receiving yards and a TD against Southern Utah and had a key fumble recovery on the punt coverage team.
- JR WR Emmanuel Daigbe ranks second on the team with 20 receptions for 268 yards and three TDs. He posted a career-high 109 yards against Eastern Oregon, totaling three catches, with touchdowns of 57 and 44 yards... in his 18-game career, Daigbe has 43 catches for 641 yards and seven TDs.
- SO WR Beau Kelly has 15 catches for 225 yards and three touchdowns. Kelly caught a career-long 61yard touchdown at Idaho State... he also has a team-best 52-yard running play on a fly sweep and 50 return yards on five punts.
- SO WR Mataio Talalemotu missed two games with a hamstring issue. But, he still has 13 receptions for 224 yards and two TDs... Talalemotu led the Vikings with five receptions for 78 yards, including a 52yard touchdown reception, at Boise State... for his career, he has 36 receptions for 626 yards and four TDs and two 100-yard games.

CHARTING CHARLIE

After missing two games with hamstring tightness, All-American tight end Charlie Taumoepeau put up his first 100-yard game of the season at Idaho State. Taumoepeau had seven receptions for 104 yards.

- In five games played Taumoepeau has 20 receptions for 239 yards, including a 32-yard touchdown at Arkansas.
- For his career, Taumoepeau now has 101 receptions for 1,641 yards (16.2) and 10 touchdowns.
- In his last 26 games played, Taumoepeau has 95 catches for 1,563 yards and nine scores.
- A consensus second team All-American last year, Taumoepeau was named preseason All-American by no less than four news outlets and is on the Walter Payton Award Watch list for the top offensive player in all of NCAA I FCS football.

A LOOK AT THE OFFENSE

Portland State's offense has averaged 443.3 yards and 36.0 points this season. The Vikings rank sixth in total offense and fifth in scoring offense in the Big Sky.

- The 52 points scored against Southern Utah were the most against a Division I opponent since a 59-42 win over 16th-ranked Montana State on Oct. 17, 2015. (PSU has scored more against lower division opponents three times since then).
- Portland State has run a "by committee" backfield with five players over 100 rushing yards, but SR RB Sirgeo Hoffman is starting to become Chairman of the Board. Hoffman leads the way with 78 carries for 336 yards (4.3) and five touchdowns. Hoffman had 24 carries for 81 yards and two touchdowns against Southern Utah... he had a career-high 88 rushing yards and a score at Idaho State. Hoffman would have had more but a 76-yard touchdown run was wiped off the board due to an illegal formation penalty... in the last four games, the Gresham native has 65 rushes for 282 yards and four touchdowns.
- Twelve different Vikings have rushed for positive yards and PSU averages 195.1 yards rushing per game.
- The Vikings' ball control offense possessed the pigskin for more than 34 minutes against Idaho. PSU leads the Big Sky in time of possession (ranking fifth in the nation) at 34:14.
- Portland State is converting third-downs at a 45% rate, and 4th downs at a 56% rate. The Vikings are 25-29 in the redzone (21 TDs, 4 FG).
- After having six turnovers in the first two games, the Vikings have only one in the last five.
- The Vikings' 70 points against Simon Fraser were the most since a 77-10 win over Idaho State in 2012.
 The Vikings amassed 646 yards of total offense (300 rushing/346 passing). Seven different players contributed 10 total touchdowns.
- Six different players had positive rushing yards and 10 made receptions in the win over Eastern Oregon. The Vikings totaled a season-high 657 yards.

KICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

SO K Cody Williams has picked up where he left off last season. At Arkansas the second-year kicker was 2-2 on field goals, hitting from 50 and 47 yards... with another field goal against Idaho, he is now 7-11 on the season.

- For his career, Williams is 18-25 on field goals, 66-66 on extra points... the PSU record for consecutive PATs is 77.
- Williams' 50-yarder at Arkansas was his second from 50+ in his career in two attempts. His long was a 52-yard game-winner at Montana in 2018 with four seconds left in the game (22-20).
- Williams has two of the 15 50+ yard field goals in school history. Only five players have two or more in their careers.

VERY SPECIAL TEAMS

Portland State special teams are performing well in 2019. Some notes:

- JR P Seth Vernon, in his first season as a Viking, is averaging 42.8 yards with five in excess of 50 yards. Vernon's average is the best by a Viking since 2014 when All-American Kyle Loomis averaged 46.0... Vernon ranks fifth in the Big Sky Conference and 18th in the nation.
- The Vikings are 7-11 on field goals and 33-33 on extra points this season.
- SO WR Beau Kelly is averaging 10.0 yards per punt return.
- **BLOCK PARTY:** SR CB Montre Brown blocked a field goal at Idaho State. It was PSU's second blocked kick of the season. SO S Anthony Adams blocked a field goal against Simon Fraser... PSU had five blocked kicks/punts last season.
- The Vikings have recovered one opponent fumble on punt returns (Davis Koetter).

YELLOW HANKIES HURTING

Portland State had its fewest penalties of the season against Southern Utah with five for 38 yards. However, one wiped a touchdown off the board. That marked the third time this season PSU has had TDs taken away on penalties (and proceeded to get only three points on those possessions). For the season, PSU has 60 penalties for 540 yards. With 77.1 penalty yards per game, the Vikings rank 11th in the Big Sky Conference.

NEW FACES ON THE FIELD

The Vikings had seven first-time starters at Arkansas. Included in the group were: SR LG Larry Brister, JR RG Babak Ghadaksaz, JR RT Daniel Giannosa, FR LB Zack Mandera, JR P Seth Vernon and the long snappers, JR Luke Fulford (punts) and FR Zach Phillipo (kicks)... against Simon Fraser, SO LB Robert Holt made his first career start.

- Brister is a great story, having walked onto the team in 2017. He saw limited duty mainly on special teams in 2018. In the off-season, Brister was awarded a scholarship, then earned the starting guard position during preseason camp.
- Zack Mandera is the only true freshman to start so far for the Vikings.
- In all, 14 players saw action for the Vikings for the first time at Arkansas: JR RB Evyn Holtz, JR RB Malik Walker, JR OL John Krahn, SR TE Jackson Davis, FR CB Greg Oliver, JR CB Arin Mannery, JR CB Ty Apana-Purcell, FR CB Benton Hoge, FR LB Zack Mandera, SO LB Moses Finau, SO DE Jarryn Bush, FR OL Zach Phillipo, JR LS Luke Fulford, JR P Seth Vernon... seven more players saw their first action against Simon Fraser: FR QB Dante Chachere, FR WR Marshaun Tucker, FR RB Kade Coons, FR LB Isaiah Henry, FR DE Kennedy Freeman, SO DE Jayson Pace and SO K Ward Bonnin... playing in their first game against Eastern Oregon were JR QB Nathan West, FR QB Jalen Chatman, FR WR Jerad Toman, JR S KJ Walker, FR LB Jay Tuinei and FR CB Emonte Scott.

OREGONIAN INFLUENCE

Portland State's defense has a decidedly Oregon flavor to it - at least among its starters. The seven players lined up closest to the ball on the first snap against Arkansas were all Oregonians. They included: SO DE Jake Porter (West Linn), JR DT Semise Kofe (Portland), SR DT Anthony Del Toro (Grants Pass), JR DE Noah Yunker (Bend), FR LB Zack Mandera (Roseburg), JR LB Nicolas Ah Sam (Springfield) and SO S Anthony Adams (Newberg).

• PSU started three Oregonians on offense and played 19 Oregonians in all among the 36 on the roster and the 57 players that got into the game.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- The Vikings return nine starters and 25 letterwinners on offense. They return eight starters and 19 letterwinners on defense. Two starters return on special teams. In all, 46 letterwinners and 15 redshirts return for 2019.
- The Viking roster consists of 19 seniors, 27 juniors, 20 sophomores and 33 freshmen (including 10 redshirt freshmen).
- Portland State signed 27 players in the off-season, 18 freshman and 9 transfers. Sixteen are defensive players, 10 are on offense and one is on special teams.
- There are 36 Oregonians on the roster and four players from just across the river in the Vancouver area.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT PORTLAND STATE AND VIKING FOOTBALL

Portland State University, located in Portland, OR, is the second-largest school in the state of Oregon with 28,407 students. It was founded in 1946 as Vanport College - a two-year institution.

Athletically, Portland State began as a junior college in 1946-47, but competed in the Oregon Collegiate Conference at the NAIA level from 1950 to 1964, winning three OCC football titles (1962, 1963, 1964). PSU became a four-year institution in 1955.

Portland State joined the NCAA in 1965 and competed at the College Division level (the forerunner of NCAA II). PSU was an NCAA 1-AA member from 1978-80, then moved back to Division II in 1981, where it competed through the 1995 season. The Vikings were members of the Western Football Conference from 1982 to 1992, winning six conference championships. PSU made eight NCAA II playoff appearances from 1987 to 1995.

In 1996, Portland State moved to the Big Sky Conference and up to the NCAA 1-AA (now FCS) level. The Vikings made their first playoff appearance at their current level in 2000. In 2015, Portland State had its best season ever at the Division I level, compiling a 9-3 record and reaching the NCAA playoffs.

Portland State's football program has produced such legendary figures as Coach Mouse Davis, quarterbacks Neil Lomax and June Jones, Tom Oberg (the first Viking to play in the NFL), Coach Pokey Allen (who led the Vikings to two NCAA II National Championship appearances), and some 30 players who have appeared in the NFL.

In 2014, three former Vikings reached NFL Championship games: Julius Thomas with Denver, DeShawn Shead with Seattle and Jordan Senn with Carolina. Thomas and Shead went on to meet in Super Bowl XL-VIII with their respective teams and Shead became a Super Bowl Champion - just the third former PSU Viking to do so (Clint Didier, Ted Popson). Shead made a return appearance to the Super Bowl in 2015, while Thomas was selected to his second Pro Bowl in as many years. He later signed a free agent contract with the Jackson-ville Jaguars, making him the highest paid tight end in the NFL.

Portland State football plays at Hillsboro Stadium, west of downtown, a 7,200-seat stadium.

SEASON HIGHLIGHT REEL

20 OR LESS

Portland State didn't win at Arkansas (8/31), but the defensive effort was worth noting. PSU held the Razorbacks under 400 yards, allowed only 20 points and allowed the Razorbacks to convert only 5-15 third downs. It was the seventh time in the last 10 games the Vikings held their opponent to 20 points or less. SR ROV Romeo Gunt had a career-high 15 tackles in the game to lead both teams. and was named Big Sky Conference Defensive Player of the week. He recorded the fourth-most tackles in the nation for the week. SO LB Robert Holt had a career-high seven tackles and the first takeaway of his career with an interception late in the first half. Holt was honored as the College Sports Madness Big Sky Conference Defensive Player of the Week.

A RECORD DAY IN VIKINGS FIRST WIN

Both offense and defense had big days in Portland State's 70-7 win over Simon Fraser (9/7). The Vikings rolled up 646 yards of total offense on its way to the most points scored in seven seasons and seventh-most in school history. However, the defense had the most notable performance. The Vikings held Simon Fraser to 113 yards of total offense and the seven points scored were the fewest allowed since 2015 - a stretch of 42 games. It was the eighth time in 11 games that Portland State had allowed 20 points or less. The Vikings had a school-record 20 tackles for loss and eight sacks. That contributed to another school record of -65 rushing yards allowed. The Viks also made nine pass breakups and forced two turnovers.

BIG DAY ON BOTH SIDES OF THE BALL

Portland State left little doubt from the first quarter on in a 59-9 win over Eastern Oregon (9/21). Heavy favorites against the NAIA Mountaineers, the Vikings validated that notion on both sides of the football. Portland State gained 657 yards of total offense and allowed just 133 yards to the Mountaineers. Quarterback Davis Alexander finished his day midway through the third quarter with 366 passing yards and five touchdowns. On defense, the Vikings forced six three-and-outs, seven punts and recovered one fumble against the Mountaineers. With only nine points allowed, PSU held the ninth of the last 13 opponents under 20 points.

OPPORTUNITY KNOCKED

Portland State took advantage of every opportunity in a 52-31 win over Southern Utah (10/5). The Vikings forced three turnovers and often had good field position and didn't miss the chance to convert. PSU scored 28 points during a 7:31 stretch of the second quarter, twice turning takeaways into touchdowns. That had the Vikings up 38-10 at halftime and led to an easy win. The 52 points were the most against a Division I opponent in four seasons. JR QB Davis Alexander had 314 yards of total offense and accounted for three touchdowns. Meanwhile the defense had a stretch of five stops, including three three-and-outs and two turnovers during the second quarter rally.

A RARE SHUTOUT

PSU's defense put the hammer down on Idaho's offense and the result was something the Vikings had not had since 2006 – A SPAN OF 100 LEAGUE GAMES – a shut out of a Big Sky opponent in 24-0 win over the Vandals (10/12). Defensive coordinator Payam Saadat's group led the Big Sky in total defense going into the contest and the Viking D improved on those numbers. The Vikings allowed just 236 total yards, picked off four passes, broke up four more, made 10 tackles for loss and six sacks in the victory. Sophomore safety Anthony Adams had another highlight game for the Vikings, intercepting two passes and breaking up two other passes to go with five tackles. Remarkably, one of his pass breakups was deflected into the waiting hands of junior free safety Sam Inos, giving him involvement in a third pick.

2019 SEASON NOTES

CAPTAINS NAMED

Portland State has named for captains for the 2019 season. They are SR TE Charlie Taumoepeau, SR DT Kenton Bartlett, JR QB Davis Alexander and SO S Anthony Adams. This is Taumoepeau's second season as a captain and will be his third as a Viking starter. Bartlett also begins his third season as a starter on the defensive line. Alexander is slated to be a starter at quarterback for the second season in a row. Adams, just a sophomore, is one of the top returners on the defense and will start again at safety.

CHUCK IN CHARGE: PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN, PAYTON CANDIDATE

If the reviews and previews are accurate, Portland State tight end Charlie Taumoepeau should be headed for a big senior season. Taumoepeau as he has been named a pre-season first team Division I FCS All-American by Stats Inc, Hero Sports, Athlon and Phil Steele. In addition, he has been named to the 25-player Walter Payton Award Watch List. The Walter Payton Award goes annually to the top offensive player in the nation at the FCS level (effectively the FCS version of the Heisman Trophy).

The 6-3, 245-pound senior from Federal Way, WA has been the Vikings top offensive threat the past

two years. Taumoepeau had 45 receptions for 673 yards and three touchdowns as a sophomore. It was the most receptions by a Viking tight end in 29 seasons. Last year, Taumoepeau started the season on fire, making eight receptions for 255 yards and four touchdowns in back-to-back weeks against Nevada and Oregon.

Taumoepeau was leading the nation in yards per catch (36.2) and touchdowns (5) after three weeks, but he later missed time with a mid-season ankle injury. Taumoepeau still finished with 28 catches for 580 yards and five scores, ranking sixth in the nation in yards per catch (20.7), first among tight ends. He was named a consensus second team All-American despite being limited due to injury.

For his career, Taumoepeau has 81 receptions for 1,402 yards and nine touchdowns. He is within reach of PSU's all-time top 10 for receptions and receiving yards going into his senior season. Taumoepeau is a two-time All-Big Sky Conference selection.

Other Big Sky Conference Players on the Payton Award Watch List include Troy Andersen (MSU), Eric Barriere (EWU), Case Cookus (NAU), and Jake Maier (UCD).

TAUMOEPEAU, BARTLETT NAMED PRESEASON ALL-BIG SKY

Portland State seniors Charlie Taumoepeau and Kenton Bartlett were selected to the Big Sky Preseason All-Conference team in voting by league media in July.

Taumoepeau, an All-American tight end, and Bartlett, an all-conference defensive tackle, will lead the Vikings into the 2019 season.

Bartlett and Taumoeapeau were among 29 players in the Big Sky Conference selected to the preseason All-Conference team.

Taumoeopeau is a two-time All-Big Sky performer at tight end. He was a consensus second team All-American pick in 2018, and has made preseason All-America lists in 2019. Taumoepeau, a 6-3, 245-pounder from Federal Way, WA, has 73 receptions, 1,253 yards and eight touchdowns in his last 20 games played.

Bartlett earned third team All-Big Sky Conference and Academic All-Big Sky honors in 2018. A fixture in the middle of the line, he has started 21 of 22 games the last two seasons. Bartlett, a 6-3, 270-pounder from Boise, ID, has 66 tackles and six tackles for loss over that span.

PHIL STEELE LIKES THE VIKS

Viking tight end Charlie Taumoepeau notched another preseason honor when he was named Preseason 1st team All-American by Phil Steele Publications. Taumoepeau was also named preseason Big Sky Offensive Player of the Year. He was on the All-Big Sky first team list. Earning second team All-Big Sky Conference were JR OL Korbin Sorensen, SR DT Kenton Bartlett and SR LB Romeo Gunt. On the third team list were JR DT Semise Kofe, SO K Cody Williams and SR LS Riley Shackelford.

A FULL-TIME MOVE TO HILLSBORO

Portland State Football moves to Hillsboro Stadium in 2019 as its full-time home venue. The Vikings join the Viking softball and soccer programs, which already use the Gordon Faber Recreation Complex in Hillsboro, as a full-time home.

The move to Hillsboro for football was made due to increasing challenges for home scheduling at Providence Park. Portland State had used Providence Park as its home venue since the 1960s. However, conflicts with Portland Timbers soccer in recent seasons had forced the Vikings to occasionally have to move out of the stadium for home games. In 2018, PSU played four of five home games at Hillsboro due to schedule conflicts.

The logistics and cost of moving back and forth between venues, and occasionally not knowing if Providence Park would be available (due to potential MLS post-season games), helped necessitate the move. Having Hillsboro as a consistent home should be more beneficial to the program, fans and staff, as well as be financially more prudent.

Portland State played the entire 2000 and 2010 seasons at Hillsboro due to construction at Providence Park. In 2018, the Vikings played four of five home games at Hillsboro, and has had some one-off games in recent years.

2019 SCHEDULE NOTES

- This is the 73rd season of Portland State football (1947). Due to the extra weekend before Thanksgiving this year, PSU will be playing a 12-game schedule for only the third time in school history (2013, 2014).
- Portland State played in front of 61,055 fans at Arkansas (8/31). It was the second-largest in PSU history. A crowd of 61,082 attended the Vikings game at Cal in 2006... Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium was the largest venue in which PSU has ever played (76,000).
- Year in and year out Portland State football has one of the most challenging Football Championship Subdivision schedules in the country, and 2019 will be no different. The Vikings play a pair of FBS opponents, Arkansas and Boise State, and face two Top-10 programs from 2018 - national runner-up Eastern Washington and UC Davis.
- This is the 10th time that Portland State has played at least two FBS level programs in the same season (the Vikings played three in 2006).
- Portland State played two lower division schools in 2019 (Simon Fraser, NCAA II; W, 70-7; Eastern Oregon, NAIA, W, 59-9). The Vikings are now 18-0 in games against lower division opponents since moving to Division I in 1996. This marks the first time PSU has played two lower division schools since 2013.
- PSU faces only five teams in 2019 that were on the schedule in 2018 (Idaho State, Idaho, Northern Colorado, Montana, Eastern Washington).
- In the Big Sky Conference's unusual 14-team format in 2019 (Idaho returned in football in 2018 and North Dakota has departed but remains in the scheduling rotation until 2020), Portland State faces just eight of the other 13 members. PSU will miss Big Sky schools Weber State, Montana State, Cal Poly and Sacramento State on their schedule in 2019. In addition, the Vikings will play Northern Arizona for only the third time in seven years and first time on the road in 2012.

THESE ARE NOT TYPOS

Yes, it's true. Viking newcomer John Krahn is 6-foot-10, 410 pounds. Would that make him the biggest Viking ever? Yes, it would. The biggest player in college football this season? Without scanning hundreds of college football rosters, we will say... possibly, probably.

Krahn is a junior college transfer from Riverside Community College. He played high school football at King HS in Riverside.

Perhaps just as interesting as Krahn's height and weight is his arm length. Krahn was measured at 36.5 inches arm length in the spring - a full three inches longer than any other player on the team. That reach should be handy while blocking on the offensive line.

Also on the line in 2019 is JR Daniel Giannosa. He moves over after two seasons at tight end to play offensive tackle. Giannosa came to PSU as a 6-8, 240-pound freshman. He now stands 6-9 1/2 and 280 pounds.

STAFF CHANGES

Portland State has added Skyler Fulton to its coaching staff as the new wide receivers coach. Fulton spent the past two seasons coaching with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

The Vikings lost a pair of coaches in the off-season. Nick Whitworth, formerly the special teams coordinator, moved on to a similar position at Texas State. AC Patterson, formerly the tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator, is now with the Minnesota Vikings.

Assistant coach Evan Mozzochi is now coaching quarterbacks and tight ends. He, along with defensive backs coach Colin Fry, are in charge of recruiting.

Defensive Coordinator Payam Saadat was elevated to the role of Associate Head Coach in the off-season as well.

REMEMBERING DEANTE

Deante Strickland never played a down for the Portland State Football team, but he will never be forgotten. Strickland, who played basketball for two seasons with the Vikings, earned his degree in June and was preparing to compete in football in his fifth year. But the former Central Catholic (OR) football and basketball star never got the chance. He died tragically on Aug. 2 at the hands of a senseless act of violence. Strickland was a popular and well-known Portlander for his athletic achievements. After competing at Casper College in Wyoming he came back to PSU and played two seasons of basketball, competing in 65 games for the Vikings. His love for football never waned, and after completing his basketball career, Strickland knew he wanted to get back on the gridiron. Although that dream did not come true, he will always be remembered by his Viking Family. Rest in peace, Deante.

OTHER TIDBITS OF VIKING TRIVIA

- Portland State has 36 players on the roster from the state of Oregon, plus four others from just across the river and the Vancouver, WA area.
- Players who originally walked on but have earned scholarships include: SR FB Sirgeo Hoffman, JR WR Easton Trakel, SR OL Larry Brister and SR WR Jacob Bystry.
- JR WR Emmanuel Daigbe was born in Liberia.
 Originally he wrestled in college at Highline and Green River CCs.
- SR ROV Romeo Gunt was born in the Côte d'Ivoire. He came to the United States at age seven, speaking only his native tongue of French.
- SR CB Montre Brown has trained to be a pilot with a former Tuskegee Airman and has soloed.
 He plans to resume his pursuit of a career in flying after his college career.
- SO S Anthony Adams is the brother of former Vikings WR Darnell Adams. Anthony is a key player on the Viking defense this season. Darnell finished his career in 2017 (99 receptions, 1,568 yards, 12 touchdowns).
- JR DE Cody Brown is the brother of former Vikings OL Josh Brown. Both prepped at Sunset (Beaverton, OR) HS.

- SO WR Mataio Talalemotu is the son of Ina Talalemotu, who played in 1987-88 on Portland State's two NCAA II National finalist teams. He is also the cousin of former Viking DL Savali Talalemotu.
- FR QB Dante Chachere's brother, Andre, is a member of the Oakland Raiders.
- SO DE Jake Porter's father, Jason, was a fouryear letterwinner in baseball at Portland State (1991-94).
- Portland State has three players on the roster that were formerly members of FBS programs.
- In 2018, PSU had a school-record 19 student-athletes earn Academic All-Big Sky Conference honors.
- Offensive Coordinator Matt Leunen (OL/TE, 2005-09) is a PSU alum who played for the Vikings.
- Portland State had a pair of former players meet in the Super Bowl for the first time in history in February 2014. TE Julius Thomas ('10, Denver) and DB DeShawn Shead ('11, Seattle) both played in Super Bowl XLVIII. Shead returned to the Super Bowl in 2015 with the Seahawks. He joins Clint Didier and Ted Popson as former Vikings with Super Bowl rings. Thomas was named a Pro Bowl tight end in 2013 and 2014. In the 2014 off-season, he signed the richest tight end contract in the NFL to play for the Jacksonville Jaguars. Thomas retired in the 2018 off-season after a seven-year career that included 71 games, 226 receptions, 2,406 yards and 36 touchdowns. Shead, a starting corner with the Seahawks in 2016, missed 2017 due to an ACL injury, then signed and played with Detroit in 2018.
- LB Patrick Onwuasor starred with the Baltimore Ravens in 2018 while LS Kameron Canaday was a starter for the Pittsburgh Steelers and DB De-Shawn Shead was with the Detroit Lions.

GET ON THE BUS: THE AMERICANA TOUR

Portland State Football Coach Bruce Barnum is renowned for taking his team on the bus to as many road games as possible. He calls it "The Americana Tour." It has made for some long bus rides, but Barnum often lets his team out to see the sights. Barnum also feels it promotes team unity (and saves a few dollars in the budget). In the past four years, PSU has logged 16,282 bus miles with a "program record" of 4,906 in 2016.

• Coach Barnum led his first "Americana Tour" in 2015, which included bus rides to Pullman, WA, Pocatello, ID, San Luis Obispo, CA, and Cheney, WA. In all, the Vikings logged 4,394 bus miles and approximately 80 hours round trip to those four destinations (PSU also flew on two road trips). The Americana Tour included such things as dozens of on-bus movies, a stop to buy a lottery ticket on the way home from beating Washington State, a practice on Boise State's blue turf, a sight-seeing trip to Alcatraz (in which equipment manager Mike Haluska was left on the island... but soon retrieved), and a midnight McDonald's run at a lonely truck stop in eastern Oregon. In addition to the economy of the bus



- trips, Barnum contends the time together draws the Viking team closer.
- The 2016 Americana Tour included round trips to San Jose, Seattle and Sacramento (twice). There was also a return bus ride from Ogden, UT and a shorter trip from Las Vegas to Cedar City... the trip to San Jose was a total of 1,340 miles. It included a stop off at Oregon Wildlife Safari and the obligatory In-and-Out Burger visitation in Medford... on the trip to Southern Utah, PSU flew into Las Vegas, took in the Criss Angel Show at the Luxor Hotel and made another midnight In-and-Out run... while traveling to Weber State, PSU visited Temple Square and the Hogle Zoo... after a pair round trips to Sacramento (UC Davis and Sacramento State), PSU had accumulated 4,906 bus miles for the season.
- The 2017 season was limited to just three bus trips: Oregon State, Idaho State and Eastern Washington. There was also a bus portion from San Jose, CA to Cal Poly. And, Portland State's trip to Corvallis was a mere 168 miles round trip. The Americana Tour bus trip to Pocatello, ID was 660 miles one way, 1,320 miles round trip. The Vikings made a stop in Pendleton and toured the Pendleton Rodeo Museum and Hall of Fame, as well as a stop along the Snake River... the Vikings had bus travel from San Jose Airport to San Luis Obispo for the game at Cal Poly. It was 376 miles round trip and included a stop over on the Monterey Peninsula on the way down. No golf was played... the final week's bus trip from PSU to Eastern Washington was 339 miles one way, 678 round trip. That made the Vikings' Americana Tour for 2017 a total of 2,542 miles.
- In 2018 Portland State made bus trips to five different states. They included Nevada (1,156 miles round trip), Oregon (218 miles), Idaho (718 miles), Montana (1,098 miles) and Sacramento State (1,158 miles). That made for a total of 4,348 bus miles.
- The 2019 Americana Tour started early as the Vikings bussed to Camp Rilea Armed Forces Training Center in Warrenton, OR (176 miles round trip) for the first three days of preseason practice. The Vikings stayed in the barracks, ate at the mess hall and practice on a makeshift field on the Helipad. Numerous team bonding exercises took place, including bowling night, a beach bonfire and three hours of liberty in Seaside, OR... only three bus trips are on the docket for 2019. They include Boise State (864 miles round trip), Idaho State (1,326 miles) and Eastern Washington (678 miles)... on the trip to Boise State, the Vikings pulled off the freeway for a couple of hours in Pendleton to enjoy the world famous Pendleton Roundup rodeo... Total bus miles for 2019 are 3,044.



Fayetteville, AR – The odds were long for Portland State as it made a first-ever trip to SEC Country, but the Vikings made a good accounting of themselves in a 20-13 loss at Arkansas.

In fact, the Vikings had the ball in the final minute with a chance to knot things up or, who knows, maybe go for two. But an interception by safety Joe Foucha at the Razorbacks' 42 with 11 seconds left sealed the game for the Hogs.

Both teams played well defensively, but the Razorbacks were a little better, holding the Vikings to 230 yards and making three interceptions. Charlie Taumoepeau had a 32-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter to go with two first-half field goals from Cody Williams for the Viking scoring.

The first half proved to be a defensive struggle most of the way.

Portland State took an early lead, scoring on their first possession. Quarterback Davis Alexander gained 27 rushing yards on three carries. Then Williams kicked a 50-yard field goal, the second-longest of his career and PSU led 3-0.

Arkansas tied it up moments later on a 34-yard field goal by Connor Limpert. The Razorbacks took the lead late in the first quarter on a 10-play, 64-yard drive. Devwah Whaley scored on a one-yard run for a 10-3 Arkansas lead.

Williams struck again from 47 yards early in the second quarter for the Vikings. It was the culmination of an 11-play, 45-yard drive for PSU. That closed the margin to 10-6 and it remained there until halftime.

Arkansas threatened to score late in the half, but Robert Holt picked off a Nick Starkel pass at the PSU five-yard line with 1:23 left. Holt returned it to the 22-yard line and the Vikings avoided a scoring threat by the Hogs.

PSU had 102 yards of total offense in the first half to 198 for Arkansas. Each team had a turnover.

The defensive struggle continued into the third quarter. Arkansas finally broke through with 2:20 left in the quarter. Rakeem Boyd scored on a two-yard run. It was a 12-play, 67-yard drive aided by a personal foul penalty on the Vikings. The extra point gave the Razorbacks a 17-6 lead and the first two-score advantage of the game.

Down 20-6 midway through the fourth quarter, the Vikings were desperate. Backup quarterback Jalani Eason replaced an injured Alexander and drove the Vikings down the field. On 4th-and-12 from the Arkansas 32, Eason eluded the on-coming rush, rolled out left and hit Taumpoepeau near the 10-yard line. Taumoepeau spun off two defenders and got into the endzone. That made it 20-13 with 4:14 to play.

Arkansas was able to move the ball into PSU territory, but the Vikings forced a punt. They took over on their own three-yard line. PSU moved the ball 26 yards before the Foucha interception.

Romeo Gunt led a solid defensive effort by the Vikings with 15 tackles. Holt had seven tackles, one for a loss, and the interception.

Arkansas had 395 total yards on 77 plays. Boyd rushed 18 times for 114 yards.

Emmanuel Daigbe had a team-high five receptions for 43 yards. Taumoepeau made four catches for 56 and the score.

GAME NOTES: Holt had his first career takeaway with the interception... it was an historic day in the sense that the Vikings played a program from the Southeastern Conference for the first time in history. Razorback Stadium was also the largest in which a PSU team has ever played (76,000)... PSU is now 4-39 all-time vs. FBS level teams.

PORTLAND STATE 70 SIMON FRASER 7



Hillsboro, OR – It took a while for the Vikings, but once Portland State got control of the game it ran roughshod over Simon Fraser, 70-7, at Hillsboro Stadium.

Simon Fraser served notice in the first series of the game, connecting on a Justin Seiber-to-Rysen John 60-yard scoring play. That gave the Clan had an early 7-0 lead.

Portland State answered later in the quarter on a 96-yard drive. Sirgeo Hoffman rushed in from 10 yards out and the game was tied.

Still, the Vikings had trouble getting going as three first-half fumbles ended drives. Penalties also hurt as PSU had six for 88 yards on the first half.

Finally, the Vikings took the lead midway through the second quarter. A short scoring drive ended with a 27-yard touchdown pass from Davis Alexander to Davis Koetter.

Another long TD pass just before halftime gave PSU a 21-7 lead at the break. Alexander hit Mataio Talalemotu on a 50-yard score.

At halftime the Vikings had a huge advantage in yardage, 317 to 127, but the turnovers kept it a two-score game. Alexander was 14-19 passing for 226 yards and two scores.

"It was a slow start between the turnovers and them scoring right away. It was a muddy start. We cleaned stuff up at halftime. And what you saw in the second half is what you hope you will get in a game like this," said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum.

Defensively, the Vikings buckled down after the first score. PSU had 14 tackles for loss in the first half and four sacks. The Clan had minus-nine yards of offense in the second quarter.

The lead grew at the start of the third quarter. Alexander led a 10-play, 66-yard drive. Carlos Martin went in from two yards out and PSU led 28-7.

Another Alexander to Koetter touchdown pass came moments later. This time, it was a 42-yard strike and the Vikings were up 35-7.

PSU's defense got into the scoring act on a big hit from linebacker Robert Holt. The sophomore middle linebacker smacked quarterback Mihai Lapuste. He lost the ball, it rolled back toward the Clan endzone, and David Joseph scooped the ball for a Viking touchdown.

PSU tacked on four more rushing touchdowns to close out the game. Freshman quarterback Dante Chachere played two series, scored twice, and ended up leading the Vikings with 65 rushing yards.

Alexander was 18-25 passing for 292 yards and three scores. Talalemotu had 132 receiving yards on six catches. Koetter caught four passes for 107 yards. In all, PSU's offense had 646 yards.

It was the defense that really made its mark. After SFU's initial score, the Vikings were dominant. The Clan had -23 yards of total offense over the last three quarters and only 113 for the game. PSU had 20 tackles for loss and eight sacks in the contest. Defensive tackle Kenton Bartlett led with three sacks. Greg Oliver had an interception, Joseph recovered fumble for a score and Anthony Adams broke up four passes.

"The defense is playing well right now," said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum. "They are flowing to the ball. It looks like one swarm of bees. That is fun to watch."

Portland State established a new school record for fewest rushing yards allowed to an opponent, due mainly to the sacks. Simon Fraser had 29 rushing plays for -65 yards. 54 yards were lost on sacks. The previous fewest yards allowed rushing was -21 by Western Washington in 1981.

GAME NOTES: Quarterback Jalani Eason had 54 passing yards in one series in the third quarter before giving way to Chachere. Eason scored on a two-yard run... Malik Walker scored his first touchdown as a Viking on a one-yard run, and Carlos Martin added a scoring run to go with 55 rushing yards... Portland State is 17-0 all-time against lower division opponents since joining the Big Sky Conference in 1996... the 70 points scored were the most since a 77-10 win over Idaho State in 2012.



#22 BOISE STATE 45 PORTLAND STATE 10



Boise, ID — Boise State asserted itself in the second quarter and took control of the game against a feisty Portland State team at Albertsons Stadium. That led the 22nd-ranked (FBS) Broncos to a 45-10 victory over the Vikings.

PSU dropped to 1-2 on the season with the loss. Both losses have come to FBS programs. Boise State improved to 3-0 and likely will move up in the rankings next week.

Boise State out-gained the Vikings 491 to 244 in the game. The Bronco defense, which has been excellent so far this season, was able to get to Viking quarterbacks for six sacks and make 10 tackles for loss. PSU was also hindered by 12 penalties in the game.

"I liked how my team hung in early. But, there was some frustration that set in on our side and we got sloppy with penalties. We know playing a team of that caliber we can't make those mistakes," said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum. "There are positives. The turnover battle we won, there are other positives as well. I know one thing; there are over 250 Division I football teams in this country and Boise State is ranked number 22 for a reason."

Just like at Arkansas, the Vikings' other FBS opponent this season, Portland State started fast. The Vikings took their opening offensive drive for a score. Sophomore kicker Cody Williams hit on a 26-yard field goal for an early lead. The kick was set up by a 52-yard option run by Beau Kelly.

Boise State had an immediate answer. Bronco wide receiver John Hightower took the ensuing kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown. Just like that the Broncos were ahead 7-3.

Boise State was up 14-3 when the Vikings hit on another big 52-yard play. Quarterback Davis Alexander found a streaking Mataio Talalemotu down the middle of the field and the sophomore wide receiver took it in for the score. That made it 14-10 by the end of the first quarter.

After the opening fireworks, there were four straight empty possessions by the teams into the middle of the second quarter. Boise State finally got control of the game with a five-play, 77-yard scoring drive. Quarterback Hank Bachmeier tossed a 23-yard TD pass to Hightower and the Broncos were ahead 21-10. The Broncos added another touchdown just before half on a Bachmeier pass and it was 28-10.

After a good first quarter for PSU, the Broncos ended up out-gaining the Vikings 294-180 in the half.

Boise State added another touchdown midway through the third quarter, and at 35-10 the Vikings were out of it.

The Broncos stifling defense that gave Florida State and Marshall fits in the second halves of their first two games, was just as challenging for the Vikings. PSU managed only 64 yards after halftime.

Bachmeier completed 16 of 25 passes for 238 yards and two touchdowns. The Broncos totaled 341 yards passing and four passing touchdowns overall. Hightower caught four balls for 79 yards and a score.

Alexander completed 11-23 passes for 133 yards and one score. His main target was Talalemotu who had five receptions for 78 yards. Kelly's 52 yards led the run game.

Safety Ryan Lesch had eight tackles to lead the Vikings, and intercepted a pass in the second quarter. It was the second pick of his career. Defensive end Shawn Richard was in on two sacks.

GAME NOTES: Portland State and Boise State were meeting for the first time since 2005... SR TE Charlie Taumoepeau did not play in the game due to hamstring tightness.

PORTLAND STATE 59 EASTERN OREGON 9



Hillsboro, OR - Quick. Efficient. Effective.

Those three words summed up the Portland State Vikings effort against Eastern Oregon at Hillsboro Stadium on Saturday as the home team took a 59-9 win.

Heavy favorites against the NAIA Mountaineers, the Vikings validated that notion on both sides of the football. Portland State gained 657 yards of total offense and allowed just 133 yards to the Mountaineers.

"The focus was to be ready to play right away," said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum. "We don't want the opportunity to slip away - especially when we get to conference play - because we had a slow start. It was a polished game to get ready for Idaho State. Now it gets real."

The win improves the Vikings to 2-2 on the season with the Big Sky Conference opener coming next Saturday at Idaho State. Eastern Oregon dropped to 1-3 with the loss

Portland State took charge right away scoring on the opening drive. PSU went 65 yards in a methodical 11-play march. Running back Sirgeo Hoffman scampered in on a nine-yard run for the score.

After a defensive three-and-out, the Vikings scored on their next series as well. This time it was a 57-yard toss from Davis Alexander to Emmanuel Daigbe. That had PSU ahead 14-0 at the 6:37 mark of the first guarter.

Alexander completed his first 10 passes in the game for 139 yards.

On the defensive side, the Vikings gave up only 12 yards and no first downs in the first quarter. In fact, Eastern Oregon's first four series ended in three-and-outs.

Portland State rolled up 411 yards of offense and a 31-0 lead by halftime. Alexander had 280 yards and three touchdowns passing. Daigbe caught two of those long balls for scores from 57 and 44 yards. Davis Koetter had the other receiving touchdown on a 10-yard recention.

Eastern Oregon scored a quick touchdown to start the second half, but that was the only resistance the Vikings would get. Alexander answered by throwing his fourth TD pass of the day, a 19-yarder to Beau Kelly, for a 38-6 PSU lead.

Alexander finished his day midway through the third quarter with 366 passing yards and five touchdowns.


Ten different Vikings caught passes in the game and eight different Vikings had running plays. Koetter led the team with seven receptions for 96 yards. Kelly caught six for 57, and Daigbe had three for 109 yards. Malik Walker led the running game with 11 carries for 73 yards.

On defense, the Vikings forced six three-and-outs, seven punts and recovered one fumble against the Mountaineers. With only nine points allowed, PSU has held nine of the last 13 opponents under 20 points.

"I know I have a dominant defense. They are playing lights out right now and we have to keep that going. They are keeping us in games, no matter who we play or where we play," said Barnum.

Robert Holt, Nicolas Ah Sam and Semise Kofe each had four tackles to lead the team. Ah Sam added a sack, while Holt got his second forced fumble of the season.

GAME NOTES: Alexander's five passing TDs were the most since Drew Hubel threw five against Eastern Washington in 2008... Beau Kelly, George McCorley, Malik Thirdgill and Marshaun Tucker all had their first career touchdown receptions... quarterback Nathan West saw his first action of the season and led a touchdown drive, throwing a 15-yard TD pass to Thirdgill... Jalen Chatman also saw his first action at quarterback... Portland State is now 18-0 against lower division opponents since joining the Big Sky Conference in 1996.

IDAHO STATE 51 PORTLAND STATE 24



Pocatello, ID – A first half to forget doomed the Portland State Vikings at Holt Arena as the Idaho State Bengals rolled to a 51-24 win in the Big Sky Conference opener for both teams.

Bengals quarterback Matt Struck threw five first-half touchdown passes, and the ISU defense picked up a score of its own on an interception return. That vaulted the Bengals to a 41-10 halftime lead and Portland State would never recover.

With the win, Idaho State goes to 2-2 on the season, 1-0 in the Big Sky. The Vikings dropped to 2-3, 0-1 as they come home for games over the next two weeks.

A pair of teams that had shown their bonafides on defense in the opening weeks of the season matched up in this one. But after two stops of the Idaho State offense, the dam broke and Portland State's defense struggled against the big play.

Struck threw long touchdown passes to Michael Dean (45 yards) and Tanner Conner (66 yards) for a 13-0 lead.

Bengal safety Christian McFarland then picked off a Davis Alexander pass and returned it 64 yards for another score. That had the Vikings down, 20-0 with 4:21 to go in the first quarter.

Portland State finally got on the board on the first play of the second quarter when Cody Williams nailed a 37-yard field goal.

But Struck came back to throw his third long TD pass, this time to Mitch Gueller, less than a minute later. The 45-yard bomb put the Bengals ahead 27-3.

Portland State mounted a lengthy drive to answer, but after moving 69 yards down the field failed on a field goal.

Struck then hit Dean again on a 15-yard score and it was 34-3.

The Vikings finally found the end zone on a 61-yard pass from Davis Alexander to Beau Kelly, but they went to the halftime locker room down 41-10.

PSU battled in the second half, but could not get closer than 24 points.

Idaho State finished the day with 509 yards of total offense while Portland State was close with 505. But a costly turnover, some big plays by the Bengals, and some lengthy PSU drives that came up empty added up to a loss.

Struck finished the day 14-23 passing for 332 yards and six touchdowns. Conner caught four passes for 117 yards and three scores.

Alexander was 20-33 throwing the football for 296 yards, one touchdown and one interception. He also rushed for 44 yards and one touchdown. Tight end Charlie Taumoepeau, finally back in the lineup after missing two games, caught seven passes for 104 yards.

GAME NOTES: Sirgeo Hoffman rushed 13 times for a career-high 88 yards and one touchdown. He had a 76-yard touchdown run in the first half called back due to an illegal motion penalty... Romeo Gunt and Robert Holt each had eight tackles to lead the Vikings.



PORTLAND STATE 52 SOUTHERN UTAH 31



Hillsboro, OR – Opportunity knocked and the Vikings answered.

Portland State took advantage of virtually everything they earned or were given on Saturday at Hillsboro Stadium and the result was a relatively easy 52-31 Big Sky Conference win over Southern Utah.

The Vikings scored 10 points on their first two drives of the day, then when opportunities arose the rest of the way they took advantage. Excellent field position after defensive stops and a pair of forced turnovers in the second quarter led to a 28-point run by the Vikings allowed them to go to halftime with a 38-10 lead.

"We wanted to start fast and take care of the football, because our start last week buried us," said Vikings Coach Bruce Barnum. "To come out against them and not have any turnovers, that's great, they had forced 10 in five games.

"We got those short fields and we scored touchdowns. We were able to run the football. The field position, forcing turnovers... it all led to a "W"."

Portland State improved to 3-3 on the season, 1-1 in the Big Sky Conference.

Portland State engineered the quality start they needed. The first two possessions resulted in 10 points – a 37-yard field goal by Cody Williams, and a two-yard touchdown run by Sirgeo Hoffman. Sandwiched in between was a key fourth-down stop by the Viking defense after Southern Utah had driven to the PSU 29.

The Vikings exploded in the second quarter, scoring four touchdowns in the span of 7:31, aided by two forced turnovers. Quarterback Davis Alexander ran for one touchdown and threw two more. One was a 16-yarder to Beau Kelly, the other a 46-yard pass to Davis Koetter late in the half. Koetter also figured in the Vikings' second TD of the four in a row. He recovered a muffed punt return by the Thunderbirds on the SUU 19. Two plays later, Emmanuel Daigbe rushed in from 11 yards out.

PSU amassed 306 yards in the first half and led 38-10 at halftime. The Thunderbirds had 154 yards, but the two turnovers led to a pair of Viking TDs.

The Thunderbirds scored a touchdown on their first possession of the second half to close within 38-17. But the Vikings controlled possession and the clock from there. A pair of touchdown drives — one in the third quarter and one in the fourth quarter — chewed up more than 11 minutes of clock time. That simply didn't allow Southern Utah enough opportunities to come back.

Alexander finished with another big day, passing for 234 yards and two touchdowns, and rushing for 80 yards and another score.

"He's a magnificent player, a great leader, and he is fun to watch. If we protect him like that, don't let him get hit, he is going to help us win some games," Barnum said of his quarterback.

Alexander was a part of an effective Viking running game led by Hoffman. The senior tailback had a career-high 24 carries for 81 yards and two short TD runs. Malik Walker rushed for 40 yards and Evyn Holtz had 28 yards as PSU totaled 239 yards and five touchdowns on the ground.

Koetter caught five passes for a career-high 108 yards and a score.

Defensive end Jake Porter led the Vikings with eight tackles. Linebacker Dylan Hanley made seven stops. Freshman linebacker Zack Mandera had five tackles, including a forced fumble and recovery. Anthony Adams picked up a key second-quarter interception that the Viking offense later turned into a touchdown.

PSU out-gained the Thunderbirds 473 to 394. SUU quarterback Chris Helbig completed 31-41 passes for 302 yards, three touchdowns and one interception, but most of his damage came after the first half.

GAME NOTES: Portland State's 52 points were the most against a Division I opponent since scoring 59 against Montana State on Oct. 17, 2015... the Vikings lead the all-time series with Southern Utah, 10-4. The T-Birds lead 3-2 in Big Sky games... PSU did not commit a turnover in the game and had a season-low five penalties.

PORTLAND STATE 24 IDAHO 0



Hillsboro, OR — With the major league baseball playoffs in full swing, Portland State decided to join the fun and pitch a shutout — except on the football field. The Vikings used dominant defense to whitewash the Idaho Vandals, 24-0, in a Big Sky Conference game at Hillsboro Stadium.

The win was the second in a row for PSU and third in four games. The Vikings improved to 4-3 on the season, 2-1 in the Big Sky. Notably, they shut out a Big Sky Conference team for the first time since Oct. 21, 2006, when PSU throttled Eastern Washington, 34-0. It was a span of exactly 100 Big Sky games since PSU's last shutout over a league opponent (Portland State has shut out two lower division teams since that time in 2011 and 2015).

"What a magical job by the defense," said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum. "To hold anybody to a goose egg — even in pee wee football — that's big. It's tough because there is so much involved; field position, turnovers, how many possessions. But our defense did it and that is damn impressive."

Idaho's defense was good as well and remarkably, the game was scoreless at halftime. But the Vikings took advantage of an early third-quarter turnover by the Vandals to get on the board. PSU's Cody Williams kicked a 38-yard field for a 3-0 lead.

"We needed to be first on the board in a game like that. You get behind in a game like that and it is dangerous," said Barnum.

PSU's defense followed with a three-and-out stop of Idaho on the next series. That led to the first touchdown drive of the game on the longest offensive series of the day. The Vikings went 91 yards on eight plays, highlighted by a 29-yard run by quarterback Davis Alexander. Two plays later, the Viking QB dropped back to pass, saw nobody open, and took off. He weaved his way through the Vandal defense for a 21-yard scoring run and a 10-0 lead

Idaho's biggest threat came late in the third quarter. The Vandals drove 75 yards, all the way to the Viking 9. But a sack by David Joseph and Semise Kofe pushed the ball back and eventually Idaho settled for a 34-yard field goal attempt. Cade Coffey missed wide left.

Alexander then took the Vikings on a decisive 10-play, 80-yard march. The clincher was a 28-yard touchdown pass over the middle to Davis Koetter. PSU led 17-0 with 10:51 to play and the Vandals couldn't respond.

PSU tacked on a late touchdown on a 21-yard pass from Alexander to Emmanuel Daigbe.

This one was all about the defense. Portland State, which leads the Big Sky in total defense, held Idaho to 236 yards of total offense and intercepted four passes. The Vikings had 10 tackles for loss, six sacks and broke up four passes.

Sophomore safety Anthony Adams had a big day with five tackles, two interceptions and two pass breakups. Also getting picks were safety Sam Inos and cornerback Deon Crayon. Joseph, who got the start at rover in place of the injured Romeo Gunt, had a big day with a team-high six tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and was in on two sacks.

Alexander was the offensive star for the Vikings in a mostly defensive struggle. He completed 13-26 passes for 167 yards and two touchdowns. The junior quarterback also rushed for a career-high 91 yards and a touchdown.

"He's fun to watch," said Barnum, acknowledging his quarterback was the difference on offense. "I thought it was going to be a defensive battle. Idaho is impressive on defense and that's what showed up. I've bragged about our defense, but theirs was a true concern."

Sirgeo Hoffman rushed for 50 yards for the Vikings, and Koetter led the receiving corps with three catches for 56 yards and a score.

Idaho dropped to 2-5 on the season, 0-3 in the Big Sky. The Vandals got 14 tackles and three tackles for loss from defensive end Christian Elliss.

GAME NOTES: PSU has now held 10 if the last 16 opponents to 20 points or less... the win over Idaho was just the second in history for Portland State (2-12) and the first in Big Sky play (1-1)... the Vikings are 4-0 at home this season.
