BIG GAMES START RIGHT NOW AS VIKINGS HOST #6 WEBER STATE

If Portland State has expectations of making waves in the Big Sky Conference and threatening for a post-season berth, this Saturday will be one of its biggest tests. The Vikings host sixth-ranked and undefeated Weber State in a 2 p.m. game at Hillsboro Stadium.

The Vikings (2-3, 1-1) have some momentum with a pair of home wins the past two weeks. They also have the memory of knocking off #24 Weber State late last season in Ogden, UT, 30-18. All of that and a superior performance will be necessary to take down the Wildcats again. Weber State (5-0, 2-0) is one of just eight teams in the nation at the FCS level that are still undefeated. And, the Wildcats share the longest road winning streak in the nation at seven in a row. Among those road wins was a 35-7 drubbing of FBS Utah State earlier this season.

Portland State will be led by suddenly hot SO QB Dante Chachere, who has thrown eight touchdown passes, rushed for three scores and totaled 724 yards of offense over the past two weeks. SR WR Mataio Talalemotu has been a beneficiary, catching five TD passes in his last six receptions.

On defense, the Vikings have relied on big plays this season. PSU has 13 sacks, ranks ninth in the nation in tackles for loss, and - outside a 7-10 third-down performance by FBS Washington - has held the other four opponents to only 11-49 conversions on third down (22%).

Weber State brings a balanced and potent offense to town, scoring 36.4 points per game. The defense is even more notable, giving up just 11.8 points (fifth in the nation) and forcing 14 turnovers to lead the Big Sky.

The Wildcats hold the edge in the all-time series (22-15) and the Big Sky Conference series (12-9).

Jacob Sharp has 21 catches for 335 yards and a score... the backfield is a three-headed monster with Damon Bankston (59-348-3), Josh Davis (72-338-2) and Dontae McMillan (28-182-3) leading the way... linebacker Garrett Beck has a team-high 31 tackles, while cornerback Maxwell Anderson leads the nation with five interceptions and four pass breakups... Weber State averages 36.4 points and 436.6 yards of offense per game... the Wildcats allow only 11.8 points and 289.4 yards per game.

STORYLINES

- This week's game is the third of three straight games at home (Oct. 1-8-15). The last time PSU played three straight home games was in 2003 (Sept. 4-13-20).
- Portland State is now 9-4 at Hillsboro Stadium since the venue became its new permanent home in 2019.
- Weber State was Big Sky Champion or co-champion in the 2017, 2018, 2019 and spring 2021 seasons.
- Portland State is 21-50 all-time against nationally-ranked FCS teams since joining the Big Sky Conference in 1996. PSU is 13-24 at home, 8-26 on the road... PSU has faced Weber State four times when the Wildcats were nationally ranked (2008, 2009, 2017, 2021), going 1-3. Weber State was ranked 24th when the teams met last season.
- The 2007 meeting between the teams in Portland is the highest-scoring Division I regulation football game in college history with Weber State winning, 73-68. Amazingly, that was NOT the most points by either team in the series. Weber State earned a 74-6 win in 1965. A Mouse Davis-coached Portland State team won 75-0 in 1980. A 65-43 win by the Vikings in 2001 in Portland was the highest-scoring game in PSU history by two teams, combined, until the 2007 contest.

LAST MEETING, Nov. 6, 2021: Portland State 30, #24 Weber State 18

Ogden, UT – The Portland State coaching staff challenged the team on the eve of Saturday's game with Weber State, telling them they only had 15 days left in their season. All the work they have put in had come down to the last 15 days. Unless.... the Vikings can find a way to extend their time.

Day one proved to be an outstanding start as the Vikings defeated 24th-ranked Weber State on the road, 30-18.

"We told our football team they had 15 days of football left. We said 'for the last 15 days, for all the work you have put in, do everything you can to try to earn another one,'" said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum. The intimation being, that if the Vikings can win out against a brutally tough November schedule (#24 Weber State, #16 Sacramento State and #5 Eastern Washington) they would likely earn a chance for the FCS post-season.

Both teams entered the game 4-4 overall, 3-2 in the Big Sky, and on two-game winning streaks. The difference was the Wildcats were ranked. PSU's win, which puts it at 5-4/4-2, was its first against a nationally-ranked team on the road since 2018 against Montana.

The Vikings dominated on both sides of the ball, racking up 299 passing yards and 428 total yards against the Big Sky's top pass defense (164.5 yards allowed per game). PSU also went 8-15 on third downs against the Big Sky's best third-down defense (29%).

"We addressed third down a lot in preparation this week," said Barnum. "If they are going to go man against us, we had to be able to pass the ball. Fortunately, I don't think we have a star receiver. I think we have six or seven who are stars."

The proof was on the stat sheet. Quarterback Davis Alexander completed 29-42 passes for 299 yards, a touchdown and no interceptions. Freshman Nate Bennett made a season-high nine receptions for 83 yards. Freshman Darien Chase had five catches for 79 yards and a touchdown. Junior Beau Kelly made five grabs for 46 yards. Junior Mataio Talalemotu had four receptions for 69 yards.

Portland State may have been even better on defense. The Vikings held Weber State to an opponent season-low 256 yards and only 3-13 on third downs. The Vikings had 10 tackles for loss, four sacks and three pass breakups.

Junior Anthony Adams made a career-high 11 tackles, two for losses and broke up a pass. Juniors VJ Malo, Jake Porter and Xavier Bell were all in on sacks. Bell added four tackles and two breakups.

"The defense was phenomenal," said Barnum after the game and alluded to what the Vikings have built on their three-game winning streak. "The kids feel the momentum and that's what is important. When you win, you earn another one."

The game was a defensive struggle until the 4:03 mark of the first quarter. The Viking defense forced punts on the first two Wildcat possessions. But on the third WSU possession, a Viking blitz left an empty defensive backfield and the Wildcats took advantage. Backup quarterback Creyton Cooper avoided the rush, broke off the left side and went 51 yards for a score.

The Vikings moved the football in the first quarter but couldn't get points. Alexander was 6-7 passing for 78 yards. However, PSU had a turnover and was stopped on its other two drives after just a couple of first downs.

Midway through the second quarter the Vikings drove to the WSU 32. Freshman kicker Gianni Smith then booted a season-long 49-yard field goal, cutting the deficit to 7-3.

Just before halftime, Alexander engineered an 11-play, 77-yard drive. He completed 6-8 passes for 76 yards in the series. Running back Malik Walker punched it in from two yards out with 56 seconds left in the half. The Vikings took the 10-7 lead into halftime.

The lead was pushed to two scores on the opening series of the second half. This time it was a 13-play, 71-yard drive. Again, Alexander was key, completing 4-6 passes for 66 yards. A 50-yard grab over the middle by Talalemotu set up the score. Alexander rushed in from four yards out and PSU led 17-7 with 9:36 to play in the third quarter.

Weber State netted only 16 yards in the third quarter but was able to produce one drive, aided by a PSU penalty, for a field goal. Kyle Thompson kicked a 45-yarder, making the game 17-10 heading to the fourth quarter.

Portland State answered with another methodical 10-play, 72-yard drive. Methodical, that is, until freshman back Jalynnee McGee broke off a pair of big runs. McGee went 10 yards, then 22 yards for back-to-back first downs. On the next play, Alexander threw a jumpball into the right corner of the endzone and Chase came down with an 11-yard TD catch. The extra point made it 24-10 PSU with 11:57 left in the game.

The Wildcats stayed alive on their next series. Using a two-quarterback system, WSU went 86 yards in 13 plays. Cooper scored again on a two-yard run. A fake extra point resulted in a two-point conversion and Weber State pulled within 24-18.

The teams traded punts on the next two possessions. Though they trailed, Weber State was backed up to their own 10-yard line and had to punt, allowing the Vikings to take over with 3:30 to play. Two first downs would solve the game.

PSU tried to run out the clock, but when pressed to third down, Alexander hit Bennett for a 15-yard first down pass with just over two minutes left. On the next play, Walker broke free on a 39-yard scamper for the final touchdown, making the score 30-18.

HEAD COACH BRUCE BARNUM



Bruce Barnum is in his eighth season as Portland State Head Football Coach and his 13th year overall with the program in 2022. Only one head coach, Tim Walsh, has had a longer tenure in PSU history.

Barnum has the distinction of earning FCS National Coach of the Year and Big Sky

Conference Coach of the Year in 2015 after leading PSU to its best season ever at the Division I level (9-3). The season included wins over FBS Washington State and North Texas, and five nationally-ranked FCS teams. The Vikings had their best season in Division I history (9-2) before losing to Northern Iowa 29-17 in the FCS Playoffs.

In his time as Head Coach, Barnum has molded the team in his image; tough, blue-collar and fundamental-sound, instituting #BarnyBall.

Barnum spent his first five seasons at PSU as the Vikings' offensive coordinator. In his five seasons as offensive coordinator, the Vikings had tremendous success. In 2013, PSU set school-records for total offense (6,486 yards), offense per game (540.5), rushing offense (3,330 yards), rushing offense per game (277.5) and rushing touchdowns (36) while maintaining balance in the attack with 263.0 yards per game in the air, leading the nation in yards per completion (16.7). Portland State ranked third in the nation in total offense (first in the Big Sky) and third in rushing offense (second in the Big Sky). The Viking program has averaged 200+ rushing yards per game in all seven seasons that Barnum has been on the Park Blocks.

Barnum has more than 30 years of coaching experience and more than 15 years as an offensive coordinator. Barnum is the 14th head coach in the 76-year history of Portland State football.

QUICK SNAPS

WINS, LOSSES, AND THE BIG SKY

- Portland State is 2-3 overall, 2-0 at home, 0-3 on the road.
- 2022 is Portland State's 30th season at the NCAA I FCS level (1978-80 (1-AA), 1996-2022). PSU is 142-176 in all games at the FCS/1-AA level.
- PSU is competing in its 27th season since moving back to FCS and the Big Sky Conference (1996-2022). PSU is 123-163 in that span, 80-56 in home games, 43-107 on the road.
- As a member of the Big Sky Conference (1996-2021) PSU is 81-116 all-time in league games, 48-51 at home, 33-65 on the road.
- Bruce Barnum (2015-22, 19-31 Big Sky, 28-46 overall) is the Vikings fourth Head Coach in the Big Sky Conference era. Previous coaches were: Tim Walsh (1993-2006, 42-41/90-68 all-time); Jerry Glanville (2007-09, 7-17/9-24); and Nigel Burton (2010-15, 13-27/21-36).
- The Vikings have never won a Big Sky title, but have tied for second five times (four times under Walsh and in 2015 under Barnum). PSU has made two NCAA FCS playoff appearances (2000, 2015).
- PSU's best record ever at the FCS level was 9-3 in 2015 (4-2 at home, 5-1 on the road).

AN EXPECTED WIN, BUT STILL ENJOYABLE

A week off from Big Sky Conference play and a lower division opponent added up to a big win for Portland State as the Vikings took down Lincoln (CA) University, 48-6, last Saturday... the Vikings out-gained Lincoln 449-234 and prevented the Oaks from converting a first down until the fourth quarter. The lone score for Lincoln came with three seconds remaining... eight different Vikings rushed the ball, eight caught passes, three threw passes, 25 made plays on defense... Portland State got off to a bit of a sluggish start, but finally took the lead with 4:58 to play in the first quarter on a nine-yard run by sophomore quarterback Dante Chachere. The Vikings had been set up in Lincoln territory following a blocked punt by Elias Spence. A 36-yard pass from Chachere to senior wide receiver Beau Kelly set up the score... Chachere tossed two TD passes early in the second quarter. The first went to senior wide receiver Maclaine Griffin, a 23-yarder, and the second was a 32-yarder to senior wide receiver Mataio Talalemotu. In between was an interception by junior linebacker Isaiah Henry for the Viking defense... It was Chachere to Talalemotu again later in the quarter, this time for 29 yards, and the Vikings led 28-0. A fourth TD pass by Chachere went to freshman tight end Tanner Beaman before halftime and the Vikings went into the locker room with a 35-0 lead... On the first possession out of the locker room, the Vikings drove 69 yards on seven plays to score again. Chachere's fifth TD pass again went to Beaman, this time for three yards. With a 41-0 lead, the rout was on... The big lead allowed numerous Vikings to get playing time throughout the third and fourth quarters. Senior quarterback Mike Irwin threw his first touchdown pass as a Viking, 22 yards to freshman wide receiver Jaylen Lynch. That bumped the Viking lead to 48-0 late in the third quarter... Each team had only one possession in the fourth quarter (except for a final kneel down play by the Vikings) as they both burned clock. The Oaks were able to produce a 17-play, 97-yard drive, finishing on a five-yard scoring run. A failed conversion made the final score, 48-6... Chachere completed 14-29 passes for 280 yards and five touchdowns in a little more than two quarters of play. He added four rushes for 42 yards and a score... Beaman led the team with five receptions for 58 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore wide receiver Nate Bennett caught four passes for 86 yards. Talalemotu had three catches for 83 yards and two TDs... Defensively, the Vikings forced two turnovers, had 11 tackles for loss and two sacks. Senior defensive tackle EJ Ane made six tackles and a sack. Junior linebacker Ian Crocker had six tackles, including one for loss. Senior defensive end VJ Malo made four tackles with two for losses... PSU is 20-0 all-time against lower division opponents since joining the Big Sky in 1996.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Portland State has averaged 464.0 yards and 41.5 points in its two wins the past two weeks... the Vikings had their biggest offensive day of the season against Northern Arizona (10/1), compiling 479 yards of total offense, 274 through the air and 205 on the ground... PSU averages 330.6 total yards per game and 24.4 points.
- **DANTE'S DATA:** SO QB Dante Chachere (SASH-er-ay) has totaled 724 yards of offense the past two weeks, including 554 passing (36-57) and 170 rushing (16 carries). Chachere has accounted for 11 touchdowns, completing eight TD passes (five to SR WR Mataio Talalemotu) and rushing for three scores... his career highs for passing are 280 yards and five touchdowns, and for rushing are 128 yards and two touchdowns.... Chachere was named Big Sky Conference co-Offensive Player of the Week for his performance against NAU (272 yards passing, 3 TDs, 128 yards rushing, 2 TDs)... for the season, Chachere is completing 61% of his passes, has 936 yards, 11 touchdowns and three interceptions. He also has 48 carries for a team-high 294 rushing yards and three TDs... he has 1,230 yards total offense (246.0 per game).
- **KELLY IS A HERO:** SR WR Beau Kelly has 22 catches for a team-high 303 yards and two scores. He ranks eighth in receiving yards in the Big Sky Conference... Kelly had a season-high nine receptions for 133 yards and a touchdown at San Jose State... last season Kelly led the Big Sky Conference during the regular season in receptions (69), total yards (981) and touchdowns (10)... Kelly's career numbers are 137 receptions (9th all-time at PSU) for 1,937 yards (11th all-time) and 15 TDs (11th).

- SO WR Nate Bennett has a team-high 23 catches for 278 yards this season.
- **MT's TDS:** SR WR Mataio Talalemotu is on a pretty good run. In the past two weeks, he has caught six passes for 189 yards and 5(!) touchdowns. Talalemotu made three catches for 106 yards against NAU, then three for 83 yards and two scores against Lincoln. His three-TD day marked the first time since Sept. 26, 2013 that a Viking had caught three touchdowns in a game... Talalemotu leads the Vikings with six total touchdowns this season, which ranks fourth in the Big Sky Conference... Talalemotu now has 108 receptions, 1,720 yards and 15 TDs in his career (11th all-time).
- **TB's TDs:** Among the many youngsters getting playing time last Saturday, FR TE Tanner Beaman had the biggest impact. The freshman from Vancouver's Skyview High School had a team-high five receptions, including a 14-yard touchdown catch in the second quarter and three-yard receiving score in the third... true FR WR Jaylen Lynch also caught a touchdown pass, a 22-yarder from SR QB Mike Irwin.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- **DEFENSIVE DIAMONDS:** Portland State's defense held Lincoln scoreless for 59:57 before allowing a late touchdown. It was the fewest points (6) the Vikings have allowed since a 24-0 win over Idaho on Oct. 12, 2019... the 234 yards allowed were the fewest by a Viking opponent this season... the Vikings had 11 tackles for loss, two sacks and two interceptions in the game... PSU currently ranks ninth in the nation with 7.8 TFLs per game this season... PSU's defense held Northern Arizona to 0-11 on third down, then Lincoln to 0-11 on third down before the Oaks finally converted one. That was 22 straight third-down stops. Outside of a 7-10 third-down performance by Washington on Sept. 10, PSU has held the other opponents to 11-49 (22%).
- **"INITIAL" DEFENDERS:** SR DT EJ Ane had another big game for the Vikings with six tackles and a sack against Lincoln. He leads the team with three quarterback sacks this season among his 21 tackles... SR DE VJ Malo made two tackles for loss in the game and has a team-high six TFLs this season (and 26 in his 17-game PSU career).
- **D-LINE DOMINANCE:** SR DEs Jake Porter and VJ Malo and SR DTs EJ Ane and Moses Finau have combined for 56 tackles, 17 tackles for loss and seven sacks this season.
- SO ROV Tyreese Shakir picked up his second interception of the season against Lincoln and he leads the team in that category. Shakir has four INTs and two fumble recoveries in 16 career games... this season, Shakir is the team leader with 26 tackles, and has three tackles for loss and two sacks.
- Portland State's defense had one of its best performances ever against an FBS-level program at San Jose State (9/1). The Vikings allowed only 288 yards in the game, making seven sacks. The most sacks PSU had in a game last season was five, and the seven sacks were the second-most in the nation by an FCS team in week one... the Viking D held SJSU to 66 yards in the second half helping the offense turn a 14-7 deficit into a 17-14 lead... PSU held four of 11 opponents under 300 yards in 2021.
- Eight different Vikings have sacks (13 total) and 18 have tackles for loss (39 total) through five games. PSU's 7.8 tackles for loss per game ranks ninth in the nation.
- SR DE Porter has now played in the most games of any current Viking (40), making 26 starts.
- SR CB Anthony Adams suffered an ankle injury at Washington and is out indefinitely. Prior to that, Adams had started 37 consecutive games in his career. He missed his first game ever at Montana. In the first two games, Adams had 15 tackles. At SJSU he had a team-high 10 tackles, one tackle for loss and two pass breakups. It was the third double-digit tackle game of his career... Adams now has 33 career pass breakups, tying former Viking Rashad Floyd (1997-2000) for the PSU career record.
- PSU has also missed top tackler SO LB Parker McKenna the past two games. SO LB Jaymason Willingham has capably filled in making 10 total tackles.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- **FOOTNOTES:** SR P George Triplett, a transfer from Princeton, has punted for an average of 43.6 yards with a long of 57... of his 27 punts, six have gone over 50 yards... he ranks second in the Big Sky Conference and 13th in the nation.
- **FOOTNOTES PART II:** SO K Gianni Smith is 3-4 on field goals this season with a long of 40 yards. Smith is now 8-12 on field goals in his career. He missed the first extra point of his career against Lincoln, but had made 43 straight prior to that. He is now 44-45 in his career.
- **BLOCK PARTY:** SO TE Elias Spence has been a key special teams player this season. Against Lincoln, he had three big plays on the punt block team, tackling the punter on one series, then blocking a punt on the next series. Spence's blocked punt was the first since 2018 (Jacob Bystry) for the Vikings. Later in the game, Spence blocked another punt... Spence has four tackles on special teams this season.
- SO LS Ryan Alvidrez started the 17th consecutive game of his career. He has a perfect long snapping record as a Viking.

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LET'S OPEN UP THE RECORD BOOK

Three Vikings are having an impact on the Portland State career record book this season. A more complete look at record book updates can be found after the season stats in these game notes.

- SR CB All-American Anthony Adams is tied for first all-time in pass breakups (33 in 37 games) with former Viking All-American Rashad Floyd (1997-2000, 45 games). Adams is two interceptions shy of making the top 10 for picks (9).
- SR WR Beau Kelly now ranks ninth all-time in receptions (137), he is 32 yards shy of the top 10 in receiving yards (1,937), one touchdown short of the top 10 for receiving touchdowns (15), and ranks ninth all-time in punt return yards (267).
- SR DE VJ Malo now ranks 10th all-time in career sacks with 11.5 in 17 career games... his 26 tackles for loss is two shy of the PSU all-time top 10.

BEAU KNOWS RECEIVING, PASSING, RETURNING, RUSHING...

SR WR Beau Kelly has done it all for the Vikings during his career. He had 1,111 all-purpose yards last season, gaining yards receiving, rushing and on punt returns. He was also 2-2 passing for 56 yards.

- In game one against San Jose State, Kelly had 144 total yards, including 133 receiving. He has 288 total yards in four games.

MALO-IFICENT TO OFFENSES

SR DE VJ Malo terrorized opposing quarterbacks in 2021. He made 10.5 sacks (2nd in the Big Sky), 20 tackles for loss (4th in the Big Sky) and forced three fumbles (1st in the Big Sky). His 20 TFLs were the second most for a season in school history, most ever at the Division I level and most since 1987. His 10.5 sacks rank eighth all-time, are the most at the Division I level and most since 1988. Malo was selected to four preseason All-America teams and preseason All-Big Sky.

- Malo picked up where he left off, making a sack in his first game of the season. He now has 11.5 career sacks, 10th-most for a career in PSU history... Malo also has 26 career tackles for loss and is approaching PSU's career top 10.

STRAIGHT AS: ALL-AMERICAN ANTHONY ADAMS

SR CB Anthony Adams is a two-time All-American - once as a safety and once as a cornerback. He led the nation in passes defended in 2019 (24; 19 PBUs, 5 INTs). He entered the 2022 season as the nation's leader in career passes defended (40; 31 PBUs, 9 INTs, plus 4 FRs through 2021).

Adams has been selected to five 2022 FCS Preseason All-America teams and was named to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List for the second time in his career. He was 12th in the balloting in 2019. Adams is also considered one of the top NFL prospects at the FCS level for 2023.

- Adams is now the career record holder at Portland State for pass breakups (33). He is also the leader among active players in total tackles (180).
- Adams had 10 tackles and two pass breakups in the Vikings' opener at San Jose State.
- Adams missed the first game - and start - of his career at Montana due to a left ankle injury. He is out indefinitely.

At Montana, SR QB Mike Irwin and FR RB Treyvon Easterling played in their first game as a Viking.

Against Northern Arizona, FR S Michael Hurst and FR TE Tanner Beaman saw action for the first time.

A total of 69 players competed against Lincoln, about 20 more than normal. As a result, several Vikings saw their first action: FR WR Jayden Brannan, FR WR Chance Miller, FR RB William Blakey, FR TE Charlie White, FR LB Joseph Nanai, FR LB Davin Beason, SO OL Chandler Ross, FR OL Braylon Cornell, FR OL Jake Cooper, FR OL Hezephaniah Po Ching, FR WR Malcolm Tatum, FR WR Jaylen Lynch, FR DL Jessie Brown, FR DL Rob Silva and FR DL Michael MacNeill.

SEASON HIGHLIGHT REEL

FLY SWATTER

SR CB Anthony Adams broke up two passes in the season-opener at San Jose State (9/1). That gave him 33 career pass breakups, tying the Portland State record for PBUs with Rashad Floyd (1997-2000).

DANTE'S DAY, WITH A LITTLE HELP FROM MATAIO

SO QB Dante Chachere had a big day in his first home start, a 35-27 win over Northern Arizona (10/1). Chachere totaled 402 yards of offense and was responsible for all five Viking touchdowns. Chachere completed 22-28 passes for 274 yards and three touchdowns. He rushed 12 times for 128 yards and two scores. His 72-yard TD run in the second quarter was the longest run by a Viking since 2018. All of his numbers were career highs in his fourth career start. Chachere was named Big Sky Conference co-Offensive Player of the Week for his performance. Benefiting from Chachere's play the most was SR WR Mataio Talalemotu. He caught three passes – all of which went for touchdowns – from 23, 17 and 66 yards. It marked the first three-TD game of Talalemotu's career and the first by a Viking in nine years.

AN ALL-AROUND WIN

Portland State made it two wins in a row with a 48-6 victory over Lincoln (10/8). The Vikings scored the most points and gave up the fewest points since 2019. SO QB Dante Chachere had another big day with 322 yards of total offense, five passing touchdowns and one rushing touchdown. The Viking defense held Lincoln to an opponent low 234 yards, made 11 tackles for loss, two sacks and two interceptions. And special teams played a big role behind SO TE Elias Spence, who blocked two punts and tackled the punter on a third punt attempt. All-around, a good win.

Thirdgill is a member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee on campus, was a co-creator of a Social Justice Team, has also been involved with PSU's freshman student-athlete mentorship program and is a volunteer with Holy Redeemer Athletics and Big Yard Foundation.

FABULOUS AS FRESHMEN

The Vikings started six freshmen, had eight making major contributions, and played 24 total freshmen in 2021... WRs Nate Bennett (50-616-4) and Darien Chase (54-579-4) were important members of the offense, while OLs Richard Estrella and D'Angalo Titali'i became starters... LB Parker McKenna led the Vikings in tackles with 88, including four tackles for loss, a sack, a forced fumble and fumble recovery. Also on defense, ROV Tyreese Shakir became a starter, making 32 tackles, two interceptions, two fumble recoveries and four pass breakups. LB Justice Pagan made 39 tackles, 6.5 TFLs, two sacks and two pass breakups... on special teams, K Gianni Smith and LS Ryan Alvidrez were starters and steady performers.

BEAM ME UP

The NCAA transfer portal has become a significant recruiting tool in all sports. In 2022, Portland State will have 16 Division I transfers on its roster, 11 of which are from FBS schools.

CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

The Portland State Football team has selected its captains for the 2022 season. In a vote of the players, seniors Anthony Adams, Beau Kelly, VJ Malo, Tyson Pauling and Mataio Talemotu were named team captains.

THE SCHEDULE

Portland State will play a traditional 11-game football schedule in 2022, featuring two FBS opponents and a rigorous eight-game Big Sky Conference slate that includes three FCS playoff programs. The Vikings have five games at home and six on the road in 2022.

- This is the 76th season of Portland State football (1947) and 27th season as a member of the Big Sky Conference.
- Year in and year out Portland State football has one of the most challenging Football Championship Subdivision schedules in the country, and 2022 will be no different. The Vikings will play three 2021 FCS playoff teams (Montana, Eastern Washington and Sacramento State). Sacramento State was the Big Sky Conference Champion (8-0). PSU's opponents were a combined 35-29 in Big Sky games last year, 49-44 overall.
- PSU faces five teams in 2022 that were on the schedule in 2021 (Weber State, Idaho, Eastern Washington, Sacramento State, Cal Poly). PSU plays at Idaho for a second straight season.
- The two FBS-level programs were San Jose State and Washington. It was the second all-time meeting with the Spartans and the third meeting with the Huskies. PSU is 4-44 all-time when playing "up" against FBS programs. Wins have come over Hawai'i (2000), New Mexico (2006), Washington State (2015) and North Texas (2015).
- Portland State has its latest home-opening start (Oct. 1) since 2010 (Oct. 2).
- The last time PSU played three straight home games (Oct. 1-8-15) was in 2003 (Sept. 4-13-20).
- Portland State played one lower division program in 2022, Division II Lincoln (CA) University. The Vikings are now 20-0 in games against lower division opponents since moving to Division I in 1996.
- The Big Sky Conference has been reduced to 12 teams in 2022. Southern Utah left the conference to join the Western Athletic Conference. Portland State faces just eight of the other 11 members. PSU will miss Big Sky schools Montana State, UC Davis and Idaho State in 2022.

VIKING TRIVIA

- **BUY LOCAL:** Portland State has 28 players on the roster from the state of Oregon, plus seven others from just across the river and the Vancouver, WA area.
- **REMEMBER ME?:** SR WR Emmanuel Daigbe was born in Liberia. Originally he wrestled in college at Highline and Green River CCs. He has not played since 2019 due to a groin injury, but was an All-Conference wide receiver and special teams performer that season.
- **THE ADAMS FAMILY:** SR CB Anthony Adams is the brother of former Vikings WR Darnell Adams. Anthony is a key player on the Viking defense this season. Darnell finished his career in 2017 (99 receptions, 1,568 yards, 12 touchdowns) which was Anthony's redshirt freshman season. This season Darnell has returned as the wide receivers coach.
- **LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON:** JR WR Mataio Talemotu is the son of Ina Talemotu, who played in 1987-88 on Portland State's two NCAA II National finalist teams. He is also the cousin of former Viking DL Savali Talemotu.
- **OH, BROTHER:** SO QB Dante Chachere's brother, Andre, is a cornerback for the NFL's Philadelphia Eagles.
- **FAMILY AFFAIR:** SR DE Jake Porter's father, Jason, was a four-year letterwinner in baseball at Portland State (1991-94). A cousin, FR OL Braylon Cornell, signed with the Vikings in 2022. Another cousin, Ellie Snook, is an All-Conference libero on the Viking volleyball team.
- **19 DEGREES:** Nineteen Portland State players have already earned their degrees, and/or are working on advanced degrees. They are: Anthony Adams, Shea Carstens, Emmanuel Daigbe, Boogie Davis, Isaiah Henry, Robert Holt, Beau Kelly, Deion Malone, Tyson Pauling, Jake Porter, Mataio Talemotu, Malik Thirdgill, Nathan West, Isaiah Avery, Xavier Bell, Broderick Harrell, Mike Irwin, Jaylen Larry and George Triplett.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT PORTLAND STATE AND VIKING FOOTBALL

Portland State University, located in Portland, OR, is the second-largest school in the state of Oregon with 23,979 students. It was founded in 1946 as Vanport College - a two-year institution.

Athletically, Portland State began as a junior college in 1946-47, but competed in the Oregon Collegiate Conference at the NAIA level from 1950 to 1964, winning three OCC football titles (1962, 1963, 1964). PSU became a four-year institution in 1955.

Portland State joined the NCAA in 1965 and competed at the College Division level (the forerunner of NCAA II). PSU was an NCAA 1-AA member from 1978-80, then moved back to Division II in 1981, where it competed through the 1995 season. The Vikings were members of the Western Football Conference from 1982 to 1992, winning six conference championships. PSU made eight NCAA II playoff appearances from 1987 to 1995.

In 1996, Portland State moved to the Big Sky Conference and up to the NCAA 1-AA (now FCS) level. The Vikings made their first playoff appearance at their current level in 2000. In 2015, Portland State had its best season ever at the Division I level, compiling a 9-3 record and reaching the NCAA playoffs.

Portland State's football program has produced such legendary figures as Coach Mouse Davis, quarterbacks Neil Lomax and June Jones, Tom Oberg (the first Viking to play in the NFL), Coach Pokey Allen (who led the Vikings to two NCAA II National Championship appearances), and some 30 players who have appeared in the NFL.

In 2014, three former Vikings reached NFL Championship games: Julius Thomas with Denver, DeShawn Shead with Seattle and Jordan Senn with Carolina. Thomas and Shead went on to meet in Super Bowl XLVIII with their respective teams and Shead became a Super Bowl Champion - just the third former PSU Viking to do so (Clint Didier, Ted Popson). Shead made a return appearance to the Super Bowl in 2015, while Thomas was selected to his second Pro Bowl in as many years. He later signed a free agent contract with the Jacksonville Jaguars, making him the highest paid tight end in the NFL.

Portland State football plays at Hillsboro Stadium, west of downtown, a 7,200-seat stadium.

PORTLAND STATE

Portland State should always be referred to as "Portland State", NEVER by just "Portland". An acceptable alternative to "Portland State" is "PSU". The nickname for both the men's and women's teams at Portland State is "Vikings". The women's teams should NEVER be referred to as the "Lady Vikings" or "Lady Viks". An acceptable alternative to "Vikings" is "Viks".

- **FROM THE FIELD TO THE SIDELINE:** Offensive Line Coach Matt Leunen (OL/TE, 2005-09) is a PSU alum who played for the Vikings... Quarterbacks Coach Kieran McDonagh (2012-15) is also a PSU alum who was recruited by and played for Bruce Barnum... Wide Receivers Coach Darnell Adams (2012-17) joined the Viking staff this season.
- **GOING PRO:** Former Viking QB Davis Alexander finished his Portland State career in 2021 ranked number two in virtually every PSU passing category behind only Neil Lomax. Alexander is currently a member of the Montreal Alouettes.
- **SUPER PLAYERS:** Portland State had a pair of former players meet in the Super Bowl for the first time in history in February 2014. TE Julius Thomas ('10, Denver) and DB DeShawn Shead ('11, Seattle) both played in Super Bowl XLVIII. Shead returned to the Super Bowl in 2015 with the Seahawks. He joins Clint Didier and Ted Popson as former Vikings with Super Bowl rings. Thomas was named a Pro Bowl tight end in 2013 and 2014. In the 2014 off-season, he signed the richest tight end contract in the NFL to play for the Jacksonville Jaguars. Thomas retired in the 2018 off-season after a seven-year career that included 71 games, 226 receptions, 2,406 yards and 36 touchdowns. Shead, a starting corner with the Seahawks in 2016, missed 2017 due to an ACL injury, then signed and played with Detroit in 2018. Shead is now an assistant coach with the Seahawks.

2021 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- After an opt-out season in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Portland State football program returned to a full season of competition in 2021. With two games to play in the season, the Vikings were still in contention for a post-season berth. However, losses to Big Sky Conference Champion Sacramento State and fifth-ranked Eastern Washington in the final two weeks had the Vikings finish the year at 5-6 overall, 4-4 in Big Sky Conference games. The 4-4 mark was PSU's best since the 2015 season. The marquee win was a 30-18 victory over 24th-ranked and defending Big Sky Champion Weber State.
- The Vikings had six players earn All-Big Sky Conference honors: 1st team: JR CB Anthony Adams (52T, 5 TFL, 5 PBU, 3 INT, 3 FR, 1 FF); 2nd team: JR WR Beau Kelly (69 receptions, 981 yards, 10 TDs); SR QB Davis Alexander (266-432, 3,075 yards, 21 TDs, 12 INTs, 6 rushing TDs); JR DE VJ Malo (45T, 20 TFL, 10.5 SK, 3 FF, 2 PBU); Honorable Mention: FR WR Nate Bennett (50 receptions, 616 yards, 4 TDs); SR DT Semise Kofe (37T, 5.5 TFL, 2.5 SK).
- JR CB Anthony Adams was named second team All-American by Hero Sports. He is now a two-time All-American (2019).
- JR TE Malik Thirdgill was named to the Big Sky Conference Community Service team for contributions away from the field. Thirdgill is a member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee on campus, was a co-creator of a Social Justice Team, has also been involved with PSU's freshman student-athlete mentorship program and is a volunteer with Holy Redeemer Athletics and Big Yard Foundation.
- JR WR Beau Kelly led the Big Sky Conference in receptions (69), receiving touchdowns (10), total receiving yards (981), and would have led in punt return average (14.4) but did not reach the required number of returns... JR CB Anthony Adams led the Big Sky in fumble recoveries (3) and had six total takeaways.
- SR RB Malik Walker was named Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Week after an Oct. 30 win over Cal Poly. Walker rushed 14 times for 116 yards and two touchdowns in the game. Walker finished the season third in the Big Sky in rushing (879 yards) and second in touchdowns (11).
- FR WR Nate Bennett was named to the 22-player Jerry Rice Award Watch List during the season. The Jerry Rice Award recognizes the top freshman in the nation at the end of the season. He finished 19th in the balloting... SR QB Davis Alexander was selected to the 46-member Walter Payton Award Watch List. The Payton Award is given annually to the top offensive player in the nation at the FCS level.
- SR QB Davis Alexander finished his career second all-time in virtually every passing category at Portland State, trailing only Viking legend Neil Lomax, including total offense (10,473 yards), passing yards (9,215), touchdown passes (63), completions (708-1,223). Alexander also had 25 career rushing touchdowns (7th all-time), and with 88 total touchdowns ranks behind only Lomax.
- JR DE VJ Malo had 20 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks on the season. Both numbers were the most ever by a Viking at the FCS level, and the most by any Viking since 1988. He was second in TFLs and fourth in sacks in the Big Sky, ranking fifth and 11th in the nation, respectively.
- Portland State had 20 student-athletes earned Academic All-Big Sky Conference honors.

GET ON THE BUS: THE AMERICANA TOUR

Portland State Football Coach Bruce Barnum is renowned for taking his team on the bus to as many road games as possible. He calls it "The Americana Tour." It has made for some long bus rides, but Barnum often lets his team out to see the sights. Barnum also feels it promotes team unity (and saves a few dollars in the budget). In the past seven years, PSU has logged 23,298 bus miles with a "program record" of 4,906 in 2016.

- Coach Barnum led his first "Americana Tour" in 2015, which included bus rides to Pullman, WA, Pocatello, ID, San Luis Obispo, CA, and Cheney, WA. In all, the Vikings logged 4,394 bus miles and approximately 80 hours round trip to those four destinations (PSU also flew on two road trips). The Americana Tour included such things as dozens of on-bus movies, a stop to buy a lottery ticket on the way home from beating Washington State, a practice on Boise State's blue turf, a sight-seeing trip to Alcatraz (in which equipment manager Mike Haluska was left on the island... but soon retrieved), and a midnight

McDonald's run at a lonely truck stop in eastern Oregon. In addition to the economy of the bus trips, Barnum contends the time together draws the Viking team closer.

- The 2016 Americana Tour included round trips to San Jose, Seattle and Sacramento (twice). There was also a return bus ride from Ogden, UT and a shorter trip from Las Vegas to Cedar City... the trip to San Jose was a total of 1,340 miles. It included a stop off at Oregon Wildlife Safari and the obligatory In-and-Out Burger visitation in Medford... on the trip to Southern Utah, PSU flew into Las Vegas, took in the Criss Angel Show at the Luxor Hotel and made another midnight In-and-Out run... while traveling to Weber State, PSU visited Temple Square and the Hogle Zoo... after a pair round trips to Sacramento (UC Davis and Sacramento State), PSU had accumulated 4,906 bus miles for the season.
- The 2017 season was limited to just three bus trips: Oregon State, Idaho State and Eastern Washington. There was also a bus portion from San Jose, CA to Cal Poly. And, Portland State's trip to Corvallis was a mere 168 miles round trip. The Americana Tour bus trip to Pocatello, ID was 660 miles one way, 1,320 miles round trip. The Vikings made a stop in Pendleton and toured the Pendleton Rodeo Museum and Hall of Fame, as well as a stop along the Snake River... the Vikings had bus travel from San Jose Airport to San Luis Obispo for the game at Cal Poly. It was 376 miles round trip and included a stop over on the Monterey Peninsula on the way down. No golf was played... the final week's bus trip from PSU to Eastern Washington was 339 miles one way, 678 round trip. That made the Vikings' Americana Tour for 2017 a total of 2,542 miles.
- In 2018 Portland State made bus trips to five different states. They included Nevada (1,156 miles round trip), Oregon (218 miles), Idaho (718 miles), Montana (1,098 miles) and Sacramento State (1,158 miles). That made for a total of 4,348 bus miles.
- The 2019 Americana Tour started early as the Vikings bussed to Camp Rilea Armed Forces Training Center in Warrenton, OR (176 miles round trip) for the first three days of preseason practice. The Vikings stayed in the barracks, ate at the mess hall and practice on a makeshift field on the Helipad. Numerous team bonding exercises took place, including bowling night, a beach bonfire and three hours of liberty in Seaside, OR... only three bus trips are on the docket for 2019. They include Boise State (864 miles round trip), Idaho State (1,326 miles) and Eastern Washington (678 miles)... on the trip to Boise State, the Vikings pulled off the freeway for a couple of hours in Pendleton to enjoy the world famous Pendleton Roundup rodeo... FR OL Shiloh Ta'ase thrilled his teammates on the way to Eastern Washington when the team stopped for lunch in Kennewick. On a dare, Ta'ase leaped into the Columbia River in the midst of chilly 33-degree temperatures... Total bus miles for 2019 were 3,044.
- PSU's lone game at Montana in spring 2021 included a 1,098-mile round trip.
- In 2021, the Americana Tour began with a bus ride to Washington State. The round-trip to Pullman was 775 miles... the Vikings flew to Las Vegas, then bussed up to Cedar City for a game with Southern Utah. A team photo in front of the legendary "Welcome to Las Vegas" sign was part of the journey. Following a PSU win, the busses took a celebratory cruise down the Las Vegas strip at midnight on the return trip. That round trip was 342 miles... Portland State made the 6+-hour bus drive to Idaho on Oct. 9 (via an overnight stay in Spokane), totaling 791 miles round trip... the Vikings bussed to Sacramento to take on the Hornets. The round trip was 1,058 miles. That increased the season bus miles to 2,966.
- The 2022 season will be low-key bus travel, as the Vikings bus to only Washington (356 miles round trip), Idaho (718 miles round trip) and Eastern Washington (680 miles round trip). That totals a mere 1,754 bus miles for the season... while in San Jose, the Viking team made a return site-seeing trip to Alcatraz (like 2015) on the day before the game.

PORTLAND STATE LEADS THE BIG SKY CONFERENCE IN

4th Down Conversions, 6-8, .750

Game 1 • Sept. 1 • San Jose, CA

SAN JOSE STATE 21, PORTLAND STATE 17

San Jose, CA – Night owls in the City of Roses were nearly treated to an upset from the hometown team on Thursday. But San Jose State quarterback Chevan Cordeiro scrambled for a two-yard touchdown with 1:11 to play, boosting the Spartans over Portland State, 21-17, at CEFCU Stadium.

In a coulda, shoulda, woulda game, the Vikings came up agonizingly short. They outgained the Spartans 395-288 on the field. The defense was resilient in the second half, allowing only 66 yards to San Jose State, forcing a missed field goal and getting a goal line stop with four minutes to play. However, the Vikings couldn't get a needed first down and had to punt it back with just over two minutes left.

PSU can look at two turnovers, a special teams miscue and seven costly penalties as big factors in their season opener.

"We made too many mistakes and we left two touchdowns on the field in the first half," said Vikings Coach Bruce Barnum. But he also acknowledged the grit his team played with, led by the defense.

"It was an outstanding performance by the defense. But there were too many mistakes to follow up what they did. They put us in a great position to win, but we have to clean it up and not make mistakes I saw in the other two phases of the game on offense and special teams."

"I told the team don't accept 'you played well' from this. Win the game. That's what we need to do. We need to clean up the mistakes and win those games."

New starting quarterback Dante Chachere was up to the moment in his first time leading the team. The sophomore signal caller drove the Vikings 66 yards for a touchdown in his first series. Chachere completed 4-4 passes for 47 yards, including an 11-yard TD toss to senior wideout Maclaine Griffin. That gave the Vikings an early 7-0 lead.

San Jose State is known for its defensive front seven and it showed after that. The Vikings went three-and-out in their next two series. The Spartans scored on their next two series and led 14-7 early in the second quarter.

The Vikings had two drives terminated inside the Spartans 10-yard line late in the second quarter. Kenyon Reed intercepted a Chachere pass at the nine-yard line to end a 73-yard PSU drive and scoring threat.

PSU's defense held on the succeeding series getting a fourth-down stop on the Spartans at the PSU 43. VJ Malo had a sack, Anthony Adams and Boogie Davis each made tackles for loss, then Jake Porter got the 4th-and-2 stop with another sack.

Again, the Vikings drove deep into Spartan territory. With the clock winding down, PSU got to first-and-goal at the one-yard line with no timeouts and 4.5

seconds on the clock. With the option of attempting a field goal, the Vikings went for a tying score. But the San Jose State defense stopped Viking back Andrew Van Buren on a dive over the line and the half ran out with the Spartans ahead 14-7.

The Vikings closed the gap on a 12-play, 70-yard drive in the third quarter. A pair of SJSU personal fouls helped the cause. Gianni Smith finished the drive with a 35-yard field goal, making it 14-10 Spartans.

PSU got a defensive stop on the next series, but the Spartans punted it down to the PSU 1. On the next play, the Vikings ran a flea flicker from their own endzone. The result was a 48-yard completion to Nate Bennett near midfield. Later, the Vikings went for it on 4th-and-2 from the Spartans 43. A wildcat run by Van Buren resulted in a first down.

On another 4th-and-2, at the Spartans 19, a Chachere keeper went for eight yards and a first down. Two plays later, Chachere hit Beau Kelly in the middle of the end zone on a go-ahead 12-yard touchdown pass. PSU led 17-14 with 9:57 to play.

The Spartans missed a chance to tie with a 37-yard field goal attempt that flew wide right. But a moment later Jordan Cobbs picked off a Chachere pass that was tipped at the line. SJSU took over at the PSU 23 with 6:20 to play.

Portland State was able to terminate that drive, making a fourth-and-goal stop with 4:03 left.

The Vikings took over at their own one-yard line, but were limited to eight yards and a punt. It was returned to the PSU 32. Six plays and two PSU penalties later Cordeiro made his dash into the end zone with the winning score.

PSU had 1:11 to play, but could only get to midfield before a last-second Hail Mary fell short.

Chachere completed 24-37 passes for 270 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. He rushed 14 times for 83 yards.

"He learned and I was proud of him," said Barnum of his new quarterback. "The pick he threw in the first half... well, the touchdown he threw in the second half was on the same play. He learned and adjusted. I was happy with what I saw from him. If he keeps doing that, he is going to put a lot of points up."

Coming up big again for the Vikings was Kelly with nine receptions for 133 yards and a score.

"He is a threat. Everybody looks at him in pregame and laughs at him (because of his 5-9, 170-pound stature), and then he torches them. He made some outstanding plays and catches. He is an All-American type football player," said Barnum.

The story was the defense though. PSU did not force a turnover, but stopped two Spartan drives on fourth down, made 11 tackles for loss and seven sacks in the

WASHINGTON 52, PORTLAND STATE 6

Seattle, WA – The Washington Huskies ran a master class on offense, sustaining drives all day, and their defense shut down the Vikings as UW defeated underdog Portland State, 52-6, at Husky Stadium.

Quarterback Michael Penix Jr. had a big first half and the Washington running game controlled the second half as the Huskies cruised to the win. Washington amassed 617 yards of total offense compared to 131 for the Vikings.

"When we play these games up at the FBS levels there are two tiers "up", said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum, "and Washington is in the top tier. Their defense was stout and they showed it. The speed of their defensive ends, we will not see that for the rest of the year."

"They have a system going on offense and how Penix sits back there, he is accurate and has a big arm, and their O-line is an impressive group."

Penix completed 20-27 passes for 337 yards and two touchdowns with one interception. The backfield of Wayne Tualapapa and Cameron Davis combined on 22 carries for 164 yards and three scores before resting a good portion of the second half.

On the Viking side, quarterback Dante Chachere was under pressure much of the afternoon, completing only 6-17 passes for 50 yards. Sophomore running back Jalynnee McGee had the best performance on offense with 12 carries for 58 yards.

"This week it affected us protecting the pass as well as the run," said Barnum. "We made some mistakes early, but once we settled down, it was just the University of Washington's front seven doing a hell of a job on Dante. They got after us up front."

Portland State dropped to 0-2 on the season following its two games with FBS opponents. The Vikings begin Big Sky Conference play on Sept. 24 at third-ranked Montana.

Washington went to 2-0 on the season with a pair of home wins, scoring 97 total points.

Washington had a pair of 10-play scoring drives in the first quarter. The first went for 77 yards and the second was 74 yards. The Huskies led 14-0 after one.

Portland State finally drove into Huskies' territory early in the second quarter. However, Chachere was sacked on successive plays and the Vikings were forced to punt.

Washington started the next series at its own one-yard line. It didn't take long to score though. Penix Jr. hit Jalen McMillan on the biggest play of the game, an 84-yard scoring pass down the left side-line. That made it 21-0 with 9:51 left in the half.

The Vikings then put together their best sustained drive of the half. They went 12 plays, 69 yards, with the help of a couple of Huskies penalties. Washington finally stalled the Vikings at fourth-and-four at the UW 6. Sophomore kicker Gianni Smith booted a 23-yard field goal and PSU was on the board.

Washington continued to impress offensively, rolling 72 yards before half-time to go ahead 28-3. The Huskies first four drives of the half, all scores, went 77, 74, 99 and 72 yards.

Sophomore roverback Tyreese Shakir intercepted a Penix pass late in the half to thwart one drive, but the Huskies tacked on a 32-yard field on the final play to go into the locker room leading, 31-3.

Penix threw for 248 yards in the first half as the Viking defense could not get pressure to the quarterback like they had at San Jose State in game one.

Washington opened the second half with an 80-yard drive for a touchdown. Leading the game 38-3 they had it well in hand at that point.

Smith drilled another field goal for the Vikings midway through the third quarter, making the score 38-6.

The Huskies added two touchdowns late in the game for the final 52-6 score.

Defensively, Xavier Bell had seven tackles to lead the Vikings. Parker McKenna and Day Day Bright each made six stops in the game. EJ Ane had five tackles and the Vikings' lone sack.

GAME NOTES

- With two receptions in the game, senior wide receiver Beau Kelly now has 126 in his career. That is good for 10th all-time at Portland State.
- Tyreese Shakir's interception was the third in his 13-game PSU career and fifth career takeaway.
- Gianni Smith is 3-3 on field goals this season and 8-11 in his PSU career.
- George Triplett averaged 47.1 yards on seven punts.
- Nate Bennett led the Vikings with three receptions for 25 yards.
- Portland State is now 4-44 all-time against FBS-level programs.

MONTANA 53, PORTLAND STATE 16

Missoula, MT – Portland State couldn't survive a second-quarter tidal wave from the Montana Grizzlies and that made for a long afternoon at Washington-Grizzly Stadium for the Vikings. Second-ranked UM defeated PSU, 53-16.

PSU trailed only 17-14 at one point, but Montana broke the game open in the second, taking advantage of some heady special teams play, scoring 25 points in the quarter. Then, a defense considered one of the best in the nation wouldn't allow the Vikings to come back.

Montana improved to 4-0 on the season. The Vikings dropped to 0-3, with all three games coming on the road.

"Montana is a good football team. We knew we couldn't make mistakes, but we made mistakes in all three phases of the game, caused by them," said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum. "When you play a team like that, you have to play mistake-free and get a couple of breaks. We didn't do that."

"They did a hell of a job on special teams and that didn't make all the difference, but it was big."

A little trickery by the Vikings to open the game got them on the board first. Kicker Gianni Smith sent a pooch kick down near the Montana 20. Viking wide receiver Maclaine Griffin raced down the field and snatched the ball before a Montana player could cover it. The Vikings were in business at the UM 22 on the first play.

PSU ran the ball four times and wide receiver Mataio Talalemotu ended up scoring on an eight-yard reverse play.

Montana's vaunted defense stifled the Vikings the rest of the quarter. The Griz scored twice, the biggest being a 72-yard punt return by Junior Bergen, and led 14-7 after the first quarter.

Following a UM field goal, the Vikings put together a 14-play, 75-yard drive with Dante Chachere hitting wide receiver Beau Kelly on a 13-yard touchdown pass.

After that though, it was all Montana. The Griz got a 64-yard TD run from Xavier Harris. A pair of special teams errors by the Vikings also hurt. A muffed

kick return spotted PSU at the two-yard line following Harris' run. On the next play, Viking QB Dante Chachere tripped in the endzone for a Montana safety. At the end of the quarter, the Vikings attempted a 54-yard field goal. It came up short and Griz Robby Hauck returned it 99 yards for a score.

Meanwhile, quarterback Lucas Johnson was 14-14 for 175 yards throwing the ball for Montana. At intermission it was 39-14 Griz.

PSU capitalized on a Montana special teams mistake in the third quarter. A bad punt snap resulted in free safety Broderick Harrell tackling the punter in the endzone for a safety. That was the only score of the period as the teams combined for only 31 yards of offense.

Early in the fourth quarter, Hauck intercepted a pass at the Viking 21. The Griz needed only two plays to score again, leading 46-16. Montana added one more score after getting into a short field situation to win 53-16.

Montana's defense, considered one of the best in the nation, was up to it on this day. Quarterbacks Chachere, and later Mike Irwin, routinely felt the pressure of six, and on occasion, seven rushers.

The Griz outgained the Vikings 396-199 overall. Johnson finished 20-26 passing for 221 yards and two scores. Meanwhile, the Vikings combined to go 14-27 passing for 103 yards, one score and one interception.

PORTLAND STATE 35, NORTHERN ARIZONA 27

Hillsboro, OR - The dynamic play of sophomore quarterback Dante Chachere made it a Home Sweet Homecoming for Portland State as the Vikings defeated Northern Arizona, 35-27, at Hillsboro Stadium.

Chachere had 402 yards of total offense and was responsible for five touchdowns as PSU took control of the game early and led the entire way. Chachere would have had a sixth touchdown late in the game, but a replay review took the score off the board and called the ball down on the one-yard line. All that did for the Vikings was allow them to kneel on the football for the final minute of play and pick up their first Big Sky Conference win. PSU is now 1-3, 1-1 in the Big Sky. NAU is 1-4, 0-2.

Chachere completed 22-28 passes for 274 yards and three touchdowns. He rushed 12 times for 128 yards and two scores. All of his numbers were career highs. He hit Beau Kelly eight times and Nate Bennett seven times with passes, but his favorite receiver had to be Mataio Talalemotu who caught only three balls, but all three went for scores (23, 17 and 66 yards).

"I was being too conservative with Dante. I kind of had a governor on him in previous games," said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum. "He had to execute and run our system. I told him today, 'just roll', and he did a hell of a job."

The Viking defense was stout early, holding NAU to 112 first-half yards as PSU built a 28-7 lead. NAU never converted a third-down (0-11), but had to take numerous chances to try and stay in the game and were able to convert 5-7 fourth downs.

NAU quarterback RJ Martinez finished 30-43 passing for 318 yards and two scores, but also threw one interception. Both TD passes came in the fourth quarter as NAU tried to catch up.

Both teams were looking for an offensive burst to start the game. The Vikings had it first. Chachere led a 70-yard drive on the first series of the game. He hit Talalemotu on a 23-yard touchdown pass to open the scoring.

PSU's defense got a three-and-out against Northern Arizona on its first series. After that, Chachere led the way again, this time 75 yards, and scored on a three-yard run. PSU led 14-0 just 10 minutes into the contest.

Northern Arizona answered back on its ensuing possession. Martinez completed a 65-yard series with a four-yard scoring rush of his own.

Chachere then came up with the biggest running play by a Viking since 2018. On a third-and-long from the PSU 28, Chachere dropped back in the pocket but couldn't find a receiver. He broke containment and went 72 yards up the middle of the field for the score. At that point he had two rushing touchdowns and one receiving touchdown and the Vikings

led 21-7 with 14:02 to go in the first half.

Chachere tossed one more touchdown pass before halftime, again finding Talalemotu on a 17-yard score with 5:27 left in the half. By halftime PSU had out-gained NAU 289-112 and led 28-7.

Portland State did not produce much offense in the third quarter, but the defense made it hold. Twice the Vikings stopped NAU on downs, and on a third series roverback David Joseph picked off a Martinez pass. At the end of three, PSU still led 28-7.

NAU finally broke through early in the fourth quarter. Martinez connected on a 53-yard bomb down the right sideline to Stacy Chukwumezie. A two-point conversion try failed and the score was 28-13.

Chachere and Talalemotu weren't done though. Barnum made a risky fourth-and-one call from the Vikings' 34-yard line and it paid off. Chachere hit Talalemotu on a quick slant and the senior wide receiver galloped 66 yards for the score. PSU led 35-13 with 12:28 left on the clock.

The Lumberjacks put together a quick, nine-play scoring drive to stay in the game. Another failed two-point conversion left them down 35-19 with 9:46 on the clock.

NAU's defense was able to get a stop on the Vikings, then drove again with Chukwumezie catching a TD in the back left of the endzone at the 4:12 mark. Martinez scrambled in on a two-point conversion and it was 35-27 Vikings.

Portland State recovered the ensuing onside kick and converted four first downs to run out the clock at the NAU one-yard line.

PSU had a season-high 479 yards of total offense, 274 through the air and 205 on the ground. NAU finished with 427 yards after a fourth-quarter passing flurry.

Linebacker Jaymason Willingham and cornerback Ezriel Vasquez led the Vikings with seven tackles each. Defensive tackle EJ Ane had six tackles, two for losses, and a sack.

- Beau Kelly moved up to ninth place all-time in receptions at Portland State with 135 in his career. He is 11th in receiving yards (1,882) and touchdowns (15).
- Mataio Talalemotu's three touchdown receptions were the 11th, 12th and 13th of his career.
- The last time a Viking had a longer run than Dante Chachere's 72-yarder was Oct. 27, 2018 when Jalani Eason went 82 yards for a score at Sacramento State.
- David Joseph's interception was the second in his career.
- Portland State had its latest home-opening start (Oct. 1) since 2010 (Oct. 2).
- This was just the fourth meeting between the teams in the last 10 seasons and the first at PSU since 2017.

Hillsboro, OR - A week off from Big Sky Conference play and a lower division opponent added up to a big win for Portland State as the Vikings took down Lincoln (CA) University, 48-6.

Nearly everyone got into the act on the Viking roster as they won their second home game in a row and built a little momentum for a big game with seventh-ranked Weber State next Saturday at Hillsboro Stadium. PSU is now 2-3 overall, 1-1 in the Big Sky.

"Everybody played and that's important," said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum. "We started slow, but once we got settled down, I liked how we played. We executed and did what we were supposed to do."

The Vikings out-gained Lincoln 449-234 and prevented the Oaks from converting a first down until the fourth quarter. The lone score for Lincoln came with three seconds remaining.

Eight different Vikings rushed the ball, eight caught passes, three threw passes, 25 made plays on defense.

"Everything wasn't perfect, but we played on the opposite side of a "money" game and did what we were supposed to do. We played with poise and effort; I liked what I saw," said Barnum. "We got the bench cleared after the first drive of the third quarter and I was happy with that because they got rewarded for their work."

Portland State got off to a bit of a sluggish start, but finally took the lead with 4:58 to play in the first quarter on a nine-yard run by sophomore quarterback Dante Chachere. The Vikings had been set up in Lincoln territory following a blocked punt by Elias Spence. A 36-yard pass from Chachere to senior wide receiver Beau Kelly set up the score.

Chachere tossed two TD passes early in the second quarter. The first went to senior wide receiver Maclaine Griffin, a 23-yarder, and the second was a 32-yarder to senior wide receiver Mataio Talalemotu. In between was an interception by junior linebacker Isaiah Henry for the Viking defense.

It was Chachere to Talalemotu again later in the quarter, this time for 29 yards, and the Vikings led 28-0. A fourth TD pass by Chachere went to freshman tight end Tanner Beaman before halftime and the Vikings went into the locker room with a 35-0 lead.

On the first possession out of the locker room, the Vikings drove 69 yards on seven plays to score again. Chachere's fifth TD pass again went to Beaman, this time for three yards. With a 41-0 lead, the rout was on.

The big lead allowed numerous Vikings to get playing time throughout the third and fourth quarters. Senior quarterback Mike Irwin threw his first touchdown pass as a Viking, 22 yards to freshman wide receiver Jaylen Lynch. That bumped the Viking lead to 48-0 late in the third quarter.

Each team had only one possession in the fourth quarter (except for a final kneel down play by the Vikings) as they both burned clock. The Oaks were able to produce a 17-play, 97-yard drive, finishing on a five-yard scoring run. A failed conversion made the final score, 48-6.

Chachere completed 14-29 passes for 280 yards and five touchdowns in a little more than two quarters of play. He added four rushes for 42 yards and a score.

Beaman led the team with five receptions for 58 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore wide receiver Nate Bennett caught four passes for 86 yards. Talalemotu had three catches for 83 yards and two TDs.

Defensively, the Vikings forced two turnovers, had 11 tackles for loss and two sacks. Senior defensive tackle EJ Ane made six tackles and a sack. Junior linebacker Ian Crocker had six tackles, including one for loss. Senior defensive end VJ Malo made four tackles with two for losses.

GAME NOTES

- Mataio Talalemotu has five TD receptions among his six catches in the last two weeks. With 15 TDs in his career, he and Beau Kelly are tied for 11th all-time at PSU.
- Dante Chachere has thrown eight touchdown passes and run for three scores in the last two games.
- Elias Spence had three big plays on the punt team, tackling the punter on one series, then blocking a punt on the next series. Spence's blocked punt was the first since 2018 (Jacob Bystry) for the Vikings. Later in the half, Spence blocked another punt.
- Isaiah Henry's interception was the first of his career. Tyreese Shakir's interception was his second of the season and fourth of his career.
- The six points allowed are the fewest by Portland State since a 24-0 win over Idaho on Oct. 12, 2019.
- Lincoln is a Division II program from Oakland, CA playing its second season of football.
- PSU is 20-0 all-time against lower division opponents since joining the Big Sky in 1996.
