## STORYLINES

- **SOS:** Portland State has the most difficult strength of schedule of any FCS team in the nation according to the Massey Ratings. Montana will be the fifth nationally-ranked team among seven Big Sky Conference opponents this season, and fourth straight opponent that was a playoff team in 2023.
- **FATHERS AND SONS - THE OLD SWITCHEROO:** Portland State Head Coach Bruce Barnum's son, Cooper, is a linebacker for the Grizzlies. Montana Head Coach Bobby Hauck's son, Robby, is the Special Teams Coordinator and Tight Ends Coach for the Vikings.
- **JUST ONE, BUT IT WAS A GOOD ONE:** Portland State has won only one game in Missoula in Big Sky Conference play in 11 tries. That came in 2018 when the Vikings knocked off 14th-ranked Montana, 22-20, on a 52-yard field goal by Cody Williams in the closing seconds.
- **FAMILIAR FOES:** Portland State and Montana will be meeting for the 48th time in history. That matches the PSU/Idaho State series of 48 games. Those two schools are Portland State's most played opponents in its 78 seasons of football.

## NUMBERS GAME

- **ON THE MARK:** Other than having two kicks blocked at #12 FBS Boise State (9/21), JR K Mathias Uribe is a perfect 9-9 on field goals this season. Uribe was 3-3 against Idaho, including a season-long 48-yarder that pulled the Vikings with 31-30 in the fourth quarter.
- **MILESTONE WATCH:** SR QB Dante Chachere passed three career milestones against Idaho: 5,000 passing yards (5,173), 2,000 rushing yards (2,015 in his career) and 7,000 total yards of offense (7,188 - fifth all-time at PSU)... with 2,015 rushing yards, Chachere has passed Connor Kavanaugh (1,956) for most rushing yards ever by a Viking QB and is the 12th Viking in history to rush for 2,000 yards in a career.
- **1K:** SO RB Quincy Craig passed 1,000 career rushing yards in his 19th career game (1,006) vs. Idaho.

## VIKINGS MEET GRIZ IN FINAL ROAD GAME OF THE SEASON

Portland State continues its march through the nation's most-challenging schedule this Saturday when the Vikings meet the Montana Grizzlies in Missoula. It will be the seventh and final road game of the season, the sixth against a nationally-ranked team, and the fourth straight against a 2023 FCS Playoff team. Sounds challenging, doesn't it? The Vikings and the Griz will kick off at 1 p.m. MT/Noon PT in a game on ESPN+.

PSU (2-7, 2-4) doesn't have the record to show for it, but has played solid football the past five weeks. Road wins over Idaho State and Sacramento State are in there, as well as taking top-10 teams UC Davis and Idaho to the end before losing close games. However, the Vikings still look for a signature win to a very difficult season. Montana would provide that, but it will be a very tall mountain to climb. PSU is 1-10 all-time in Big Sky games in Missoula and have lost their last four meetings overall to the Griz.

10th-ranked Montana (7-3, 4-2) comes off a rare home loss to fourth-ranked UC Davis, 30-14. The Griz are 4-2 at home this season.

Portland State will wrap up its 2024 season at home on Nov. 23 against Northern Colorado. The Bears will be the first home opponent for the Vikings that are NOT ranked in the top 10 in the nation.

## TEAM LEADERS

- **PORTLAND STATE:** SR QB Dante Chachere is 124-210 passing for 1,632 yards, 12 touchdowns and four interceptions this season. He also leads the team in rushing with 637 yards (761 positive yards) and 12 scores.... FR RB Delon Thompson is second in rushing with 111 carries for 534 yards and five TDs. SO RB Quincy Craig has 84 carries for 375 yards and two TDs. Craig has a team-high 703 all-purpose yards and seven touchdowns this season... JR WR Branden Alvarez leads the team with 34 receptions, 453 yards and five TDs... FR WR Eric Denham has 24 catches for 431 yards and three touchdowns... SO LB Peyton Wing leads the Vikings with 79 tackles and seven tackles for loss this season. SO LB Michael Montgomery has 72 tackles, three tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks and four pass breakups... JR K Mathias Uribe is 9-10 on field goals this season... PSU's balanced attack is averaging 184.9 yards rushing, 194.4 yards receiving and 379.3 yards per game... the Vikings are allowing 239.9 rushing yards, 310.3 passing yards and 550.2 total yards per game... PSU has a -2 turnover ratio.
- **MONTANA:** Montana averages 36.9 points and 439.0 yards of offense per game. The Griz have a balanced attack as well with 208.9 yards rushing and 230.1 yards passing per game... Montana allows 24.9 points and 351.7 yards per game... a pair of quarterbacks have seen significant action for the Griz. Logan Fife is 129-193 for 1,479 yards, 11 touchdowns and two interceptions. Keali'i Ah Yat is 85-143 for 822 yards, five touchdowns and three picks... Keelan White is the top receiver with 45 catches for 494 yards and three touchdowns. Junior Bergen has 37 receptions for 472 yards and three scores. Bergen is also a talented return man with a 16.8 average on punts (and one TD) and a 21.4 average on kicks... the running game is also a dual effort with Eli Gillman (113-787-12) and Nick Ostmo (111-684-3) leading the way... linebacker Ryan Tirrell is the top defender with 75 tackles, four tackles for loss, two sacks and four pass breakups... defensive end Hayden Harris has team-leading 14 tackles for loss, 7.5 sacks and has forced three fumbles.

## LAST MEETING, Nov. 11, 2023: #3 Montana 34, Portland State 10

**Portland, OR** - If you don't have the football, it's hard to win the game.

Montana proved that in nearly doubling up the number of offensive play calls against Portland State as the third-ranked Griz defeated the Vikings, 34-10.

A stout defense and a steady offense flexed its muscles against the Vikings in improving to 9-1 on the season, 6-1 in the Big Sky Conference and setting up a winner-take-all game with Montana State next week for the league championship.

With the loss, Portland State dropped to 4-6 on the season, 3-4 in the Big Sky and heads to Northern Colorado for a season finale next Saturday.

Only a late surge of plays by the Vikings made the game look a little more balanced. After punting with 7:11 to go in the fourth quarter, Montana had run 75 offensive plays to 38 for the Vikings. In the end, the Griz ran 78 plays for 489 yards, while the Vikings ran a season-low 47 plays for 255 yards.

"Their offense dominated," said Viking Coach Bruce Barnum. "When we had the ball we challenged them in the run, and they won that battle. We probably should have thrown more earlier, but it seemed like the offense never had the ball."

And that's not far from the truth as Montana had four drives during the game of 12 plays or more. Two resulted in touchdowns, one a field goal and one a punt.

"Montana has gotten better each week this season. That's a coaching feat. They are peaking at the right time. In all three phases of the game we got beat, and that doesn't happen very often," Barnum said.

Each team scored on its opening possession. The Vikings got a 37-yard field goal from Gianni Smith, then Montana followed with a 77-yard touchdown drive. Quarterback Clifton McDowell scored on a one-yard plunge.

On Montana's next series, a big play broke the game open. McDowell dropped back on a fourth-and-eight play from PSU's 36. He was nearly sacked but broke away, then broke two more tackles for a 15-yard run. Montana went on to score again and led 14-3 early in the second quarter. They wouldn't look back.

McDowell scored again for Montana on a 20-yard run midway through the second quarter. A late field goal made the halftime score 24-3 Montana. The Griz out-gained the Vikings, 293-105, in the half. They scored on all four of their possessions with lengthy drives of 12, 9, 9 and 12 plays.

After PSU's field goal, the Vikings were held to two three-and-outs and a nine-play drive that ended in a punt.

The Vikings eventually forced a punt on Montana's first drive of the second half, but the Griz soon scored again. McDowell rushed for his third touchdown, a 17-yarder, with 8:29 left in the third quarter.

PSU overcame a miscue on the ensuing kickoff and came away with its only touchdown of the night. Confusion on a fair catch on the kick had the Vikings starting their series from their own one-yard line. After digging out of that hole, quarterback Dante Chachere found Jermaine Braddock down the middle on a 64-yard touchdown pass – PSU's longest pass play of the season.

But that would be all the fireworks for the Vikings as Montana went on to the 34-10 victory.

PSU rushed 29 times for 93 yards, while Chachere passed for 162 yards. Braddock was the star of the night with eight receptions for a career-high 142 yards and the one score. Jobi Malary rushed 11 times for 54 yards.

On defense, sophomore linebacker Parker McKenna made a career-high 15 tackles with two for losses. Freshman linebacker Michael Montgomery made 13 tackles and was also in on two for losses.

McDowell finished with the three rushing touchdowns and 72 yards on the ground for Montana. He passed for 127 yards.

- Portland State is 2-7 overall, 0-3 at home, 2-4 on the road.
- Portland State is 13-11 at Hillsboro Stadium since becoming its permanent home in 2019... Portland State is 21-0 in games against lower division opponents since moving to Division I in 1996... the Vikings are now 22-6 in home openers since joining the Big Sky.
- 2024 is Portland State's 32nd season at the NCAA I FCS level (1978-80 (1-AA), 1996-2024). PSU is 151-193 in all games at the FCS/1-AA level.
- PSU is in its 29th season since moving back to FCS and the Big Sky Conference (1996-2024). PSU is 132-180 in that span, 84-63 in home games, 48-117 on the road.
- As a member of the Big Sky Conference (1996-2024) PSU is 89-128 all-time in league games, 51-58 at home, 38-70 on the road.
- Bruce Barnum (2015-24, 27-42 Big Sky, 37-63 overall) is the Vikings fourth Head Coach in the Big Sky Conference era. Previous coaches were: Tim Walsh (1993-2006, 42-41/90-68 all-time); Jerry Glanville (2007-09, 7-17/9-24); and Nigel Burton (2010-15, 13-27/21-36).
- The Vikings have never won a Big Sky title, but have tied for second five times (four times under Walsh and in 2015 under Barnum). PSU has made two NCAA FCS playoff appearances (2000, 2015).
- PSU's best record ever at the FCS level was 9-3 in 2015 (4-2 at home, 5-1 on the road).

### VIKINGS MATCH VANDALS FOR 55 MINUTES, FALL LATE, 39-30

Portland State went toe-to-toe with Idaho, the nation's 9th-ranked team, for 55 minutes. But the Vandals were able to put the clinching touchdown on the board late to pull out a 39-30 Big Sky Conference win at Hillsboro Stadium... The game was tied or a one-score margin the entire game until Art Williams was able to rush in a score from three yards with 1:56 remaining on the clock. A two-point conversion iced the game for the Vandals... Ultimately, the game was won up front by Idaho. The Vandals rushed for 257 yards and totaled 462 yards on the day. The Vikings, normally a strong rushing team, were held to 134 on 44 carries, partially due to five quarterback sacks. PSU had just 314 yards of total offense... Portland State's defense got a first-series' stop highlighted by a sack from Peyton Wing. However, on the ensuing punt, the ball was muffed and recovered by the Vandals at PSU's 24-yard line. From there, the Vandals were able to score within four plays. Williams rushed in from seven yards out for 7-0 Idaho lead... The teams traded touchdowns in a rapidly played first half. PSU had drives of 70 and 79 yards. Delon Thompson scored on a one-yard run on the first series, then Dante Chachere tossed a 20-yard scoring pass to Quincy Craig. In between was another Idaho scoring pass. That had the game tied at 14-14 midway through the second quarter... With 6:52 left in the half, Idaho rolled the dice on a 4th-and-three play from its own 47. PSU was ready as Michael Montgomery and Spencer Elliott sacked quarterback Jack Wagner... PSU took over at the Idaho 44. Two runs by Delon Thompson gained 18 yards,

## HEAD COACH BRUCE BARNUM



Bruce Barnum is in his 10th season as Portland State Head Football Coach and his 15th year overall with the program in 2024. Only one head coach, Tim Walsh, has had a longer tenure in PSU history.

Barnum has the distinction of earning FCS National Coach of the Year and Big Sky Conference Coach of the

Year in 2015 after leading PSU to its best season ever at the Division I level (9-3). The season included wins over FBS Washington State and North Texas, and five nationally-ranked FCS teams. The Vikings had their best season in Division I history (9-2) before losing to Northern Iowa 29-17 in the FCS Playoffs.

In his time as Head Coach, Barnum has molded the team in his image; tough, blue-collar and fundamentally-sound, instituting #BarneyBall.

Barnum spent his first five seasons at PSU as the Vikings' offensive coordinator. In his five seasons as offensive coordinator, the Vikings had tremendous success. In 2013, PSU set school-records for total offense (6,486 yards), offense per game (540.5), rushing offense (3,330 yards), rushing offense per game (277.5) and rushing touchdowns (36) while maintaining balance in the attack with 263.0 yards per game in the air, leading the nation in yards per completion (16.7). Portland State ranked third in the nation in total offense (first in the Big Sky) and third in rushing offense (second in the Big Sky). The Viking program has averaged 200+ rushing yards per game in all seven seasons that Barnum has been on the Park Blocks.

Barnum has more than 30 years of coaching experience and more than 15 years as an offensive coordinator. Barnum is the 14th head coach in the 78-year history of Portland State football.

then Chachere threw a play-action slant to Branden Alvarez for a 22-yard touchdown. The Vikings had their first lead at 21-14 with 5:40 to go in the half... Idaho came back to score twice before intermission, each on a running play by Deshaun Buchanan of 22 and 13 yards. The Vandals had a halftime lead of 28-21... PSU took its own gamble on the first possession of the third quarter. On 4th-and-two at the Viking 47, Chachere scrambled for two yards to keep the drive alive. The Vikings were able to convert a 44-yard field goal by Mathias Uribe to close the gap to 28-24... Idaho added a field goal, then Uribe made another with 14:11 to play and it was 31-27 Vandals... Idaho drove to the PSU 26 on the next series. On 4th-and-1 the Vandals tried a trick play with a tight end sneaking under center. However, they were flagged for a false start and had to attempt a 43-yard field goal. Cameron Pope's try went wide right though, and the Vikings took over with 8:29 to play... PSU couldn't make anything happen on the next series and had to punt it away. That's when the Vikings got their own break. The punt hit Idaho's Jakhari Larmond as he was running back to block. The Viking snapper, Kristian Ingman recovered the ball and PSU was back in business. However, once again, they failed to get a first down. Uribe booted his third field goal of the game, from 48 yards, and narrowed the Idaho lead to 31-30... The Vandals took over with 5:11 remaining in the game. Methodically, they moved downfield in eight plays, getting the final score from Williams... Buchanan led the Idaho running game with 22 carries for 212 yards and two scores... For Portland State, Thompson rushed 15 times for 71 yards and one score. Chachere completed 15-21 passes for 180 and two scores, but gained only 25 yards on the ground due to five Idaho sacks... Wing led the defense with 13 tackles and a sack. Ezriel Vasquez made nine stops.

### OFFENSIVE NOTES

- **THE NUMBERS:** Portland State is averaging 379.3 yards of offense per game, 184.9 on the ground and 194.4 through the air... the Vikings average 28.9 points per game and have eight turnovers... PSU had its best offensive output of the season against Sacramento State with 544 yards, including 299 rushing, and 58 points... PSU's top passing game was a 306-yard effort at Chattanooga, and top rushing game was 300 yards at Idaho State.
- **DANTE'S DATA:** SR QB Dante Chachere has passed for 1,632 yards and 12 touchdowns and rushed for a team-high 637 yards and 12 touchdowns... Chachere completed 19-30 passes for a career-high 306 yards at Chattanooga (9/29) with one touchdown and two interceptions... he rushed for a career-high 202 yards and three touchdowns in the win at Idaho State (10/12)... Chachere pulled off a PSU first when he passed for 200 yards (216 with three TDs) and rushed for 200 yards (202 with three TDs) in the same game. In the game, Chachere had runs of 62, 48 and 53 yards, and a pass completion of 50 yards. Chachere was named National and Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Week... he was nine yards shy of the PSU QB rushing record of 211 yards by Connor Kavanaugh... Chachere then came close to matching that at Sacramento State (11/2) with 245 yards and one touchdown passing, 165 yards and a career-high four touchdowns rushing for a total of 410 yards and 5 TDs. Once again he was named Big Sky Conference Player of the Week... with three TD passes against ISU. Chachere has seven games of three or more in his career... Chachere has 78 career touchdowns (47 passing, 31 rushing) which is third all-time at Portland State behind Neil Lomax, 1977-80 (13 rushing, 106 passing, 119 total); and Davis Alexander, 2017-21 (25 rushing, 63 passing, 88 total)... Chachere passed three career milestones against Idaho (11/9): 5,000 passing yards (5,173), 2,000 rushing yards (2,015 in his career) and 7,000 total yards of offense (7,188 - eighth all-time at PSU)... with 2,015 rushing yards, Chachere has passed Connor Kavanaugh (1,956) for most rushing yards ever by a Viking QB and is the 12th Viking in history to rush for 2,000 yards in a career.
- **Q RATING:** SO RB Quincy Craig has battled back from a knee injury suffered in game six of 2023 to once again become the Vikings' key offense weapon. Craig has a team-high 703 all-purpose yards and seven touchdowns this season. He is third on the team in rushing (84-375-2) and second in receptions and receiving touchdowns (31-253-5). Craig has 73 kickoff return yards and a 28-yard pass completion for good measure... with a 10-carry, 103-yard rushing game at Chattanooga (9/28), Craig now has four 100-yard games in his career... Craig passed 1,000 career rushing yards in his 19th career game (Idaho, 11/9).
- **YOUTH SHALL SERVE:** In addition to Craig's production, Portland State's other youthful skill players are shining as well... RS FR Delon Thompson has 534 rushing yards and five touchdowns to rank second on the team. He led the Vikings with 15 carries for 96 yards at Washington State (8/31) and 12 carries for 68 yards against UC Davis (10/5), adding 84 yards and two scores at Sacramento State (11/2). Thompson also led in rushing with 15 for 71 yards and a score against Idaho (11/9)... RS FR Eric Denham has 24 receptions for 431 yards and three touchdowns. He had career-highs of five receptions, 127 yards and two touchdowns in the win at Idaho State (10/12)... SO WR Jaylen Lynch has 14 receptions and 220 yards... even JR WR Branden Alvarez - while an upperclassman - has team leading numbers of 34 catches, 453 yards and five touchdowns. He went for a career-high 105 yards on five catches at Sacramento State (11/2)... SO TE Tanner Beaman has 17 catches for 166 yards and a touchdown.
- **MORE YOUTH, UP FRONT:** Last season, SO OL Isaac Perez earned a spot in the starting lineup as a true freshman. This year, true FR OLs Pule Leatigaga and Shaun Torgeson broke through up front earning starts at guard.

## PORTLAND STATE

Portland State should always be referred to as "Portland State", NEVER by just "Portland". An acceptable alternative to "Portland State" is "PSU". The nickname for both the men's and women's teams at Portland State is "Vikings". The women's teams should NEVER be referred to as the "Lady Vikings" or "Lady Viks". An acceptable alternative to "Vikings" is "Viks".

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

- **THE NUMBERS:** Portland State is allowing 239.9 rushing yards, 310.3 passing yards and 44.4 points per game... the Vikings have 35 tackles for loss, six sacks, and six forced turnovers... against UC Davis (10/5), the Viking defense made seven tackles for loss, two sacks, three pass breakups and forced two turnovers while allowing the fewest points (27) of the season... in the decisive second half against Idaho State (10/12), PSU's defense stopped the Bengals on six of seven series, including three three-and-outs, and two fourth-down stops.
- **WING STOP:** SO LB Peyton Wing leads the Vikings with 79 tackles and seven tackles for loss this season. He also has a sack... Wing had a career-high 13 stops at Weber State (9/7) and led the team in tackles with nine at Boise State (9/21) and 10 at Chattanooga (9/28). He came back to match his career high with 13 tackles and a sack against Idaho (11/9)... Wing is tied for second in the Big Sky in tackles per game (8.8).
- **SWEET 16:** SO LB Michael Montgomery had a career-high 16 tackles at Weber State (9/7), which was the most by a Viking in six seasons. Montgomery, named a Freshman All-American by two media outlets last year, is second on the Vikings in tackles with 72. He also has three tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks and four pass breakups... he had 10 tackles against UC Davis (10/5) to tie for the team lead... Montgomery is tied for six in the Big Sky in tackles per game (8.0).
- **CAREER LEADER:** SR CB Tyreese Shakir picked up his sixth career interception in the win at Sacramento State (11/2). He is the Vikings leader in several categories among active players... he has 169 career tackles, 13 pass breakups, six interceptions and three fumble recoveries - all of which ranks first among active players. His 11.5 tackles for loss ranks second and three sacks ranks third... Shakir had a team-high 10 tackles and three tackles for loss against UC Davis (10/5)...
- **YOUTH SHALL SERVE, PART 2:** Among Portland State's top nine tacklers, seven are freshmen and sophomores.

## SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- **FOOTWORK:** JR K Mathias Uribe is 9-10 on field goal attempts this season (43, 42, 35, 40, 23, 30, 44, 27, 48)... 22 of his 49 kickoffs have been touchbacks... SO K Fedya Henrichs-Tarasenkov handled all three second-half kickoffs at Idaho State (10/12) and all three were touchbacks.
- **DON'T EVEN TRY:** JR P Tony Johnson is averaging 40.5 yards per punt. He bombed a season-best 69-yarder at Weber State (9/7). Most important, Johnson's punts are not being returned with any effectiveness. In 21 returns this season, opponents have netted only 72 yards. Boise State (9/21) had four attempts for -4 yards.
- **IT'S A SNAP:** FR TE Kristian Ingman has started eight games at long snapper, while FR LS Brock Fleming started in game three. Ingman has five tackles and a fumble recovery on punt coverage.
- **GRUBB HUB:** SR RB Christian Grubb had a season-best 71-yard kickoff return at Sacramento State (11/2). He is averaging 21.9 yards on 21 returns this season.
- **YOUTH SHALL SERVE, PART 3:** FR RB Jordan Herron surprised everyone when he picked up a UC Davis (10/5) punt on the bounce and raced 40 yards up field before being tackled in his first career play as a Viking. Not a bad start as the true freshman was given the punt returner role against the Aggies.

State)... Portland State has 20 players on its roster that previously were at other Division I schools, 13 of those were FBS-level schools.

### MEANINGLESS TRIVIA

- SR OL Billy Lutui began his Portland State career in 2023 as a defensive tackle. After starting the first two games there he was moved to the offensive line. Lutui started immediately and has ever since.
- For the fourth straight meeting with the Vikings, Weber State was nationally ranked (9/7). WSU has won three of those four games.
- The Sept. 14 game with South Dakota was canceled due to a whooping cough outbreak on the Vikings team. The game has not been rescheduled.
- As a result of the Sept. 14 cancellation, PSU played four straight road games for the first time since 1989... PSU's Oct. 5 home opener is the last home opening start since 1971.
- Prior to playing Chattanooga, Portland State had never played a member of the Southern Conference. And it is only the second time in history that PSU has played a game in the Eastern Time Zone (Delaware, 2000).
- Portland State traveled 7,994 miles before making the 14-mile jaunt to Hillsboro Stadium for its home opener.
- Portland State has now played Idaho State 48 times in its history – the most of any opponent all-time... PSU leads the Big Sky Conference series with the Bengals, 14-13... PSU has faced Montana 47 times prior to a Nov. 16 matchup in Missoula.
- SR CB Travis West started his career as a cornerback at Portland State. This year, as a senior, he was moved to wide receiver. In six games he caught three passes and ran with the ball once for a total of 57 yards. Against Montana State, West moved back to cornerback and started the game, making two tackles... SR RB Jalynnee McGee also moved to the defensive side of the ball, seeing action at safety against Sacramento State.
- The Vikings have a winning record at Sacramento State, going 11-9 all-time and 7-6 in Big Sky Conference games... PSU is 24-14 all-time against Sacramento State, 14-9 in Big Sky Conference games.
- Head Coach Bruce Barnum coached his 100 career game against Idaho (2015-24), which ranks behind only Tim Walsh (158) among all PSU Head Coaches. Barnum has been on the Vikings coaching staff for 157 games total (2010-24).

Chachere and SR CB Tyreese Shakir are both on the Senior Bowl Watch List for 2025.

### THE MATURATION PROCESS

- PSU played 47 freshmen, including 24 redshirt freshmen and 23 true freshmen in 2023. The Vikings had 95 different players participate in at least one game.
- The Vikings well-documented 2023 true freshman class had an impact, particularly on defense where 15 true freshmen played in at least one game, with five getting starts (OL Isaac Perez, S Zach Wusstig, LB Michael Montgomery, NICK Jaden DaCosta and DE Elijah Eason). The true freshman group was rated the best National Letter of Intent class in the Big Sky Conference and third-best at the FCS level after the Feb. 1 signing date by 247Sports.com (18 freshmen, three JCs).

### COACHING CHANGES IN 2024

- Co-Defensive Coordinator Mark Rhea is now coaching the linebacker position group.
- Korey Rush named Defensive Line Coach/Pass Rush Specialist .
- Robby Hauck elevated to Special Teams Coordinator/Tight Ends Coach.

### MOST CHALLENGING SCHEDULE IN PROGRAM HISTORY

Has any team - ever - been scheduled to face six of the top nine ranked teams in a preseason poll? Plain and simple, the 2024 Portland State Football schedule may be the most challenging in program history. And, it may be the most challenging in the nation at the FCS level.

The Viking program's 12-game slate is loaded; loaded with teams that had winning records in 2023, loaded with teams with playoff appearances, and loaded with FBS opponents. In fact, seven of the Vikings' nine FCS opponents in 2024 finished 2023 nationally-ranked, including six in the top 14, and national finalist Montana.

PSU will play five home games and seven road games in 2024 – all against Division I programs. PSU hosts South Dakota (Sept. 14), UC Davis (Oct. 5), Montana State (Oct. 19), Idaho (Nov. 9) and Northern Colorado (Nov. 23) in contests at Hillsboro Stadium.

The Vikings are on the road at Washington State (Aug. 31), Weber State (Sept. 7), Boise State (Sept. 21), Chattanooga (Sept. 28), Idaho State (Oct. 12), Sacramento State (Nov. 2) and Montana (Nov. 16).

Notable are games against Washington State (Aug. 31), which is playing a hybrid Mountain West Conference schedule, and Boise State (Sept. 21), a member of the Mountain West. It will be a second meeting with each of those FBS schools in the past five seasons.

PSU also picked up a pair of brand new opponents in South Dakota and Chattanooga. A member of the Missouri Valley Football Conference, South Dakota was 10-3 in 2023, reaching the NCAA FCS Quarterfinals. Chattanooga, from the Southern Conference, was 8-5 overall reaching the round of 16 in the FCS Playoffs.

The Vikings will play all four Big Sky Conference playoff teams in succession - Montana State, Sacramento State, Idaho and Montana – between Oct. 19 and No. 16. That gives PSU six (!) 2023 FCS playoff teams on its 2024 schedule who had a combined 7-6 record in the post-season.

Nine of the 12 opponents had winning records in 2023 with a combined record of 85-64.

ton State (2015) and North Texas (2015)... this marks the 10th consecutive season that Portland State has played two FBS opponents. PSU has done so a total of 14 times, including three in 2006.

- 2024 is the 78th season of Portland State football (1947) and 29th season as a member of the Big Sky Conference (1996).
- Portland State has won the Dam Cup rivalry trophy game the past two years against Eastern Washington. The Vikings will hold onto the trophy for at least another year as they are not scheduled to face the Eagles again until 2025.

### VIKING BACKGROUND TRIVIA

- **BUY LOCAL:** Portland State has 29 players on the roster from the state of Oregon, plus seven others from just across the river and the Vancouver, WA area.
- **BAR-KNEE BALL:** Knee surgery isn't exclusively the domain of the athlete. Just ask Viking Football Head Coach Bruce Barnum. In late February, Barnum had right knee replacement surgery on a troublesome joint that had bothered him for years. With the occasional aid of a cane, he was moving swiftly - okay, just moving - through spring practice. In the ensuing months, the knee has gotten stronger and he expects to be at top speed by fall. 40-yard dash time yet to come...
- **STUDENT-ATHLETES:** Portland State has 12 players on its roster that have already earned undergraduate degrees: Dante Chachere, Kennedy Freeman, Christian Grubb, Richard Estrella, Elias Spence, Keegan Stancato, Travis West, Billy Lutui, CJ Jordan, Jamal McMurrin, Gavin Miller, and Joe Moeaki.
- **MORE STUDENT-ATHLETES:** SR DE Kennedy Freeman and JR DE Slade Shufelt were named Academic All-District by the College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-District team in 2023.
- **OH, BROTHER:** SR QB Dante Chachere's brother, Andre, is a cornerback for the NFL's Arizona Cardinals... SR CB Tyreese Shakir's brother, Khalil, is a wide receiver for the NFL's Buffalo Bills.
- **OH, FATHER:** Speaking of the NFL, the Vikings have a pair of players whose fathers had prominent careers in The League. JR LB Jordan Allen is the son of Eric Allen, a 14-year veteran of the NFL (1988-2001) who was a six-time Pro Bowl selection. FR OL Pryce Roberts is the son of Ray Roberts, a first-round draft pick and nine-year veteran of the NFL (1992-2000).
- **LEGACY PLAYER:** SR WR Travis West is a walk-on from Portland's Central Catholic High School. Despite being the smallest player on the team (5-6, 160) he has been a contributor during his career. This season he moves from nickelback to wide receiver. West is also a PSU legacy as his late father, Travis West, Sr. was an NCAA II All-American and National Champion wrestler for the Vikings (1989, 1990) and a member of the 1988 US Olympic team.
- **FAMILY AFFAIR:** SO OL Braylon Cornell has had a cousin, Jake Porter, play on the Viking Football team (2018-22), another cousin play on the Viking volleyball team, Ellie Snook (2019-22), and two uncles play at PSU, Jamie Snook (basketball, 1996-99) and Jason Porter (baseball, 1991-94).
- **FROM THE FIELD TO THE SIDELINE:** Run Game Coordinator/Offensive Line Coach Matt Leunen (OL/TE, 2005-09) is a PSU alum who played for the Vikings... Quarterbacks Coach Kieran McDonagh (2012-15) is also a PSU alum who was recruited by and played for Bruce Barnum.
- **VIKINGS' PRESENCE IN THE NFL:** Entering the 2024 season, there have been 33 former Portland State players who have appeared in regular season NFL games. **The first:** Tom Oberg, DB, Denver Broncos, 1968. **Longest career:** Neil Lomax, QB, 1981-88; Clint Didier, TE, 1982-89; and Adam Hayward, LB, 2007-14, all played in eight NFL seasons. Hayward played in the most total games (118). **Highest draft pick:** Neil Lomax, QB, 1981, 2nd round, 33rd pick, St. Louis Cardinals. **Total draft picks:** 10. **Most Touchdowns:** Julius Thomas, TE, 2011-17, 36 (receiving). Darick Holmes, RB, 1995-99, 9 (rushing); Neil Lomax, QB, 1981-88, 136 (passing). **Head Coach:** June Jones (Atlanta Falcons and San Diego Chargers, 1994-98). **Super Bowl Champions:** Clint Didier, TE (2, 1982, 1987, Washington); DeShawn Shead, CB (2013, Seattle); Ted Popson, TE (1994, San Francisco).
- **SUPER PLAYERS:** Portland State had a pair of former players meet in the Super Bowl for the first time in history in February 2014. TE Julius Thomas ('10, Denver) and DB DeShawn Shead ('11, Seattle) both played in Super Bowl XLVIII. Shead returned to the Super Bowl in 2015 with the Seahawks. He joins Clint Didier and Ted Popson as former Vikings with Super Bowl rings. Thomas was named a Pro Bowl tight end in 2013 and 2014. In the 2014 off-season, he signed the richest tight end contract in the NFL to play for the Jacksonville Jaguars. Thomas retired in the 2018 off-season after a seven-year career that included 71 games, 226 receptions, 2,406 yards and 36 touchdowns. Shead, a starting corner with the Seahawks in 2016, missed 2017 due to an ACL injury, then signed and played with Detroit in 2018. Shead is now an assistant coach with the Miami Dolphins.

### 2023 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- Portland State was 5-6 overall, 4-4 in the Big Sky Conference. The Vikings were 3-2 at home and 2-4 on the road. PSU was one game improved over its 2022 mark (4-7, 3-5).
- The Vikings had four players named second team All-Big Sky Conference and three others earned honorable mention. Senior fullback Andrew Van Buren, senior offensive lineman Shiloh Ta'ase, senior defensive lineman Dino Kahualelio and junior kicker Gianni Smith were all named second team All-Big Sky. Senior wide receiver Jermaine Braddock, sophomore linebacker Parker McKenna and freshman all-purpose back Quincy Craig earned honorable mention.
- During the course of the season, three players earned Big Sky Conference Player of the Week honors.

They included: JR QB Dante Chachere after a 45-21 win over Northern Arizona (14-19 passing for 159 yards, 5 TDs, 12 rushes for 83 yards, 1 TD); JR RB Jobi Malary after a 47-35 win over Eastern Washington (23 carries, 241 yards, school-record tying six touchdowns); and JR K Gianni Smith with 3-3 field goals (51, career-best 55 and 42 yards) and 2-2 on PATs against UC Davis. Smith was also named the FCS FedEx Ground National Special Teams Player of the Week.

- The Viking running game was dominant, averaging 224.0 yards per game. That ranked second in the Big Sky Conference and fifth in the nation... PSU was also fifth in the nation in third-down conversion percentage (.475).
- FR RB Quincy Craig was named to the Jerry Rice Watch List for National Freshman of the Year honors. Craig had 66 carries for 410 yards and three touchdowns, 19 receptions for 207 yards and three touchdowns and six punt returns for 70 yards after six games. At that point he was leading the Big Sky Conference in all-purpose yards (124.0). Unfortunately, a knee injury knocked him out for the remainder of the season.
- The Vikings scored 150 points in consecutive games (Sept. 16-23) including a stunning 115 points in the two first halves of those wins. PSU had 63 at halftime against North American, and 52 points at halftime against Cal Poly. PSU's 91-0 score over North American ranks as the third-highest scoring game in PSU history.
- Portland State won the Dam Cup rivalry trophy game for the second season in a row, beating Eastern Washington 47-35. The Vikings totaled 544 yards of offense, 403 yards on the ground.

- A youthful team with only 11 seniors and the top-ranked recruiting class in the Big Sky, PSU was able to play 95 different players in 2023. Forty-seven of those were freshmen, including 24 redshirt freshmen and 23 true freshmen. Six true freshmen got starts during the course of the season.
- FR LB Michael Montgomery was named a Freshman All-American by FCS Football Central and Stats Perform after totaling 69 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and a fumble recovery.
- JR WR Christian Grubb set a Portland State record for longest kickoff return for touchdown with a 99-yarder against Cal Poly. The previous record was 98 yards... JR K Gianni Smith set the mark for best career field goal percentage at PSU (18-23, .783)... JR RB Jobi Malary tied the school record for rushing touchdowns in a game with six against Eastern Washington.
- Five Vikings were named Academic All-District: JR WR Nate Bennett, JR OL D'Angalo Titalii, JR DE Kennedy Freeman, SO DE Slade Shufelt and JR K Gianni Smith.

**WASHINGTON STATE 70, PORTLAND STATE 30**

**Pullman, WA** – Washington State filled the stat sheet with big plays in the first half then rolled on to a 70-30 season-opening win over the Portland State Vikings.

After being stopped on their initial series, the Cougars scored six straight touchdowns on offense, ranging from 30 to 58 yards in length. Four of the touchdowns were passes by quarterback John Mateer, who was making his first career start. That got WSU out to a 49-10 halftime lead and the Vikings could not recover.

Portland State moved the ball on offense, totaling 449 yards on the day, but could not stop the pass-heavy Washington State offense. The Cougars went for 637 yards, including 413 through the air.

“Coach Dickert has a good football team,” said Vikings Coach Bruce Barnum of the Cougars. “They picked the right guy at quarterback. Mateer played well today. They played well and they played clean. We didn’t tackle well, but they have good players.

“We have to clean some stuff up. I think I have a good football team but you can’t play a team like that and have the multitude of mistakes that we had.”

Portland State’s defense got off to the best start possible, forcing the Cougars to a three-and-out in the first series of the game. Then, the offense put a score on the board quickly. Freshman running back Delon Thompson broke away on a 53-yard run. Two plays later, quarterback Dante Chachere scored on a five-yard scamper for a 7-0 Viking lead.

Washington came back behind Mateer. The Cougar signal-caller completed TD passes of 30, 39 and 58 yards on WSU’s next three possessions for a 22-7 lead at the end of the first quarter.

Mathias Uribe kicked a 44-yard field goal to open the second quarter and get the Vikings within 22-10.

WSU tailback Wayshawn Parker scored on a 54-yard run and the Cougars were up 29-10. A few minutes later, Parker caught a 52-yard touchdown pass from Mateer. That made it 36-10 Cougs midway through the second quarter.

Later in the second quarter, the Vikings drove 14 plays and 71 yards. On a fourth-and-goal play from the four-yard line, Chachere was intercepted by Stephen Hall, who returned it 100 yards for a score.

In the final 90 seconds of the half, Chachere and then Will Haskell engineered another Viking scoring drive. Chachere moved PSU to the Wazzu 29, but came out of the game after being hit from behind. Haskell came in and completed two passes, the second was an 11-yard score to wide receiver Branden Alvarez.

At halftime it was 49-17 Washington State. The Cougars had 393 yards of total offense to 260 for the Vikings.

Portland State continued to move the football in the second half, a positive sign for the 2024 season. They scored two more touchdowns, with both coming on 75-yard drives. Eric Denham had a 40-yard TD reception from Chachere in the third quarter. Chachere scored a second rushing touchdown with a four-yard run on a fourth-down play in the fourth quarter.

However, the hole was too deep for the Vikings. WSU still had a 21-13 advantage after halftime.

PSU had 215 rushing yards and 234 passing yards for the game. Thompson came up just shy of 100 yards with 15 carries for 96 yards. Craig had 10 rushes for 54 yards, four receptions for 24 yards and completed a pass on a halfback option for 28 yards.

Chachere was 14-25 for 175 yards, a touchdown and a pick. Haskell completed 5-9 passes for 31 yards and a score.

Senior cornerback Tyreese Shakir made a team-high seven tackles. Sophomore linebacker Peyton Wing made five stops, including one tackle for loss.

**Game 2 • Sept. 7 • Stewart Stadium, Ogden, UT**  
**WEBER STATE 43, PORTLAND STATE 16**

**Ogden, UT** – Weber State’s defense came to play in the Big Sky Conference opener, shutting down Portland State and leading the 24th-ranked Wildcats to a 43-16 win at Stewart Stadium.

Weber State held a normally potent Viking offense to six series of three-and-out, including four straight at one point in the game, then came up with two late turnovers when PSU was in desperation mode. As a result, the Wildcats out-gained the Vikings 535 yards to 240 and cruised to a 1-0 start in league play.

Portland State is 0-2 after two weeks of play and will host fifth-ranked South Dakota in a non-conference home opener next Saturday at Hillsboro Stadium.

The Vikings were matched with a team that has built its reputation on defense the past several seasons. Weber State held the Vikings to just 18 yards in the first quarter to set the tone.

But the Vikings offense eventually got a boost from the defense. PSU made a fourth-down stop against the Wildcats at the PSU 29 on the final play of the first quarter. The offense took over at the start of the second quarter and marched 71 yards downfield for a tying touchdown. Running back Quincy Craig dominated the series with 51 total yards. He had a 37-yard rushing burst in the middle of the drive, then wrapped it up by catching a four-yard pass from quarterback Dante Chachere for the score. That tied the game at 7-7.

The teams traded field goals to make it 10-10. PSU got a 42-yarder from Mathias Uribe, his second of the season.

A 61-yard run by the Wildcats’ Clarence Butler sparked a late first-half score. The Wildcats went in on a one-yard run, but a two-point conversion attempt was intercepted by Peyton Wing. WSU led 16-10 at the break.

Each team ran 33 plays in the half, but the Wildcats stout run defense in the first quarter held the Vikings down. WSU had 227 yards, while the Vikings had only 132.

Weber State had the halftime lead, but took control of the game in the third quarter. The Wildcat defense forced the Vikings into three straight three-and-outs and -4 yards in the period.

A 25-yard Wildcat field goal to open the fourth quarter extended the lead to 22-10.

The Vikings finally got a first down in their first series of the fourth quarter, but were again stopped after five plays.

The Wildcats effectively put the game on ice with an 83-yard scoring drive on their first series of the fourth quarter. Quarterback Richie Munoz scrambled in from nine yards out and it as 29-10 Weber State with 10:41 remaining to be played.

Portland State finally got on the board in the second half after a 75-yard drive. Will Haskell hit Branden Alvarez on a five-yard toss to narrow the score to 29-16 with 5:36 to play. But Wildcats running back Damon Bankston finished off the Vikings with a 75-yard touchdown run on the ensuing series.

Bankston had 133 rushing yards and two touchdowns for Weber State, while Munoz passed for 219 yards, one passing TD and scored one rushing TD.

Craig led the Vikings with 93 total yards on 14 carries and five receptions. Chachere completed 10-22 passes for 61 yards, and rushed 15 times for 57 yards, which included three sacks.

On defense, linebacker Michael Montgomery had a career-high 16 tackles, including two for losses, and a sack. His linebacker mate Wing also had a career-high with 13 tackles and two tackles for loss.

**GAME NOTES**

- This was the earliest start, by date, to a Big Sky Conference season in Portland State history. The Vikings had a season-opening Big Sky Conference game back in 1998 at Eastern Washington (a 30-27 PSU overtime win), however that game was played on Sept. 12.
- For the fourth straight meeting with the Vikings, Weber State was nationally ranked, this time 24th. WSU has won three of those four games.
- Dante Chachere’s second-quarter touchdown pass to Quincy Craig was the 37th of his career, tying him with Juston Wood for 10th all-time in PSU history.
- PSU is 12-16 all-time in Big Sky openers, 9-9 at home, 3-7 on the road.

**Game 3 • Sept. 21 • Albertsons Stadium, Boise, ID**  
**BOISE STATE 56, PORTLAND STATE 14**

**Boise, ID** – Boise State’s backfield responded to an early challenge by Portland State and led the Broncos to a 56-14 win over the Vikings at Albertson Stadium.

Boise State rolled up 609 yards, including 342 on the ground, on their way to a victory and a 3-0 record. The Vikings dropped to 0-3 on the season.

Stopping Bronco running back and Heisman candidate Ashton Jeanty was always going to be a tall task for the Vikings. After all, Jeanty went into the game with 459 yards and nine(!) touchdowns in just two games against Georgia Southern and Oregon.

But, with a minute to play in the first quarter, Jeanty had only touched the ball one time. That was a minor victory for the Vikings.

Jeanty soon announced his presence though. A 68-yard run just before the end of the first quarter set up a go-ahead touchdown for Boise State. The Broncos finished that series on a short touchdown pass to take the lead for good at 14-7 early in the second quarter.

That set in a motion a second-quarter of dominance for the Broncos and turned a 7-7 first-quarter tie into a 28-7 halftime lead. The Vikings had 108 yards of offense in the first quarter, but only 46 in the second. Meanwhile, BSU quarterback Maddux Madsen threw two TD passes and rushed for a third in the second quarter. Jeanty had 127 yards on 11 carries by halftime.

“We wanted to limit their possessions and try to create turnovers and see what we could do,” said Vikings Coach Bruce Barnum. “It worked for a little while, but then they unleashed number two (Jeanty). He’s not the only guy. They rushed for a lot of yards. We lost the edge a couple times and they made us pay for it. You don’t chase Jeanty down, but you don’t chase the other guys down either.”

In the interest of Jeanty’s health and a three-TD lead, Boise State did not play their star back in the second half. In fact, it was Madsen who had the biggest performance of the day, throwing for three touchdowns and rushing for a fourth. And, other than Jeanty, six other Bronco backs combined for more than 200 yards on the ground.

The Vikings totaled 277 yards and had no turnovers, but the Boise State defense forced seven punts and blocked a pair of field goal attempts.

Portland State’s first quarter performance was encouraging. PSU scored on its second offensive series. The Vikings went 12 plays and 73 yards, 36 on the ground and 37 through the air. Quarterback Dante Chachere was making a dash for the end zone when he was hit at the one-yard line and the ball came free. Running back Delon Thompson pounced on it in the end zone for a Viking touchdown. That tied the game at 7-7.

On the Broncos next series, safety Jaden Dacosta forced a fumble that was recovered by defensive tackle J’Queria Ladson. PSU drove with a chance to take the lead but a Mathias Uribe field goal attempt was blocked. Soon after came Jeanty’s big run and the Broncos grabbed control of the game. They scored three times in the second quarter and never looked back.

Following their first score, the Vikings punted four times and had two field goals blocked before scoring again early in the fourth quarter. Chachere scampered in on a 10-yard run. He also completed 3-3 passes in the series for 64 yards. However, the Vikings were down 42-14 with just over 14 minutes to play.

Boise State added two late touchdowns for the 56-14 final.

Chachere led PSU with 202 yards of total offense, completing 12-18 passes for 126 yards and rushing 13 times for 76 yards and a score.

The Vikings had 147 yards rushing and 130 yards passing for the game.

Linebacker Peyton Wing led the defense with nine tackles, including one for loss. Cornerback Jamal McMurrin had seven tackles, one for loss and a pass breakup.

- Dante Chachere scored his 59th career TD (22 rushing, 37 passing) in the game. That ties him with his QB Coach Kieran McDonagh who had 17 and 42 for 59 total from 2012-15. They are tied for fourth all-time at PSU (Neil Lomax 119, Davis Alexander 88, Jimmy Blanchard 69)... Chachere is 12th in career rushing touchdowns at PSU (22).
- The attendance at Albertson Stadium was 36,972, a sellout.

**Game 4 • Sept. 28 • Finley Stadium, Chattanooga, TN**  
**CHATTANOOGA 45, PORTLAND STATE 30**

**Chattanooga, TN** – A hurricane passed through the southeast in recent days, with only remnants impacting the Chattanooga area. Rain and wind had mostly subsided by the time Portland State got to town. But the Vikings had to deal with an offensive hurricane from the Chattanooga Mocs, as the home team rolled over PSU, 45-30, at Finley Stadium.

Chattanooga's offense, which was slumbering through the first three games of the season, awoke against the Vikings. They scored on all four full possessions in the first half and never punted in the game. Chattanooga totaled 567 yards to 463 for the Vikings.

The loss dropped Portland State to 0-4 on the season, while Chattanooga, a playoff team in 2023, improved to 1-3.

"Chattanooga showed glimpses of doing things in their earlier games," said Vikings Coach Bruce Barnum. "Their offense came out with a spark tonight and was outstanding on third downs. It really won the game for them."

In the first quarter alone Chattanooga scored 21 points and gained 217 yards. The Vikings averaged nearly 11 yards per play in the quarter - more than the Mocs - but only ran half as many plays and committed one turnover. Dante Chachere scored on a three-yard run in the middle of the first, but the Vikings trailed 21-7 after 15 minutes.

By the closing seconds of the half, the Mocs only had the ball four times but they made the most of it. Chattanooga put together drives of 65, 62, 85 and 83 yards, all resulting in touchdowns. The Mocs out-gained the Vikings, 316-251, in the half, but with PSU committing one turnover and punting once, they trailed 28-14.

Perhaps the best example of the effectiveness of Chattanooga's offense was its third-down conversion rate. The Mocs were 8-8 on third down before the Vikings finally got a stop. That stop led to a field goal and a 31-14 Chattanooga lead with eight minutes remaining in the third quarter.

Late in the third, the Vikings completed a 50-yard scoring drive, set up by a big kickoff return by Christian Grubb. Quincy Craig completed the series with a one-yard scoring run. Still, the Vikings trailed, 38-20.

The Vikings finally got a key defensive stop on the first play of the fourth quarter. Jayden House pressured Mocs QB Chase Artopoulos, deflecting a pass out of his hands. Spencer Elliott picked off the ball as it fluttered in the air over the line of scrimmage. From, there PSU drove for a quick 35-yard field goal from Mathias Uribe. That cut the deficit to 38-23 with 10:12 to play.

Unfortunately, Chattanooga recovered an ensuing onside kick and was able to drive for another score.

PSU added another touchdown with 6:15 remaining in the game. Chachere was 5-6 passing in the 82-yard series, and completed a scoring toss of eight yards to Craig.

It was too little, too late though as Chattanooga finished with the 45-30 win.

Artopoulos finished with 396 yards passing and four touchdowns. For the Vikings, Chachere was 19-30 for a career-high 306 yards, one TD and two interceptions.

"I saw confidence grow on offense tonight, and that really showed in the last drive. Now they think they can go score against anyone and that's what we need going forward," said Barnum.

**GAME NOTES**

- Dante Chachere went over 4,000 career passing yards in the game... with his two rushing TDs, Chachere now has 24 in his career, tying Jeff Salta for ninth in PSU history.
- Quincy Craig had the fourth 100-yard rushing game of his career in 14 total games played. Craig went for 103 rushing yards on 10 carries, and had four receptions for 24 yards, scoring two touchdowns.
- Peyton Wing led Viking tacklers with 10 stops, including one for a loss. Michael Montgomery made nine tackles.
- Portland State was playing on the second game in program history in the Eastern Time Zone (2000, at Delaware), and facing Chattanooga (or any Southern Conference team) for the first time in program history.
- The game also marked the first time since 1989 that PSU has played four games in a row on the road.

**#9 UC DAVIS 27, PORTLAND STATE 26**

**Hillsboro, OR** – You never want a game to come down to the “official review,” but Saturday’s Portland State clash with ninth-ranked UC Davis did just that, and it didn’t go the Vikings way as the Aggies won on the final play, 27-26, at Hillsboro Stadium.

As heart-breaking losses go, this one is at the top of the list. Portland State never trailed in the game and was ahead 23-14 heading into the fourth quarter.

UC Davis, behind the stellar play of quarterback Miles Hastings and running back Lan Larison, was able to come back with two fourth quarter scores. The Aggies got a three-yard scoring run by Hastings with 12:48 to go, narrowing PSU’s lead to 23-21.

The Vikings then drove 80 yards over nearly seven minutes, but were stopped on a third-and-goal play from the six. They settled for a 23-yard field goal from Mathias Uribe and a 26-21 advantage with 5:47 to play.

The Aggies came back looking for a go-ahead touchdown and had moved 23 yards up field when PSU’s defense came up with a big play. Hastings was picked off by Vikings safety Isaiah Green, who returned the ball to the Aggies 43 with 3:04 remaining.

Now with the football, the Vikings had a chance to put the game away. UCD’s defense had other ideas and stuffed the Vikings on three plays, forcing a punt.

With 1:50 remaining, Hastings led the game’s final march from the Aggies six-yard line. UCD was able to run off 13 plays in the final series. With five seconds remaining and the Aggies on the Vikings’ 11-yard line, Hastings dropped back, moved right and tossed a ball to the back of the end zone to CJ Hutton. It was tipped and fell incomplete.

The scoreboard clock read 00:00 and the celebration was on for a Viking win... until it wasn’t. The officials ruled that one second remained in the game, allowing the Aggies one more chance.

This time, Hastings rolled right again and zipped a ball to the right goal line pylon and wideout Trent Tompkins. Tompkins made the catch at the goal line and was simultaneously hit by cornerback Bryson Ross, who drove him back to the field of play. The official on the goal line signaled touchdown. Within a moment the play was under review as to whether the receiver had broken the plane of the goal line. After four tense minutes of review the referee stated the call was confirmed as the ball was caught in the end zone.

And with that, UC Davis took the come-from-behind victory, and the Vikings took one of the hardest losses possible.

“They said they reviewed the timing and the side judge said he still had a second on the clock (for the last

play),” said Vikings Coach Bruce Barnum afterward. “I’m proud of my football team for how much they worked this week and fought. To see them not get any payoff is too bad. Welcome to life, nothing is easy... We just have to come back and get ready for next week.”

A defense that struggled through the first month of the season had a makeover in the past week leading up to facing the ninth-ranked Aggies, and that led to a good start. The Vikings limited UC Davis to 13 yards on its first two possessions.

Given an opportunity to get a lead, the offense produced, with a pair of touchdown passes from Dante Chachere to Quincy Craig of 22 and 24 yards. The Vikings were ahead 14-0 with just over eight minutes to play in the first half.

The Aggies offense would not be held down for too long though. A rapid three-play drive – ignited by a 50-yard run from Larison – led to a UC Davis score.

After stopping the Vikings on a three-and-out for the first time in the game, the Aggies went on the march again. Their no huddle offense was quick and effective. An eight-play, 61-yard drive was completed on a Hastings to Larison six-yard scoring pass. With two minutes remaining in the half, the game was suddenly tied, 14-14.

Portland State could play fast too though. With 1:59 left in the second quarter, Chachere completed passes of 45 yards to Jaylen Lynch and 24 yards to Branden Alvarez. On first and goal from the five, Chachere found Alvarez in the end zone for a third passing TD. The extra point was blocked, but the Vikings led 20-14 at halftime.

It went to a two-score advantage for the Vikings early in the second half. Kicker Mathias Uribe completed a PSU drive with a 40-yard field goal for a 23-14 lead.

The Aggies then got two touchdowns in the final thrilling, heart-breaking quarter. UCD improved to 5-1 on the season, 2-0 in the Big Sky, and will look to move up in the top 10 rankings. The Vikings dropped to 0-5, 0-2 on the season.

Chachere finished the game 17-23 passing for 259 yards and three touchdowns while also rushing for 38 yards. Delon Thompson had 12 carries for 68 yards. Alvarez made a season-high seven receptions for 63 yards and a score. Craig made four catches for 66 yards and two TDs.

Cornerback Tyreese Shakir made 10 tackles, with three tackles for losses. Linebacker Michael Montgomery also made 10 stops.

In all, the Viking defense made seven tackles for loss, two sacks, three pass breakups and forced two turnovers.

Larison rushed 23 times for 124 yards and caught nine passes for 109

**PORTLAND STATE 42, IDAHO STATE 38**

**Pocatello, ID** – It looked like a bad case of déjà vu for the Vikings at the ICCU Dome on Saturday evening; a narrow lead late in the fourth quarter and having to punt the ball away in the final two minutes. That scenario turned into a nightmare last week, but Portland State got the job done this Saturday, beating Idaho State, 42-38.

PSU's defense, which struggled mightily through the first half, made the difference in the second half, stopping Idaho in six of seven possessions, including three three-and-outs. Then, when ISU took over at its own 21-yard line with 1:36 remaining to be played and needing a touchdown for the win, the Vikings "D" got the job done.

The Bengals moved into PSU territory, but the Vikings forced incompletions on Idaho State's final three plays, including a fourth-and-five game-decider at the PSU 36 with 29 seconds left.

Portland State's win was especially sweet after losing in a controversial finish to ninth-ranked UC Davis last Saturday.

"There is a lot to winning, but the defense made some great adjustments at halftime. That was critical," said Vikings Coach Bruce Barnum. "On a philosophical side, after that snake bite last week, I have a team that believes they can win that kind of game. The culture in the locker room changed last week."

By pulling out the win, PSU can also celebrate a tour de force performance by quarterback Dante Chachere. The senior signal caller passed for 216 yards and three touchdowns and rushed for 202 yards and three touchdowns. It marked the first time in PSU history that a Viking quarterback has had a 200-200 game.

"He was fantastic from that very first third down we had. They send six players at him and he runs for a (62-yard) touchdown. That stuff doesn't happen on EA Sports. To see him do that and bring his game. He got us out of a lot of trouble," said Barnum.

"The offense was efficient and explosive tonight and was able to burn up a lot of time late and force Idaho State to use their timeouts."

There was little resistance on defense for either side at the start of the game as the first three possessions went for scores. Idaho State opened with a field goal and a touchdown. Sandwiched in between was the 62-yard scoring run by Chachere – the longest of the season for the Vikings. ISU led 10-7 at the end of the first.

The Bengals had three more lengthy drives in the second quarter, all resulting in touchdowns. The Vikings got a second rushing touchdown from Chachere, and a 31-yard scoring pass from Chachere to Eric Denham. However, the Bengals' flawless half concluded with a 31-21 lead.

ISU dominated possession with five drives of 11, 11, eight, 11 and seven plays for scores. That amounted to 20:45 of the 30 minutes of first half possession time. ISU nearly doubled the Vikings in plays run, 47 to 24. In fact, PSU averaged 10.2 yards per play (11.9 rushing) to 7.0 yards per play for the Bengals.

Portland State got the momentum swing it needed to start the second half. Beginning with the ball at midfield due to a pair of Idaho State penalties, the Vikings scored almost immediately. Chachere hit Branden Alvarez on a crossing route and the junior wide receiver shook a tackle and went 50 yards for a score.

PSU's defense then got its first three-and-out of the game and the offense was back in business. On a third-and-long play near midfield, Chachere scrambled out of the pocket and raced 53 yards for a go-ahead score. PSU now had two TDs in just over four minutes of play in the third quarter and led 35-31.

On the Bengals next two series they were stopped again. The second time was on a fourth-and-five play from the Vikings 36. ISU completed a short pass, but linebackers Michael Montgomery and Peyton Wing were there to make the tackle a yard short of the first down.

PSU took over with under three minutes left in the third quarter but couldn't move the ball. That allowed ISU to take back the lead early in the fourth at 38-35.

Chachere wouldn't be stopped though. He engineered a drive that turned into the game winner. A 34-yard completion to Denham on a third-and-eight play moved the Vikings down to the ISU 24. Two plays later, Denham caught another pass, this time for 21 yards and a score. PSU led 42-38.

Portland State would hold that lead for the final 11:34 of the game. In Idaho State's final three possessions, PSU's defense got two three-and-outs, then the decisive stop in the closing seconds.

PSU finished the game with 300 yards rushing, 216 passing and out-gained ISU, 516-503.

Denham had career-highs of five receptions, 127 yards and two touchdowns. Delon Thompson rushed 14 times for 72 yards.

On defense, safety Michael Hurst made a career-high 13 tackles, had two pass breakups, a tackle for loss and defended the final play.

Portland State is now 1-5 on the season, 1-2 in the Big Sky. Idaho State is 3-4 on the season, 1-2 in the Big Sky.

**#3 MONTANA STATE 44, PORTLAND STATE 14**

**Hillsboro, OR** – Third-ranked Montana State left no question where it stands in the hierarchy of the Big Sky Conference and FCS Football nationally on Saturday at Hillsboro Stadium. The Bobcats, behind the nation’s second-ranked running game and a top-10 defense, rolled over Portland State, 44-14.

The Bobcats rushed for 323 yards, had 607 yards total and held Portland State to a season-low 235 yards in maintaining their perfect season. MSU moves to 8-0 on the season, 4-0 in the Big Sky Conference, with the win. The Vikings are now 1-6 on the year, 1-3 in the Big Sky.

A methodical start by both teams left the score at only 7-0 MSU after the first quarter. But Montana State exploded for four second-quarter touchdowns and had the game out of reach at halftime, 35-0. At intermission, the Bobcats already had over 400 yards of offense to only 91 for the Vikings.

PSU played better in the second half, holding MSU to three field goals, and despite a 14-9 advantage, it was too little, too late.

Scottre Humphrey led a Bobcats running game that averaged 8.3 yards per carry with 160 yards and two touchdowns on 14 carries. Quarterback Tommy Mellott was efficient, completing 15-20 passes for 239 yards and three scores.

Vikings quarterback Dante Chachere was stymied by a Bobcats

defense that leads the Big Sky in fewest yards allowed and fewest points allowed this season. Coming off a National Player of the Week honor, Chachere completed 11-18 passes for only 64 yards and was intercepted once. He netted only four rushing yards.

Delon Thompson was PSU’s most effective offensive weapon, carrying the ball 12 times for 78 yards and a nine-yard touchdown run. The Vikings other score came from backup QB Will Haskell, who led the Vikings on a 75-yard scoring drive in the fourth quarter. Haskell rushed in from 12 yards out.

“That is a team that will go a long way in the playoffs,” said Vikings Coach Bruce Barnum of the Bobcats. “They run it well and their defense stifled us. We’re not bad on offense, but they got after us. They were physical early and we didn’t answer the bell.”

**PORTLAND STATE 58, SACRAMENTO STATE 38**

**Sacramento, CA** – Sometimes you have to show off a little for big bro. That’s the way Vikings quarterback Dante Chachere looked at it as he propelled his Viking team to a 58-38 Big Sky Conference win over Sacramento State at Hornet Stadium.

Chachere led an efficient and effective offense that totaled 544 yards - the most points in 15 games - was 11-15 on third-down, 1-1 on fourth down and 7-7 in the red zone. For his part, the senior quarterback rushed 14 times for 165 yards and four scores, and completed 14-27 passes for 245 yards and another touchdown. All in front of his big brother Andre... for the first time.

Andre, who has spent the past three seasons in the NFL, was in town to see little brother play a college football game for the very first time. His appearance only begs the question, ‘maybe he should show up more often?’

“The whole week leading up, I kept asking ‘are you going to make it?’ I was telling the guys, my brother is coming and I’m going to ball out. He’s only seen me play my junior in high school. So, I was very excited for that,” a happy Dante said after the game.

The youngest Chachere totaled 410 yards and five touchdowns. That qualifies as “balling out.” But he was far from the only star. To name just a few:

- Kick returner Christian Grubb had a 71-yard return setting up an early rushing touchdown by Chachere.
- The Viking defense got a key three-and-out in the third quarter, allowing the offense to score back-to-back touchdowns and take a two-score lead for the first time in the game.
- Senior nickelback Tyreese Shakir made an important interception in the fourth quarter, leading to another score and an insurmountable 20-point lead.
- Freshman running back Delon Thompson was solid in the backfield with 84 rushing yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore running back Quincy Craig added 84 yards rushing and receiving and also scored.
- Wide receiver Branden Alvarez had a career-high 105 yards on six receptions.

“In the end, we all came together: offense, defense, special teams... that’s how you win the game,” said Chachere.

After trailing by four points at half-time, PSU outscored the Hornets 41-17 in the second half, including three scores from Chachere.

“The consistency of the offense was outstanding,” said Vikings Coach Bruce Barnum. “Particularly ‘Chach’ and Alvarez made some plays that kept the chains moving. Everybody had a damn good day on offense, but those two were great.

“The defensive staff’s adjustments at halftime were unbelievable too. I think the kick return by Grubb was big, and we scored after the turnover.

“I always tell the team, ‘the game changes’ and that’s the way we played tonight. I told them we were going to change the game, start attacking more, and that’s what I saw tonight with all those key plays.

The Hornets led 7-0, 14-7 and 21-17 in the first half, but PSU responded with their best offensive half of the season after intermission.

Chachere came out throwing in the second half. He hit wide receiver Eric Denham on a 37-yard completion, then three plays later found tight end Tanner Beaman up the right sideline for an 18-yard touchdown. The Vikings were on top 24-21.

Following a tying field goal by Sacramento State, the Vikings created some breathing room. A 12-play, 75-yard march culminated in a one-yard scoring run by Thompson. PSU’s defense then stuffed the Hornets on three downs and forced a punt. This time, Chachere let his feet do the work. On a third-down-and-nine play near midfield, he broke out of the pocket on a 54-yard scoring sprint. The extra point failed due to a bad snap, but suddenly the Vikings led 37-24 with just over two minutes left in the third.

Again, the Hornets answered back with a score in the span of just 90 seconds. The Vikings would not be stopped, though. On their next series, Chachere completed a 48-yard bomb to Alvarez, who lost his balance just short of the goal. No worries, as Craig rushed it in from two yards out on the next play. The Vikings went back ahead 43-31 with 12:28 left to play.

Then came the defensive play of the game. Shakir picked off Conklin on the first play of the ensuing series, returning it to the Hornets 31-yard line.

PSU burned four minutes off the clock before Chachere picked up his fourth rushing TD of the night, a two-yard trot into the endzone. PSU led 51-31 with eight minutes to go and it was all over except for the shouting. Each team added a score in the final four minutes but the game was never in doubt.

The Vikings rushed for 299 yards and seven touchdowns, had 245 yards receiving with one score, and did not turn the ball over in the game.

Hornets quarterback Carson Conklin passed for 325 yards and four touchdowns with one interception.

The win improves the Vikings’ record to 2-6 on the season, 2-3 in the Big Sky. Sacramento State is 3-6, 1-4.

**#9 IDAHO 39, PORTLAND STATE 30**

**Hillsboro, OR** – Portland State went toe-to-toe with Idaho, the nation’s 9th-ranked team, for 55 minutes. But the Vandals were able to put the clinching touchdown on the board late to pull out a 39-30 Big Sky Conference win at Hillsboro Stadium.

The game was tied or a one score margin the entire game until Art Williams was able rush in a score from three yards with 1:56 remaining on the clock. A two-point conversion iced the game for the Vandals.

Ultimately, the game was won up front by Idaho. The Vandals rushed for 257 yards and totaled 462 yards on the day. The Vikings, normally a strong rushing team, were held to 134 on 44 carries, partially due to five quarterback sacks. PSU had just 314 yards of total offense.

“They took some things away from us up front,” said Vikings Coach Bruce Barnum. “They ran the ball better than us and in a tight game that was the difference. Up front, they made more plays than we did.

“I saw some good things. It’s a little frustrating, because I have freshmen and sophomore making a lot of plays. I’ve got a team coming back (next year). So, it shows me when we compete with a team this good, this close, we don’t have far to go.”

Idaho improved to 7-3, 4-2 in the Big Sky Conference. The loss dropped the Vikings to 2-7, 2-4 in the Big Sky.

Portland State’s defense got a first-series’ stop highlighted by a sack from Peyton Wing. However, on the ensuing punt, the ball was muffed and recovered by the Vandals at PSU’s 24-yard line. From there, the Vandals were able to score within four plays. Williams rushed in from seven yards out for 7-0 Idaho lead.

The teams traded touchdowns in a rapidly played first half. PSU had drives of 70 and 79 yards. Delon Thompson scored on a one-yard run on the first series, then Dante Chachere tossed a 20-yard scoring pass to Quincy Craig. In between was another Idaho scoring pass. That had the game tied at 14-14 midway through the second quarter.

With 6:52 left in the half, Idaho rolled the dice on a 4th-and-three play from its own 47. PSU was ready as Michael Montgomery and Spencer Elliott sacked quarterback Jack Wagner.

PSU took over at the Idaho 44. Two runs by Delon Thompson gained 18 yards, then Chachere threw a play-action slant to Branden Alvarez for a 22-yard touchdown. The Vikings had their first lead at 21-14 with 5:40 to go in the half.

Idaho came back to score twice before intermission, each on a running

play by Deshaun Buchanan of 22 and 13 yards. The Vandals had a halftime lead of 28-21.

PSU took its own gamble on the first possession of the third quarter. On 4th-and-two at the Viking 47, Chachere scrambled for two yards to keep the drive alive. The Vikings were able to convert a 44-yard field goal by Mathias Uribe to close the gap to 28-24.

Idaho added a field goal, then Uribe made another with 14:11 to play and it was 31-27 Vandals.

Idaho drove to the PSU 26 on the next series. On 4th-and-1 the Vandals tried a trick play with a tight end sneaking under center. However, they were flagged for a false start and had to attempt a 43-yard field goal. Cameron Pope’s try went wide right though, and the Vikings took over with 8:29 to play.

PSU couldn’t make anything happen on the next series and had to punt it away. That’s when the Vikings got their own break. The punt hit Idaho’s Jakhari Larmond as he was running back to block. The Viking snapper, Kristian Ingman recovered the ball and PSU was back in business. However, once again, they failed to get a first down. Uribe booted his third field goal of the game, from 48 yards, and narrowed the Idaho lead to 31-30.

The Vandals took over with 5:11 remaining in the game. Methodically, they moved downfield in eight plays, getting the final score from Williams.

Buchanan led the Idaho running game with 22 carries for 212 yards and two scores.

For Portland State, Thompson rushed 15 times for 71 yards and one score. Chachere completed 15-21 passes for 180 and two scores, but gained only 25 yards on the ground due to five Idaho sacks.

Wing led the defense with 13 tackles and a sack. Ezriel Vasquez made nine stops.

**GAME NOTES**

- Idaho was the third straight top-10 opponent the Vikings have faced at home.
- SR QB Dante Chachere passed three milestones: 5,000 passing yards (5,173), 2,000 rushing yards (2,015 in his career) and 7,000 total yards of offense (7,188 - eighth all-time at PSU)... with 2,015 rushing yards, Chachere has passed Connor Kavanaugh (1,956) for most rushing yards ever by a Viking QB and is the 12th Viking in history to rush for 2,000 yards in a career.
- The game marked the 100th in Bruce Barnum’s head coaching career. It was his 157th game at PSU overall.

## WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT PORTLAND STATE AND VIKING FOOTBALL

Portland State University, located in Portland, OR, has an enrollment of 21,040 students (fall 2023). It was founded in 1946 as Vanport College - a two-year institution.

Athletically, Portland State began as a junior college in 1946-47, but competed in the Oregon Collegiate Conference at the NAIA level from 1950 to 1964, winning three OCC football titles (1962, 1963, 1964). PSU became a four-year institution in 1955.

Portland State joined the NCAA in 1965 and competed at the College Division level (the forerunner of NCAA II). PSU was an NCAA 1-AA member from 1978-80, then moved back to Division II in 1981, where it competed through the 1995 season. The Vikings were members of the Western Football Conference from 1982 to 1992,

winning six conference championships. PSU made eight NCAA II playoff appearances from 1987 to 1995 and played in the NCAA National Championship game in 1987 and 1988.

In 1996, Portland State moved to the Big Sky Conference and up to the NCAA 1-AA (now FCS) level. The Vikings made their first playoff appearance at their current level in 2000. In 2015, Portland State had its best season ever at the Division I level, compiling a 9-3 record and reaching the NCAA playoffs.

Portland State's football program has produced such legendary figures as Coach Mouse Davis, quarterbacks Neil Lomax and June Jones, Tom Oberg (the first Viking to play in the NFL), Coach Pokey Allen (who led the Vikings to two NCAA II National Championship appearances), and some

33 players who have appeared in the NFL.

In 2014, three former Vikings reached NFL Championship games: Julius Thomas with Denver, DeShawn Shead with Seattle and Jordan Senn with Carolina. Thomas and Shead went on to meet in Super Bowl XLVIII with their respective teams and Shead became a Super Bowl Champion - just the third former PSU Viking to do so (Clint Didier, Ted Popson). Shead made a return appearance to the Super Bowl in 2015, while Thomas was selected to his second Pro Bowl in as many years. He later signed a free agent contract with the Jacksonville Jaguars, making him the highest paid tight end in the NFL.

Portland State football plays at Hillsboro Stadium, west of downtown, a 7,600-seat stadium.

### DIRECTIONS TO PORTLAND STATE

The PSU campus is located in downtown Portland. It is bordered on the north by SW Market, on the east by SW 1st, on the south by I-405, and on the west by SW 13th.

• **TO PORTLAND STATE FROM THE PORTLAND AIRPORT:** Exit the Airport on Airport Way, heading east. Take I-205 South for approximately 3 miles. Exit on I-84 West and follow for approximately six miles. Move into the left lane of I-84 westbound as you approach the I-5 interchange. Take I-5 southbound and move into the left lane as you cross the Marquam Bridge. Merge with I-405, moving into the right lane. The 4th, 6th and 13th Avenue exits all lead onto the Portland State campus.

• **DIRECTIONS TO THE ATHLETICS OFFICE/STOTT COMMUNITY FIELD:** The Portland State Vikings practice at the Stott Community Field located at SW 10th and Hall on the PSU campus, adjacent to the Stott Center/Viking Pavilion. To get there, follow the directions to the PSU campus. On-street parking is available after exiting on 6th Avenue. A parking garage is also located on 6th Avenue between Hall and Harrison Streets. Walk three blocks west through the Park Blocks.

### DIRECTIONS TO HILLSBORO STADIUM

Hillsboro Stadium is located at 4450 NE Century Blvd in Hillsboro. From downtown Portland and the Portland State University campus take Highway 26 westbound toward Beaverton/Hillsboro/Ocean Beaches. Follow US-26 for 12 miles to NE Cornelius Pass Rd, exit 62A. Continue one-half mile on NE Cornelius Pass Rd to Evergreen Parkway. Turn right on Evergreen Parkway and follow for one-half mile to Century Blvd. Turn right and follow to parking entrances.
