WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT PORTLAND STATE AND VIKING FOOTBALL

Portland State University, located in Portland, OR, has an enrollment of 21,040 students (fall 2023). It was founded in 1946 as Vanport College - a two-year institution.

Athletically, Portland State began as a junior college in 1946-47, but competed in the Oregon Collegiate Conference at the NAIA level from 1950 to 1964, winning three OCC football titles (1962, 1963, 1964). PSU became a four-year institution in 1955.

Portland State joined the NCAA in 1965 and competed at the College Division level (the forerunner of NCAA II). PSU was an NCAA 1-AA member from 1978-80, then moved back to Division II in 1981, where it competed through the 1995 season. The Vikings were members of the Western Football Conference from 1982 to 1992, winning six conference championships. PSU made eight NCAA II playoff appearances from 1987 to 1995 and played in the NCAA National Championship game in 1987 and 1988.

In 1996, Portland State moved to the Big Sky Conference and up to the NCAA 1-AA (now FCS) level. The Vikings made their first playoff appearance at their current level in 2000. In 2015, Portland State had its best season ever at the Division I level, compiling a 9-3 record and reaching the NCAA playoffs.

Portland State's football program has produced such legendary figures as Coach Mouse Davis, quarterbacks Neil Lomax and June Jones, Tom Oberg (the first Viking to play in the NFL), Coach Pokey Allen (who led the Vikings to two NCAA II National Championship appearances), and some 33 players who have appeared in the NFL.

In 2014, three former Vikings reached NFL Championship games: Julius Thomas with Denver, DeShawn Shead with Seattle and Jordan Senn with Carolina. Thomas and Shead went on to meet in Super Bowl XLVIII with their respective teams and Shead became a Super Bowl Champion - just the third former PSU Viking to do so (Clint Didier, Ted Popson). Shead made a return appearance to the Super Bowl in 2015, while Thomas was selected to his second Pro Bowl in as many years. He later signed a free agent contract with the Jacksonville Jaguars, making him the highest paid tight end in the NFL.

Portland State football plays at Hillsboro Stadium, west of downtown, a 7,600-seat stadium.

2025 VIKINGS SPRING FOOTBALL PREVIEW

The Portland State Football program will open its spring practice session on Wednesday, April 2 at Stott Community Field. It will be the first of 15 spring practices throughout the month of April that concludes with the Spring Game on April 26.

The Vikings will go from 8-10 a.m. each practice day. Approximately 80 players will be available to practice. They include 42 returning letterwinners, 33 redshirts and seven transfers who have entered school either in winter or for the spring term.

The Vikings will have 13 returning starters on the roster. Interesting position battles will take place at quarterback, on the offensive and defensive lines, and defensive back.

Portland State will scrimmage on the mornings of Apr. 11 and 19. The Spring Game will take place at Stott Community Field on Apr. 26, beginning at 10 a.m.

THE QUARTERBACK COMPETITION IS REAL

The Viking program comes off three seasons and 33 starts from former QB Dante Chachere (2022-24, 7,612 yards of total offense and 78 total touchdowns) and prior to that QB Davis Alexander played for four years and 37 starts (2017-21, 10,473 yards of total offense and 88 total touchdowns). So you could say there has been some stability at the position for a long time.

Therefore, the most intriguing aspect of spring football (and likely fall camp) is the battle to be the new starting quarterback, replacing Chachere. Certainly, there is an intriguing array of candidates, including three transfers and three young players. SR QB Will Haskell (6-4, 200, 12-19-2-80-2TD) was the backup to Chachere in 2024 after transferring from Washington. Former Idaho and Northern Illinois QB CJ Jordan (SR, 6-2, 220) also has Division I experience and is a native of Portland. The 2025 signing class includes another transfer in former Hawai'i QB John-Keawe Sagapolutele (SO, 6-1, 205).

Among the young players is SO QB Gabe Downing (6-0, 185, 1-2-0-10-0), who has seen brief action and RS FRs Cru Newman (6-0, 185) and Tyrese Smith (6-2, 225).

Those six will need all need a lot of snaps in the spring to be evaluated by Barnum and quarterbacks coach Kieran McDonagh.

DEPTH AT TE

The evolution of JR TE Tanner Beaman (6-3, 235) and SO TE Kristian Ingman (6-5, 235) has the Vikings tight end corps in good shape heading into the 2025 season. Beaman (21-257-1) grew into a reliable pass catcher for the Vikings and earned second team All-Big Sky Conference honors in 2024. Ingman saw significant action as a redshirt freshman, and even moonlighted as the team long snapper.

Now, junior backups Brooks Ferguson (6-5, 240), Charlie White (6-2, 235) and Seth Lyon (6-3, 245) want to add to the depth at the position.

THOMPSON IN THE SPOTLIGHT

The spotlight wasn't too bright for SO RB Delon Thompson (5-9, 200) in his rookie season. As a redshirt freshman he stepped up to carry the ball 139 times for 678 yards (5.3 pc) and seven touchdowns. His spotlight games were against the top competition. Thompson's first game of the season at Washington State was a breakout with 15 carries for 96 yards. Later in the season, Thompson had 84 yards and two scores in a win at Sacramento State. Then, his marquee game was a 22-carry, 117-yard, one-TD effort at Montana that kept the Vikings in contention late into the fourth quarter against the 10th-ranked Griz. More performances like that from Thompson will be key to the Vikings' offensive success in 2025.

Backing him up will be burly veteran Jacques Badalato-Birdsell (SR, 5-10, 205, 8-30-1) and a pair of fleet redshirt freshmen in Micah Avery (5-10, 185) and Jordan Herron (5-10, 160). SO WR Eric Denham may also be a situational back for the Vikings.

YOUNG RECEIVERS TO STEP UP

The Vikings return their three starting wide receivers from 2024 in SR Branden Alvarez (5-11, 180, 36-480-5), SO Eric Denham (5-11, 190, 35-516-3) and JR Jaylen Lynch (6-2, 185, 16-246-0). Also back is a player that was projected to possibly be the Vikings' best wideout in 2024 in JR Terence Loville (6-0, 185). Unfortunately, a hand injury in the first game cost Loville the entire season. He is back and healthy and, with the other three, gives PSU an excellent combo of talent and experience at wide receiver in 2025.

Returning letterwinners Chance Miller (SR, 6-0, 185) and Eddy Schultz (SO, 6-1, 195) give the Vikings more depth.

And it gets even better from there. Portland State has no fewer than six redshirt freshman wide receivers on its roster. Who among the six will step forward to become major contributors? Certainly, options abound. The Vikings have three lanky receivers in the group, including Ben Stevens (6-4, 220), Daulton Beard (6-5, 200) and Marcus Angiuli (6-3, 215). The other three are more of the slot variety in Kiwan Sims (5-9, 165), Kenen Elder (6-0, 175) and Andre Miller (6-0, 180).

UP FRONT

Portland State's offensive line will have a different look in 2025, but not without experience. The Vikings return two starters in SR OTs Pedro Timoteo (6-4, 320) and Jakob Belton (6-7, 320). However, three others have started games for the Vikings. RS FR OGs Pule Leatigaga (6-4, 335) and Shaun Torgeson (6-4, 290) combined for eight games and six starts at guard in 2024. They were limited in their playing time to maintain their redshirt seasons. That talented tandem should be strong favorites to start in 2025. JR OL Anthony Tena (6-4, 290) has actually played in the most games of anyone on the offense (26) and has a pair of starts in his past.

Other players with experience include SO OLs Pryce Roberts (6-5, 300) and Tristan Lewis (6-5, 305) and JR OL Hezephaniah Po Ching (6-2, 310). JR OL Braylon Cornell (6-6, 285) has been highly thought of in his time at PSU, but hasn't been able to get out of the training room due to injuries. He could be a wild card in the mix in 2025.

Three offensive line transfers will increase the competition. They include JRs Semisi Latu (6-2, 305) and James Minot (6-2, 290), both from College of San Mateo, and Kapeliele Hausia (6-4, 305) from Riverside Community College.

BATTLE IN THE TRENCHES

Portland State has a cadre of defensive linemen returning in 2025 - its largest position group prior to the season - ensuring heated competition for playing time. The Vikings have 12 returning letterwinners, three redshirts and two transfers.

SR DE Slade Shufelt (6-3, 255, 13T-2.5TFL) is the most experienced player in the group. But JRs Spencer Elliott (6-2, 235, 17T-2.5TFK-INT), Elias Sanders (6-2, 265, 8T-TFL) and Elijah Eason (6-5, 250, 16T-1.5TFL) also have significant field time. SOs Nate Richter (6-3, 225, 14T-TFL) and Frederick Lujan III (6-1, 285, 10T-3TFL) stepped up in their redshirt freshmen seasons as well. At defensive end, SR DE Jayden Brannan (6-3, 210, 5 tackles) is back after showing promise early in 2024. Unfortunately, an injury limited him to three games.

A big addition is actually a returning player. SR DT J'Querian Ladson (6-3, 330, 8T-TFL-FR) got a year of eligibility back from the NCAA due to his previous status as a junior college player. He is a favorite to be the Vikings nose tackle.

Those players, along with transfers Tuaoa Taui'i'ili (SO, 6-3, 330, Idaho State) and Daniel Matagi (SO, 6-0, 285, Central Washington), should form a deep, veteran group up front for the Vikings.

GOLD WING

JR LB Peyton Wing (6-0, 225) comes off an excellent season for the Vikings in which he led the team with 93 tackles and seven tackles for loss. That was the most tackles by a Viking since 2013 and earned Wing second team All-Big Sky Conference honors. He will anchor the defensive unit in

2025 and be expected to lead on the field and off.

Two other junior linebackers need to elevate their games in the coming year. Davin Beason (6-1, 235) competed at middle linebacker, making 24 tackles in mostly a backup role last season. Jaxton Helmstetler (6-2, 220) had two starts and made 15 tackles with two tackles for loss.

After that, the Vikings will look for help from newcomers. JR Jordan Allen (6-0, 225) was expected to have an impact last year after transferring in from San Jose State. But a knee injury wiped out his season. If he can get to full strength, Allen should see a lot of action. JR Solomon McDaniel (5-11, 225) is a local player who is a transfer from nearby Lewis & Clark College.

SR Keegan Stancato (6-4, 210) and RS JR Deon Cavitt (6-1, 200) bring depth at the position.

DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD

The Vikings defensive backfield is young and hungry to make its mark. There is little experience beyond three returning sophomores. FS Isaiah Green (50T-3PBU-INT) and CB Bryson Ross (19T-3PBU in seven games) are athletic and evolved into starters as the 2024 season progressed. Their success will be vital to the defensive backfield's overall performance.

The real wild card will be NICK Zach Wusstig (6-1, 195). A supremely talented player, Wusstig has seen each of the past two seasons end prematurely due to a shoulder injury. His career consists of nine total games with six starts. He has 40 tackles and three pass breakups in that brief action. A healthy 2025 will make a big difference in the defensive backfield.

The coaching staff is high on redshirt DBs Pierce Walker (FR, 5-10, 180), Carsten Mamaril (JR, 5-9, 180), Elyjah Gordon (FR, 6-4, 190), DaMari Washington (FR, 6-0, 185) and Boise State transfer Dionte Thornton (SO, 6-0, 205). How all those players sort themselves out will be as interesting as the battle at quarterback.

GET ON THE GOOD FOOT

Coming off strong first seasons with the Vikings, SR K Mathias Uribe and SR P Tony Johnson should give PSU one of the better special teams units in the conference.

Uribe was an honorable mention All-Big Sky Conference choice and a Fred Mitchell Award finalist, given to the top placekicker at the FCS, Division II, III, NAIA or JC level. He was 11-12 on field goals and 37-38 on extra points.

Johnson averaged 41.0 yards per punt, and was a key to holding opponents to just 72 return yards all season (3.3 pr).

SO LS Kristian Ingman (6-5, 235) and RS FR LS Brock Fleming (6-1, 180) both return as well.

REINFORCEMENTS

In the world of the NCAA Portal, it is always important to have quality transfers. Among Division I transfers, the Vikings have added SO QB John-Keawe Sagapolutele (Hawai'i), SO CB Dionte Thornton (Boise State) and SO DT Tuaoa Tauili'iili (Idaho State), and Division II transfer SO DT Daniel Matagi (Central Washington). Expect more transfers when the Portal opens again in May.

Portal transfers from last year that had a big impact included WR Branden Alvarez, DT Joe Moeaki, OL Jakob Belton and CB Jamal McMurrin - all starters. Also among last year's transfers who could be key this year are QB Will Haskell, WR Terence Loville, QB CJ Jordan, RB Jacques Badolato-Birdsell and LB Jordan Allen.

GOOD HEALTH

A team can amass all the talent in the world, but if it isn't healthy, the talent can mean very little. With that preface, the Vikings hope to have healthy seasons from a handful of players expected to be in the two-deep last year that missed significant time with injuries. They include:

JR WR Terence Loville (hand, one game), FR S Zach Wusstig (shoulder, 7 games), JR LB Jordan Allen (knee, DNP), JR DE Jayden Brannan (shoulder, 3 games), SO OL Braylon Cornell (knee, DNP for two seasons), SO TE Charlie White (knee, DNP).

COACHING STAFF UPDATE

Portland State has two new assistant coaches, both former Viking players. Head Coach Bruce Barnum has also made a few assignment changes for 2025. Here is the Viking Football staff.

THE SCHEDULE

The 2025 Portland State Football schedule will be one of the most unique in school history, including a home game at Providence Park. Along the way the Vikings will face a first-time "zero week" opponent, opponents from nine different states and four time zones, departure from the mainland, and of course, the usual difficulty of four playoff opponents and two FBS-level opponents.

PSU will have the earliest start in school history with a zero week home game against a first-time opponent Tarleton State on Aug. 23. The Texans are members of the United Athletic Conference and were an FCS playoff team in 2024. Tarleton finished the year 10-4, winning an opening-round game to Drake before losing to fourth-ranked South Dakota.

The Vikings then have an extremely challenging three-game road stretch, including a pair of FBS opponents. PSU plays at BYU on Aug. 30. The Cougars were 11-2 in 2024, including 7-2 in the Mountain West Conference, and winners of the Alamo Bowl, 36-14, over Colorado. BYU ended the year ranked 17th in the nation. The teams have met once previously, a 20-6 PSU loss at BYU, in 2017.

A trip further east comes the following week (Sept. 6) with a game at North Dakota. PSU and North Dakota are former Big Sky Conference foes, but UND moved to the Missouri Valley Football Conference in 2020. North Dakota leads the all-time series 6-2. The Fighting Hawks had a 5-7 record in 2024.

On Sept. 13 the scenery will look completely different with Portland State playing at Hawai'i. The Warriors were also 5-7 last season, with a 3-4 mark in the Mountain West. Hawai'i leads the series with the Vikings, 5-1. The last meeting was a 49-35 Warriors win in 2021 at the Clarence T.C. Ching Complex on the Hawai'i campus in front of no fans due to COVID restrictions.

Big Sky Conference play opens with Northern Arizona at home on Sept. 27. The Lumberjacks were 8-5 in 2024, 6-2 in the Big Sky, and reached the FCS playoffs. The teams last met in 2023, a 45-21 Viking win in Flagstaff. PSU has won the last two meetings, but NAU leads the Big Sky series, 14-7.

Dam Cup competition returns on Oct. 4 with PSU traveling to Eastern Washington (4-8 in 2024). The Vikings have won the Dam Cup Rivalry Trophy in the past two meetings with the Eagles, and have actually held it for three years as the teams did not play in 2024. The Vikings won 38-35 at Eastern Washington in 2022, then 47-35 at home in 2023. The all-time series is tied between the programs 22-22-1, so the 2025 game will be for the Trophy and to break the all-time tie.

Portland State will try to avenge last season's loss to Weber State when it hosts the Wildcats on Oct. 18. WSU beat PSU 43-16 early last fall in Ogden. The Wildcats hold a 24-15 all-time edge and 14-9 Big Sky Conference edge in the series.

The Vikings travel to Idaho on Oct. 25 to face a program transitioning with a new head coach. The Vandals were 10-4 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs before they were knocked out by Montana State. Idaho leads the Big Sky series with Vikings, 4-1, including wins in the last three games. Of six Big Sky Conference matchups, this will be the fourth played in Moscow.

On Nov. 1, Portland State will play at Cal Poly. The Vikings and Mustangs

last met in 2023, a 59-21 Viking win at Hillsboro Stadium. Cal Poly comes off a 3-8 season. The Mustangs lead the Big Sky series with the Vikings, 5-3.

After two games in a row on the road, PSU will have two in a row at home. Sacramento State comes to town on Nov. 8. Portland State leads the series with the Hornets, 24-14 all-time and 14-9 in Big Sky games. The Vikings picked up a 58-38 win at Hornets Stadium last November.

A long-awaited return to Providence Park in downtown Portland arrives on Nov. 15 when Portland State hosts no less an opponent than the Montana Grizzlies. The Vikings' former home, it marks PSU's first game in the venerable downtown stadium since Oct. 13, 2018. Montana comes off a 9-5 season in which it once again reached the FCS playoffs. The Grizzlies beat the Vikings, 28-17, in Missoula in November and have won four in a row in the series.

Snow could be a factor in the Vikings' regular-season finale as they travel to Northern Colorado. PSU will try to pick up a sixth straight win over the Bears. The Vikings beat UNC 45-13 in the 2024 finale and lead the all-time series 12-5.

SCHEDULE NOTES

- PSU is pursuing an unprecedented 13th game - at home - due to playing on zero week and having an exempt game at Hawai'i. With two open dates on the schedule, game 13 is tentative at this time.
- 2025 will be the 79th season of Portland State Football and the 30th as a member of the Big Sky Conference.
- The Vikings face five teams that were on the schedule in 2024: Weber State, Idaho, Sacramento State, Montana and Northern Colorado. PSU was 2-3 against that group.
- Of the non-conference opponents, PSU has never played Tarleton State, faced BYU once (0-1), North Dakota eight times (2-6) and Hawai'i six times (1-5)... PSU's 45-20 win at Hawai'i in 2000 was the program's first-ever over an FBS-level program (the Vikings now have four such wins).
- PSU's two FBS-level opponents are BYU and Hawai'i. PSU is 4-48 all-time when playing "up" against FBS programs. Wins have come over Hawai'i (2000), New Mexico (2006), Washington State (2015) and North Texas (2015)... this marks the 11th consecutive season that Portland State has played two FBS opponents. PSU has done so a total of 15 times, including three in 2006.
- BYU was ranked 17th in the final 2024 FBS polls and won a bowl game over Colorado... Tarleton State (13th), Northern Arizona (22nd), Idaho (7th), and Montana (10th) were all ranked in the final 2024 FCS poll and competed in the 2024 FCS playoffs.
- Portland State last played at Providence Park on Oct. 13, 2018, a 35-14 win over Northern Colorado. The Vikings last played a full season at Providence Park in 2016... that was also the last time Portland State played its first game of the season at home. Since then, PSU has opened on the road seven straight times.
- Portland State has won the Dam Cup rivalry trophy game in the last two meetings with Eastern Washington (2022, 2023). The teams did not meet in 2024.
- The Vikings will play opponents from Washington, Idaho, Utah (2), North Dakota, Hawai'i, Arizona, California (2), Montana, Texas and Colorado.

- **FAMILY AFFAIR:** JR OL Braylon Cornell has had a cousin, Jake Porter, play on the Viking Football team (2018-22), another cousin play on the Viking volleyball team, Ellie Snook (2019-22), and two uncles play at PSU, Jamie Snook (basketball, 1996-99) and Jason Porter (baseball, 1991-94).

2024 PORTLAND STATE VIKINGS SEASON REVIEW

PSU COMPLETES 2024 SEASON AT 3-8, 3-5 IN BIG SKY

Portland State completed its 2024 season with a 3-8 record overall, 3-5 in the Big Sky Conference. PSU faced its most challenging schedule in school history, facing five nationally-ranked FCS teams (four in the top 10), an FBS Playoff team (Boise State) and a second winning FBS program (Washington State).

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- The Vikings were 3-8 overall, 3-5 in the Big Sky Conference. PSU was 1-3 at home, with three losses to top-10 programs. The Vikings were 2-5 on the road.
- Seven Vikings earned All-Big Sky Conference honors. SR QB Dante Chachere (all-purpose back), SO LB Peyton Wing and SO TE Tanner Beaman earned second team honors. Named to the honorable mention team were Chachere again (QB), SR OLs Billy Lutui and Richard Estrella, SR DB Tyreese Shakir and JR K Mathias Uribe.
- SR QB Dante Chachere turned in quite a senior season - and career. He was twice named Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Week, also earning National Player of the Week on one occasion. In a 42-38 win over Idaho State (10/12), Chachere posted a 200-200, six-touchdown game. He rushed 13 times for 202 yards and three touchdowns, and completed 12-26 passes for 216 yards and three touchdowns and was named Big Sky Conference Player of the Week. That performance also earned him Stats Perform National Player of the Week... in a 58-38 win over Sacramento State (11/2), Chachere completed 14-27 passes for 245 yards and one touchdown, and rushed 14 times for 165 yards and four scores. Once again, he was named Big Sky Player of the Week.
- Chachere completed his PSU career high on the all-time offensive lists. He had 78 total touchdowns (47 passing, 31 rushing, 3rd all-time), ranking seventh in passing touchdowns and fifth in rushing touchdowns. He completed 441-726 passes (9th all-time) for 5,511 yards (12th all-time). His 2,101 rushing yards were the 11th-most in school history and most ever by a quarterback. Chachere's 7,612 yards of total offense is fourth in school history.
- JR K Mathias converted 11-12 field goals, including his last nine in a row. The .917 kicking percentage set a new Portland State record... Uribe was a Fred Mitchell Award finalist and honorable mention All-Big Sky selection.
- FR RB Delon Thompson was named an FCS Football Central Freshman All-American. He was one of 69 players from around the nation named to the team. Thompson had 678 total rushing yards and seven touchdowns this season. He ranked 10th in the Big Sky in rushing yards.
- Eight members of the Viking Football team earned CSC Academic All-District honors: Senior defensive end Kennedy Freeman, junior defensive end Slade Shufelt, sophomore linebacker Peyton Wing, freshman safety Isaiah Green, senior wide receiver/defensive back Travis West, senior defensive tackle Joe Moeaki, freshman running back Delon Thompson and sophomore linebacker Jaxton Helmstetler.
- 25 members of the Viking Football team earned Academic All-Big Sky Conference honors as the team had a 3.09 cumulative GPA.

SEVEN VIKINGS EARN ALL-BIG SKY HONORS

As a well-known dual-threat quarterback for the Portland State Vikings, perhaps it was no surprise that Dante Chachere earned recognition twice as the Big Sky Conference released its All-League honors as voted on by league coaches.

Chachere, along with tight end Tanner Beaman and linebacker Peyton Wing, were named second team All-Big Sky Conference. Meanwhile, Chachere appeared again on the honorable mention list with offensive linemen Billy Lutui and Richard Estrella, defensive back Tyreese Shakir and kicker Mathias Uribe.

Chachere, a 6-3, 200-pound senior from Fresno, CA, was named second team All-Big Sky as an all-purpose back, no doubt because of his running and passing abilities. He was also selected as an honorable mention quarterback, effectively earning recognition as the third-best quarterback in the league.

For the third year in a row, Chachere led the Vikings' offense. He completed 61% of his passes for a career-high 1,970 yards and 12 touchdowns, while also rushing for a team- and career-high 723 yards and 12 touchdowns in 11 games. Chachere ranked sixth in passing yards, seventh in rushing yards and was third in total offense in the Big Sky. He was twice named Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Week, and earned National Offensive Player of the Week honors after a 216-passing yard, 202 rushing-yard, six-touchdown game in a win over Idaho State.

One of Chachere's key targets was Beaman, a 6-3, 230-pound sophomore tight end from Vancouver's Skyview High School. Beaman emerged as a top pass catcher with 21 receptions for 257 yards and a touchdown, while also being a key blocking cog for a running game that averaged over 200 yards per outing.

Peyton Wing, a 6-foot, 225-pound sophomore linebacker from Sumner, WA, was one of the top tacklers in the Big Sky Conference. He ranked fourth in the Big Sky with 8.5 tackles per game. Wing's 93 total tackles and 7.5 tackles for loss led the Vikings on the season. He also had a sack and a pass breakup. Wing's 93 tackles were the most by a Viking in 10 seasons.

Also collecting Big Sky kudos on the honorable mention list were senior offensive linemen Billy Lutui (6-1, 325, Corona, CA) and Richard Estrella (6-4, 325, Eugene, OR). Both started all 11 games and led an offensive that averaged 393.0 yards and 29.3 points. PSU rushed for 203.2 yards per game, the most in three years.

Defensive back Tyreese Shakir was also named to the honorable mention team. Shakir, a 5-10, 195-pound senior from Murrieta, CA, ranked third on the Vikings with 54 tackles, had 3.5 tackles for loss, four pass breakups, an interception and a forced fumble.

Junior kicker Mathias Uribe earned honorable mention as well. The 5-9, 200-pounder from San Dimas, CA, converted 11-12 field goals on the season with a long kick of 48 yards, while making 37-38 extra points. His field goal kicking percentage (.917) ranked second in the Big Sky and established a new PSU record. He had 23 touchbacks on 60 kickoffs.

THOMPSON NAMED FCS FOOTBALL CENTRAL FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICAN

Portland State running back Delon Thompson picked up national recognition Tuesday as a member of the third annual FCS Football Central Freshman All-American team.

Thompson earned the honor after rushing for 678 yards on 4.9 yards per carry and seven touchdowns this past fall. He rushed for a career-high 117 yards on 22 carries and a touchdown in the Vikings' road game at Montana. He finished with 84 yards on 20 carries and two touchdowns in the team's 58-38 road win at Sacramento State.

Thompson ranked 10th in the Big Sky this season while averaging 61.6 yards per game. He ranked sixth among all freshmen in FCS football with that average, while he also ranked tied for sixth in rushing touchdowns and fifth in yards per carry among his classmates.

Additionally, Thompson contributed to a team rushing attack that ranked 11th nationally with 203.2 yards per game.

URIBE AMONG 10 FINALISTS FOR THE FRED MITCHELL AWARD

Portland State kicker Mathias Uribe has been named as a finalist for the 2024 Fred Mitchell Award, presented annually to a collegiate kicker recognizing exceptional placekicking and community service.

Uribe, a junior from San Dimas, CA, finished the 2024 season for the Vikings converting 11-12 field goals and 37-38 extra points. He made his last nine straight field goals and was 6-6 from beyond 40 yards. Uribe also had 26 touchbacks on 60 kickoffs. He was named to the honorable mention All-Big Sky Conference team.

A first-year player for the Vikings, Uribe also participated as a volunteer coach at Camp Exceptional Youth Sports Camp this past summer in Portland.

The annual Fred Mitchell Outstanding Place-Kicker Award (also known as the Fred Mitchell Award) is provided to the nation's top collegiate

place-kicker among more than 750 FCS, Division II, III, NAIA and NJCAA football teams. The selection committee is comprised of former NFL and college kickers, previous award winners, as well as prominent businessmen and community-minded individuals.

EIGHT VIKINGS EARN ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS

Eight members of the Portland State Football team have been named to the College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-District team for 2024.

Senior defensive end Kennedy Freeman, junior defensive end Slade Shufelt, sophomore linebacker Peyton Wing, freshman safety Isaiah Green, senior wide receiver/defensive back Travis West, senior defensive tackle Joe Moeaki, freshman running back Delon Thompson and sophomore linebacker Jaxton Helmstetler all received honors for their achievements in the classroom and on the field.

To qualify, a student-athlete must have completed at least one full year at their current institution, be a starter or important reserve, and have at least a 3.50 cumulative GPA (on a 4.0 scale). All-District selections are now eligible for Academic All-America honors, which will be announced on January 28.

Freeman, a senior from Aiea, HI, was a team co-captain and part-time starter who played in 42 games in his PSU career. He is a four-time Academic All-Big Sky Conference selection and is completing his MBA at Portland State.

Shufelt, a junior from Hillsboro, has been a starter the past two seasons for the Vikings. This year, he had 13 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

Both Freeman and Shufelt were CSC Academic All-District choices in 2023.

Wing, a sophomore from Sumner, WA, was a second team All-Big Sky Conference selection this season after leading the Vikings in tackles and ranking among the league leaders. He had 93 stops, 7.5 tackles for loss, a sack and a pass breakup while starting every game.

Green, a redshirt freshman from Oxnard, CA, ranked fourth on the Vikings with 50 tackles. He added an interception and three pass breakups while starting seven of 11 games.

Thompson, a redshirt freshman from Newbury Park, CA, ranked 10th in the Big Sky in rushing. He had 139 carries for 678 yards (4.9 pc) and seven touchdowns, and caught seven passes for 87 yards.

West, a senior from Portland, lettered four seasons for the Vikings and is also a four-time Academic All-Big Sky honoree. This past year, he flipped between playing offense and defense. West had 10 tackles, three receptions for 50 yards, one running play for seven yards and returned one kickoff for 15 yards.

Moeaki, a senior from Portland, started at defensive tackle for the Vikings. In 10 games he had 17 tackles, one tackle for loss and a pass breakup.

Helmstetler, a sophomore from Seattle, played in all 11 games with two starts. For the season, he had 15 tackles with two tackles for loss.

25 VIKINGS EARN ACADEMIC ALL-BIG SKY HONORS

QUICK SNAPS

WINS, LOSSES, AND THE BIG SKY

- Portland State was 3-8 overall, 1-3 at home, 2-5 on the road.
- Portland State is 14-11 at Hillsboro Stadium since becoming its permanent home in 2019... Portland State is 21-0 in games against lower division opponents since moving to Division I in 1996... the Vikings are now 22-6 in home openers since joining the Big Sky.
- 2024 was Portland State's 32nd season at the NCAA I FCS level (1978-80 (1-AA), 1996-2024). PSU is 152-194 in all games at the FCS/1-AA level.
- PSU completed its 29th season since moving back to FCS and the Big Sky Conference (1996-2024). PSU is 133-181 in that span, 85-63 in home games, 48-118 on the road.
- As a member of the Big Sky Conference (1996-2024) PSU is 90-129 all-time in league games, 52-58 at home, 38-71 on the road.
- Bruce Barnum (2015-24, 28-44 Big Sky, 38-64 overall) is the Vikings fourth Head Coach in the Big Sky Conference era. Previous coaches were: Tim Walsh (1993-2006, 42-41/90-68 all-time); Jerry Glanville (2007-09, 7-17/9-24); and Nigel Burton (2010-15, 13-27/21-36).
- The Vikings have never won a Big Sky title, but have tied for second five times (four times under Walsh and in 2015 under Barnum). PSU has made two NCAA FCS playoff appearances (2000, 2015).
- PSU's best record ever at the FCS level was 9-3 in 2015 (4-2 at home, 5-1 on the road).

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- **THE NUMBERS:** Portland State averaged 393.0 yards of offense per game, 203.2 yards on the ground and 189.8 through the air... the Vikings averaged 29.3 points per game and had 15 turnovers... PSU had its best offensive output of the season against Sacramento State with 544 yards, including 299 rushing, and 58 points... PSU's top passing game was a 306-yard effort at Chattanooga, and top rushing game was 358 yards against Northern Colorado.
- **DANTE'S DATA:** SR QB Dante Chachere passed for 1,970 yards and 12 touchdowns and rushed for 723 yards and 12 touchdowns... he ranked sixth in the Big Sky in passing, seventh in rushing and third in total offense... Chachere was named second team All-Big Sky Conference All-Purpose Back and honorable mention quarterback... Chachere completed 19-30 passes for a career-high 306 yards at Chattanooga (9/29) with one touchdown and two interceptions... he rushed for a career-high 202 yards and three touchdowns in the win at Idaho State (10/12)... Chachere pulled off a PSU first when he passed for 200 yards (216 with three TDs) and rushed for 200 yards (202 with three TDs) in the same game. In the game, Chachere had runs of 62, 48 and 53 yards, and a pass completion of 50 yards. Chachere was named National and Big Sky Conference Offensive Player of the Week... he was nine yards shy of the PSU QB rushing record of 211 yards by Connor Kavanaugh... Chachere then came close to matching that at Sacramento State (11/2) with 245 yards and one touchdown passing, 165 yards and a career-high four touchdowns rushing for a total of 410 yards and 5 TDs. Once again he was named Big Sky Conference Player of the Week... with three TD passes against ISU, Chachere has seven games of three or more in his career... Chachere has 78 career touchdowns (47 passing, 31 rushing) which is third all-time at Portland State behind Neil Lomax, 1977-80 (13 rushing, 106 passing, 119 total); and Davis Alexander, 2017-21 (25 rushing, 63 passing, 88 total)... Chachere passed three career milestones against Idaho (11/9): 5,000 passing yards, 2,000 rushing yards

and 7,000 total yards of offense... with 2,101 rushing yards, Chachere has passed Connor Kavanaugh (1,956) for most rushing yards ever by a Viking QB and is the 12th Viking in history to rush for 2,000 yards in a career.

- **Q RATING:** SO RB Quincy Craig has battled back from a knee injury suffered in game six of 2023 to once again become the Vikings' key offense weapon... Craig closed out the season with a career-best rushing performance of 15 carries for 137 yards and two touchdowns against Northern Colorado (11/23)... his game at Montana (11/16) showed what Craig is capable of... he totaled a career-high 251 all-purpose yards with 90 rushing, 48 receiving and 113 on kick returns... Craig had a team-high 1,104 all-purpose yards and 10 touchdowns this season. He was third on the team in rushing (115-602-5) and third in receptions and tied for first in receiving touchdowns (34-314-5)... Craig has 186 kickoff return yards and a 28-yard pass completion for good measure... Craig had a 10-carry, 103-yard rushing game at Chattanooga (9/28) and has five 100-yard games in his career... Craig passed 1,000 career rushing yards in his 19th career game (Idaho, 11/9) and now has 1,233.
- **GET OFF DELON:** RS FR Delon Thompson proved to be a tough tackle this season for Vikings opponents. He ranked second on the team in rushing with 139 carries for 678 yards and seven touchdowns... Thompson posted a career-high 117 yards on 22 carries with one score at Montana (11/16)... he led the Vikings with 15 carries for 96 yards at Washington State (8/31) and 12 carries for 68 yards against UC Davis (10/5), adding 84 yards and two scores in a win at Sacramento State (11/2).
- **YOUTH SHALL SERVE:** In addition to PSU's running backs, other youngsters performed well on offense... RS FR Eric Denham had 35 receptions for a team-high 516 yards and three touchdowns. He had a career-high six receptions at Montana (11/16), and a career-high of 127 yards and two touchdowns in the win at Idaho State (10/12)... SO TE Tanner Beaman made 21 catches for 257 yards and a touchdown, and earned second team All-Big Sky Conference honors... SO WR Jaylen Lynch had 16 receptions and 246 yards... even JR WR Branden Alvarez - while an upperclassman - has a team-leading 36 catches for 480 yards and five touchdowns. He went for a career-high 105 yards on five catches at Sacramento State (11/2).
- **MORE YOUTH, UP FRONT:** Last season, SO OL Isaac Perez earned a spot in the starting lineup as a true freshman. This year, true FR OLs Pule Leatigaga and Shaun Torgeson broke through up front earning starts at guard.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- **THE NUMBERS:** Portland State allowed 230.1 rushing yards, 297.1 passing yards and 40.1 points per game... the Vikings had 42 tackles for loss, eight sacks, 36 pass breakups and eight forced turnovers... against top-10 UC Davis (10/5), the Viking defense made seven tackles for loss, two sacks, three pass breakups and forced two turnovers while allowing the fewest points (27) of the season to that point... in the decisive second half against Idaho State (10/12), PSU's defense stopped the Bengals on six of seven series, including three three-and-outs, and two fourth-down stops... in the season finale against Northern Colorado (11/23), PSU's defense allowed the fewest points (13).
- **WING STOP:** SO LB Peyton Wing led the Vikings with 93 tackles and 7.5 tackles for loss this season. He also has a sack and a pass breakup... Wing averaged 8.5 tackles per game to rank fourth in the Big Sky and earned second team All-Conference honors... Wing had a career-high 13 stops at Weber State (9/7) and led the team in tackles with nine at Boise State (9/21) and 10 at Chattanooga (9/28). He came back to match his career high with 13 tackles and a sack against Idaho (11/9). Wing's 10 tackles at Montana (11/16) marked the fifth time this season he led the Vikings.
- **SWEET 16:** SO LB Michael Montgomery had a career-high 16 tackles at Weber State (9/7), which was the most by a Viking in six seasons. Montgomery, named a Freshman All-American by two media outlets last year, was second on the Vikings in tackles with 80. He also had four tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks and four pass breakups... he had 10 tackles against UC Davis (10/5) to tie for the team lead.
- **CAREER LEADER:** SR CB Tyreese Shakir picked up his sixth career interception in the win at Sacramento State (11/2). He was the Vikings leader in several categories among active players in 2024... he has 176 career

tackles, 13 pass breakups, six interceptions, three fumble recoveries and two forced fumbles - all of which rank first among 2024 active players. His 11.5 tackles for loss ranks second and three sacks ranks third... Shakir had a team-high 10 tackles and three tackles for loss against UC Davis (10/5).

- **YOUTH SHALL SERVE, PART 2:** Among Portland State's top nine tacklers, seven are freshmen and sophomores.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- **FOOTWORK:** JR K Mathias Uribe was 11-12 on field goal attempts this season (43, 42, 35, 40, 23, 30, 44, 27, 48, 40, 33). His .917 field goal percentage is a new PSU record... 23 of his 60 kickoffs were touchbacks... Uribe earned honorable mention All-Big Sky Conference... SO K Fedya Henrichs-Tarassenkov handled four kickoffs with three touchbacks this season.
- **DON'T EVEN TRY:** JR P Tony Johnson averaged 41.0 yards per punt. He bombed a season-best 69-yarder at Weber State (9/7). Most important, Johnson's punts were not returned with any effectiveness. In 22 returns this season, opponents have netted only 72 yards. Boise State (9/21) had four attempts for -4 yards.
- **IT'S A SNAP:** FR TE Kristian Ingman has started 10 games at long snapper, while FR LS Brock Fleming started in game three. Ingman had seven tackles and a fumble recovery on punt coverage.
- **GRUBB HUB:** SR RB Christian Grubb had a season-best 71-yard kickoff return at Sacramento State (11/2). He is averaging 21.9 yards on 21 returns this season.
- **YOUTH SHALL SERVE, PART 3:** FR RB Jordan Herron surprised everyone when he picked up a UC Davis (10/5) punt on the bounce and raced 40 yards up field before being tackled in his first career play as a Viking. Not a bad start as the true freshman was given the punt returner role against the Aggies.
