The final non-conference game of 2019 for the Quakers features the first-ever visit to historic Franklin Field for the Sacred Heart Pioneers. The two teams met last year in Connecticut in a game that hung in the balance until the very end. Both teams are looking to get back in the win column after losses at home last weekend in conference play.

The Penn-Sacred Heart Series — Second Meeting

These two teams have met just once, a 31-27 win for the Quakers in Fairfield last fall. Penn jumped out to a 24-0 lead early in the third quarter, but the Pioneers rattled off 27 consecutive points to take the lead with 9:54 remaining. The Red and Blue rallied, though, with a Ryan Glover 10-yard pass to Christian Pearson with 1:13 left giving the Quakers the win. The Quakers ran for 323 yards in the win last year, led by 191 yards from Karekin Brooks. The Quakers made some history in the win, as Taheeb Sonekan tied the NCAA FCS record for field goal blocks in a game with two.

KK2K

Senior Karekin Brooks continues to climb Penn's all-time rushing charts. He ran for 91 yards and two touchdowns against Dartmouth last weekend, giving him 451 yards and four TDs in 2018. For his career, Brooks has run for 2,295 yards which ranks No. 6 all-time by a Quaker. He is now 184 yards away from the No. 5 spot held by Rich Comizio '87. Brooks enters today with 22 career rushing TDs, tied with Sam Matthews '06 for No. 8 all-time by a Quaker.

An Above-Average Average

Over his stellar career, Karekin Brooks has carried the ball 389 times for his 2,295 yards - averaging an astounding 5.89 yards per carry which ranks No. 5 among active FCS running backs. Penn's career record is 5.68 held by Chris Flynn and the Ivy League record is 6.06 set by Dartmouth's Rick Klupchak from 1971-73.

Leading The Country

Brooks is averaging 150.3 yards-per-game on the ground this season, No. 1 among FCS rushing backs. His 174.3 all purpose yards-per-game rank No. 3.

Here's To You, Mr. Robinson

Quarterback Nick Robinson ranks No. 6 in the country in completion percentage, entering this weekend 63-for-91 (69.2%) which also ranks No. 2 in the Ivy League. Since throwing an interception early in the second quarter of the season opener at No. 20 Delaware, Robinson is 56-for-81 (69.1%) for 597 yards with three touchdowns and zero interceptions.

- Ray Priore officially took over as the 22nd George A. Munger Head Coach of Football at Penn on Dec. 1, 2014.
- With Penn's most recent Ivy championship season in 2016, Ray Priore has been a part of 12 Ivy League titles at Penn.
- The veteran of the Red and Blue coaching staff as he enters his 33rd year on the Quakers sideline in 2019. Prior to taking the helm of the Quakers in 2015, he spent the previous 16 seasons as Penn's defensive coordinator and secondaries coach, and nine as the associate head coach.
- Priore is the first Ivy League head coach since Dartmouth's Jack Crouthamel 1971-72, to win back-to-back Ivy League championships in his first two years as head coach.
- Priore's first career win as head coach was a signature one. He led his team up the Main Line to No. 4 Villanova and secured Penn's first win over the Wildcats since 1911 — also the program's first-ever road victory over a Top-5 opponent. Later in 2015, Priore would take his team to Cambridge and knock off No. 12 Harvard, 35-25, to give Penn its first season with two road wins over Top-25 opponents in its storied football history.
- While Priore spent his first 28 years as a coach on the defensive side of the ball, he has set up his team to excel on the offensive side as head coach. In 2015, the Quakers were second in the Ivy League — and 24th nationally — in scoring offense, averaging 32.9 points-per-game. First-team All-Ivy quarterback Alek Torgersen was second among all FCS signal-callers in completion percentage (69.1%) while third-team All-American, first-team All-Ivy wide receiver, and runner-up for Ivy League Offensive Player of the Year Justin Watson led the Ivy League in receptions, receiving yards, and touchdowns.
- In 2009, Priore finished as runner-up for the National Coordinator of the Year award after guiding Penn's defense to the top of the FCS. Penn finished the season ranked No. 1 in the nation in total defense, allowing just 217.6 yards per game. The Quakers were also tops in the country in scoring defense as the only team in the country that gave up less than 10 points per game (9.6). The 2009 season marked the fewest points allowed by a Penn defense in a 10-game season since 1927. During one stretch, Penn's defense held opponents scoreless for 183 minutes, 42 seconds. A span of more than 12 quarters without giving up a single point. The Quakers, who also led the Ivy League in every major defensive category, finished in the top 10 in the nation in eight defensive categories.
- Priore resides in Mt. Laurel, N.J., with his daughter, Jenna.



NCAA Record

No program in the history of college football—at any level—has played more games than Penn. Every time they play, the Quakers set an NCAA record. Saturday’s game will be the 1,397th in the Red and Blue’s illustrious history. Penn is one of only seven programs to pass 1,300 games, and was the first to hit that mark on Oct. 31, 2009 in an overtime win at Brown.

Penn Scoring Trend at Home

Home is where the points are. Penn has gone 146 consecutive games at home without being shut out. The last time the Quakers were scoreless at home was a 24-0 loss to Dartmouth on Nov. 18, 1989.

Leading Indicators

Penn has protected leads as well as anyone in the country under Ray Priore. The Red and Blue are 23-2 when leading at halftime, and 24-1 when leading at the end of the third quarter. Priore had won his first 13 games when leading at the half and first 15 with a lead after three quarters before an overtime loss at Columbia on October 14, 2016. The only other time since 2015 that the Quakers did not protect a halftime lead was Week One this season when the Red and Blue led, 21-7, at No. 20 Delaware. Priore’s teams are 11-0 at home when leading at the half and 11-0 at Franklin Field when leading after three quarters.

Priore Powers Through the Ivy League

With a win over Dartmouth in 2016, Ray Priore became the third-fastest Ivy League head coach to record his first win over all seven League opponents. Only Ed Zubrow (Penn, 7 games in 1986) and Jordan Olivari (Yale, 7 games in 1956) swept through the Ivy League in fewer games than Priore’s eight.

Priore Primed When Facing Ivy’s Winningest Coaches

Fifth-year head coach Ray Priore is one of the shortest-tenured head coach among the eight bench bosses in the Ivy League, with just 42 total games to his credit. However, he has found early success against the two winningest-coaches in recent Ivy history — Harvard’s Tim Murphy and Columbia’s Al Bagnoli. Priore is 6-2 against the two coaches who have over 115 Ivy League wins apiece. Priore is one of only four current Ivy head coaches with a winning record in Ancient Eight play.

Look, Ma! We’re On TV!

A nation’s eyes will be on the Quakers once during the 2019 season as Penn makes an appearance on ESPNU on October 4 as part of the Ivy League’s national television deal with ESPN. Penn is 10-4 on national television appearances dating back 2015 and is 20-12 on national TV dating back to the 2008 season. In addition, five Penn games will air on regional broadcast networks to give the Quakers six total TV games this season. Eight of Penn’s ten games will air on ESPN+.

Captain Vhito

Eight-year old Vhito DeCapria (#1 on the sidelines and in our hearts!) became the first captain of Ray Priore's tenure in April of 2015, and went 2-for-2 in terms of Ivy League championships to open his career! Vhito signed his letter of intent to join and lead the Penn Football team at a press conference in the Directors Room of the Dunning Coaches Center. Vhito was diagnosed with Atypical Teratoid Rhabdoid Tumor (ATRT) in April of 2014 and has been through numerous radiation treatments since that time. ATRT is a rare cancer, but Vhito persevered through a survival rate of just 17 percent and was declared cancer free by his doctors at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia on Aug. 21, 2015. Vhito and the Quakers are part of the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation. In 2017, Vhito and the Quakers were profiled by ESPN's Julie Foudy on SportsCenter as part of "Foudy's Finds".



Vhito's Co-Captains

A pair of All-Ivy performers will serve as co-captains this season. Karekin Brooks and Sam Philippi were voted captain by their teammates. Philippi was a captain in 2018, making him the 12th Quaker in program history to be named a captain multiple times.

Penn Football And "Be The Match"

Each spring, Penn Football joins programs around the country in registering potential bone marrow donors through the "Be The Match" registration drive. In November of 2016, safety Sam Philippi was found to be a match as a potential donor. Then a sophomore, Philippi played his way to second-team All-Ivy honors before donating in early December. This summer, junior Anthony Lotti was also found to be a match and he donated bone marrow to a young woman and mother with leukemia. Anthony suffered a career-ending injury during the 2018 season, but remains with Penn Football as a student assistant. He is the fifth Penn Football player to donate bone marrow during the time Penn has participated in "Be The Match".

Penn Adds Three Coaches To Staff In 2019

There are three newcomers to the Penn coaching staff in 2019, led by new offensive coordinator Kevin Morris. The former OC at Monmouth from 2014-18, Morris was OC at Yale from 2012-13 and head coach at UMass from 2009-11. He is joined as first-year coaches on staff by Maurice (Mo) Banks who coaches outside linebackers. Banks was on staff at Georgetown from 2014-18, where he coached DBs. A Georgetown grad, Banks played for the Hoyas under current Penn defensive coordinator Bob Benson. Ryan Becker W'13 returns to his alma mater to coach tight ends. A two-time Ivy League champion quarterback for the Quakers (2010, 2012), Becker was an assistant director of operations at Penn in 2017. Most recently, he was tight ends coach at East Tennessee State.

The #UPrising Returns

Since 2015 when Ray Priore took over as head coach of the Quakers, Penn is the only Ivy League team with four consecutive winning seasons. The Red and Blue have won at least six games in all four years with Priore as head coach, and captured Ivy League titles in each of his first two seasons.

Championship Experience

Of the 44 players listed on Penn's two-deep to enter the season, 15 were a part of an Ivy League championship during their freshman seasons in 2016. Another — fifth-year safety Sam Philippi — played on Ivy title teams in 2015 and 2016. Overall, the Class of 2020 has won 19 games over its first three seasons.

Non-Conference Success

Last season saw the Quakers go 3-0 in non-conference play for the first time since 2003 and just the seventh time since 1986. In five of the seven seasons since 1986 where Penn went 3-0 in non-conference games the Quakers would go on to win an Ivy League championship.

Quakers Return Six Total All-Ivy Players

Three Quakers who earned All-Ivy honors in 2018 are joined by a trio of teammates who'd picked up the recognitions earlier in their career to give the Quakers a solid nucleus of All-Ivy players. Senior running back is a two-time All-Ivy selection who earned second-team All-Ivy honors last season. He is joined by 2018 honorable mention All-Ivy defensive backs Mohammed Diakite and Jacob Martin. Other Quakers to earn All-Ivy honors in their careers include senior safety Sam Philippi — a second-team selection in 2016 and 2017 — as well as linebacker Connor Jangro (honorable mention in 2016) and offensive lineman Greg Begnoche (honorable mention in 2017).

Something Old, Something New

Of the five offensive linemen expected to start today, three bring a wealth of experience while two are earning their second starting nod. Greg Begnoche has 20 games of starting experience at right tackle, but has slid to left tackle to replace graduated All-Ivy honoree Tommy Dennis. Next to him will be Ace Escobedo who started all 10 games last season at left guard. At right guard will be Jeff Gibbs who has played in 27 career games with 22 career starts across the line. The newcomers include right tackle Dan Beaver — who has 11 appearances as a reserve and special teamer — and center Trevor Radosevich who spent last season on the defensive side of the ball. If Trevor needed any guidance on how to adjust to the offensive line, he could ask his older brother, Reilly, who is a first-team All-Ivy tackle at Princeton.

Party In The Backfield

Through three games, the Red and Blue have 10 sacks as a team and Penn's 3.3 sacks-per-game rank No. 7 the FCS. Eight different players have at least one sack for the Quakers, with Benji Mowatt and Brian O'Neill leading the way with two apiece. O'Neill's 2.2 tackles for loss-per-game rank No. 3 in the FCS.

Time To Turn On The Turnovers

The Quakers have not forced a turnover yet this season and enter today -4 in the turnover department. The Quakers will be looking to Conor O'Brien (6 career interceptions) and Sam Philippi (6 interceptions and four fumble recoveries) to help fill the quota on defense.

O'Neill On The Mark

Junior middle linebacker had 2.5 sacks through his first 21 career games heading into Week Two at Lafayette. Against the Leopards, he dialed up two solo sacks to almost match his career high. His six tackles for loss lead the Ivy League and his 2.2 TFLs per game are No. 3 in the country.

Release The Cragun

Sophomore Ryan Cragun has caught 16 passes for 273 yards over his first two varsity starts. Cragun has gone over 100 yards in each of Penn's first two games after the Quakers only produced one 100-yard receiver in a game all of last season. Cragun is the first Quaker to go over 100 yards in consecutive games since Justin Watson '18 did so in three straight games from 10/21-11/4 in 2017. Cragun's receiving yardage total through two games this season would have ranked No. 3 among Penn receivers last season. Because I know what you're wondering, all-everything wide receiver Justin Watson '18 had 3 catches for 21 yards in his first career game at Jacksonville in 2014 and did not have a 100-yard game until his 11th career appearance. Watson, of course, went on to record an Ivy League record 19 100-yard games.

Ragin' Cragun

Cragun's 136.5 yards-per-game lead the Ivy League and rank No. 2 among FCS receivers. His 8.0 receptions-per-game also lead the Ivy League and are No. 9 among FCS wideouts.

Third Down Thoughts

Penn enters the week ranked No. 20 in the country in third down conversions, converting on 20-for-44 for 46%. Opponents are 17-for-43 on third down (40%).

Fourth Down Fun

The Quakers were 1-for-2 on fourth down conversion attempts in Week One at Delaware, the one successful fourth down play a 12-yard touchdown pass from Nick Robinson to Kolton Huber on 4th-and-1 in the third quarter. That was Penn's first 4th down attempt of the season, and was Penn's first conversion on 4th down since 2017 — Penn was 0-for-8 on fourth down last season. Overall in 2019, Penn is 5-for-9 on fourth downs (56%) with two touchdowns on fourth down —including a 43-yard Karekin Brooks run in Week Three against Dartmouth.

Line Leading The Way

The Quakers did not concede a sack in Week One, and have only allowed four over three games (1.3 per game) which ranks No. 3 in the Ivy League. On the flip side, the Quakers have recorded 10 sacks through three games, ranking No. 7 in the nation in sacks-per-game (3.3). Brian O'Neill and Benji Mowatt are both tied for No. 42 among FCS defenders with 0.67 sacks-per-game.

Zach Attack

Senior linebacker Zach Evans has 28 total tackles in three games this season after totaling 39 in 12 appearances over the previous two seasons combined. He has 12 tackles against Dartmouth, and his 6.3 solo tackles-per-game rank No. 7 in the country while his 9.3 total tackles-per-game rank No. 31.

Red (Zone) Alert

Penn enters the week 7-for-9 on red zone opportunities, with touchdowns on all seven scoring drives inside the red zone. Converseley, Penn has allowed a touchdown all seven times an opponent has crossed into the red zone. Penn's last red zone stop came against Princeton in 2018 when the Tigers were held to a missed 28-yard field goal attempt on their first drive of the game. Since then, opposing teams are 13-for-13 in the red zone with 13 touchdowns. The last time an opponent turned the ball over on downs in the red zone was when Dartmouth did so on 4th-and-1 from the Penn 5 in 2018. Penn's last turnover forced in the red zone came against Yale in 2018, when the Quakers forced a fumble on the 1-yard line. Penn would then march 99 yards for a TD.

About the Pioneers

Sacred Heart started their season with a loss at No. 7 Maine before rattling off three consecutive wins. Their winning streak was halted last time out against CCSU for the Pioneer's first NEC loss of the season.

THE OFFENSE: The Pioneers do a good job protecting the quarterback, allowing just 0.4 sacks-per-game which ranks No. 6 in the nation. SHU is also No. 4 in tackles-for-loss allowed (3.2). Behind grad transfer Logan Marchi, the passing attack is averaging 265 yards a game (No. 31 in the nation) while Marchi himself is No. 10 among FCS QBs. Sophomore Julius Chestnut is No. 10 in the nation in rushing yards-per-game (108.4) and is averaging 5.5 yards-per-carry.

THE DEFENSE: Sacred Heart has allowed 445.2 yards-per-game which is No. 96 out of 124 FCS teams. The bulk of that yardage has come through the air where SHU has allowed 291.6 yards-per-game (No. 110 in the nation).

THE SPECIAL TEAMS: Kezio Snelling has racked up 393 yards of combined kick returns, and is averaging 24.6 yards on kickoff returns. As a team, SHU is 2-for-4 on FGs, with a long of 32. Noah Gettman is averaging 38.4 yards-per-punt.

THE HEAD COACH: Head coach Mark Nofri is in his eighth season with the Pioneers and has won three NEC titles (2013, 2014, 2018) and is a three-time NEC Coach of the Year. He started at SHU as defensive backs coach in 1994.

The University of Pennsylvania football team went toe-to-toe with No. 20 Delaware, coming up one point short in a 28-27 loss to the Blue Hens that served notice to Ivy League football fans.

The Quakers (0-1) outgained the Blue Hens (3-1), 462-360, and were especially dominant on the ground where the Red and Blue amassed 269 yards to Delaware's 100.

If there was any questions about the mindset and attitude of the Quakers this season, they were answered when Isaiah Malcome took a Delaware punt 69 yards to the house for a touchdown to bring the Quakers within one with 2:24 to play. The offense went on the field, looking for the 2-point conversion and the lead. Nick Robinson's pass was just short to Karekin Brooks and the Blue Hens gained the one first down needed after a failed onside kick attempt by Penn and held on.

The Malcome punt return sparked a Penn team which had seen a 21-7 lead turn into a 28-21 deficit with 7:36 remaining in the game. A pair of Nolan Henderson third-quarter touchdown passes had tied the game, 21-21, and a Will Knight six-yard touchdown run had given Delaware its first lead since a 7-0 advantage just 2:29 into the game.

After Delaware touchdown, Penn had an apparent 3rd-and-9 conversion called back for an illegal shift, and the Quakers eventually punted to the Delaware 19. Adan Conyer eventually would haul down Henderson for a 12 yard loss and force the Blue Hens to punt.

Malcome would take that punt at his own 31, shake by the first man and then blow through the remainder of the defense for Penn's first punt return for a touchdown since 2010 to setup the deciding two-point play.

In his first start since 2017, Robinson was 18-for-27 for 193 yards and three touchdowns. His three touchdown passes helped the Quakers turn a 7-0 deficit into a 21-7 lead early in the third quarter.

Karekin Brooks ran 28 times for 158 yards, averaging 5.6 yard a rush. In addition to his 69-yard punt, Malcome ran nine times for 73 yards and caught one pass - a 1-yard touchdown in the second quarter.

Ryan Cragun made quite the impression in his first varsity game as the sophomore caught eight passes for 145 yards. Senior Kolton Huber caught three passes - two of them for touchdowns.

Defensively, Mohammed Diakite was busy in the secondary with 11 tackles. David Ryslik had seven tackles and a sack, while Adam Conyer had six tackles and a sack for a loss of 12 yards.

Lafayette (0-5) drew first blood on Saturday, taking the opening kickoff and driving 46 yards to Penn's 25-yard line. From there, Jeffrey Kordenbrock kicked a 43-yard field goal and the Leopards led, 3-0. Those were the only points in a quick first quarter.

Penn (1-1) had a chance to draw level early in the second quarter, but David Perkins' 39-yard field goal was blocked and Lafayette took over. It only delayed the inevitable. On the Quakers' next drive, they drove 76 yards over nine plays and took a 7-3 lead when Nick Robinson rolled out to the right and found Ryan Cragun for a four-yard touchdown pass.

Lafayette came right back and re-took the lead with a seven-play, 74-yard drive that ended with Keegan Shoemaker hitting Zadok Scott down the left sideline for a 29-yard score.

Penn immediately responded. With the clock winding down on the first half, the Quakers took 13 plays to drive 71 yards and took a 14-10 lead into the half when Robinson found Cragun in the left corner of the end zone for their second touchdown connection of the day. The third quarter was scoreless, with Penn avoiding trouble late in the period when Robinson hit Rory Starkey, Jr. for a 53-yard gain that took the Quakers from their own 1-yard line into Lafayette territory. The drive stalled after that, but that play nevertheless paid dividends as the Quakers punted and downed the ball on Lafayette's 3-yard line.

With the field effectively flipped, the Leopards went three-and-out and then punted to Sam Philippi who made a fair catch at the Lafayette 42. The Quakers quickly took advantage of the short field, Robinson hitting Tyler Herrick for 25 yards on the first play to get them into the red zone. Six plays later, Karekin Brooks fielded a snap in the Wildcat formation and ran it in behind the right side of the line for a 21-10 Penn lead.

After another defensive stop, it looked like Penn would put this game to bed on its next possession as the Red and Blue used pure power—10 rushing plays—to drive 72 yards and knock more than seven minutes off the clock. However, on second-and-goal Brooks was stripped of the ball and Lafayette recovered and advanced it to its 20-yard line.

Before you knew it, Lafayette had gone 80 yards and was in the end zone. The Leopards then converted a two-point conversion—hello, Philly Special—and this was a three-point game (21-18) with 2:04 left. The drive took less than two minutes and was helped by a late-hit penalty on the defense and a 44-yard Shoemaker pass play to Quinn Revere.

With the game suddenly in the balance, Brooks atoned and single-handedly salted this game away. On Penn's first play from scrimmage, the senior went for 40 yards which put the ball in Lafayette territory. Two plays later, he hammered the final nail in the coffin by going up the gut and through the Leopard defense for 31 yards to paydirt.

On a night when the University celebrated 125 years of Franklin Field, the University of Pennsylvania football team fell to Dartmouth, 28-15.

To celebrate the occasion, Penn (1-2) busted out red jerseys and red helmets, a look that hadn't been seen around these parts since the 1970s. Unfortunately, it was Dartmouth (3-0) that walked out of the historic venue with the victory. Friday night's game, which was televised to a national audience on ESPNU, was the Ivy League opener for both teams.

After a defensive stop, Penn's opening drive showed promise, the Quakers driving from their 17-yard line to Dartmouth's 33 before stalling. David Perkins then attempted a 49-yard field goal which had the distance but not the accuracy, skirting wide right to keep the game scoreless. Dartmouth's second drive didn't last long, but it didn't need to. On just the second play, Jared Gerbino faked a handoff to Zack Bair, who then took off around the left side of the line on a wheel route. No Penn players followed him, and Gerbino couldn't miss the wide-open back for a 57-yard scoring play. Dartmouth doubled its lead in sudden fashion late in the first quarter, Penn fumbling on its own 26-yard line and the Big Green's Jack Traynor picking it up and running it in untouched.

Penn got on the board quickly in the second quarter. On fourth-and-2 at Dartmouth's 43-yard line, Karekin Brooks broke through the line and shook off one final tackler before scampering into the end zone. The touchdown run was the first conceded by the Big Green in four games, and the longest rushing touchdown against Dartmouth's defense since the 2016 season.

Dartmouth came right back, though. The Big Green needed just nine plays to march 75 yards, Bair carrying the ball around the left end for the final 17 yards to make the score 21-7. That's how the half ended.

The third quarter was scoreless, before Dartmouth went on a long fourth-quarter drive that basically put this game to bed. The Big Green used 15 plays to drive 84 yards and took 8:24 off the fourth-quarter clock before Gerbino ran through the left side of the line to paydirt with 3:57 to play.

Forced to play catch-up, Penn rolled quickly down the field. Using just six plays and 1:42 of game time to cover 75 yards, the Quakers got in the end zone when Brooks ran it up the gut for two yards for his second score of the night. The Red and Blue then converted a two-point conversion, making the score 28-15 with 2:15 to play. Penn used an onside kick after that and it was successful, the Quakers recovering in Big Green territory. However, the Quakers' drive stalled at Dartmouth's 21-yard line as an Eric Markes catch on 4th-and-23 was two yards short in the final minute and the visitors ran out the clock.

Brooks finished the night with 91 yards rushing, and he also caught 10 passes to lead the Quakers in that category. Nick Robinson completed 27 of his 39 throws on the night for 209 yards, spreading the ball around to eight different receivers.
