THE SERIES

- This is the first meeting between the Quakers and the Tigers in men's hoops.
- In fact, this trip to the Show-Me State is just the second in program history, the other coming December 2, 1995 when the Quakers lost at Saint Louis, 58-51.
- Penn is 7-18 overall against current SEC programs, including a loss at Arkansas last year. That said, the Quakers went to Alabama to open the 2019-20 season and beat the Crimson Tide, 81-80, in head coach Nat Oats' 'Bama debut.

A BIT ABOUT US

• Penn won the Philadelphia Big 5 title in 2019 with a 4-0 record. The historic city rivalry consists of La Salle, Penn, Saint Joseph's, Temple and Villanova playing a round-robin schedule with each other every year. A common question: What about Drexel? The answer: When the Big 5 was formed in the 1950s, Drexel was a Division 2 program.

• Penn has won 26 Ivy League titles, played in 24 NCAA Tournamentsmost recently in 2018-and is tied with Princeton for most NCAA wins among Ancient Eight programs (13).

NOTES FROM MONDAY

- Junior Jordan Dingle scored 16 points.
- Sophomore **George Smith** was the only other Quakers player to reach double figures, with 10 points, and he also grabbed six rebounds.
- Senior Max Lorca-Lloyd nearly had a double-double with career highs in points (9) and rebounds (14, including six on the offensive boards); he also had three blocked shots.
- Sophomore Eddie Holland III had a solid shooting night, hitting three of his four attempts and finishing with nine points which is more than he scored all of last season (4).

- 2 All-Ivy players back across the league in 2022-23: Princeton's Tosan Evbuomwan and Penn's **Jordan** Dingle.
- 2 Penn players with international playing experience: seniors Max Lorca-Lloyd (Chile) and Michael Moshkovitz (Israel). Of note, Moshkovitz started every game when Israel won the 2018 FIBA Under-20 European Championship in Germany, the first gold medal by an Israeli team at a FIBA event.
- **3** 2022-23 non-conference opponents who were picked in the preseason to win their respective leagues: Iona (MAAC), Towson (CAA), and Colgate (Patriot League). Penn was picked by the Ivy League media to win the Ancient Eight.
- 4 Players in program history who scored more points in their first two seasons than **Dingle** (880): Ernie Beck (1,154), Keven McDonald (1,021), Ron Haigler (947), and Stan Pawlak (922).
- 4 Ivy League Rookie of the Week honors won last season by junior Clark Slajchert (3) and sophomore George Smith (1); sophomores like Slajchert were eligible for the award last season because there was no 2020-21 season due to COVID-19.

- **6** 30-point games registered by **Dingle** last year, tied for the most in a season in program history (Beck, 1951-52); in fact, the six games put Dingle fourth on the program's list of CAREER 30-point games behind only Beck (13), McDonald (8) and Pawlak (7).
- 9 Returning players who had at least two double-figure scoring games in 2021-22, led by **Dingle** (23), **Slajchert** (15), and junior **Max Martz** (12).
- 9 Returnees who made at least one start in 2021-22, led by **Dingle** who started all 26 games in which he played. The other returnees who had double-figure start totals last year are **Martz** (22), **Moshkovitz** (16), senior **Jonah Charles** (14) and **Smith** (11), while Lucas Monroe made nine starts.
- 20.8 Dingle's points-per-game average last season, seventh on Penn's single-season list and highest by a Quakers player since Keven McDonald averaged 22.3 ppg as a senior in 1977-78.
- 25 Points scored by sophomore Nick Spinoso in Penn's last two games against Yale last season, including 14 in the Ivy League Tournament; he had three points combined in the rest of the Quakers' Ivy League games.

- **43** Points scored by **Slajchert** in the two games missed by Dingle last season; Slajchert stepped into Dingle's starting spot at Arkansas and Dartmouth, scoring 25 points against the Razorbacks and 18 vs. the Big Green to lead Penn on both occasions.
- **53** Three-point baskets hit by **Charles** last season, good for second on the team behind only Dingle (66); of note, however, was that the senior only had six two-point baskets.
- **88.5** Percentage of Penn's points that return from last season (1,785 of 2,017); that includes the Quakers' top four scorers in **Dingle** (20.8 ppg), **Slajchert** (10.7), **Martz** (10.0) and **Charles** (6.7).

2022-23 Schedule Notes

- Penn will play ten games in the month of November.
- Penn opened the season with its first-ever trip to Iona. In fact, the four previous meetings between these two programs had all been neutralsite affairs, the first at the 1979 NCAA Tournament—the start of Penn's run to the Final Four— and the most recent in the 1998 ECAC Holiday Festival at Madison Square Garden.
- Penn has two first-time opponents on its schedule: Missouri and Wilkes. In fact, Penn's trip to the Show-Me State on November 11 will be just the program's second, the other coming December 2, 1995 when the Quakers lost at Saint Louis, 58-51.
- Penn will make the shortest trip in NCAA Division I basketball on November 15 when they travel 0.4 miles (per Google Maps) from The Palestra to the Daskalakis Athletic Center to play Drexel. In that game, head coach Steve Donahue will match wits with his longtime assistant at Cornell, Zach Spiker.
- Penn's trip to West Virginia on November 18 will be just its second to Morgantown to play the Mountaineers. The other came in 1981, the Quakers losing 67-64 to WVU in the only NIT appearance in program history.
- Penn will play in the inaugural Cathedral Classic, a four-team event that will take place at The Palestra over

Thanksgiving Weekend. The Quakers will play Hartford on Friday, Nov. 25; Colgate on Saturday, Nov. 26; and Delaware on Sunday, Nov. 27.

- Penn will actually play Hartford twice this season, also meeting the Hawks in the Nutmeg State on January 23. The last time Penn played a non-lvy team twice in the same season was 2001-02 (Saint Joseph's).
- Penn will once again play all four of its Big 5 games over an 11-day span, starting on November 30 when Saint Joseph's comes to The Palestra. (That night will actually be just the seventh true Big 5 doubleheader in Palestra history, with La Salle hosting Temple in the first game.)
- In addition to coaching against Zach Spiker, Coach Donahue also will match wits this season against two former Penn players of his, Mike Jordan (Lafayette) and Matt Langel (Colgate), as well as the man who brought him to Penn, Fran Dunphy (La Salle).
- For the second straight season, the Ivy League is going with a 10-week schedule that, for Penn, starts at Brown on Monday, Jan. 2. This schedule includes only three of the Friday/ Saturday doubleheaders that were staples of the old Ivy schedule for decades. (Five of Penn's first six Ivy games this season will be on the road.)

#IvyMadness, Year 5

The fifth edition of the Ivy League Tournament will take place March 11-12 at Princeton's Jadwin Gym. The top four regular-season finishers will descend upon Princeton for the semifinals on Saturday, with the final to determine the League's NCAA Tournament bid on Sunday. All three games will air on the ESPN family of networks. The first two Ivy League Tournaments, in 2017 and 2018, were hosted by Penn at the historic Palestra.

STEVE DONAHUE, JOHN R. ROCKWELL HEAD COACH



PASSION. GRATITUDE. UNITY. COMPETITIVENESS. HUMILITY.

Now in his eighth year and seventh season as the John R. Rockwell Head Coach of the University of Pennsylvania men's basketball program, these are the five core values that Steve Donahue has established for the players, coaches and staff affiliated with the program that are under his stewardship.

Steve Donahue was introduced as the John R. Rockwell Head Coach of Men's Basketball on March 17, 2015 as the 20th head coach in program history.

Donahue is the only person in Ivy League history to lead two different programs to conference championships, Cornell (2008, 2009, 2010) and Penn (2018). In addition, he is one of just seven coaches in Ancient Eight history to win 100 conference games—he finished the 2019-20 season with 116 total—and the only one among those seven to do it at two different schools (78 at Cornell, 38 at Penn)

Donahue's third year at Penn was one of the most memorable in the program's illustrious history. The Quakers went 24-9 overall, the most wins since the 2001-02 team had 25. In Ivy League play, Penn went 12-2 during the regular season and clinched a share of its first Ancient Eight title since 2006-07. Following the regular season, the Red and Blue defeated Yale and then co-champion Harvard in the Ivy League Tournament to earn the program's first NCAA Tournament bid since 2007. The Quakers traveled to Wichita, Kan., where they fell to top-seeded Kansas, 76-60.

After the season, Donahue was named Ivy League Coach of the Year, NABC District 13 Coach of the Year, and ECAC Coach of the Year.

The Quakers followed that up by going a perfect 4-0 against their Philadelphia Big 5 foes in 2018-19, including a 78-75 win over No. 17 Villanova that snapped the Wildcats' record 25-game win streak in Big 5 play. It was the first time Penn went 4-0 in Big 5 play since 2001-02 and just the second time since 1973-74.

Donahue's hiring marked a return to Penn for the Delaware County native; he was an assistant coach for the Quakers under Fran Dunphy from 1990-91 until 1999-2000. During that 10-year span, Penn won six Ivy League titles—including four separate undefeated conference campaigns—and compiled a 182-91 overall record that included a 114-26 mark in Ivy play.

Donahue left Penn to become head coach at Cornell ahead of the 2000-01 season. He stayed in Ithaca for 10 years, gradually building the Big Red program up until the table was set for a three-year run that included a trio of Ivy League titles; a 72-21 overall record that included a 38-4 Ivy mark; and three NCAA Tournament appearances that included a run to the Sweet 16 in 2010. Donahue was the Clair Bee National Coach of the Year and National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 4 Coach of the Year in 2009-10; and the NABC District 4 Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District II Coach of the Year in 2007-08, when his team went 14-0 in Ivy League play to become just the third program in Ancient Eight history to achieve an unbeaten conference season (also Penn and Princeton).

While at Cornell, Donahue coached and/or recruited seven of the school's top 13 all-time leading scorers; two Ivy League Player of the Year selections; two Ivy League Rookie of the Year selections; eight NABC All-District selections; six Academic All-District players; and two Academic All-Americans.

Following that Sweet 16 campaign, Donahue left Cornell to become head coach at Boston College. He spent four years at The Heights, going 21-13 his first season and getting the Eagles to the NIT. In 2012-13, Olivier Hanlan was the consensus ACC Rookie of the Year.

Prior to his arrival at Penn for the 1990-91 season, Donahue was an assistant under legendary coach Herb Magee at Philadelphia University for two seasons and helped the Rams to a pair of 20-win seasons and the NCAA Division II Tournament. Before that, Donahue was as an assistant for current Lafayette head coach Fran O'Hanlon at Monsignor Bonner High School, helping guide Bonner to a Catholic League title. He began his coaching career at Springfield (Pa.) HS.

A 1984 Ursinus College graduate, Donahue was a four-year letter man in basketball and baseball for the Bears and captain of the basketball team as a senior. His freshman season, Donahue helped the hoops team finish 23-8 and advance to the NCAA Division III Tournament semifinal round. His sophomore year, the Bears were NCAA quarterfinalists.

Donahue and his wife, Pamela, have four children: Taylor, Matthew, Katie and Jack.

Twos, Threes, and Frees

In a Philadelphia Daily News article published in September 2015, Coach Donahue explained his offensive philosophy thusly: "I want to get a layup or a dunk. When I'm attacking the basket, I ask my guys, 'Are you 95 percent certain that you're going to make this or get fouled?' If they're not, there are mechanisms in place to find my second thing: a standstill, in-rhythm three. The third thing is a post-up with two feet in the lane, one on one. If you get that, great; if not, it should be kicked. So everything we do evolves from that."

With that in mind, we decided to chart the number of two-point field-goal attempts, three-point field-goal attempts, and foul shots that Penn has taken this season as well as the field-goal breakdown throughout Donahue's career as head coach.

The only schools with better win percentages during that decade were UCLA (273-27, .910) and Marquette (252-40, .863). UNC was fourth (.786), while Kentucky was fifth (.764).

• Penn was a part of arguably the most famous Final Four in history?

The Quakers joined Magic Johnson's Michigan State team and Larry Bird's Indiana State team in Provo, Utah, that year. Penn was beaten by the Spartans in the semifinal round. The fourth team in that Final Four? Mark Agguire's DePaul team, which beat Penn 96-93 in overtime in the consolation game.

• Penn's 1970-71 team holds a unique distinction in the annals of college basketball? That Quaker squad went 28-1 overall, losing in the NCAA Tournament East Regional final to Villanova. The Wildcats would later vacate the win due to the use of an ineligible player in the game. Thus, in the NCAA's eyes, Penn's record that vear is 28-0—making them the only "undefeated" team in history to play in the NCAA Tournament but not win it. (There have been undefeated teams that did NOT play in the NCAA Tournament, most notably Kentucky in 1953-54 and N.C. State in 1972-73.)

- Penn is one of just two teams to defeat the University of North Carolina in an NCAA Tournament game played in the state of North Carolina? On March 11, 1979, the ninth-seeded Quakers defeated the top-seeded Tar Heels, 72-71, in an East Regional second-round game played at Reynolds Coliseum in Raleigh. (That day is known by fans on Tobacco Road as "Black Sunday," as second-seeded Duke also lost at Reynolds, to St. John's.) UNC's only other loss in its 35 other in-state NCAA Tournament games came on March 18, 2018, an 86-65 loss to Texas A&M.
- Penn holds the second-longest conference winning streak in NCAA Division I history? The Quakers won 48 straight Ivy League games from 1992-96, including three straight 14-0 seasons in 1992-93, 1993-94 and 1994-95. The overall record for conference wins is held by UCLA, which won 50 straight Pac-8 games from 1971-74.
- Penn's 1919-20 and 1920-21 teams were considered national champions?

The 1919-20 Quakers went 20-0 during the regular season, clinching the EIL title with a four-overtime win over Princeton (tied for the most OTs played in program history). Penn then met the Western champion, the University of Chicago, in a best-of-three series to determine the national champion and won the series 2-1. The 1920-21 team went 21-2 overall, the only losses coming by a point at Cornell and by two points vs. Penn State. Both of those Quakers teams were retroactively named national champion by the Helms Athletic Foundation.

- Penn's home court, The Palestra, has hosted 48 NCAA Tournament games? The first were the East Regional in the tournament's first year, 1939. The most recent took place in 1984, when Penn hosted an opening-round tripleheader. The Palestra also hosted the last Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (A.I.A.W.) national championship game, in 1982, as Rutgers beat Texas, 83-77. The following year, the NCAA took over the women's basketball
- Four former Penn players are currently Division I head coaches? They are Mike Jordan (Lafayette), Matt Langel (Colgate), Fran McCaffery (Iowa), and Andrew Toole (Robert Morris).

national championship.

- When Penn beat Delaware State on December 27, 2017, the Quakers set an NCAA Division 1 record? Penn had 10 different players hit three-pointers in the 105-52 win at The Palestra, breaking the previous mark of nine set three times, first by Dartmouth in 1993 and most recently by Michigan in 2008.
- Hall of Fame coach Chuck Daly was once the head coach at Penn? Before he won a pair of NBA titles as head coach of the Detroit Pistons in 1989 and 1990, and before he headed up the "Dream Team" at the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona, Daly spent six years at the Quaker helm, going 125-38 (including a 74-10 lvy League mark) and winning four lvy titles.
