The Dartmouth Series

Saturday marks the 90th meeting between Penn and Dartmouth and is the first matchup since 2018 to not be played on a Friday night. The Quakers lead the all-time series, 49-38-2 dating back to 1896. Last year, the Red and Blue snapped a four-game losing streak to the Big Green with a 23-17, double-overtime victory in Hanover on national television. That kickstarted the first of three consecutive Ivy League victories on the year. The last time these two teams met in Philadelphia, Penn fell to Dartmouth, 31-7, under the lights on ESPNU.

We'll Miss You, Coach Teevens

Longtime Dartmouth head coach Buddy Teevens passed away on Tuesday, Sept. 19 at the age of 66 due to injuries sustained from a bicycle accident in March. A former Ivy League Player of the Year for the Big Green in 1978, Teevens was a head football coach for more than 30 years, including 22 in Hanover, winning Ivy titles in 1990, 1991, 2015, 2019 and 2021.

Ivy Opener

Though not the first conference game of the year for all teams in the Ancient Eight, Saturday marks the first for both Penn and Dartmouth, both looking to get off on the right foot to start the year. Since **Ray Priore** took over as head coach prior to the 2015 season, the Quakers are 2-5 in Ivy openers against the Big Green. The Red and Blue will be looking for their first home victory over Dartmouth in the Priore era when the two teams square off Saturday.

Preseason Predictions

When the Ivy League announced its preseason poll in early August, all eyes were on Penn, as the Quakers were picked third with 90 voting points. Dartmouth was picked to finish sixth with 54 points. Yale was selected to repeat as Ivy League champion with 122 points and 13 first-place votes. Last season, Penn finished in a tie for second place with Princeton, while Dartmouth was tied for sixth with Cornell following a 2-5 campaign.

Beating The Bison

Penn is once again 2-0 to start a campaign following a dominant, 37-21 victory at Bucknell Saturday afternoon in Lewisburg. The victory, the Quakers' ninth straight over the Bison since 2003, was guided by 515 total yards of offense and a rush defense that surrendered just eight yards on the ground on the afternoon. Strong-armed by **Sayin's** career performance under center—35 completions for 354 yards and three touchdowns—Penn scored 20 third-quarter points to cruise to a comfortable victory. Senior defensive lineman **Joey Slackman** had an impressive day, totaling five tackles with a career-high 3.5 tackles-for-loss.

Last Meeting With Dartmouth

You might call last season's matchup with the Big Green an "instant classic," because it certainly felt like one. Penn left it all out on the field in a 23-17, double-overtime victory in Hanover last September in a game that pitted the Quakers against the two-time defending Ivy League champions. Trailing 10-7 in the closing seconds of the fourth

quarter in a scoring drive orchestrated by quarterback **Aidan Sayin**, kicker **Graham Gotlieb** booted a 35-yard field goal through the uprights to send the contest to OT at 10-10. A Sayin TD pass to **Joshua Casilli** gave Penn a 17-10 lead and in the second overtime, Grant Ristoff blocked a field goal attempt and Trey Flowers leaped over the pile to give the Red and Blue the game-winning score.

Weekly Honors

You may have wondered if we forgot to mention someone in the previous bullet point. We didn't. Sophomore wide receiver **Jared Richardson** has been nothing short of amazing through his first two career starts as a critical part of the passing game, catching 12 passes—tied for a single-game NCAA FCS high—for 139 yards and two touchdowns in the Quakers' victory at Bucknell on Saturday. As a result, he was named Ivy League Offensive Player of the Week on Monday afternoon. Through two games, Richardson has a team-high 19 grabs for 201 yards and three TDs. He's the first Penn player to earn Offensive Player of the Week honors since **Sayin** after the final game of last season and the first wideout since Justin Watson on Nov. 6, 2017 to win the award.

Red and Blue Rush Defense

We mentioned earlier that the Quakers allowed just eight yards of rushing offense Saturday at Bucknell. Through the first two games of the year, Penn has the nation's top run defense (34.0 ypg) and the fifth-best scoring defense (13.5 ppg) in NCAA FCS football. A big part of that defense has been Slackman, who ranks second in the country in TFLs per game with 2.5, also leading the Ivy League in that category.

Preseason All-Ivy

Twelve Penn players earned Preseason All-Ivy selection by Phil Steele in early August including first-team honorees **Key, Kendren Smith** and **Julien Stokes**. A 2022 first-team All-Ivy pick, Smith, along with Key will play a large role in anchoring the Penn defense this season. The second team was made up of eight Quakers—**Joshua Casilli, Jake Ligos, Jack Purcell, Micah Morris, Joey Slackman, Jack Fairman, Jonathan Melvin** and **Gotlieb**—while **Sayin** earned a spot on the third team.

Hey, Coach!

Head Coach **Ray Priore** has one new face on the coaching staff as **Sean Reeder** takes over as tight ends coach for the 2023 season. Reeder joins the Quakers following six seasons on staff at Ithaca, the first five working with the offensive line before he was promoted to the role of offensive coordinator in 2022. Prior to his stint with the Bombers, Reeder spent two years at Division II Wayne State before working as a tight ends and offensive line coach at California Lutheran. As a student-athlete, Reeder was a key member of the offensive line at Johns Hopkins, where he graduated with a degree in biomedical engineering in 2013.

Oh Captain, Our Captains

Following a team vote, Priore named five captains for the 2023 Quakers including a familiar face to the leadership group. For the second straight year, **Melvin** was voted a co-captain, while **Casilli, Sayin, Slackman** and **Kendren Smith** will join him for the coin toss at the beginning of each game this season.

P LAST GAME RECAP



Game 2: Penn 37, Bucknell 21 September 23, 2023 | Lewisburg, Pa.

HAMILTON, N.Y. – Guided by 515 yards of total offense and a stout rush defense which held Bucknell to just eight yards on the ground, the University of Pennsylvania football team exploded for 20 third-quarter points to come away with a 37-21 victory over the Bison at rain-soaked Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium.

Penn started with the ball and had a nice drive to Bucknell's 32-yard line before things stalled out. The Quakers surprised the Bison with a quick-kick, Sayin doing his best punter impression as he pinned the ball on Bucknell's 3-yard line.

Bucknell went three-and-out, punted from the shadow of its goalpost, and Penn's second drive started right at midfield. This time the Quakers needed just four plays to find paydirt as Sayin aired it out to Malone Howley (17 yards) and Jared Richardson (22), then tossed an eight-yard screen to Alex Haight who followed a nice block and tucked inside the left pylon for his first collegiate touchdown.

Bucknell's defense was bend-but-don't-break in the second quarter, as Penn had two lengthy drives but only found three points from them. The Quakers' first drive of the period started at their 27 and went all the way to the Bison's 17, but went for naught as Graham Gotlieb's field-goal attempt missed. Bucknell then went three-and-out, and Penn had a 12-play drive that ended with Gotlieb splitting the uprights from 18 yards after the Quakers decided not to go for a fourth-and-1 at Bucknell's 1-yard line. Penn clung to a 10-0 lead at the half.

The Red and Blue got the second half started strong on a 22-yard completion from Sayin to Casilli then focusing mainly on the run game again, turning to backup quarterback Liam O'Brien in the red zone. The sophomore converted on a two-yard sneak to give the Quakers a 17-0 lead following the Gotlieb PAT.

After the Penn defense forced the sixth Bucknell punt of the contest with eight minutes to go in the quarter, Sayin ran into some trouble in throwing his second pick of the day to set up favorable field position for the Bison offense. Bucknell used the opportunity to its advantage, converting a deep pass down the middle for 40 yards and the touchdown to get on the board, making it 17-7.

Just one drive later, the Quaker offense went to work quickly down the field with a two-play, 43-yard drive capped by Sayin's 18-yard heave to Richardson for the score, giving the Red and Blue a 23-7 edge with 5:07 left in the frame.

Richardson made one of the catches of the day on Penn's next offensive drive, as Sayin completed a pass out short to the wideout for a first down and then another deep down the sideline to the sophomore 40 yards and the score. It was Richardson's second touchdown of the day as Penn led 30-7 heading into the fourth quarter.

Trailing by 23 and looking for a positive outcome to begin the fourth quarter, the Bison drove down the field 79 yards on eight plays resulting in a 31-yard touchdown pass from Rucker to Weatherly, cutting into the Penn lead, now 30-14.

After Albert Jang had to punt on fourth down with 10:22 to play in the game, Penn's defense went back to work swarming Rucker in the pocket, as Paul Jennings and Isaiah Jordan sacked the QB to set up a third-and-long, in which the Bison offense could not overcome.

The Quakers' next drive started with a pair of long rushes by Mulatu (for 18 yards) and Isaac Shabay (for 10 yards), which set up the passing game again as Sayin aired it out 21 yards to Richardson back down to the Bucknell 21-yard line. Mulatu pounded the ball four consecutive times and marched into the end zone on a one-yard carry to extend the lead to 37-14 with 2:47 to play.

Bucknell was able to cut back into the Penn lead with a 10-play, 78-yard touchdown drive to close the game as the score was deemed final at 37-21 following an onside-kick attempt and the Quaker victory formation.

"I thought we got better from last week. We hit on some key things during the week in practice including our offensive consistency and our ability to run the football. Once again, we spread the ball out amongst many receivers and our defense came back to where they left off from Colgate. We made some big plays in the second half and really stifled the run. - 2015 Ivy League Coach of the Year
 - 2015, 2022 STATS FCS National Coach of the Year finalist
 - Officially took over as the 22nd George A. Munger Head Coach of Football on December 1, 2014.
- A veteran of the Red and Blue coaching staff as he enters his 36th season on the Quakers sideline in 2023. Prior to taking the helm of the Quakers in 2015, he spent 16 seasons as Penn's defensive coordinator and secondaries coach and nine as the program's Associate Head Coach.
- The first Ivy League coach to win back-to-back Ivy League championships in each of his first two years as head coach since Dartmouth's Jake Crouthamel (1971-72).
 - His first career win as head coach was a signature one, as Priore led the Quakers out to the Main Line for a meeting with No. 4 Villanova and secured the program's first win over the Wildcats since 1911. It also was the program's first road win against a top-five opponent. Late that same season, Priore took his team to Cambridge where they knocked off No. 12 Harvard, 35-25, marking the first time in the program's storied history that they had two road wins over top-25 opponents.
 - While Priore spent his first 28 years as a coach on the defensive side of the ball, he has set up his team to excel on the offensive side as a head coach. In 2015, the Quakers were second in the Ivy League and 24th nationally in scoring offense, averaging 32.9 points per game. First-team All-Ivy quarterback Alek Torgersen was second among all FCS signal-callers in completion percentage (69.1 percent) while third-team All-America and first-team All-Ivy wide receiver Justin Watson led the Ivy League in receptions, receiving yards, and touchdowns.
 - In 2009, Priore finished as a runner-up for the National Coordinator of the Year award after guiding Penn's defense to the top of the FCS. The Quakers finished the season ranked No. 1 nationally in total defense, allowing just 217.6 yards per game. Penn also was tops in the nation in scoring defense and was the only team that gave up fewer than 10 points per contest (9.6). The 2009 season marked the fewest points allowed by a Penn defense in a 10-game season since 1927. During one stretch, the defense held opponents scoreless for a staggering 183 minutes and 42 seconds of game time, a span of more than 12 quarters. Penn led the Ivy League in every major defensive category and finished in the top 10 nationally in eight defensive categories.

*Jared Richardson and Maurcus McDaniel each hauled in first career receiving touchdowns. Richardson finished with a team-high 62 yards.

*Junior quarterback Aidan Sayin settled in late, completing 26 passes for 166 yards and a pair of TDs.

*Jacob Cisneros ran eight times for a team-high 65 yards while Sayin carried five times for 20 yards.

*Penn's defense tallied six sacks—one each for Travis McFarling, Paul Jennings, Kendren Smith, Logan Nash, Micah Morris and John Lista—while Smith had a strong game with a team-high eight total tackles, two pass breakups and a hurry. It's the most sacks for the Quaker defense since last year's season opener, also against Colgate.

*Graham Gotlieb booted two field goals, including a career-high 42-yarder, while drilling a pair of extra points.

*Penn led the way with 276 yards of total offense and went 3-for-4 in red-zone opportunities. First downs were even, 19-19.

Game 2: Penn 37, Bucknell 21

Sept. 23 | Lewisburg, Pa. | Mathewson Stadium

**Penn is 2-0 for the second straight season and the fourth time in the Ray Priore era. Previously, the Quakers had not won their first two games to start a campaign since 2003.

*Make it nine wins in a row for Penn against Bucknell dating back to Oct. 11, 2003. It's the fifth consecutive victory in Lewisburg for the Red and Blue.

*The Quakers were lethal offensively, gaining 515 total yards on 86 plays, including 354 through the air. It's the first time since Oct. 26, 2019 at Yale the Quakers had 500 or more total yards (521).

*Junior quarterback Aidan Sayin recorded his first career 300-yard passing game, going 35-for-49 with 354 yards, three touchdowns and two interceptions. His 354-yard performance is tied with Nick Robinson (Nov. 23, 2019 against Princeton) for the 11th-most yards thrown in a single game in program history.

*Jared Richardson is looking like the 'new big thing' for the Quaker offense, finishing the day with 12 catches for 139 yards and two touchdowns. Through the first two games, Richardson leads his teammates with 19 catches for 201 yards and three TDs.

*Alex Haight also had a solid outing, catching six Sayin passes for 80 yards and his first career score.

*Jonathan Mulatu carried the ball 11 times for 64 yards and a touchdown.

*Jack Fairman and Joey Slackman both finished with five tackles, while Slackman had 3.5 TFLs and a sack.

*Fairman, Slackman, Paul Jennings, Isaiah Jordan and Charlie Mossy each finished with sacks on the afternoon.

*Jack Iuliano and Micah Morris were consistently putting pressure on the Bucknell quarterback with a pair of hurries.

*Penn handled the time of possession and it wasn't even close, holding onto the ball for 41:29. Bucknell only had control of the ball for 18:31.
