### Ivy League Opener

Saturday marks the Ivy League opener for both Penn and Dartmouth, the teams hoping to embark on a championship campaign.

The Big Green have won each of the last two Ivy League titles, while the Quakers are searching for their first title since 2016.

Dartmouth has the most Ivy League titles all-time in conference history with 22, while Penn is tied for third with Yale with 18.

### The Dartmouth Series

Penn leads the all-time series over Dartmouth, 49-40-2, one of four Ivy opponents the Quakers have a winning record against.

At Franklin Field, the Quakers are 31-21-1 against the Big Green but have dropped five consecutive games at home dating back to Oct. 3, 2015 with the last win coming in four overtimes on Oct. 5, 2013, a 37-31 victory.

The George A. Munger Head Coach **Ray Priore** has never beaten Dartmouth at home in his career and is 2-7 all-time against the Big Green, the wins coming on the road in 2016 and 2022.

### Last Time Against Dartmouth

In the season's first Ivy game on Oct. 5, 2024, Penn fell 20-17 at Dartmouth in a back-and-forth contest that stayed within one score throughout.

The Big Green piled up 439 yards of offense, highlighted by 275 through the air and 164 on the ground, while holding the Quakers to just 211 total yards. Dartmouth's decisive 21-play, clock-chewing drive in the fourth quarter converted all five third downs and bled nearly nine minutes off the clock, leaving Penn with only seconds for a final possession.

Despite being bottled up for much of the night, running back Malachi Hosley scored both of Penn's touchdowns and finished with 82 yards on 15 carries, while quarterback Aidan Sayin completed 11-of-27 passes for 123 yards. Linebacker **Kadari Machen** turned in a standout defensive effort with 15 tackles, including eight solo stops, but the Quakers couldn't overcome Dartmouth's efficiency and ball control down the stretch.

### Scouting The Big Green

Receiving votes in both the FCS coaches and media polls, Dartmouth enters the weekend with a 2-0 overall record following victories over No. 23 New Hampshire and Central Connecticut State.

On Saturday at CCSU, quarterback Grayson Saunier had an excellent performance with a career-high 407 yards (30-for-44) with two touchdowns, including a 50-yard strike to KyDric Fisher with 16 seconds remaining to seal the dramatic 35-28 win. D.J. Crowther paced the ground game with 86 rushing yards and two TDs on 24 carries. Defensively, Tyson Grimm led the way with eight solo tackles, while Zylon Freer-Brown had 1.5 tackles for loss.

Saunier leads the Ancient Eight and is third in the nation in completions per game (26.0) and first, second in passing yards per game (325.5). Grayson O'Bara is second in the Ivy and fourth in the country in receiving yards per game at 117.0 while D.J.

Crowther ranks eighth in FCS football in rushing yards per game (114.5).

Dartmouth has the eighth-best offense in the country by averaging 478.0 yards per contest.

### Toe-to-Toe With Lehigh

Penn gave No. 9/10 Lehigh all it could handle in a 44-30 loss Saturday in Bethlehem. The Quakers scored their most points against a Top 10 opponent since Nov. 10, 1945 (32-7 win over No. 10 Columbia).

QB **Liam O'Brien** was sharp—completing 28 of 37 passes for 316 yards and three touchdowns and adding a TD on the ground—while wide receivers **Jared Richardson** (141 yards, two TDs) and **Bisi Owens** (100 yards, TD) both eclipsed the century mark.

Penn grabbed a four-point lead early in the third quarter on the first of two O'Brien-to-Richardson connections before Lehigh pulled away for good.

**Julien Stokes** provided a spark on special teams with 133 return yards, including a 60-yarder that set up the go-ahead touchdown, while freshman kicker **Mason Walters** continued a perfect start to his rookie campaign by converting a 32-yard field goal to make it a one-possession game late in the fourth quarter. Defensively, safety **Ty Cortes** led the Quakers with a career-high 10 tackles and **Carter Janki** added two TFLs for the second straight game.

### Another One!

**Stokes** was named Ivy League Special Teams Player of the Week for the second straight week on Monday after another standout performance, becoming just the 11th player in program history to earn back-to-back Ivy weekly honors and the first on special teams.

On Saturday at Lehigh, he returned four kicks for 133 yards, highlighted by a 60-yarder that set up a go-ahead touchdown.

Through two games, the Newbury Park, Calif. native has six kick returns for 193 yards and four punt returns for 82 yards and a touchdown, and he currently leads the NCAA FCS in punt return average (20.5) and all-purpose yards (206.5), while ranking eighth in kickoff return average (32.2).

In addition, QB **O'Brien**, WR **Richardson**, and DL **Janki** were tabbed to the Ivy League's weekly honor roll.

### All Ready For Richardson

Senior wideout **Richardson** has delivered standout performance after standout performance for the Quakers to begin the 2025 season, solidifying his reputation as one of the Ivy League's premier playmakers.

Through the first two games, he has recorded 244 yards on 17 catches and three touchdowns. His most impressive outing came this past weekend at nationally-ranked Lehigh—his "homecoming" game—where he amassed 141 yards and two touchdowns on 12 receptions.

Richardson continues to climb Penn's all-time receiving list, entering Week 3 with 1,716 career yards, having just cleared Doug O'Neill '00 (1,614) for seventh all-time. Richardson begins to chase Conner Scott '14 for sixth at 1,762 and then will turn

his attention to becoming just the sixth Penn receiver to reach the 2,000-yard milestone.

In addition, Richardson is now ranked fifth in Penn history in touchdown receptions with 18, passing both Don Clune '73 and Christian Pearson '18 at 17. He needs four TDs to pass Rob Milanese '02 for fourth with 21.

### O'Brien's Offense

You couldn't ask for a better start to a season for Penn senior QB **O'Brien**, who heads into Week 3 ranked second in the Ivy League in passing yards per game at 277.0, while completing 64.7 percent (44-for-68) of his passes with four touchdowns and just two interceptions.

His passer rating of 146.7 ranks fourth behind Dartmouth's Saunier (147.7), Princeton's Kai Colon (155.9) and Harvard's Jaden Craig (222.5).

O'Brien entered this season with just four starts under his belt after taking over for the injured Aidan Sayin following Week 6 vs. Yale. He immediately jumped off the page at Cornell when he set Penn's single-game program records for passing touchdowns (6) and total TDs (7) in a 67-49 victory over the Big Red. He got himself on the map when he was named FCS National Offensive Player of the Week by Stats Perform following the effort.

### In The National Rankings

Just like last season, there really is no better team in the nation in punt return defense than the Penn Quakers, ranked second in that category at 0.00 yards per attempt. On the other end, the Red and Blue rank third in punt return yards per attempt at 20.50, much due to the impact **Stokes** has had in that area.

Also, the Quakers rank first with six others in fourth-down conversion percentage (1.000), fifth in fewest penalties (9), sixth in fewest penalty yards (98), and seventh in first downs defense (44). Penn also has the 11th best passing offense in the country at 277.0 yards per game.

Individually, Stokes leads all of FCS football in all-purpose yards with 206.5, while Richardson ranks 25th (122.0). Stokes also has the nation lead in punt return TDs (1) and punt return yards per attempt (20.5) while ranking eighth in kickoff return yards per attempt (32.2). Under center, **O'Brien's** 277.0 passing yards per game rank third and is seventh in completions per game (22.0).

Not only does **Janki** pace the Ancient Eight in TFLs per game (2.0), but he also ranks second in FCS behind just Furman's Joshua Stoneking (2.63).

### Academic Heisman Watch

Besides a strong outing at Lehigh last weekend, **O'Brien** also found himself in the news for being named a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, announced by the National Football Foundation (NFF) and the College Football Hall of Fame.

One of four co-captains for the 2025 season, O'Brien is a member of several campus and community initiatives including Penn's Student-Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC), the Penn Athletics Wharton Leadership Academy (PAWLA), and the Ivy League Football Council, the leadership group that brought the FCS Playoffs to the conference for the first time ever.

He has also participated in Uplifting Athletes, a non-profit organization that invests in lives of those affected by rare diseases, which sponsors Lift for Life events. He also has been involved in Penn Football's annual Bone Marrow Drive with NMDP.

A Finance and Business Analytics double major in Penn's prestigious Wharton School of Business, O'Brien spent the past summer as an Investment Banking Analyst at J.P. Morgan as a part of its Business Services Coverage Group. He received a full-time job offer from the company upon completion.

### Preseason Honors

There has been no shortage of preseason honors bestowed upon the Red and Blue with multiple student-athletes receiving national laurels ahead of the 2025 campaign.

Senior offensive lineman **Netinho Olivieri** has been front and center for Penn this preseason, taking home All-America honors from Stats Perform (third team), FCS Football Central (third team), and Phil Steele (third team).

Senior wide receiver **Richardson** joined Olivieri on Phil Steele's All-America list, while also being honored by FCS Football Central along with senior offensive lineman **Will Bergin**.

Olivieri and Richardson were also tabbed to the East-West Shrine Bowl 1000 Watch List.

### Those Are Some Good Works!

Not only was he recognized for his effort on the field, **Bergin** also got some love off for his work in the community by being nominated for the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team.

The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team was established in 1992 by the College Football Association, recognizing the extra efforts made by college football players and student support staff off the field. AFCA became the governing body of the award in 1997 and continues to honor college football players who go the extra mile for those in need. Allstate worked to present the award starting with the 2008 season.

Bergin, a team captain for the 2025 season, is a key contributor to the Penn Football chapter of Uplifting Athletes, where he helps coordinate team fundraising events either through games or lifts to raise money and awareness for children with rare diseases. He and his teammates involved helped raise over \$7,000 two years in a row.

In addition, Bergin has been involved with Young Quakers, an organization partnered with the University of Pennsylvania's Netter Center that works with Philadelphia kids ages 6-18. He's also a member of the Penn Athletics Wharton Leadership Academy (PAWLA) and Penn's Student Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).

Like other football student-athletes, Bergin has also donated his time to helping at Get in the Game Bone Marrow drives for NMDP.

### Five Up Front

It's not every day you get five returning offensive linemen on your roster, but Penn has that exactly heading into the start of the year.

It's a mammoth O-Line with all five starters weighing over 300 pounds. Spearheaded by first-team All-Ivy selection **Olivieri** at left tackle and second-team All-Ivy honoree **Bergin** at center, the duo with a combined weight of 620 pounds is joined by senior **Maxwell Freeman** at right guard, junior **Luke Sacchetti** at left guard, and junior **Aaron Kruse** at right tackle.

This formidable group did wonders in run blocking for Hosley in 2024, who racked up nearly 1,200 yards on the ground en route to being named Ivy Offensive Player of the Year. In addition, the offensive line allowed just 15 sacks all season, the ninth-fewest number in FCS football.

### Yes, Captains

Penn has four captains leading the charge in 2025 with QB **O'Brien**, OL **Bergin**, DL **Paul Jennings**, and LB **Lista**.

Jennings is the latest Quaker to be a two-time captain after earning the honor in 2024 as well. The senior missed a significant chunk of time in 2024 due to injury and comes back healthy and ready to go. Jennings was impressive in 2023, recording six tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks over 10 games for the Red and Blue.

## Game 2: #9/10 Lehigh 44, Penn 30 September 27, 2025 | Bethlehem, Pa.

**BETHLEHEM, Pa.** – The University of Pennsylvania football team gave ninth-ranked Lehigh all it could handle on Saturday, putting up 30 points against a Lehigh defense that hadn't given up more than 24 in its first four games. However, the Quakers were hard-pressed to stop the Mountain Hawks attack and took a 44-30 loss at Goodman Stadium.

Penn falls to 1-1 heading into its home and Ivy League opener next Saturday, while Lehigh remained unbeaten at 5-0.

The Mountain Hawks wasted little time getting on the board Saturday, receiving the opening kickoff and marching down the field for three points when Nick Garrido split the uprights from 35 yards out. Lehigh made it 10-0 on the next drive, Hayden Johnson finding Matt D'Avino for a 22-yard score to end a nine-play, 77-yard drive.

Penn put points on the board quickly after that. Less than two minutes after falling behind by double digits, the Quakers were within three when Liam O'Brien escaped the Lehigh rush and found Bisi Owens behind the Hawks defense for a 48-yard touchdown pass. However, Lehigh kicked another field goal—making it three scores in three possessions—and the Mountain Hawks led after one, 13-7.

The Red and Blue created their own problems early in the second, turning the ball over in their own territory and giving Lehigh a short field. The Mountain Hawks got the ball all the way to Penn's 4-yard line, but were pushed back by a penalty and settled for a 25-yard Garrido field goal that made the score 16-7.

Penn's offense redeemed itself on the next drive. The Quakers drove 75 yards in eight plays and were back within two when O'Brien bounced off a defender and went around the right side of the line into the end zone. Both Jared Richardson and Owens had big plays on the drive, Richardson's going for 29 yards and Owens' for 16. The score was still 16-14 at halftime.

Penn received the second-half kickoff, and Julien Stokes immediately electrified the crowd when he busted through the left side and took the return all the way to Lehigh's 40-yard line before falling out of bounds. Just two plays later, the Quakers had their first lead of the day as O'Brien found Richardson twice, the first for 34 yards and the second in the left corner of the end zone. The kick was no good so Penn's lead was 20-16.

Lehigh drove down the field on its first drive of the second half,

but it looked like the Penn defense had held when the Mountain Hawks faced fourth-and-7 and brought out the field-goal unit for a 37-yard attempt. Instead, the ball was snapped and holder Geoffrey Jamiel took off around the left side of the line. The opening took him all the way to the end zone and Lehigh was back in front, 23-20.

Penn punted on its next possession, but the kick was muffed and the Quakers' Davis Ellis recovered on Lehigh's 31-yard line. The Red and Blue could not take advantage, however, and on third-and-9 O'Brien had the ball knocked out of his hand as he got set to pass. The fumble was recovered by the Mountain Hawks at the Lehigh 42.

The Hawks turned the turnover into points, Johnson hitting Jamiel for a 35-yard touchdown on the first play of the fourth quarter. That capped a 58-yard drive that took seven plays and a little more than three minutes off the clock.

Penn got back within three points less than two minutes later. Richardson actually scored two touchdowns on the drive. The first, where he caught the ball over his shoulder in the back left corner of the end zone, was initially ruled a score but overturned when a review found his right foot was out of bounds while he caught the ball. No matter: on the very next play the Quakers sent him inside on a seam route and he carried two defenders over the line to finish an 18-yard play.

The Quakers defense forced a Lehigh punt for the first time in the game on the next drive, but the offense gave the ball right back to the Mountain Hawks when O'Brien's pass to the left sideline was picked off at the 20-yard line. Five plays later, Lehigh was back up by ten, at 37-27, after Luke Yoder went up the gut and muscled the ball into the end zone from a yard out.

Once again, the offense atoned. The Quakers used six plays to drive 56 yards, most of them coming when Stokes took a pass from O'Brien in the right flat and sped 47 yards down the sideline before finally being caught at the Lehigh 18. The Red and Blue were stymied at the 15, but Mason Walters made this a one-score game by kicking a 32-yard field goal with 4:50 left.

A stop was needed after that, but Lehigh's power game went into full effect and the Mountain Hawks essentially ran out the clock before Yoder burst through a seam in the final minute for a 25-yard touchdown. That set the final score at 44-30.

## The Nation's Oldest Collegiate Football Stadium

Just how historic is Franklin Field? Consider that when the oldest ballpark in professional baseball, Fenway Park, opened in 1912, Franklin Field was already 17 years old. Wrigley Field didn't open until 1914. The next-oldest college stadium, Harvard Stadium, opened in 1904; the oldest stadium in pro football, Soldier Field, was first used in 1924—nearly three full decades after the opening of Franklin Field. Fans have been watching Penn Football from the corner of 33rd and Spruce since the Quakers defeated Swarthmore 40-0 in the stadium's first game on Oct. 1, 1895. Below is a brief list of the experiences enjoyed by the millions of fans who have passed through the Franklin Field gates:

## 1895

### First stadium scoreboard



Stands are built at the stadium's current location at 33rd and Spruce Streets. The stadium is opened for the Penn Relays, and football plays its first game there on Oct. 1, 1895, a 40-0 win over Swarthmore.

## 1899

### First neutral-site Army-Navy game



Army defeats Navy by a score of 17-5 at Franklin Field on Dec. 2, 1899 in the first neutral-site game ever played between the two storied rivals.

## 1903

### College football's original horseshoe



In 1903, in response to inadequate seating for big games, wooden stands are replaced by a brick horseshoe, seating 20,000 fans and making Franklin Field the first permanent horseshoe college stadium.

## 1922

### College football's first radio broadcast



Cornell beats Penn, 9-0, on WIP-AM radio on Nov. 30, 1922. Also, the first tier is rebuilt in brick and concrete. These stands remain today as the lower bowl.

## 1925

### First double-decked stadium



The second deck is completed, making Franklin Field the nation's first double-decker football stadium. The capacity is 78,205, the largest in the country.

## 1940

### College football's first televised game



Franklin Field hosts the first-ever telecast of a college football game as Penn routs Maryland, 51-0 on Oct. 5, 1940. Local station Philco (now KYW) used two cameras to broadcast all the action.

## 1961

### First Wide World of Sports episode



The first episode of ABC's *Wide World of Sports* is filmed at the Penn Relays on April 29, 1961.

## 1969

### AstroTurf installed



In 1969, natural grass is replaced with AstroTurf; Franklin Field has had a synthetic surface ever since.

## 2013

### New SprintTurf added



Over the past decade, renovations have included red and blue chairback seating, a new SprintTurf synthetic surface along with a new scoreboard and videoboard.

### ALSO HOME TO....

Over more than 125 years, Franklin Field has hosted football, track and field, field hockey, lacrosse, soccer, sprint football, baseball, rugby, cricket, commencements, concerts, Presidential speeches and drum corps competitions. It has hosted the NFL, CFL, USFL, Army-Navy games, and NCAA championships in men's and women's lacrosse, track & field, men's soccer and field hockey. More than 100,000 fans visit every April for the Penn Relays. It was the Philadelphia Eagles' home from 1958-70 and site of their first NFL championship, in 1960—Vince Lombardi's only NFL playoff loss with the Green Bay Packers. Franklin Field also hosted the first CFL game played on American soil, and has hosted more Army-Navy games than any other existing stadium (18). Franklin Field has even been immortalized in film—scenes from the Hollywood blockbusters *"Invincible"* and *"Unbreakable"* were filmed there. The ESPN documentary series *"Peyton's Places,"* hosted by NFL Hall of Famer Peyton Manning was shot at Franklin Field for its Dec. 25, 2023 episode.

- Officially took over as the 22nd George A. Munger Head Coach of Football on December 1, 2014.
- A veteran of the Red and Blue coaching staff as he enters his 39th season on the Quakers sideline in 2025. Prior to taking the helm of the Quakers in 2015, he spent 16 seasons as Penn's defensive coordinator and secondaries coach and nine as the program's Associate Head Coach.
- The first Ivy League coach to win back-to-back Ivy League championships in each of his first two years as head coach since Dartmouth's Jake Crouthamel (1971-72).
- His first career win as head coach was a signature one, as Priore led the Quakers out to the Main Line for a meeting with No. 4 Villanova and secured the program's first win over the Wildcats since 1911. It also was the program's first road win against a top-five opponent. Late that same season, Priore took his team to Cambridge where they knocked off No. 12 Harvard, 35-25, marking the first time in the program's storied history that they had two road wins over top-25 opponents.

• While Priore spent his first 28 years as a coach on the defensive side of the ball, he has set up his team to excel on the offensive side as a head coach. In 2015, the Quakers were second in the Ivy League and 24th nationally in scoring offense, averaging 32.9 points per game. First-team All-Ivy quarterback Alek Torgersen was second among all FCS signal-callers in completion percentage (69.1 percent) while third-team All-America and first-team All-Ivy wide receiver Justin Watson led the Ivy League in receptions, receiving yards, and touchdowns.

• In 2009, Priore finished as a runner-up for the National Coordinator of the Year award after guiding Penn's defense to the top of the FCS. The Quakers finished the season ranked No. 1 nationally in total defense, allowing just 217.6 yards per game. Penn also was tops in the nation in scoring defense and was the only team that gave up fewer than 10 points per contest (9.6). The 2009 season marked the fewest points allowed by a Penn defense in a 10-game season since 1927. During one stretch, the defense held opponents scoreless for a staggering 183 minutes and 42 seconds of game time, a span of more than 12 quarters. Penn led the Ivy League in every major defensive category and finished in the top 10 nationally in eight defensive categories.

In the Ivy League's 2025 preseason media poll, Penn was picked to finish sixth place with 49 voting points. The Quakers finished tied for sixth last season with Brown and Princeton. **EASTON, Mass.** – The University of Pennsylvania football team scored in the first minute and the last minute of Saturday's season opener at Stonehill, and the latter proved to be the difference as the Quakers knocked off the Skyhawks 24-21 at W.B. Mason Field.

Making his first field goal attempt as a collegian, freshman Mason Walters kicked a 45-yard field goal with just 15 seconds left to provide the winning points over a Stonehill team that entered the day 1-2 and was coming off a 13-10 win last Saturday at the University of Maine. The game was the first-ever meeting between these programs. Penn needed exactly 50 seconds and three plays to get on the scoreboard for the first time in 2025. O'Brien found Richardson across the middle and the senior receiver took over from there, covering the final 65 yards on the ground for the touchdown.

The Quakers doubled their lead midway through the first. Julien Stokes caught a punt at his own 37-yard line. He shook off an immediate tackler, moved to the left sideline and was gone, 63 yards to the house. Stonehill was able to get one of those scores back late in the period with its first score of the day, and the Red and Blue's lead was 14-7 after one.

Penn responded to the Stonehill TD by again making it a two-score game in the second quarter. The Quakers used 11 plays to drive 49 yards with Sean Williams Jr. picking up the final one up the gut. That made the score 21-7, and the Red and Blue had another chance to tack on points on the last play of the half but missed on a 22-yard field goal. As a result, the teams went to their locker rooms with Penn up by 14.

After a scoreless third quarter, Stonehill made this a one-score game on the first play of the fourth quarter when Zavion Woodard spun off a few Penn defenders and got into the end zone from five yards out. Penn got into Stonehill territory after that score, but O'Brien threw a jump ball pass to Owens on the right sideline and it was intercepted by the Skyhawks' Zack Athy.

Starting on its own 1-yard line, the Skyhawks got some breathing room and then used the big play to get to midfield, O'Connell finding Zachary Kim down the left sideline for 32 yards. Several plays later, Stonehill tied this game on a fourth-and-2 play when O'Connell rolled to his left and flung a pass into the left corner of the end zone that Torance Washington Jr. caught behind an outstretched Quakers defender. The play went for 28 yards and tied things at 21-21.

The teams traded punts on their next drives, with Stokes briefly muffing the Stonehill punt but picking it up and putting Penn on its 36-yard line with only a few minutes remaining. O'Brien used a pair of quarterback draws to get the ball into Stonehill territory, the second going for 16 yards as he shook off a few tackles along the way. O'Brien then found Richardson for nine yards to the Skyhawks' 28-yard line with 27 seconds left, and after a Stonehill timeout the defense stuffed a rush up the middle for no gain. The Skyhawks again took a timeout, giving Penn time to think of its next step. Facing fourth-and-1, the Quakers put the ball on the freshman Walters' foot and he delivered, splitting the uprights for a 45-yarder that would have cleared the crossbar from a good 10 yards or more.

Stonehill returned the ensuing kickoff to its 40-yard line, offsetting penalties keeping the ball on the 40. With just nine seconds left, the Skyhawks attempted a hook-and-ladder play at midfield but the ball was fumbled on a second lateral and the clock ran out as the Stonehill player fell on it.

**BETHLEHEM, Pa.** – The University of Pennsylvania football team gave ninth-ranked Lehigh all it could handle on Saturday, putting up 30 points against a Lehigh defense that hadn't given up more than 24 in its first four games. However, the Quakers were hard-pressed to stop the Mountain Hawks attack and took a 44-30 loss at Goodman Stadium.

Penn falls to 1-1 heading into its home and Ivy League opener next Saturday, while Lehigh remained unbeaten at 5-0.

The Mountain Hawks wasted little time getting on the board Saturday, receiving the opening kickoff and marching down the field for three points when Nick Garrido split the uprights from 35 yards out. Lehigh made it 10-0 on the next drive, Hayden Johnson finding Matt D'Avino for a 22-yard score to end a nine-play, 77-yard drive.

Penn put points on the board quickly after that. Less than two minutes after falling behind by double digits, the Quakers were within three when Liam O'Brien escaped the Lehigh rush and found Bisi Owens behind the Hawks defense for a 48-yard touchdown pass. However, Lehigh kicked another field goal—making it three scores in three possessions—and the Mountain Hawks led after one, 13-7.

The Red and Blue created their own problems early in the second, turning the ball over in their own territory and giving Lehigh a short field. The Mountain Hawks got the ball all the way to Penn's 4-yard line, but were pushed back by a penalty and settled for a 25-yard Garrido field goal that made the score 16-7.

Penn's offense redeemed itself on the next drive. The Quakers drove 75 yards in eight plays and were back within two when O'Brien bounced off a defender and went around the right side of the line into the end zone. Both Jared Richardson and Owens had big plays on the drive, Richardson's going for 29 yards and Owens' for 16. The score was still 16-14 at halftime.

Penn received the second-half kickoff, and Julien Stokes immediately electrified the crowd when he busted through the left side and took the return all the way to Lehigh's 40-yard line before falling out of bounds. Just two plays later, the Quakers had their first lead of the day as O'Brien found Richardson twice, the first for 34 yards and the second in the left corner of the end zone. The kick was no good so Penn's lead was 20-16.

Lehigh drove down the field on its first drive of the second half, but it looked like the Penn defense had held when the Mountain Hawks faced fourth-and-7 and brought out the field-goal unit for a 37-yard attempt. Instead, the ball was snapped and holder Geoffrey Jamiel took off around the left side of the line. The opening took him all the way to the end zone and Lehigh was back in front, 23-20.

Penn punted on its next possession, but the kick was muffed and the Quakers' Davis Ellis recovered on Lehigh's 31-yard line. The Red and Blue could not take advantage, however, and on third-and-9 O'Brien had the ball knocked out of his hand as he got set to pass. The fumble was recovered by the Mountain Hawks at the Lehigh 42.

The Hawks turned the turnover into points, Johnson hitting Jamiel for a 35-yard touchdown on the first play of the fourth quarter. That capped a 58-yard drive that took seven plays and a little more than three minutes off the clock.

Penn got back within three points less than two minutes later. Richardson actually scored two touchdowns on the drive. The first, where he caught the ball over his shoulder in the back left corner of the end zone, was initially ruled a score but overturned when a review found his right foot was out of bounds while he caught the ball. No matter: on the very next play the Quakers sent him inside on a seam route and he carried two defenders over the line to finish an 18-yard play.

The Quakers defense forced a Lehigh punt for the first time in the game on the next drive, but the offense gave the ball right back to the Mountain Hawks when O'Brien's pass to the left sideline was picked off at the 20-yard line. Five plays later, Lehigh was back up by ten, at 37-27, after Luke Yoder went up the gut and muscled the ball into the end zone from a yard out.

Once again, the offense atoned. The Quakers used six plays to drive 56 yards, most of them coming when Stokes took a pass from O'Brien in the right flat and sped 47 yards down the sideline before finally being caught at the Lehigh 18. The Red and Blue were stymied at the 15, but Mason Walters made this a one-score game by kicking a 32-yard field goal with 4:50 left.

A stop was needed after that, but Lehigh's power game went into full effect and the Mountain Hawks essentially ran out the clock before Yoder burst through a seam in the final minute for a 25-yard touchdown. That set the final score at 44-30.
