MARCH MADNESS HISTORY

• Penn is making its 25th appearance in the NCAA Tournament, second among Ivy programs (Princeton, 26); the Quakers boast a 13-26 record.

• This is Penn's first NCAA appearance since 2018 and just the second time the Quakers have advanced by virtue of winning the Ivy League Tournament, which started in 2017.

Penn has been a 14 seed two other times...

• The 1993 team was the first of three straight to go unbeaten in Ivy League play (ultimately winning 48 straight Ivy games) but fell to third-seeded UMass, 54-50, in Syracuse, N.Y. That team was led by Barry Pierce and featured guards Jerome Allen and Matt Maloney.

• The second came in 2007, the Quakers capping a three-year run of Ivy League championships with a 68-52 loss to Texas A&M in Lexington, Ky. That team featured Ivy Player of the Year Ibby Jaaber and first-team All-Ivy Mark Zoller.

GOOD TO KNOW

• Penn enters March Madness having won five in a row and nine of its last 10; the only loss in that stretch came on February 21, a four-point loss on the road to Ivy regular-season champion Yale.

• Penn won the Ivy League Tournament in dramatic fashion, knocking off second-seeded Harvard and top-seeded Yale, both in overtime (Penn's first OT games this season). Junior **TJ Power** set an ILT record with 44 points in the championship game and was named Most Outstanding Player of the event.

• **Power** was a unanimous selection as first-team All-Ivy—the program's first since Jordan Dingle in 2022-23—while senior **Ethan Roberts** received second-team All-Ivy honors.

• Head coach **Fran McCaffery**—a 1982 Penn alum—is just the fifth coach in history to bring five different programs to March Madness (previously Lehigh, UNC Greensboro, Siena, and Iowa).

P SERIES INFORMATION/BY THE NUMBERS

THE SERIES WITH (3) ILLINOIS

• Seventh meeting in a series that dates back to 1947; Illinois leads, 6-0.

• Second NCAA Tournament meeting: Illinois beat Penn, 68-58, in the 2000 Tournament in Winston-Salem, N.C. That Penn team featured current Colgate head coach Matt Langel and his backcourt mate Michael Jordan. (No, not *that* Michael Jordan!)

• Most recent meeting took place on November 22, 2001 at the Las Vegas Invitational, a 7871 Illinois victory.

• Penn head coach **Fran McCaffery** is no stranger to Thursday's opponent, of course, having faced them for 15 years as head coach at Iowa. He has an 11-16 record against the Fighting Illini.

THE SERIES WITH (6) UNC

• Ninth meeting in a series that dates to 1948; Carolina leads, 6-2.

• Fourth NCAA Tournament meeting: UNC beat Penn in the 1972 Elite Eight, 73-59, and toppled the Quakers in the 1987 first round, 113-82. In between, Penn pulled off one of the great wins in NCAA history, a 72-71 victory in 1979 on the way to the Final Four. (Part of "Black Sunday" on Tobacco Road, top-seeded UNC and second-seeded Duke both losing that day in Raleigh)

• Last meeting was November 15, 2008, an 86-71 UNC win at the Dean Dome.

• Coach **McCaffery** has faced the Heels twice in his career and beaten them both times.

THE SERIES WITH (11) VCU

• Second meeting: the first took place just last year, the Rams earning a 66-47 victory over the Quakers in Richmond.

• Potentially fun little Philly battle, as Coach McCaffery would be matching wits with Phil Martelli, Jr.

• Coach **McCaffery** has never coached against VCU.

1 • Seniors across the Big 5 (and Drexel) who played all four years at the same school: Penn's **Cam Thrower**; *after not hitting for double digits in a game since December 28, Thrower had 11 vs. Harvard and a career-high 19 against Yale last weekend at the Ivy Tourney.*

3 • Different starting lineups this season for Penn (only due of injury or illness); *compare that to a year ago, when the Quakers put out 15 different lineups.*

+3.64 • Penn's turnover margin in Ivy League regular-season play, tops among the Ancient Eight programs.

5.4 • Difference in points-per-game average for sophomore **AJ Levine** in Ivy play (10.9 ppg) vs. the non-conference portion of Penn's season (5.5 ppg).

8 • Penn players who have led the team in scoring in at least one game this season; also the number of players who have led the team in rebounding in a game this season. (See page 25 for a full breakdown of both stats.)

12 • Combined points that Penn lost by in its four Ivy road losses: 78-76 at Princeton (2), 64-63 at Harvard (1), 72-67 at Columbia (5), 74-70 at Yale (4).

14 • Points needed by junior **TJ Power** to become the 16th player in program history with a 500-point season. (The last was Jordan Dingle, who did it in 2021-22 and again in 2022-23.)

16.9 • Senior **Ethan Roberts'** overall points-per-game average, tops on the team and fourth among Ivy players; *he missed Ivy Madness with his second concussion this season.*

19 • Steals collected by Penn in its regular-season finale at Brown, most against a D1 opponent since January 23, 1982—when current head coach **Fran McCaffery** was a senior. ("White Magic" had six of those thefts.)

34 • Steals by **Levine** in Ivy League play this season, tops among Ivy players.

38.6 • Penn's overall 3FG percentage this season, which is third among Ivy teams but 15th nationally.

44 • Points scored by **Power** in Penn's ILT championship win over Yale—23 in the first half, 17 in the second half, 4 in OT—including two treys in the final seconds of regulation to force overtime; *that is tied for the third-highest scoring game in Penn men's basketball history.*

65 • Offensive rebounds pulled down this season by junior **Augie Gerhart**, tied for second among Ivy players behind Columbia's Mason Ritter.

92.0 • **Michael Zanoni's** overall FT percentage this season (46-50); *with four more makes, he'll likely hold the program's single-season record for percentage (currently 89.7 by Matt Maloney in 1993-94).*

115 • Assists dished out by **Levine** this season, most by a Penn player since AJ Brodeur—also the program's all-time leading scorer—had 140 in 2019-20.

309 • Free throws taken in league play by Penn, most among the Ancient Eight programs (Dartmouth was the only other team within 60 of the Quakers, with 297); *the Quakers took 81 more foul shots than their opponents in Ivy play, by far the biggest margin among the eight teams.*

1,000 • Penn's free-throw percentage in the Ivy Madness final against Yale (16-16); quite a feat, given that the Quakers finished the regular season sixth among Ivy teams in the category (.693).

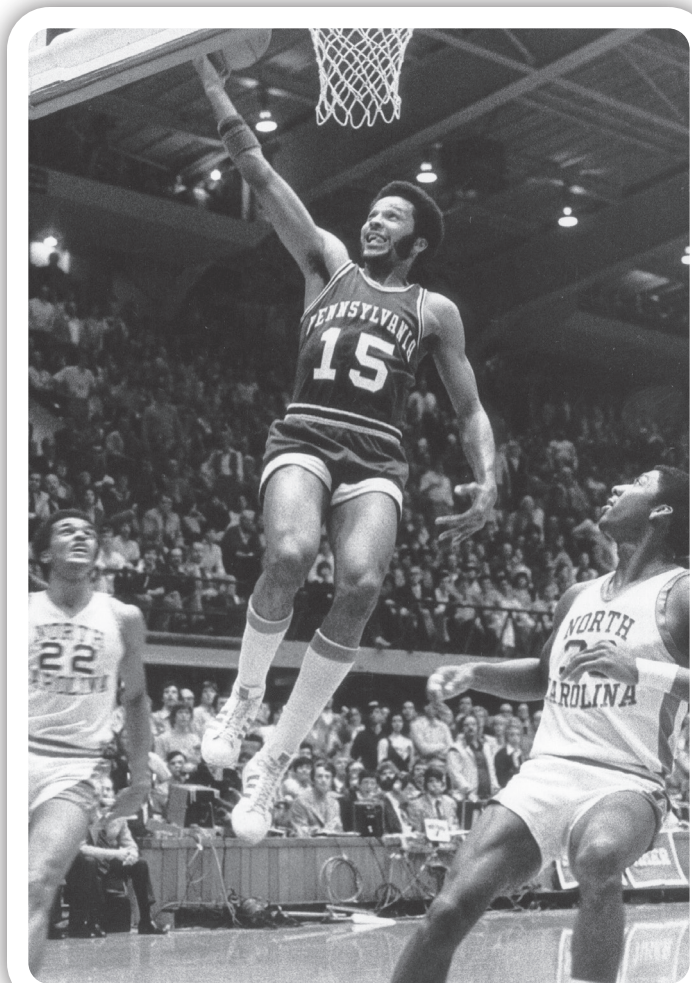

The 1979 Final Four was arguably the most famous of all time—it featured Magic Johnson (Michigan State), Larry Bird (Indiana State) and Mark Aguirre (DePaul) and the final (pitting Magic vs. Bird) remains the highest-rated final in TV history. However, it was TONY PRICE who was the leading scorer in the 1979 NCAA Tournament, scoring 142 points across Penn's six games (23.7 ppg).

Notemeal vs. Yale (ILT)

• Penn improved to 2-0 when playing in the Ivy League Tournament championship game, the other win coming in 2018 over Harvard.

• Penn's win snapped a streak that saw Yale win six in a row and nine of the last ten against the Quakers.

• For the second time this season, Penn was perfect at the foul line (16-16); the other time was the Ivy League opener at Princeton, when the Quakers set a program record by going 19-19.

• Yale (17) actually took more free throws than Penn (16). That doesn't often happen: Penn improved to just 2-6 in such games this season.

• Penn hit 14 three-point shots, a high for this season, and shot exactly 50 percent behind the arc.

• Junior **TJ Power** had one of the most amazing performances ever seen in the Red and Blue uniform, scoring half of Penn's points (44 of 88) and grabbing 14 rebounds for his second double-double in as many days. Not surprisingly, he was named Most Outstanding Player following the event.

• **Power's** 44-point performance is tied for the third-highest-scoring game in program history with Hassan Duncombe, who scored 44 at Navy on December 8, 1989. The two performances ahead of them were set by Ernie Beck, who was the program's all-time scoring leader for 67 years (47 vs. Duke on December 30, 1952 and 45 vs. Harvard on February 6, 1952).

• **Power** drained seven treys on 14 attempts—most by a Penn player in a game since January 25, 2025 (Sam Brown 8 vs. Columbia)—and was a perfect 9-9 at the foul line.

• **Power** set Ivy Tournament records for points in a game (44) and tournament (60), and his 14 rebounds were one shy of the ILT single-game mark.

• Playing in what could have been his last game for Penn, senior **Cam Thrower** kept his career alive with a career-high 19 points and grabbed four boards. He was 6-10 from the field, knocking down four of his six three-point attempts, and was named to the all-tournament team.

• Sophomore guard **AJ Levine** scored nine points and led all players in assists (6) and steals (4) before fouling out.

Notemeal vs. Harvard (ILT)

• This was Penn's first overtime game of the season and the first for the program since December 23, 2024 (a 77-73 win over Rider).

• Penn "improved" to 3-6 when finishing a game in the 60s—but interestingly, those three wins have come the last three times they've ended up in the 60s (February 7 vs. Princeton, 61-60; February 28 vs. Harvard, 64-61; and Saturday).

• Penn entered the game leading the league in turnover margin and that was a factor again, the Quakers going +9 with just eight turnovers while Harvard had 17.

• Penn took just eight foul shots, a season low, but Harvard only took two free throws which was an opponent low for the season.

• **Levine's** winning shot capped a game that saw him finish with nine points, three rebounds, two assists and two steals.

• **Power** lifted Penn in the first half, with 13 points, and grabbed eight second-half rebounds on the way to a 16-point, 12-rebound performance as he led all players in both categories.

• **Power** also tied a season/career high with four steals, something he did for the first time just last weekend at Brown.

• After scoring just two points in 49 combined minutes against Harvard in the regular season, **Zanon** scored 11

points in this Ivy Tournament semifinal. He added four rebounds.

• **Thrower**—who stepped into the starting lineup in place of leading scorer **Ethan Roberts**, who was injured earlier this week in practice—also scored 11 points, his sixth double-figure scoring game this season but his first since December 28.

*Freshman **Jay Jones** once again provided solid minutes off the bench, scoring six points and grabbing five boards in 23 minutes of action.

Notemeal at Brown

• The 21-point win was Penn's largest margin of victory this season (previously 19, an 80-61 win over NJIT on New Year's Eve).

• Penn's 26-point lead late in the game (80-54) was its biggest against a Division I opponent all season.

• Penn collected 19 steals on Friday night, most by the Quakers against a Division I opponent since they had a staggering 21 against Penn State on January 23, 1982—coincidentally, current head coach **Fran McCaffery's** senior year. ("White Magic" had six of those steals.)

• Not surprisingly, Brown's 23 turnovers were an opponent high this season and Penn's 32 points off those turnovers were also a season best.

• Brown scored 27 second-half points, tied for an opponent low this season (originally set by La Salle).

The eighth edition of the Ivy League Tournament will take place March 14-15 at Cornell's Newman Arena. The top four regular-season finishers will descend upon Ithaca for the semifinals on Saturday, with the final to determine the League's NCAA Tournament bid on Sunday. All three games will air on the ESPN family of networks. The first two Ivy League Tournaments, in 2017 and 2018, were hosted by Penn at the historic Palestra.

• Penn hit 10 three-point shots, the seventh time the Quakers have reached double figures in that category.

• **Roberts** led Penn with 18 points, giving him 46 in two games against Brown this season.

• **Power** once again flirted with a double-double, scoring 17 points and tying for team-high honors with eight rebounds. He also had four steals and two assists, and he knocked down five of his eight three-point shots.

• **Zanoni** finished the night with 11 points while freshman Dalton Scantlebury added 10 and also contributed six boards and three steals. Scantlebury also had the best plus/minus among Penn players, at +28.

• **Levine** stuffed the stat sheet with eight points, eight rebounds, six assists—which tied for game-high honors—and four steals.

• On a night when ten different players scored, **Jones** finished with seven points and junior **Niklas Polonowski** drained both of his trey attempts for six.

Notemeal vs. Harvard

• The 10-point halftime deficit that Penn made up to win the game was its largest this season. The previous best? Eight points, set the previous night vs. Dartmouth.

• Penn finished the season with a 12-2 record in The Palestra, its best mark since the 2006-07 Ivy champions also went 12-2.

• Penn finished Ivy play with a 6-1 home record, best since 2022-23; this is the 18th time the Quakers have gone 6-1 in Ancient Eight play since the start of Ivy play in the 1950s.

• Interesting stat: Penn is now 7-1 when only two players score in double figures, as happened in this game (**Roberts**, 21; **Levine**, 13).

• Penn improved to 10-1 this season when shooting a better field-goal percentage than its opponent.

• Penn is just 2-6 when scoring fewer than 70 points this season—but those two wins have come the last two times the Quakers did it (also a 61-60 win over Princeton on February 7).

• Penn's 21-point first half was the Quakers' lowest-scoring half of the season, and the 10 foul shots they took were a season low.

• **Roberts**—who was honored prior to the game along with fellow seniors **Thrower**, **Dylan Williams** and **Johnnie Walter**—led all scorers with 21 points, 17 of them coming after halftime.

• By the same token, ten of **Levine's** 13 points came in the second half. The sophomore also had seven rebounds.

• **Power** scored all of his nine points in the second half and very nearly had his second double-double in as many nights by adding a game-high nine boards.

• Sophomore **Lucas Lueth** was a huge presence off the bench, with six points and two boards in 24 minutes.

• **Polonowski** also made his presence felt, getting almost eight minutes and scoring five points.

Notemeal vs. Dartmouth

• Penn is 8-1 this season when reaching the 80-point mark against a Division I opponent this season, the eight wins coming in a row after the Quakers lost

their first such game back on November 11 at Providence.

• Penn outrebounded Dartmouth on Friday, 44-33; the 44 boards were two shy of the season high against a Division I opponent, topped only by the 46 the Quakers grabbed against Merrimack in the Cathedral Classic opener back in November.

• Of those 44 rebounds, 15 came on the offensive glass; that was one shy of the season high vs. a D1 foe, behind the 16 grabbed by the Red and Blue vs. Hofstra in its Cathedral Classic finale.

• Penn entered this game having taken more foul shots in league play than anyone else, and the Quakers added 37 to that total against the Big Green—their second-highest total this season, behind only the 41 taken two games ago vs. Cornell.

• **Power** scored 38 points, the fifth-highest scoring game in program history. He also had a game-high 12 rebounds for his fifth double-double this season.

• **Power** was efficient offensively, going 14-22 from the field and knocking down six of his eight three-point shots. The six treys were tied for most by a Penn player this season (**Zanoni** hit six at American on November 9).

• At one point in this game, **Power** had 38 points and the rest of the team had 32. By the same token, at one point in the second half he had scored 22 of Penn's 36 points in the period.

• Speaking of **Zanoni**, he was the Quakers' only other double-figure scorer on Friday, with 10 points.

• Freshman **Jay Jones** had another outstanding performance off the bench, playing nearly 25 minutes and finishing with three points, six rebounds, a game-high four assists—his season/career best—and two steals.

• **Lueth** also came off the bench to grab six boards—four of them coming on the offensive glass—and added two steals.

• Freshman **Dalton Scantlebury** finished with six points and five rebounds.

• **Thrower** scored five points, which doesn't seem particularly noteworthy until you realize they were his first points since January 19.

Notemeal at Yale

• Penn lost despite shooting a season-best 52.6 percent from three-point land (10-19).

• Penn shot 50 percent in the first half (16-32), but didn't hit a field goal for the first five minutes of the second half and ended up shooting just 33.3 percent for the period (9-27).

• **Zanoni** led all scorers in the game, with 20 points; it was his sixth time hitting that mark this season, but his first since doing so against Brown on January 10.

• **Power** added 18 points—knocking down four of his seven three-pointers—and led Penn with eight rebounds. He also had three assists.

• **Roberts** was the Quakers' other double-digit scorer, with 12 points, and he also tied for the team high with four assists, grabbed four rebounds, and came up with two steals.

Notemeal vs. Cornell

• Penn took 41 free throws and made 27, both season highs. The last time the Quakers met both of those numbers was February 2, 2018 when they took 44 foul shots and made 30 against Brown.

• Penn scored 46 points in the second half of Saturday's game, tying a season

high that was originally set the last time the Quakers played the Big Red.

• Penn had just nine turnovers while Cornell had 16; for the weekend, the Quakers had 19 combined turnovers while their opponents had 36, and the Red and Blue scored 45 points off turnovers while their opponents had 15.

• Two weeks after putting six players in double figures in Ithaca, Penn had five score in double digits at The Palestra.

• The biggest push came from **Jones**, who nearly doubled his previous high with 17 points (11 of them coming in the second half).

• **Power** also scored 17 points and led the Quakers with eight rebounds.

• **Levine** finished the night with 16 points, grabbed three boards, dished out four assists, and came up with five steals to give him 11 for the weekend.

• **Roberts** scored 14 points and grabbed seven rebounds, four of them coming on the offensive glass.

• **Lueth** had his first double-figure scoring game as a Quaker, with 11 points, and also recorded six rebounds as well as both of Penn's blocked shots.

Notemeal vs. Columbia

• Penn won a game in which it led for just 2:46 of game time; Columbia lost a game that it led for 33:23.

• Penn won for just the second time when trailing at halftime; the other came against La Salle. The Quakers are now 2-7 in such games.

• Penn won for just the second time when getting outrebounded by its opponent; the other came, you guessed it, vs. La Salle. The Quakers are now 2-7 in such games.

• Where was this game won? Well, Penn committed 10 turnovers and Columbia committed 20. The Quakers had 22 points off turnovers compared to five for the Lions.

• Penn tied a season high with 10 steals on Friday night; the Quakers also did it against NJIT on December 31.

• Penn won for just the third time this season when shooting a worse field-goal percentage than its opponent (Columbia 48.1 pct, Penn 43.5 pct).

• **Roberts** scored 21 points, his team-leading seventh game with 20 or more points. The Quakers are 6-1 in those games. Sixteen of those points came in the final 5:08, 12 coming in the final 2:42.

• **Zanoni** finished the night with 16 points, shooting an efficient 6-10 from the field.

• **Power** had 12 points and added six rebounds, two assists and two steals.

• How about the stat line put together by **Levine**? He flirted with a double-double—nine points and a team-high nine rebounds, which tied his career high—and also dished out six assists and came up with six steals.

• **Lueth** also had nine points and grabbed two offensive boards.

Notemeal vs. Princeton

• The win was Penn's first over Princeton since the 2017-18 season—ending a 14-game losing streak to the Tigers—and tied the all-time series between the rivals, 127-127.

• A clean game by both teams offensively, as they committed just seven turnovers each.

• **Power** led the offense, with 18 points on 6-11 shooting including a trio of treys. He also had seven rebounds and three assists and was named Ivy League Player of the Week the following Monday.

• **Levine** was the Quakers' other double-figure scorer, with 13 points. He also stuffed the stat sheet with three rebounds, three assists and a game-high three steals.

• How about **Jones**? He played more than 22 minutes and led the Red and Blue with eight rebounds to go with six points and two assists.

Notemeal at Cornell

• For just the second time in a game against a Division I opponent this season, Penn never trailed; the other time that happened was November 21 at Drexel.

• Penn set season highs in points (91), first-half points (49), FG percentage (30-54, .556), and assists (20).

• Penn's 23-point lead late in the first half (43-20, then 48-25) was its biggest against a D1 opponent this season.

- Penn put six different players in double figures in the scoring column, the first time that has happened since March 7, 2015—coincidentally, also against Cornell.

- Penn outrebounded Cornell, 36-26, and took 30 foul shots to the Big Red's 19 (doubling them up in the make category, 22-11).

- **Zanoni** led the scoring brigade with 19 points, shooting 6-9 from the field (3-4 from distance) and making all four of his foul shots down the stretch.

- **Roberts** finished with 17 points, draining a trio of treys and hitting six of his seven foul shots. Roberts also tied for game-high honors in rebounds (7) and had five assists.

- **Levine** was efficient offensively, going 5-7 both from the field and at the line for his 15 points. He also had five boards and six assists.

- Junior **Augie Gerhart** was a perfect 6-of-6 from the field on Saturday night, scoring 13 points (including eight in a row to start the second half).

- His colleague at center, freshman **Dalton Scantlebury**, ended the night with 12 points, seven rebounds, two steals and two blocked shots. He also led the Quakers in plus-minus, at +15.

- **Power** scored 11 points, matched his season/career high with six assists—tying Levine for team-high honors—and added four rebounds and two steals.

Notemeal at Columbia

- Penn lost this game despite just eight turnovers while Columbia had 18, a Division I opponent high this season.

- **Power** led all players with 23 points, 19 of them coming in the second half. He also led the Quakers in rebounds (7) and assists (4) and tied his season/career high with five treys.

- **Zanoni** was Penn's only other double-digit scorer, with 15 points; he started the game by scoring 10 of the Quakers' first 14 points.

- **Gerhart** scored eight points—giving Penn its first lead with a steal and score with 9:05 to play—and grabbed five rebounds, two on the offensive glass.

- **Jones** was a factor off the bench, scoring six points and doubling his

previous high with six boards (three offensive). He also had three assists, matching his season/career best.

- **Roberts** entered the night leading the Ivy League in conference scoring but was held to five points; it was just the second time this season he was held under double digits.

Notemeal vs. Yale

- Penn matched its season low with 60 points, set previously in a loss to Hofstra on November 30.

- Penn set a season high for blocked shots in a game with eight as **Gerhart** had three—matching a career high he set in his collegiate debut—and **Lueth** swatted two.

- **Levine** had another strong overall game, tying for game-high honors with 17 points, leading all players in assists (7) and steals (4), and grabbing four rebounds.

- **Power** scored 12 points, led the Quakers with seven boards, and added four assists.

- **Roberts** also had 12 points and recorded six rebounds and two assists.

Notemeal at Harvard

- **Roberts** led the scoring brigade with a game-high 27 points; he was an efficient 9-15 from the field, hit three of his seven trey attempts, and went a perfect 6-6 at the foul line.

- **Levine** stuffed the stat sheet with 15 points, a game-high eight rebounds—a season high and one shy of his career best—four assists (against just one turnover) and four steals.

- **Power** had a strong second half for the second straight game, scoring 10 of his 12 points after the break. He also had four rebounds.

- **Gerhart** grabbed seven rebounds, with five of them coming on the offensive glass.

Notemeal at Dartmouth

- Penn committed only five turnovers, fewest in a game since the Quakers had just four against Princeton on March 9, 2024; the Red and Blue did not have one in the second half on Saturday and recorded 13 points off turnovers while Dartmouth had just four.

- Penn outrebounded Dartmouth on the

day, 40-36, and had 13 on the offensive glass.

- Penn continues to stroke it from the outside; the Quakers entered the day tenth nationally in 3FG percentage (39.4) and shot 9-21 (42.9 pct) from beyond the arc Saturday.

- For the second straight game and the third time this season, Penn was tied at halftime; the Quakers are undefeated in such games (3-0).

- **Power** scored a game-high 27 points and flirted with his fifth double-double of the season with eight rebounds (five offensive). He was an efficient 10-17 from the field (3-5 from distance).

- **Roberts** finished with 25 points, giving him 72 in three Ivy games so far this season (24.0 ppg). He also had four rebounds and two assists and shot 4-7 from beyond the arc.

- The last time Penn had two players scored 25 or more points in the same game was November 26, 2022 when Clark Slajchert had 33 and Jordan Dingle added 26 in the inaugural Cathedral Classic vs. Colgate.

- **Levine** ended the day with 14 points including a pair of emphatic dunks, a one-hander at the end of the first half and a two-hander early in the second. He also dished out three assists without a turnover and shot 5-7 from the field.

- **Michael Zanoni** scored 11 points, his sixth straight game in double digits (17.0 ppg); he hit all four of his field goal attempts in the final 8:43.

- **Gerhart** led all players with nine rebounds, three of them coming on the offensive glass.

Notemeal vs. Brown

- Penn won for just the second time this season when shooting a worse field-goal percentage than its opponent—Brown shot 48.3 percent on Saturday while the Quakers were 46.4 percent. Prior to Saturday, the Red and Blue was 1-6 in such games.

- Penn outrebounded Brown, 35-30, and had 15 assists with just nine turnovers which was one above the Quakers' season best.

- **Roberts** led the scoring charge with 28 points, three short of his season high. He split them almost evenly, with 13 in the first half and 15 after the break.

- **Roberts** also had four rebounds, tied for team-high honors with five assists, and was 12-14 at the foul line which matched his season/career best (also 12-14 against Saint Joseph's on November 17).

- **Zanoni** scored 20 points, 14 of them coming after halftime. He was an efficient 6-9 from the field (3-5 on 3FG) and 5-6 at the foul line.

- **Gerhart** led Penn with six rebounds—four of them coming on the offensive glass—and added eight points.

Notemeal at Princeton

- Penn lost this game despite taking five more shots than its opponent, pulling down 12 more rebounds than the Tigers (35-23), going a perfect 19-19 at the foul line, and putting five players in double figures in the scoring column for the first time this season.

- Penn's 19-19 performance at the foul line marked the first time the Quakers were perfect from the charity stripe since November 11, 2022—when they went 11-11 at Missouri—and marked the most shots made while shooting 100 percent in a game in program history.

- Princeton started the second half going 16-16 from the field, with four of them coming from distance. By the time they missed, the Tigers had turned an eight-point halftime deficit into a 15-point lead.

- **Roberts** made his first appearance since getting injured on December 6 and was right back in the flow, leading Penn with 19 points and tying for team-high honors with four assists. He had the Quakers' first four points on Monday night, the first coming just 20 seconds into the game.

- **Levine** had 15 points—giving him 45 across the last three games—and tied Roberts for team-high honors with four assists.

- **Power** ended the night with 13 points and seven rebounds, tying for game-high honors in boards.

- Freshman **Dalton Scantlebury** also had seven rebounds to go with 12 points off the bench.

- **Zanoni** was Penn's other double-digit scorer, with 13 points as he went 6-8 from the field.

Notemeal vs. NJIT

- Penn sat seven players, including three of its top five scorers—**Roberts, Cam Thrower** and **Scantlebury**—with various illnesses and ailments.

- Penn's 19-point margin of victory was its highest against a Division I opponent this season, and the Quakers held NJIT to an opponent low for the season with the 61 points while matching a season best with 45 second-half points.

- Penn had another strong shooting night from beyond the arc, hitting a season-high 13 triples on 33 attempts (39.4 percent).

- For the first time this season, Penn took more three-point shots (33) than two-point shots (27).

- Defensively, Penn came up with 10 steals which is a team high against a Division I opponent this season (the Quakers had 11 vs. Rowan).

- **Levine** had seven of the steals, his career high and most by a Penn player in a game since the Ivy League's all-time steals leader, Ibrahim Jaaber, had seven at Navy on December 7, 2006.

- **Levine** also scored a career-high 19 points—14 of them coming after halftime—going 7-9 from the field including 4-6 from three-point land. He also matched a season high with five rebounds and dished out four assists.

- **Zanoni** had 23 points for the second straight game, leading all scorers in the contest.

- **Power** posted his fourth double-double, with 13 points and a game-high 11 rebounds. He also dished out five assists and had a steal.

- **Gerhart** nearly had his first collegiate double-double, scoring a career-high 16 points and grabbing nine boards. He also dished out four assists.

- **Lueth** got the start with Roberts and Thrower out of action and scored six points.

Notemeal at George Mason

- Penn had 19 assists, tied for most against a Division I opponent this season (also Villanova on December 6), and the Quakers' 19/8 assist/turnover ratio (2.38) was a season best.

- Penn shot 11-26 from beyond the arc, the third-best shooting game from distance percentage-wise this season and the fourth time the Quakers have reached double digits in treys.

- Penn had seven blocked shots, a season high.

- **Zanoni** scored 23 points, most in a game since he dropped 30 at Providence on November 11; *Zanoni—who was 9-14 from the field including 5-9 on three-pointers—also dished out four assists, his Penn career high.*

- **Thrower** filled the box score with 14 points, six rebounds and five assists. The assist total was a career high, the rebound total matched his career best, and the 14 points were two shy of his career standard.

- After going scoreless in Penn's last game, at Rutgers, sophomore **Levine** scored a season-high 11 points and added five assists (without a turnover) and two steals.

- **Gerhart** was hampered by foul trouble but finished with 10 points and five rebounds in less than 20 minutes.

- **Power** saw his double-figure scoring streak end at ten games on Sunday, as he finished with eight points on six shots. He also had three rebounds and two assists.

Notemeal at Rutgers

- Penn lost for the first time this season when shooting a better field-goal percentage than its opponent (42.6 to Rutgers' 41.1); the Quakers were 5-0 in such games prior to Saturday.

- Penn also lost for the first time this season when outrebounding its opponent (42-29); prior to this, the Red and Blue were 5-0 in such games; *Penn's +13 rebound margin was its second-best this season against a Division I opponent, surpassed only by the +14 (46-32) the Quakers pinned on Merrimack on November 28.*

- Penn had 12 offensive rebounds, compared to eight by Rutgers, and finished with a 20-5 advantage on second-chance points.

- **Power** posted his third double-double of the season, leading Penn with 19 points and grabbing a game-high 13 rebounds which was two shy of his season/career best. Power has scored in double figures in all 10 of Penn's Division I games this season, and he also added two assists and two blocked shots.

- **Scantlebury** had another active night off the bench, finishing with 13 points, seven rebounds and a blocked shot.

Notemeal vs. Lafayette

- Penn committed nine turnovers, a season low, and dished out 18 assists for a season-best 2.00 ratio.

- Penn's leading scorer was **Gerhart**, who dropped a career-high 15 points—all of them in the first half—and added six rebounds. The junior was 6-of-7 from the field.

- **Power** nearly posted his third double-double of the season, with 14 points and a game-high nine rebounds.

- **Scantlebury** also had 14 points, seven in each half. He shot 6-of-9 from the field and also snared three boards.

- **Zanoni** ended the night with nine points; however, after hitting his first two foul shots—giving him 18 in a row to start the season—he missed his third to end his streak.

- **Levine** set a season/career high in assists (8, tops in the game), tied his season best with five rebounds, and knocked down a pair of three-pointers en route to eight points which is one shy of his season high.

- **Thrower** got the start in place of an injured Ethan Roberts and finished the night with six points, three rebounds and four assists.

- **Lueth** scored four points and grabbed seven rebounds, six of them coming on the offensive glass.

Notemeal vs. Villanova

- Penn knocked down 11 three-pointers, one shy of the team high for the season (which, coincidentally, came against another Big East program: Providence).

- **Thrower** was one of three Penn players to score 11 points on the night, his first-double-digit scoring game since he had 16 at American on November 9. Of note, Thrower was a perfect 3-of-3 from beyond the arc.

- **Levine** finished the night with a season-high nine points and also had four assists.

- Sophomore **Michelangelo Oberti** led Penn with five rebounds while senior **Dylan Williams** led the Red and Blue with five assists—without committing a turnover—which was his high at Penn.

- **Jones** also scored nine points, all of them in the second half.

Notemeal vs. Hofstra (CC)

- Penn was outrebounded on the day, 40-31, but the Quakers had 16 offensive boards to Hofstra's eight and scored 19 second-chance points to the Pride's 10.

- **Roberts** was the Quakers' top scorer, with 16 points.

- **Power** finished the day with 10 points, three assists and three rebounds and was named to the all-tournament team.

- **Zanoni** also hit double digits in the scoring column, with 11 points.

- **Scantlebury** led Penn with six rebounds and three steals, scored eight points, and dished off two assists.

Notemeal vs. La Salle (CC)

- For the first time this season, Penn won a game it was trailing at halftime; prior to this, the Quakers were 0-2 in such games.

- For the third straight game, Penn shot at least 50 percent from the field as the Quakers were exactly 50 percent both overall (26-52) and from beyond the arc (10-20).

- **Power** had a monster game, with 29 points as he shot 10-17 from the field including 5-8 from three-point land. Power also added six rebounds, three assists, a steal and a blocked shot.

- **Roberts** was the Red and Blue's only other double-digit scorer, finishing with 12 points to go with four rebounds and two assists.

- **Gerhart** tied for game-high honors with seven rebounds.

- **Jones** was the revelation: he saw his first action since Providence on November 11, coming into the game in the second half and contributing seven points, three rebounds, an assist and two steals in a little more than 12 minutes of action.

Notemeal vs. Merrimack (CC)

- Penn had its best shooting night of the season against a Division I opponent, going 31-58 (53.4 percent) from the floor. Of note, the Quakers were 28-46 (60.9 pct.) inside the arc.

- For the first time this season, Penn got more points from the bench (39) than from its starters (38).

- Penn outrebounded Merrimack, 46-32, the 46 boards serving as a team high against a D1 opponent this season.

- Merrimack's 65 points for the game and 30 first-half points were both opponent lows for this season, as was the Warriors' shooting performance (25-67, .373).

- **Scantlebury** led the charge, scoring 22 points (on a perfect 10-10 shooting night) and grabbing 13 rebounds with eight of them coming on the offensive glass. He also had three blocked shots and two assists.

- **Power** also had a double-double, scoring 14 points and snaring 12 boards. He also led the Quakers with six assists.

- **Lueth** was active off the bench, finishing the game with nine points, four rebounds and a blocked shot in 22 productive minutes.

- **Gerhart** ended the game with eight points—hitting all three of his field goals and both of his foul shots—and added four boards.

Notemeal at Drexel

- For the first time in a game against the Division I opponent this season, Penn never trailed in the contest. The only tie of the night came at 2-2.

- Penn shot 50 percent from the field (27-54), its best percentage against a Division I opponent this season.

- **Roberts** once again led the scoring parade, dropping 30 points including 19 in the first half; *the last time a Penn player scored 30 points in consecutive games was the 2021-22 season, when Jordan Dingle scored 31 against Yale and another 31 six days later at Harvard.*

- **Roberts**—who was 11-18 from the field and a perfect 6-6 at the foul line—also led all players with eight rebounds and added three steals and two assists.

- **Power** had a strong second half,

scoring 12 of his 18 points after the break. He also had four rebounds and three assists.

- **Michael Zanon**i was the Quakers' other double-digit scorer, with 12 points all in the first half. He also had five boards and went 4-4 at the foul line, making him 13-13 for the season.

- **Levine** had season highs in points (7) and rebounds (5), and tied a career high with seven assists (with no turnovers).

Notemeal vs. St. Joe's

- Penn shot 45.2 percent from the field overall (28-62) and 44.4 percent from beyond the arc (8-18); both were season highs against Division I competition.

- For the fourth time in as many games, Penn took more foul shots (23) than its opponent (15).

- Penn led SJU in points off turnovers (24-12), points in the paint (38-32), and second-chance points (8-7).

- Monday's game had more lead changes (12) and ties (15) than any other game so far in this young season; the previous highs were six lead changes and five ties, both at American on November 9.

- **Roberts** led the way offensively for the Quakers, scoring 31 points—two shy of his career high—of which 24 came in the second half. He also had five rebounds, two assists, and tied his career best with three steals.

- **Power** posted his first double-double as a collegian, scoring 23 points and grabbing a game-high 15 rebounds. Both were career highs for the junior transfer.

- **Power's** 15 rebounds were the most by a Penn player in a game since Lucas Monroe grabbed 16 against, you guessed it, Saint Joseph's on November 30, 2022.

- The last time Penn had one player score at least 30 points and another score at least 20 in the same game was December 2, 2023—coincidentally, also a Big 5 game (Clark Slajchert 33 points, Tyler Perkins 20 vs. La Salle).

- **Scantlebury** finished the night with eight points, three rebounds, two steals and two blocked shots in a little less than 17 minutes.

Notemeal at Providence

- The 106 points scored by PC marked the most by a Penn opponent in a game since Duke dropped 114 on the Quakers on December 31, 2009.

- Penn actually took three more shots than Providence (70-67); however, the Quakers shot just 35.7 percent from the field (25-70) while the Friars were 53.7 percent (36-67).

- For the second straight game, Penn shot well from beyond the arc (12-28, 42.9 pct.) which was above what they shot inside the arc (13-42, 31.0 pct.).

- After having a 0.50 assist/turnover ratio at American (9/18), the Quakers had a 1.80 ratio vs. the Friars (18/10).

- For the third time in as many games, Penn took more free throws (24) than its opponent (23); for the first time, the Quakers made fewer (19) than their opponent (21) as PC was a scintillating 91.3 percent at the charity stripe.

- **Zanon**i scored 30 points, a career high, giving him 50 across the last two games. Zanon drained five of his eight three-point shots, giving him 11 treys in the last two games, and was 10-17 overall and 5-5 at the foul line.

Notemeal at American

- Penn struggled a bit offensively, shooting just 42.3 percent (22-52); in fact, the Quakers shot better from beyond the arc (9-21, .429) than they did inside it (13-31, .419).

- Two days after shooting 49 free throws against D3 Rowan, Penn again found its way to the line plenty of times—the Quakers took 32 foul shots Sunday, compared to American's 23.

- **Zanon**i led Penn in scoring, with 20 points, and was 6-of-10 on three-point shots which was one shy of his career high set last year at Penn State.

- **Roberts** filled the box score with 19 points, a game-high five assists, and four rebounds. He drew 12 fouls in the game and was 11-of-14 at the foul line.

- **Thrower** finished the game with 16 points, tying his career high. He was a perfect 7-of-7 at the foul line and 4-of-7 from the field.

***Power** started slow but worked his way into the game, finishing the day with 10 points, seven rebounds and two steals.

- **Gerhart** continued to bring energy at the center spot, grabbing a game-high 11 rebounds (his career high) and adding eight points and two steals. Five of his boards came on the offensive glass.

Notemeal From Rowan

- Penn scored 119 points, a program record; it broke the previous mark of 115 scored on December 1, 1969 against Muhlenberg.

- It was the Quakers' first 100-point game since a 111-57 victory over FDU-Florham on December 6, 2023.

- Penn took 49 free throws, making 33. The last time the Quakers shot that many foul shots was their four-overtime game at Monmouth on November 25, 2017 (50), and the last time they made at least 33 was January 25, 2014 (35-of-43 vs. NJIT).

- Penn outrebounded Rowan, 59-29; the +30 differential was the largest since the Quakers outboarded Bucknell 52-22 almost exactly two years ago (November 8, 2023) and the 59 boards were the most the Red and Blue snared in a single game since they had 59 against Haverford College on December 18, 1993.

- **Roberts** led all scorers with 28 points, going 8-of-11 both from the field and at the foul line. That included a 4-of-5 performance from beyond the arc.

- In his collegiate debut, **Scantlebury** posted a double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds. *The last Penn player to record a double-double in his debut was AJ Brodeur; the program's all-time scoring leader posted 23 points and 11 rebounds at Robert Morris on November 11, 2016.*

- **Gerhart** nearly had his first collegiate double-double, scoring 12 points (matching a career high) and grabbing nine boards.

- After missing all of last season due to injury, **Thrower** played nearly 15 minutes on Friday and finished with 10 points and four assists with just one turnover.

- **Levine** dished out seven assists, a career high, and also had four rebounds and two steals.

- In his first collegiate game, **Jones** had eight points and three assists.

- Ten players saw at least 13 minutes in the game, and all but two of the 15 who played scored at least four points.

2025-26 Schedule Notes

- The Big 5 continued its “pod” setup again for the third straight year. Penn’s pod this year included Saint Joseph’s and Drexel. From those “group stage” games, the teams were paired up for the third annual Big 5 Classic on Saturday, Dec. 6 at Xfinity Mobile Area. At that event, Penn played Villanova in the championship game after La Salle and Drexel met in the fifth-place game and Saint Joseph’s tipped Temple at the buzzer for third place in the city series.

- Penn’s 11/17 home game with the Hawks marked a Palestra return for the Quakers’ most recent head coach; Steve Donahue took over on Hawk Hill in September when previous head coach Billy Lange left the program for a job with the NBA’s New York Knicks.

- Penn’s 11/21 “road trip” to Drexel was the shortest road trip at the Division I level this season—per Google Maps, the distance from The Palestra to the Daskalakis Athletic Center is 0.5 miles.

- Penn hosted a Thanksgiving tournament for the fourth straight season; the Cathedral Classic featured the Quakers, Merrimack, Hofstra, and Big 5 rival La Salle. The teams played doubleheaders on Friday, Nov. 28; Saturday, Nov. 29; and Sunday, Nov. 30.

- A relative newcomer to NCAA Division I, Merrimack is the only first-time D1 opponent this season. That said, this was only the third meeting between the Quakers and Hofstra and the first since they met at Madison Square Garden in the 1998 ECAC Holiday Festival final.

- Penn played five home games in November and will play five more in February; in between those two months, the Quakers are home just four times combined in December and January.

- Penn renewed a dormant rivalry on December 20 with a trip to Rutgers. The Quakers and Scarlet Knights were traditional early-season foes through the 1950s and 1960s and have played 23 times overall, but the holiday matchup was the first between the programs since a 1975 meeting at Madison Square Garden.

- Penn hosted NJIT on New Year’s Eve, the Quakers’ first game on NYE since 2018-19 when they fell in OT to

Monmouth at The Palestra.

- The Ivy League schedule is new this season and Penn had some work to do early on—the Quakers will play five of their first seven league games on the road, then five out of six at home before ending the campaign at Brown on Friday, March 6.

- That said, Penn played just one road “Ivy weekend” this season—that happened January 30-31 at Columbia and Cornell. The Dartmouth-Harvard trip was a Saturday/Monday weekend, the game with the Crimson coming on MLK Day.

- Two of Penn’s Ivy League games aired nationally on ESPNU—the January 24 home game with Yale and the February 7 home game with Princeton.

• **Penn entered the 2025-26 season 24th on the NCAA Division I list of all-time winningest programs?** The Quakers had 1,854 victories in program history at the start of the season.

• **From 1970-79, Penn went 223-56 overall, a .799 win percentage?**

The only schools with a better win percentage during the 1970s were UCLA (.910) and Marquette (.863). UNC was fourth (.786) while Kentucky was fifth (.764).

• **Penn was a part of arguably the most famous Final Four in history?**

The Quakers joined Magic Johnson's Michigan State team and Larry Bird's Indiana State team in Provo, Utah, that year. Penn was beaten by the Spartans in the semifinal round. The fourth team in that Final Four? DePaul—led by Mark Aguirre—which beat Penn 96-93 in OT in the consolation game. The ninth seed in a 10-team East Region (the tournament featured just 40 teams in 1979), many consider that Penn team to be the first “Cinderella” in NCAA Tournament history.

• **Penn's 1970-71 team holds a unique distinction in college basketball?** That Quaker squad went 28-1 overall, losing in the NCAA Tournament East Regional final to Villanova. The Wildcats would later vacate the win due to the use of an ineligible player in the game. Thus, in the NCAA's eyes, Penn's record that year is 28-0—making them the only “undefeated” team in history to play in the NCAA Tournament but not win it. (There have been undefeated teams that did NOT play in the NCAA Tournament, most notably Kentucky in 1953-54 and N.C. State in 1972-73.)

• **Penn is one of just two teams to defeat the University of North Carolina in an NCAA Tournament game played in the state of North Carolina?** On March 11, 1979, the ninth-seeded Quakers defeated the top-seeded Tar Heels, 72-71, in an East Regional second-round game played at Reynolds Coliseum in Raleigh. (That day is known by fans on Tobacco Road as “Black Sunday,” as second-seeded Duke also lost at Reynolds, to St. John's.) UNC's only other loss among its 38 in-state NCAA Tournament games came on March 18, 2018, an 86-65 loss to Texas A&M.

• **Penn holds the second-longest conference winning streak in NCAA Division I history?** The Quakers won 48 straight Ivy League games from 1992-96, including three straight 14-0 seasons in 1992-93, 1993-94 and 1994-95. The overall record for conference wins is held by UCLA, which won 50 straight Pac-8 games from 1971-74.

• **Penn's 1919-20 and 1920-21 teams were considered national champion?** The 1919-20 Quakers went 20-0 during the regular season, clinching the EIL title with a four-overtime win over Princeton (tied for the most OTs played in program history). Penn then met the Western champion, the University of Chicago, in a best-of-three series to determine the national champion and won the series 2-1. The 1920-21 team went 21-2 overall, the only losses coming by a point at Cornell and by two points vs. Penn State. Both of those Quakers teams were retroactively named national champion by the Helms Athletic Foundation.

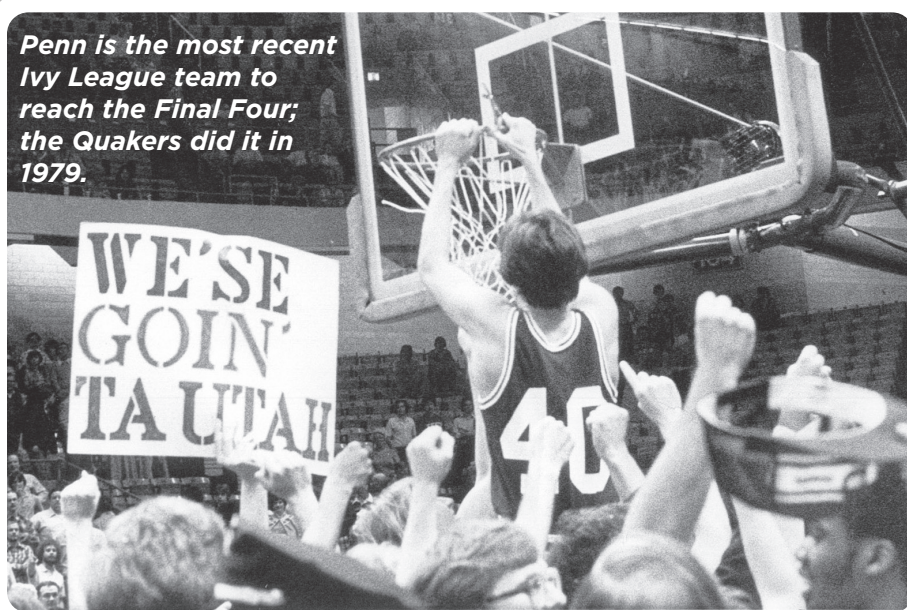
• **Penn's home court, The Palestra, has hosted 48 NCAA Tournament games?** The first were the East Regional in the tournament's first year, 1939. The most recent took place in 1984, when Penn hosted an opening-round tripleheader. The Palestra also hosted the last Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (A.I.A.W.) national championship game, in 1982, as Rutgers beat Texas, 83-77. The following year, the NCAA took full control of the women's basketball national championship.

• **Three former Penn players are currently Division I head coaches?** They are McCaffery here at his alma mater, Matt Langel (Colgate), and Andrew Toole (Robert Morris).

• **When Penn beat Delaware State on December 27, 2017, the Quakers set an NCAA Division 1 record?** Penn had 10 different players hit three-pointers in the 105-52 win at The Palestra, breaking the previous mark of nine set three times, first by Dartmouth in 1993 and most recently by Michigan in 2008.

• **Hall of Fame coach Chuck Daly was once the head coach at Penn?** Before he won a pair of NBA titles as head coach of the Detroit Pistons in 1989 and 1990, and before he headed up the “Dream Team” at the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona, Daly spent six years at the Quaker helm, going 125-38 (including a 74-10 Ivy League mark) and winning four Ivy titles.

Penn is the most recent Ivy League team to reach the Final Four; the Quakers did it in 1979.

FRAN McCAFFERY, JOHN R. ROCKWELL HEAD COACH



- Introduced as the program's 21st John R. Rockwell Head Coach of Men's Basketball on March 27, 2025.

- Grouped with Hall of Famers Rick Pitino (6) and Bob Huggins (5) as the only Division I coaches to lead teams to conference tournament titles in five or more different leagues.

- One of just five Division I head coaches to take at least five different programs to the NCAA Tournament

(Lehigh, UNC Greensboro, Siena, Iowa, Penn); the others are Pitino (who has taken six teams to the NCAAs), Steve Alford, Lon Kruger, and Tubby Smith.

HEAD COACH AT IOWA (2011-25)

- The winningest coach in program history, with 297 victories.

- Coached Iowa to eight 20-win seasons over his last 13 years, including 26 wins in 2022—the second highest win total in single-season history—and 25 wins in 2013. He is one of only two Iowa coaches (Tom Davis) to register at least eight 20-win seasons.

- Coached the Hawkeyes to seven NCAA Tournament appearances and four NIT appearances; Iowa made the second round of NCAAs four times during his tenure and was runner-up at the 2013 NIT.

- Iowa posted first-division finishes in the Big Ten in 11 of his last 13 seasons, including third place in 2015, 2016 and 2021. Iowa won 10 or more conference games nine times in his last 11 seasons including a program-record six straight times from 2019-24.

- Had Iowa nationally ranked in five of his last seven seasons; Iowa was ranked as high as No. 3 in 2016 and 2021. The Hawkeyes were ranked in the final AP Poll three of his last six seasons.

- Coached Iowa to four wins in four days (Northwestern, Rutgers, Indiana, Purdue) to capture the 2022 Big Ten Tournament, the third tournament title in program history (the others coming in 2001 and 2006).

- Recruited and coached six NBA draft picks including a pair of first-rounders: Keegan Murray (fourth overall pick in 2022) and Kris Murray (23rd overall pick in 2023). The second-rounders were Joe Wieskamp (41st overall pick in 2021), Aaron White (49th in 2015), Luka Garza (52nd in 2021), and Devyn Marble (56th in 2014).

- Coached 23 Hawkeyes to professional contracts, either in the NBA or overseas.

- Coached five consensus All-Americans over his last nine seasons: Kris Murray (2023, third team), Keegan Murray (2022, first team), Garza (2020 and 2021, unanimous first team) and Uthoff (2016, second team).

- Kris Murray was a Karl Malone Award finalist and a semifinalist for the Wooden and Naismith awards, while Keegan Murray shattered the school's single-season scoring record (822 points in 2021-22) on his way to becoming the 2022 Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year and a first-team

consensus All-America.

- Garza was a two-time national player of the year (2020/2021) and is Iowa's all-time leading scorer (2,306 points). He is one of nine players in program history to have his number retired (#55). Garza is the only Hawkeye to be a two-time Big Ten Player of the Year, USBWA District VI Player of the Year, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year, Pete Newell Big Man of the Year, unanimous first-team All-America and all-league. He was voted 2021 Big Ten Jesse Owens Male Athlete of the Year. Garza also was awarded the 2021 Senior CLASS Award, which recognizes excellence on the court, in the classroom, and in the community.

- Uthoff is the only Hawkeye to earn All-America honors on the court and Academic All-American of the Year off it in the same season.

- Recruited and coached eight first-team All-Big Ten honorees over his last 11 seasons: Marble (2014), White (2015), Uthoff (2016), Peter Jok (2017), Garza (2020 and 2021), Keegan Murray (2022), and Kris Murray (2023).

- Iowa won a national-best 15 combined games against ranked opponents over a span of two seasons, in 2020 and 2021.

- In 2018-19, McCaffery and his coaching staff guided Iowa to a perfect nonconference record for the first time in 32 years.

- Iowa led the Big Ten in scoring offense five straight seasons, from 2019 to 2023, before finishing second each of his last two seasons.

HEAD COACH AT SIENA (2006-10)

- Went 112-51, still the best five-year span in program history; Siena won 27 games in both 2008-09 and 2009-10, still program marks.

- Led Siena to four straight 20-win seasons from 2006-07 to 2009-10, something never before done in program history and not done since.

- Led the Saints to three straight Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) championships and NCAA Tournament appearances; from 2008-10, Siena was the only program in the country to win its regular-season and postseason titles all three seasons.

- The only coach to guide a MAAC program to two NCAA Tournament wins (83-62 over Vanderbilt in 2008, 74-72 OT over Ohio State in 2009).

- 2009 MAAC Coach of the Year.

- Led Siena to 17-0 home records each of his last two seasons.

- Inducted into the Siena Athletics Hall of Fame in 2017.

HEAD COACH AT UNC GREENSBORO (2000-05)

- In 2001-02, led the Spartans to their first 20-win season since joining the Southern Conference and coached them to a share of the SoCon North Division title for the first time in program history.

- McCaffery's UNCG squads own the two highest-scoring seasons in program history.

FRAN McCAFFERY, JOHN R. ROCKWELL HEAD COACH

HEAD COACH AT LEHIGH (1986-88)

- At 26, was the nation's youngest Division I head coach when he was hired on September 11, 1985.
- Coached two winning seasons in three years; Lehigh had just four such seasons in the 55 years prior to his arrival.
- Coached the 1987-88 Mountain Hawks to a 21-10 record—still tied for second-best in program history—and led them to the NCAA Tournament, the youngest head coach ever to do so at the time.
- Was assistant coach/recruiting coordinator from 1983-85 and helped the team to its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1985. In that position, helped sign Darren Queenan (1985-88) who remains Lehigh's all-time leading scorer with 2,703 points.

COACHING ROOTS

- **1989-99:** Assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Notre Dame under head coaches Digger Phelps and John McLeod. Among the players he recruited to play for Notre Dame were Pat Garrity, Academic All-American of the Year in 1998, and Troy Murphy, the Big East Player of the Year in 2000 and an eventual first-round NBA draft pick. Garrity was also a first-round NBA draft pick and the Big East Player of the Year in 1997. In addition to Murphy and Garrity, McCaffery was involved in recruiting NBA First Round picks LaPhonso Ellis (1992 Draft, No. 5 Denver), Monty Williams (1994 Draft, No. 24 New York) and Ryan Humphrey (2002 Draft, No. 19-Utah Jazz). McCaffery helped the Fighting Irish to NCAA Tournament appearances in 1989 and 1990, the NIT final in 1992, and the NIT quarterfinal round in 1997.
- **1982-83:** Made his coaching debut with Penn following his graduation, as the Quakers' assistant varsity coach and head JV coach under head coach Craig Littlepage.

PLAYING CAREER (WAKE FOREST/PENN)

- Spent his freshman year at Wake Forest University in 1977-78, playing in 28 games and making 11 starts as the Demon Deacons went 19-10.
- Transferred to Penn and sat out the 1978-79 season, when the Quakers advanced to the Final Four.
- Played three years for the Red and Blue, leading the Ivy League in assists (105) and steals (51) as a senior in 1981-82.
- Voted recipient of the Bus MacDonald Award as the team's most inspirational player as a senior.
- Penn went 36-6 in Ivy League play during his three seasons, winning three league titles and playing in the NCAA Tournament his sophomore and senior years.

PERSONAL

- Married to the former Margaret Nowlin, who enjoyed a standout career with the Notre Dame women's basketball program under head coach Muffet McGraw (1,312 career points) and helped lead the Fighting Irish to their first NCAA Tournament as a senior in 1991-92.
- Three sons (Connor, Patrick, Jack) and one daughter (Marit).
- Connor (2019-23) and Patrick (2021-24) both played for their father at Iowa. Connor is second on Iowa's all-time

list for games played, at 166, and is the Hawkeyes' all-time leader—and second in NCAA Division I history—in assist/turnover ratio (3.59). Patrick finished his career with 1,054 career points.

- Connor is currently an assistant coach at Butler University, and Jack—who was Iowa's 2024-25 Gatorade State Player of the Year—is a freshman for the Bulldogs.
- Coach McCaffery is a Philadelphia native who attended La Salle College High School. His father was a regular employee at The Palestra during Coach McCaffery's formative years.
- Older brother, Jack, has been a longtime sports writer for the Delaware County Times.

The moment everyone will remember, of course, is TJ Power draining not one but two treys in the final seven seconds of regulation, the second one coming with exactly 1.0 seconds left on the clock and tying the game at 75-75 after Trevor Mullin had gone 4-of-4 at the foul line.

Playing in what could have been his last game as a collegian, Cam Thrower scored a career-high 19 points with five of them coming in OT. He scored five in a row at a critical juncture of the period, one bucket coming from distance and the other on a putback underneath, as the Quakers led for more than four minutes in overtime. Foul shots by Power and Michael Zanon in the final 17 seconds sealed it.

Two Quick Notes...

- For the second time this season, Penn shot a perfect 100 percent from the foul line (16-16).

- **Power's** 44-point game was tied for the third-best scoring game in program history.
