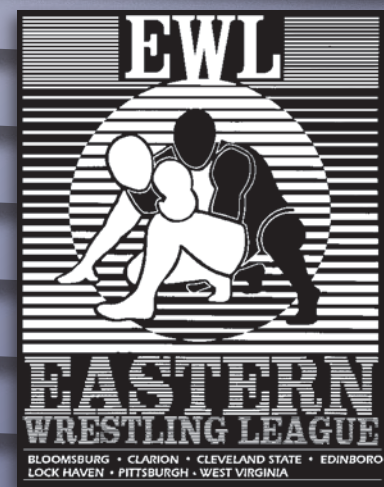

### Senior Associate Athletic Director

Carol Sprague has been at the forefront of many initiatives and positive developments during her University of Pittsburgh career which spans three decades of service.

As Senior Associate Athletic Director, Sprague is responsible for capital project management and facilities and event operations management and serves as sport administrator for women's basketball, volleyball, gymnastics and wrestling. Sprague worked as the athletic department's project manager during the planning and construction of the Petersen Events Center. She also oversaw the department's move from Pitt Stadium and back to the Petersen Events Center. This year, Sprague has contributed to the design and construction of both the Olympic sports weight room and new wrestling facility.

Sprague began her career at Pittsburgh in 1974 as an assistant swimming coach. Since that time she has held a variety of positions including coordinator of student affairs for student-athletes, assistant athletics director for women's sports and associate athletics director for non-revenue sports.

A graduate of Slippery Rock University, Sprague earned her bachelor's degree in health and physical education in 1971 and a Master of Science degree in 1974. A member of the Rockets' swimming team, she was a national championship qualifier and is a member of the Western Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame after an illustrious career as a player and coach for the Pittsburgh Debs softball team.



## KIM KING

### Head Strength & Conditioning Coach

Kim King, the head strength and conditioning coach for Olympic sports, is in her eighth season working with the Panthers. King serves as the strength coach for the women's basketball team, as well as many of the Panthers' Olympic sports.

Having been in the strength and conditioning profession for over 20 years, King boasts a wealth of experience and her work shows in the development of the Panthers' student-athletes.

# 2005-06 SEASON OUTLOOK

**T**here's a lot of excitement surrounding the Panthers' upcoming 2005-06 wrestling season. Ranked in the top-25 of a number of significant polls, the optimism is high, and so are the challenges.

The team has seven returning NCAA qualifiers, two of which have earned three berths to the national championships. Last year Head Coach Rande Stottlemeyer added another student-athlete, Drew Headlee, to Pitt's prestigious list of NCAA All-Americans. In addition, freshman Zach Sheaffer won the EWL title at 285 pounds in his first season as a Panther.

The Panthers are a decorated team going into this season, but a few challenges will face them in the coming year. With early season injuries to both Headlee and Sheaffer, there will be a shuffle to Pitt's starting line up early in the season. In addition, Matt Kocher and Keith Gavin, both NCAA qualifiers last year, could possibly redshirt this season.

With some different faces in the starting line up going into this season, Stottlemeyer said the team has high goals for the next year, and a number of wrestlers are embracing their opportunity to gain some experience in the early dual season.

In addition to an already solid roster, there are a number of freshman with state, district and sectional championship titles. Stottlemeyer predicts that the newcomers to the Panthers will make an impact on the team.

"There's great optimism, and there's good talent," explained Stottlemeyer. "Some kids are going to get the opportunity to step in and help us out."

Looking to improve both their conference and NCAA standings, the following is a breakdown of the 2005-06 Panthers:

## 125 POUNDS

Pitt has a number of options at 125 pounds, but it also has a lot of newcomers. **Zach Bowman** is the returning starter, having placed fifth at last year's EWL Championships. Bowman, after finishing with a 9-15 record, has something of an edge since he did start in a number of dual matches for the Panthers last season.

"He's the guy that brings the experience to the table," Stottlemeyer said of Bowman. "He's worked hard this summer. He's gotten stronger. The experience that he got last year will definitely help him. He'll vie for a starting spot."

Also returning for the Panthers is sophomore **Geoff Moy** who competed against EWL rivals Cleveland State and West Virginia last year.

New to the team will be four freshmen in **Ryan Bosso**, **Brad Gentzle**, **Robbie Hickman** and **Brandon Skonieczky**. Hickman is a three-time New Jersey state placewinner, and Skonieczky was a two-time county and sectional champion from nearby

Fox Chapel High School. Bosso is also a sectional champion and district placewinner from Penn Manor High School. Gentzle led his team to three dual meet state championships.

With no returning NCAA qualifiers for this weight class, Stottlemeyer said that the starting position is up for grabs. "We need a young kid to step up to the plate at 125," he said. "We have some freshmen that are going to make it interesting - Skonieczky, Gentzle and Hickman. All three of those guys are very good freshmen, and they will compete for a starting spot."

## 133 POUNDS

Returning from a season with All-America honors in his first NCAA berth, **Drew Headlee** is Pitt's starter at 133 pounds. Despite being injured for part of the season, Headlee was still able to post an 18-6 record, a third-place finish at the EWL Championships and an eighth-place finish at the NCAAs.

"He's got his sights set high, and we're going to do everything we can to get him where he wants to be," Stottlemeyer said of Headlee. He is recovering from an injury but will likely return to the Panthers' starting line up in late December.

Thus, the Panthers will look to senior **Mike Ciotti** to post some early wins. Ciotti wrestled in last year's EWL Championships, finishing in fourth-place at 149-pounds. He has plenty of experience and brings much to the table for the Panthers.

"Mike Ciotti has provided great depth in his past three seasons as a Panther. We expect him to do everything that he can to keep the starting spot," said Stottlemeyer. "If he can gain confidence early in the season, he has the ability to be very successful."

## 141 POUNDS

**Ronald Tarquinio**, with three NCAA berths and an EWL Championship title in 2004, returns for the Panthers at 141 pounds. Tarquinio has been a consistent winner in the Panthers' line up, posting a record of 26-12 in the 2004-05 season. He also finished second at the EWL Championships last year.

**Zach Sheaffer ('05)**

"Ron is a dedicated athlete that has paid the price to be a national champion," Stottlemeyer said. "He needs to think big and expect to win."

Also returning at 141 pounds will be redshirt freshman **Joe Ciampoli**. Ciampoli injured his ACL midway through last season but will return to the line up this year.

"Joe was 9-2 when he got hurt, and losing him last year was disappointing," explained Stottlemeyer. "He's worked unbelievably hard to rehab his knee, and we are excited to see him compete this year."

Adding depth will be the New York-native **Julian Warshaw**. Warshaw gained experience in his freshman year in both dual matches and tournaments. A freshman who will add both talent and depth to an already strong weight class is two-time state placewinner **Justin Hunt** from Salem, N.Y.

## 149 POUNDS

A key addition to this weight class will be freshman **Joey Ecklof** from Northampton, Pa. A probable starter for the Panthers, Ecklof was a three-time state champion and finished sixth at Senior Nationals. His talent will allow him to make significant contributions to the team.

"Joey is the type of blue-chip talent that you need to be a top program in the country," Stottlemeyer said. "He has goals of being a four-time All-American, and he is fully capable of accomplishing that."

Other new faces at 149 pounds will be true freshmen **Brandon Smith** and **Zach Snyder**. Smith set a school record at Columbia High School after compiling 125 career wins. Snyder helped lead his team to a state championship title in 2005.

## 157 POUNDS

**Matt Kocher** is the front-runner at this weight. Kocher is a two-time national qualifier and has led the Panthers in victories for the past two seasons.

"Matt is fully capable of becoming an All-American this season, and he has the ability to challenge for the national title."

Other returning wrestlers are redshirt freshman **Sean Richmond** and sophomore **Brian Scott**, both projected wrestlers at 157 pounds. Richmond has worked extremely hard to come back from an injury he sustained last year. Scott gained experience as a freshman with 16 tournament matches.

New to the weight class are freshmen **Mike Eckenroth** and **Dave Kapetanovich**. Eckenroth graduated from Cedar Crest High School where he finished with a 102-30 record, and Kapetanovich is a Pittsburgh-native who wrestled for North Hills High School.

## 165 POUNDS

Pitt has another three-time NCAA qualifier returning at 165 pounds with redshirt

senior **Justin Nestor**. Posting a 24-12 record last season, he finished fourth at the EWL Championships.

"Justin's done a great job for us for four years," said Stottlemeyer. "He's come in stronger and more focused. He's improved his technique and strategy, and finishing in the round of 12 last year has given him confidence. We have hopes of him gaining All-American status."

Adding depth to the line up will be **Tim Allen**, a redshirt from the 2004-05 season. In the last two years, Allen has gained experience wrestling in a number of tournaments for the Panthers.

## 174 POUNDS

The Panthers will welcome back **Francis Iorfido** as a starter at 174 pounds. Iorfido redshirted for the 2004-05 season but was an NCAA qualifier in the previous year. Last year, he was 6-2 in tournaments for the Panthers.

"We missed Francis last year," said Stottlemeyer. "Now he's ready to step in and lead the team as one of our captains. We have high expectations for him. Francis is a perfectionist; his goal is to be a national champion."

Also wrestling at 174 pounds will be redshirt freshman **Nick Padezan** who finished 5-2 last year in tournament action. Padezan saw limited action last season but has a solid work ethic and wrestles with great tenacity.

## 184 POUNDS

Stottlemeyer predicts some excitement in the 184-pound weight class with a number of people vying for the starting position.

**Keith Gavin** finished second in this weight class at the EWL Championships last year. "Keith has worked hard in the off-season to gain strength and size," said Stottlemeyer. "He's a true competitor with great scrambling ability, making him very difficult to beat."

**Kyle Deliere** redshirted last season, but has the potential to break into the starting line up this year. **Mike Heist** gained some dual match experience, posting a 2-4 record and finishing 4-10 overall last year.

"Right now it's between Deliere and Heist," Stottlemeyer said of a likely back up for Gavin. "Whoever wrestles for us will be expected to step up and win."

**Matt Darnell** is coming off a redshirt freshman season and is the consummate team player. Last year **Eric Cassidy** competed in nine dual matches for the Panthers as well as a number of tournaments.

## 197 POUNDS

Stepping up to the starting position last season was freshman **Lou Thomas** who will likely remain the Panthers' starter this season as well. Thomas finished in fourth-place at

the EWL Championships and 6-7 for the season.

"Lou had a very tough freshman year," Stottlemeyer said of Thomas' mid-season start last year. "We expect to get a complete turnaround on him this year. He's a guy that's got a year under his belt, and he's got a lot of athletic ability."

Competing with Lou will be redshirt freshman **Dave Thurston** who competed in a number of tournaments for the Panthers last season.

## 285 POUNDS

**Zach Sheaffer** returns to the starting line up after a break out freshman season. The reigning EWL champion at 285 pounds, Sheaffer finished 10-5 in dual matches for the season and 25-13 for the year.

"[Zach's] a great wrestler. He works extremely hard, and he makes conditioning a factor," said Stottlemeyer. "Whether he's redshirting or competing, we know he'll be doing everything necessary to become a national competitor."

## THE SCHEDULE

The Panthers kick off their 2005-06 season against EWL competitor Bloomsburg before heading to a series of tournaments including the Cornell Body Bar and Las Vegas Invitational.

Home meets will begin when the Panthers face Missouri on December 19 before heading to the Southern Scuffle tournament in North Carolina later in the month.

January will continue dual meet action with the Panthers facing powerhouse Lehigh and EWL rival Cleveland State. The Panthers will also host a tri-meet with western Pennsylvania teams Duquesne and Slippery Rock on January 7.

In February, the Panthers will finish up conference competition by facing West Virginia, Clarion, Lock Haven and Edinboro. The Panthers were able to defeat three of the four teams last season and look to win their first EWL dual meet championship this year.

The Panthers will head to Edinboro from March 4-5 for the EWL Championships. Last year, the Panthers had ten wrestlers post top-six performances with one EWL champion at 285 pounds. The Panthers have three conference champions in the last two years, and they look to keep their streak alive.

Finally, the team will head to Oklahoma for the NCAA Championships from March 16-18. With seven NCAA qualifiers returning for the 2005-06 season, the Panthers look to have solid representation this year and have a goal of improving their 29th-place finish at last year's championships.

According to Stottlemeyer, the schedule is a good one for this team because it will familiarize them with a number of key wrestlers they'll face later in the season. By

entering three early tournaments, the Panthers have the opportunity to see some of the nation's best wrestlers prior to the NCAA Championships. With a competitive schedule and some new faces in the starting line up, the Panthers look to have an exciting 2005-06 season.

**T**wenty-six years at the helm of one of the most history-rich wrestling programs in the East is no small accomplishment. Pittsburgh's head wrestling coach, Rande Stottlemeyer, has done it the old-fashioned way: a dedication and commitment to one's principles and beliefs and a good day of hard work.

Along with his assistant coaches, Stottlemeyer has continued a winning tradition that he was a part of prior to his coaching days.

Last season, Stottlemeyer coached yet another NCAA All-American in Drew Headlee, giving him 24 total to date. In addition, Zach Sheaffer became the EWL Champion at 285 pounds in his first season as a Panther.

Three years ago, Carl Fronhofer, now an assistant coach under Stottlemeyer, went from being unseeded to an NCAA finalist and an All-American at 174 pounds.

"Jason [Peters], Carl and Bryan [Stout] have done an outstanding job with the student-athletes on this team," Stottlemeyer said. "All three guys have an amazing rapport with our team and with prospective wrestlers out there at the high school level."

Pittsburgh's all-time winningest coach with 223 victories in those 26 seasons, Stottlemeyer still enjoys what he does and gets just as much of a thrill in seeing his team succeed that he did in taking the job back in 1979.

His excitement and enthusiasm for a sport he has been a part of for over 30 years is contagious as he talks about his coaching duties with the Panthers.

"Coaching at the University of Pittsburgh has given me an opportunity to work with some top-notch assistants," Stottlemeyer said. "It has also given me an opportunity to help student-athletes build character and acquire tools they will need in the future."

The Panthers have seven NCAA qualifiers returning, six from 2005 and last year's redshirt, Francis Iorfido.

During his tenure, Stottlemeyer has produced a two-time national champion in Pat Santoro, 24 NCAA All-Americans, 106 national qualifiers and 25 Eastern Wrestling League Champions. In 16 of the last 22 years of his career, Stottlemeyer has coached at least one NCAA All-American and his teams have finished in the Top 30 nationally.

Academically, seven of his athletes have been honored as recipients of either the Blue-Gold or Panther Awards, student-athletes whose names are permanently etched in the stones of the sidewalk leading between the Cathedral of Learning and Heinz Chapel. His most recent addition to that special list was Fronhofer, who earned the Blue-Gold Award in 2003.

In addition, two of Stottlemeyer's former wrestlers, Greg Zimmerman and John Withrow, were the recipients of the prestigious Omicron Delta Kappa Award, presented annually to the outstanding senior student at Pittsburgh. Numerous Pittsburgh wrestlers have been named to the Eastern Wrestling

League's Academic Honor Roll.

Stottlemeyer's strong ties and success in the sport of wrestling date back to his high school career at Hickory High School in nearby Hermitage, Pa., where he was a PIAA state runner-up and two-time Junior National Freestyle wrestling champion.

Following a stellar scholastic career at Hickory, Stottlemeyer enrolled at the University of Pittsburgh, where he became a three-time NCAA All-American, achieving that level of distinction only one year before becoming a full-time assistant coach to then Panther wrestling coach Dave Adams. As a collegian, Stottlemeyer put together a record of 68-16-2, won one EWL title and served as team captain for each of his varsity seasons.

As a coach, Stottlemeyer stresses the importance of keeping one's priorities straight.

"What we hope to accomplish here at Pittsburgh is to give our guys tools for life," Stottlemeyer said. "I believe in education through athletics. You learn so much in the sport of wrestling, where there is no place to hide. It is two guys going against each other, exposed in a public forum."

"We want our wrestlers to not just love the sport but love the process of progressing in our sport. It's important for them to realize that although they only do it for a short period of time, wrestling will be a part of who they are the rest of their lives."

And as a celebrated wrestler and coach, Stottlemeyer, who in 1992 received induction into the Western Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame, realizes the unique nature of his chosen sport and the value of its potential rewards.

"Wrestling is a very grueling sport. And in order to be successful it takes an unusual amount of discipline and the ability to make a lot of personal sacrifices. It's a very combative sport and a battle of wills. Who's going to quit first? And that's one of the things I emphasize most to the guys — never quit. Your opponent may end up beating you, but don't give up. Because then you've lost more than just a wrestling match."

Those words tell more about Stottlemeyer than any others. His work ethic is unquestionable as is his desire to keep Pittsburgh among the elite wrestling programs in the country.

## JASON PETERS

### Assistant Coach

**J**ason Peters begins his fourth season on the Pittsburgh coaching staff and third as the top assistant under Head Coach Rande Stottlemyer.

"Jason's main responsibility has been recruiting," said Stottlemyer. "That's an area where you need somebody who knows all the kids, is diligent and knows the sleepers as well as the superstars."

"I think Jason does a really good job of scouring the country, knowing the best kids out there and then getting us in the door."

In his first season with the Panthers, Peters concentrated on recruiting and spent last two years helping with on-the-mat training for all of the Panthers' wrestlers.

In his past three seasons with the Panthers, Peters has helped now assistant coach and former Pitt wrestler Carl Fronhofer to All-America status and the NCAA finals in 2003. Last season, he coached his second wrestler to All-America status and six Panthers to qualify for the NCAA Championships.

Peters joined the Panthers from Harvard University. He was an assistant coach with the Crimson for the 2001-02 season.

While at Harvard, he helped lead individual workouts for the wrestlers while training himself for freestyle competitions. Peters was also an instructor for the Dave Schultz

Wrestling Club in Boston, Mass.

"Jason has a wealth of coaching experience that has helped us get better in training and in practice before we can get better in meets and in the tournaments," Stottlemyer said.

In his spare time, Peters was a personal wellness trainer and promoter for the Boston Sports Club at the Harvard University Recreational Department. There, he educated members by providing specialized wellness programs designed for specific individual needs, incorporating exercise and nutrition.

Peters also served as the head wrestling coach for the Massachusetts Cadet and Junior National Team. He worked directly with the USA Wrestling state director and headed his team to the national competition in Fargo, N.D. His team was the first in 10 years from Massachusetts to compete in the Cadet and Junior Nationals.

From 1998-2001, Peters was the head assistant wrestling coach at Princeton University where he served as recruiting coordinator as well as helped with marketing, fundraising and the development of practice plans and strategies.

Prior to Princeton, Peters gained experience as an assistant wrestling coach at his alma mater, East Stroudsburg University. In 1997-98, Peters assisted the coaching staff at East Stroudsburg with training the team's wrestlers for competition.

He is a 1998 graduate of East Stroudsburg with a bachelor's degree in movement studies and exercise science with a concentration in exercise physiology.

# COACHING STAFF



**CARL FRONHOFER**  
Assistant Coach

**C**arl Fronhofer enters his third season as an assistant coach with the Panthers' wrestling team after culminating an outstanding career as a Pitt grappler, earning All-America honors as a senior in 2003 by advancing to the national finals at 174 pounds.

Fronhofer is responsible for helping the Panthers' techniques and training methods in the wrestling room as well as recruiting, something that Head Coach Rande Stottlemeyer feels Fronhofer has done very well in his first few years.

According to Stottlemeyer, Fronhofer brings a unique aspect to the group of coaches in that he's still training as a wrestler and can better demonstrate to the athletes the techniques he's trying to convey. "Carl's trying to make the Olympic team," said Stottlemeyer. "So our guys see him training and going through the same things they're going through. He sets a great example for them that way."

In his five seasons as a wrestler at Pittsburgh, Fronhofer won 123 matches against just 39 losses. His win total is the third-highest in Panthers history, behind only Pat Santoro (161) and Rob Loper (131).

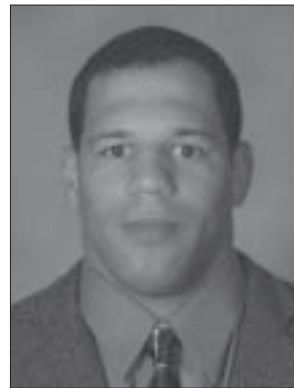
As a freshman, Fronhofer became just one of five first-year Pittsburgh wrestlers to win 30 matches in a season when he finished the year 30-11. He qualified for his first NCAA Championships and won his first Nationals match. Also that year, Fronhofer won his second consecutive FILA Junior National Greco-Roman title at 167.5 pounds and was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Wrestler for the second time as well.

Fronhofer won an EWL title at 165 pounds in 2001 and qualified for his second straight NCAA meet. During the season, he was a perfect 11-0 in dual meets.

After a third straight appearance at NAAs as a junior in 2001-02, Fronhofer moved up a weight class prior to his senior year. After finishing second at the EWL Championships, Fronhofer won five straight matches before dropping the championship match to Robbie Waller of Oklahoma by a 7-3 decision. He earned All-American honors for his second-place finish, the first Panthers' All-American in three years and first finalist in 13 years.

In addition to coaching, Fronhofer continues to wrestle on the national level. In 2005, he captured a fourth-place finish at the U.S. Nationals and a second-place finish at the NYAC International Tournament. His future wrestling goals include making the U.S. National Team and continuing with training until the 2008 Olympics.

Fronhofer is a 2003 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh and earned his bachelor's degree in sociology. He was a NCWA first team Academic All-American as a senior.



**BRYAN STOUT**  
Volunteer Assistant Coach

**B**ryan Stout, now in his fourth season working with the Panthers' wrestling program as a volunteer assistant coach, has helped mold the heavier weight classes into solid competitors. Stout was a four-time All-American at Clarion University, becoming the Golden Eagles' only four-time honoree.

After being named the Eastern Wrestling League's Freshman of the Year in 1993-94, Stout went on to win two EWL titles. He was also a three-time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference finalist, winning two PSAC titles. A 190-pounder for his first three years at Clarion, Stout moved up to the heavyweight class in his senior season. Stout's wrestling achievements were recognized last year as he was a 2005 inductee into the EWL Wrestling Hall of Fame.

With the Panthers, Stout has offered his time to concentrate on technique and training with the upper weight classes for Head Coach Rande Stottlemeyer. In 2005, Stout helped coach Zach Shaeffer to an EWL Championship in his first season with the Panthers. "I think he's done a good job with Zach in particular, in terms of trying to develop him," Stottlemeyer said. "And obviously [Shaeffer] won EWLs last year as a freshman, so Bryan must be doing something right."

"Having him on the staff has given us a wealth of championship experience. He was a very strong and intelligent wrestler at Clarion and he has helped the wrestlers at Pittsburgh improve in trying to get to the same level. He is excellent in the wrestling room and an outstanding technician. Bryan also communicates extremely well with the wrestlers on this team and they have a great deal of respect for him."

Before his time at Clarion, Stout was a three-time district and region champion at Southern Regional High School in Barnegat, N.J. He also became the school's first state champion in his senior year. In that incredible season, no opponent scored a single point on Stout and every one of his victories was by major decision, technical fall or pin.

After his graduation from Clarion in 1997, Stout worked at a medical marketing company in Philadelphia for two years while helping out with the University of Pennsylvania's wrestling program. Stout moved to Pittsburgh in 1999 and has worked with Bayer Corporation for the past four years. In 2002-03, he held a sales manager position at Bayer for a nationwide network of distributors. Now, he works in the sales and marketing department, focusing on national industrial paint accounts.

Stout and his wife currently reside in Mt. Lebanon with their three sons.

# DAVID SANDBERG CHAMPION AWARD

David Sandberg was a valued and integral member of the Panthers wrestling family from 2000 to 2003.

In 2001 and 2002, Sandberg was an NCAA qualifier at 197 pounds for Head Coach Rande Stottlemeyer and had an overall record of 47-25, including a 20-10 mark in dual meets. In fact, Sandberg did not miss a dual meet in his two years with the team.

Then, he joined the Panthers' coaching staff for the 2002-03 season until his passing in January of 2003.

"David was everything a coach wanted as a wrestler," Stottlemeyer said. "David was as fine a young man as we have ever recruited to this University."

As just the second wrestler recruited west of the Mississippi River by Stottlemeyer, Sandberg didn't disappoint after earning NJCAA All-America status as the national runner-up in 2000. He finished in fourth place at the EWL Championships in both 2001 and 2002 and qualified for the NCAAs in both years.

In each of his two NCAA appearances, Sandberg upset a seeded opponent in the first round. He finished his career with 13 major decisions and seven falls among his 47 victories.

Sandberg was a regional, state, and three-time district champion at North Central High School in Spokane, Wash., and compiled a cumulative record of 132-14. He also garnered all-city and all-state honors as a track athlete and all-city honors in football.

Sandberg was a native of Spokane and is survived by his mother Sheryl and his grandparents, Bonnie and Wesley Butler.

# NEW TRAINING FACILITY

*The Panthers' new training room captures the program's rich history and demonstrates the university's commitment to the future of Pitt Wrestling.*

The 2005-06 season brings new changes to the Pitt wrestling program as it welcomes a new training facility located in the Fitzgerald Field House. The original wrestling room was built in 1951 along with the rest of the Field House, but hadn't been updated until this summer.

Pitt's wrestling program is ranked 13<sup>th</sup> nationally for having 15 NCAA champions. The program continues to produce All-Americans and EWL champions as well. With the addition of the new wrestling room, the Panthers are in a facility that is representative of a rich and proud tradition that is Pittsburgh wrestling.

The new wrestling room is twice the size of the previous training facility while containing new floor and wall mats. In addition, the room is equipped with a new ventilation system and lighting. Adding to the facility is a video and recruitment room as well as a cardio area on a balcony above the surface.

"We've really gone from a one to a ten," said head coach Rande Stottlemeyer. "I think it exceeds expectations when people walk in and see what's been done."

Stottlemeyer said that the improvements made under the guidance of athletic director Jeff Long and senior associate athletic director Carol Sprague have boosted the morale of the team.

The new wrestling room is one of two new facilities the athletic department is introducing for the 2005-06 year. An Olympic sports weight room was also added to the Fitzgerald Field House and will serve as a primary training facility for over 300 Pitt student-athletes. According to Stottlemeyer, these two additions have given the teams a renewed sense of pride in their university and should contribute to improving a number of successful programs.



The new wrestling facility officially opened on Friday, October 14. A number of wrestling alumni returned to welcome in a new era in Pitt wrestling. 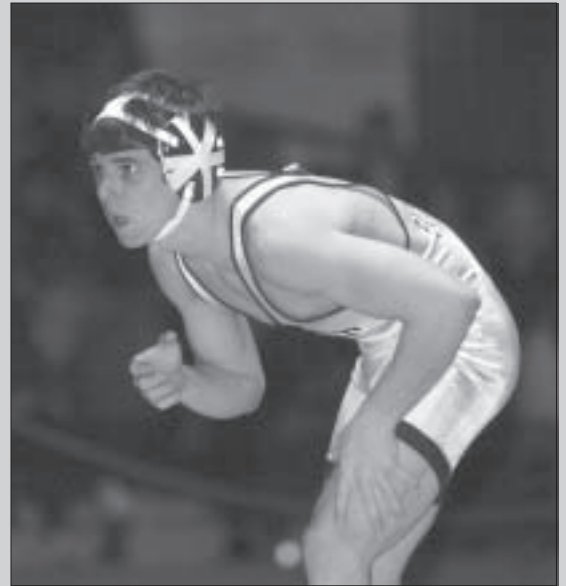


If you ask Drew Headlee how long he's been wrestling, he'll tell you since age five. If you ask him how long he's been competitive, he'll again tell you since age five. For Headlee wrestling is more than just a sport or a hobby. It's his passion and something he's worked to perfect for over 15 years.

In 2005, Headlee's hard work and diligence paid off at the NCAA Championships where he earned All-America honors with an eighth-place finish. The glory didn't come without struggles, though. Earlier in the season Headlee dislocated his shoulder in a match against Matt Ciasulli of

Lehigh, causing him to miss a couple of key dual meets in mid-season. Not the type to be sidelined for too long, Headlee fought back to a third-place finish at the EWL Conference Championships, earning him his first NCAA berth.

Headlee became an All-American after defeating Derek Moore of UC-Davis, a wrestler he had lost to earlier in the season at the Las Vegas Invitational. Always looking to turn a negative into a positive, Headlee says he prefers wrestling opponents he's lost to in the past. He believes it gives him a certain edge when they meet again. "I knew what was going to be happening in the match," he said. "If I had been wrestling him for the first time, it probably would have gone the same as it did in Las Vegas."



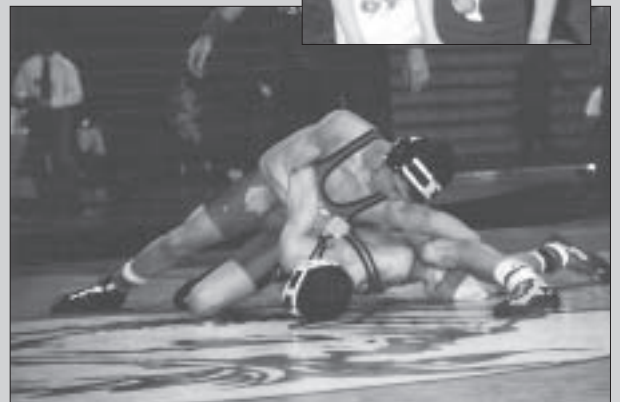
Now that he's received national honors and numerous preseason accolades, Headlee knows there are higher expectations going into this season. "It gives me much more confidence in wrestling better guys," he said of the hype. "Now I'm going into [the season] with the mentality that I'm just as good as anyone. The nervousness is gone."

What's left for Headlee now that he already achieved status as one of the nation's best as just a sophomore? "Don't get me wrong, I like having my picture on the All-American wall, but now I want my picture up there," he said, pointing to the wall of NCAA Champions.
