#### Game Storylines

- Pitt looks to enhance its postseason profile when it hosts the Miami Hurricanes at Heinz Field. The Panthers gained bowl eligibility with their 17-16 win at Syracuse last week. A victory over the Hurricanes would give Pitt a seventh win and improved positioning for an ACC bowl slot.

- In addition to bowl implications, Pitt will have sentimental motivations against the Hurricanes. Eighteen seniors will be making their final appearance at Heinz Field in a Pitt uniform. Three of those seniors — running back Desmond Brown, linebacker Shane Gordon and linebacker Emanuel Rackard — hail from the state of Florida.

- The Panthers seek their first win over Miami in eight tries. The Hurricanes have won their past seven encounters with Pitt, including 31-3 at Heinz Field in 2010. Pitt's last victory in the series occurred in 1997 when the Panthers upset No. 21 Miami, 21-17, before a Thursday night ESPN television audience.

- Pitt senior defensive tackle Aaron Donald is one of the most productive — and disruptive — players in the country. Donald leads the nation in tackles for loss (2.4 per game), while ranking 10th in sacks (0.91 per game) and 11th in forced fumbles (0.36 per game).

- Perhaps Aaron Donald's most impressive stat this season: more than half of his total tackles (51) have been behind the line of scrimmage (26).

- Aaron Donald is a finalist for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award. He is a semifinalist for the Bednarik Award, Outland Trophy and Lott IMPACT Trophy.

- Tyler Boyd is having one of the most productive seasons by a freshman receiver in Pitt history. With one regular-season game to go, Boyd has 68 catches — the most of any freshman in the country and one reception shy of Larry Fitzgerald's Pitt frosh record of 69.

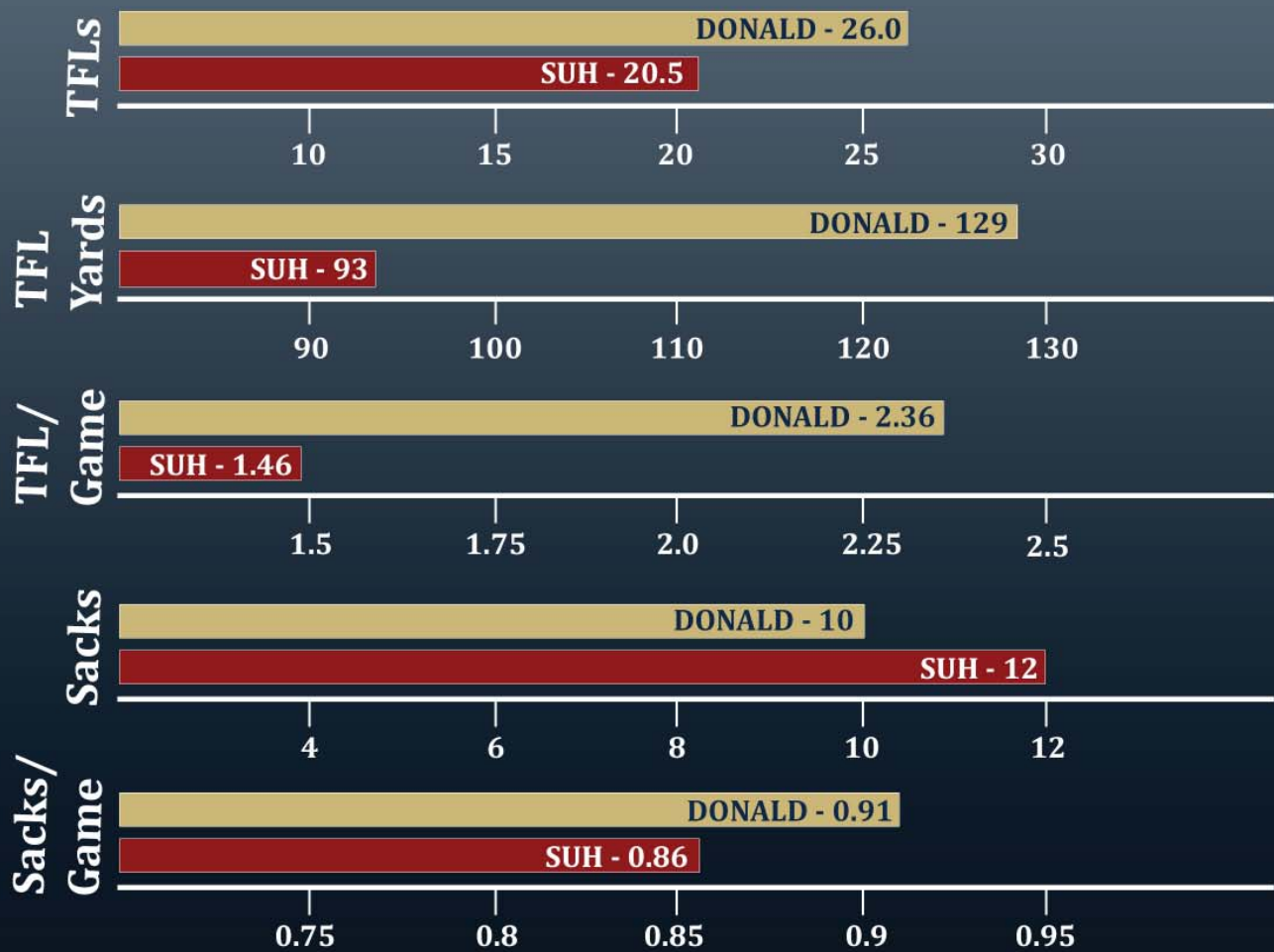
# DONALD VS. SUH COMPARISON

✓ In 2012, Paul Chryst's first season as head coach, Pitt won four of its final six regular-season games to earn a berth in the BBVA Compass Bowl. Pitt notched two victories over Top 25 opponents — 35-17 over No. 13 Virginia Tech and 27-6 over No. 19 Rutgers — and nearly claimed a third before falling in three overtimes, 29-26, to eventual BCS title game entrant Notre Dame.

✓ Known for his grooming of quarterbacks, Chryst helped senior Tino Sunseri to the finest season of his career in 2012. Sunseri passed for 3,288 yards (the second highest single-season total in school history) with 21 touchdowns against just three interceptions. Tailback Ray Graham rushed for a career-high 1,042 yards, giving Pitt a 3,000-yard passer and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season for the first time ever.

✓ Chryst joined Pitt following an exceptional tenure at Wisconsin, where he earned acclaim as one of college football's finest teachers and strategists. The Badgers compiled a 60-19 record (.759) during his six seasons overseeing the offense (2006-11).

✓ Chryst was twice named a finalist for the prestigious Broyles Award (2010 and 2011), annually presented to college football's top assistant.

✓ In 2011, Chryst helped Wisconsin to an 11-3 record and its second consecutive Big Ten title and Rose Bowl berth. The Badgers featured a prolific offense that set no fewer than a dozen school records, including points per game (44.1 avg.), total offense per game (469.9 avg.), total rushing yards (3,298) and total passing yards (3,280).

✓ From 2009-11, Wisconsin achieved the Big Ten's best record (32-8, .800) while averaging 39.2 points per game during that span.

✓ During his tenure as the Badgers' offensive coordinator (2006-11), Wisconsin produced nine first team All-Americans on offense: tackle Joe Thomas (unanimous selection, 2006), tight end Travis Beckum (2007), guard Kraig Urbik (2008), tackle Gabe Carimi (unanimous selection, 2010), tight end Lance Kendricks (consensus selection, 2010), guard John Moffitt (2010), running back Montee Ball (2011), center Pete Konz (2011) and guard Kevin Zeitler (2011).

✓ Chryst coached three major award winners on offense while at Wisconsin: quarterback Scott Tolzien, who won the 2010 Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award (nation's top senior quarterback), and two Outland Trophy winners (nation's outstanding college lineman) in tackles Gabe Carimi (2010) and Joe Thomas (2006).

✓ Chryst's offenses at Wisconsin produced five Big Ten Player of the Year awards. The honorees include running back John Clay (2009 Big Ten Player of the Year), tackle Gabe Carimi (2010 Big Ten Lineman of the Year), running back Montee Ball (2011 Graham-George Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year and Ameche-Dayne Big Ten Running Back of the Year) and quarterback Russell Wilson (2011 Griese-Brees Big Ten Quarterback of the Year).

✓ Under Chryst's guidance, quarterback Russell Wilson led the nation in pass efficiency in 2011 with a staggering 191.78 rating (topping Baylor Heisman Trophy winner Robert Griffin III's 189.48). Wilson, who is now with the Seattle Seahawks, threw for 3,175 yards with 33 touchdowns and only four interceptions in leading the Badgers to the Big Ten title and a Rose Bowl berth.

✓ In addition to a potent passing game in 2011, Chryst also oversaw a rushing attack led by first team All-American and Heisman Trophy finalist Montee Ball, who led the nation in total rushing yards (1,923) and scoring (39 touchdowns and 16.71 points/game). Ball's 39 TDs tied the NCAA record set by Oklahoma State's Barry Sanders in 1988.

✓ In 2010, Chryst's Wisconsin offense nearly became the first team in FBS history to have three different players rush for at least 1,000 yards in the same season: James White (1,052 yards), John Clay (1,012) and Montee Ball (996). That team had an incredible 48 rushing touchdowns, tying the Big Ten record.

✓ Chryst was offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Oregon State during the 2003 and '04 seasons. The 2003 Beavers became the first team in NCAA Division I history to have a 4,000-yard passer (Derek Anderson), 1,500-yard rusher (Steven Jackson) and two 1,000-yard receivers (James Newson and Mike Hass).

✓ Chryst has coached in 12 bowl games during his collegiate career, including the 2011 and 2012 Rose Bowl games.

✓ Chryst's coaching career includes seven seasons in professional football, including a three-year stint in the NFL as tight ends coach with the San Diego Chargers (1999-2001). He also spent time with the Canadian Football League's Saskatchewan Roughriders (1996) and Ottawa Rough Riders (1994), as well as the World League's San Antonio Riders (1991-92).

## SERIES NOTES

This is the 33rd meeting between Pitt and Miami in a series that dates back to 1950...this year's meeting will serve as the first Atlantic Coast Conference game between the two schools...the Panthers and Hurricanes will meet annually as members of the ACC's Coastal Division...Miami leads the all-time series 22-9-1, and has won the last seven games, including a 31-3 decision at Heinz Field in 2010...the Panthers' last victory over Miami was on Sept. 18, 1997, when Pitt defeated the No. 21 Hurricanes, 21-17, at Pitt Stadium in front of a Thursday night ESPN television audience...the victory launched Pitt to a 6-5 regular season and Liberty Bowl berth, the program's first postseason appearance in eight years...prior to the '97 encounter, Pitt's last win over Miami came during the 1976 national championship year (36-19 at Pitt Stadium).

Pitt will pay tribute to 18 seniors making their final Heinz Field appearance when the Panthers host Miami on Friday, Nov. 29. Pitt's 2013 senior class includes defensive back E.J. Banks, long snapper Kevin Barthelemy, running back Desmond Brown, defensive lineman Aaron Donald, defensive lineman Tyrone Ezell, linebacker Shane Gordon, placekicker/punter Drake Greer, defensive back Jason Hendricks, offensive lineman Juantez Hollins, offensive lineman Cory King, defensive lineman Jack Lippert, linebacker Emanuel Rackard, quarterback Tom Savage, offensive lineman Ryan Schlieper, wide receiver Devin Street, wide receiver Ed Tinker, defensive back K'Waun Williams and punter Matt Yoklic.

### SEEKING WIN #7

Pitt achieved its sixth win of the year — and bowl eligibility — by defeating Syracuse, 17-16, last week. The Panthers can improve their postseason outlook by defeating Miami at Heinz Field in the regular-season finale. A win would guarantee Pitt a winning season, something it has not achieved since 2010 when it finished 7-5 during the regular season and 8-5 overall following a BBVA Compass Bowl victory over Kentucky (27-10).

### CLOSE SHAVES

Four of Pitt's five losses this season have been by a combined 31 points, an average of just over seven points per game. Two of the Panthers' losses — 24-21 at Navy and 34-27 to North Carolina — have been by single-digits with the winning score coming late in the fourth quarter.

Pitt's lone lopsided defeat came in the opener to Florida State, 41-13. The undefeated Seminoles (11-0) have been outscoring opponents 55.2 to 11.4 this season.

### 124 SEASONS AND COUNTING

The 2013 football season marks the 124th in Pitt history. The Panthers, who played their inaugural season in 1890, have a 689-502-42 all-time record (.576).

The Panthers boast the ACC's most productive receiving tandem. Senior Devin Street and freshman Tyler Boyd are the only pair of teammates to rank in the ACC's Top 6 in **both** receiving yards per game and receptions per game.

## THE BILETNIKOFF LIVES HERE

Two Pitt players — Devin Street and Tyler Boyd — were named to the watch list for the 2013 Biletnikoff Award, annually presented to the outstanding receiver in college football.

Pitt owns a strong history with the Biletnikoff. Former Panthers Larry Fitzgerald (2003) and Antonio Bryant (2000) both earned the honor before moving on to careers in the National Football League.

A third winner of the Biletnikoff Award was added to the Pitt family in 2012 when Bobby Engram joined Paul Chryst's staff as wide receivers coach. As a collegian at Penn State, Engram was the award's inaugural winner in 1994 after catching 52 passes for 1,029 yards (19.8 avg.). He went on to a 14-year NFL career, compiling nearly 8,000 receiving yards.

## BOY OH BOYD

Tyler Boyd has four 100-yard receiving games to his credit, matching the Pitt freshman record established by Larry Fitzgerald in 2002. Boyd most recently had 118 yards and a touchdown on 11 catches at Georgia Tech on Nov. 2.

Boyd accomplished the feat in just eight collegiate games. Fitzgerald notched his fourth 100-yard receiving performance in the 12th game of his freshman season.

Boyd had three consecutive 100-yard receiving games in September, becoming only the second Pitt freshman to reach that yardage milestone in three straight contests. Antonio Bryant also had three consecutive in 1999. No Pitt freshman has ever had four consecutive 100-yard receiving games.

### BENNETT BUSTS OUT

Junior Isaac Bennett enjoyed a career night in Pitt's 35-24 victory over Old Dominion on Oct. 19. Bennett rushed for 240 yards and three touchdowns on 30 carries (8.0 avg.) — all personal bests. It was Pitt's highest single-game rushing performance since Dion Lewis had 261 yards on 42 carries (6.2 avg.) at Cincinnati in 2010.

Bennett leads the Panthers in rushing on the season with 654 yards on 145 carries (4.5 avg.) and six TDs.

### CONNER CONTRIBUTES

Freshman running back James Conner is Pitt's second leading rusher with 548 yards and seven touchdowns on 115 carries (4.8 avg.). Conner has posted a team-high three 100-yard rushing efforts this year. His seven rushing TDs also lead the Panthers. ### TOM TERRIFIC

Senior quarterback Tom Savage produced one of the finest passing performances in school history in Pitt's 58-55 win at Duke on Sept. 21. Savage completed nearly 70% of his passes (23 of 33) for 424 yards and tied an ACC record with six touchdown passes. His yardage total was the most by a Pitt quarterback since 1997 and ranks fourth in school history. Savage garnered a boatload of honors for his sensational performance, including Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week, Davey O'Brien Quarterback of the Week and ACC Offensive Back of the Week.

## TDs AGAINST INTs

Over Pitt's past seven games, Tom Savage has thrown nine touchdowns against just two interceptions. Savage's INTs during that stretch came in the final minute against Georgia Tech and on a deflected pass at Syracuse.

On the season, Savage has thrown 19 touchdowns against just eight interceptions. His TD pass total ranks third in the ACC and 30th (tied) nationally.

## TAKING CARE OF THE ROCK

Pitt has 15 total turnovers on the season (eight interceptions and seven fumbles). That total ranks third in the ACC (tied) and 35th nationally. Last season, the Panthers ranked tied for first nationally (and first in the Big East) with just 10 lost turnovers (seven fumbles and three INTs).

## SENSATIONAL SCORING OUTBURST

Prior to winning a defensive slugfest with Virginia, 14-3, on Sept. 21, Pitt was coming off its highest scoring game in nearly two decades. The Panthers produced 58 points in their win at Duke on Sept. 14. It was their highest scoring production since a 66-30 win over Eastern Michigan on Sept. 9, 1995.

Before facing Duke, Pitt put up 49 points in a Sept. 14 victory over New Mexico. The combined 107 points marked the Panthers' highest total in back-to-back games since scoring 121 in consecutive wins in 1977 (76-0 over Temple and 45-7 over Boston College).

## O-LINE GROWING UP

Pitt features one of its least experienced offensive lines in recent years. Junior guard Matt Rotheram leads the unit with 26 career starts followed by senior guard Cory King with 23. (King, however, has missed the past six games due to injuries.)

At Georgia Tech on Nov. 2, freshman Dorian Johnson started at left tackle, becoming the first true frosh to make a start on Pitt's offensive line since 2006. Johnson started again on Nov. 16 against North Carolina.

## DONALD'S DOMINATING NIGHT

Aaron Donald had one of the most incredible individual performances in Pitt history — and certainly one of the finest by a college defensive player this season — when the Panthers played at Georgia Tech on Nov. 2.

Donald compiled 11 tackles (all solo), six TFLs, two forced fumbles and a sack against the Yellow Jackets. The six TFLs are the most by an FBS player this season.

Perhaps the most impressive stat of the night: Georgia Tech ran 63 offensive plays, nearly 10% of which ended in a TFL by Donald. For his effort, he received three different weekly awards: the Chuck Bednarik Award National Defensive Player of the Week, FWAA/Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week and ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week.

## VINOPAL KEYS VICTORY

Junior safety Ray Vinopal played a vital role in Pitt's 28-21 victory over Notre Dame on Nov. 9. In addition to his seven tackles, Vinopal had a hand in each of the Irish's three turnovers and was named the ACC Defensive Back of the Week.

His initial big play came in the second quarter when he stripped receiver TJ Jones of the ball at the Pitt 6 and it was recovered by cornerback Lafayette Pitts. In the decisive final period with the score tied, 21-21, Vinopal halted an Irish drive by intercepting Tommy Rees in the end zone with 14:04 remaining. Less than four minutes later, he picked off Rees again, returning it 40 yards to the Irish 5 to set up Pitt's winning touchdown.

Vinopal leads Pitt in interceptions (three) and is tied for the team lead in tackles (68) and fumble recoveries (one).

## TRACKING TURNOVERS

Since the 2000 season, Pitt has finished in the nation's top 30 in total defense eight times. The feat was most recently accomplished last year when the Panthers ranked 17th nationally while allowing just 330.54 yards per game. During this 13-season stretch, Pitt ranked as high as fifth at the end of the year (2007, 297.67 yards per game). Its lowest per game average occurred in 2001 when Pitt yielded just 284.64 yards per contest and ranked seventh nationally.

## SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

### PITT NEARLY PERFECT ON PATs

Since the opening of the 2006 season, Pitt has been virtually flawless on its extra-point kicks. The Panthers have missed only four PAT kicks over this current stretch (304 of 308, .987). Pitt is 33 of 34 (.971) on PATs this season.

### TRUE FRESHMAN KICKERS

For the first time in 11 years, Pitt features a true freshman as its starting placekicker. Chris Blewitt, a former all-state kicker out of Virginia's West Potomac High, handles field goals, extra points and kickoffs for the Panthers. He is Pitt's leading scorer with 63 points (10-of-12 field goals and 33-of-34 PATs).

The last true freshman to start at kicker for Pitt was David Abdul in 2002. Abdul finished his freshman year with 67 points (13-of-20 field goals and 28-of-29 extra points). His point total stands as a Pitt record for a true frosh kicker.

Prior to Abdul, Chris Ferencik was the last true freshman to handle placekicking on a full-time basis at Pitt. In 1995, Ferencik compiled 59 points (12-of-13 field goals and 23-of-24 extra points) to lead Pitt in scoring and earn first team All-Big East.

# Pitt freshman kick-scoring record

### "SPOON" SPARKS PUNT RETURN GAME

Junior wide receiver Kevin Weatherspoon has established himself as Pitt's top punt returner. In the Panthers' 35-24 win over Old Dominion on Oct. 19, Weatherspoon provided arguably the game-turning play when he returned a punt 56 yards to the ODU 12, setting up Pitt's second touchdown. At the time of the return, the Panthers were trailing 10-7 in the second quarter.

Weatherspoon's 56-yarder was Pitt's longest punt return since Nov. 16, 2006, when Darrelle Revis had a 73-yard return for a TD against West Virginia.

On the season, Weatherspoon has 12 punt returns for 98 yards, an average of 8.2 yards per return.

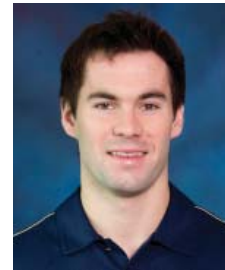

Pitt took a 7-0 lead with a skillful game-opening drive but ultimately could not keep pace with a laser-accurate Florida State passing attack...the Seminoles' redshirt freshman quarterback Jameis Winston connected on 93% of his passes (25 of 27) for 356 yards and four TDs...three of those scoring passes went to tight end Nick O'Leary...the Panthers (0-1, 0-1 ACC) opened the scoring with an 80-yard TD drive, capped by a four-yard pass from Tom Savage to Manasseh Garner...it would be Pitt's first and only lead as FSU (1-0, 1-0) tied the game later in the quarter and then scored 21 points in the second period to seize a 28-10 halftime advantage...Pitt played 11 true freshmen in the game, including receiver Tyler Boyd who compiled a game-high 151 all-purpose yards...Savage, also making his Pitt debut after sitting out 2012 as a transfer, threw for 201 yards with one TD and two interceptions...Devin Street had a career-high 141 receiving yards on six catches...the game, nationally televised by ESPN on Labor Day night, served as Pitt's inaugural contest in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The University of Pittsburgh and its multimedia rights holder IMG College provide the Panthers with comprehensive radio coverage throughout the football season. Led by 50,000-watt flagship station Sportsradio 93.7 The Fan (KDKA-FM) in Pittsburgh, Pitt football games are broadcast on the Pitt IMG Sports Network, a loyal network of stations that spans the Commonwealth.

## Radio coverage for Pitt football includes:

- A three-hour pregame show (first hour on 93.7 The Fan and the last two on the entire Pitt IMG Sports Network).
- "Panther Reaction," a call-in show on 93.7 The Fan following post-game coverage.
- A weekly "Paul Chryst Show" airing live on most Wednesdays from 6 to 7 p.m. Coach Chryst previews the upcoming game and takes questions from callers listening on many of the same Pitt IMG Sports Network affiliates that carry Panthers' game broadcasts.

Known to Pitt fans nationwide as the "Voice of the Panthers," **Bill Hillgrove** will handle football play-by-play duties for the 40th consecutive year. His accurate and descriptive style truly paints the picture for Pitt fans listening to the network. Hillgrove has a long association with the Panthers and Pittsburgh sports scene. Prior to taking over as the play-by-play man for Pitt football, Hillgrove served as the Panthers' color analyst from 1970-73. He has also served as the play-by-play man for Pitt basketball broadcasts since 1969.

Hillgrove is a 1962 graduate of Duquesne and has also been the Pittsburgh Steelers' play-by-play announcer since 1995. Hillgrove was named the 2007 recipient of the prestigious Chris Schenkel Award for excellence in college football broadcasting.

Joining Hillgrove in the booth for his third year as color analyst will be former Pitt quarterback **Pat Bostick**. A three-year letterman (2007-08, 2010), Bostick was under center for such memorable Pitt victories as the 13-9 upset of West Virginia in 2007 and 36-33 quadruple-overtime win at Notre Dame in 2008.

Bostick makes a tremendous impression on listeners with his keen insight and analysis. In addition to Pitt game days, he will continue to be a frequently heard voice talking college football on 93.7 The Fan's various shows.

A 2010 honors graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, Bostick earned his bachelor's degree in just three years before beginning work on his master's degree in Pitt's School of Education. He also serves as the assistant director of development for the Panther Club, the athletic department's official fundraising office.

Pitt pregame coverage and in-game sideline reports will be provided by CBS Radio Pittsburgh talents **Gregg Giannotti** and **Larry Richert**.

In his second season working Pitt football broadcasts, Giannotti is a popular host of The Fan Morning Show on KDKA-FM and also serves as a weekend host for CBS Sports Radio. Prior to his 2010 arrival in Pittsburgh, Giannotti served as a producer and part-time host at WFAN in New York. The Hofstra University graduate has also worked for Sirius Satellite Radio and the National Hockey League.

Richert is one of Pittsburgh's most recognized voices and faces. Host of the venerable KDKA Morning News Show (1020 AM) since 2001, his broadcasting career spans nearly 35 years in both radio and television.

Richert is highly active in community endeavors, emceeding more than 100 benefits annually around the region. He is the Heinz Field public address announcer for Pittsburgh Steelers home games and narrates the Steelers' annual highlight films.

This fall marks Richert's return to college football. Working alongside Bill Hillgrove, he produced Pitt football radio broadcasts for four seasons in the 1980s. Born in Millvale and raised in McCandless Township, Richert graduated from North Allegheny High School and Clarion University.

The 2013 season marks the fourth for Pitt's partnership with CBS Radio Pittsburgh and its flagship, Sportsradio 93.7 The Fan. Beyond game broadcasts, the station airs a wide array of weekly programming focusing on the Panthers' sports scene throughout the year.
