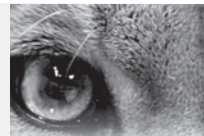

2008 SEASON OUTLOOK



Pitt enters 2008 with high hopes after advancing to postseason play in two of the last three seasons

With the promise of a new season, the 2008 Pitt Women's Soccer team is prepared to take on the challenge of competing and moving up in the Big East Conference. Under the guidance of sixth year head coach Sue-Moy Chin, the Panthers are securely focused on improving in the win-loss column.

"It's a fresh year and our team is hungry for wins," Chin said. "With a better regular season record, hopefully we can have a successful year and make it back to the Big East Tournament."

Through instilling a tough, defensive-minded mentality, Chin has guided Pitt to appearances in two of the last three Big East Championships. The Panthers advanced to post-season play in back-to-back seasons for the first time in school history in 2005 and 2006.

As the Panthers prepare for the coming 2008 season, Chin has full confidence in her two member senior class and talented roster of underclassmen. Pitt returns eight starters and 15 letterwinners from last year's squad. Seniors Jennifer Kritch and Kylie Veverka will assume leadership roles of the team. Pitt's top two leading scorers in Kritch (five goals) and junior Ashley Habel (five goals) both return to the mix, along with its entire defense intact.

"The seniors will do a great job in the leadership department," Chin said. "The team will also have guidance from some of our junior standouts."

Along with a seasoned group of returnees, Pitt's first-ever nationally ranked freshman class arrives in August. The nine-member class was ranked 95th nationally and 13th in the Mid-Atlantic Region by Soccer Buzz Magazine. With nine new players from renowned club teams, the Panthers are excited and welcome the new talent.

"This could be the strongest class that we have ever recruited," said Chin. "It is an honor to be nationally recognized for our recruiting efforts."

With a 6-10-2 record last season, Chin hopes to use her leadership, upcoming talent, and strength from the middle to improve upon her team's record.

"Our strength will lie in our midfield and being able to connect our frontline with our backline," Chin said. "With talented returnees and newcomers, I am excited for the 2008 season."

FORWARDS

Pitt returns three forwards from last year's team, including junior Ashley Habel, one of the team's top offensive returnees. Habel, who started all 18 games in 2007 season, led the Panthers in goals (five), assists (four), points (14) and game winning goals (three). She also ranks among school career leaders in goals (11).

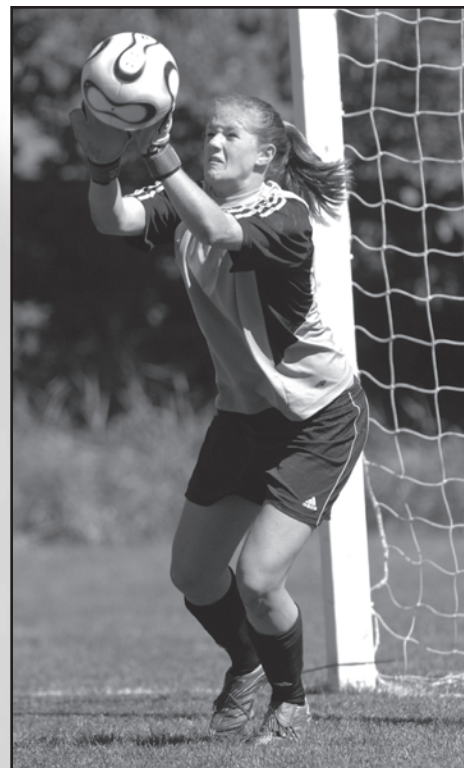
"Ashley is a great player," Chin said. "We are looking for her to lead our team and have a very productive 2008 season."

Also returning at forward is sophomore Liz Carroll. Carroll, who adds size to the frontline, scored three goals and added an assist last season as a freshman. She will be counted upon to provide a scoring threat.

"We are looking to Liz to put up big numbers this year," Chin said.

In addition to the three returning players, Pitt will also see the emergence of two strong freshmen forwards in Klarissa Ames and Brittany Pfaff. Ames, a New Mexico native, has winning experience. Not only did she lead her team to a high school state championship, but she also was a three-time First-team All-State selection. Pfaff, a Pittsburgh native, also led her team to a PIAA State Championship.

"Klarissa Ames is a very aggressive player," Chin said. "She will be a perfect fit

on our team. Brittany Pfaff is also a great find."

MIDFIELDERS

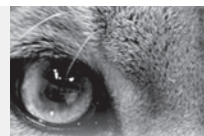
Pitt's strength lies in its midfield. Senior Jennifer Kritch, along with sisters Maura and Katie Caslin, all return as three of the team's top midfielders and offensive players. Kritch, who enters her senior season, is ranked tied for fourth among school career leaders in three categories including all-time career goals (11), points (29) and assists (7). Last year she tied for the team lead in scoring with five goals and one assist. Kritch returns as the team's most experienced midfielder and will be counted upon to provide leadership.

"Jennifer has great speed, and is a tremendous athlete," Chin said. "We expect great things from her this season."

As juniors, Katie and Maura Caslin both return to the squad after playing in a combined 56 career games. Both return after a productive spring season.

"Maura was our most consistent player in the spring and Katie has all the tools," Chin said.

Sophomores Laura Berbert, Katheryn Kunugi and Kaitlyn Kacsuta all add midfield depth and will push for playing time. Berbert was one of only three Pitt players to start all

18 games last year in the midfield. She completed an impressive freshman season with five points, one goal, and three assists and will be counted upon for leadership.

Sophomore Alexandra Jaffe and talented freshmen Maura Lacey, Molly McGeehin and Katelyn Ruhe will also compete for playing time in the ever-deep midfielder position.

"We are extremely excited for Katie Ruhe to come in and earn a starting job," Chin said.

BACKFIELD

With a stellar group of underclassmen defenders, Chin will look to senior Kylie Veverka to anchor the backline. Veverka has played in 44 games with 31 career starts and is the most experienced player in the backfield.

"Not only does Kylie have lots of experience, but she has also become more of a vocal leader," Chin said.

Chin also has faith in returning players including juniors Molly Griganavicius and A'idah Clinton and sophomores Kat Weiler and Christina Nicassio.

"Those four are all physical and solid players," Chin said. "If free from injury, they will be a tremendous help."

Griganavicius and Clinton both return with a wealth of experience and Weiler and

Nicassio both completed impressive freshman seasons last year. Weiler started all 18 games last year and proved to be an impressive performer.

Chin also expects freshmen Dorie Heald, Shannon Cody and Kelsi Morris to contribute immediately, add depth and compete for playing time.

GOALKEEPER

At goalkeeper, the Panthers return two experienced players in junior Alison Finch and sophomore Morie Kephart. As a junior, Finch has appeared in 33 career games with 32 starts, owns a 1.62 career goals against average and has made 145 career saves. Last year, Finch started and played in 14 games, made 64 saves and concluded the year with a 1.65 goals against average. Though Kephart saw action in six games with four starts in goal, she made 23 saves and accumulated an impressive 1.91 goals against average. She also contributes as a field player.

"Hopefully these two players will come back healthy and ready for the season," said Chin. "Alison recently had surgery and Morie is coming off an ankle injury."

Incoming freshman Kristina Rioux should present a challenge to both existing players as well.

"Kristina is going to provide constant competition among goalkeepers. This competition will make for an exciting year," Chin said.

SCHEDULE

Pitt will once again face a difficult schedule included matches against some of the nation's top teams. In all, Pitt will play a total of 20 games including 11 Big East Conference matches.

Pitt opens its 2008 campaign on August 22 against Akron. The non-conference schedule also features visits to Founders Field from Pennsylvania, UNC-Charlotte, Kent State and St. Bonaventure. Pitt will play in the University of Illinois Tournament against the likes of Dayton and face either Illinois or Arizona. Pitt will also travel to Toledo. Big East Competition opens on September 18 against West Virginia. Pitt will take on Big East opponents St. John's, Connecticut, Providence, Villanova and Georgetown all at Founders Field. The Panthers will also travel to West Virginia, Syracuse, Rutgers, Seton Hall, South Florida and Marquette. The Big East tournament begins on October 30.

"Our non-conference schedule will undoubtedly challenge us," Chin said. "That type of pressure is what we need to win Big East games," said Chin.

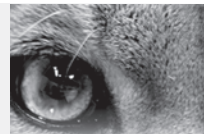

HEAD COACH SUE-MOY CHIN

SIXTH SEASON AT PITT
FLORIDA INTERNATIONAL, '98

Sue-Moy Chin begins her sixth season as head women's soccer coach at the University of Pittsburgh. Chin arrived at Pitt during the Spring of 2003 following a two-year stint as the top assistant at the University of Colorado. In her 13-year career, she has established a broad background in all aspects of coaching from recruiting, scheduling and budgeting and has coached 20 All-Americans and 13 players who competed in the WUSA.

A 1998 graduate of Florida International University, Chin has worked with several nationally prominent soccer programs over the past several years, including her alma mater Florida International, Notre Dame, Duke and Colorado.

Chin has the Pitt program moving in the right direction, as she has led Pitt to postseason appearances in two of the last three seasons. In 2006, Chin guided Pitt to its second consecutive postseason appearance as the Panthers earned a berth in the Big East Tournament before dropping a double overtime decision at Louisville. Additionally, Pitt tied its school record with eight victories on the year, a mark that matched the 1998 total. In 2005, Chin guided Pitt to its first postseason appearance in seven seasons. During her first season at Pitt, Chin's Panthers achieved school records for least goals

allowed in a season (23) and least goals allowed per game (1.32). She also registered the most wins ever for a first-year coach in Pitt's women's soccer history. Additionally, Chin's Panthers produced in the classroom as 33 student-athletes earned Big East Academic All-Star honors, while 19 others achieved grade point averages of a 3.0 or better in the 2004 academic school year.

Chin joined the coaching staff at Colorado in 2001 as the program's top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. She was responsible for the goalkeepers and field player development while also coordinating the Buffaloes' scheduling, traveling and budgeting. As the recruiting coordinator, Chin was responsible for Colorado's largest all-time recruiting class (15), which produced the 2002 Big 12 Freshman of the Year.

Prior to Colorado, Chin served as an assistant coach at Duke University (2000-01) and was in charge of recruiting. She coached two All-Americans for the Blue Devils and, as the recruiting coordinator, helped sign a Top-20 recruiting class to the university, which produced the Atlantic Coast Conference's Freshman of the Year in 2001. In 2000, Duke advanced to the ACC Tournament final and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament.

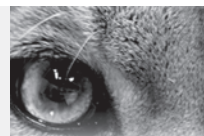

COACHING STAFF



As an assistant at Notre Dame from 1997-99, she helped lead the Fighting Irish to two Final Four appearances (1997 and 1999), three 20-win seasons, three Big East Conference titles and three NCAA Tournament appearances. Notre Dame reached the 1999 NCAA title game before falling to 16-time national champion North Carolina. Chin also coached 18 All-Americans, including World Cup Champion Kate (Sobrero) Markgraf and Olympic Gold medalist Shannon Boxx.

During her playing career at Florida International, Chin started all 67 games at goalkeeper from 1991-94. She earned Soccer News Honorable Mention All-America honors in 1993, one of only two Florida International players to earn such accolades. That same year, Chin led Florida International to its lone Trans American Athletic Conference Championship and its only NCAA Tournament appearance. During her collegiate career, she earned the Hall of Fame Award from the university (1994), All-Trans American Athletic Conference Second Team honors (1993-94), All-South Honors (1993), and All-Florida Honors (1991-93). A three-year captain, Chin recorded an impressive 41-21-6 record. Chin also owns two school records at Florida International, including career shutouts (20) and single-season shutouts (7). Her career goals against average of 1.11 also stands as the best mark in school history. Due to a broken finger during her senior year, Chin scored two goals in seven games as a left midfielder.

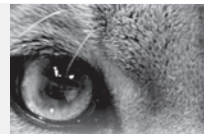
A Scarborough, Ontario native, Chin was a member of the Canadian National Pool Team from 1990-92 and was a five-year standout at Aurora High School, receiving honors as a two-time Athlete of the Year along with Hall of Fame honors (1991). An all-around athlete, Chin also lettered in volleyball, basketball, track and field, and field hockey.

Coaching runs in the Chin family, as her older sister, Carla Baker, served as the head women's soccer coach at the University of Iowa from 2002-05. The two coached together at Notre Dame during the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

ASSISTANT COACH BARRY BIMBI

SECOND SEASON AT PITT
ST. FRANCIS (PA.), '94

Barry Bimbi begins his second year as an assistant women's soccer coach at the University of Pittsburgh.

Bimbi has compiled a diverse coaching background and owns a combined 11 years as an NCAA Division I assistant coach at three institutions including Pitt, Marquette and St. Francis (Pa.).

"I am thrilled to have Barry in our women's soccer family," Pitt Head Coach Sue-Moy Chin said. "Barry brings with him a wealth of knowledge and experience. His passion for the game and experience in developing talented players will help our rising program grow."

Prior to joining the Panthers, Bimbi served as a coaching staff member for the FC Milwaukee soccer club, one of the premier programs in Wisconsin. Bimbi guided the Under-16 boys team to a third-place national tournament finish as well as

the Regional II championship title. That same year, he helped guide the Under-15 girls team to a state title.

Bimbi worked as an assistant coach with the Marquette University men's soccer program for four seasons from 2002-05. While at Marquette, he served as the program's recruiting coordinator, oversaw player development and coordinated academic activities. In 2002, the Golden Eagles earned the No. 1 seed in the Conference USA tournament. Bimbi also served as academic coordinator for the men's soccer team and established a summer camp at the school.

Prior to his tenure at Marquette, Bimbi spent six years as the assistant men's soccer coach at his alma mater, St. Francis University in Loretto, Pa. from 1996-2002. He helped lead the Red Flash to the program's first-ever back-to-back winning records in Northeast Conference play in

both 2000 and 2001. In addition, he played a key role in recruiting, coordinated fundraising for the program and oversaw the Red Flash summer camps.

Bimbi has coached several Olympic Development teams and served as the Director of Coaching for the Keystone Soccer Club from 1996-2002. He earned his USSF "A" license in January, 2005.

As a player at St. Francis (1990-93), Bimbi earned four All-NEC honors including First Team honors as a junior in 1992. He led the conference in scoring as a freshman, led the team to its first-ever winning conference record as a junior and served as team captain for three seasons. As a senior, he was honored with the distinguished J. Irving Walley Award which is annually presented to the top male athlete at St. Francis. Bimbi graduated from St. Francis with a business management degree in 1994.

Kirsten Lawrence begins her first season as an assistant women's soccer coach at Pitt.

Lawrence joins the Panthers after serving two seasons (2006-07) as an assistant women's soccer coach at Campbell University in Buies Creek, N.C. She assisted in all phases of the program including recruiting, administrative duties, on-field instruction and oversight of summer camps.

"I am thrilled to have Kirsten join our women's soccer family," Pitt Head Coach Sue-Moy Chin said. "Kirsten brings with her a wealth of knowledge and coaching experience."

Prior to joining the Panthers, Lawrence was a member of Campbell's 2004 women's soccer team, a squad that captured the Atlantic Sun Conference championship. During her year on the team, she helped guide the Camels to a tournament title and the school's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth. The 2004 Camels posted a 12-2-7 overall record.

Lawrence earned her master's degree in exercise science from Campbell in May, 2006. While completing academic requirements for her master's degree, she spent the 2005-06 school year as a graduate assistant coach with the Campbell women's swimming and diving

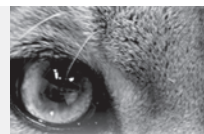
program, a season that saw the team set new school records in all but three events.

She holds a Scottish Football Association Early Touches coaching license, NSCAA Advanced National Diploma and NSCAA State Goalkeeping Diploma.

Originally from Scotland, Lawrence graduated with honors from the University of Aberdeen with a degree in sports studies in July 2004. Lawrence also played for the Aberdeen Ladies Football Club and competed for the Under-19 Scottish National Team in the 2001-02 European Championships.

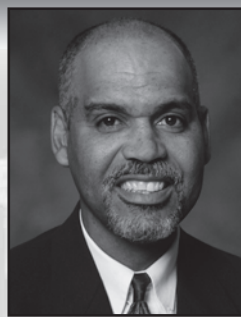

Kirk Bruce is in his 11th year as assistant athletic director for Olympic sports, but his association with the University goes back much further. In his current capacity, Bruce oversees the day-to-day operations of Pittsburgh's Olympic sports, including men's and women's soccer, men's and women's swimming and diving, track and field, cross country, women's tennis, baseball and softball.

Bruce previously served as the Panthers' head women's basketball coach for 13 years from 1985-1998. His coaching career was highlighted by the 1992-93 season in which the Panthers produced their first 20-win season (21-10) and finished third in the Women's National Invitational Tournament. Bruce coached numerous Big East All-Conference players and two Kodak All-American honorable mention players in Jonna Huemrich and Lorri Johnson.

A standout starting point guard at Pittsburgh from 1971-75, Bruce was a member of the Panthers' 1974 team that finished 25-4 and advanced to the East Regional finals. He was drafted by the Utah Stars of the former American Basketball Association (ABA). When the league disbanded, he returned to Pittsburgh to begin his coaching career as an assistant for the Panthers. Bruce was later promoted to the head coaching position prior to the 1985-86 season.

Bruce and wife Marleen have three daughters, Chelsea (25), Carmen (22), and Courtney (20).
