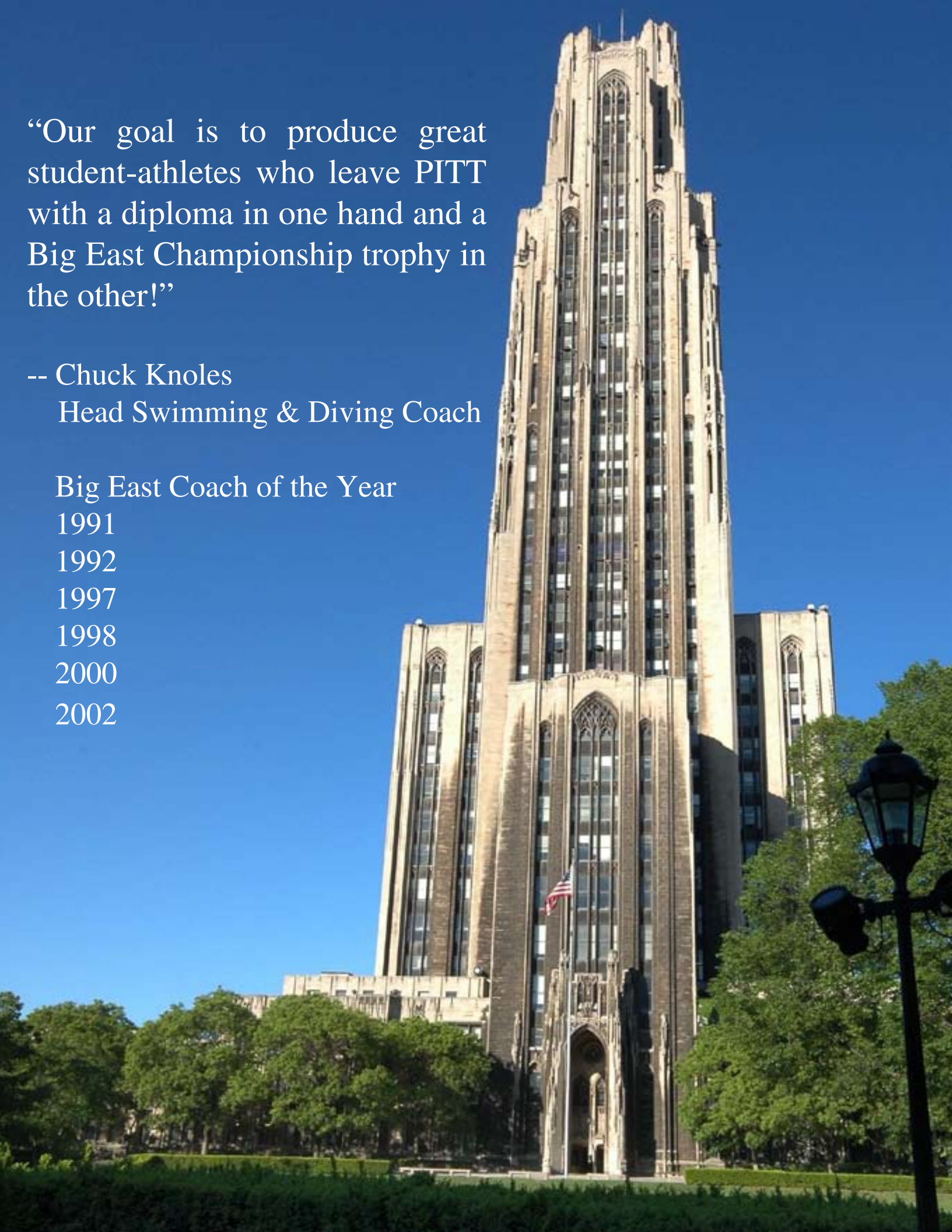

JOSEPH C. TREES POOL

Home of the 2010 Big East Championships

Joseph C. Trees Pool was opened in 1962 on the upper campus of the University of Pittsburgh, with Ben Grady as the Panthers' head men's swimming coach. Forty-two years later, it remains one of the largest natatoriums in the nation. One of the last 55-yard pools built in the United States, Trees Pool is home to the Pittsburgh Panthers' Swimming and Diving program. 28 Big East Conference titles have been won by the men's and women's teams since joining the league in the early 1980s.



Trees Pool Facts

Originally built in 1962, it was one of the first pools with a 10-meter tower, underwater windows, underwater sound system and a heated deck and benches. The pool holds approximately 750,000 gallons of water.

Two Pools In One

Along with the main pool, the facility houses a 25-yard, six-lane smaller pool, which was added in the summer of 1963, one year after the building was completed.

New Additions

This year, renovations to Pitt's swimming and diving facilities have raised the quality of Joseph C. Trees Pool, as well as, the expectations for Pitt's swimming and diving program.

"We are blessed to have an athletic administration and chancellor that believes in providing first class facilities for its student-athletes," said Head Coach Chuck Knoles. "Historically, when pools are renovated we see a boost in success. Trees pool had been untouched since 1962, but now our standards are up to those of the Big East and other NCAA universities. "

In 2002, a new state-of-the-art Daktronics scoreboard was installed on the pool's balcony and was officially dedicated to Ben Grady during the 2003 ECAC Championships held at Trees Pool. The following year, a new Panthers' Wall of Fame was unveiled by the team's former All-Americans and award winners, featuring the plaques of the 96 Pittsburgh Swimming and Diving All-Americans as well as trophies from the Panthers' 28 conference titles and meet championships.

The most recent renovations have modernized Trees Pool, shortening the 55 yard pool to 50-meters and upgrading the circulation systems and 1-meter diving area.

"The renovation was something that we did not plan for at the end of last year," added Knoles. "It was something that we needed for several years when we found out the project was going to happen we were esstastic. It is also special due to the recent announcement of the 2010 Big East Championships being held at Trees Pool. It has been traveling for 16 years and will return next year to a revitalized Trees Pool."

Chuck Knoles enters his 18th season at Pitt and his seventh year as the head coach of both the men's and women's swimming and diving teams.

For the second consecutive season, a Knoles-coached team will open the year with votes in the Top 25 College Swimming Coaches Association of America (CSCAA) dual-meet poll.

Committed to success and the total package his student-athletes receive at Pitt, Knoles values achievements in and out of the pool. The level of excellence that his student-athletes have achieved in the classroom illustrates his philosophy that the Pitt experience is far more than just breaking pool records. It involves producing student-athletes that are the best they can be.

True to the student-athlete ideal, Knoles' swimmers have performed exceptionally well in the classroom. The CSCAA recognized Pitt as an All-American Academic team on both the women's and men's side. In addition, two student-athletes, Kristin Brown and Amy Miteff, earned ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America honors in the last four years. This past year, Jeremy Stultz earned Big East/Aeropostale Scholar Athlete of the Year accolades, joining

Brown and Carlyne Savini (1999-2003) as previous honorees.

Still known as the 'Beast of the East' under Knoles, Pitt has recruited the top student-athletes, both nationally and internationally to lead the Panthers back to the top of the conference. Knoles opens this season with notable freshmen classes, as Collegewimming.com ranked the men 25th and listed the women's incoming freshmen as a 'team to watch.'

In 2006, Knoles became the all-time winningest coach in men's swimming and diving history and now boasts a 152-54 record, eclipsing Pitt legendary coach Ben Grady (125-88-4) on the all-time coaches list.

Under Knoles' direction, the men have finished in the top three at the conference championships 17 of 18 years, including 11 championship titles. The women have steadily climbed back to the top of the league in the past five years, including a second-place finish in 2005.

Last season, the men claimed a third-place league finish and the women's squad placed fourth overall at the Big East Championships. Pitt's men's team was led by MVP Warren Barnes as he advanced to the finals in three events (100 breast, 200 IM and 200 breast). Later, Barnes placed fifth in the 100 breast at the Canadian Olympic Trials. The 2008 MVP on the women's side was Agnes Mago, who retired with three school records (200 fly, 400 IM, 800 free relay), after earning a record-setting, second-place performance in the 200 fly at the BEC.

After Knoles took over the reins of the women's team in 2002-03, the Panther women promptly broke 13 school records in his first season at the helm. The following season, more records fell and the women's team received votes in the CSCAA national rankings for the first time in nearly a decade.

This past summer, Kristin Brown and Stacie Safritt each qualified for the 2008 Olympic Trials. Brown would go on to finish among the top 35 U.S. swimmers in the 100, 200 and 400 freestyle events.

On the men's side, Jason Miller was the third Panther to qualify for the 2008 Olympic Trials.

Dating back to the 2007 Big East Championships, Jeff Leath entered the Big East and Pitt record books with his third 200 back Big East crown in four years. Leath became the first swimmer in the conference's history to accomplish such a feat in that event.

Likewise on the women's side, then-senior Andrea Shoust swept the backstroke events and became the first Panther to win conference crowns in the 100 and 200 back since 1987. Additionally, Brown garnered her second consecutive NCAA berth that year, which was the first back-to-back bid for a woman in nearly 20 years.

During the 2006-07 season, the women's team was led by a strong freestyle core and broke several school records, setting the Panthers up for postseason competition. The crowning moment was when Brown earned an outright bid to the NAAs.

In his tenure, Knoles has consistently maintained the Panthers' reputation as one of the top collegiate programs in the East and continues to lead his teams to success year after year.

But it hasn't been easy. Knoles is aware of how competitive collegiate swimming has become, and demands that his student-athletes strive to maintain a hunger to compete.

"You must go into every competition as tough as nails," Knoles said. "You learn from winning, just as you learn from

losing. Hard work is part of the formula for success, and we keep on our kids to stay in shape and to train hard in and out of season. There is no real 'off' period. You must do it year-round to compete and to win at the big-time NCAA Division I level."

By following Knoles' formula for success and his goal for a national top-15 finish, the men have inched closer and closer to a ranking in the last three seasons. At the end of the 2005-06 season the men finished with votes in the top 25 dual-meet rankings.

Knoles has demonstrated his ability to win as a coach. In addition to the Panthers' 11 men's Big East Championships, his teams have also recorded three second-place finishes and two third-place finishes. His teams have a combined 203-79 dual meet record, while 19 of Knoles' Pittsburgh swimmers have been either Olympic Trial qualifiers or finalists. He has garnered six Big East Men's Swimming Coach of the Year awards (1991, 1992, 1997, 1998, 2000 and 2002).

Knoles has had extensive experience and success coaching at the collegiate level, even prior to Pitt. As the interim head coach at the University of Arizona in 1988-89, he led both the men's and women's squads to a 15th-place finish at the NCAA Championships, and coached 13 All-Americans, including the school's first NCAA champion in any sport.

Knoles was head coach at Shadow Mountain High School in Phoenix, Arizona, from 1977-1988, where he coached both the men's and women's teams, and was named High School Skyline Coach of the Year seven times while leading his teams to an amazing 132-23 combined record.

In 1989, Knoles was the recipient of the College Swim Coaches Association

Outstanding Achievement Award. He won the American Swimming Coaches Association Award of Excellence four times from 1990-1994 and was awarded the CSCAA's Master Coach Award in 1996.

Knoles resides in Oakland.

A fixture on the Panther athletic scene for three decades, Julian Krug enters his 30th season at Pitt and his fourth year as Assistant Head Coach for Diving.

Earning his fifth Men's Diving Coach of the Year honor, last season, Krug has led Pitt's diving team to dominance in the Big East. Just this past year, Alex Volovetski became Krug's eighth All-American and second in the last two seasons.

Additionally, Krug had guided four different Panthers to be named Big East Most Outstanding Divers in the last five consecutive seasons.

Since his tenure began in 1979, Krug has produced 17 individual Big East Champions, 41 titles overall, eight All-Americans, numerous Honorable Mention All-Americans, seven repeat NCAA qualifiers, six school record holders and 15 Big East Championship Most Outstanding Divers.

In 2000, Krug was elected to the U.S. Diving Board of Directors and also spent time on the NCAA Rules Committee. A member of the U.S. Diving Education Committee, Krug is a National Spotting Certifier and has served

as a member of the Senior National Rules Committee. Two years ago, he was appointed U.S. Diving Vice President for Senior Diving.

Prior to Volovetski, Jeremy Stultz garnered an All-America finish at the NCAA finals, and his third Big East Diver of the Year honor (2007). Before that, diver Dennis Nemtsanov earned Honorable Mention All-America honors under Krug's tutelage. And going back even further in 2001-02, Michael Wells was a Pitt NCAA qualifier in diving.

Krug believes that preparing oneself to the best of his or her abilities is the most important thing his performers should strive for, as opposed to focusing on first-place finishes.

"I believe that if you train hard with a positive attitude, winning will take care of itself," Krug said.

A standout diver himself, in 1974 Krug became the first person to successfully execute a 5½ front somersault dive from 10 meters. He performed the dive at Kimball's Diving Camp in Brandon, Fla.

Krug and his wife, Doe, have just returned from the Summer Olympic Games in Beijing, where they worked as diving advisors for the NBC telecast. They served in a similar capacity at the 2004 Athens Games, 2000 Sydney Games, 1996 Atlanta Games and 1992 Barcelona Games.

From 1997-2003, Krug served as the US national team coach at the FINA Mexico Grand Prix. He additionally helped develop two Olympic divers in David Pichler (1996, 2000) and Karen LaFace (1992).

Krug and his wife Dorothy reside in Kennedy Township, and are diving coaches at the Pittsburgh Aquatic Club. They have two children, Cassidy (23) and Kyle (19). Cassidy was a standout diver at Stanford University where she won the 2007 NCAA Division I Championships in both the 1M and 3M diving events, posting record scores.

In 2007, Krug was joined by his wife and daughter as all three became the first family of recipients of the prestigious Whosam Inc. Award for commitment to excellence and dedication to the highest physical and spiritual ideals at the United States Aquatic Sports Awards banquet.

Marian Clark is in her fourth season as the Director of Operations/Senior Assistant Coach for both the men's and women's swimming teams. This season also marks the sixth year Clark will work with both squads after serving as head coach of the women's team at Pittsburgh for nine seasons (1993-2002). Her duties include facilitating all home meet operations, maintaining the budget, handling team travel and academics as well as coaching with the distance group.

Clark began her coaching career as an assistant coach at Pitt after graduating from the university in 1988. She served as an assistant coach at both Florida State and Miami before being appointed to head the Pittsburgh women's program in the summer of 1993. Her appreciation for the rewards and benefits intercollegiate athletics can provide for its young participants is not lost in her coaching.

"I enjoyed my undergraduate years at Pitt," Clark said. "I learned not only how to set goals within a team structure, but also how to achieve them by working and interacting with team members. A team commitment is essential for success. Obviously, I want individuals to excel, but I also want them to bring the others on the team along with them."

Clark was a major contributor to four Big East Conference championships during her undergraduate years at Pitt. She was a Big East champion in the 500 freestyle in 1986, and in the 400 individual medley in 1988.

Her teamwork was also on display when she swam for eight Pittsburgh relay teams that captured Big East first-place finishes. An exercise physiology major as an undergraduate, Clark graduated cum laude and understands the main reason a student-athlete comes to college.

The results have been nothing but impressive. Under the guidance of Clark, the Panthers are regularly selected to the College Swim Coaches' Association All-America Academic Team list. Pitt has been ranked as high as 17th in the country among other swimming and diving teams. The team has also been awarded the University's Academic Award several times, which is given annually to the Pittsburgh athletic team that boasts the highest grade-point average.

"We take great pride in our academics," said Clark. "I really believe that bright student-athletes find a way to succeed both in the classroom and in the pool."

Clark resides in Squirrel Hill with her husband Todd, daughters Maiti (11) and Mara (10) and Mac (1).

Jeff Berghoff enters his fourth year as the Assistant Head Coach for Women's Swimming, while entering his 10th season on the Pitt swimming and diving coaching staff. He served his first three years as an assistant for the women's team before working with both squads for the last six years.

Berghoff has helped establish the women's team into a competitive force in the Big East Conference and also helped guide the men's team to two league titles in 2003 and 2004.

Most recently, Berghoff was instrumental in the Olympic Trial training of Kristin Brown, who travelled to Omaha, Neb., this past summer. During Brown's four years as a Panther, he aided in her record-setting and back-to-back NCAA Championship qualifying career.

Berghoff first became familiar with the Pitt swimming program due to his involvement with Team Pittsburgh Aquatics since 1997. He was the head coach at nearby Oakland Catholic High School for four years, where he coached 15 different NISCA High School All-Americans and the 1999 Pennsylvania State Championship teams, while coaching former Pitt standout Jordan Wallace as she attended O.C.

A native of Murrysville, Pa., Berghoff returns to Team Pittsburgh Aquatics in his 12th season and his second stint as Head Age Group Coach and has had 11 senior national qualifiers on the team.

In the spring of 2003, his club team went on to win the Speedo Championship Series, recording five individual champions. That summer, the women's 800-free relay became the Summer Sectional Meet record-holder for that event. Team Pittsburgh Aquatics also won the prestigious STAR Summer Invitational in Buffalo in 2003.

To add to his long list of accomplishments, Berghoff has coached eight Olympic Trial qualifiers, along with one Olympic Games participant and one All-Africa Games participant. Berghoff has coached several Allegheny Mountain Swimming record holders as well as two U.S. Open finalists and two senior national finalists. Other swimmers under Berghoff have won the esteemed Got Milk scholarship in addition to a finalist for both the Marshall scholarship and the Rhodes scholarship.

Berghoff earned his bachelor's degree in economics from Carnegie Mellon University in 1994. He lives in Monroeville, Pa. with his wife Mykie and sons; Ryan (15), Justin (9) and Jacob (5).

Aaron is in his second season as an assistant coach and primarily works with the sprint group for men's and women's swimming. Additionally, Workman is the lead recruiter for men's swimming.

Workman comes to Pitt after coaching at the University of Nevada Las Vegas for two seasons where he served as assistant swim coach and recruiting coordinator. Workman was in charge of all aspects of men's and women's recruiting, sprint/middle distance-group, running all meets and invitationals and managing the travel budget.

Workman was also instrumental in the recent success of Stacie Safritt's qualifying for and participating in the 2008 Olympic Trials.

While at UNLV, Workman coached the Rebels to a 28th place finish at the Division I NCAA Championships and contributed to the men's swimming team's back-to-back Mountain West Conference Championships.

Workman had a brief head coaching stint at Hollins University (2002-2003) where he led the team to their best finish in three seasons. While at Hollins, Workman coached two conference swimmers of the week and led his team to the highest point total at conference meets in three seasons.

Workman's collegiate coaching skills also include assistant stints at Wittenberg University (2003-2004) and the University of Kentucky (2001-2002). At Wittenberg, Workman coached two NCAA All-Americans and a top 20 Division III finish at the National Championships.

While serving as an assistant senior coach for the Wildcats Aquatics Club (2002-2004) for two years, he helped coach eight sectional qualifiers and two Senior National Qualifiers.

Workman received his bachelor's of science degree in broadcasting from Kentucky in 2001. As an undergraduate at Kentucky, he swam for the Wildcats and was a four-time All-American during his four seasons there. He helped the Wildcats to four straight top-20 finishes, and was also a two-time academic all-conference selection while earning academic All-American in 2001. Workman swam in the 2000 Olympic trials.

Along with coaching, Workman is very active in serving his community. He has spent time helping Maxwell Elementary School as a Big Buddy, D.A.R.E. as a speaker, Habitat for Humanity and the Salvation Army.

Workman resides in Bradford Woods with his wife Jaime, a former All-American swimmer at Kentucky, and their daughter Molly Lynn (1).

Jessica Siegele is in her first season as a member of the swimming and diving staff. Siegele will work specifically with the stroke and sprinters, including the butterfly and backstroke.

Siegele brings a variety of success and experience to Pitt after spending the last season as an assistant at Ashland University. There, Siegele helped lead the men's and women's teams to a fourth and fifth place conference finish respectively, while eight athletes qualified for the NCAA Division II Championships.

Prior to Ashland, Siegele served in an internship with the United States Association of Blind Athletes. Among the many duties included managing the membership database, producing press releases for the organization and acting as the events manager for World Youth and Student Games.

Siegele's background also includes a stint as an assistant coach with the Trinity Preparatory School and Trinity Preparatory Aquatics. Siegele has worked as a camp counselor at the Pine Crest Swim Camp and worked in the fan relations/game night staff of the NBA's Orlando Magic.

A native of Wexford, Pa., and a product of North Allegheny high school, Siegele is a 2005 graduate of the University of Kentucky, where she competed in swimming and diving for four years (2002-05). Later, she earned her masters degrees in sport business management and business administration from Central Florida in 2007.

At Kentucky, Siegele was a two-year co-captain, four-year letter winner, three-time school record holder and a two-time NCAA All-American. In 2003, Siegele competed at the Irish National Swimming Championships in Belfast, Ireland where she won seven gold medals.

As an associate athletic director, Kirk Bruce is in his 12th season overseeing the Olympic sports, but his association with the University goes back much further.

In his current capacity, Bruce oversees the day-to-day operations of men's and women's soccer, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's track and field, women's tennis, softball, and volleyball.

While dedicating his time to Olympic Sports, the Pitt men's swimming and diving program has earned the nickname "Beast of the East" after capturing six conference titles since 1998.

More recently, Bruce helped guide the softball team to two back-to-back-to-back Big East Championships, where they upset then-No. 25 South Florida in the opening round in 2006. He also had a hand in the women's tennis team making a trip to Tampa, Fla., for the conference championships, while the women's soccer team set a school record for season wins last year.

Bruce was instrumental in leading the women's track and field program to three Big East titles and four consecutive ECAC outdoor titles. Additionally, Bruce oversaw the Pitt baseball team which finished runner-up in the Big East in 2004.

Bruce previously served as the Panthers' head women's basketball coach for 13 years from 1985-1998. His coaching career was highlighted by the 1992-93 season in which the Panthers produced their first 20-win season (21-10) and finished third in the Women's National Invitation Tournament. Bruce coached numerous Big East All-Conference players and two Kodak All-America honorable mention players in Jonna Huemrich and Lorri Johnson.

A standout starting point guard at Pittsburgh from 1971-75, Bruce was a member of the Panthers' 1974 team that finished 25-4 and advanced to the East Regional finals. He was drafted by the Utah Stars of the former American Basketball Association (ABA). When the league disbanded, he returned to Pittsburgh to begin his coaching career as an assistant for the Panthers. Bruce was later promoted to the head coaching position prior to the 1985-86 season.

Bruce and his wife Marleen have three daughters, Chelsea (26), Carmen (24) and Courtney (21).

WOMEN'S SWIMMING & DIVING OUTLOOK

After finishing the past two seasons with a fourth-place Big East Conference finish, the Pitt women's swimming and diving program have set a goal to move upward in the conference.

"Last year the women came in fourth in the Big East, and fell below our expectations," Pitt Head Coach **Chuck Knoles** said. "This year, our success as a team is a matter of lifting our sights high enough so that we aren't satisfied with just getting better.

"The women know that the pressure is on to improve," Knoles added.

"There are times when one athlete can ignite a spark that fires up everyone else. That's what happened for our women's team last year against Notre Dame."

In fact, that upset of Notre Dame marked the first time a Big East Conference member won a dual meet over the Fighting Irish.

"Our women realized they had a window of opportunity and they jumped through it with a lot of energy," Knoles explained. "I think Pitt beating Notre Dame was one of the most significant dual meet victories in our program's history!"

The Panthers' coaching staff is looking for the same kind of success this season. Swimmers and divers are being pushed to work toward achievement in the weight room and at the swimming pool.

Seniors **Sabrina Jennings**, **Erin Meehan** and **Ruth Seiffert** were named team captains this year.

"We have seniors with valuable experience, who are all stepping comfortably into leadership roles, Knoles stated. "We are optimistic about their senior season being a success and then having that success spread to the rest of the team."

In addition to the senior class, Pitt returns 20 juniors and sophomores and welcomes seven talented newcomers.

"We have a balanced group of underclassmen ready to contribute from the get go."

Freestyle:

Pitt looks to sophomore **Katie Cutrell** and junior **Lisa McDonnell** to lead the team in the freestyle events this year. Cutrell will lead the distance swimmers. She finished fifth in the 500 free at the ECAC Championships, while McDonnell was a member of the fourth-place 400 free relay team at the Big East Championships.

Sophomore **Kristen McMullan** is

also expected to be a major contributor in the sprint free, after placing in the top 10 of the 100 free at the Big East Championships as a freshman.

A new addition to the freestyle corps is freshman **Elena Spak**, who was the 2008 Metropolitan Area (DC) 100 free Champion. She will bring depth to the team, along with **Emily DeStefano**, **Meehan**, **Yolandi Van Rooyen** and **Megan Sculley**.

Breaststroke:

Pitt hopes to see continued success from Seiffert in the breaststroke races. Seiffert currently holds the school record in the 200 breast and has repeatedly paced the Panthers in this stroke.

"Ruth is not a flamboyant winner, she is quietly successful," Knoles said. "She is a hard worker who is also a remarkably hard-nosed leader."

Sophomore **Cookie McIntyre** will also be a go-to athlete to for points in the breast. She set a freshman record in the 100 breast with a NCAA provisional mark of 1:03.07 at the conference championships.

Additionally, sophomore **Laura Barnes**, a former member of the Canadian National Junior Team, will be looked to be a force in these events.

Butterfly:

McIntyre and McMullan will lead the flyers this season. McIntyre made her debut with a fourth-place performance at the Big East Championships in the 200 fly, while McMullan set the freshman record in the 100 fly at the conference championships. Fellow sophomore **Caitlin Trant** will be a fierce competitor in the fly events.

A new addition this year is **Tamara Lelli**, who brings a wealth of experience to the pool with two Arizona State Championship wins in the 100 fly, 12 All-America honors and competition experience from the 2008 Canadian Olympic Trials.

Backstroke:

Leading the backstrokers will be junior **Ryann Kishbaugh**, who advanced to the finals of the 100 back at the Big East Championships. Adding depth will be classmates **Allie Horvath**, **Tiffany Malatesta**, and **McDonnell**.

Freshman **Megan Bender** is expected to make an immediate impact, coming off a high school career with three All-America selections and being named the Mega-Red Conference Swimmer of the Meet, twice in Detroit.

IM:

Seiffert will be one of many Panthers expected to compete in the IM. Seiffert has consoled in the 400 IM at Big East. Helping her out will be McIntyre, junior **Sophie Cross**, a former consolation finalist in the 200 IM at the conference championships, **Scott** and **Bender**.

Diving:

Diving continues to be a strong event for the Panthers. The squad is highlighted by junior **Margo Ekstrom**, who won Pitt's Diver of the Year award for the second consecutive season. Ekstrom recorded a fourth-place finish in the 1M event at the conference championships and qualified for the NCAA Zones on the 3M board.

Additionally, sophomore **Morgan Speece** and junior **Alyssa Ferraro** advanced to the finals for the first time at the Big East Championships. Speece claimed fourth on the 3M, while Ferraro was seventh on the 1M.

Both Jennings and sophomore **Malory Mullady** placed in the top 16 at the Big East Championships and will add depth to this event.

The Panthers are set to reach new levels of achievement this year, pushing toward two goals: winning a Big East Team Championship and qualifying as many swimmers as possible for the NCAA Championships.

MEN'S SWIMMING AND DIVING OUTLOOK

Coming off a third-place finish in the Big East Championships, the men's swimming and diving team started their climb back toward the Big East Conference. The ultimate goal: to add another Big East Conference Championship to the tally.

"We set high goals knowing the great history of our program, while also knowing that we have a lot of work to do," Head Coach **Chuck Knoles** said. "Setting goals that are as high as our programs' are can be daunting for swimmers and divers here, but we've put together a plan of success."

"Pitt is going to make a statement," Knoles added.

The men have won 11 championships in 19 years under Knoles. This year, Pitt's goal is to make it 12, while also qualifying swimmers and divers for the NCAA Championships. Pitt's program is looking to perform to its full potential this year, especially in key matchups against Notre Dame and WVU.

"We must have a certain level of over-achievement" said Knoles. "Our swimmers and divers have started to embrace that idea and that is exciting."

Leading the Panthers will be senior **Eric Becker** and junior **Geoff Morgan** as the team captains. Both qualified for the Big East Championship last year and are going to be counted on to inspire their teammates.

Senior **Andrew Kyrejko** will also be returning for his senior season at Pitt. Last year, he swam the team's individual top times in both the 200 free and 200 fly.

"Andrew has always been a leader on the team," Knoles commented. "What we're looking for from him is more confidence in his performance. He has been taking huge steps toward meeting those goals and leading on both dry land and in the water."

This young squad's strong leadership is going to be supported by a young talented core of student-athletes, as the men's recruiting class earned a No. 24 ranking by Collegeswimming.com. Additionally, Pitt adds sophomore transfer **Bobby Smith**, who finished fourth in the 200 back at the Big West Championships. New additions include freshmen **Christoph Berger**, **Aidan Considine**, **Steven Forrest**, **David Goszczycki**, **Rousseau Kluever**, **George Krakowski**, **Jake Lucas**, **Ryan Lynn**, **Alex Navarro** and

David Shen, who all bring strong swimming backgrounds to Pitt's already rich history of success in swimming and diving.

"The freshmen will be the key in helping us produce a more competitive season and get closer to our goal of winning another Big East Championship" Knoles said. "We as coaches just need to coach well and get the team going in the right direction."

Freestyle:

Senior **Jon Buchanan** returns as the team's top distance freestyler. He is entering into the season healthy after a series of injuries throughout his career.

"Jon's performance in the summer and fall show that he has done everything right," Knoles stated. "He has confidence and skill and is healthy enough to perform. Now all he has to do is perform."

In the shorter races, Pitt will look to a former member of the Polish National Team, sophomore **Andrzej Dubiel** for points. Dubiel improved to sixth in the finals of the 50 free at the conference championships, with a personal best of 20.72 in his rookie season.

Navarro will provide depth to the freestylers, contributing mostly in middle distance events, while junior **Justin Corvin** and **Otto Pagel** will join the Panthers' freestyler corps in January.

Senior **B.J. Conklyn**, sophomore **Dan Connealy**, **Goszczycki**, **Krakowski**, junior **Alex Kubicek**, **Kyrejko**, **Lucas** and **Lynn** will provide depth.

Breaststroke:

Conklyn returns as the team's leading breaststroker. Last season, his performances recorded in-season best times in both the 50 free and 100 breast, falling just shy of achieving lifetime bests.

Buchanan will also swim the breast for Pitt, while Considine and Shen will add depth.

Butterfly:

Kyrejko and Morgan will be the returning veterans in the butterfly events this year. Last season, Kyrejko finished 12th in the 200 fly at the conference meet, while Morgan placed fourth in the 100 fly at ECACs.

Lucas will be looked to contribute in the

sprint fly events, in his first season, while Kluever and Forrest will see a lot of time in the distance races.

Corvin, Krakowski, Kubicek and junior **Charlie Zettel** will be looked upon for depth.

Backstroke:

Dubiel will be valuable in the backstroke events, as well as the sprint free. This will be his second year leading the Panthers in the backstroke after a great first season, which included a second-place performance in the 100 back at his first Big East Championship meet, setting a freshman team record.

Smith is expected to aid the Panthers in this stroke, as well. The transfer from Pacific was previously a four-time state qualifier and finalist in high school.

Lucas and McLaren should also see action in backstroke events.

IM:

Pitt will be looking for Buchanan to be a strong contributor in the individual medleys this year.

"We want Jon to do really well in the IM this year," Knoles commented. "His wide range of strengths will really propel him forward in this event and he will be filling a lot of holes for us this season."

A Swiss National Champion in the 400 IM, Berger's addition to the team will be immediately impacted in this race. Additionally, Considine, Smith and Zettel will add depth.

"IM swimmers are your most versatile swimmers," Knoles stated.

Diving:

Talented and consistent are two words that describe the members of the diving team, as Pitt has earned the Big East Most Outstanding Diver of the Year Award in each of the last five years. This season, All-American selection **Alex Volovetski** will lead the team in his senior year, after sweeping the boards at the conference meet.

With the return of Becker, sophomores **Jason Erdeljac** and **Collin Forner** will also score points for the Panthers this season. Erdeljac and Forner advanced to the finals in their first-ever conference meet a year ago. **Charlie Hauser** and **Zane McLain** will add depth.

With all of the events returning key contributors and adding talented newcomers, the Panthers are expecting to reach the top of the conference and make a splash into the NCAA scene.

"It would've been easy for Pitt to remain a mid-level program," Knoles commented. "We are one of the finest institutions of education in the world and we intend on honoring that level of excellence here in swimming and diving."

Ben Grady

Head Coach -- Swimming and Diving University of Pittsburgh (1939-1966)

Ben Grady was a three-time All-America diver in high school and a three-time All-American at the University of Michigan as well. In 1937, Grady was the NCAA 3-meter springboard champion in his senior year with the Wolverines.

During his coaching career at Pittsburgh, with the exception of 1942-45 (served as an officer in the U.S. Navy), Grady molded one strong team after another at Pittsburgh. He had 14 winning seasons and led the 1948 team to an undefeated season.

From 1939-59, Grady's teams finished no lower than third place in the Eastern Collegiate Swimming Association Championships and won an unprecedented five straight ECSA titles from 1952-56. He accomplished it all without a pool of his own until 1962 when he spear-headed the planning and design of Trees Pool.

At the 2003 ECAC Championships, the Panthers' new Daktronics scoreboard was dedicated to Grady, for his commitment to the swimming and diving program.

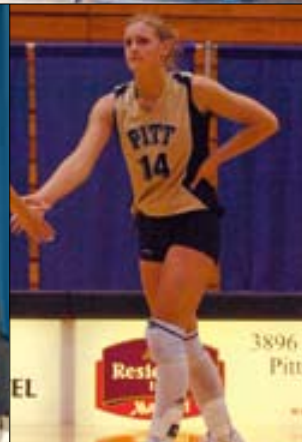
