Game Storylines

- Pitt will play a Top 10 opponent for the second time in as many weeks when it hosts No. 9/8 Oklahoma State at Heinz Field. The Panthers are looking to bounce back from last week's 33-14 loss at then-No. 4 Penn State.
- This will be only the second all-time meeting between the Panthers and Cowboys. In the inaugural game last season, Oklahoma State used a late touchdown to slip past Pitt, 45-38, in Stillwater.
- In Oklahoma State, the Panthers are facing one of the country's most prolific offenses. The Cowboys are averaging 51.5 points and 572.5 yards per contest.
- Fueling the Cowboys' attack is quarterback Mason Rudolph, the all-time leading passer in Oklahoma State history with 9,352 yards. Rudolph's top target is explosive receiver James Washington, who averages an incredible 30.4 yards per catch. Both players are All-America candidates.

- The game will be a significant test for Pitt's youthful defense. Through the opening two games, the Panthers have essentially been breaking in nine new starters on that side of the ball. This week's two-deep lists only two seniors-end Allen Edwards and cornerback Avonte Maddox—on defense.
- Pitt's ability to possess the ball will be key. Through two contests, the Panthers have averaged 36:25 in possession time, the sixth highest average in the nation. In contrast, the quick-strike Cowboys average only 26:42 to rank 101st.
- Oklahoma State is the highest ranked opponent Pitt has hosted at Heinz Field since a 42-30 loss to No. 8/9 Notre Dame in 2015.
- The Panthers' last win over a Top 10 foe occurred on the road, 43-42 over No. 3/2 Clemson last year in Death Valley. Pitt last defeated a Top 10 team at Heinz Field in 2003, a 31-28 win over No. 5 Virginia Tech.

 $\sqrt{\text{Pat Narduzzi}}$ has directed Pitt to eight regular-season wins in each of his first two years, something the Panthers had not achieved since 2008-09.

 $\sqrt{\ }$ In his first two seasons, Narduzzi fashioned a 16-10 overall mark (11-5 in the ACC). The last Pitt coach to achieve as many victories in his first two years was the late Serafino "Foge" Fazio, who went 17-6-1 over his initial two seasons in 1982-83.

 $\sqrt{}$ In ACC annals, Narduzzi became only the fifth man to begin his head coaching career with at least eight wins in each of his first two seasons. The others are Charley Pell of Clemson (1977-78), Ralph Friedgen of Maryland (2001-02), Jeff Jagodzinski of Boston College (2007-08) and Jimbo Fisher of Florida State (2010-11).

 $\sqrt{\ }$ In 2016, Pitt was the only school to have wins over two teams that finished in the top 5 of the final College Football Playoff rankings. The Panthers gave No. 2 Clemson—the eventual national champion—its only loss (43-42) and kept No. 5 Penn State out of the playoff field by defeating the Nittany Lions, 42-39.

 $\sqrt{\ }$ In 2016, Quadree Henderson earned consensus All-America status as a return specialist after leading the country in kickoff return touchdowns (three) and combined kick return yards (1,166). Additionally, guard Dorian Johnson, now of the Arizona Cardinals, was a first team All-American.

 $\sqrt{\ }$ In his debut campaign at Pitt in 2015, Narduzzi led the Panthers to an 8-4 regular-season record, their best 12-game mark since 2009, and a Military Bowl invitation. Pitt finished as the runner-up in the ACC Coastal Division with a 6-2 mark, its best conference record ever.

 $\sqrt{}$ Pitt boasted the ACC's top offensive and defensive newcomers in 2015. Safety Jordan Whitehead was named the league's Overall and Defensive Rookie of the Year. Tailback Qadree Ollison was named the Offensive Rookie of the Year following a 1,000-yard rushing campaign.

√ Narduzzi arrived at Pitt following eight highly successful years as the defensive coordinator at Michigan State under Mark Dantonio. The Spartans were the only team to rank in the nation's top 10 in total defense and rushing defense each season from 2011-14.

 $\sqrt{\rm Michigan}$ State boasted the nation's top rushing defense in 2014, yielding just 88.5 yards per game. The Spartans finished third nationally with 34 turnovers gained and eighth in total defense, holding opponents to just 315.8 yards per contest.

√ In 2014, the Spartans finished with a No. 5 national ranking and 11-2 record following a stirring 42-41 victory over Baylor in the AT&T Cotton Bowl. Narduzzi's defense shut out the high-scoring Bears in the fourth quarter, opening the

door for 21 unanswered points by Michigan State in one of the most thrilling games of the 2014-15 bowl season.

 $\sqrt{}$ In 2013, Michigan State finished No. 3 in the country following a Big Ten title and 24-20 victory over No. 5 Stanford in the Rose Bowl. In the wake of that championship season, Narduzzi was named the 2013 recipient of the prestigious Broyles Award, annually presented to the country's top assistant coach.

 $\sqrt{\mbox{Narduzzi}}$ tutored an impressive list of decorated defensive players at Michigan State, including first team All-Americans in cornerback Darqueze Dennard, safety Kurtis Drummond, linebacker Greg Jones and defensive tackle Jerel Worthy. Dennard was a unanimous All-American in 2013, becoming the first Michigan State cornerback to earn that distinction. He also was the school's first winner of the Jim Thorpe Award, given annually to college football's top defensive back.

 $\sqrt{}$ Dennard was a first-round NFL Draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals in 2014, the first Spartans defensive back taken in the initial round since 1961. In the 2015 draft, another Narduzzi pupil, Michigan State cornerback Trae Waynes, was a first-round pick of the Minnesota Vikings.

 $\sqrt{\text{Prior}}$ to Michigan State, Narduzzi spent three years (2004-06) as defensive coordinator under Dantonio at Cincinnati, helping the Bearcats to a pair of bowl invitations.

 $\sqrt{\mbox{In 2003}}$, Narduzzi was the defensive coordinator at Miami of Ohio under the late Terry Hoeppner. The RedHawks stormed to a 13-1 record that season, capturing the Mid-American Conference championship and defeating nationally ranked Louisville in the GMAC Bowl to finish No. 10 in the Associated Press poll.

√ Narduzzi served as linebackers coach at Northern Illinois for three seasons (2000-02). NIU won a pair of MAC divisional titles during his tenure and in 2002 had the league's top rushing defense. From 1993-99, Narduzzi coached at his alma mater, Rhode Island, serving as the Rams' defensive coordinator his final two seasons. He began his coaching career at Miami of Ohio, working as a graduate assistant in 1990 and 1991, before earning his first full-time position as receivers coach for the 1992 season.

 $\sqrt{\mbox{Narduzzi}}$ was a starting linebacker under his father, the late Bill Narduzzi, as a freshman at Youngstown State University in 1985 before transferring to Rhode Island, where he became a three-year starter for the Rams from 1987-89.

 $\sqrt{}$ Bill Narduzzi was head coach at YSU from 1975-85. He led the Penguins to two NCAA Division II playoff appearances, including the national championship game in 1979, and twice was named the Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year.



SERIES NOTES

This marks the second meeting between Pitt and Oklahoma State... it is the final contest in a two-game home-and-home agreement..the inaugural game was played last year in Stillwater, a 45-38 Cowboys victory...the Panthers have played eight of the 10 programs in the Big 12, the two exceptions being Kansas State and Texas Tech.

TEAM NOTES

HEINZ SWEET HEINZ

Pitt finished the 2016 season with a 6-1 record at Heinz Field, matching its best home mark since the stadium opened in 2001. The Panthers also went 6-1 at Heinz in 2009. Including its season-opening victory over Youngstown State, Pitt has won seven of its past eight home games. The Panthers are 10-4 (.714) at home under Pat Narduzzi, 7-5 (.583) in road games and 0-2 at neutral sites.

FIRST-TIME PITT STARTERS

Nine players made their first career starts for Pitt in the seasonopening 28-21 victory over Youngstown State.

On offense, five players made their debut in the Panthers' starting lineup: senior tight end Matt Flanagan, senior quarterback Max Browne, senior guard Brandon Hodges, senior fullback Colton Lively and redshirt freshman center Jimmy Morrissey. (Flanagan, Browne and Morrissey each started against Penn State as well.)

On defense, junior nose tackle Shane Roy, junior strong safety Dennis Briggs, redshirt freshman defensive tackle Keyshon Camp and redshirt freshman free safety Bricen Garner were all first-time starters. Each of those players were also in Pitt's starting defensive lineup against Penn State last week.

FRESH FACES

Five true freshmen have played for Pitt this season: running back A.J. Davis, tight end Tyler Sear, long snapper Cal Adomitis and cornerbacks Damarri Mathis and Jason Pinnock.

YOUR 2017 PITT TEAM CAPTAINS

As selected by their teammates, the captains for the 2017 Panthers are senior quarterback Max Browne, junior safety Dennis Briggs, senior cornerback Avonte Maddox and senior wide receiver Jester Weah.

Browne, a graduate transfer from USC, owns the distinction of also being elected a captain last season for the Trojans.

PITT PENALTY PROFICIENCY

Pitt is doing an exceptional job in the penalty department. The Panthers rank third nationally in fewest penalties per game (3.00 avg.) and seventh in fewest total penalties (six).

Pitt is sixth in the nation in fewest penalty yards per game (27.50 avg.) and 12th in total penalty yards (55).

The Panthers did not incur a single penalty in its season-opening victory over Youngstown State. It marked the first time since a 21-14 win at Louisville on Nov. 12, 2011 that the Panthers went through a game penalty free.

CLOSE SHAVES

Under Pat Narduzzi, the Panthers have a winning record in close contests. Narduzzi has directed Pitt to a 9-7 record in games decided by single digits. In contrast, the Panthers were 1-5 in single-digit contests in 2014, the year before Narduzzi's arrival. From 2010-14, Pitt was 8-17 in such games.

Pitt is 67-57-5 against current members of the Big 12. However, most of those contests were played prior to the formation of the league in 1996.

West Virginia ranks as Pitt's most-played opponent with 104 games from 1895 to 2011. The schools, separated by a mere 75 miles, met annually as independents and later as members of the Big East. Pitt's series with the Mountaineers, known as "The Backyard Brawl," is scheduled to resume with a four-game agreement from 2022-25.

HEARTBREAK HOTEL

Four of Pitt's five losses in 2016 were by a combined 18 points, an average margin of 4.5 points per game: Northwestern (31-24, Pinstripe Bowl), Virginia Tech (39-36), North Carolina (37-36) and Oklahoma State (45-38). The 23-point loss at Miami (51-28) was Pitt's largest margin of defeat last season.

Two of Pitt's losses came on late scores. In the one-point defeat at UNC, the Tar Heels' winning points came on a two-yard touchdown pass with two seconds to go. At Oklahoma State, the Cowboys scored on a one-yard run with 1:28 remaining to claim a seven-point win.

128 YEARS AND COUNTING

The 2017 campaign marks the 128th football season in Pitt history. The Panthers, who played their inaugural season in 1890, have a 713-521-42 all-time record (.575). The program's rich legacy includes 92 first team All-Americans, 24 College Football Hall of Famers, eight Pro Football Hall of Famers and nine national titles.



BLUE & GOLD RALLY CAPS

Since the 2002 season, Pitt has won 28 games with second-half comebacks. The Panthers' most recent comeback was their 43-42 win at Clemson on Nov. 12, 2016, when Chris Blewitt kicked a 48-yard field goal with six seconds left to secure the upset of the No. 2 Tigers.

ISN'T IT GRAND?

Pitt returns a 1,000-yard rusher for 2017 in junior Qadree Ollison, who netted 1,121 in 2015 en route to earning ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors. Ollison will attempt to become just the sixth player in Pitt history to achieve multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons.

The last player to accomplish the feat was James Conner, who had 1,092 yards in 2016 and 1,765 yards in 2014. The other Panthers in this elite group are Tony Dorsett (four from 1973-76), Curvin Richards (1988-89), LeSean McCoy (2007-08) and Dion Lewis (2009-10).

Through two games this year, Ollison has 187 yards on 37 carries (5.1 avg.). He is averaging 93.5 rushing yards per contest.

RUSH HOUR

Pitt compiled 208 rushing yards in its season-opening victory over Youngstown State, the ninth time in the past 14 games the Panthers have reached the 200-yard mark on the ground. Under Pat Narduzzi, Pitt has compiled at least 200 rushing yards 13 times.

The Panthers featured one of the most potent rushing attacks in the ACC and nationally in 2016. Pitt averaged 225.1 rushing yards per game to rank third in the ACC and 28th in the nation.

It was Pitt's third highest rushing average since 1988. The Panthers averaged 249.5 yards on the ground in 2014 and 253.2 during the '88 campaign.

OWNING THE CLOCK

Pitt ranks sixth nationally in time of possession, averaging 36:25 in its opening two contests. The Panthers have won the possession battle in each of their two games: 34:31 to 25:29 against Youngstown State and 38:20 to 21:40 against Penn State.

NOTABLE SCORING STRETCH

Pitt has scored at least 28 points in 14 of its past 16 games. The two exceptions were the 2016 Pinstripe Bowl, a 31-24 loss to Northwestern, and last week's 33-14 loss at Penn State.

O-LINE EXPERIENCE

Pitt boasts six players on the offensive line who own a combined 99 collegiate starts. The leader of the group is senior Alex Officer with 38 career starts. Junior offensive tackle Brian O'Neill, an All-ACC honoree last year, is second with 27 career starting assignments.

Pitt could not contain a lethal Oklahoma State passing attack in a 45-38 loss in Stillwater...Cowboys quarterback Mason Rudolph was 26 of 46 for 540 yards and two touchdowns, while receiver James Washington hauled in nine receptions for an incredible 296 yards and two TDs....despite those prolific numbers, Pitt was deadlocked with OSU, 38-38, entering the fourth quarter...but at the 12:55 mark of the final period, play was suspended for nearly two hours due to lightning... when action resumed, Rudolph made the decisive play—an 86-yard pass to Jhajuan Seales—that put Oklahoma State at the Pitt 1...on the next play, Rennie Childs rushed in for the game-winning score, his fourth TD of the game, with 1:28 left...Pitt had one last chance, advancing to the OSU 45-yard line, but Nathan Peterman was intercepted by Ramon Richards with 15 seconds left to seal the result... James Conner rushed for 111 yards and a TD for Pitt (2-1)...it was the inaugural meeting between the Panthers and Cowboys (2-1).

O'NEILL FINDS THE END ZONE

Brian O'Neill has started 27 consecutive games at tackle for the Panthers. However, the junior's contributions have gone beyond the conventional duties of an offensive lineman.

While he was instrumental for Pitt's nationally ranked running game in 2016, O'Neill actually carried the ball twice himself last year—scoring touchdowns each time. His initial carry came on a throwback lateral that went for a 24-yard TD in the Panthers' 37-34 win over Georgia Tech. O'Neill reached the end zone again on an end-around play against Virginia Tech that resulted in a five-yard score. He had two carries for 29 yards on the year (14.5 avg.) and even threw two passes (both incomplete).

Originally a tight end who moved to tackle during the 2015 offseason, O'Neill's unconventional contributions earned him SB Nation's 2016 "Piesman Trophy," the only award in college football that honors offensive and defensive linemen who run, pass or catch the ball. He was an All-ACC selection at tackle by the coaches (second team) and media (third team).

ALL-PURPOSE DYNAMO

Wide receiver Quadree Henderson was one of the nation's most productive all-purpose performers in 2016. Henderson ranked 11th nationally and second in the ACC with an average of 160.23 all-purpose yards per game.

He compiled 2,083 all-purpose yards for the season, second only to legendary tailback Tony Dorsett in Pitt annals. Dorsett had 2,217 during his 1976 Heisman Trophy campaign.

Dorsett and Henderson are the only players in Pitt history to reach 2,000 all-purpose yards in a season.

In 2017, Henderson has totaled 188 all-purpose yards (94.0 yards per game).

TD VARIETY

Quadree Henderson totaled 10 touchdowns in 2016, reaching the end zone in four different ways. Henderson had five rushing touchdowns, three kickoff return touchdowns, one receiving TD and one punt return score.

Since 2007, Henderson is just the ninth player from a Power 5 conference to total nine touchdowns via rushing, receiving, kick return and punt return (per ESPN.com).

CAP AND GOWN: THE GRADUATES

Nine players on this year's Pitt football team have already earned their bachelor's degrees. With nine graduates on the roster, Pitt is tied for the seventh highest total among all Bowl Subdivision schools in terms of number of players with their degree already in hand.

JESTER'S NO JOKE

In 2016, his first year as a starting wide receiver, Jester Weah led the Panthers in catches (36), receiving yards (870) and touchdown receptions (10). Weah averaged an astounding 24.2 yards per catch, which ranked second in the country and first in the ACC. He became just the seventh Pitt player since 1989 with double-digit catches in a season to average more than 20 yards per reception. The Pitt season record for yards per catch is 28.3 set in 1991 by Dietrich Jells (12 catches for 339 yards). Weah's average ranks second to Jells.

A NOSE FOR THE END ZONE

Jester Weah had only one catch against Youngstown State but it was a big one—a game-winning 11-yard touchdown catch in overtime. Weah now has eight touchdown catches in his last nine games.

WEAH'S BIG NIGHT

Jester Weah was a catalyst in the Panthers' 43-27 win over Marshall last season by producing the highest receiving yardage by a Pitt player in 12 years. Weah compiled 176 yards on seven catches—both career highs—and made the game's decisive play when he beat a defender for a 54-yard touchdown to put Pitt up by 10 with 1:04 left. His receiving yardage was the most by a Pitt player since Nov. 6, 2004, when Greg Lee had 188 yards (on nine catches) at Syracuse.

Pitt has scored seven defensive touchdowns under Pat Narduzzi. The Panthers had four defensive TDs in 2016 to lead the ACC and rank eighth nationally.

Three current members of Pitt's defense have touchdowns: cornerback Dane Jackson, cornerback Avonte Maddox (two) and safety Jordan Whitehead (two).

The Pitt defense has scored 31 touchdowns since the 2001 season. The Panthers are 26-3 when scoring at least one defensive TD in a game during that span. (The losses occurred against Notre Dame and Navy in 2015, and Oklahoma State in 2016.)

YOUTH MOVEMENT

Pitt has only two seniors listed in its defensive two-deep: end Allen Edwards and cornerback Avonte Maddox. The Panthers have essentially been playing with nine new starters on that side of the ball through its opening two games. In addition to Maddox, the only returning starter to play on defense has been junior linebacker Oluwaseun Idowu.

BLUE AND GOLD RUSH

Under Pat Narduzzi, Pitt has annually displayed an outstanding pass rush. The Panthers ranked sixth nationally with an average of 3.31 sacks per game (43 total) last year.

In 2015, Pitt ranked 16th nationally in sacks with an average of 2.85 per game. Pitt had 37 total sacks, 18 more than it had the year before Narduzzi's arrival (19 in 2014).

On the young season, the Panthers have totaled two sacks (12 quarterback hurries) and 10 tackles for loss.

HENDERSON TAKES IT TO THE HOUSE

Quadree Henderson established himself as college football's most dangerous return man in 2016. A consensus All-American as a return specialist, Henderson led the nation with a school-record three kickoff return touchdowns. He also had a punt return for a score in 2016

Over his past 16 games, Henderson has a total of five return touchdowns (dating back to the 2015 Military Bowl when he had a 100-yard kick return TD).

UNPRECEDENTED IMPACT ON RETURNS

Since the 2000 season, Pitt has just 11 kickoff returns for touchdowns and Quadree Henderson is responsible for four of them. No other Pitt player during that span has more than one.

In the Panthers' 2015 Military Bowl game against Navy, Henderson took the opening kickoff 100 yards for a score—Pitt's first 100-yard kickoff return since 1990 (Ricky Turner vs. West Virginia). Henderson had his second 100-yard return at Miami during the 2016

HOME RUN HITTER

For his career, Quadree Henderson has six kickoff returns that have gone for more than 80 yards. But perhaps the most memorable return of his career was one that didn't result in a touchdown. In the Panthers' stirring 42-39 victory over Penn State in 2016, Henderson made one of the game's critical plays when he returned a kickoff 84 yards to the Nittany Lions' 10 in the fourth quarter. Three plays later James Conner scored on a shovel pass to put Pitt up 42-31, providing the winning cushion.

RETURN MAN EXTRAORDINAIRE

Quadree Henderson led the nation in 2016 in combined kick return yardage with 1,166. Henderson compiled a school single-season record 914 yards on kickoffs as well as 252 on punts. Henderson's 30.5-yard kickoff return average (on 30 attempts) ranked fifth in the nation. He averaged 15.8 yards per punt return (on 16 attempts) to rank third nationally.

PITT PUNT RETURN TDs

Since the 2000 season, Pitt has eight punt return touchdowns, including Quadree Henderson's 65-yarder in the Panthers' 56-14 win over Duke in 2016.

Henderson's punt return TD vs. Duke was Pitt's first that did not involve a block since the 2013 season when Tyler Boyd had a 54-yarder that sparked the Panthers to a 30-27 victory over Bowling Green in the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl.

Pitt built a 21-0 intermission lead but needed overtime to fend off Youngstown State, 28-21, in the season opener for both teams...Jester Weah's leaping 11-yard touchdown grab on the opening possession of OT provided the winning points...on YSU's subsequent possession, redshirt freshman safety Bricen Garner ended the game by picking off Hunter Wells in the end zone...the victory marked the Panthers' first in overtime since a 36-33 win at Notre Dame in 2008...Pitt had dropped three consecutive OT contests before beating YSU...Qadree Ollison rushed for 91 yards and two touchdowns, while Quadree Henderson ran for 77...Pitt compiled 208 yards on the ground but was outgained in total offense, 418 to 348...in his Pitt debut, Max Browne completed 17-of-24 passes for 140 yards and the winning strike to Weah...the Panthers incurred zero penalties in the game, the first time they achieved that feat in six years (2011 at Louisville)...
