

2018 Pitt Football Game Notes Notre Dame Stadium • Saturday, October 13, 2018 Game No. 7: #5 Notre Dame 19, Pitt 14



Team

- Pitt was edged by No. 5 Notre Dame, 19-14, on Saturday at Notre Dame Stadium in front of 77,622 fans.
- Pitt fell to 21-49-1 all-time against Notre Dame and 10-22 against the Fighting Irish in South Bend.
- However, the Panthers (3-4, 2-1 ACC) became the first team to lead after any quarter against the undefeated Fighting Irish (7-0) this season. Pitt led 7-0 after the first, 7-6 at halftime and 14-12 after three quarters.
- Pitt set the tone with its first offensive drive. The Panthers used 17 plays to go 88 yards in 9:43.
- The Panthers defense limited Notre Dame's rushing attack to a season-low 80 yards on 38 carries (2.1 per attempt).
- Pitt also recorded three sacks for a total of 32 yards.
- Three Panthers earned their first career starts in the game. Redshirt freshmen Carson Van Lynn, normally an offensive tackle, started at tight end, and Dontavius Butler-Jenkins started at wide receiver. On defense, sophomore linebacker Elias Reynolds also garnered his first career start.

Maurice Ffrench

- Junior Maurice Ffrench returned the opening kickoff of the second half 99 yards for a touchdown.
- It was Ffrench's second kickoff return TD of the season and his career after he went 92 yards vs. Albany.
- Ffrench became the first Pitt player with two kickoff return TDs since Quadree Henderson had three in 2016.
- Pitt now has 24 kick return TDs since 2000, with half of those occurring the Pat Narduzzi era (since 2015).

Rashad Weaver

- Sophomore defense end Rashad Weaver keyed Pitt's pass rush and run defense.
- Weaver recorded a career-high 1.5 sacks and finished with five total tackles in the game.

Jason Pinnock

Sophomore corner Jason Pinnock recorded his first career interception on the final play of the first quarter.

Jazzee Stocker

- Junior safety Jazzee Stocker also tallied his first career interception in the third quarter.
- With the INTs by Pinnock and Stocker, Pitt now has seven interceptions this season—all by different players.

Aaron Mathews

• Junior wide receiver Aaron Mathews tied a career high with four receptions for a team-high 47 yards.
