Game Storylines

- Pitt makes its 34th all-time postseason appearance when it faces Stanford in the Hyundai Sun Bowl. The Panthers have played in the historic El Paso bowl game on three prior occasions.
- Pitt is 2-1 in the Sun Bowl, winning in 1975 (33-19 vs. Kansas) and 1989 (31-28 vs. Texas A&M). The Panthers' most recent appearance in the Sun City was in 2008 when they dropped a 3-0 decision to Oregon State.
- The Panthers are 2-1 all-time against Stanford but the two schools haven't played in 86 years. The Cardinal won the lone postseason meeting, 7-6, in the Rose Bowl on Jan. 2, 1928. Pitt claimed regular-season wins in 1922 (16-7) and 1932 (7-0).
- Pitt played a national-best 11 bowl-eligible teams this year, including undefeated College Football Playoff entrants Clemson (13-0) and Notre Dame (12-0). The Panthers also faced a 12-0 UCF team that finished No. 8 in the final CFP rankings.
- Pat Narduzzi faced Stanford in a bowl game during his tenure as defensive coordinator at Michigan State. The Spartans won the 2013 Big Ten title and then defeated David Shaw's Cardinal, 24-20, in the Rose Bowl.
- The Panthers own a 23-26 record against current members of the Pac-12 Conference. Pitt last played a Pac-12 team during the 2011 season, a 26-14 loss to Utah at Heinz Field. The Panthers' last bowl game against a Pac-12 team was the Oregon State loss in the 2008 Sun Bowl.
- The Panthers boast the nation's No. 18 rushing attack with an average of 229.5 yards per game. Stanford is surrendering 140.9 yards on the ground to rank 40th nationally.
- Prior to 2018, Pitt never had a 1,000-yard rushing duo in the same season, but senior running backs Qadree Ollison (1,190) and Darrin Hall (1,021) are now the first to reach that shared historic achievement.

✓ The 2018 season marks the fourth for Pat Narduzzi as Pitt's head football coach. Narduzzi's 28 wins to date are the most by a Panthers coach in his initial four seasons since Jackie Sherrill won 39 contests from 1977-80. The 2018 Hyundai Sun Bowl is Pitt's third bowl appearance under Narduzzi's watch.

✓ Narduzzi directed Pitt this season to its first ACC Coastal Division title. The Panthers went 6-2 in ACC play to earn a berth in the 2018 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game, the first conference title game in Pitt history.

✓ Pitt closed the 2017 season with a 24-14 victory over No. 2 Miami, the highest-ranked opponent the Panthers have ever defeated at home. Pitt snapped the nation's longest active winning streak at 15 games by beating the Hurricanes.

✓ In addition to the Miami victory in 2017, the Panthers also defeated No. 2 Clemson, 43-42, in 2016. It was the Tigers' only loss that season as they finished with a 14-1 record and claimed the College Football Playoff national championship.

✓ In 2016, Narduzzi's Panthers defeated two teams that finished in the top 5 of the final 2016 College Football Playoff rankings. Pitt defeated eventual national champion Clemson (43-42) and kept No. 5 Penn State out of the playoff field by defeating the Nittany Lions, 42-39.

✓ In 2016, Quadree Henderson earned consensus All-America status as a return specialist after leading the country in kickoff return touchdowns (three) and combined kick return yards (1,166). Additionally, guard Dorian Johnson also was a first team All-American under Narduzzi.

✓ In his debut campaign at Pitt in 2015, Narduzzi led the Panthers to an 8-4 regular-season record, their best 12-game mark since 2009, and a Military Bowl invitation. Pitt finished as the runner-up in the ACC Coastal Division with a 6-2 mark, its best conference record ever.

✓ Pitt boasted the ACC's top offensive and defensive newcomers in 2015. Safety Jordan Whitehead was named the league's Overall and Defensive Rookie of the Year. Tailback Qadree Ollison was named the Offensive Rookie of the Year following a 1,000-yard rushing campaign.

✓ Narduzzi arrived at Pitt following eight highly successful years as the defensive coordinator at Michigan State under Mark Dantonio. The Spartans were the only team to rank in the nation's top 10 in total defense and rushing defense each season from 2011-14.

✓ Michigan State boasted the nation's top rushing defense in 2014, yielding just 88.5 yards per game. The Spartans finished third nationally with 34 turnovers gained and eighth in total defense, holding opponents to just 315.8 yards per contest.

✓ In 2014, the Spartans finished with a No. 5 national ranking and 11-2 record following a stirring 42-41 victory over Baylor in the AT&T Cotton Bowl. Narduzzi's defense shut out the high-scoring Bears in the fourth quarter, opening the door for 21 unanswered points by Michigan State.

✓ In 2013, Michigan State finished No. 3 in the country following a Big Ten title and 24-20 victory over No. 5 Stanford in the Rose Bowl. Narduzzi was named the 2013 recipient of the prestigious Broyles Award, annually presented to the country's top assistant coach.

✓ Narduzzi's decorated defensive players at Michigan State included first team All-Americans in cornerback Darqueze Dennard, safety Kurtis Drummond, linebacker Greg Jones and defensive tackle Jerel Worthy. Dennard was a unanimous All-American in 2013, becoming the first Michigan State cornerback to earn that distinction. He also was the school's first winner of the Jim Thorpe Award, given to college football's top defensive back.

✓ Dennard was a first-round NFL Draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals in 2014, the first Spartans defensive back taken in the initial round since 1961. In the 2015 draft, another Narduzzi pupil, Michigan State cornerback Trae Waynes, was a first-round pick of the Minnesota Vikings.

✓ Prior to Michigan State, Narduzzi spent three years (2004-06) as defensive coordinator under Dantonio at Cincinnati, helping the Bearcats to a pair of bowl invitations. In 2003, Narduzzi was the defensive coordinator at Miami of Ohio under the late Terry Hoeppner. The RedHawks stormed to a 13-1 record that season, capturing the Mid-American Conference championship and defeating nationally ranked Louisville in the GMAC Bowl to finish No. 10 in the Associated Press poll.

✓ Narduzzi served as linebackers coach at Northern Illinois for three seasons (2000-02). NIU won a pair of MAC divisional titles during his tenure and in 2002 had the league's top rushing defense. From 1993-99, Narduzzi coached at his alma mater, Rhode Island, serving as the Rams' defensive coordinator his final two seasons. He began his coaching career at Miami of Ohio, working as a graduate assistant in 1990 and 1991, before earning his first full-time position as receivers coach for the 1992 season.

✓ Narduzzi was a starting linebacker under his father, the late Bill Narduzzi, as a freshman at Youngstown State University in 1985 before transferring to Rhode Island, where he became a three-year starter for the Rams from 1987-89. Bill Narduzzi was head coach at YSU from 1975-85. He led the Penguins to two NCAA Division II playoff appearances, including the national championship game in 1979, and twice was named the Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year. One of Bill's first coaching posts was as a freshman line coach at Pitt in 1962.

SERIES NOTES

This is the fourth all-time meeting, and second bowl encounter, between Pitt and Stanford...Pitt leads the series, 2-1...the 2018 Hyundai Sun Bowl marks the first game between the Panthers and Cardinal in 86 years...the three prior games involved legendary Hall of Fame coaches Glenn Scobey "Pop" Warner and John Bain "Jock" Sutherland...Warner was the head coach at Pitt from 1915-23, compiling a 60-12-4 record with three national championships (1915, 1916 and 1918)...Warner led Pitt to a 16-7 win at Stanford on Dec. 30, 1922, the first meeting between the two schools...when Warner left the Panthers to take the Stanford job following the 1923 season, he was succeeded by Sutherland, who was a star guard at Pitt (1914-17) and played three seasons under Warner...Sutherland went 111-20-12 as Pitt head coach from 1924-38, leading the Panthers to five national titles (1929, 1931, 1934, 1936 and 1937)...Sutherland's Panthers played Warner's Cardinal squad twice...the first occasion was a 7-6 Stanford victory in the Rose Bowl on Jan. 2, 1928...that defeat in Pasadena was the lone loss of the 1927 season for Pitt, which finished 8-1-1...Sutherland and the Panthers gained a measure of revenge five years later when they defeated Warner and Stanford, 7-0, in Pitt Stadium on Nov. 26, 1932...Warner would finish his nine-year Stanford tenure (1924-32) with a 71-17-8 mark and stands as the second-winningest coach in Cardinal history (behind David Shaw's 81 wins)...Sutherland's 111 victories remain the benchmark for Pitt...the Panthers own a 23-26 record against current members of the Pac-12 Conference...Pitt last played a Pac-12 team during the 2011 season, a 26-14 loss to Utah at Heinz Field...in 2010, Pitt lost at Utah, 27-24 in overtime, when the Utes were in their final season as Mountain West Conference members...the Panthers' last bowl game against a Pac-12 team was in the 2008 Sun Bowl, a 3-0 loss to Oregon State.

TEAM NOTES

TOUGH SLATE OF OPPONENTS

Through 13 games of the 2018 campaign, Pitt played a national-best 11 bowl-eligible teams. The Panthers' slate included undefeated College Football Playoff (CFP) entrants Clemson (13-0) and Notre Dame (12-0). The Panthers also faced a 12-0 UCF team that finished No. 8 in the final CFP rankings.

RANKED FOES

Five Pitt opponents appeared in the most recent Top 25 polls: Clemson (No. 2 Associated Press/No. 2 USA Today Coaches Poll), Notre Dame (No. 3/3), UCF (No. 7/7), Penn State (No. 13/12) and Syracuse (No. 17/17).

129 YEARS AND COUNTING

The 2018 campaign marks the 129th football season in Pitt history. The Panthers, who played their inaugural season in 1890, have a 724-533-42 all-time record (.574).

The program's rich legacy includes 92 first team All-Americans, 24 College Football Hall of Famers, eight Pro Football Hall of Famers and nine national titles.

YOUR 2018 PITT TEAM CAPTAINS

As selected by their teammates, the captains for the 2018 Panthers are senior offensive lineman Alex Bookser, senior safety Dennis Briggs and senior linebacker Quintin Wirginis.

Briggs was also elected a captain as a junior in 2017. He becomes Pitt's first multiple-time captain since defensive tackle Aaron Donald in 2012-13.

WORKING OVERTIME

Pitt outlasted Syracuse in overtime, 44-37, at Heinz Field on Oct. 6. The victory improved the Panthers' all-time OT record to 8-9. Pat Narduzzi is 2-0 in overtime as Pitt's head coach. (In addition to this year's Syracuse victory, the Panthers defeated Youngstown State, 28-21, in OT to open the 2017 season.)

HEINZ SWEET HEINZ

Pitt closed the home portion of its 2018 season with a 52-22 victory over Virginia Tech (Nov. 10). The Panthers finished with a 5-1 overall mark at Heinz Field, the lone loss coming to Penn State on Sept. 8. Against ACC foes at home, Pitt went undefeated (4-0) for the first time ever.

This is only the third time since Heinz Field opened in 2001 that Pitt completed its home schedule with only one defeat. The 2009 and 2016 teams each went 6-1.

ACTIVE DUTY FOR EIGHT TRUE FROSH

Eight true freshmen have seen active duty for Pitt thus far.

On offense, wide receiver Shocky Jacques-Louis has played in nine games (earning three starting assignments). Defensive back/wide receiver V'Lique Carter has played in six contests (all on offense/special teams) and running back Mychale Salahuddin has appeared in three contests.

Defensively, linebacker Wendell Davis has played in four games, while cornerback Marquis Williams has seen action in three contests. Also making appearances this season are a trio of freshmen defensive linemen: Devin Danielson (two games), John Morgan (two games) and Habakkuk Baldonado (one game).

MORE FRESH FACES

Seventeen redshirt freshmen have made their collegiate debuts this season. That total includes nine players on offense (running back Todd Sibley Jr.; receivers Dontavious Butler-Jenkins, Michael Smith and Darian Street; offensive linemen Jerry Drake Jr., Owen Drexel and Gabe Houy; and tight ends Grant Carrigan and Carson Van Lynn), six defensive players (cornerback Paris Ford; defensive linemen Deslin Alexandre and Jaylen Twyman; and linebackers Albert Tucker, Cam Bright and Kyle Nunn) and two specialists (punter Kirk Christodoulou and placekicker/holder Jake Scarton).

OFFENSIVE NOTES

TWO-HEADED RUSHING MONSTER

The Panthers boast a formidable senior tailback tandem in Qadree Ollison and Darrin Hall. Prior to 2018, Pitt never had a 1,000-yard rushing duo in the same season, but Ollison (1,190) and Hall (1,021) are now the first to reach that shared achievement.

Pitt most recently flirted with two 1,000-yard rushers in 2010. That year Dion Lewis ran for 1,061 yards, while Ray Graham netted 922.

The Panthers are the only team to boast two players among the ACC's top eight rushers (yards per game). Ollison is third at 91.5, while Hall ranks eighth at 78.5.

PANTHERS ON THE RUN

Pitt boasts the nation's No. 18 rushing attack with an average of 229.5 yards per game. Among ACC teams, the Panthers rank third in rushing, trailing only Georgia Tech's spread-option attack (335.0 avg.) and Clemson (259.8).

Pitt is producing at its highest rate on the ground since the 2014 season when it averaged 249.5 rushing yards. That year, sophomore tailback James Conner led Pitt with 1,765 yards and was named a first team All-American and ACC Player of the Year.

OLLISON ROLLIN'

Qadree Ollison's rushing production as a senior ranks among the finest backs in the ACC and the nation. Through 13 games, Ollison has run for 1,190 yards and 11 touchdowns on 189 carries (6.30 avg.). He is averaging 91.5 rush yards per contest.

ISN'T IT GRAND?

Qadree Ollison joined an elite fraternity of Pitt running backs when he reached the 1,000-yard rushing milestone this season.

Ollison became only the sixth player in Pitt history to achieve multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons. He has 1,190 through 13 games this year.

As a redshirt freshman in 2015, Ollison netted 1,121 yards en route to earning ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors.

Prior to Ollison, the last player to accomplish the feat was James Conner, who had 1,092 yards in 2016 and 1,765 yards in 2014. The other Panthers in this distinguished group are Tony Dorsett (four from 1973-76), Curvin Richards (1988-89), LeSean McCoy (2007-08) and Dion Lewis (2009-10).

PITT-STANFORD BOWL REWIND

Jan. 2, 1928 • The Rose Bowl (Pasadena, Calif.) • 70,000

Pitt's first bowl trip resembled a politician's whistle-stop tour. Wherever the Panthers were at lunchtime during their trek west, they practiced. The routine was simple: deboard the train around 11:15 a.m.; explore the day's town until noon; lunch at 12; walk lunch off, then practice; reboard the train. So it was that Pitt practiced in Dodge City, Albuquerque and Winslow, Arizona, on the way to Pasadena. The game had a sentimental storyline: the coach against his mentor. Panther head coach John B. "Jock" Sutherland had played for Stanford coach Glenn "Pop" Warner when the latter was at Pitt. Amidst all that, the game, although close, was controlled by Stanford. Pitt grabbed a 6-0 third-quarter lead when Jimmy Hagan scooped up a Cardinal fumble and ran 17 yards for a touchdown. The extra point was missed. Stanford, which made several marches deep into Pitt territory, finally scored on an unusual play. It looked like the Panthers would make a defensive stand when they forced a fumble from Stanford fullback "Big Biff" Hoffman near the goal line. But Frank Wilton of the Cardinal picked up the loose ball and carried it into the end zone for a five-yard touchdown. Hoffman, who ran for 82 yards and would be named the Rose Bowl's Most Valuable Player, broke the tie with his extra point. Pitt, a slight favorite entering the game, mustered very little offense in its first of four Rose Bowl appearances and was outgained by Stanford, 246 to 169. The Panthers' usually potent ground attack produced 78 fewer yards than the Cardinal (203 to 125). It would be the lone loss of the 1927 season for Sutherland's Panthers, who finished the campaign with an 8-1-1 mark. Stanford's Rose Bowl triumph over Pitt capped an 8-2-1 season.

HISTORIC DASH

Qadree Ollison put the finishing touches on Pitt's 52-22 win over Virginia Tech (Nov. 10) with a touchdown run of epic proportions.

With the Panthers taking over at their own three-yard line with five minutes remaining, Ollison burst through the line and sprinted 97 yards for a score, using a brutal stiff-arm at midfield to dismiss the final defender.

It stands as the longest play from scrimmage—run or pass—in Pitt history. Ollison broke the record held by teammate Darrin Hall, who had a 92-yard touchdown run in Pitt's 24-17 win at Duke in 2017. Ollison's 97-yard run is also tied for the longest in college football this year (with Notre Dame's Dexter Williams).

SUN BOWL REWIND: OREGON STATE 3 PITT 0 Dec. 31, 2008 • Sun Bowl Stadium (El Paso, Texas) • 49,037

Making its first bowl appearance since the 2004 season, Pitt failed to take advantage of a masterful defensive performance, falling to Oregon State, 3-0, in the Sun Bowl. Coach Dave Wannstedt's Panthers (9-4) held the Beavers to 273 yards and forced three turnovers. Unfortunately, Pitt's offense was also bottled up, managing only 178 yards and never penetrating Oregon State's (9-4) 36-yard line. Pitt appeared poised to pull out a fourth-quarter comeback when T.J. Porter returned a punt 36 yards to the OSU 42 with 12:39 left. A sack and forced fumble by the Beavers' Victor Butler, however, ended the threat. Pitt's final scoring opportunity came with 2:02 remaining when Conor Lee attempted a 57-yard field goal, but the kick fell just short of the crossbar. Linebackers Scott McKillop and Austin Ransom led Pitt with 11 tackles each. McKillop also had an interception in the end zone to end the first half. Greg Romeus was named the Jimmy Rogers Jr. Most Valuable Lineman after collecting four tackles and two sacks. Oregon State placekicker Justin Kahut accounted for the lone points of the day on a 44-yard field goal with 2:18 left in the second quarter. It was the lowest scoring bowl game since 1959, a 0-0 tie between Air Force and TCU in the Cotton Bowl.

HALL MAKES MARK

Darrin Hall is enjoying the most productive season of his career as a senior. Hall has rushed for 1,021 yards and nine touchdowns on 137 carries (7.45 avg.). His yards per carry average ranks seventh nationally and second in the ACC.

Hall had a season-high 229 yards and three touchdowns on 19 carries (12.1 avg.) in the 23-13 win at Virginia (Nov. 2). He has seven 100-yard games for his career, including two 200-yard efforts.

SUN BOWL REWIND: PITT 31 TEXAS A&M 28

Dec. 30, 1989 • Sun Bowl Stadium (El Paso, Texas) • 44,887

Led by bowl MVP Alex Van Pelt's 354 yards passing, Pitt parlayed a Sun Bowl-record 530 yards in offense into a 31-28 come-from-behind victory over Texas A&M. It was a day of firsts for the Panthers. Paul Hackett, named head coach moments before kickoff, won his first game as a head coach. It also was Pitt's first bowl win since the Panthers' 24-20 Sugar Bowl victory over Georgia in 1982. Van Pelt, who completed 20-of-40 passes and threw for two touchdowns, rallied Pitt (8-3-1) from a 28-24 deficit when he connected with Henry Tuten on a 44-yard touchdown strike with just 2:19 remaining in the game, giving Pitt a 31-28 lead. Curvin Richards rushed for 156 yards on 23 carries and scored the first points of the game with a 12-yard TD. Texas A&M (8-4) countered with a nine-yard touchdown run by quarterback Lance Pavlas, tying the score at 7-7 to end the first quarter. With the score tied at 10 late in the first half, Van Pelt threw an eight-yard touchdown pass to Ronald Redmon, giving Pitt a 17-10 halftime lead. Flanker Olanda Truitt caught four passes for 124 yards, including a key 59-yard reception that set up Redmon's score. Carnel Smith finished the game with 10 tackles and Barry Threats had a game-ending interception, which halted Texas A&M's final drive and secured the Panthers' victory.

CARTER INCREDIBLE IN DEBUT

Freshman V'Lique Carter was dazzling in his college debut against Duke (Oct. 27). Carter ran for 137 yards and two touchdowns on just seven carries, an incredible average of 19.6 per rush. His scoring dashes covered 31 and 16 yards. Carter is the first Pitt player to achieve a 100-yard rushing game in his debut since Qadree Ollison had 207 yards and a TD on 16 carries as a redshirt freshman against Youngstown State in 2015. Carter is also the first true freshman to rush for 100 yards in his initial game since Dion Lewis had 129 yards and two TDs on 20 carries against Youngstown State in 2009.

RUSH HOUR

Pitt has flirted with the 500-yard rushing mark in two games this season. The Panthers piled up 492 yards and six touchdowns on 36 carries (13.7 avg.) in a 52-22 victory over Virginia Tech (Nov. 10). It marked the second-highest rushing total ever at Pitt, trailing only the school-record 530 yards gained at Army on Oct. 18, 1975.

In the Panthers' 54-45 win over Duke (Oct. 27), Pitt compiled 484 yards and four touchdowns on 52 carries (9.3 avg.), the third-highest ground total in school annals.

Since Pat Narduzzi's initial season as Pitt's head coach in 2015, the Panthers have rushed for at least 200 yards on 22 occasions. Pitt is 17-5 in those contests. During that same time span, the Panthers have six games with at least 300 rushing yards and are 6-0 in those outings. Pitt is 2-0 when reaching the 400-yard rushing milestone with both of those contests occurring this season.

SUN BOWL REWIND: PITT 33 KANSAS 19

Dec. 26, 1975 • Sun Bowl Stadium (El Paso, Texas) • 30,272

A player rushing for 100 yards is impressive. Two players on the same team is remarkable. Three is unheard of, but that is how Coach Johnny Majors' Pitt squad knocked off Kansas in the 1975 Sun Bowl. The Panthers' 100-yard rushing trio consisted of running backs Tony Dorsett (142 yards on 27 carries) and Elliott Walker (123 yards on 11 carries), as well as quarterback Robert Haygood (101 yards on 14 carries). Haygood, who also completed 8-of-11 passes for 60 yards and a touchdown, earned the game's Most Valuable Offensive Player award. As a team, Pitt (8-4) rushed for 372 yards and four touchdowns. Walker got the ball rolling with a 60-yard touchdown run in the first quarter and added a two-yard score in the final period. Dorsett scored two TDs in the second quarter. Gordon Jones scored the Panthers' final touchdown on a seven-yard pass from Haygood. Jones set that last TD up by returning a kickoff 63 yards. Unfairly overshadowed was Pitt's defense, which yielded only a single score through three quarters before giving up a pair of late touchdowns. Leading that effort was nose guard Al Romano, the bowl's Most Valuable Defensive Player. Romano made one of the game's key plays when he stuffed a 4th-and-1 run at the Pitt 16, halting a 64-yard Kansas (7-5) drive in the opening quarter. The triumph in El Paso was Pitt's first bowl victory since a 21-0 decision over Washington in the 1937 Rose Bowl. It also set the stage for the Panthers' run to the 1976 national championship.

HISTORIC OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

In Pitt's 52-22 demolition of Virginia Tech (Nov. 10), the Panthers piled up a school-record 654 yards in total offense, eclipsing the prior mark of 648 set against Eastern Michigan in 1995.

This was Pitt's second game this season with more than 600 yards in offense (634 vs. Duke, Oct. 27). The Panthers have eclipsed 600 yards only eight times in program history.

O-LINE EXPERIENCE

Pitt has seven players on the offensive line who own a combined 135 collegiate starts.

Although the Panthers feature four seniors on the starting unit, three of those upperclassmen (tackle Stefano Millin, guard Mike Herndon and center/guard Connor Dintino) are in their first seasons as Pitt starters.

Pitt was dealt a significant blow when sophomore center Jimmy Morrissey was lost for the balance of the season due to an injury sustained in the waning moments of Pitt's 34-13 win at Wake Forest (Nov. 17). Morrissey had started 23 consecutive games at center for Pitt.

In the Panthers' final regular-season game of the year, at Miami on Nov. 24, Dintino started at center and sophomore Bryce Hargrove, making his first college start, filled in at left guard. Both players also started at those positions against Clemson in the Dr Pepper ACC Championship Game on Dec. 1.

CAP AND GOWN: THE GRADUATES

Sixteen players on this year's Pitt football team have already earned their bachelor's degrees. With 16 graduates on the roster, Pitt ranks third among all Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools in terms of number of players with their degree already in hand.

KENNY'S CAREER DAY

A career performance by Kenny Pickett lifted Pitt past Wake Forest, 34-13, on Nov. 17, clinching the Panthers' first ACC Championship Game berth. Pickett completed 23-of-30 passes (77%) for 316 yards and three touchdowns. His yardage, completions and TDs were all personal bests.

Each of Pickett's touchdown passes came in the second half to help Pitt erase a 10-6 halftime deficit. Two of his scoring tosses came less than three minutes apart: a four-yarder to Rafael Araujo-Lopes and a 63-yard strike to Taysir Mack that put Pitt up 20-10 at the end of the third period. After Wake Forest kicked a field goal to make it 20-13 early in the fourth, Pickett responded with a 23-yard TD pass to Maurice Ffrench, boosting the lead to 27-13 with 7:27 to play and essentially sealing the result.

TDs BY THE "D"

Pitt has scored nine defensive touchdowns under Pat Narduzzi, including one this season (cornerback Dane Jackson's 35-yard fumble return against Syracuse).

The Pitt defense has scored 33 touchdowns since the 2001 season. The Panthers are 27-4 when scoring at least one defensive TD in a game during that span. (The losses occurred against Notre Dame and Navy in 2015, and Oklahoma State in 2016 and 2017.)

LOW INT TOTAL RANKS AMONG FBS BEST

Kenny Pickett has only thrown six interceptions in 13 games. As a result, the Panthers rank among the nation's best in fewest interceptions thrown. Pitt ranks 19th nationally and second in the ACC with six INTs. Among ACC teams, the Panthers trail only run-heavy Georgia Tech (four INTs) in that category.

Pickett's six interceptions are the fewest thrown in a season by a Pitt quarterback with a minimum of 175 attempts since Tino Sunseri in 2012. Sunseri threw only three interceptions in 13 games (393 attempts) that year. Sunseri actually went 271 attempts between interceptions in 2012.

Pickett this season had a string of 143 attempts without an interception broken against Clemson in the Dr Pepper ACC Championship Game. That streak covered six consecutive games (the Oct. 13 Notre Dame game through the Nov. 24 Miami contest).

DEFENSIVE NOTES

STICKY FINGERS

Sophomore defensive end Rashad Weaver ranks fifth in the nation and tied for first in the ACC with three fumble recoveries (tied with Georgia Tech linebacker Charlie Thomas).

Weaver picked up two fumbles in the Sept. 8 Penn State game, returning one for 20 yards. He became the first Pitt player to recover two fumbles in a single game since linebacker Mike Caprara also had two against Penn State on Sept. 10, 2016. Weaver added another fumble recovery in the Sept. 15 victory over Georgia Tech.

Additionally, junior cornerback Dane Jackson has two fumble recoveries, which ranks third in the ACC and 21st on a national level. Jackson had a 35-yard fumble return for a touchdown against Syracuse and also had a strip-and-recovery at Virginia.

As a team, the Panthers have collected nine fumble recoveries, which rank seventh in the ACC and 43rd nationally.

Other Pitt players with recoveries this season are redshirt freshman linebacker Cam Bright (at North Carolina), junior free safety Damar Hamlin (at Miami), senior defensive end Dewayne Hendrix (against Duke) and senior nose tackle Shane Roy (at Miami).

IT'S BEEN AWHILE

Should Rashad Weaver recover a fourth fumble this season, it would be the first time in 37 years a Pitt player achieved that feat. The last time it occurred was during the 1981 season when defensive end Michael Woods collected a total of five fumble recoveries.

KNOCK IT LOOSE

Pitt also has a player among the national leaders in forced fumbles. Cornerback Dane Jackson has four forced fumbles in 12 games played this season. His average of 0.33 forced fumbles per contest ranks second in the ACC and eighth nationally. In the Panthers' 23-13 win at Virginia, Jackson halted a Cavs drive in Pitt territory with a strip and recovery.

REYNOLDS TO THE RESCUE

Sophomore Elias Reynolds has been Pitt's starting middle linebacker the past seven games. Reynolds began the year as the top reserve but was forced into a more prominent role the week of Oct. 8 when senior starter and team captain Quintin Wirginis sustained a non-contact knee injury in practice that resulted in season-ending surgery.

Reynolds made his first career start at Notre Dame (Oct. 13) and has continued to entrench himself in the middle of Pitt's defense. He has totaled 49 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and one sack on the season. Reynolds had a career-high 12 stops and two TFLs in the Panthers' 54-45 win over Duke (Oct. 27).

PITT BLOCK PARTY

Pitt has 55 blocked kicks since the 2000 season. That total includes 10 blocks during Pat Narduzzi's tenure as Pitt head coach (since 2015).

ALL-STAR CALIBER

Quintin Wirginis was having an All-ACC caliber season before his senior year was cut short due to injury prior to the Oct. 13 Notre Dame contest.

Through six games, Wirginis ranked as the Panthers' most productive defender, leading the team in tackles (41), tackles for loss (7.0), sacks (3.0) and forced fumbles (tied with two).

In what would be his final game of the season, a 44-37 overtime victory over Syracuse (Oct. 6), Wirginis was especially impactful. He collected eight tackles, including a six-yard sack, and forced a crucial fumble that was returned for a 35-yard touchdown by teammate Dane Jackson. Wirginis also applied pressure on a blitz that resulted in a game-ending interception in overtime by Therran Coleman.

GROUND DEFENSE

Under Pat Narduzzi, Pitt has held a total of 17 opponents under the 100-yard rushing mark. The Panthers are 14-3 overall in such games, including a 3-1 mark this season.

In the 2018 opener, a 33-7 win over Albany, Pitt yielded only 60 yards on 28 carries (2.14 avg.).

In their Oct. 13 contest at Notre Dame, the Panthers limited the Irish to 80 yards on 38 carries (2.11 avg.) in a 19-14 setback.

Pitt held Virginia to 44 yards on 26 attempts (1.69 avg.) in a 23-13 win (Nov. 2).

Most recently, Pitt held Wake Forest to 79 yards on 28 carries (2.82 avg.) in a 34-13 win (Nov. 17).

During the Pat Narduzzi era, Pitt has recorded four or more quarterback sacks in a game 16 times. The Panthers have a 13-3 record in those contests where they have compiled at least four sacks. Pitt boasts a 7-0 mark when they have at least five sacks.

Pitt has twice compiled five sacks in a game this season: a 23-13 win at Virginia (Nov. 2) and a season-opening 33-7 win over Albany (Sept. 1). The Panthers had four sacks in their 52-22 victory over Virginia Tech (Nov. 10).

During Pat Narduzzi's tenure as Pitt head coach, the Panthers have held an opponent under 300 yards in total offense eight times, including twice this season.

That feat was most recently achieved in the Panthers' 34-13 win at Wake Forest (Nov. 17), when the Demon Deacons were limited to 285 yards (79 rushing and 206 passing). In Pitt's 23-13 win at Virginia (Nov. 2), the Cavs only mustered 249 total yards (44 rushing and 205 passing).

RARE GLORY

Rare is the time an interior lineman gets the glory of an interception but it happened in the Panthers' 44-37 overtime victory over Syracuse on Oct. 6. Junior defensive tackle Amir Watts had the first interception of his career when he snagged an Eric Dungey pass over the middle. The Panthers parlayed the pick into a field goal and 20-14 second-quarter lead. It was the first INT by a Pitt interior defensive lineman since Chas Alecxih against Buffalo on Sept. 3, 2011.

DAMAR'S LONG-DISTANCE RETURN

Junior safety Damar Hamlin made a key play in Pitt's season-opening 33-7 win over Albany when he halted the Great Danes' first drive with an interception at the Pitt 2. Hamlin returned the pick 79 yards, setting up the Panthers' second touchdown for an early 13-0 lead.

The 79-yard interception return marked Pitt's longest since October 16, 2010, when Ricky Gary had an 80-yard return for a score at Syracuse.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

BIG FOOT

Sophomore Alex Kessman has six of the eight longest field goals in school history: a Pitt record-tying 56-yarder, two 55-yard kicks, two 54-yarders and a 53-yard kick. Kessman owns the distinction of having the most 50-yard field goals in Pitt history with six.

Since 1961 (57 years), Pitt has made only 18 field goals of 50 yards or more.

LONGEST EVER AT HEINZ

Alex Kessman can claim the longest field goal at Heinz Field by either a professional or collegian. On a notoriously difficult track for kickers, his 55-yarder against Syracuse (Oct. 6) eclipsed the prior Heinz record of 54 set by Old Dominion's Jarod Brown in 2013 against Pitt. The longest NFL field goal at Heinz Field is 53 yards by Chris Boswell (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Dan Bailey (Dallas Cowboys).

FOUR OF THE NATION'S LONGEST KICKS

Alex Kessman owns four of the top-17 longest field goals made in college football during the 2018 season: a 55-yard kick (Syracuse, Oct. 6), which ranks third; two 54-yarders (Syracuse and on Oct. 27 against Duke), which rank eighth; and a 53-yarder (Virginia, Nov. 2), which ranks 17th.

KESSMAN GETS HIS KICKS

Alex Kessman has twice notched a career-high 14 points in a game this season. He initially set the personal milestone in Pitt's 44-37 overtime win over Syracuse (Oct. 6). Kessman was perfect on each of his eight kicks against the Orange (3-for-3 field goals and 5-for-5 PATs). His field goals came from 54, 55 and 45 yards. The 55-yarder set a Heinz Field record (NFL and college).

Kessman also accounted for 14 points in Pitt's 54-45 win over Duke (Oct. 27), again converting 3-of-3 field goals and each of his five PATs. His field goals covered 27, 54 and 48 yards.

Kessman currently leads the Panthers in scoring with 72 points on 11-of-14 field goals (79%) and 39-of-41 PATs (95%). He has made his last seven consecutive field goal tries.

FFRENCH IS "FFAST"

When Pitt visited Notre Dame on Oct. 13, Maurice Ffrench made one of the game's most dramatic plays when he took the second-half's opening kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown, giving the Panthers a 14-6 lead. It marked Ffrench's second kick return TD of the season. He also owns a 91-yarder for a score in the opener against Albany.

Ffrench is the first Pitt player to have multiple kick return touchdowns in a season since Quadree Henderson had a school-record three in 2016, when Henderson was a consensus All-America return specialist.

OPENING THE 2018 SEASON IN STYLE

Pitt opened the 2018 season in explosive fashion against Albany when Maurice Ffrench returned the game's opening kickoff for a 91-yard touchdown. It was the first kick return score of his collegiate career and the first time on record that the Panthers opened a season with a kickoff return TD.

Ffrench's return marked the second time in 27 games Pitt returned the game's opening kickoff for a score. The previous occasion was on Dec. 28, 2015, when Quadree Henderson had a 100-yard return against Navy in the Military Bowl.

YOU CAN'T GET MUCH LONGER

Maurice Ffrench's 99-yard kickoff return touchdown at Notre Dame (Oct. 13) is the second longest by an ACC player this season and ranks eighth on a national scale.

Maurice Ffrench has established himself as one of college football's top return threats. Ffrench is tied for first in the ACC and ranks second nationally with two kickoff return touchdowns. (New Mexico State's Jason Huntley is the FBS leader with three kickoff return TDs. Ffrench is tied for the ACC lead with Georgia Tech's Juanyeh Thomas.)

Ffrench also leads the ACC and ranks seventh nationally with a 27.4-yard kickoff return average (20 for 547 yards).

ARAUJO-LOPES OWNS FIFTH-LONGEST PUNT RETURN

Rafael Araujo-Lopes owns the nation's fifth-longest punt return of the 2018 season: his 86-yard touchdown at UCF on Sept. 29. It is also the longest in the ACC this year.

CHRISTODOULOU MAKES AMERICAN DEBUT

Redshirt freshman punter Kirk Christodoulou, in his first active season at Pitt, is averaging 41.6 yards on 68 punts. He has a season long of 73 yards (at Miami) and has placed 18 inside the 20-yard line. Thirteen of his punts have resulted in a fair catch.

Christodoulou had the most active day of his career at Miami, when he punted 12 times for a 43.3-yard average. In addition to his career-long 73-yarder, he had a personal-best five punts inside the 20-yard line.

Christodoulou actually has two punts over 70 yards this year. He also had a 71-yarder at Wake Forest (Nov. 17).

The 2018 season not only marks Christodoulou's collegiate debut but also his first official game action in America.

A native of Australia, Christodoulou enrolled at the University of Pittsburgh in January 2017. He was a standout Australian rules football player before embarking on his goal to play college football in the United States. Christodoulou worked with the renowned Prokick Australia program that has produced many successful collegiate and NFL punters.

Prokick Australia's "exports" include Pittsburgh Steelers punter Jordan Berry and all three 2016 Ray Guy Award finalists: winner Mitch Wishnowsky (Utah) as well as Michael Dickson (Texas; now with the Seattle Seahawks) and Cameron Johnston (Ohio State; now with the Philadelphia Eagles).

Pitt's four-game winning streak was halted by Miami with a 24-3 defeat in the regular-season finale...facing a Hurricanes defense that entered the game ranked No. 3 nationally in fewest yards allowed (274.5 avg.), the Panthers mustered only 200 yards and a field goal on the day...it was Pitt's lowest yardage production in five years (199 in a 14-3 win over Virginia, Sept. 28, 2013)...the Panthers failed to score a touchdown in a game for the first time since a 28-6 loss to SMU in the BBVA Compass Bowl on Jan. 7, 2012...Miami's swarming pass rush produced six sacks...the Panthers were also held to a season-low 69 rushing yards on 38 carries (1.8 avg.)...it was 178 yards below Pitt's season average on the ground (247.5)...Pitt (7-5, 6-2) recovered two Miami fumbles near midfield but could not parlay either turnover into points...Kirk Christodoulou was forced to punt 12 times (43.3 avg.)...he launched a career-long 73-yarder and placed five inside the Miami 20...however, a key play of the game was a 65-yard punt return touchdown by DeeJay Dallas in the second quarter, giving the Hurricanes a 10-point lead...Miami (7-5, 4-4) gained a measure of revenge one year to the day that Pitt scored a 24-14 upset at Heinz Field over the No. 2-ranked Hurricanes in the 2017 regular-season finale.

Playing in its first Dr Pepper ACC Championship Game, Pitt could not overcome Clemson's Travis Etienne or its own ineffective passing night in a 42-10 defeat at rainy Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte... Etienne, the 2018 ACC Player of the Year, raced for a 75-yard touchdown on the game's first play from scrimmage...he finished with 156 yards on just 12 carries (13.0 avg.) and was selected the game's Most Outstanding Player...the Tigers piled up 301 yards and four TDs on the ground...Pitt ran for 192 yards, the highest rushing total against Clemson this season, but only completed 4-of-16 passes for eight yards on the night...in sloppy conditions, the Tigers forced three turnovers, resulting in 14 points...midway through the second quarter, however, the Panthers (7-6) were very much in contention...Pitt scored 10 consecutive points, including a one-yard TD plunge by Qadree Ollison, to make it 14-10...but two short scoring passes by Trevor Lawrence in the final five minutes of the half gave Clemson a 28-10 advantage and Pitt never threatened again...Darrin Hall had 86 yards on 14 carries, pushing him past 1,000 yards for the year...Hall (1,021) and Ollison (1,190) became Pitt's first 1,000-yard rushing duo in the same season...the No. 2 Tigers (13-0) became the first team to win four straight ACC title games and secured their selection to the College Football Playoff for the fourth year in a row.
