LEADING OFF

- The University of Pittsburgh softball team will take on Kent State in a midweek matchup Wednesday at the Diamond at Dix in Kent, Ohio.

THE SCHEDULE

- The Panthers [22-16-1, 11-6 ACC] will face the Golden Flashes [20-18, 6-8 MAC] in its first of two meetings this season, Wednesday, April 18 at 4 p.m.
- The contest marks the first game in a home and home series, with game two occurring in Pittsburgh Tuesday, May 1 at 6 p.m.

LAST TIME OUT

- Pitt earned its fifth ACC series win of the season after taking two of three from Georgia Tech. The Panthers played a doubleheader Friday, winning game one 4-2, before dropping game two against the Yellow Jackets 8-6. Pitt returned Saturday to defeat Georgia Tech 6-2.
- Junior **Sarah Dawson** earned the start in game one, where she finished her 11th career complete-game win after surrendering just three hits and two runs while striking out a career-high tying seven batters. The junior retired 12 consecutive Yellow Jacket batters to open the game, adding five strikeouts through the first four frames.
- Despite falling behind early in game two 6-0, the Panthers battled back to tie the score 6-6, but were unable to complete the comeback.
- In the rubber match, freshman **Hunter Levesque** went 2-for-3 on the day while adding a home run, two RBIs and three runs. Senior **Giorgiana Zeremenko** earned Pitt's other long ball of the day, roping her 13th home run of the season over the center field wall. Sophomore **Kaitlyn Kruger** went 2-for-3 to go along with an RBI while junior **Olivia Gray** went 2-for-4 with a run.

THE SERIES

- Pitt and Kent State have met 25 times in program history, with the Golden Flashes owning a 14-11 edge.
- The Panthers won five of the last six meetings, including a 7-0 victory the last time they faced each other in 2017.
- On the road, Pitt is 3-7 all-time against Kent State.

SCOUTING KENT STATE

- Kent State owns a 20-18 overall record and a 6-8 mark MAC play.
- The Golden Flashes are coming off a series loss to Miami University after losing the final two contests of a three-game series.
- Kent State is led in the circle by sophomore Madi Huck, who owns a 12-7 record in 26 appearances, including 13 complete games and four shutouts. In 129.1 innings on the mound, Huck owns a 3.14 ERA and has struck out 73.
- At the plate, the Golden Flashes have two batters hitting over .400 on the season in senior Holly Speers and Kennadie Goth. Speers holds a .469 batting average to go along with ten home runs, 39 RBIs, 34 runs and a slugging percentage of .917. Goth is batting .427 with 44 hits in 103 plate appearances for Kent State.

DOUBLE OR NOTHING

- Pitt's defense ranks first in the ACC with 0.69 double plays per game, good for third overall in the nation. The Panthers have turned 27 double plays this season.

GOING YARD

- With 1.05 home runs per game, the Panthers sit 26th in the nation this week in the category. In the ACC, the squad holds the second spot. Pitt has blasted 41 long balls in 39 games.
- Pitt has seen 11 different players hit a home run, including a team-leading 13 bombs by senior **Giorgiana Zeremenko**, who ranks 19th in the nation in home runs and first in the ACC while also ranking 17th in the nation in home runs per game.
- Zeremenko became the all-time leader in the category at the BIG/ACC Challenge, notching her 35th career home run. She was the leading home run hitter for Pitt the past two seasons, including 2016, when she set the single-season record with 17. Zeremenko is just four home runs away from tying her own record and five away from breaking it, as her 13 home runs in 2018 sits fifth overall in program history in a single season. She now has 42 in her career.

MYERS MAKING MOVES IN ACC PLAY

- Seeing substantial playing time for the first time in her career, junior **Taylor Myers** has proved to be an asset both at the plate and in the outfield for the Panthers.
- In conference play, Myers ranks third on the team with a .311 batting average. In 45 at-bats, she has produced 14 hits while adding three doubles and one long ball. The junior has also racked up six RBIs and seven runs. Myers has also been hit with a team-leading four pitches.
- Defensively, she has seen her time in the outfield increase, playing all three positions. She owns 25 putouts in ACC play.
- Overall, Myers is batting .244 with 19 hits and eight RBIs, while boasting 45 putouts, one assist and one error in the field to make for a .979 fielding percentage.

THE ZEREMENKO ZONE

- Senior **Giorgiana Zeremenko** has been on a wrath at the plate in 2018 for the Panthers.
- On the season, the Canonsburg, Pa., native is leading the team in multiple categories including average (.347), hits (41), doubles (10), home runs (13), slugging percentage (.763) and walks (20).
- She boasts a team-leading 12 multi-hit games, tied with fellow teammate Olivia Gray.
- In conference play, Zeremenko has been unstoppable, tallying 19 hits in 47 at-bats for a .404 average. She has recorded four doubles and six home runs in 17 games, while producing 11 RBIs and 10 runs scored. Zeremenko has reached base in over 54 percent of her appearances.
- She ranks 19th in the nation in home runs, while also ranking 17th in the nation in home runs per game. She leads the ACC in both categories.
- With a team-leading 13 home runs, Zeremenko is just four away from tying her own single-season record of 17 long balls and five away from breaking it, as her 2018 total sits fifth overall in program history in a single season. She now has 42 in her career.
- After cranking a home run to right center in her first at-bat against Duke, Zeremenko was intentionally walked four times in Pitt's doubleheader against the Blue Devils March 31. In the three game series, she finished 2-for-6 with five walks, two runs, one home run and one RBI.

TAYLOR AT THE PLATE

- In her final season with the Panthers, senior **McKayla Taylor** continues her dominance at the plate.
- Taylor has reached base in 19 out of the past 21 games and is hitting .252 on the season with 29 hits, 28 runs scored and 14 RBIs.
- Against NC State, Taylor recorded her 128th RBI, setting a new program record as she passed Holly Stevens, who set the record with 127 from 2010-13. The senior now has 134 in her career.
- Her record-breaking weekend saw her record six hits in 11 at-bats to hit .545 against the Wolfpack. The senior put up four RBIs and scored twice. Two of Taylor's hits were for extra bases as he blasted a three-run homer and an RBI-double in game two. On the weekend, she finished with a .909 slugging percentage and a .583 on-base percentage.
- She was perfect in game two of the NC State series, reaching base in all four appearances at the plate. She went 3-for-3 with a homer, double and was hit by a pitch. Taylor also posted a team-leading four RBIs. She continued her dominance in game three, producing three singles in her first three at-bats.

FRESHMAN STANDOUT

- After starting the season out in the bottom of the batting order, freshman **Hunter Levesque** worked her way into the top half of the order after picking up her game.
- Levesque ranks second on the team with a .302 batting average to go along with 29 hits, 18 runs scored and three home runs.
- The freshman reached base in nine straight games during a span from March 8 to March 23.

SOLAK SHOWING OFF

- Junior **Alexis Solak** has proved to be one of the Panthers most consistent hitters at the plate.
- The junior boasts nine games in which she has recorded multiple hits and has reached base in 14 of the last 18 games.
- Solak is currently hitting .280 and ranks third on the team with 35 hits.
- Against Georgia Tech, Solak went 5-for-10 to hit .500 on the weekend with three extra-base hits.
- From Feb. 10 to Feb. 24, Solak reached the base paths in 10 straight games.

HARRIS' LAST HURRAH

- Senior pitcher **Kayla Harris** looks to finish out her career in the circle for the Panthers on a high note.
- Harris is currently 9-1 on the season in and 6-0 in ACC play. In 21 total appearances, 16 of which she started, Harris has tossed eight complete games, including five shutouts.
- In 91.0 innings pitched, Harris has struck out 33, while giving up just 17 walks.
- In conference play, Harris boasts a 2.19 ERA after eight appearances and has held her opponents to a .248 average.
- While facing No. 13/9 Florida State, the senior posted a complete game shutout after the Panthers earned a 1-0 extra-innings win. Pitt's victory snapped the Seminoles 36-game conference win streak, which was the fifth-longest streak in NCAA history. Harris' outstanding effort later earned her ACC Pitcher of the Week honors.
- Against Virginia Tech, she tossed a complete-game shutout, giving up just four hits to the Hokies, while holding them scoreless. While facing 26 batters, she allowed just one walk.

DOMINANT DAWSON

- Junior pitcher **Sarah Dawson** has been dominant in the circle for Pitt so far in 2018.
- Dawson is currently 11-11 on the season. In a team leading 111.2 innings pitched, she has struck out 58 batters and owns a 2.70 ERA.
- In a phenomenal outing against Georgia Tech, Dawson earned the start in game one, where she finished with a complete-game win after surrendering just three hits and two runs while striking out a career-high tying seven batters. The junior retired 12 consecutive Yellow Jacket batters to open the game, adding five strikeouts through the first four frames. On the weekend, Dawson gave up just six hits and five runs in 12.1 innings pitched, striking out 10 batters, while walking just two.
- In a win over Coastal Carolina, Dawson pitched a complete game and struck out a career-high seven batters.
- At the BIG/ACC Challenge, the junior gave up just five earned runs in 13.1 innings pitched, while striking out 11 total batters. Four of those earned runs came in the opening game of the weekend, leaving Dawson almost perfect after that.

- Against Illinois Feb. 18, Dawson started the game and pitched all but one frame in the five-inning game, as she and Brittany Knight combined to toss the team's first shutout victory, 9-0. Dawson struck out five on the day and walked just one batter against the Illini.

LOCAL LEADER

- Local product **Olivia Gray**, who hails from Washington, Pa., just south of Pittsburgh and attended Trinity High School, has grown to become one of Pitt's top players.
- Gray, who started all of 2017 at third base and the beginning of the 2018 slate, has since become the starting shortstop. She boasts a .304 career average with 117 hits.
- This season, Gray is hitting .301 with 37 hits. She leads the team alongside Giorgiana Zeremenko with 12 multi-hit games.
- Against the Hokies, Gray went 4-for-6 at the plate with three RBIs and a walk. She posted a .625 on base percentage and slugged .667. In the opening game of the series, Gray was perfect, going 3-for-3. She tallied every RBI for the Panthers to lead Pitt to a win. In game two, she reached base twice, producing a single and a walk. Defensively Gray completed five putouts.
- Gray hit .353 in the team's opening weekend tournament boasting a team-leading six hits, including one triple and four runs scored.

UP NEXT

- Pitt will host ACC opponent Virginia in a three-game series at Vartabedian Field starting Friday April 20 at 5 p.m.

NATIONALLY RANKED FSU STREAKING NO MORE

- Pitt took one out of three games in its ACC series against No. 13/9 Florida State last weekend, marking its first ACC series loss of the season. The Panthers played a doubleheader Friday, dropping game one 2-1 after a walk-off by the Seminoles before bouncing back with a 1-0 extra-innings win. Pitt then dropped game three to Florida State, 8-0, Sunday.
- The Panthers' win against the Seminoles broke Florida State's 36-game conference win streak, which dated back to the 2016 season and was the fifth-longest streak in NCAA history.

- Junior **Sarah Dawson** earned the start in game one of the series, allowing eight hits and just two runs in 6.1 innings on the mound.
- Senior **Kayla Harris** entered the circle for game two, earning a complete game shutout after allowing nine hits and striking out two in eight innings of play. Harris' outstanding effort later earned her ACC Pitcher of the Week honors.
- Both Dawson and junior **Taylor Rahach** saw the rubber in game three. Dawson surrendered six runs in 1.2 innings, while Rahach allowed two runs in three innings of relief work.
- Offensively, freshman **Hunter Levesque** had the Panthers strongest showing in the series, going 3-for-7 with a double and a run.
- Junior **Olivia Gray** recorded two hits in the series, with one sending in junior **Marissa DeMatteo** for the game-winning run against Florida State in the eighth inning of game two. Gray also came up big defensively in the eighth, snagging a high line drive to short before tagging out a runner at second for a clutch double play that helped the Panthers seal the game.
- Senior **Giorgiana Zeremenko** also finished the series with two hits, while adding a double.

PANTHERS TAKE INAGURAL SERIES VS. DUKE

- Pitt took two out of three games in its Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) series against Duke this past weekend. The Panthers won game one 6-4 and game two 8-4 before dropping the series finale to the Blue Devils, 2-1.
- Junior **Sarah Dawson** started two games in the series, splitting the pair. Dawson went the distance in both games, giving up 17 hits, six runs and two earned runs while striking out six in 14 innings on the rubber.
- Senior **Kayla Harris** made one start in the series, earning a complete game win after allowing four runs (three earned) and striking out four.
- Junior **Olivia Gray** went 4-for-9 in the series while adding a home run, two scores and three RBIs.
- Junior **Taylor Myers** went 4-for-10 at the plate while producing a double and one run.

- Pitt dropped a mid-week contest to Ohio University, 6-1, Tuesday, March 27.
- Ohio was led by a strong pitching performance by senior Danielle Stiene, who allowed just one hit and one run while dealing 10 strikeouts in seven innings of play.
- Junior **Taylor Rahach** took the loss for the Panthers. Rahach saw just 1.2 innings of action while giving up four runs (three unearned) on four hits.
- Junior **Alexis Solak** recorded Pitt's lone hit of the game, blasting a solo shot over the fence in the fourth inning. The homerun was her first this season and the eighth of her career.

SWEEP THE TAR HEELS

- After spring break, Pitt returned to ACC Play, taking on North Carolina in Chapel Hill, N.C.
- The Panthers went 2-1 on the weekend, winning their second conference series of the season. Pitt dropped the opening game 8-4, before bouncing back to win the second game 6-3 and the series finale 10-2 in six innings.
- Senior **Giorgiana Zeremenko** continued her wrath at the plate as she finished the weekend with a .700 average, going 7-for-10 at the plate with six extra-base hits including three home runs and three doubles, one of each in every game. The senior tallied six RBIs, while scoring four times herself after reaching base safely in nine of her 12 appearances. With her four runs scored, she now sits fifth all-time in the category with 116. Zeremenko was also intentionally walked twice on the weekend, in her final two appearances. On the series, she reached base 75 percent of the time and posted a 1.900 slugging percentage.

SPRING BREAK RECAP

- Over Pitt's spring break trip, the Panthers played seven games in five days, going 3-4.
- The Panthers split a doubleheader at FIU, falling 8-0 in five innings before winning 2-0.
- At the Parents' Weekend Tournament, hosted by FAU, Pitt went 2-3, earning victories in its first two contests against Ball State (6-1) and FAU (7-1).
- The squad then fell in three straight with their first against No. 21/22 Michigan. Despite the loss, the Panthers held the Wolverines to just three

runs and lost by just one run. Pitt closed out the weekend with losses to Rutgers and Stony Brook, both by 7-5 scores.

PANTHERS OPEN CONFERENCE PLAY

- The Panthers opened conference play at NC State last weekend, earning their first series win, 2-1.
- Pitt dropped a pitchers' duel in the opening game of the series, after falling to the Wolfpack 7-0. Pitt played well throughout the first four innings of the game, as junior starting pitcher **Sarah Dawson** and the defense held NC State to just three hits.
- Behind an 11-hit performance, the Panthers earned their first conference win of the season. Six of Pitt's hits were for extra bases, including a three-run blast by senior **McKayla Taylor**. Taylor was perfect in the game, reaching base in all four appearances at the plate. She went 3-for-3 with a homer and double, and was hit by a pitch. Taylor also posted a team-leading four RBI. In the circle, senior **Kayla Harris** and sophomore **Brittany Knight** combined to hold NC State to just one run and three hits. Knight earned the win in the game despite Harris getting the start.
- In the series finale, the Panthers found a 4-0 lead in the contest after back-to-back two-run innings in the fourth and fifth. What the Panthers thought was a comfortable advantage turned out to be the opposite as a four-run inning in the sixth by NC State allowed the Wolfpack to tie the score late in the contest. In the final inning of play, Pitt scored three clutch runs on two hits and held NC State to just one run to earn the victory. The Panthers finished the game with double-digit hits for the second straight game, tallying 10. The win was a complete team effort as seven different players recorded hits.

SUCCESSFUL SHOWDOWN

- The Panthers traveled to Conway, S.C. to participate in the Chanticleer Showdown, hosted by Coastal Carolina. The squad went 3-2, defeating the host team, but splitting with both Saint Joseph's and Georgetown.
- On day one, Pitt took down Georgetown 2-0 behind a stellar outing from senior pitcher **Kayla Harris**. Harris threw a complete game shutout, including four perfect innings with the help of her defense.

She also struck out two batters without giving up any walks. Against Saint Joseph's, the Panthers posted eight hits, while the Hawks committed four errors to lead Pitt to a 7-1 victory.

- The Panthers dropped their first game of day two to the Hoyas, 5-3. Despite a late comeback attempt that saw Pitt score three in the final two innings of play, Georgetown held on for the victory. Against the Chanticleers, Pitt bounced back with a 4-3 victory. Junior **Sarah Dawson** tossed a complete game, striking out a career-high seven batters.
- Pitt closed out the tournament against Saint Joseph's, falling to the Hawks 8-6.

ZEREMENKO BREAKS HOME RUN RECORD

- In a 2-2 weekend for the Panthers at the BIG/ACC Challenge, **Giorgiana Zeremenko** led Pitt at the plate, setting a new program record in career home runs.
- The senior, who set the Panthers' single-season record in 2016 with 17 long balls, surpassed former Pitt standout Holly Stevens, who previously held the record with 34. Zeremenko now has 35 in her career, including four in 2018 which leads the team.
- Zeremenko broke the home run record in the Panthers' loss to Illinois Friday, Feb. 16, as she posted two home runs in the game, finishing 2-for-2 in the contest with a walk.

BIG/ACC CHALLENGE RECAP

- The Panthers traveled to Chapel Hill, N.C. to participate in the BIG/ACC Challenge. The squad went 2-2, splitting with both Illinois and Wisconsin.
- Despite Pitt dropping both games on day one of the Challenge, Friday, Feb. 16, senior **Giorgiana Zeremenko** went yard twice against Illinois to set a new program record. The senior, who set the Panthers' single-season record in 2016 with 17 long balls, surpassed former Panther standout Holly Stevens, who previously held the record with 34. Zeremenko now has 35 in her career, including four in 2018 which leads the team.
- Pitt bounced back Saturday, Feb. 17, defeating Wisconsin in nine innings, 6-5. Junior **Gabrielle Fredericks** had a day for the Panthers, tallying a career-high four RBI after going 2-for-3 with a three-run homer in the opening inning of play. Fredericks had all but one of Pitt's RBI as junior **Alexis Solak**

earned the last one.

- In the Panthers final game Sunday, Feb. 18, the squad evened the series with Illinois following a dominant performance that saw Pitt win 9-0 in five innings of play. The Panthers had a phenomenal day at the plate, tallying 11 hits, with a home run from junior **Olivia Gray**. Four other players added two hits apiece, including Solak, Fredericks, Zeremenko and freshman **Hunter Levesque**. Junior Sarah Dawson and sophomore **Brittany Knight** were solid in the circle, as the two combined to shutout Illinois. Dawson, who started the game, tossed four complete innings, striking out five and giving up just one walk. She let up just five hits.

KNIGHT MAKES HER RETURN

- After tearing her Achilles tendon in August of 2017, pitcher **Brittany Knight** made her return from injury at the BIG/ACC Challenge.
- The sophomore saw action in three games, tossing 5.1 total innings. Through her appearances, Knight did not let up a run and only gave up two hits.

SUCCESSFUL OPENING WEEKEND

- Pitt opened the 2018 season with a successful weekend at the Titan Classic in Fullerton, Calif., going 3-1-1 with wins over Loyola Marymount, Utah State and Rutgers.
- The season began Friday, Feb. 9, with back-to-back wins. The Panthers first defeated the Lions, 4-1, behind home runs from seniors **McKayla Taylor** and **Erin Hershman**.
- Pitt followed with its first walk-off win the year, a 3-2 victory over the Aggies. The long ball continued to benefit the Panthers in game two as back-to-back homers by senior **Giorgiana Zeremenko** and junior **Gabrielle Fredericks** brought the team back to tie Utah State 2-2 in the sixth. The home runs set up a walk-off win for Pitt as junior **Olivia Gray** smacked a single to left center in the bottom of the seventh to score junior **Taylor Myers** from first.
- The Panthers split on day two, defeating Rutgers, while falling to host Cal State Fullerton. Pitt opened the day with a 6-2 win over the Scarlet Knights, as the Panthers tallied nine hits en route to the victory. Three different players tallied two hits in Gray and **Alexis Solak** and sophomore **Connor McGaffic**. Freshman **Hunter Levesque** had Pitt's lone home

run of the game in her first career-hit.

- In a battle of the bats, the Panthers fell in game two of the day to the host team, 10-7. The game was a back-and-forth affair as each team led twice before Fullerton remained ahead. The game consisted of 17 total runs, 21 hits and six errors, as five of those plagued the Panthers.
- On Sunday, Feb. 11, Pitt's final game of the tournament ended in a tie due to a drop dead time limit despite the Panthers taking a 2-0 lead in the top of the ninth. However, time expired, leaving a leading Pitt squad from winning as the game reverted back to the conclusion of the eighth.

A LOOK BACK AT 2017

- Pitt finished the 2017 with a 24-23 overall record and a 7-17 mark in conference play.
- Despite a tough finish, the Panthers were ranked for the first time in program history in both the USA Today/NFCA Division I Coaches Poll and ESPN.com/USA Softball Top 25 Collegiate Poll. Pitt was ranked for the first three weeks of season, reaching as high as No.19 in week two.
- Current senior pitcher **Kayla Harris** tossed Pitt's second perfect game in program history as the Panthers defeated Southeastern Louisiana, 5-0, Feb. 26, 2017.
- Former Panther **Valerie Ortega** earned ACC All-Freshman Team honors in 2017.

10 YEARS AT THE HELM

- Head coach **Holly Aprile** will begin her 10th season at the helm of the Pitt softball program.
- Prior to taking over in 2009, Aprile spent five seasons with the Panthers as an assistant coach under Michelle Phalen, Pitt's first softball coach.

PITT'S TOUGH SLATE

- The Panthers are set to take on three teams that finished ranked in the top 25 of the NFCA Coaches Poll including reigning ACC Champion Florida State, who reached the Super Regionals, along with Michigan and Marshall.
- Pitt will also face a total of 10 NCAA Tournament teams from 2017.
- The Panthers will compete in 53 contests this season, 37 of which will be on the road.
- Pitt will play a total of 16 games at Vartabedian Field

in the Petersen Sports Complex, four of which will be three-day conference series.

DIVIDING THE CONFERENCE

- With the addition of Duke as a Division I softball team, the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) will split into the Atlantic and Coastal Divisions for the 2018 season.
- Joining the Panthers in the Coastal Division will be Duke, Georgia Tech, North Carolina, Virginia and Virginia Tech.
- Making up the Atlantic Division will be Florida State, Boston College, Louisville, NC State, Notre Dame and Syracuse.
- The ACC will now feature 12 total teams, eight of which Pitt will face this season. In the squads' first year in the Coastal, the Panthers will face every opponent in the division. From the Atlantic Division, Pitt is set to square off with the Seminoles, Cardinals and Wolfpack.

MLB TIES

- Talent runs in the family for junior **Alexis Solak** and sophomore **Kaitlyn Kruger**, as both Pitt players have current ties to the MLB.
- Nick Solak, the junior's older brother, was recently traded to the Tampa Bay Rays after spending the last two seasons with the New York Yankees. The Yankees took the second baseman in the second round of the 2016 MLB Draft after earning All-America and All-ACC honors after hitting .376 with five home runs in 45 starts as a junior at Louisville.
- The Los Angeles Angels, who he remains with today, drafted Jack Kruger, the older brother of Kruger, in the 20th round of the 2016 MLB Draft. A native of Los Angeles, Kruger returns to his hometown after attending Mississippi State. The catcher hit .344 in his only season at MSU with eight home runs and 44 RBIs.

REPRESENTING THE WPIAL

- The Pitt softball team features six local players, all which spent their high school careers playing for a school in the Western Pennsylvania Interscholastic League, known in the area as the WPIAL.
- Freshman **Brie Horrell** (Gibsonia, Pa./Pine-Richland HS), sophomore **Connor McGaffic** (Georgetown, Pa./South Side Beaver HS), juniors **Marissa DeMatteo**

(New Castle, Pa./Neshannock HS) and **Olivia Gray** (Washington, Pa./Trinity HS) and seniors **Erin Hershman** (Mars, Pa./Mars HS) and **Giorgiana Zeremenko** (Canonsburg, Pa./Canon-McMillan HS) make up the crew that played locally in the conference.

ROSTER REVIEW

- Pitt returns all but one starter from a year ago, welcoming back a veteran team of five seniors, six juniors and five sophomores, while adding four newcomers.
- Freshmen **Hunter Levesque**, **Brie Horrell** and **Morgan Batesole** will begin their first year with the Panthers, with Levesque looking at a starting position in the outfield.
- Junior transfer **Taylor Rahach** will see immediate time in the circle after transferring from Coastal Carolina.

KEY DEPARTURE

- The Panthers will be moving into 2018 without one key member from 2017 that played a significant role over the past four years in **Kaitlin Manuel**.
- The former Panther and then senior earned NFCA All-Mid-Atlantic Region Second Team honors after playing a key part on both the field and the plate.
- As Pitt's starting first baseman, Manuel recorded a nearly perfect fielding percentage (.993) after tallying 401 putouts and 11 assists, while committing just three errors all season. She left the Panthers as the career leader in putouts (1,529), chances (1,569) and fielding percentage (.995).
- On offense, Manuel finished with a .273 average after recording 39 hits in 143 at-bats, including six doubles, one triple and two home runs. She rounded out the season with 25 RBIs and 19 runs scored.

AT THE PLATE

- Offensively, the Panthers will look to a core of power hitting players in seniors **Giorgiana Zeremenko** and **McKayla Taylor**, along with junior **Olivia Gray**.
- Zeremenko led the team in RBI (35), doubles (10), and home runs (11) just a year after hitting 17 long balls in 2016, a Panthers' single-season record. Her .604 slugging percentage sat ninth in the conference.

- Gray led Pitt at the plate with 42 hits and hit .290 on the year.
- Taylor finished with a .260 average and 39 hits.

IN THE FIELD

- The Panthers will see some consistency in the field, as junior **Olivia Gray** and senior **McKayla Taylor** lead the infield. Gray will remain at third this season, while Taylor begins her final year at shortstop.
- Pitt will see multiple players see playing time at second and first. Juniors **Alexis Solak** and **Marissa DeMatteo** will battle it out for the starting spot at second, while the Panthers will look to replace former Panther Kaitlin Manuel at first with sophomore **Alexee Haynes** and junior **Gabrielle Fredericks**.
- In the outfield, senior **Erin Hershman** will return to her position in centerfield, however Pitt could see multiple different players fill in on both sides, including, junior **Taylor Myers**, sophomore **Connor McGaffic** and freshman **Hunter Levesque**.

BEHIND THE PLATE

- The Panthers will have three options behind the plate, including senior **Giorgiana Zeremenko**, who also saw time at catcher last season, and junior **Gabrielle Fredericks**.

IN THE CIRCLE

- On the mound, Pitt will rely depth throughout the 2018 season. Four pitchers, including senior **Kayla Harris**, junior transfer **Taylor Rahach**, junior **Sarah Dawson** and sophomore **Brittany Knight** will be called upon.
- Harris appeared in 30 games last season, 22 of which she started. The senior tossed Pitt's second perfect game in program history as the Panthers defeated Southeastern Louisiana, 5-0, Feb. 26, 2017.
- Rahach, a right-handed pitcher who transferred from Coastal Carolina after two seasons, saw action in 42 games during her time with the Chanticleers, starting 27 of those on the mound. Following a freshman campaign in which she tossed 25.2 innings, Rahach became a staple in Coastal Carolina's pitching rotation, finishing with a 13-9 record and a 2.80 ERA. She struck out 119 batters and walked just 55.
- Dawson will look to step into a leadership role after appearing in 19 games last season, with 42.2

innings pitched.

- Knight, who came in firing as a freshman last year, returns for her second season after finishing with a 13-12 record in 25 appearances. She tossed 151.2 innings in 2017 while striking out 62 batters.

ACC PRESEASON COACHES POLL

- Pitt was predicted to finish ninth in the ACC Softball Preseason Coaches Poll as announced by the league office Tuesday, Feb. 6.
- No. 6/9 Florida State, who will look for their fourth-consecutive ACC title, is predicted to finish on top for the fourth-straight season. The Seminoles received 11 first-place votes and 121 points.
- North Carolina, who is receiving votes in both the USA Today/NFCA Division I Coaches Poll and ESPN.com/USA Softball Top 25 Collegiate Poll, came in at second with one first-place vote and 105 points.

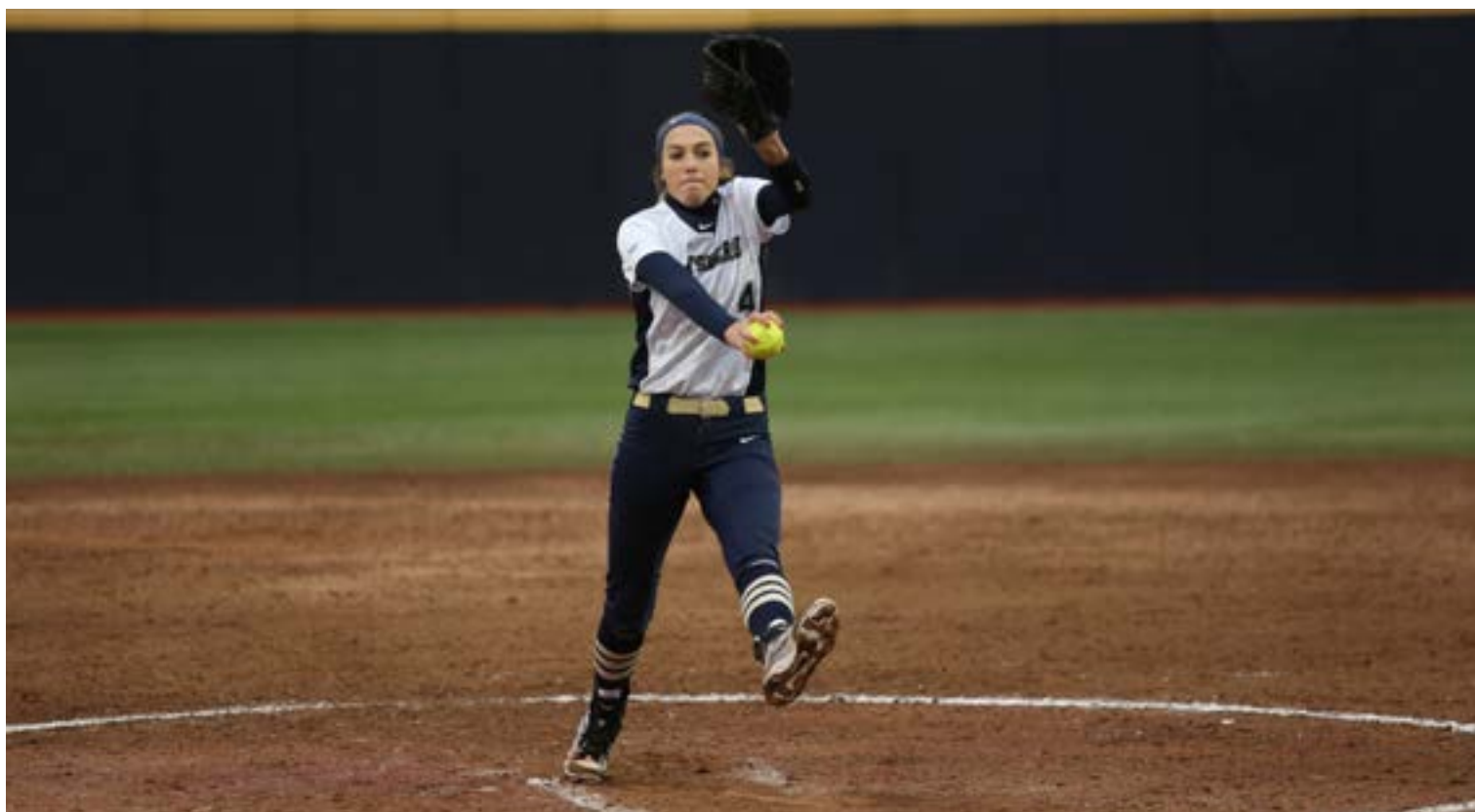
