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THE MATCH

- The University of Pittsburgh men's soccer team will travel to Louisville, Ky., to face the sixth-ranked Cardinals Friday, Sept. 21 at 7:30 p.m. at Lynn Stadium.

LAST TIME OUT

- Pitt earned a 2-0 victory over Detroit Mercy Tuesday, Sept. 18 at Ambrose Urbanic Field in Pittsburgh, Pa.
- Senior **Javi Perez** and sophomore **Marcony Pimentel** each recorded goals in the match, with freshman **Alec Townsend** adding an assist.
- The Panthers closed the match with advantages in shots (16-2), shots on goal (7-1) and corners (6-2).

SURVEYING THE STATS

- Five different Panthers have scored a goal so far this season in Perez, Pimentel, redshirt senior **Robby Dambrot**, sophomore **Edward Kizza** and redshirt freshman **Fiorre Mane**.
- Kizza leads the team with five scores, followed by Perez with two. Dambrot, Mane and Pimentel have each netted one goal apiece.
- Pitt has also seen seven players record assists on the season.
- Dambrot, Pimentel, Townsend, sophomores **Alexander Dexter** and **Jose Luis Sena Arbona** and freshmen **Nyk Sessock** and **Chandler Vaughn** have all added one helper each.

SIZING UP THE 2018 SLATE

- Pitt faces some tough competition in the 2018 season, with a schedule that includes 12 NCAA Tournament teams from a year ago.
- The Panthers have already faced three ranked opponents this season in then-ranked No. 25 Colgate, No. 4 Akron and No. 5 North Carolina.
- Of Pitt's remaining 11 matches, six teams are currently ranked in the top 25 of the United Coaches Poll, while one other squad is receiving votes.

KIZZA COMMANDING ATTENTION

- Coming off a freshman season in which he scored four goals, Kizza has already notched five goals just six games into the 2018 slate.
- The Kampala, Uganda native currently leads the team in shots (16), shots on goal (11), points (10) and goals (5).
- Kizza netted three goals in Pitt's second match of the season against Delaware Monday, Aug. 27, making him just the 20th player in program history to record a hat trick.
- The sophomore's goal in the opening minutes of the contest was also the quickest goal to start a game in school history, coming just 1:40 into the match and besting the previous record of 1:58 set in 2006.

THE SERIES - LOUISVILLE

- The Panthers and Cardinals have met just four times in program history, with Louisville owning a 4-0 series edge over Pitt.
- In their most recent meeting, the Cardinals earned a 2-0 road win against Pitt Friday, Sept. 9, 2016.
- The teams' first meeting came in 2006, with Louisville nudging out a 2-1 victory over the Panthers in Pittsburgh, Pa.

SCOUTING THE CARDINALS

- Louisville enters Friday's match with a 4-1-1 overall record, including a 2-0-0 mark in ACC play.
- The Cardinals have consistently stayed within the top 10 of the United Soccer Coaches Poll, and recently moved up one spot from last week's No. 7 ranking heading into Friday's match with the Panthers.
- The 2017 Cardinal squad finished last season with a 13-2-5 (5-2-1 ACC) record en route to an appearance in the NCAA Tournament, where they advanced to the Elite Eight before falling to Akron in a shootout.
- Louisville is led by head coach Ken Lolla, who enters his 13th season with the program. Lolla has compiled a 357-157-65 (.673) record during more than 28 years as a head coach and owns a 148-73-37 (.645) record with the Cardinals.
- Through six games, seniors Geoffrey Dee and Adam Wilson and junior Cherif Dieye lead the team with two goals apiece. Junior Kino Ryosuke and

sophomores Ziyad Fekri and Elijah Amo have added one goal each.

- In goal, two keepers have split time so far this season for the Cardinals in sophomores Jake Gelnovatch and Will Meyer.
- Gelnovatch has started four matches, collecting eight saves while allowing three goals. Meyer has made two starts, recording three saves while giving up three scores.

UP NEXT

- The Panthers will return to Pittsburgh, Pa., for their first of five consecutive home matches as they play their rescheduled match against No. 18 NC State Tuesday, Sept. 25 at 7 p.m. at Ambrose Urbanic Field.

PITT TAKES 1-0 VICTORY OVER VCU

- Pitt earned a 1-0 victory over VCU Wednesday, Sept. 12 at SportsBackers Stadium in Richmond, Va.
- The Panthers lone goal of the match came from sophomore **Edward Kizza**, who added his fifth score of the season in the 21st minute off of a feed from sophomore **Marcony Pimentel**.
- Pimentel finished the match with a team-high four shots and one assist, while senior **Javi Perez** and redshirt freshman **Fiorre Mane** notched two shots apiece. Kizza and sophomore **Alexander Dexter** each added one shot, with Kizza contributing the lone goal of the day.

PANTHERS FALL TO #5 UNC IN 2OT

- Pitt fell in double overtime to No. 5 North Carolina, 2-1, in its ACC opener Saturday, Sept. 8 at Koskinen Stadium on the campus of Duke University in Durham, N.C.
- The Panthers got out to an early lead after sophomore **Edward Kizza** found the back of the net in the 13th minute off a feed from redshirt senior **Robby Dambrot**.
- North Carolina's first goal didn't come until the 73rd minute, sending the game into overtime. The Tar Heels ultimately prevailed in the match after a goal in the 109th minute gave them the 2-1 victory.
- Kizza finished the match with a team-high three shots and one goal, while Dambrot added a shot and assist. Senior **Javi Perez**, sophomore **Marcony Pimentel** and freshman **Alec Townsend** also recorded one shot apiece in the match.

PITT DROPS MATCH TO #4 AKRON, 1-0

- Pitt fell to then-ranked No. 4 Akron, 1-0, Saturday, Sept. 1 at Cub Cadet Field.
- The lone goal of the match was scored in the fifth minute by Zip sophomore David Egbo.
- The Panthers closed the match with advantages in shots (13-9) and corners (7-4).

PANTHERS DOMINATE DELAWARE, 6-1

- Pitt earned an impressive 6-1 road win at Delaware Monday, Aug. 27 in its first road contest of the season.
- Sophomore **Edward Kizza** led the charge, scoring three goals, making him just the 20th player in program history to record a hat trick.
- Senior **Javi Perez**, redshirt senior **Robby Dambrot** and redshirt freshman **Fiorre Mane** all added a goal of their own in the match.
- The Panthers also recorded four assists in the match, with sophomores **Alexander Dexter** and **Jose Luis Sena Arbona** and freshmen **Nyk Sessock** and **Chandler Vaughn** each contributing a helper.

HATS OFF FOR KIZZA

- After finishing the 2017 season with four goals, sophomore **Edward Kizza** collected three goals in Pitt's second match of the season against Delaware.
- Kizza's hat trick made him just the 20th player in program history to accomplish the feat.
- Pitt's last hat trick came in 2013 when Chris Davis recorded three goals against Howard.

PANTHERS FALL TO #25 COLGATE

- Pitt dropped its season opener to No. 25 Colgate, 1-0, Friday, Aug. 24.
- Colgate's Freddy Jonsson scored the lone goal of the match in the 74th minute, giving the Raiders the eventual win.
- The Panthers finished the match with advantages in shots (11-7), shots on goal (6-2) and corner kicks (6-3) but were unable to capitalize.

PITT'S PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- The Panthers earned multiple preseason honors, both as a team and individually, heading into the 2018 slate.
- Pitt received votes in the United Soccer Coaches Preseason Poll released Tuesday, Aug. 7 earning nine total points.
- The team's incoming freshman class was also rated sixth in the nation by Top Drawer Soccer.
- Individually, senior **Javi Perez** and sophomore **Edward Kizza** landed in Top Drawer Soccer's Preseason Top 100 Players list, with Perez coming in at No. 26 and Kizza coming in at No. 99.
- Two Panthers also earned recognition in Top Drawer Soccer's Preseason Best XI, with Perez being named to the Second Team and freshman **Chandler Vaughn** collecting Freshman Team honors.

SYNOPSIS OF THE SQUAD

- Pitt returns 13 players from a year ago, including senior **Javi Perez**, who earned All-ACC Second Team honors, as well as sophomores **Alexander Dexter** and **Edward Kizza**, who were both named to the ACC All-Freshman Team.
- The Panthers also welcome 12 new players into the fold, with a mix of freshmen and transfers.
- Senior **Peter Prescott**, a transfer from Creighton, and redshirt senior **Shane Wiedt**, a transfer from Akron, both have experience making deep NCAA College Cup runs with their former teams.

2017 SEASON IN REVIEW

- Pitt amassed an 8-10 overall record while collecting multiple marquee wins.
- The Panthers earned the program's first wins over ranked opponents since 2008 after producing victories against No. 7 Notre Dame, No. 13 Columbia and No. 21 Syracuse.
- Pitt's wins over the Orange and Fighting Irish were also its first conference victories since joining the ACC in 2013.
- The Panthers also defeated longtime rivals West Virginia and Penn State during the season, including a dominant 7-0 victory over the Mountaineers.
- Pitt's seven goals marked the 28th time in program history that the team had achieved the feat and the first time since 1998.

VIDOVICH'S COACHING CAREER

- Head coach **Jay Vidovich** enters his third year with the program heading into the 2018 season.
- Following a rebuilding year in 2016, Vidovich led the Panthers to an 8-10 record in a 2017 season that included multiple marquee wins against ranked opponents.
- Prior to Pitt, Vidovich spent 21 years as the head coach at Wake Forest, where he led the Demon Deacons to a 2007 National Championship, made four College Cup appearances and claimed five ACC regular season titles.
- The two-time NSCAA Coach of the Year has produced 36 professional players, 21 All-Americans and five ACC Player of the Year honorees while compiling a 282-144-53 (.644) career record.

Jay Vidovich, one of America's most respected and accomplished soccer coaches, was named the third Pitt men's soccer head coach at the University of Pittsburgh in December of 2015.

Following his first year at the helm, Vidovich led the Panthers to wins over No. 7 Notre Dame, No. 13 Columbia and No. 21 Syracuse in the 2017 season. The win over Syracuse would be the Panthers' first win over a ranked opponent since the 2008 season. The victory over the Orange was also the first conference win for Pitt since moving into the ACC at the start of the 2013 season, and they would add their second conference win against the Fighting Irish on Oct. 13. The Panthers would also capture victories against rivals Penn State and West Virginia throughout the season.

Vidovich also guided four players to All-ACC recognition, with Javi Perez earning Second Team honors, Pol Planellas receiving Third Team recognition and both Alexander Dexter and Edward Kizza being named to the All-Freshman Team. The postseason accolades were the team's first in program history since joining the ACC.

Planellas would go on to become the first Pitt men's soccer player in program history to be drafted by an MLS Club team after being selected by the Los Angeles Football Club in the second round of the 2018 MLS SuperDraft, becoming the 36th professional player under Vidovich's tutelage.

Prior to making the move to Pittsburgh, Vidovich oversaw the men's soccer program at Wake Forest for 21 seasons (1994-2014), building the Demon Deacons into a national power and winning the 2007 NCAA championship. He spent this past year in professional soccer, coaching the Portland Timbers 2 (T2) in the United Soccer League (USL).

During his Wake Forest tenure, Vidovich compiled a 272-121-50 record and led the Demon Deacons to the NCAA Tournament in 13 of his final 14 seasons. Wake Forest won five Atlantic Coast Conference titles under his watch, compiling a 76-52-22 mark in one of the nation's most challenging leagues.

In 2007, Wake Forest went 22-2-2—the winningest season in school history—and defeated Ohio State, 2-1, in the national final to claim the program's first NCAA title. The Demon Deacons made four consecutive appearances in the College Cup from 2006-09.

Vidovich, a two-time National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) National Coach of the Year (2007 and 2008) and five-time ACC Coach of the Year (2002, 2004, 2006, 2008 and 2009), ranks among the most decorated coaches in collegiate soccer.

Vidovich was the 2008 recipient of the prestigious Walt Chyzowych Award for lifetime contributions to the sport of soccer. Vidovich was an assistant under the legendary Chyzowych for eight seasons at Wake Forest from 1986-93.

Widely regarded as one of the game's top evaluators and developers of talent, Vidovich has produced 21 All-Americans and five ACC Player of the Year honorees (three offensive and two defensive). He also coached Marcus Tracy, the first player in Wake history to win the Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy, which honors the top individual player in college soccer.

Thirty-five players under Vidovich went on to play in the professional ranks from 2002-14. His Wake Forest teams also achieved academically, evidenced by two ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honorees, two Academic All-Americans, one adidas National Scholar-Athlete of the Year and one Senior CLASS Award recipient.

Born in Detroit, Mich., Vidovich was an all-state player for New Canaan High School in Connecticut. He played for Indiana University in 1978 before transferring to Ohio Wesleyan, where he was a three-year starter. As a senior, Vidovich was team captain and helped lead OWU to the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament.

A 1982 graduate of Ohio Wesleyan with a bachelor's degree in physical education, he went on to earn a master's degree in sports sciences from the University of Denver in 1983.

It was at Denver where Vidovich's coaching career was launched as an assistant in 1982. He served in additional assistant posts at Regis College (1983) and his alma mater Ohio Wesleyan (1984-85) before joining Wake Forest's staff in 1986.
