Game Storylines

- √ The 2019 Quick Lane Bowl marks Pitt's 35th all-time bowl appearance and fourth under the direction of Coach Pat Narduzzi. The Panthers enter the postseason with a 7-5 mark and can win eight games for the third time under Narduzzi.
- √ This will be Pitt's second alltime postseason trip to Detroit. The Panthers last played a bowl game at Ford Field in 2013, when the Panthers defeated Bowling Green, 30-27, behind MVP James Conner's 229 rushing yards.
- √ Pitt and Eastern Michigan have played twice before, most recently in 2007, a 27-3 Pitt victory at Heinz Field. The initial meeting was in 1995, when the Panthers defeated the Eagles, 66-30, in Pitt Stadium.
- √ The Panthers are 32-4 alltime against MAC opponents, including a 20-10 victory over Ohio this season (Sept. 7). Pat Narduzzi is 2-0 against MAC foes as Pitt's head coach.

- √ Pitt boasts one of the country's stingiest defenses. The Panthers enter the postseason owning top-35 national rankings in no fewer than nine categories.
- √ Pitt ranks 11th in the nation in total defense, surrendering just 302.5 yards per game. The Panthers are also 11th in rushing defense (106.9 yards per game) and 20th in passing defense (195.6 yards per game).
- √ Eastern Michigan features the MAC's top passing game. EMU is throwing for more than 280 yards per contest, which ranks 29th nationally. Pitt counters with a pass rush that has compiled 49 sacks and ranks second nationally with an average of 4.08 sacks per game.
- √ Since 2015, Pat Narduzzi has directed the Panthers to 24 victories in ACC play, tied for the third-highest win total (with Virginia Tech) during that span and trailing only Clemson (38) and Miami (25).

- √ The 2019 season marks Pat Narduzzi's fifth as Pitt's head football coach. Since 2015, Narduzzi has directed the Panthers to 24 victories in ACC play, tied for the third-highest win total (with Virginia Tech) during that span and trailing only Clemson (38) and Miami (25).
- √ In 2018, the Panthers won their first Coastal Division championship and made their inaugural appearance in the ACC Championship Game.
- √ Entering the 2019 Quick Lane Bowl, Narduzzi has led Pitt to a 35-29 overall record. The Panthers have now advanced to four bowl games under his watch.
- √ Under Narduzzi, the Panthers have a burgeoning reputation as a dangerous opponent for highly ranked foes. In 2017, Pitt closed the season with a 24-14 victory over No. 2 Miami. In 2016, the Panthers defeated two teams that finished in the top 5 of the final College Football Playoff rankings. Pitt gave No. 2 Clemson—that year's eventual national champion—its only loss (43-42) and kept No. 5 Penn State out of the playoff field by defeating the Nittany Lions, 42-39.
- √ Over Narduzzi's initial four seasons as head coach, Pitt had 26 All-ACC Academic Football Team honorees, the second-highest total among conference schools during that span.
- √ The Panthers also were a recipient of the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) 2018 Academic Achievement Award after scoring a perfect single-year 1,000 Academic Progress Rate (APR).
- √ Over the past four NFL Drafts (2016-19), the Panthers had 10 players selected, tied for the sixth-highest total among ACC teams.
- √ Each of Pitt's three 2018 draft picks—tackle Brian O'Neill (Minnesota Vikings), safety Jordan Whitehead (Tampa Bay Buccaneers) and cornerback Avonte Maddox (Philadelphia Eagles)—were rookie starters. Moreover, running back James Conner, a Pittsburgh Steelers' 2017 draft pick, was selected to the Pro Bowl after rushing for nearly 1,000 yards in his second professional season.
- √ In 2016, Quadree Henderson earned consensus All-America status as a return specialist after leading the country in kickoff return touchdowns (three) and combined kick return yards (1,166). Additionally, guard Dorian Johnson also was a first team All-American under Narduzzi.

- √ Narduzzi has coached three ACC major award winners at Pitt: running back James Conner (2016 Brian Piccolo Award), running back Qadree Ollison (2015 Offensive Rookie of the Year) and safety Jordan Whitehead (2015 Overall and Defensive Rookie of the Year).
- √ Narduzzi arrived at Pitt following eight highly successful years as the defensive coordinator at Michigan State under Mark Dantonio. The Spartans were the only team to rank in the nation's top 10 in total defense and rushing defense each season from 2011-14.
- √ Michigan State boasted the nation's top rushing defense in 2014, yielding just 88.5 yards per game. The Spartans finished third nationally with 34 turnovers gained and eighth in total defense, holding opponents to just 315.8 yards per contest.
- √ In 2014, the Spartans finished with a No. 5 national ranking and 11-2 record following a stirring 42-41 victory over Baylor in the AT&T Cotton Bowl. Narduzzi's defense shut out the high-scoring Bears in the fourth quarter, opening the door for 21 unanswered points by Michigan State.
- √ In 2013, Michigan State finished No. 3 in the country following a Big Ten title and 24-20 victory over No. 5 Stanford in the Rose Bowl. Narduzzi was named the 2013 recipient of the prestigious Broyles Award, annually presented to the country's top assistant coach.
- √ Narduzzi's decorated defensive players at Michigan State included first team All-Americans in cornerback Darqueze Dennard, safety Kurtis Drummond, linebacker Greg Jones and defensive tackle Jerel Worthy. Dennard was a unanimous All-American in 2013, becoming the first Michigan State cornerback to earn that distinction. He also was the school's first winner of the Jim Thorpe Award, given to college football's top defensive back.
- √ Narduzzi was a starting linebacker under his father, the late Bill Narduzzi, as a freshman at Youngstown State University in 1985 before transferring to Rhode Island, where he became a three-year starter for the Rams from 1987-89.
- √ Bill Narduzzi was head coach at YSU from 1975-85. He led the Penguins to two NCAA Division II playoff appearances, including the national championship game in 1979, and twice was named the Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year. One of Bill's first coaching posts was as a freshman line coach at Pitt in 1962.



SERIES NOTES

This marks the third meeting between Pitt and Eastern Michigan in a series that dates back to 1995...the Panthers lead the all-time series, 2-0...this is the first postseason encounter between the two schools... each of the prior two contests were played in Pittsburgh...most recently, the Panthers defeated the Eagles, 27-3, in the 2007 season opener for both teams...the initial meeting took place at Pitt Stadium in 1995 and was won by the Panthers, 66-30...the Panthers are 32-4 all-time against MAC opponents, including a 20-10 victory over Ohio this season...the 2019 Quick Lane Bowl marks Pitt's second postseason game against a MAC foe...the Panthers defeated MAC champion Bowling Green, 30-27, at Detroit's Ford Field in the 2013 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl...that game was made memorable by an MVP-performance from freshman running back James Conner, who rushed for 229 yards and even served as a pass rush specialist...defensive tackle Aaron Donald, playing in his final collegiate contest, had a game-clinching sack in the final minute and was named the bowl's Most Valuable Lineman.

- $\sqrt{\text{The 2019}}$ campaign marks the 130th football season at the University of Pittsburgh.
- $\sqrt{\text{The Panthers}}$, who played their inaugural season in 1890, have a 731-539-42 all-time record (.573).
- √ The program's rich legacy includes 92 first team All-Americans, 24 College Football Hall of Famers, eight Pro Football Hall of Famers and nine national titles.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

PICKETT POINTS:

- √ Junior quarterback Kenny Pickett, in his second season as Pitt's full-time starter, has thrown for 2,737 yards on 262-of-430 passing (61%) with 10 touchdowns and nine interceptions. Pickett is averaging 248.8 passing yards through 11 games. (He missed Pitt's Sept. 28 victory over Delaware due to injury.)
- √ Pickett ranks seventh in the nation—and first among ACC quarter-backs—with an average of 23.82 completions per game. He is 29th nationally in passing yards per game (248.8; second in ACC) and 39th in total offense per game (258.4; fifth in ACC).
- √ Pickett had one of the finest games of his career in Pitt's 34-27 overtime win over North Carolina (Nov. 14), completing 25-of-41 passes (61%) for 359 yards and one touchdown. He also rushed for two TDs, including the eventual game-winner in OT.
- √ Pickett was prolific against Penn State's highly regarded defense (Sept. 14), throwing for 372 yards on 35-of-51 passing (69%). In that game, he established career bests in passing yardage, completions and attempts.

THE LAST TIME: PITT 27 EASTERN MICHIGAN 3 Sept. 1, 2007 • Heinz Field • 36,183

Pitt opened the 2007 season in winning fashion, defeating Eastern Michigan, 27-3, at Heinz Field...the Panthers limited EMU to 145 yards, the lowest total by a Pitt season-opening opponent since 1989...Eastern Michigan (0-1) rushed for 39 yards on 23 carries, an average of just 1.7 per attempt...junior Bill Stull impressed in his first starting assignment by throwing for 177 yards on 14-of-20 passing...his 21-yard touchdown pass to Oderick Turner put Pitt in control early in the second period with a 14-3 lead...Stull, however, would ultimately leave the game in the third quarter after injuring the thumb on his right (throwing) hand...redshirt freshman Kevan Smith came on in relief over the final quarter-and-a-half and led Pitt to two scores—Conor Lee field goals of 28 and 35 yards—while completing 2-of-4 passes for 18 yards...after managing just 19 yards on 13 carries in the first half, Pitt's rushing game came to life over the final two quarters...freshman LeSean McCoy made his collegiate debut by rushing for a game-high 68 yards on 10 carries, while LaRod Stephens-Howling had 67 yards on 16 carries...MLB Scott McKillop, making his first collegiate start, had eight tackles and a six-yard sack...DT Gus Mustakas had five tackles, including two for losses.

- √ Pickett led Pitt to a 35-34 win over UCF (Sept. 21) by throwing for 224 yards and a touchdown, rushing for 61 additional yards and catching the game-winning TD, a three-yard reception off a fourth-down gadget play.
- √ In a 33-30 win over Duke (Oct. 5), Pickett threw for 268 yards with three TDs and two INTs on 29-of-48 passing. With Pitt facing a 30-26 deficit and 1:25 remaining, he directed a four-play, 82-yard march, capped by a 26-yard scoring strike to V'Lique Carter that proved to be the game winner with 38 seconds left.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS:

√ Kenny Pickett is on the verge of cracking the top 10 on Pitt's single-season passing yardage list. In terms of career passing yards, Pickett is already eighth in school history.

Sparked by freshmen James Conner and Tyler Boyd, Pitt edged MAC champ Bowling Green, 30-27, in Detroit's Little Caesars Pizza Bowl... Conner rushed for 229 yards, while Boyd caught eight passes for 173 yards and also scored on a punt return...Conner broke Pitt's bowl record for rushing vards set by Tony Dorsett (202 vs. Georgia in the Jan. 1, 1977 Sugar Bowl)...Conner also played on defense as a pass rusher (drawing a key holding penalty on Bowling Green's final possession) and was named the game's MVP...Boyd broke Pitt's bowl record for receiving yardage (surpassing Gordon Jones' 163 yards vs. Clemson in the Dec. 30, 1977 Gator Bowl) and had the Panthers' first punt return TD (non-block) since 2006...a third freshman, Chris Blewitt, provided the winning points on a 39-yard field goal with 1:17 remaining...QB Chad Voytik played the entire second half in relief of injured Tom Savage...Voytik completed 5-of-9 passes for 108 yards and had a five-yard TD run...Most Valuable Lineman Aaron Donald had a sack in the final minute to ice the result...with its first bowl win since 2010, Pitt finished 7-6 and dropped the Falcons to 10-4.

- √ Redshirt freshman quarterback Nick Patti made the first start of his career against Delaware (Sept. 28). Patti, filling in for ailing starter Kenny Pickett, finished 23 of 37 for 271 yards with two touchdowns and one interception.
- √ Pitt entered the final period trailing 14-10, but took the lead for good on Patti's 12-yard touchdown pass to Taysir Mack with 10:33 to go. Earlier, Patti connected with V'Lique Carter on a 30-yard touchdown strike.
- √ Patti's 271 passing yards were the most by a Pitt quarterback in their starting debut since John Turman threw for 316 yards and two TDs against Penn State on Sept. 11, 1999.
- $\sqrt{\text{On the season, Patti has played in six games and completed 26-of-43 passes for 301 yards with three TDs and one interception.}$

CENTURY RECEIVING GAMES:

- √ Under Pat Narduzzi, Pitt has produced 15 100-yard receiving performances, including five this season.
- √ The most recent was in the Panthers' regular-season finale against Boston College (Nov. 30), when freshman Jared Wayne had 100 yards on six receptions. Wayne became the first freshman to log a 100-yard receiving effort since 2013, when Tyler Boyd had five such outings.

- $\sqrt{}$ Pitt ranks second in the nation in team sacks with an average of 4.08 per game. The Panthers are seventh in tackles for loss (8.2 per game), 11th in total defense (302.5 yards per game), 11th in rushing defense (106.9 yards per game) and 11th in pass efficiencv defense (112.63 rating).

TURNOVER TALK:

- $\sqrt{}$ On the season, Pitt has gained 13 total turnovers (eight interceptions and five fumbles).
- $\sqrt{}$ In its 33-30 victory at Duke (Oct. 5), Pitt forced a season-high six turnovers (three interceptions and three fumbles). It was the highest amount of turnovers forced by the Panthers since Dec. 3, 2011, when they also had six against Syracuse (four fumbles and two interceptions).
- $\sqrt{\text{Safety Paris Ford has a team-high three interceptions, the most by}}$ a Pitt player since 2016, when corner Avonte Maddox also had three.
- $\sqrt{\ }$ The last Pitt player with more than three picks in a season was safety Jason Hendricks, who had six in 2012.

Playing a rare season opener against a conference opponent, Pitt fell to ACC Coastal Division foe Virginia, 30-14...the Cavaliers, considered the preseason favorite for the Coastal title, overcame a 14-13 halftime deficit with 17 unanswered points...the Panthers rallied for the lead at intermission after falling behind 10-0 in the opening quarter...three Pitt mistakes—two interceptions and a blocked punt—proved critical in the final result...Virginia's three touchdown drives all came on short fields following miscues by the Panthers...the Cavaliers' longest TD march of the night covered just 29 yards...Virginia's dual-threat quarterback Bryce Perkins threw for 181 yards and two TDs, while rushing for an additional 44 yards...excluding the second quarter, when Pitt mounted a pair of skillful touchdown drives, the Panthers were bottled up offensively...Pitt mustered just 78 yards on 30 rushes (2.6 avg.) and totaled only 263 yards overall...Kenny Pickett threw a personal-high 41 passes, but had multiple interceptions for the first time in his career...the loss snapped Pitt's five-game winning streak in season openers...Virginia won for the first time in six all-time visits to Pittsburgh...the Cavaliers had not beaten Pitt since a win in 2014 in Charlottesville...the contest was nationally televised by the newly launched ACC Network.

A career outing by Kenny Pickett and swarming pass rush on defense lifted Pitt to its first victory of the season, a 20-10 win over Ohio... Pickett threw for 321 yards on 26-of-37 passing (70%)...his passing yardage and completion total marked career highs...his top target was Maurice Ffrench, who also achieved personal bests with 10 catches for 138 yards...Pickett and Ffrench connected on a 74-yard touchdown, giving Pitt (1-1) a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter... Ffrench became the first Pitt receiver to reach double-digit catches in a game since Tyler Boyd during the 2015 season...a week after being bottled up, Pitt's ground game gained traction with A.J. Davis rushing for 89 yards and freshman Vincent Davis netting 50, including his first career TD that put the Panthers up 17-0...Ohio, the media's preseason favorite to win the Mid-American Conference title, was held to just 212 yards overall and a mere 35 rushing...the Panthers collected six sacks, including three by tackle Jaylen Twyman...Twyman became the first Pitt player with three sacks since 2015 (five by DE Ejuan Price against Louisville)...it was the highest sack total by a Pitt defensive tackle since 2011 (three by Aaron Donald against Utah)...with the win over the Bobcats (1-1), the Panthers improved to 32-4 all-time against MAC foes.

In the 100th and final scheduled meeting between Pitt and Penn State. the Nittany Lions edged the Panthers, 17-10...this Keystone Classic will be remembered for its physical play and dramatic conclusion...the Panthers (1-2) threatened to tie the game twice in the final minutes but could not penetrate the end zone...a spectacular 29-yard pass from Kenny Pickett to Taysir Mack gave Pitt first-and-goal at the 1-yard line with just over five minutes remaining...the drive failed to produce any points, though, when a 19-yard field goal hit off the left upright...on Pitt's final drive, another remarkable catch by Mack converted a 4thand-12 to give the Panthers one final chance...but Pickett's final pass from the 26-yard line fell incomplete in the end zone as time expired... Pickett posted career highs in completions (35), attempts (51) and yards (372)...his completion total was two shy of the school record (37 by Alex Van Pelt vs. Notre Dame in 1990)...after Penn State seized a 7-0 lead in the first quarter, Pitt responded with 10 unanswered points in the second period...freshman Vincent Davis scored from three yards out, giving Pitt a 10-7 lead with 2:08 left...PSU tied the game at 10-10 when Jordan Stout kicked a school-record 57-yard field goal with one second left before halftime...PSU (3-0) scored the decisive TD on a 13yard Noah Cain run in the third quarter...Pitt fell despite holding advantages in total yards (396 to 389), passing yards (372 to 222), time of possession (34:16 to 25:44) and first downs (20 to 17)...Pitt could not muster a running game, producing just 24 yards on 25 attempts...the game's start was delayed 40 minutes due to lightning.

In a matchup between two contenders in the ACC's Coastal Division, Pitt failed to gain any offensive traction in rainy Blacksburg and fell 28-0 to No. 25 Virginia Tech...the Panthers, who were shut out for the first time since 2008, mustered just 177 yards for the contest... Pitt concluded the regular season with a 26-19 setback to visiting Boston College...the Panthers (7-5, 4-4) committed four critical turnovers and struggled to contain the Eagles' standout tailback AJ Dillon, who rushed for 178 yards...needing a win to secure bowl eligibility, Boston College (6-6, 4-4) built an early 10-point lead...however, Alex Kessman kept Pitt in contention with three field goals in the second quarter, including a 48-yarder on the final play before intermission... Kessman finished the game a perfect 5-for-5 on placements (four field goals and an extra point)...on the opening drive of the second half, Vincent Davis broke a 39-yard TD run to give the Panthers their first and only lead at 16-13...but Boston College answered less than a minute later with a 61-yard scoring burst from Dillon to retake the lead for good...Pitt QB Kenny Pickett completed 30-of-40 passes for 323 yards...his top target was Jared Wayne, who had a game-high 100 receiving yards on six catches...Wayne became the first Pitt freshman with a 100-yard receiving game since Tyler Boyd in 2013...but struggles in the red zone and three lost fumbles proved to be the Panthers' undoing as Boston College claimed its first victory in Pittsburgh since 1998...prior to the game, Pitt honored 17 players for Senior Day.
