Game Storylines

✓ Pitt opens its 130th season of intercollegiate football when the Panthers host ACC foe Virginia at Heinz Field. The game will serve as Pitt's initial appearance on the newly launched ACC Network.

✓ The Panthers are the defending ACC Coastal Division champion. Pitt finished with a 6-2 conference mark last season to claim the division and advance to the ACC Championship Game.

✓ In a preseason media poll, Virginia was picked to win the 2019 Coastal championship. Pitt was voted fourth.

✓ The Panthers are 5-1 against Virginia in ACC play, the lone loss occurring during the 2014 season in Charlottesville. Pat Narduzzi is undefeated (4-0) against the Cavaliers during his Pitt tenure.

✓ Virginia is winless in five prior visits to Pittsburgh. In the Cavs' last visit to Heinz (2017), Pitt claimed a 31-14 win.

✓ Pitt is 84-43-2 (.659) all-time in openers. Since the 2000 season, the Panthers are 14-5 (.737) in their initial game, including 4-0 under Pat Narduzzi.

✓ This will be only the third time that Pitt has opened a season against a conference opponent. The Panthers are 0-2 in such instances (0-1 in the ACC).

✓ Pitt last opened the season with a conference game on Sept. 2, 2013. Playing in their inaugural ACC game, the Panthers lost 41-13 to visiting Florida State, that year's eventual national champion. (That 2013 game against the Seminoles also marks the last time Pitt lost a season opener.)

✓ Over his initial four years as Pitt's head coach (2015-18), Pat Narduzzi led the Panthers to the third-best record in ACC play with a 20-12 mark. Only Clemson (30-2) and Miami (21-11) achieved better ACC records during that span.

- ✓ The 2019 season marks Pat Narduzzi's fifth as Pitt's head football coach. Over his initial four years (2015-18), Narduzzi led the Panthers to the third-best record in ACC play with a 20-12 mark. Only Clemson (30-2) and Miami (21-11) achieved better ACC records during that timeframe.
- ✓ In 2018, the Panthers won their first Coastal Division championship and made their inaugural appearance in the ACC Championship Game.
- ✓ Narduzzi's 28 overall wins from 2015-18 marked the most by a Pitt coach in his first four seasons in nearly four decades. (Jackie Sherrill compiled 39 victories from 1977-80.)
- ✓ Under Narduzzi, the Panthers have a burgeoning reputation as a dangerous opponent for highly ranked foes. In 2017, Pitt closed the season with a 24-14 victory over No. 2 Miami. In 2016, the Panthers defeated two teams that finished in the top 5 of the final College Football Playoff rankings. Pitt gave No. 2 Clemson—that year's eventual national champion—its only loss (43-42) and kept No. 5 Penn State out of the playoff field by defeating the Nittany Lions, 42-39.
- ✓ Over Narduzzi's initial four seasons as head coach, Pitt had 26 All-ACC Academic Football Team honorees, the second-highest total among conference schools during that span.
- ✓ The Panthers also were a recipient of the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) 2018 Academic Achievement Award after scoring a perfect single-year 1,000 Academic Progress Rate (APR).
- ✓ Over the past four NFL Drafts (2016-19), the Panthers had 10 players selected, tied for the sixth-highest total among ACC teams.
- ✓ Each of Pitt's three 2018 draft picks—tackle Brian O'Neill (Minnesota Vikings), safety Jordan Whitehead (Tampa Bay Buccaneers) and cornerback Avonte Maddox (Philadelphia Eagles)—were rookie starters. Moreover, running back James Conner, a Pittsburgh Steelers' 2017 draft pick, was selected to the Pro Bowl after rushing for nearly 1,000 yards in his second professional season.
- ✓ In 2016, Quadree Henderson earned consensus All-America status as a return specialist after leading the country in kickoff return touchdowns (three) and combined kick return yards (1,166). Additionally, guard Dorian Johnson also was a first team All-American under Narduzzi.
- ✓ Narduzzi has coached three ACC major award winners at Pitt: running back James Conner (2016 Brian Piccolo Award), running back Qadree Ollison (2015 Offensive Rookie of the Year) and safety Jordan Whitehead (2015 Overall and Defensive Rookie of the Year).
- ✓ Narduzzi arrived at Pitt following eight highly successful years as the defensive coordinator at Michigan State under Mark Dantonio. The Spartans were the only team to rank in the nation's top 10 in total defense and rushing defense each season from 2011-14.
- ✓ Michigan State boasted the nation's top rushing defense in 2014, yielding just 88.5 yards per game. The Spartans finished third nationally with 34 turnovers gained and eighth in total defense, holding opponents to just 315.8 yards per contest.
- ✓ In 2014, the Spartans finished with a No. 5 national ranking and 11-2 record following a stirring 42-41 victory over Baylor in the AT&T Cotton Bowl. Narduzzi's defense shut out the high-scoring Bears in the fourth quarter, opening the door for 21 unanswered points by Michigan State.
- ✓ In 2013, Michigan State finished No. 3 in the country following a Big Ten title and 24-20 victory over No. 5 Stanford in the Rose Bowl. Narduzzi was named the 2013 recipient of the prestigious Broyles Award, annually presented to the country's top assistant coach.
- ✓ Narduzzi's decorated defensive players at Michigan State included first team All-Americans in cornerback Darqueze Dennard, safety Kurtis Drummond, linebacker Greg Jones and defensive tackle Jerel Worthy. Dennard was a unanimous All-American in 2013, becoming the first Michigan State cornerback to earn that distinction. He also was the school's first winner of the Jim Thorpe Award, given to college football's top defensive back.
- ✓ Narduzzi was a starting linebacker under his father, the late Bill Narduzzi, as a freshman at Youngstown State University in 1985 before transferring to Rhode Island, where he became a three-year starter for the Rams from 1987-89.
- ✓ Bill Narduzzi was head coach at YSU from 1975-85. He led the Penguins to two NCAA Division II playoff appearances, including the national championship game in 1979, and twice was named the Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year. One of Bill's first coaching posts was as a freshman line coach at Pitt in 1962.

SERIES NOTES

This is the 12th meeting between Pitt and Virginia in a series that dates back to 1953...Pitt leads the overall series, 8-3, and has won the last four encounters with the Cavaliers...the Panthers claimed a 23-13 road victory over UVA last year...in the last meeting at Heinz Field, Pitt triumphed, 31-14, in 2017...Virginia's last win in the series occurred in 2014 at Scott Stadium, 24-19...the Panthers lead the ACC series, 5-1...Pitt is 5-0 against the Cavaliers in Pittsburgh and 3-2 in Charlottesville...Virginia won the lone neutral site contest, a 23-16 decision in the 2003 Continental Tire Bowl, played in the Carolina Panthers' Bank of America Stadium (Charlotte, N.C.)...that postseason contest featured all-time great Pitt wide receiver Larry Fitzgerald and UVA standouts Matt Schaub at quarterback and Heath Miller at tight end.

ACC COASTAL CLASH OPENS 2019:

- ✓ Pitt will open its 2019 season with an ACC Coastal Division clash against Virginia at Heinz Field on Aug. 31.
- ✓ The Panthers have opened a campaign with a conference game only two other times: Aug. 31, 1996 against then-Big East foe West Virginia at Pitt Stadium and Sept. 2, 2013 against Florida State at Heinz Field. The game against the Seminoles served as Pitt's inaugural ACC contest.
- ✓ Pitt is 0-2 when opening a season with a conference opponent (losing 34-0 to West Virginia and 41-13 to Florida State). However, Pat Narduzzi is undefeated (4-0) against Virginia during his Pitt tenure.

DEFENDING COASTAL CHAMPS:

- ✓ Pitt enters Pat Narduzzi's fifth season as head coach coming off the program's first appearance in the ACC Championship Game.
- ✓ The Panthers used a late four-game winning streak to win the ACC's Coastal Division and finished with a 6-2 record in league play.
- ✓ Pitt met eventual national champion Clemson in the 2018 ACC title game at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte on Dec. 1.

AMONG THE ACC'S BEST:

- ✓ Since Pat Narduzzi became Pitt's head coach in 2015, the Panthers have compiled the third-best record in league play among all ACC teams.

- ✓ The 2019 campaign will mark the 130th football season at the University of Pittsburgh.
- ✓ The Panthers, who played their inaugural season in 1890, have a 724-534-42 all-time record (.573).
- ✓ The program's rich legacy includes 92 first team All-Americans, 24 College Football Hall of Famers, eight Pro Football Hall of Famers and nine national titles.

YOUR 2019 PITT TEAM CAPTAINS:

- ✓ As selected by their teammates, the captains for the 2019 Panthers are senior wide receiver Maurice Ffrench, senior cornerback Dane Jackson and junior center Jimmy Morrissey.

TOUGH SLATE:

- ✓ The Panthers' 2019 schedule features 11 opponents that qualified for the postseason last year.
- ✓ Three Pitt opponents appeared in the final Associated Press Top 25 poll for 2018: No. 11 UCF, No. 15 Syracuse and No. 17 Penn State.
- ✓ In 14 games during the 2018 season, Pitt played a national-best 12 bowl-eligible teams. Three of those 2018 opponents went a combined 39-2: College Football Playoff (CFP) national champion Clemson (15-0), CFP entrant Notre Dame (12-1) and UCF (12-1), which finished No. 8 in the final CFP rankings.

2019 RANKED FOES:

- ✓ Three Pitt opponents appear in the preseason Top 25 polls: Penn State (No. 15 Associated Press/No. 14 USA Today Coaches Poll), UCF (No. 17/17) and Syracuse (No. 22/22).

OFFENSIVE NOTES

BIG SHOES TO FILL:

- ✓ Pitt must replace the first 1,000-yard rushing tandem in school history.
- ✓ Prior to 2018, Pitt never had a 1,000-yard rushing duo in the same season, but Qadree Ollison (1,213) and Darrin Hall (1,144) became the first to reach that shared achievement last year.
- ✓ Ollison and Hall helped Pitt boast the nation's No. 18 rushing attack in 2018, averaging 227.9 yards per game. Among ACC teams, the Panthers ranked third in rushing, trailing only Georgia Tech's spread-option attack (325.1 avg.) and national champion Clemson (248.2).

RUSH HOUR:

- ✓ Since Pat Narduzzi's initial season as Pitt's head coach in 2015, the Panthers have rushed for at least 200 yards on 23 occasions. Pitt is 17-6 in those contests.
- ✓ During that span, the Panthers have six games with at least 300 rushing yards and are 6-0 in those outings. Pitt is 2-0 when reaching the 400-yard rushing milestone under Narduzzi.
- ✓ Pitt flirted with the 500-yard rushing mark in two games in 2018.
- ✓ The Panthers piled up 492 yards and six touchdowns on 36 carries (13.7 avg.) in a 52-22 victory over Virginia Tech (Nov. 10). It marked the second-highest rushing total ever at Pitt, trailing only the school-record 530 yards gained at Army on Oct. 18, 1975.
- ✓ In the Panthers' 54-45 win over Duke (Oct. 27), Pitt compiled 484 yards and four touchdowns on 52 carries (9.3 avg.), the third-highest ground total in school annals.

Pitt leapfrogged Virginia and claimed the ACC Coastal Division lead thanks to a 23-13 victory on a soggy Friday night in Charlottesville... the Panthers (5-4, 4-1) dominated the line of scrimmage, especially in the second half, to knock off the nationally ranked Cavaliers, who entered the game on a three-game winning streak...Darrin Hall keyed Pitt's rushing attack and finished with 229 yards and three touchdowns on just 19 carries...Hall, honored as the Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week for his effort, averaged 12.1 yards per carry and scored on runs of 41, 2 and 75 yards...Hall's third TD gave the Panthers a 20-13 advantage in the fourth quarter... kicker Alex Kessman added Pitt's final points with a clutch 53-yard field goal with just 4:25 left...Dewayne Hendrix led Pitt's aggressive pass rush, tallying a career-high 2.5 sacks...the Panthers tied their season high with five total sacks of mobile Virginia QB Bryce Perkins...Pitt outgained Virginia by a 254-44 margin on the ground...the Panthers defeated the Cavs (6-3, 4-2) for the fourth consecutive season...it was Pitt's first road victory over a ranked opponent since its upset of No. 3/2 Clemson in 2016.

- ✓ Junior defensive end Rashad Weaver will miss the 2019 season due to a torn anterior cruciate ligament, Coach Pat Narduzzi announced on Aug. 9.
- ✓ Considered one of the top returning defensive linemen in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Weaver was named preseason All-ACC by no fewer than three different publications.
- ✓ As a sophomore in 2018, he led Pitt in sacks (6.5), tackles for loss (14) and fumble recoveries (three).
