- » Friday's match will mark the fifth against a ranked opponent for the Panthers and fourth for the Cardinals so far this season. Louisville enters the match ranked No. 25 in the latest United Soccer Coaches Top-25 Poll.
- » Pitt is looking to extend their unbeaten streak to five games while the Cardinals come into the match owning a 4-2-1 record overall and a 0-1-1 ACC mark as they downed Florida Gulf Coast Monday night, 1-0.
- » The Panthers are in search of a 3-0 start to ACC play Friday night. With a win, it would mark just the second time in program history Pitt opened conference play 3-0.
- » Junior midfielder Filip Mirkovic has been on a roll in his last four games as he has recorded two goals, five assists and nine points while Pitt is 3-0-1 in those matches. Last time out, Mirkovic netted a four-point game with a goal and two assists.

AKRON RECAP

- After falling behind No. 14 Akron 2-0 early in the first half, the Panthers were able to battle back to earn a hard-fought 3-3 draw Monday night at Ambrose Urbanic Field.
- Trailing 2-0 late in the first half, Mohammad Abualnadi netted a header goal in the 43rd minute and then he set up Filip Mirkovic for the game-tying goal with one second to play in the half.
- Freshman Noah Hall started the second half for Pitt and delivered his first career goal as he headed home a great cross from Mirkovic to give Pitt the 3-2 lead. Akron responded with the game-tying goal just over two minutes later as the game ended in a draw.
- Pitt held the 18-9 advantage in shots and the 9-2 lead in corner kicks in the tie.

THE SERIES VS. LOUISVILLE

- This meeting marks the seventh all-time between the two programs with the Cardinals owning the 5-1-0 advantage in the series.
- The Panthers won the last meeting against the Cardinals, 4-1, on the road in 2020. Filip Mirkovic and Valentin Noel each netted goals in the win.
- Pitt is 1-2 all-time in games played in Louisville in the series.
- The first meeting between the two teams came in 2006 as Louisville earned the 2-1 win in Pittsburgh.

SCOUTING THE CARDINALS

- Louisville is 4-2-1 overall and 0-1-1 in ACC play so far this season after defeating Florida Gulf Coast Monday night, 1-0, on the road. The Cardinals are ranked No. 25 in the latest United Soccer Coaches National Top-25 Poll.
- The Cardinals have scored 13 goals in seven matches as they have four players with two goals each. Freshman Konstantinos Georgallides is leading the way with six points on two goals and two assists.
- Sander Roed leads the team with four assists to go along with 10 shots while Aboubacar Camara has two goals, both game-winners, so far this

season.

- In goal, Gavin Krenecki has earned six starts and owns a 3-2-1 record with a 1.33 goals-against average and a .636 save percentage with one shutout. Last time out, Ryan Troutman made his first start and earned a cleansheet in the win over Florida Gulf Coast, making two saves.

PITT LOOKING FOR 3-0 ACC START

- The Panthers opened ACC play with back-to-back shutout victories for the first time in program history as they downed North Carolina on the road 1-0 and NC State at home, 3-0.
- Pitt will be looking to improve to 3-0 in ACC play for just the second time on Friday night as they head to Louisville. Pitt opened the 2020-21 season with four straight wins.
- Pitt will be looking for their third straight shutout to open ACC play. It would make the first time in program history the Panthers started conference play with three straight cleansheets.

PANTHERS RANKED ONCE AGAIN

- The Pitt program has turned into a fixture in the national polls since head coach Jay Vidovich took over the program.
- Pitt is ranked No. 8 in the latest United Soccer Coaches Top-25 Poll, No. 3 in the TopDrawerSoccer Top-25 Poll and No. 6 in the College Soccer News Top-30 Poll.
- Pitt has been ranked in all five United Soccer Coaches Polls this season.
- Overall, Pitt has been ranked for 36 consecutive weeks in the United Soccer Coaches Poll. Pitt has earned a top-10 ranking in 31 of those 36 straight weeks.
- Pitt has been ranked No. 1 in the poll for eight weeks since the poll started in 1996.

FACING RANKED OPPONENTS

- The Panthers are no stranger to nationally ranked opponents. Louisville will be the fifth ranked opponent Pitt has faced this season after they opened the year with three straight ranked foes for the first time in program history.

Freshman Noah Hall delivered the first goal of his collegiate career Monday night as the Panthers and No. 14 Akron battled to a 3-3 draw at Ambrose Urbanic Field.



- Pitt opened the season with back-to-back wins over top-10 programs for the first time in program history as they downed No. 2 Georgetown 2-1 and No. 6 West Virginia 3-0.
- Pitt is 4-0-1 against top-5 opponents over the last two seasons as they downed Georgetown (No. 2), Clemson (No. 2), Duke (No. 3) and North Carolina (No. 4) during the regular season and tied Notre Dame (No. 4) in the Elite Eight last season.
- Overall, Pitt is 6-1-2 against nationally ranked foes over the last two seasons.
- Over the last three seasons, Pitt owns a 10-4-2 record against ranked opponents.

LET ME ASSIST YOU

- A major strength of the Panthers over the past couple seasons has been the way they distribute the ball.
- So far this season, Pitt has 19 assists on 18 goals. The 19 total assists is currently ranks 9th in the NCAA while their 2.71 assists per game is 13th in the NCAA.
- Filip Mirkovic leads the Panthers with five assists on the year while a total of six Panthers have at least two helpers.
- Last season, Pitt led the NCAA in assists (63) and assists per game (3.15), both of which marked program records.
- Over the last three seasons, Pitt leads the NCAA in total assists with 126 helpers.

THE FRENCH CONNECTION

- The combination of midfielder Valentin Noel and forward Bertin Jacquesson has been deadly for the Panthers over the past three seasons.
- The two prolific scorers haven't disappointed early on as they have combined for six goals and 16 points through seven games.
- Jacquesson currently leads the

- Panthers in scoring on the year as he has three goals, three assists and nine points. Noel ranks third in scoring with three goals, one assist and seven points. They have also combined for 40 shots on the year.
- The two Frenchmen have combined to score 38 goals for Pitt over the last three seasons. The 38 goals are the most by any duo in the ACC over the last three seasons.
- Noel currently ranks fifth in program history in goals (27) and sixth in points (65). He is one point shy of fifth place (Alexander Dexter) and two points shy of fourth place (Robert Cuthbert) on the all-time list.
- Jacquesson is currently third in program history in assists (21) and is one shy of second place (Dexter Alexander, 22). He currently leads all active D1 players in the NCAA in assists per game (.47).
- Noel has racked up 65 points in 63 career games while Jacquesson has 49 points in 45 career games.

WALTI DOING IT ALL FOR PITT

- Graduate student Jackson Walti has been a stalwart in the central midfield for the Panthers since stepping foot on campus in 2018.
- Walti went from a walk-on his first season, to one of the most reliable and talented players in Pitt



Junior midfielder **Filip Mirkovic** has been great of late for the Panthers as he has netted a goal, four assists and six points across his last two games. On the season, Mirkovic ranks 10th in the NCAA and 2nd in the ACC with five assists.

program history. His work rate and the fact that he hasn't missed a practice throughout his collegiate career makes Walti one of the most important players on the pitch each match.

- The three-year captain currently leads all NCAA Division I soccer player in minutes played with 7,680 career minutes for Pitt. His 86 games played are also the most by any Division I player.

- A native of Switzerland, Walti has appeared in 86 matches and started 83 across his career while adding four goals, five assists, 13 points and 37 shots.

MIRKOVIC THE MAGICIAN

- Junior midfielder Filip Mirkovic has turned into one of the most dangerous players on the pitch for the Panthers this season.

- Mirkovic has started five matches this season and has accumulated two goals, a team-high five assists and nine points while adding 11 shots.

- The Manhattan, NY native has been extremely dangerous over his last two matches as he has six points (one goal, four assists). The back-to-back multi-point efforts gives him eight career multi-point games for the Panthers.

- Since returning to the lineup against Howard, Mirkovic has put up nine points in four matches including a season-best four point (goal and two assists) last time out vs. #14 Akron.

- The junior brings loads of experience to the field for the Panthers as he has appeared in 44 matches and started 40. He has posted eight goals, 12 assists and 28 points to go along with 52 shots in three years of action for Pitt.

VAN DER SAR EARNING STARTING SPOT

- After serving as the backup goalkeeper for the Panthers last season, senior goalkeeper Joe van der Sar had made a nice transition into the starting role for Pitt.

- Last time out against No. 14 Akron, van der Sar saw his shutout

streak of 343 minutes snapped as he allowed a goal in the ninth minute. He finished the game making one stop as Pitt earned the tough draw against the Zips.

- The talented keeper has started all seven games for the Panthers this season as he owns a 5-1-1 record and a 0.86 goals against average, a .727 save percentage and four shutouts.

- van der Sar ranks second in the ACC in shutouts (4) while ranking fourth in save percentage (.727) and fifth in goals-against average (0.86).

- After making his first career start in the win over No. 2 Georgetown, van der Sar has notched shutouts of West Virginia, Howard, North Carolina and NC State.

- He is the son of former professional goalkeeper Edwin van der Sar who is considered by many as one of the best goalkeepers of all-time. Edwin is currently the Chief Executive of AFC Ajax, a team who plays in the top division in the Netherlands.

- Edwin made 605 appearances in goal for Ajax, Juventus, Fulham and Manchester United across his professional career. He also made 130 appearances for the Netherlands National Team.

HOME TURF ADVANTAGE

- The Panthers have been one of the best teams in the country on their home turf over the last four seasons as they own a 28-3-2 record at Ambrose Urbanic Field.

- Pitt held a 19-match home winning streak from Oct. 7, 2019 to Nov. 10, 2021, which at the time was the longest streak in the ACC and second longest unbeaten streak in the nation.

- Head coach Jay Vidovich is 34-16-4 at home in his seven seasons at Pitt. - Since the start of the 2019 season, Pitt has outscored its opponents 100-32 at home including a 16-4 advantage this season.

- The Panthers win percentage (.879) at home over the past four seasons is the best in the ACC and third overall in the NCAA.

LED BY ONE OF THE BEST

- The Panthers have become one of the most respected and successful programs in the country over the last couple years thanks to head coach Jay Vidovich and his staff.

- He has posted a career coaching record of 334-172-59 (.642). His 334 career coaching wins are 13th among active D1 head coaches.

- With the win over NC State Friday night, Vidovich became the first head coach in ACC history to collect 100 regular season conference wins. He currently owns a 100-76-26 (.559) record in ACC matches.

- Vidovich is one of the most decorated coaches in the NCAA as he earned one national title (2007, Wake Forest) while earning two NSCAA National Coach of the Year awards (2007, 2008) and seven ACC Coach of the Year awards (2002, 2004, 2006, 2008, 2009, 2020, 2021).

PANTHERS EARN WEEKLY ACC HONORS

- Pitt has earned two ACC weekly awards so far this season.

- Bertin Jacquesson was named Co-Offensive Player of the Week after for week 1 as he netted a goal and assist in the Panthers season-opening win over No. 2 Georgetown.

- Jacquesson is just the second Panther to earn ACC Offensive Player of the Week multiple times, joining teammate Valentin Noel.

- Last week, freshman defender Jackson Gilman was named Co-Defensive Player of the Week after helping Pitt secure a pair of shutouts. He also added five shots in the two victories for Pitt.

- Gilman is the first Pitt freshman in program history to earn ACC Defensive Player of the Week honors and just the fifth overall.

- Since joining the ACC in 2013-14 Pitt has earned 13 Player of the Week honors (eight offensive, five defensive).

UP NEXT

- Pitt returns home Friday, Sept. 30 as they welcome Virginia to Ambrose Urbanic Field for a 7:00 pm ACC match. Friday's match will air on ACC Network Extra.

- Friday's match will be the 14th meeting between the two squads all-time with the Cavaliers owning the 7-4-2 series advantage.

- Pitt is 4-0-1 in the last five matches against Virginia as they two sides tied 2-2 last season in Charlottesville. Valentin Noel netted both goals for Pitt in the road draw last year.

PAIR OF PANTHERS DRAFTED

- For the first time in program history, the Panthers had a pair of players selected in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft. Pitt was one of five ACC programs that saw multiple players selected in the draft.

- Defender Arturo Ordoñez was selected in the second round (39th overall) by Houston Dynamo while Jasper Löeffelsend was taken in the third round (81st overall) by Real Salt Lake.

- Löeffelsend is enjoying a nice start to his career in the MLS as he has appeared in 23 matches and made 14 starts while posting one goal and two assists on 10 shots.

- The Panthers have seen five players drafted into the MLS in program history, all of which were coached by Jay Vidovich.

FORMER PANTHERS PLAYING FOR THE RIVERHOUNDS

- Three former Pitt standouts are currently playing for the Pittsburgh Riverhounds in the USL Championship, the second tier league in the US.

- Arturo Ordoñez (2022 grad) has earned 28 starts and notched one goal while Shane Wiedt (2018 grad) has earned 24 starts on defense and netted two goals. Former standout Edward Kizza has also appeared in 15 games and scored one goal for Pittsburgh.

Jay Vidovich, one of America's most respected and accomplished soccer coaches, was named the third Pitt men's soccer head coach at the University of Pittsburgh in December of 2015.

A season after taking the Pitt men's soccer program to new heights by reaching its first College Cup in school history, Vidovich and the team picked up where it left off in 2021 and captured a share of the ACC Coastal Division Title for the second-straight season and appeared in the NCAA Elite Eight for the second consecutive year. His efforts at the helm earned him ACC Coach of the Year for the second-straight season and seventh time in his illustrious career.

Since the start of the 2020-21 campaign – one split into two seasons due to the COVID-19 pandemic - the Panthers have been nationally ranked and have totaled 31 straight weeks in the United Soccer Coaches Poll. Of those 31 weeks, 21 have been in the top-five and 26 in the top-10.

The 2021 team proved to be one of the best passing teams in the nation, totaling 63 assists and 3.15 assists per game. The total assist mark surpassed last year's program high of 44 while the assists per game was .65 higher than the previous program best of 2.50 set back in 1971.

The team earned a key 2-0 victory on the road at No. 2 Clemson Sept. 25, 2021, snapping the Tigers' longest home winning streak in the nation. After the victory, Pitt secured the top spot of home wins in a row, a feat that lasted 19 games and six and a half weeks in the nation's toughest conference. In addition to longest active home winning streak, the Panthers held the second longest home unbeaten streak in the country at 19-0-0. Vidovich and staff have transformed Ambrose Urbanic Field as a tough place to play as Pitt has outscored its competition 84-28 since the 2019 season and outscored its opponents 43-12 in 2021.

Finishing 13-5-2 with a 5-2-1 conference ledger, the 2021 squad earned multiple accolades both on and off the pitch. Jasper Loeffelsend was named College Soccer News First Team All-American and United Soccer Coaches Second Team All-American, becoming the first two-time All-American in program history as he received both honors in 2020-21. Loeffelsend was also named ACC Defensive Player of the Year for the second consecutive season, a feat that has not happened in the conference since Ike Opara in 2008-09, a player Vidovich coached at Wake Forest.

Nine players were named to the All-ACC Team including a program best six on the Second Team. Pitt's achievements happened in the classroom as well as eight players were named to the All-ACC Academic Team with Jackson Walti earning the ACC Postgraduate Scholarship Award.

After the conclusion of the 2021 season, both Loeffelsend and Arturo Ordoñez were drafted in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft. Ordoñez was taken 39th overall by the Houston Dynamo, while Loeffelsend was selected 81st overall by Real Salt Lake.

Vidovich and the Panthers concluded one of the most memorable seasons in Pitt men's soccer history in 2020-21, finishing with a school record 16 wins, nine conference victories and a NCAA College Cup appearance, the first the program has seen. The Panthers finished 16-4 (9-1) and clinched the school's first ever Coastal Division crown with a 5-0 shutout victory at home over Virginia April 8, 2021.

Under Vidovich and staff, the Panthers earned a plethora of awards in 2020-21. Midfielder Valentin Noel and defender Jasper Loeffelsend received United Soccer Coaches First and Second Team All-America, respectively, the first All-Americans in program history. Three players were named ACC Players of the Year, including Noel (Offensive), Loeffelsend (Defensive) and Bertin Jacquesson (Freshman). A school record five were named to the United Soccer Coaches All-South Region Team, while a program record 10 were named to the All-ACC teams. Noel was also named a finalist for the prestigious MAC Hermann Trophy award, given to college soccer's best male and female player.

Pitt's offense ranked among the best in 2020-21, ranking fifth in the country in scoring offense with 2.55 goals per game. The Panthers were first in the nation in total goals (51), total assists (44), and total points (146) while ranking 13th in assists per game (2.20) and sixth in points per game (7.30). In part to leading Pitt to a high powered offense, Pitt earned the No. 1 ranking via United Soccer Coaches Poll for the first time ever Oct. 20, 2020. Men's soccer became the third athletics team to be named No. 1 in its respective sports poll, joining football and men's basketball.

Vidovich was named ACC Coach of the Year for the sixth time in his career and first as the Panthers' head coach April 14, 2021.

In his fourth year at the helm of Pitt men's soccer, Vidovich led the Panthers to a 10-8-2 record in 2019. Vidovich saw Pitt upset No. 1 Virginia on the road on Oct. 18, host an ACC Tournament game against NC State for the first time in school history on Nov. 10, earn a trip to the ACC Semifinals for the first time in program history and stamp its name into the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship for the first time since 1965.

Vidovich and the Panthers earned a monumental victory on Nov. 21, 2019 as they defeated Lehigh at Ambrose Urbanic Field, 2-0, winning the first NCAA Men's Soccer Championship game in school history. The season ended Nov. 24 against No. 2 Georgetown in the second round of the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship, but only after a record setting season that saw six All-ACC honorees, two ACC All-Tournament Team winners and one United Soccer Coaches All-South Region Team recipient.

During his third year at Pitt in the 2018 season, Vidovich led the Panthers to wins over two ranked opponents in No. 12 NC State and No. 7 Virginia in the ACC Men's Soccer Tournament. The victory over the Cavaliers marked the Panthers' first ACC Tournament win in program history. Pitt collected its first conference win on the season against the Wolfpack and picked up

Vidovich played a crucial role in the development of Javi Perez, who was drafted by LAFC in the third round of 2019 MLS Superdraft. With the selection, Perez became only the second player in program history to be drafted to an MLS club team. Three Panthers were also named to All-ACC teams under Vidovich's guidance as Edward Kizza was given First Team honors, Javi Perez earned Second Team recognition and Chandler Vaughn was named to the All-Freshman Team. Both Kizza and Perez earned All-Region Honors as well, with Kizza voted to the Second Team and Perez named to the Third Team.

Following his first year at the helm, Vidovich led the Panthers to wins over No. 7 Notre Dame, No. 13 Columbia and No. 21 Syracuse in the 2017 season. The win against Syracuse would be the Panthers' first win over a ranked opponent since the 2008 season. The victory over the Orange was also the first conference win for Pitt since moving into the ACC at the start of the 2013 season, and they would add their second conference win against the Fighting Irish on Oct. 13. The Panthers would also capture victories against rivals Penn State and West Virginia throughout the season.

Vidovich also guided four players to All-ACC recognition, with Javi Perez earning Second Team honors, Pol Planellas receiving Third Team recognition and both Alexander Dexter and Edward Kizza being named to the All-Freshman Team. The postseason accolades were the team's first in program history since joining the ACC.

Planellas would go on to become the first Pitt men's soccer player in program history to be drafted by an MLS Club team after being selected by the Los Angeles Football Club in the second round of the 2018 MLS SuperDraft, becoming the 36th professional player under Vidovich's tutelage.


Prior to making the move to Pittsburgh, Vidovich oversaw the men's soccer program at Wake Forest for 21 seasons (1994-2014), building the Demon Deacons into a national power and winning the 2007 NCAA championship. He spent 2015 in professional soccer, coaching the Portland Timbers 2 (T2) in the United Soccer League (USL).

During his Wake Forest tenure, Vidovich compiled a 272-121-50 record and led the Demon Deacons to the NCAA Tournament in 13 of his final 14 seasons. Wake Forest won five Atlantic Coast Conference titles under his watch, compiling a 76-52-22 mark in one of the nation's most challenging leagues.

In 2007, Wake Forest went 22-2-2—the winningest season in school history—and defeated Ohio State, 2-1, in the national final to claim the program's first NCAA title. The Demon Deacons made four consecutive appearances in the College Cup from 2006-09.

Vidovich, a two-time National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) National Coach of the Year (2007 and 2008) and five-time ACC Coach of the Year (2002, 2004, 2006, 2008 and 2009), ranks among the most decorated coaches in collegiate soccer.

Vidovich was the 2008 recipient of the prestigious Walt Chyzowych Award for lifetime contributions to the sport of soccer. Vidovich was an assistant under the legendary Chyzowych for eight seasons at Wake Forest from 1986-93.



Widely regarded as one of the game's top evaluators and developers of talent, Vidovich has produced 21 All-Americans and five ACC Player of the Year honorees (three offensive and two defensive). He also coached Marcus Tracy, the first player in Wake history to win the Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy, which honors the top individual player in college soccer.

Thirty-five players under Vidovich went on to play in the professional ranks from 2002-14. His Wake Forest teams also achieved academically, evidenced by two ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honorees, two Academic All-Americans, one adidas National Scholar-Athlete of the Year and one Senior CLASS Award recipient.

Born in Detroit, Mich., Vidovich was an all-state player for New Canaan High School in Connecticut. He played for Indiana University in 1978 before transferring to Ohio Wesleyan, where he was a three-year starter. As a senior, Vidovich was team captain and helped lead OWU to the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament.

A 1982 graduate of Ohio Wesleyan with a bachelor's degree in physical education, he went on to earn a master's degree in sports sciences from the University of Denver in 1983.

It was at Denver where Vidovich's coaching career was launched as an assistant in 1982. He served in additional assistant posts at Regis College (1983) and his alma mater Ohio Wesleyan (1984-85) before joining Wake Forest's staff in 1986.
