TOP OF THE ORDER

- Pitt travels to Morgantown, WV for the first installment of the Backyard Brawl this season against West Virginia.
- The Panthers outit the Mountaineers in a hard-fought game at Wagener Field last year. Jayden Melendez hit a two-run home run in the loss. Luke Cantwell had three hits in his last trip to Morgantown, WV.
- This season, Pitt has six comeback victories when trailing in the fifth inning or later. The Panthers came back in the eighth inning to win game one of Friday's doubleheader at Boston College.
- First baseman **Luke Cantwell** has recorded a hit in 17 out of Pitt's last 18 games. There have been just three games this season he has been held hitless. Cantwell is hitting .413 with 43 hits, 22 RBI, 14 doubles and a triple this year. He is fifth in the country in doubles.
- The Panthers' offense ranks 5th in the ACC in hit by pitches and 7th in the base on balls.
- LHP **Ethan Firoved** earned his sixth save of the year game one of Friday's doubleheader at Boston College. In eleven appearances this year, Firoved has a 1.84 ERA with one win and 38 strikeouts.
- Sophomore third baseman **Ryan Zuckerman** launched his ninth home run of the year in game one of Friday's doubleheader at Boston College. Zuckerman is hitting .333 and leading the team in home runs (9), runs scored (27), RBIs (34) and slugging percentage (.676). He is second in hits (38) and doubles (12).
- Pitt has scored 42 runs over their last three midweek wins. They have slugged nine home runs and have combined for 41 hits.
- The Panthers added 22 newcomers to campus for the 2025 season. Among them are 16 transfers and 6 freshmen. Per 64Analytics, the Panthers landed a top-20 transfer portal recruiting class.

Mike Bell enters his seventh season as head coach of the Pitt baseball program in 2025. Bell was hired in July of 2018, becoming the fifth head coach in Pitt baseball history.

During the Mike Bell Era, the Panthers have seen one All-American, five All-Region selections and 11 All-ACC honorees while 14 players have been drafted or signed by MLB organizations. Pitt has amassed 133 wins, with 32 of them coming against ranked opponents, as well as four postseason wins in their four postseason appearances. In 2021, Bell led the Panthers to their first national ranking since 2013. They reached the highest ranking in program history on March 22, 2021, when Baseball America ranked the Panthers as the 14th team in the country. Under Bell, the program has also had their two-best starts to a season in over twenty years. Pitt started the year 10-1 in 2020 and 8-1 in 2024.

Off the field, Pitt has elevated program standards in player development, recruiting, academics and community service with Bell at the helm. During the 2023 fall semester, Pitt earned a program record 3.30 team GPA while also earning their first ever perfect Academic Progress Rate score. Over the last four years, the program has seen 13 student-athletes on average earn a degree or certificate from the University of Pittsburgh. Pitt also worked a program record 425 community service hours over the 2023-24 season and have averaged 395 hours per year over the past three seasons.

Pitt has had 10 players sign professional contracts in the last three seasons. Phil Fox and Ryan Andrade became the highest drafted Panthers under Bell when they were each selected in the seventh round of the 2024 MLB Draft. On the recruiting front, Bell and his staff have consistently pieced together talented rosters over the last six seasons. Per 64Analytics, the Panthers landed a top-20 ranked transfer portal recruiting class in 2024.

Growing the game of baseball, Bell's program has seen five former players prevail in the collegiate coaching ranks recently, while two of which are currently on Pitt's staff in Matt Gilbertson (Director of Player Development) and Jack Anderson (Director of Baseball Operations). Former Panthers Sky Duff (assistant coach, Delaware), Bryce Hulett (assistant coach, State College of Florida) and Johnny Long (grad assistant, Mississippi State) are all succeeding in the next stages of their careers.

The Panther baseball program notched another 20+ win campaign under Bell, winning 26 games and clinching a berth in the ACC Tournament for the fourth consecutive season in 2024. Prior to Bell's tenure, Pitt made the ACC tournament just once since joining the league.

Pitt saw an uptick in their offensive output in 2024 as they scored their most runs (382) and had their second-highest batting average (.282) since 2013. The Panthers would also claim the inaugural Las Vegas Baseball Classic in dominating fashion, scoring 38 runs over two games against Oklahoma and California.

RHP Phil Fox earned All-America status in just his first year with the pro-

gram, becoming Pitt's first All-American since 2016, and the first under Bell. Fox would also go on to earn All-Region and All-ACC honors for his performance on the mound as Pitt's closer.

Fox (199th overall) and Ryan Andrade (216th overall) would each be selected in the seventh round of the 2024 MLB Draft in July becoming the highest draft picks of the Mike Bell Era. Jack Sokol signed as an undrafted free agent with the New York Yankees and became the 14th Panther to sign an MLB contract since 2019.

The 2023 season was highlighted with wins over multiple top-ranked programs, including Bell's 100th career win in a shutout over No. 2 Wake Forest. The Panthers would also take the series from No. 7 Virginia, snapping their program record 23-game home win streak. Pitt went on to make the ACC Tournament and take their opening round matchup against No. 8-seeded Notre Dame. Graduate student, Kyle Hess, garnered all-conference recognition for the first time in his illustrious Pitt career in 2023, being named a Third Team All-ACC outfielder. Bell and the Panthers would then watch as RHP Logan Evans (Seattle Mariners) and RHP Dylan Simmons (Cincinnati Reds) were selected minutes from each other in the 2023 MLB Draft.

Pitt continued the program's ascension under Bell in 2022, posting a winning record with 29 victories, which tied for the program's most since joining the conference in 2014. The Panthers recorded five ACC series victories, including triumphs over a pair of top-five ranked squads (Louisville and Clemson). Pitt advanced to the ACC Tournament semifinals for the first time since 2018, logging wins over No. 7-seeded Georgia Tech and No. 2-seeded Louisville. The Panthers ended the regular season with an RPI ranking of 69, the 37th-toughest strength of schedule, 12 wins against quadrant one teams and 10 wins against the NCAA Tournament field.

Pitt saw three Panthers sign MLB contracts following the 2022 season. Catcher Tatem Levins was selected in the eighth round (246 overall) of the 2022 MLB Draft by the Seattle Mariners while right-handed pitchers Billy Corcoran (Arizona Diamondbacks) and Baron Stuart (New York Yankees) would sign undrafted free agent contracts following the draft. Starting pitchers Matt Gilbertson (Second Team) and Billy Corcoran (Third Team) were named All-ACC selections in 2022, becoming the first tandem of Panther pitchers to earn All-ACC honors in the same season. Gilbertson would also be named to the 2022 ABCA/Rawlings East All-Region Second Team.

The 2021 campaign saw Bell direct Pitt to its most successful season in the ACC. The Panthers set program records for their highest ranking in the polls (No. 14 by Baseball America), consecutive weeks in the polls (nine), RPI (50) and strength of schedule (30). In ACC play, Pitt set program-bests in ACC series wins (six) and ACC victories (16). The Panthers went 18-12 against teams that made the NCAA Regionals, tied for the second-best record against such opponents in the nation. The Panthers won 17 times against quadrant one teams and became just the second team to sweep Florida State and Miami in the same season.

With Bell serving as the pitching coach for the first time since becoming head coach of the Panthers, Mitch Myers was selected in the 12th round of the MLB Draft with the 368th pick by the Oakland Athletics. Myers was one of a program-best four Panthers selected to the All-ACC Third Team, joining Sky Duff, Nico Popa and David Yanni. Duff earned a selection to

the ABCA/Rawlings All-East Region Second Team. A member of the 2019 Second Team, Popa became the first Panther to earn All-ACC honors twice. The all-time leader in program history in games played, starts and walks, Yanni had his best season as a Panther in 2021.

In 2020, Bell guided Pitt to a 10-6 record before the season was cut short due to COVID-19. Revamping the roster with 21 newcomers, Bell led the Panthers to a 10-1 start to the year, tied for the second-best start through 11 games in program history. Pitt's offense played a huge part, ranking second in the nation in doubles per game (2.88), 37th in slugging percentage (.447) and 38th in scoring (7.3 runs per game).

Since 2005, Bell has helped lead three teams to four College World Series appearances - Tennessee (2005), Oklahoma (2010) and Florida State (2012 & 2017). He has coached nine first round draft picks, 36 Top-10 round picks, 94 overall Draft picks, 19 Major Leaguers, and helped guide 12 Top-25 recruiting classes. In 2012, he was named the Perfect Game Assistant Coach of the Year and was named the No. 13 recruiter in the country by D1Baseball.com prior to the 2017 season.

In five of his seven seasons, Florida State pitchers recorded 500 or more strikeouts, including a pair of top 10 seasons in 2017 (640, fifth-most) and 2018 (635, seventh-most). The Seminoles posted a 314-136-0 record in his tenure, reaching a Super Regional on three occasions and advancing to the College World Series twice. Florida State captured three ACC titles in Bell's time in Tallahassee, taking home conference tournament titles in 2015, '17 and '18.

Bell made stops at Oklahoma and Tennessee in his time prior to Florida State. In his first seven seasons at the Division I level, including four at Oklahoma and three at Tennessee, he helped recruit and develop 22 pitchers who were selected in the Major League Baseball draft. That includes three first-round selections - including 2006 No. 1 overall pick Luke Hochevar.

In four seasons at Oklahoma, Bell's pitching staffs established a number of new standards. His 2011 group posted a 3.00 ERA, which was the Sooners' lowest since 1978. Four of his hurlers earned All-Big 12 honors, including Second Team All-American Michael Rocha. The Sooners posted a 41-17 record and were ranked No. 15 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll. In 2010, his pitching staff was instrumental in leading OU back to the College World Series for the first time since 1995.

Beyond his Division I experience, he spent two seasons as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at Division II perennial power Florida Southern, where the Mocs twice finished in the top 20 nationally in ERA. He launched his coaching career in 2002 at Brandon High, where he led the team to a district title and a regional runner-up finish as the head coach, earning Hillsborough County Coach of the Year honors.

A left-handed pitcher and first baseman for the Seminoles, Bell reached the College World Series as a player at Florida State in both 1994 and '95. Bell posted a two-year record of 14-4 with a 3.00 ERA and was twice named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll. He earned a bachelor's degree in physical education at Florida State in 1996 and previously spent two seasons as a pitcher at Hernando Community College, where he was a two-time All-Suncoast Conference selection.

Selected in the 20th round of the 1995 draft by the Montreal Expos, Bell spent six years in the minors, including the final three with the Baltimore Orioles' organization where he reached the Double-A level.

Bell is married to the former Alicia Favarato, a Florida State graduate, and the couple has two children, daughter, Alexis, and son, Kyler.

THE FIREMAN

• LHP **Ethan Firoved** has been the Panthers' go-to high-leverage reliever this season. He's earned six saves and one win in his eleven appearances.

• Firoved has a 1.84 ERA in 29.1 innings this year. He has 38 strikeouts and has allowed six earned runs.

• Four of his six saves have been multiple innings in length. He is ranks second in the ACC in saves.

• Firoved pitched two scoreless innings in both games of Pitt's doubleheader at Boston College, earning a save in game one. He struck out five and surrendered just four hits and one walk over four scoreless innings.

CANTWELL'S IN THE ZONE

• **Luke Cantwell** has recorded a hit in 17 out of Pitt's last 18 games. There have been just three games this season he has been held hitless.

• Cantwell is hitting .413 with 43 hits, 22 RBI, 14 doubles and a triple this year. He is fifth in the country in doubles.

• He ranks top-five in the ACC in doubles (2nd), on-base percentage (2nd), batting average (4th) and walks (4th).

WE'RE GOING STREAKING

• **Ryan Zuckerman** has reached base safely in all 27 games this season. Dating back to last year, he has reached safely in 31-consecutive games.

• **AJ Nessler** has reached base safely in 22-straight game while **Luke Cantwell** has an 18-game reached base streak.

• **Jayden Melendez** has a 10-game hitting streak. He's reached base safely in 14-consecutive games.

THE ZUCK GENE

• Sophomore **Ryan Zuckerman** has been one of Pitt's clutchest hitters during his time with the program.

• Zuckerman is hitting .333 and leading the team in home runs (9), runs scored (27), RBIs (34) and slugging percentage (.676). He is second in hits (38) and doubles (12).

• He had the third multi-home run game of his career in their midweek against Akron. It was his second of the season.

• Zuckerman's three-run home run in their series finale at Georgia Tech helped kickstart Pitt's six-run comeback victory.

• He hit a game-winning three-run blast in the top of the 12th inning which lifted Pitt over ETSU in their series opener.

• The sophomore has already hit two walk-off home runs in his young career. Zuckerman began Pitt's season with a bang when he hit a walk-off home run on Opening Day.

• The Panthers have led off 15 games this season by reaching base safely.

COACHING STAFF



Brandon Romans enters his second season as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the University of Pittsburgh's baseball program. Romans coaches third base and works primarily with the hitters and outfielders. He also spearheads the Panthers' recruiting process throughout the year.

In his first year at Pitt, Romans helped a number of Panthers achieve career highs at the plate.

Under his direction, the Panthers scored their most runs (382) and had their second-highest team batting average (.282) since 2013.

Pitt's leadoff man for a majority of 2024, Dom Popa, had the best offensive season of his career in his first year with Romans. Popa tallied career highs in every major statistical category, including batting average, where he hit .350 over 55 games as a senior. Popa's 72 hits were the most in a single season by a Panther since 2019.

Pitt's first baseman, Luke Cantwell, was second in all of the ACC in on-base percentage (.515) and third in the ACC in hit-by-pitches (18) during his first season with Romans. Cantwell would go on to set the single season walks record by a Panther with 57 in 2024.

Romans has spent the past fifteen seasons coaching at the Division I level. He had spent the previous six seasons at Florida Gulf Coast University as their assistant coach and recruiting coordinator prior to arriving at Pitt.

Romans was crucial in FGCU breaking multiple single-season program records over the duration of the 2023 season. Setting the team single season home run (142), RBI (550), walk (310), runs scored (578) total base (1,252) and slugging percentage (.592) records. He also helped position players break six individual season records and six individual career records.

At the end of conference tournament play in 2023, FGCU led the nation in home runs (142) and slugging percentage (.592). At the end of the college baseball season, Romans' offense led the country in home runs per game (2.37), runs scored per game (9.63), slugging percentage (.592) and OPS (1.024). The only teams who finished with more home runs at the end of the season were the two teams who played for a national championship in Omaha in late June, Florida (146) and LSU (144).

Under the tutelage of Romans, 26 of his players have earned all-conference honors. Throughout his career, he coached 60 players who have been drafted and 10 players who have been fortunate enough to the play in the big leagues.

From 2013 to 2015, Romans was the first assistant at Jacksonville State. During his time there he helped the Gamecocks record 98 victories, 55 conference victories, and a conference tournament championship in 2014. In his first year at Jacksonville State, Romans coached two All-Americans in Michael Bishop and Travis Stout.

Romans began his coaching career at UCF as a volunteer assistant from 2010 to 2012, immediately followed his playing career for the Knights from 2007 to 2009. He would make his second stint at UCF during the 2016 season, that time as an assistant coach.

During his time at UCF, Romans helped engineer back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances in 2011 and 2012. Romans aided D.J. Hicks in earning a Dick Howser Trophy Semifinalist nomination in addition to his second consecutive All-America honor that year as well. During the 2011 season, UCF led the conference in home runs, doubles, runs scored and slugging percentage while clinching a NCAA Tournament berth for the first time since 2004.

Romans spent three years as an outfielder at UCF where he had a career .314 batting average, hit 17 home runs and drove in 77 runs. As a senior in 2009, he hit .333 while leading the team in home runs (14) and RBI (49). The performance earned him Conference-USA Second Team All-Conference honors and a selection on the Johnny Bench Award Watch List.

Romans has a wife, Emily, and a son, Landon.



Chris Collazo enters his second season as an assistant coach for the University of Pittsburgh's baseball program. In addition to coaching first base, Collazo works primarily with the infielders, hitters and will command defensive alignments.

In his first season at Pitt, the Panthers turned the fourth-most double plays in the ACC. Pitt's 42 double plays in 2024 were their most in a season in the last 10 years. A plethora of players would also improve defensively under Collazo's command.

As for success at the plate, the Panthers scored their most runs (382) and had their second-highest team batting average (.282) since 2013 under the direction of Collazo.

Chris has coached in collegiate baseball for the last 14 years.

In his first season at Delaware in 2023, Collazo helped the Blue Hens clinch a berth in the conference tournament for the first time since 2018. Three of his position players would go on to earn all-conference honors, with one earning All-Region Second Team honors. In his only season on staff, Delaware's offense finished first in the conference in runs, hits, triples, RBIs, and walks, second in doubles, home runs, total bases, slugging percentage, OPS and runs per game and fourth in batting average and on base percentage.

Prior to his year with Delaware, he spent the previous seven seasons at his alma mater, Monmouth. Collazo coached 15 players to all-conference (MAAC) selections during his tenure from 2016-2022. He helped steer the Hawks to a top three MAAC finish in five out of six seasons, including a first-place finish in 2018.

He spent the 2015 season with Villanova where he worked with the hitters and defense, and helped two of his players earn All-Big East honors. The Wildcats saw a 28-point jump in batting average from the previous year during his only season with the program.

Prior to his stint at Villanova, Collazo spent three years at Wagner as an assistant coach where he worked closely with the hitters and infielders. Collazo's offense improved from his first year to his second, as the team showed jumps in batting average, slugging percentage, on-base percentage and extra base hits. While at Wagner, Collazo coached Ian Miller who was an all-conference player and Seattle Mariners draft pick.

Collazo spent his first collegiate season as an assistant coach at Felician College in 2011. He helped them to a 24-win season and aided three hitters to all-conference selections. He would spend the fall at Seton Hall before he began at Wagner the following year.

A 2009 graduate of Monmouth, Collazo finished his career tied for the program record in hits with 247. The record is still good for second all-time in Monmouth baseball history. He was a first team all-conference selection in 2008 and 2009, a First Team All-NJCBA selection in 2009 and earned NJCBA All-Rookie honors as a freshman in 2006. Collazo was a part of two conference championship teams while at Monmouth in 2007 and 2009 and was the conference tournament MVP for his play during the NEC conference tournament in 2009.



Devin Mesoraco is entering his second season as an assistant coach and his fifth season as a member of the Pitt baseball coaching staff after being promoted from volunteer assistant to assistant coach in 2023.

Mesoraco was named the baseball volunteer assistant coach in September of 2020 and worked primarily with the program's catchers. As an assistant, he will continue to work with the program's catchers, while also serving as the bench coach with a focus on in-game offensive and defensive strategies.

Pitt's starting catcher, Jayden Melendez, improved both at the plate and behind it in his second year working with Mesoraco. He recorded career highs in hits (44), RBIs (44), runs scored (44), walks (38) and a team-leading 16 home runs. Behind the plate, Melendez would commit just three errors while his fielding percentage improved by nine points from the previous season.

Mesoraco mentored the catching tandem of Jayden Melendez and Johnny Long III in 2023. Melendez was one of five Panthers last year to hit double digit home runs (10), he drove in 22 runs, slugged .550 and had a .909 OPS in addition to that. Long III recorded 23 hits, scored 14 runs, had 12 RBI and hit two home runs in 2023 as well. The tandem each threw out seven would-be base stealers this past season and were a calming presence behind the plate for the Panther pitching staff.

In 2022, catcher Tatem Levins was selected in the eighth round (No. 246) of the 2022 MLB Draft by the Seattle Mariners. Levins started all 56 games for the Panthers, leading the squad in batting average (.321), slugging percentage (.613), OPS (1.048), hits (68), extra base hits (27), home runs (16) and total bases (130).

Mesoraco joined the Panthers after spending eight years as a catcher in the big leagues. He made his MLB debut with the Cincinnati Reds on Sept. 3, 2011 and spent nearly his entire career with the organization before ending it with the Mets in 2018. He was selected to the MLB All-Star Game in 2014 and finished that season with 25 home runs and 80 runs batted, leading all major league catchers in home runs and slugging percentage (.534). He wrapped up his professional tenure with a career-batting average of .232, 58 homers and 192 RBIs.

Selected by the Reds with the 15th overall pick of the 2007 MLB Draft, Mesoraco had a decorated prep career at nearby Punxsutawney Area High School. He set school records in walks, runs, hits, doubles, home runs and stolen bases. As a senior he led the Chucks to the PIAA Class AAA State Championship and was named the Pennsylvania Gatorade Player of the Year.

Mesoraco lives in Pittsburgh with his wife Kira and son Luke.



Matt Gilbertson, the former All-ACC pitcher, will begin his first season as the baseball program's Director of Player Development.

Gilbertson spent the last three years of his collegiate career at the University of Pittsburgh as he etched his name in the Pitt baseball record books. He finished his career eighth all-time in wins (17), 13th all-time in strikeouts (180) and 14th all-time in games started (32) and innings pitched (205.1).

Following his graduation in the spring of 2022, Gilbertson went out West to be an assistant coach with the Las Vegas Baseball Academy. There, he would run practices, camps, games and summer leagues for youth baseball players of all ages. During that time, Gilbertson was also an assistant trainer at Greathouse Physical Therapy and

Sport Science where he would write and direct workout programs and progressions for youth, high school and collegiate baseball players.

The Henderson, Nevada native was named an All-ACC and ABCA/Rawlings All-Region Pitcher following of his fifth-year senior season in 2022. Gilbertson posted a team-best 9-3 record, with four of those wins coming against ranked opponents (No. 5 Virginia, No. 5 Louisville, No. 7 Georgia Tech and No. 20 Clemson), while also lead the in ERA (3.74), WHIP (1.17), starts (15), innings pitched (96.1) and strikeouts (88). Matt ranked among the national leaders in walks allowed per nine innings (8th - 1.03) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (12th - 7.91). He also ranked among the ACC leaders in wins (T-3rd - 9), innings pitched (4th - 96.1), innings per game (1st - 6.42), games started (T-8th - 15), strikeouts (T-8th - 88), strikeouts looking (2nd - 37), walks allowed (T-2nd - 11), shutouts (T-1st - 1) and complete games (T-1st - 1).

Gilbertson played at Green Valley High School in Henderson, Nevada where he was named First Team All-Southern Nevada in his junior and senior years. He also earned USA Today First Team All-Nevada Pitcher and Second Team All-Sunrise Region DH selections during his senior year, finishing with a 9-1 record and a 1.43 ERA over 50.1 innings pitched.
