GAME STORYLINES

- The Panthers open their 136th season of intercollegiate football when they host neighboring Duquesne of the Northeast Conference at Acrisure Stadium.
- Pitt and Duquesne will meet for the first time in 86 years and seventh time overall. The Panthers hold a 5-2 series edge. Duquesne won the most recent encounter, 21-13, in 1939.
- Pitt is 22-1 all time against FCS
- The 2025 season marks Pat Narduzzi's 11th as head coach of the Panthers.
- Narduzzi is Pitt's longest-tenured head football coach since John Michelosen spent 11 seasons leading the Panthers from 1955-65.
- Narduzzi's 72 victories rank second all-time at Pitt, trailing only the legendary Jock Sutherland, who compiled 111 wins from 1924-38.
- Pitt is 89-44-2 (.667) all time in openers.
- Since the 2000 season, Pitt is

- 19-6 (.760) in its initial game, including 9-1 (.900) under Narduzzi.
- Pitt returns redshirt sophomore QB Eli Holstein for his second year as the starter for the Panthers. He completed 62% of his passes (180 of 291) for 2,228 yards and 17 touchdowns in 2024. His 17 TD passes tied the Pitt freshman record set by Alex Van Pelt (1989).
- Senior RB Desmond Reid was named a second team All-American in the all-purpose category by no fewer than six outlets last year. He was also selected first team All-ACC as an all-purpose player and return specialist, as well as Honorable Mention All-ACC at running back.
- Redshirt Junior LB Kyle Louis is back to lead the defense after becoming Pitt's first sophomore defensive player to earn All-America status from an NCAA-recognized selector since the legendary Hugh Green in 1978.

- The 2025 season marks Pat Narduzzi's 11th as Pitt's Chris Bickell '97 Head Football Coach. During his tenure, Narduzzi has led the Panthers to an ACC championship (2021) and two ACC Coastal Division titles (2018 and 2021).
- Narduzzi has compiled a 72-56 overall record. His 72 victories rank second all-time at Pitt, trailing only the legendary Jock Sutherland, who compiled 111 wins from 1924-38.
- From 2015-24, Narduzzi directed Pitt to 46 victories in ACC play, the conference's third-highest win total during that span, trailing only Clemson (71) and Miami (49).
- Over the 2021-22 seasons, Narduzzi directed the Panthers to a combined 20 wins. Pitt previously achieved 20 wins over a two-year span in 1981-82.
- In 2022, Pitt finished 9-4, including a stirring 37-35 win over nationally ranked UCLA in the Sun Bowl.
- Pitt finished 2022 in the national Top 25 for the second consecutive season, placing No. 22 in both major polls. It marked the first time since 1979-83 that Pitt earned Top 25 finishes in back-to-back years.
- In 2021, Narduzzi led Pitt to one of the most accomplished seasons in school history. The Panthers stormed to 11 victories—their most since 1981—and claimed their first outright conference title with a 45-21 triumph over Wake Forest in the ACC Championship Game.
- Pitt earned a No. 13 ranking in the final 2021 polls, its highest finish since 1982.
 Pitt placed No. 12 in the final College Football Playoff ratings, its highest ever.
- Narduzzi has coached 10 first team All-Americans at Pitt. In 2024, linebacker Kyle Louis was named a first team All-American by The Sporting News, the first Pitt sophomore defensive player to earn that distinction since the legendary Hugh Green in 1978.
- In 2021, quarterback Kenny Pickett won the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award (nation's top upperclassman quarterback) and was a Heisman Trophy finalist, wide receiver Jordan Addison won the Biletnikoff Award (nation's outstanding receiver) and specialist Cal Adomitis earned the Patrick Mannelly Award (nation's top long snapper).

- Under Narduzzi's watch, Pitt continues to produce high-level NFL prospects. Over the past five NFL drafts (2021-25), the Panthers' 20 picks are the second most of any ACC program (trailing only Clemson's 22.)
- Six Pitt products—Kancey, offensive tackle Carter Warren, running back Israel Abanikanda, linebacker SirVocea Dennis and safeties Erick Hallett II and Brandon Hill—were selected in the 2023 NFL Draft, the most in the ACC (tied with Clemson) and fifth most nationally.
- Kancey was drafted in the first round by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, marking the second consecutive year Pitt produced a first-round pick. In the 2022 draft, quarterback Kenny Pickett was a first-round selection of the Pittsburgh Steelers—the first Pitt QB to be picked in the opening round since Dan Marino in 1983.
- Narduzzi's Panthers have a well-earned reputation as a dangerous opponent for highly ranked foes. In 2019, Pitt scored a 35-34 triumph over UCF, which visited Heinz Field riding a 27-game non-bowl winning streak. The winning touchdown a gadget-play pass caught by quarterback Kenny Pickett—has been immortalized as the "Pitt Special."
- In 2017, Pitt closed the season with a 24-14 victory over No. 2 Miami, which entered the game undefeated and on the cusp of the College Football Playoff.
- In 2016, the Panthers defeated two teams that finished in the top 5 of the final CFP rankings. Pitt gave No. 2 Clemson—that year's national champion—its only loss (43-42) and kept No. 5 Penn State out of the playoff field by defeating the Nittany Lions, 42-39.
- Pitt has also thrived off the field under Narduzzi's watch. During the 2021-22 academic year, Pitt led all college football programs in community service hours.
- During Narduzzi's tenure, Pitt has two recipients of the Disney Spirit Award, presented to the most inspirational figure in college football: James Conner (2016) and Tre Tipton (2021). Additionally, Deslin Alexandre was honored as the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year and the male collegiate recipient of the Coach Wooden Citizenship Cup for 2022.

- In 2020, Pitt earned an NCAA Public Recognition Award for achieving an Academic Progress Rate (APR) score that ranked in the top 10% of all football programs. The Panthers' multi-year 988 APR set a Pitt football program record and was 24 points higher than the national average.
- Narduzzi arrived at Pitt following eight highly successful years as the defensive coordinator at Michigan State under Mark Dantonio. The Spartans were the only team to rank in the nation's top 10 in total defense and rushing defense each season from 2011-14.
- Michigan State boasted the nation's top rushing defense in 2014, yielding just 88.5 yards per game. The Spartans finished with a No. 5 national ranking and 11-2 record following a 42-41 victory over Baylor in the Cotton Bowl.
- In 2013, Michigan State finished No. 3 in the country following a Big Ten title and 24-20 victory over No. 5 Stanford in the Rose Bowl. Narduzzi was named the 2013 recipient of the prestigious Broyles Award, annually presented to the country's top assistant coach.
- Narduzzi tutored an impressive list of decorated defensive players at Michigan State, including first team All-Americans in cornerback Darqueze Dennard, safety Kurtis Drummond, linebacker Greg Jones and defensive tackle Jerel Worthy.
- Dennard was a unanimous All-American in 2013, becoming the first Michigan State cornerback to earn that distinction. He also was the school's first winner of the Jim Thorpe Award, given annually to college football's top defensive back.
- Dennard was a first-round NFL Draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals in 2014, the first Spartans defensive back taken in the initial round since 1961. In the 2015 draft, another Narduzzi pupil, Michigan State cornerback Trae Waynes, was a first-round pick of the Minnesota Vikings.
- Prior to Michigan State, Narduzzi spent three years (2004-06) as defensive coordinator under Dantonio at Cincinnati, helping the Bearcats to a pair of bowl invitations.

- In 2003, Narduzzi was the defensive coordinator at Miami of Ohio under the late
 Terry Hoeppner. The RedHawks stormed
 to a 13-1 record that season, capturing the
 Mid-American Conference (MAC) championship and defeating nationally ranked
 Louisville in the GMAC Bowl to finish No.
 10 in the Associated Press poll.
- While quarterback Ben Roethlisberger headlined Miami's offense, Narduzzi's stout unit topped the MAC in rushing defense (19th nationally), scoring defense (22nd nationally) and pass efficiency defense (34th nationally).
- Narduzzi served as linebackers coach at Northern Illinois for three seasons (2000-02). NIU won a pair of MAC divisional titles during his tenure and in 2002 had the league's top rushing defense.
- From 1993-99, Narduzzi coached at his alma mater, Rhode Island, serving as the Rams' defensive coordinator his final two seasons. He began his coaching career at Miami of Ohio, working as a graduate assistant in 1990 and 1991, before earning his first full-time position as receivers coach for the 1992 season.
- Narduzzi was an All-Ohio performer at Youngstown's Ursuline High School, leading the Irish to the Steel Valley championship and state playoffs as a senior in 1984.
- Narduzzi was a starting linebacker under his father, the late Bill Narduzzi, as a freshman at Youngstown State in 1985 before transferring to Rhode Island, where he became a three-year starter for the Rams from 1987-89.
- Bill Narduzzi was head coach at YSU from 1975-85. He led the Penguins to two NCAA Division II playoff appearances, including the national championship game in 1979, and twice was named the Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year. One of Bill's first coaching posts was as a freshman line coach at Pitt in 1962.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

DESMOND DAZZLES

- √ Desmond Reid was a Pitt newcomer of high impact, earning firstteam All-ACC honors as an all-purpose back and return specialist. He earned second team All-America in the all-purpose category.
- $\sqrt{\text{Reid}}$ entered the bowl season ranked sixth nationally with an average of 150.90 all-purpose yards per game.
- $\sqrt{\text{He was Pitt's top punt returner, averaging 12.2 yards on 13 returns}}$ (159 total yards).
- √Despite missing two full games (Youngstown State and Boston College) due to injury, Reid netted a team-high 962 rushing yards and scored five touchdowns on 183 carries (5.3 avg.).
- $\sqrt{\rm Additionally}$, he had 52 receptions (tied for team lead) for 579 yards (11.1 avg.) and four scores
- √ Reid led the Panthers with 10 total touchdowns: five rushing, four receiving and one on a 78-yard punt return (vs. Kent State).

IMPRESSIVE COMPANY

- √Desmond Reid was the only player in the nation last season to compile three games with at least 100 receiving yards and 50 rushing yards.
- $\sqrt{\text{Reid}}$ was the first player to accomplish that feat since Stanford's Christian McCaffrey in 2015.

REID IN REVIEW

- √ Desmond Reid compiled three 100-yard rushing games and three 100-yard receiving games last season.
- √ In the Panthers' 28-27 win at Cincinnati (Sept. 6), he became the first Pitt player on record to compile 100 rushing yards and 100 receiving yards in the same game.
- $\sqrt{\text{Against the Bearcats, Reid rushed for 148 yards on 19 carries (7.8)}}$

- avg.) and caught six passes for 106 yards (17.7 avg.) and a TD. His historic performance helped the Panthers to a one-point victory after trailing 27-6 in the third quarter.
- √ In Pitt's 17-15 win over Cal (Oct. 12), Reid ran for both Pitt touchdowns—including a dazzling 72-yard sprint—and netted 120 yards on 16 carries (7.5 avg.).
- √ In Pitt's 34-24 win at North Carolina (Oct. 5), he posted game highs with 11 catches for 155 yards, including a two-yard TD reception. He rushed for 55 more, posting 210 all-purpose yards.
- $\sqrt{\text{In the Panthers'}}$ 24-20 loss to Clemson (Nov. 16). Reid had 10 catches for 108 yards (10.8 avg.).
- $\sqrt{\text{In his Pitt debut against Kent State (Aug. 31), Reid compiled 234}}$ all-purpose yards and scored two touchdowns, the first on a 78-yard punt return and the second on a 46-yard run.
- $\sqrt{\text{He}}$ averaged 10.4 yards per rush against the Golden Flashes, totaling 145 yards on 14 carries.

PASSING IMPROVEMENT

- $\sqrt{\text{Pitt's}}$ passing game made dramatic improvement last season. The Panthers averaged 277.8 yards per game through the air in the regular season, which ranked 15th nationally and third in the ACC.
- $\sqrt{\text{During the 2023 campaign, Pitt averaged just 216 passing yards}$ per contest. That passing average ranked 75th nationally (eighth in the ACC).

ELI'S DANDY DEBUT

- √ Redshirt freshman quarterback Eli Holstein established himself as one of college football's top newcomers in 2024 and was named a semifinalist for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award.
- $\sqrt{\text{On the season, Holstein completed 62\% of his passes (180 of 291)}}$ for 2,228 yards and 17 touchdowns with seven interceptions. He was also Pitt's second-leading rusher with 328 yards and three TDs on 81 carries (4.0 avg.).
- $\sqrt{\text{Holstein's 17 TD passes tied with Alex Van Pelt (1989)}}$ for the most by a Pitt freshman.
- $\sqrt{\text{Among all FBS freshmen, Holstein ranked third in passing yards}}$ per game (222.8 avg.) and total offense per game (255.6 avg.). He was fifth in touchdown passes (17).
- $\sqrt{\text{Among Power 4 freshmen, he ranked first in passing yards and total offense per game and third in TD passes.}$
- $\sqrt{\text{In leading the Panthers to a 7-0 record}}$, Holstein became the first Pitt quarterback to win his initial seven career starts since Dan Marino accomplished the feat over the 1979-80 seasons. Marino won his first nine starts spanning the 1979 (five) and 1980 (four) seasons.

MORE HOLSTEIN HIGHLIGHTS

- $\sqrt{\text{Holstein led Pitt past host North Carolina, 34-24, compiling 457}}$ yards in total offense and accounting for four touchdowns (Oct. 5).
- $\sqrt{\text{Holstein}}$ threw for a Pitt freshman-record 381 yards (25-of-42 passing) with three touchdowns and one interception. He also was the Panthers' leading rusher with 76 yards and a touchdown on 10 carries (7.6 avg.) against the Tar Heels.
- √ Holstein directed Pitt to a 73-17 demolition of Youngstown State (Sept. 21), compiling 340 yards in total offense and accounting for five touchdowns.
- √Through the air he completed 67% of his passes (16 of 24) for 247 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions. His TD passes covered six, 10 and 82 yards, the last marking Pitt's longest passing play since 2019.
- $\sqrt{\text{Holstein}}$ was also highly productive on the ground against YSU, rushing for 93 yards and two touchdowns on nine carries (10.3 avg.). His rushing yardage was the most by a Pitt quarterback since 2014.



- √ Against West Virginia (Sept. 14), Pitt trailed, 34-24, with less than five minutes remaining when Holstein led touchdown drives of 75 and 77 yards to give Pitt a stirring 38-34 win.
- √ He completed 70% of his passes (21 of 30) for 301 yards and three touchdowns against the Mountaineers. He also led Pitt with 59 rushing yards.
- √In Pitt's 28-27 win at Cincinnati (Sept. 7)—a game the Panthers trailed 27-6 late in the third period—Holstein threw for 302 yards and three touchdowns with an interception on 20-of-35 passing. He added 36 rushing yards.
- $\sqrt{\text{In his collegiate debut, a 55-24 win over Kent State (Aug. 31), Holstein completed 75% of his passes (30 of 40) for 336 yards with three touchdowns and an interception.$
