TOP OF THE ORDER

- Pitt travels to Chapel Hill, NC this weekend for a three-game set with the No. 2 ranked North Carolina Tar Heels.
- The Panther offense set the program record for home runs in a single season with 92 this year. They have driven in 170 runs via the long ball, hitting seven grand slams and nineteen three-run home runs this year. Pitt's previous home run mark was 79 in 2022.
- Lorenzo Carrier ranks fifth in the country in walks (50), fifth in OBP (.540), sixth in walks/game (1.09) and seventh in SLG (.821) while ranking seventeenth in RBI (61). He earned multiple midseason First Team All-America honors and was named to the Golden Spikes Award and Baseball America Player of the Year Midseason Watch Lists. Carrier was recently named as one of the nine semifinalists for the Tony Gwynn Community Service Trophy.
- The Oakland Lumber Company is open for business and Pitt's offense is one of the best in the country. They lead the nation in base on balls (322), rank fourth in OBP (.443), seventh in SLG (.557) and home runs per game (2.00), eighth in home runs (92) and scoring (9.0), tenth in runs scored (416) and sixteenth in batting average (.310).
- SS Caden Dulin was named as a semifinalist for the Brooks Wallace Award which is given to the nation's most outstanding shortstop. During ACC play, Dulin is hitting .425 with 45 hits, 24 RBI, 24 runs scored, seven home runs, seven doubles and 73 total bases.
- Pitt leads the entire country in walks this year with 322. OF Lorenzo Carrier's 50 lead the ACC and rank fifth in the nation. The program record for walks in a single season is 326, set in 2023.

Mike Bell enters his eighth season as head coach of the Pitt baseball program in 2026. Bell was hired in July of 2018, becoming the fifth head coach in Pitt baseball history.

During the Mike Bell Era, the Panthers have seen one All-American, six All-Region selections and 11 All-ACC honorees while 16 players have been drafted or signed by MLB organizations. Pitt has amassed 161 wins, with 34 of them coming against ranked opponents, as well as five postseason wins in their five postseason appearances. In 2021, Bell led the Panthers to their first national ranking since 2013. They reached the highest ranking in program history on March 22, 2021, when Baseball America ranked the Panthers as the 14th team in the country. Under Bell, the program has also had their two-best starts to a season in over twenty years. Pitt started the year 10-1 in 2020 and 8-1 in 2024.

Off the field, Pitt has elevated program standards in player development, recruiting, academics and community service with Bell at the helm. During the 2023 fall semester, Pitt earned a program record 3.30 team GPA while also earning their first ever perfect Academic Progress Rate score. Over the last five years, the program has seen 61 student-athletes earn a degree or certificate from the University of Pittsburgh. Pitt also worked a program-record 495 community service hours over the 2024-25 season and have averaged 420 hours per year over the past four seasons.

Pitt has had 12 players sign professional contracts over the last four seasons. Phil Fox and Ryan Andrade became the highest drafted Panthers under Bell when they were each selected in the seventh round of the 2024 MLB Draft. On the recruiting front, Bell and his staff have consistently pieced together talented rosters over the last seven seasons. Per 64Analytics, the Panthers landed a top-5 recruiting class in the ACC in 2025.

Growing the game of baseball, Bell's program has seen four former players prevail in the collegiate coaching ranks recently. Two of which are currently on Pitt's staff in Sky Duff (assistant coach) and Jack Anderson (Director of Baseball Operations). Former Panthers, Matt Gilbertson (pitching coach, UNC Asheville) and Bryce Hulett (assistant coach, State College of Florida) are both succeeding in the next stages of their careers as well.

The Panther baseball program notched another 20+ win campaign under Bell, winning 28 games and clinching a berth in the ACC Tournament for the fifth consecutive season in 2025. Prior to Bell's tenure, Pitt made the ACC tournament just once since joining the league.

Pitt lived up to their "Gritsburgh" slogan in 2025, winning nine games when they trailed in the fifth inning or later. The Panthers took late leads in four of their last five wins in 2025. Perhaps their signature win of the season came in the Backyard Brawl against No. 12 West Virginia. Trailing by four runs in the bottom of the ninth inning, the Panthers roared back to walk off the Moun-

taineers with five runs in the final frame.

LHP Ethan Firoved earned ABCA/Rawlings All-Region honors in 2025. Firoved was Pitt's go-to, high-leverage, arm out of the bullpen. He earned eight saves and three wins with a team-leading 75 strikeouts.

LHP Ryan Reed and 1B Luke Cantwell were each selected by the San Diego Padres in the 2025 MLB Draft. They became the first pair of Panther teammates to be drafted to the same team in the same draft since 2016. Selected in the 15th round (460 overall), Reed became the ninth pitcher that has been drafted since Bell arrived at Pitt in 2019. While Cantwell, selected in 20th round (610 overall), was Pitt's first position player drafted in three years.

Pitt saw an uptick in their offensive output in 2024 as they scored their most runs (382) and had their second-highest batting average (.282) since 2013. The Panthers would also claim the inaugural Las Vegas Baseball Classic in dominating fashion, scoring 38 runs over two games against Oklahoma and California. RHP Phil Fox earned All-America status in just his first year with the program, becoming Pitt's first All-American since 2016, and the first under Bell. Fox would also go on to earn All-Region and All-ACC honors for his performance on the mound as Pitt's closer. Fox (199th overall) and Ryan Andrade (216th overall) would each be selected in the seventh round of the 2024 MLB Draft in July becoming the highest draft picks of the Mike Bell Era. Jack Sokol signed as an undrafted free agent with the New York Yankees and became the 14th Panther to sign an MLB contract since 2019.

The 2023 season was highlighted with wins over multiple top-ranked programs, including Bell's 100th career win in a shutout over No. 2 Wake Forest. The Panthers would also take the series from No. 7 Virginia, snapping their program record 23-game home win streak. Pitt went on to make the ACC Tournament and take their opening round matchup against No. 8-seeded Notre Dame. Graduate student, Kyle Hess, garnered all-conference recognition for the first time in his illustrious Pitt career in 2023, being named a Third Team All-ACC outfielder. Bell and the Panthers would then watch as RHP Logan Evans (Seattle Mariners) and RHP Dylan Simmons (Cincinnati Reds) were selected minutes from each other in the 2023 MLB Draft.

Pitt continued the program's ascension under Bell in 2022, posting a winning record with 29 victories, which tied for the program's most since joining the conference in 2014. The Panthers recorded five ACC series victories, including triumphs over a pair of top-five ranked squads (Louisville and Clemson). Pitt advanced to the ACC Tournament semifinals for the first time since 2018, logging wins over No. 7-seeded Georgia Tech and No. 2-seeded Louisville. The Panthers ended the regular season with an RPI ranking of 69, the 37th-toughest strength of schedule, 12 wins against quadrant one teams and 10 wins against the NCAA Tournament field.

Pitt saw three Panthers sign MLB contracts following the 2022 season. Catcher Tate Levin was selected in the eighth round (246 overall) of the 2022 MLB Draft by the Seattle Mariners while right-handed pitchers Billy Corcoran (Arizona Diamondbacks) and Baron Stuart (New York Yankees) would sign undrafted free agent contracts following the draft. Starting pitchers Matt Gilbertson (Second Team) and

Billy Corcoran (Third Team) were named All-ACC selections in 2022, becoming the first tandem of Panther pitchers to earn All-ACC honors in the same season. Gilbertson would also be named to the 2022 ABCA/Rawlings East All-Region Second Team.

The 2021 campaign saw Bell direct Pitt to its most successful season in the ACC. The Panthers set program records for their highest ranking in the polls (No. 14 by Baseball America), consecutive weeks in the polls (nine), RPI (50) and strength of schedule (30). In ACC play, Pitt set program-bests in ACC series wins (six) and ACC victories (16). The Panthers went 18-12 against teams that made the NCAA Regionals, tied for the second-best record against such opponents in the nation. The Panthers won 17 times against quadrant one teams and became just the second team to sweep Florida State and Miami in the same season.

With Bell serving as the pitching coach for the first time since becoming head coach of the Panthers, Mitch Myers was selected in the 12th round of the MLB Draft with the 368th pick by the Oakland Athletics. Myers was one of a program-best four Panthers selected to the All-ACC Third Team, joining Sky Duff, Nico Papa and David Yanni. Duff earned a selection to the ABCA/Rawlings All-East Region Second Team. A member of the 2019 Second Team, Papa became the first Panther to earn All-ACC honors twice. The all-time leader in program history in games played, starts and walks, Yanni had his best season as a Panther in 2021.

In 2020, Bell guided Pitt to a 10-6 record before the season was cut short due to COVID-19. Revamping the roster with 21 newcomers, Bell led the Panthers to a 10-1 start to the year, tied for the second-best start through 11 games in program history. Pitt's offense played a huge part, ranking second in the nation in doubles per game (2.88), 37th in slugging percentage (.447) and 38th in scoring (7.3 runs per game).

Since 2005, Bell has helped lead three teams to four College World Series appearances - Tennessee (2005), Oklahoma (2010) and Florida State (2012 & 2017). He has coached nine first round draft picks, 36 Top-10 round picks, 94 overall Draft picks, 19 Major Leaguers, and helped guide 12 Top-25 recruiting classes. In 2012, he was named the Perfect Game Assistant Coach of the Year and was named the No. 13 recruiter in the country by D1Baseball.com prior to the 2017 season.

In five of his seven seasons, Florida State pitchers recorded 500 or more strikeouts, including a pair of top 10 seasons in 2017 (640, fifth-most) and 2018 (635, seventh-most). The Seminoles posted a 314-136-0 record in his tenure, reaching a Super Regional on three occasions and advancing to the College World Series twice. Florida State captured three ACC titles in Bell's time in Tallahassee, taking home conference tournament titles in 2015, '17 and '18.

Bell made stops at Oklahoma and Tennessee in his time prior to Florida State. In his first seven seasons at the Division I level, including four at Oklahoma and three at Tennessee, he helped recruit and develop 22 pitchers who were selected in the Major League Baseball draft. That includes three first-round selections - including 2006 No. 1 overall pick Luke Hochevar.

In four seasons at Oklahoma, Bell's pitching staffs established a number of new standards. His 2011 group posted a 3.00 ERA, which was the Sooners' lowest since 1978. Four of his hurlers earned All-Big 12

honors, including Second Team All-American Michael Rocha. The Sooners posted a 41-17 record and were ranked No. 15 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll. In 2010, his pitching staff was instrumental in leading OU back to the College World Series for the first time since 1995.

Beyond his Division I experience, he spent two seasons as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at Division II perennial power Florida Southern, where the Mocs twice finished in the top 20 nationally in ERA. He launched his coaching career in 2002 at Brandon High, where he led the team to a district title and a regional runner-up finish as the head coach, earning Hillsborough County Coach of the Year honors.

A left-handed pitcher and first baseman for the Seminoles, Bell reached the College World Series as a player at Florida State in both 1994 and '95. Bell posted a two-year record of 14-4 with a 3.00 ERA and was twice named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll. He earned a bachelor's degree in physical education at Florida State in 1996 and previously spent two seasons as a pitcher at Hernando Community College, where he was a two-time All-Suncoast Conference selection.

Selected in the 20th round of the 1995 draft by the Montreal Expos, Bell spent six years in the minors, including the final three with the Baltimore Orioles' organization where he reached the Double-A level.

Bell is married to the former Alicia Favarato, a Florida State graduate, and the couple has two children, daughter, Alexis, and son, Tyler.

COACHING STAFF



Luke Bonfield enters his first year as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the Pitt baseball program.

In addition to coordinating recruiting efforts, Bonfield will work with the program's outfielders while assisting in offensive game plans and strategies.

Prior to joining Pitt's staff, Bonfield spent six years with the University of Tennessee's baseball program.

He joined the Volunteers' staff as a student manager prior to the 2020 season after a productive collegiate career at the University of Arkansas and two years of professional baseball in independent leagues. Bonfield was promoted to Director of Player Development in September of 2021 and moved into a new role as the Director of Recruiting Operations following the 2024 season.

During his time at Tennessee, he helped the Volunteers make five NCAA Tournament appearances, five Super Regionals, three trips to the College World Series (2021, 2023, 2024) and captured the program's first national championship in 2024.

Tennessee would also combine for four SEC Titles in that timeframe while winning both the regular season and tournament crowns twice (2022 & 2024).

As an outfielder at Arkansas, Bonfield was a .287 career hitter, totaling 199 hits, 120 runs scored, 26 home runs and 139 RBIs during his four years in Fayetteville. The Skillman, New Jersey native helped lead the Razorbacks to the 2018 College World Series where the Hogs finished as the runner-up. As a senior that year, Bonfield hit .296 with 10 doubles, nine homers and 44 RBIs.

A top prospect coming out of high school, Bonfield played his prep baseball at IMG Academy in Florida and Immaculata High School in New Jersey. He was rated the 57th-best recruit in the nation by Perfect Game and was selected by the New York Mets in the 21st round of the 2014 MLB Draft.



Sky Duff enters his first year as an assistant coach for the Pitt baseball program.

Duff spent the entirety of his five-year collegiate career at Pitt, setting numerous school records and earning multiple individual and team awards. His name is littered throughout the Pitt baseball record book.

After his playing career concluded, Duff spent the 2024 season as Pitt's graduate manager where he worked with the program's hitters and infielders while assisting with the Panthers' in-game defensive alignments.

Pitt turned the most double plays in the ACC (42) in 2024 with the help of Duff. As for their success at the plate in 2024, the Panthers scored their most runs (382) and had their second-highest team batting average (.282) since 2013.

Duff would depart from Pitt after being named as an assistant coach at the University of Delaware for the 2025 season. In his first year with the program, he helped the Blue Hens to a 28-win season while two of his hitters went on to earn all-conference honors.

As a player, Duff is the Pitt baseball program's all-time leader in doubles (54) and walks (171). Additionally, he ranks second all-time in games played (213) and at-bats (794), third all-time in games started (207), fifth all-time in runs scored (163) and eighth all-time in hits (226).

Duff's 2021 campaign earned him ABCA All-Region and All-ACC honors, batting .366 with 60 hits, 18 doubles and a .985 OPS. In his final collegiate season in 2023, Duff started in all 55 of the Panthers' games, collecting 55 hits, 54 runs scored, 47 walks, 25 RBI, 15 doubles and five home runs.

The Shamong, NJ native played his high school ball at Bishop Eustace Prep in Pennsauken, NJ where he helped lead them to two conference championships.



Devin Mesoraco is entering his sixth season as a member of the Pitt baseball coaching staff and first as the program's director of player development.

Mesoraco joined the staff as a volunteer assistant in 2020 and was promoted to an assistant coach prior to the 2024 season.

Pitt's starting catcher, Jayden Melendez, improved both at the plate and behind it in his second year working with Mesoraco. He recorded career highs in hits (44), RBIs (44), runs scored (44), walks (38) and a team-leading 16 home runs. Behind the plate, Melendez would commit just three errors while his fielding percentage improved by nine points from the previous season.

Mesoraco mentored the catching tandem of Jayden Melendez and Johnny Long III in 2023. Melendez was one of five Panthers last year to hit double digit home runs (10), he drove in 22 runs, slugged .550 and had a .909 OPS in addition to that. Long III recorded 23 hits, scored 14 runs, had 12 RBI and hit two home runs in 2023 as well. The tandem each threw out seven would-be base stealers this past season and were a calming presence behind the plate for the Panther pitching staff.

In 2022, catcher Tatem Levins was selected in the eighth round (No. 246) of the 2022 MLB Draft by the Seattle Mariners. Levins started all 56 games for the Panthers, leading the squad in batting average (.321), slugging percentage (.613), OPS (1.048), hits (68), extra base hits (27), home runs (16) and total bases (130).

Mesoraco joined the Panthers after spending eight years as a catcher in the big leagues. He made his MLB debut with the Cincinnati Reds on Sept. 3, 2011 and spent nearly his entire career with the organization before ending it with the Mets in 2018. He was selected to the MLB All-Star Game in 2014 and finished that season with 25 home runs and 80 runs batted, leading all major league catchers in home runs and slugging percentage (.534). He wrapped up his professional tenure with a career-batting average of .232, 58 homers and 192 RBIs.

Selected by the Reds with the 15th overall pick of the 2007 MLB Draft, Mesoraco had a decorated prep career at nearby Punxsutawney Area High School. He set school records in walks, runs, hits, doubles, home runs and stolen bases. As a senior he led the Chucks to the PIAA Class AAA State Championship and was named the Pennsylvania Gatorade Player of the Year.

Mesoraco lives in Pittsburgh with his wife Kira and son Luke.



Clay Martin begins his first year as assistant coach and director of pitching development for the Pitt baseball program.

Martin spent the last three seasons as an assistant coach at Seton Hill where he was instrumental in the Griffins making three-consecutive NCAA Super Regional appearances and clinching a PSAC Championship in 2023. In that short time frame, Martin helped the Griffins accumulate 129 wins, including 18 postseason wins.

This past season, he led First Team All-American Ian Korn to earning multiple National Pitcher of the Year awards. Under the guidance of Martin, Korn earned three First Team All-America honors, was named the Atlantic Region Pitcher of the Year, the PSAC West Pitcher of the Year and was a first team All-PSAC West selection in 2025.

In his second year on staff, Seton Hill maintained a 3.70 ERA throughout the 2024 season which ranked fifth in the entire country. On the mound, the Griffins had one all-region and two all-conference selections. Right-hander Aidan Layton, who earned multiple all-region honors, was selected in the 17th round of the 2024 MLB Draft by Oakland.

The Griffins earned their first NCAA Super Regional berth in Martin's first year at Seton Hill. His pitching staff led the Griffins to a perfect conference tournament record as they clinched a PSAC Championship in 2023. Martin's staff had the second-best ERA (3.54) in the conference in fourth-best in the all of Division-II. He had four pitchers earn all-conference honors while three would go on to be named all-region selections as well.

Prior to Seton Hill, Martin was an Assistant Coach and Director of Baseball Development/Operations at Division-I Eastern Illinois for one season. Martin handled the player development efforts of the program with performed data aggregation, analysis and implementation with coaching staff and student-athletes.

After graduating from Washington & Jefferson University in 2019, Martin spent two seasons as the Pitching Coach/Recruiting Coordinator for the Westminster College baseball program. Martin served as a jack of all trades in his time with the Titans. He handled all recruiting efforts, managed the pitching staff and assisted with the catchers and infielders while also preparing and supervising the strength and conditioning program at Westminster.

Martin shined on the mound for four years at Washington & Jefferson where he left as one of the most accomplished relief pitchers in school history. He made 52 appearances throughout his career and currently holds school records for saves in a career (13) and saves in a single season (12). In his four years with the program, Martin was a two-time all-conference honorable mention while the Presidents won two PAC Championships, made two NCAA Division-III College World Series appearances and were the NCAA Division-III College World Series runner-up in 2017.
