## GORILLAS ON RADIO/TV

Gorilla fans can catch all of Pittsburg State's football games locally on KKOW Radio (860 AM) & Rock 107.1 FM with Eddie Lomshek (play-by-play) and former PSU defensive lineman B.J. Harris (color analyst) describing the action.

KKOW's pregame show begins two hours prior to kickoff (1st hour on 96.9 FM, remainder on 860 AM/107.1 FM) on home games and an hour prior to kickoff on all away games.

A detailed scoreboard show follows each contest. The Tim Beck Show also can be heard on KKOW each Monday night from 6:05 to 7 p.m. The show, presented by CDL Electric, is recorded live on location at Gusano's, 200 E. Centennial Drive, Pittsburg.

KSNF TV (Pittsburg cable channel 2) also hosts The Tim Beck Show on Sunday nights following the KSN Hometown News, with KSNF sports director Eric Knecht and Coach Beck recapping the week's Gorilla football action and previewing upcoming contests.

CAPSTV (Pittsburg cable channel 13) also tape delay broadcasts each Pitt State game, home and away, on Tuesday nights.

The Pittsburg State University football team, the No. 4 ranked team in NCAA Division II, will play host to MIAA rival Washburn University Saturday (Sept. 19).

Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. (CDT) at Brandenburg Field/Carnie Smith Stadium.

Pittsburg State, the winningest all-time NCAA Division II program, is off to a 2-0 start to the season after a 38-14 road win over Northeastern State University on Sept. 3 and a 56-28 home victory over Lindenwood University last Saturday (Sept. 12). The Gorillas climbed one spot to No. 4 in this week's AFCA/NCAA Division II Top 25 poll (for complete poll see page 4).

Washburn is 1-1 on the season. The Ichabods claimed a 34-14 home win over the University of Nebraska-Kearney in their last action on Sept. 10. Washburn dropped a 20-14 decision to Lindenwood in its season-opener at St. Charles, Mo., on Sept. 3.

## THE COACHES



**Tim Beck** is in his sixth season as head coach at Pitt State with a **49-14 (.778)** career record.

Beck led his alma mater (PSU, '88) to the 2011 NCAA Division II National Championship three seasons ago, earning national coach of the year honors from Liberty Mutual, the Don Hansen Football Committee and FieldTurf™.

Beck became the school's 14th all-time head football coach in December 2009, after serving for 23 seasons as an assistant coach for the Gorillas including 16 years as the team's offensive coordinator from 1994-2009.

In his first season leading the Gorillas, Beck guided Pitt State to a 6-6 record and a victory in the 2010 Mineral Water Bowl. In 2011, Beck led the Gorillas to the program's second NCAA national championship and the school's fourth national title overall in a 13-1 campaign. Pitt State captured the MIAA Championship and ultimately the NCAA-II National Championship with a 35-21 victory over Wayne (Mich.) State on Dec. 17, 2011.

In 2012, the Gorillas opened the season 5-0 before finishing the year 7-3 overall, while in 2013 Pitt State posted the program's 20th all-time 10-win season during a 10-2 campaign.

Last year, the Gorillas shared the MIAA regular season title and advanced to the second round of the NCAA-II playoffs during an 11-2 campaign.

During his 16 seasons as offensive coordinator, the Gorilla offense consistently ranked among the finest units in NCAA Division II.

In 2008, Beck was selected the inaugural NCAA Division II Coordinator of the Year by *FootballScoop.com*, following a vote of his coaching peers.

In 2004, Beck's offensive unit established itself as the most prolific squad in the history of NCAA football. PSU shattered a 118-year-old scoring record, scoring an amazing 837 points (55.8 ppg). His squad also set the NCAA all division records for rushing (5,320 yards) and total offense (8,976 yards).

Beck's teams led Division II in scoring in two of the last six years (2004, 2006) and ranked in the top two nationally in total offense three times in the last six seasons (2004, 2005, 2006). His squads ranked among the national rushing leaders every season, leading Division II in 1995 (318.8 ypg) and 2004 (354.7 ypg). Beck's "multiple choice" option attack also compiled 16,483 passing yards (216.9 ypg) and 143 aerial touchdowns during the last six years.

Pitt State averaged a staggering 38.8 points and 442.5 yards of total offense per game during his tenure as offensive coordinator.

Prior to assuming the offensive coordinator's role, Beck served two years as Pitt State's defensive coordinator (1992-93). He became a full-time assistant on the Pitt State staff in 1989, after serving first as a student assistant (1987) and then as a graduate assistant (1988).

This will be Beck's fifth meeting vs. the Ichabods. He is 2-2 vs. Washburn.

**Craig Schurig** is in his 14th season directing the Ichabods program and his 14th year as a collegiate coach. Schurig (Colorado Mines, '87), who became head coach at Washburn in 2002 after eight seasons as an assistant at Pitt State (1994-2001), has a **92-59-0 (.609)** record leading the Ichabods. He is 5-7 all-time vs. Pitt State, including a 2-4 mark in Pittsburg.

## THE PITT STATE-WASHBURN SERIES

This will be the 86th all-time meeting between the Gorillas and the Ichabods in a series that dates all the way back to the 1921 season.

The two teams met annually from 1941-2011, but did not face one another in 2012-13 thanks to an unbalanced MIAA schedule.

Pitt State holds a commanding **62-22-1** advantage in the series. The Gorillas are 31-9-1 vs. the Ichabods in Pittsburg all-time, including a 17-2 mark in the last 19 meetings in Pittsburg dating back to the 1979 season.

Last year, the Gorillas blanked the Ichabods, 42-0, at Topeka on Sept. 20, 2014.

In that game, eighth-ranked Pitt State rushed out to a 35-0 lead, rode out a 75-minute weather delay and coasted to a 42-0 win over WU.

Senior quarterback **Anthony Abenoja** completed 19 of 33 passes for 330 yards and four touchdowns in the contest, while junior running back **Jeff Seybold, Jr.** carried the ball 17 times for 122 yards and a score.

## GORILLAS IN "THE PITT"

Pitt State holds a **341-122-12 (.731)** record in 475 games inside Carnie Smith Stadium (including postseason). The Gorillas have won 140 of their last 157 regular season home games, posting a **141-16-1 (.896)** record over the last 31 seasons.

Washburn is **1-7 (.125)** in its last eight road games dating back to the 2013 season.

## PSU'S REGULAR SEASON SUCCESS

Pitt State has won 277 of its last 326 regular season games, posting a phenomenal **277-47-2 (.853)** mark during the past 31 seasons (1985-2015). PSU is **150-16-1** at home, **123-22-1** on the road and **4-9-0** at neutral sites in the regular season during that span.

## PITT STATE IN THE AFCA TOP 25 POLL

Pitt State has been ranked in Division II's top 10 **116 times** in the last **205 polls** and the Gorillas have been ranked in the top 25 poll in **179 of 205** weeks overall (dating back to the 1999 season). [for complete poll, see page 5]

## ALL-TIME WINNINGEST PROGRAMS

Pittsburg State is the all-time winningest NCAA Division II football program. The Gorillas, who are in their 108th season of intercollegiate competition, have compiled a **686-333-48 overall record**, winning 66.5 percent of their 1,067 all-time games.

Pittsburg State is one of just 17 NCAA Division II institutions to have recorded 500 all-time victories and the Gorillas are just one of five schools to have reached the 600-win plateau.

### QUICK STRIKE OFFENSE

The Pitt State offense has exhibited a penchant for being a "quick strike" unit.

During the last 11 seasons (2005-15), the Pitt State offense has generated 698 scoring drives (587 TDs, 111 FGs) and averaged just 2:51 of elapsed time per drive. [Overtime scoring drives not included in elapsed time figures.]

The Gorillas have been highly successful when they are quick out of the gates. Pitt State has scored on its opening drive 61 times (51 TDs, 10 FGs) in the last 123 games, posting a **58-3 (.951)** record in those games. By contrast, Pitt State is **34-28 (.548)** in games it doesn't score on its opening drive during the same span.

### RODERIQUE FOLLOWS UP DEBUT WITH SECOND BIG GAME



Freshman quarterback **John Roderique, Jr.** followed up a solid outing in his collegiate debut on Sept. 3 with a second strong showing against Lindenwood last Saturday.

The Webb City, Mo., native completed 19 of 21 passes for 204 yards and three touchdowns against the Lions, while rushing 12 times for a game-high 84 yards and two scores.

In two games, he is averaging 8.3 yards per carry and 87.5 yards per game on the ground with 21 rushes for a team-leading 175 yards and five touchdowns. He's the third-leading rusher in the MIAA to date.

Roderique also has completed 78.4 percent of his passes with three TDs and no INTs, going 29 of 37 for 326 yards. He leads NCAA Division II in completion percentage and ranks second in the MIAA and 12th nationally in passing efficiency (179.1 rating).

He also leads the MIAA and ranks in a tie for fifth place nationally in scoring (15.0 ppg).

Copelin blocked and recovered a pair of second quarter Lindenwood punts, helping the Gorillas explode for 35 points in the stanza en route to a 56-28 victory over the visiting Lions.

He blocked the first LWU punt and recovered it at the Lions 2 yard line to help the Gorillas break a 14-14 tie. Later in the period, he blocked another attempt and ran the ball in from 16 yards out for a 35-14 lead with 1:53 to play in the first half.

Pitt State junior transfer cornerback **Darnell Walker, Jr.** raised his season interception total to three with two picks against Lindenwood last Saturday.

Walker halted a pair of Lions drives in the fourth quarter as the Gorillas defense made three interceptions overall in the contest.

The Lawrenceville, Ga., native returned one INT 54 yards to set up the Gorillas' final score of the game. For the season he has eight tackles with the three INTs and two PBUs.

Walker transferred to Pitt State from Coffeyville Community College after playing two seasons at the University of Tulsa.

He now has 13 career interceptions – four at Tulsa in 2013, six at Coffeyville in 2014 and three this season.

# GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

## Pittsburg State 38, Northeastern State 14

TAHLEQUAH, Okla. — Seventh-ranked Pittsburg State University scored on each of its first two offensive plays and jumped out to a quick 21-0 lead over Northeastern State University, before settling for a 38-14 season opening victory Thursday (Sept. 3).

Freshman transfer quarterback John Roderique, Jr. scored on a 39-yard touchdown scamper on the first play of the game. Marquise Cushon set up the play with a 47-yard kickoff return into RiverHawk territory.

After a quick three-and-out by the Pitt State defense, Cushon popped a 38-yard punt return and an NSU personal foul — one of several in the contest — set up the Gorillas at the NSU 36. Roderique again broke loose on a zone option play to make it a 14-0 game 60 seconds into the contest.

Michael Rose added a seven-yard touchdown run for a 21-0 Pitt State advantage with 5:40 to play in the opening period. NSU countered with a 47-yard touchdown pass from Kevin Pantastico to running back Joel Rockmore two minutes later.

The RiverHawks got the ball back and had a chance to slice further into the Pitt State lead, but the Gorillas' Dino Teague intercepted Pantastico in the end zone to halt the threat.

Roderique led the Gorillas 92 yards in seven plays late in the first half, punctuating the drive with a five-yard touchdown run for a 28-7 halftime advantage.

Rose, who rushed for a game-high 127 yards, added a second score — on a 23-yard jaunt — late in the third quarter for the Gorillas and Chad Levin booted a 26-yard field goal with 10:39 to play for the game's final points.

Roderique rushed for 91 net yards — he was sacked three times in the game. He also completed 10 of 16 passes for 122 yards. Levi Copelin caught four passes for a team-leading 51 yards.

Pantastico was 20 of 44 passing for 275 yards and two touchdowns with two interceptions for NSU, which dropped its 12th straight game dating back to 2014. Rockmore carried the ball 17 times for 92 yards.

Spencer Brown made a team-leading six tackles and the Gorilla defense registered five quarterback sacks in the contest.

## Pittsburg State 56, Lindenwood 28

PITTSBURG — Fifth-ranked Pittsburg State University blocked a pair of punts during a 35-point second quarter outburst, including one the Gorillas returned for a touchdown. The scoring frenzy helped Pitt State turn a 14-7 deficit into a 42-14 advantage as the Gorillas pulled away for a 56-28 victory over Lindenwood University before a sellout crowd of 10,362 fans at Brandenburg Field/Carnie Smith Stadium.

Freshman quarterback John Roderique, Jr. completed 19 of 21 passes for 204 yards and three touchdowns and he rushed the ball 12 times for a game-high 84 yards and two more scores leading the Gorillas offense to 429 total yards in the contest.

Roderique scored on runs of 26 yards in the first quarter and one yard in the second quarter. He added TD passes of 23 yards to sophomore running back Michael Rose and five yards to senior tight end Kyle Swartz in the second period as well as a 19-yard TD toss to senior running back Jeff Seybold, Jr. in the third quarter.

Junior Levi Copelin blocked a Lindenwood punt, recovered the ball and scored from 16 yards out to give Pitt State a 35-14 lead with 1:53 to play in the second quarter. He also blocked and recovered a punt at the LWU 2 yard line earlier in the period to set up another score.

Rose added a 17-yard touchdown run with 6:21 to play in the game.

Junior cornerback Darnell Walker, Jr. recorded a pair of second-half interceptions. The Gorillas secondary registered three picks and deflected 12 passes in the game.

Lindenwood quarterback Jesse Scroggins completed 17 of 38 passes for 235 yards with one touchdown and one interception, while Lions back-up Mason Bendigo went 4 of 9 for 51 yards with two interceptions.

Four players — junior safeties Devron Moore and Deron Washington, senior linebacker Colby Hall and junior linebacker Spencer Brown — each made a team-leading nine tackles for the Gorillas. Drew White made two of the Gorillas' four quarterback sacks.
