The Pittsburg State University men's basketball team will wrap up a three-game homestand Saturday (Jan. 16) when the Gorillas play host to MIAA rival Missouri Southern State University. Tipoff is set for 3:30 p.m. (CST) at John Lance Arena.

### THE RECORDS

Pitt State is 8-8 overall and 3-7 in MIAA play. The Gorillas split a pair of home games last week, posting an 80-69 win over the University of Central Missouri on Jan. 7 before dropping an 83-71 decision to Southwest Baptist University last Saturday (Jan. 9).

The Gorillas, who have slid into a tie for 13th place in the MIAA standings, snapped a six-game losing streak with the victory over the Mules.

Missouri Southern is 10-6 overall, 7-3 in the MIAA and positioned in a three-way tie for first place in the conference standings (along with Lindenwood and Northwest Missouri).

The Lions enter Saturday's action on a two-game winning streak. MSSU defeated SBU, 80-63, at Joplin, Mo., on Jan. 7 and UCM, 100-89, at the Leggett & Platt Athletic Center two days later.

### HEAD COACH KEVIN MUFF

Pittsburg State's **Kevin Muff** is in his sixth season leading the Gorillas. Muff (Kansas State, '86) became the Gorillas' 14th all-time head coach on Apr. 5, 2010, after spending 12 seasons at Cloud County Community College, where he helped the Thunderbirds to an average of 21 wins in each of the last five seasons. He has an **84-75 (.528)** record in his tenure with the Gorillas.

Muff was named the 2015 MIAA Co-Coach of the Year after leading the Gorillas to a 16-11 regular season record and a tie for third-place in the MIAA standings. Pitt State was picked to finish 10th in the 14-team league in the MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll after posting an 8-18 (4-15 MIAA) mark the previous season.

He then guided the Gorillas to a perfect 4-0 record in the MIAA Postseason Tournament, helping the Gorillas become the first No. 5 seed to claim the championship. Pitt State earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Division II National Tournament and finished the 2014-15 campaign with a 20-12 overall record.

Saturday's action will be Muff's 10th match-up against MSSU. He has a 4-5 record against the Lions.

### SERIES HISTORY

Pitt State and MSSU will meet for the 96th time Saturday in a series that dates all the way back to the 1969 season – MSSU's first year as a four-year college. The Lions hold a slight **50-45** edge in the series, but the Gorillas are **30-16** against MSSU in Pittsburg.

The two teams split a pair of match-ups last season. The Lions claimed a 66-63 regular season victory at John Lance Arena on Feb. 21, 2015.

Pitt State and Southern met again in the Finals of the 2014-15 MIAA Postseason Tournament and the Gorillas cut down the nets at Municipal Auditorium in Kansas City, Mo., on Mar. 8, 2015, with a 91-65 victory over the Lions.

Trey Starks scored a game-high 24 points in the contest and secured Tournament MVP honors following the win over Southern helping Pitt State earn an automatic qualifying berth to the NCAA-II National Tournament and secure the program's 11th 20-win season.

## GORILLAS AT HOME

Pitt State has compiled a **387-182 (.680)** record in 569 career games played at John Lance Arena (1970-present).

The Gorillas have posted a **207-72 (.742)** record on their home floor during the past 21 seasons (1997-2016), including a school record 40 straight home wins between Jan. 10, 1997 and Feb. 22, 1999. Pitt State is **49-24 (.671)** at home during the past six seasons under Coach Muff.

All told, the Gorillas have compiled an **831-343 (.708)** all-time home record, winning 70.8 percent of their 1,174 home games.

## SCOUTING THE GORILLAS

The Gorillas have three players averaging in double figures on the season: junior guard **Josiah Gustafson** (15.4 ppg), senior guard **Trey Starks** (13.7 ppg) and sophomore guard **Dakota Jones** (10.7 ppg).

Gustafson (6-6, 180) is averaging a team-leading 15.4 points per game thus far. The Omaha, Neb., native has converted 82 of 171 shots (.480) from the field, 34 of 70 3-point field goals (.486) and 49 of 56 free throws (.875) in 32.2 minutes of action per game. He also is averaging a team-leading 5.3 rebounds as well as 1.4 assists per game.

Gustafson ranks 11th in the MIAA in scoring. He ranks second the MIAA in 3-point field goal percentage and third in the league in free throw percentage.

Gustafson made 38 consecutive free throws between Nov. 14 and Jan. 2.

He scored a career-high 34 points in the Gorillas' 100-97 victory over William Jewell on Nov. 19. He was named the MIAA Player of the Week on Nov. 30, after averaging 21.0 points and 6.0 rebounds per game in a pair of victories at Denver, Colo., against Regis and Metro State.

Gustafson started all 32 games as a sophomore in 2014-15 in the Pitt State program, averaging 15.5 points per game. He ranked eighth in the MIAA in scoring and fifth in the league in free throw percentage (.838, 124-148).

For his career, Gustafson has scored 953 points in 74 games, averaging 12.9 points per game.

Starks (6-0, 190) is averaging 13.7 points, 2.9 rebounds and 2.8 assists per game on the year.

The Springfield, Mo., native is shooting 46.4 percent from the field (65-of-140) and he's made 66 of 82 free throw attempts (.805) on the season.

He matched his career high with 24 points in the Gorillas' 80-62 road win over Regis on Nov. 27.

Starks averaged 12.3 points in Pitt State's final 12 games in 2014-15, after taking the court for the first time with the Gorillas on Feb. 7.

He scored a season-high 24 points in the finals of the MIAA Tournament against Missouri Southern (Mar. 8) to help the Gorillas claim the tournament title. Starks was named the MIAA Tournament Most Valuable Player, averaging 15.3 points per game in Pitt State's four victories.

Jones is averaging 10.7 points and 1.8 assists per game. The Warrensburg, Mo., native is shooting 43.9 percent from the field (54-of-123), including 47.3 percent from 3-point range (26-of-55). He's also converted 37 of 44 free throws (.841) on the season.

Jones tallied a career-high 23 points vs. Northeastern State on Dec. 2. He also scored 23 points and converted five of seven 3-point field goals against Missouri Western on Dec. 10. Jones ranks sixth in the MIAA in free throw percentage. He would rank third in the league in 3-point field goal percentage but does not meet the 2.0 per game minimum of makes to qualify for a ranking.

Additionally, four Pitt State players are averaging between 5.4 and 9.1 points on the year: senior forward **Lamine Dieng** (9.1 ppg), senior guard **Javis Flynn** (8.9 ppg), sophomore guard **Jaxon Holden** (7.5 ppg) and freshman guard **Chris Owens** (5.4 ppg).

Dieng is averaging 9.1 points and 4.9 rebounds per game on the season, while shooting a team-high 58.6 percent from the field (65-of-111).

The Thies, Senegal native logged his first career double-double with 19 points and 13 rebounds against Newman on Nov. 17. He also scored 18 points in the road win against Regis on Nov. 27.

Flynn is averaging 8.9 points, an MIAA-leading 5.3 assists as well as 2.0 steals per game. The Watonga, Okla., native scored a career-high 19 points in the Gorillas' win vs. William Jewell (Nov. 19) and matched that total against Fort Hays State (Jan. 2). He dished out 10 helpers in the win vs. St. Cloud State (Nov. 14); and he currently ranks second in the MIAA in steals.

Flynn led the MIAA in assists and steals last season. He also converted 17 of 45 3-point field goal attempts (.378) on the year.

His 76 steals and his 160 assists both ranked as the second highest single season totals in school history. Flynn set the Pitt State single game assist record with 12 helpers vs. Emporia State on Jan. 14. He twice made a season-high seven steals, including vs. Minnesota State-Moorhead in the NCAA Division II National Tournament.

Holden (6-1, 185) scored 19 points in his Pitt State debut on Nov. 13 vs. Minnesota State. The Flower Mound, Texas native is averaging 7.5 points on the season. He suffered a concussion five minutes into the Newman game on Nov. 17. He missed five games, before returning to the lineup in a reserve role vs. Missouri Western on Dec. 10.

Holden came to Pitt State after one season at Stephen F. Austin University where he played in 17 games for the Lumberjacks as a freshman in 2014-15 and helped SFA to a 29-5 record and a trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Owens (6-4, 180) is averaging 5.4 points and 2.5 rebounds per game in 15.3 minutes of action. The Springdale, Ark., native scored 10 points and pulled down a season-high nine rebounds against Metro State on Nov. 28. He scored a season-high 15 points against William Jewell (Nov. 19).

As a team, the Gorillas are averaging 75.9 points per game and shooting 48.1 percent from the field (403-of-838). Pitt State also is shooting 39.6 percent from 3-point range (105-of-265) and 74.1 percent from the free throw line (304-of-410). The Gorillas are +1.2 in the rebounding margin department.

Defensively, Pitt State is allowing 77.2 points per game while its opponents are shooting 49.0 percent from the field (424-of-866), 43.0 percent from 3-point range (128-of-298) and 72.0 percent from the free throw line (260-of-361).

Pitt State ranks fourth in the MIAA in field goal percentage, but the squad is 13th in the league in field goal percentage defense. The Gorillas are third in the league in 3-point field goal percentage.

## Kevin Muff, Head Coach

Kevin Muff is in his sixth year as head basketball coach at Pittsburg State University after being hired to the position on April 5, 2010.

Muff has compiled an 84-75 (.528) record in five seasons at Pitt State. He led the Gorillas to an 18-10 record – the squad's highest win total since the 2006-07 campaign – and an appearance in the second round of the MIAA Postseason Tournament in 2013. Muff guided the Gorillas to a 17-14 record and a berth in the finals of the MIAA Postseason Tournament in 2012. He was named the 2015 MIAA Co-Coach of the Year after leading the Gorillas to a 16-11 regular season mark and a third-place tie in the MIAA standings. Muff led Pitt State to the program's first MIAA Tournament Championship with a 91-65 victory over Missouri Southern on Mar. 8, 2015 and the program's 11th all-time 20-win season.

Muff, 51, a former assistant coach at Pitt State from 1990-93, returned to campus after serving for 12 seasons as head coach at Cloud County Community College in Concordia, Kan., where he averaged 21 wins per season over his last five years at the school.

Prior to his assignment at Cloud County, Muff coached five seasons at Wamego High School, leading the school to a Kansas Class 4A state runner-up finish in 1998. He was named the Flint Hills Area Coach of the Year during the 1997-98 season.

He served as the top assistant at Pittsburg State from 1991 to 1993 under former head coach Dennis Hill, after serving as a graduate assistant for the Gorillas in 1990. Muff helped the Gorillas post a 21-8 record during the 1991-92 campaign – the school's first 20-win season in two decades. That Pitt State squad rose to a top 10 national ranking and the Gorillas upset No. 1 ranked Washburn, 72-71, before a school record crowd of 5,000 fans at John Lance Arena on Jan. 18, 1992.

Pitt State narrowly missed the NCAA Division II National Tournament that year – at the time only four teams in each region qualified for the postseason and the Gorillas finished the season ranked fifth in the South Central Region.

Prior to joining the Pitt State staff, Muff served as an assistant basketball coach at Atwood High School from 1987-90. He served as a student assistant coach at Kansas State University under former Wildcats head coach Lon Kruger during the 1986-87 season.

Muff, a member of the Kansas Basketball Coaches Association, served as the president of the Kansas Jayhawk Conference Basketball Coaches Association from 2004-2009. He was extremely active in the community of Concordia, Kan., serving as a volunteer coach for Concordia Youth Basketball and a volunteer for "Big Brothers/Big Sisters" of Cloud County. Muff also served as a lector at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Catholic Church.

Muff, a Salina, Kan., native, was a two-year basketball letterman at Kansas State during the 1984-85 and 1985-86 seasons. He transferred to K-State after playing two seasons at Cloud County Community College, where he was a first-team NJCAA All-Region VI selection as a sophomore in 1983-84. Muff was both a McDonalds and Converse High School All-America selection as a senior during the 1981-82 season at Salina Central High School.

Muff earned a bachelor's of science degree in education (BSed) in social science from Kansas State University in 1986 and a master's of science degree (MS) in physical education from Pittsburg State University in 1991.

He is married to the former Kim Kidd. Kevin and Kim have three daughters: Alex (23), Skyler (21) and Taylor (15).

**Javis Flynn • 5-10 • 170 • SR • G**  
**Watonga, Okla.**

**General:** Second-year player... one of the premiere point guards in the MIAA and the Central Region of NCAA Division II... expected to have a big senior season for the Gorillas.

**In 2014-15:** Started 31 of 32 games... averaged 6.1 points and 3.7 rebounds per game... dished out 160 assists (5.0 apg) — the second-highest single season total in school history... made a team-leading 76 steals (2.4 spg), also the second-highest single season mark in Pitt State history... led the MIAA in both assists and steals... set the school single game assist record with 12 helpers vs. Emporia State (Jan. 14)... scored in double figures six times with a season-high 17 points vs. Northeastern State (Jan. 28)... scored 11 points, including the game-winning basket in the waning seconds, vs. Missouri Western (Jan. 10)... twice made seven steals, including vs. MSU Moorhead in the NCAA-II Tournament (Mar. 14).

**In Junior College:** A second-team Jayhawk Conference West selection as a sophomore at Pratt Community College in 2014... averaged eight points, four rebounds and nine assists per game for the Beavers.

**In High School:** A first-team All-District performer as a senior at Watonga High School as a senior in 2012... averaged 20 points, five rebounds and seven assists per game... also an All-State performer in football.

**Personal:** Son of Bege Holdge... a physical education major.

**Omaha, Neb.**

**General:** Third-year player... one of the premiere players in the MIAA and the Central Region of NCAA Division II... a returning first-team All-MIAA performer... a versatile athlete who is poised for another big season for the Gorillas this winter... has scored 706 points in 58 career games (12.2 ppg).

**In 2014-15:** Started all 32 games... averaged 15.5 points and 3.6 rebounds per game... shot 46.4 percent from the field (162-349), including 42.5 percent from 3-point range (48-113)... also shot 83.8 percent from the free throw line (124-148)... ranked eighth in the MIAA in scoring and fifth in the conference in free throw percentage... scored in double figures 26 times, including 10 games with 20 or more points... scored a career-high 26 points in the season opener vs. Augustana (Nov. 15)... also had a season-best eight rebounds vs. Central Oklahoma (Jan. 31).

**In 2013-14:** Started 16 of 26 games played... averaged 8.1 points and 3.0 rebounds per game... shot 80.6 percent from the free throw line (54 of 67)... scored in double figures 10 times, including a season-high 16 points vs. Northwest Missouri (Dec. 5)... recorded a season-best five rebounds on five occasions.

**In High School:** A three-year starter and four-year letterman at Omaha's Millard North High School... earned Gatorade Nebraska Player of the Year honors averaging 22 points, eight rebounds and four assists per contest... also was selected first-team All-Super State.

## Gustafson Leads Pitt State to 72-61 Win Over Metro State

DENVER — Josiah Gustafson scored 21 of his game-high 23 points in the second half as the Pittsburg State University men's basketball team pulled away in the second half for a 72-61 victory over Metro State University Saturday (Nov. 28) at the Auraria Event Center.

The Gorillas (5-1) erupted for 48 second-half points against the Roadrunners (2-4) after trailing 25-24 at halftime.

Pitt State led 40-37, with 10:06 to play in the game, before the Gorillas used a 12-5 run to gain separation. Gustafson scored seven points in the run and Dakota Jones capped the streak with a 3-pointer for a 52-42 lead with 4:49 remaining.

Metro never got closer than seven points down the stretch.

Gustafson hit consecutive 3-pointers at the 1:31 mark and the 0:52 mark to turn a 60-53 lead into a 66-53 margin.

Jones finished in double figures with 14 points for the Gorillas, while Chris Owens added 10 points and a game-high nine rebounds.

Pitt State shot 58.3 percent from the field in the second half, converting 14 of 24 shots. The Gorillas also made all 14 free throw attempts in the second period, finishing the game 20 of 23 from the charity stripe.

The Roadrunners got 10 points apiece from DeShawn Phenix and Tony Dobbinson.

Metro built a 10-2 lead out of the gates in a first-half where points were hard to come by.

The Gorillas, who finally got on the scoreboard with a pair of free throws by Trey Starks at the 16:31 mark of the first period, chipped away at the Roadrunners as both teams shot 37% or lower from the field in the opening 20 minutes.

Pitt State got within a point, 14-13, on two free throws by Gustafson. Metro countered with a 5-0 run to extend its margin to six, 19-13. The Roadrunners still led 23-18 on Dobbinson's jumper with 6:33 remaining in the first period, but MSU didn't score again until converting a Dobbinson layup with 1:33 to go.

The Gorillas chipped away with Trevor Gregory's layup tying the score at 23-23 with 2:37 to play in the opening stanza.

## Gorillas Exploit RiverHawks Record-Breaking Charity in 106-99 Win

PITTSBURG — The Pittsburg State University men's basketball team set school and MIAA records for free throws made and attempted as the Gorillas claimed a 106-99 victory over Northeastern State University in the conference opener for both schools Wednesday (Dec. 2) at John Lance Arena.

The Gorillas (6-1, 1-0 MIAA) generated 48 points at the free throw line, converting 48 of 63 attempts in a game slowed by 64 combined personal fouls. Pitt State also shot 57.8 percent from the field against the RiverHawks (1-4, 0-1 MIAA) as six Gorilla players scored in double figures.

Dakota Jones led Pitt State with a career-high 23 points. He was 5-for-9 from the field, including a perfect 2-for-2 from 3-point range and 11-for-11 from the foul line. Javis Flynn and Josiah Gustafson added 19 points apiece with Flynn making 13 of 17 free throws. Gustafson scored 17 of his points in the first half, including back-to-back 3-pointers in a 32-second flurry that turned a tenuous 2-point lead into an eight-point margin late in the opening stanza.

Trey Starks added 16 points, while Lamine Dieng chipped in with 13 and Chris Owens finished with 11.

Dakota Caudill had a team-leading 19 points for the RiverHawks, who shot 50 percent from the floor in the game (34 of 68) and made 22 of 29 free throws. He posted a double-double with a game-high 11 rebounds as well. Trey Mohair added 17 points and eight assists.

Both Pitt State and NSU turned the ball over 20 times in the contest. The RiverHawks committed 39 personal fouls with 10 players being charged with three or more infractions. The Gorillas were whistled for 25 fouls.

Pitt State bested the previous MIAA records for free throws made (46) and attempted (60) set by former conference member Missouri State University 60 years ago. The Bears set those marks on Jan. 11, 1955, in a game against Northwest Missouri State University.

The previous Pitt State record for free throws made was 41 against Southwest Baptist University on Feb. 19, 2005, while the Gorillas twice attempted 55 free throws – against the University of Central Arkansas on Nov. 21, 1998, and against Emporia State University on Feb. 4, 2002.

ST. JOSEPH, Mo. — The Pittsburg State men's basketball team dug itself another double-digit first-half deficit but this time the No. 25 Gorillas couldn't quite complete the comeback.

Missouri Western's Currie Byrd hit a pair of critical 3-pointers in the game's final 1:47 after the Gorillas had battled back to tie the score and the Griffons pulled out a 69-66 victory Thursday (Dec. 10) at the MWSU Fieldhouse.

The loss snapped a five-game winning streak for Pitt State (7-2, 2-1 MIAA) as the Gorillas fell from a tie atop the conference standings. MWSU improved to 3-6 overall and 1-2 in the MIAA.

Trey Sampson made three of four free throws in the final 21 seconds, but his miss with 7.2 seconds to play left the door open for Pitt State to force overtime. Josiah Gustafson rebounded Sampson's miss and rushed the ball upcourt. He found Jaxon Holden at the top of the key but his 25-footer missed at the buzzer.

Dakota Jones matched his career high with 23 points on the night, including five of Pitt State's 11 3-pointers in the contest. The Gorillas made 62.5 percent of their shots in the second half, making 15 of 24 shots after struggling through a tepid first half shooting slump (7-22, .318).

The Griffons outscored the Gorillas, 17-11, at the foul line. Pitt State converted just 50 percent of its charity shots, making 11 of 22 attempts, while MWSU made 17 of 21 (.810) free throws.

Holden, returning to the Pitt State lineup after missing five games with a concussion, scored 11 points, while Trey Starks chipped in with 10

Byrd had a team-leading 16 points to pace the Griffons, while Cole Clearman added 15 points.

The visiting Bearcats (8-8, 3-5 MIAA) led 38-36 at halftime against the Gorillas (8-8, 3-7 MIAA), but SBU scored 15 of the first 22 points in the second half to build a nine-point margin, 53-44, with 14:15 remaining in the game. Pitt State could never get any closer than seven points of the Bearcats the rest of the way.

Josiah Gustafson had a game-high 19 points and nine rebounds to lead the Gorillas, while Lamine Dieng (14), Trey Starks (14) and Javis Flynn (13) also scored in double figures.
