The Tim Beck Show also can be heard on ESPN 100.7 each Monday night from 6 to 7 p.m. The show, presented by CDL Electric, is recorded live on location at Two Brothers Mining Company Restaurant within the Kansas Crossing Casino.

KSNF TV (Pittsburg cable channel 2) also hosts The Tim Beck Show on Sunday nights following the KSN Hometown News, with KSNF sports director Eric Knecht and Coach Beck recapping the week's Gorilla football action and previewing upcoming contests.

The Pittsburg State University football team will seek its ninth consecutive victory dating back to the 2017 season Saturday (Sept. 15) when the Gorillas travel to Tahlequah, Okla., to face MIAA rival Northeastern State University.

Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. (CDT) at Doc Wadley Stadium.

Pittsburg State, the winningest all-time NCAA Division II program, has accumulated 707 victories, posting a **707-346-48** overall mark in 111 years of intercollegiate play.

The Gorillas opened the 2018 season with a 21-7 win over the University of Central Oklahoma on Aug. 30 at Brandenburg Field/Carnie Smith Stadium. Pitt State followed that up with a 34-13 road win over Emporia State University on Sept. 6.

The Gorillas posted an 8-4 record in 2017 with six straight victories to end the year including a 48-31 win in the Agent Barry Live United Bowl over Arkansas Tech University in the season finale.

Northeastern State is 0-2 on the young season. The RiverHawks dropped a 34-7 decision to Emporia State in their home opener on Aug. 30 and NSU fell, 62-10, on the road against No. 21 University of Central Missouri last Thursday (Sept. 6).

THE COACHES



Tim Beck is in his ninth season as head coach at Pitt State. He has compiled a **70-27 (.722)** career record.

Beck led his alma mater (PSU, '88) to the 2011 NCAA Division II National Championship, earning national coach of the year honors from Liberty Mutual, the Don Hansen Football Committee and FieldTurf™.

Beck became the school's 14th all-time head football coach in December 2009, after serving for 23 seasons as an assistant coach for the Gorillas including 16 years as the team's offensive coordinator from 1994-2009.

In his first season leading the Gorillas, Beck guided Pitt State to a 6-6 record and a victory in the 2010 Mineral Water Bowl. In 2011, Beck led the

Gorillas to the program's second NCAA national championship and the school's fourth national title overall in a 13-1 campaign. Pitt State captured the MIAA Championship and ultimately the NCAA-II National Championship with a 35-21 victory over Wayne (Mich.) State on Dec. 17, 2011.

In 2012, the Gorillas opened the season 5-0 before finishing the year 7-3 overall, while in 2013 Pitt State posted the program's 20th all-time 10-win season during a 10-2 campaign.

In 2014, the Gorillas shared the MIAA regular season title and advanced to the second round of the NCAA-II playoffs during an 11-2 campaign.

In 2015, a young Pitt State team battled a rash of key injuries to frontline players and the Gorillas had to settle for an uncharacteristic 6-5 season. In 2016, the Gorillas battled key injuries once again and Pitt State posted a 7-4 season.

Last year, Pitt State posted six straight wins to end the season with an 8-4 record including a victory in the 2017 Agent Barry Live United Bowl.

During his 16 seasons as offensive coordinator, the Gorilla offense consistently ranked among the finest units in NCAA Division II.

In 2008, Beck was selected the inaugural NCAA Division II Coordinator of the Year by *FootballScoop.com*, following a vote of his coaching peers.

In 2004, Beck's offensive unit established itself as the most prolific squad in the history of NCAA football. PSU shattered a 118-year-old scoring record, scoring an amazing 837 points (55.8 ppg). His squad also set the NCAA all division records for rushing (5,320 yards) and total offense (8,976 yards).

Beck's teams led Division II in scoring in two of the last six years (2004, 2006) and ranked in the top two nationally in total offense three times in the last six seasons (2004, 2005, 2006). His squads ranked among the national rushing leaders every season, leading Division II in 1995 (318.8 ypg) and 2004 (354.7 ypg). Beck's "multiple choice" option attack also compiled 16,483 passing yards (216.9 ypg) and 143 aerial touchdowns during the last six years.

Pitt State averaged a staggering 38.8 points and 442.5 yards of total offense per game during his tenure as offensive coordinator.

Prior to assuming the offensive coordinator's role, Beck served two years as Pitt State's defensive coordinator (1992-93). He became a full-time assistant on the Pitt State staff in 1989, after serving first as a student assistant (1987) and then as a graduate assistant (1988).

This will be Beck's seventh meeting vs. the RiverHawks. He is 6-0 vs. NSU.

Rob Robinson is in his fifth season directing the RiverHawks program, after serving as an assistant coach at MIAA rival Washburn University for 12 seasons. Robinson (William Jewell, 2000) has a **6-40-0 (.130)** record leading NSU. He is 0-4 all-time vs. Pitt State.

THE PITT STATE-NSU SERIES

This will be the 34th all-time meeting between the Gorillas and the RiverHawks in a series that dates back to the 1912 season.

Pitt State holds a **19-12-2** advantage in the series. The Gorillas have won the only seven contests between the two schools since 1970.

Last year, Pitt State blocked two punts, scored on a long punt return and added a defensive score as the Gorillas rolled to a 68-21 victory over NSU on Sept. 16 at Doc Wadley Stadium.

The Gorillas scored the game's first 31 points against the RiverHawks.

Marcus Brantley returned a fumble 29 yards for a touchdown and Paul Davis returned a blocked punt 17 yards for a score in the second quarter as Pitt State broke open a 10-0 game. Austin Panko also scampered 73 yards for a fourth quarter punt return touchdown.

Juanté Baldwin registered both blocked punts for the Gorillas, while Demetrius Bernard forced the fumble Brantley returned for a score.

Quarterback Thomas LePage passed for 174 yards and three touchdowns. He tossed a 10-yard strike to Slade Nordic for the game's first points and added a 23-yard connection to Panko and a 37-yard score to Lorenzo West.

The Pitt State defense limited the RiverHawks to 60 net rushing yards, registering five quarterback sacks. Josh Hornback led the Gorillas with eight tackles. Simanu'a Thomas made a pair of quarterback sacks in the contest.

GORILLAS ON THE ROAD

Pitt State has posted an **85-27-0 (.759)** record in its last 112 road games (including post-season play). The Gorillas are **32-6 (.842)** in their last 38 road games dating back to Oct. 23, 2010.

Pitt State posted a school and MIAA record 20 straight road wins between the 2010 and 2014 seasons before dropping a 24-21 overtime decision to Minnesota State in the second round of the NCAA-II playoffs on Nov. 29, 2014.

During the last 25 years (1994-pres.), the Gorillas are an equally impressive **96-29-1 (.766)** on the road.

PSU'S REGULAR SEASON SUCCESS

Pitt State has won 297 of its last 359 regular season games, posting a phenomenal **297-60-2 (.830)** mark during the past 34 seasons (1985-2018). PSU is **159-24-1** at home, **134-27-1** on the road and **4-9-0** at neutral sites in the regular season during that span.

PITT STATE IN THE AFCA TOP 25 POLL

Pitt State has been ranked in Division II's top 10 **116 times** in the last **241 polls** and the Gorillas have been ranked in the top 25 poll in **184 of 241** weeks overall (dating back to the 1999 season).

The Gorillas made their debut in the NCAA Division II Top 25 poll Monday at No. 23 after receiving votes in the preseason and week one polls. [for complete poll, see page 4]

ALL-TIME WINNINGEST PROGRAMS

Pittsburg State is the all-time winningest NCAA Division II football program. The Gorillas, who are competing in their 111th season of intercollegiate competition, have compiled a **707-346-48 overall record**, winning 66.4 percent of their 1,101 all-time games.

Pittsburg State is one of just five NCAA Division II institutions to have recorded 600 all-time victories and the Gorillas became just the 33rd program – the first Division II institution – across all levels of college football to reach the 700-win plateau.

Tuskegee is second on the Division II all-time list with 686 victories, followed by Hillsdale (630), Carson-Newman (626) and Central Oklahoma (625).

NSU has a **445-432-30 (.507)** record in 96 seasons of intercollegiate play.

QUICK STRIKE OFFENSE

The Pitt State offense has exhibited a penchant for being a "quick strike" unit.

During the last 14 seasons (2005-18), the Pitt State offense has generated 851 scoring drives (705 TDs, 144 FGs) and averaged just 2:56 of elapsed time per drive. [Overtime scoring drives not included in elapsed time figures.]

The Gorillas have been highly successful when they are quick out of the gates. Pitt State has scored on its opening drive 73 times (62 TDs, 11 FGs) in the last 156 games, posting a **65-8 (.890) record** in those games. By contrast, Pitt State is **48-36 (.571)** in games it doesn't score on its opening drive during the same span.

INSIDE THE PITT STATE OFFENSE / DEFENSE



Senior quarterback **John Roderique** made his 23rd start under center for the Gorillas against ESU last week. Roderique competed 11 of 22 passes for 220 yards and two TDs against the Hornets. The Webb City, Mo., native has passed for 5,003 yards and 34 touchdowns in 26 career games for the Gorillas. He also has rushed for 1,138 yards and 15 TDs, compiling 6,141 yards of total offense (236.2 ypg) and accounting for 49 touchdowns. Roderique became just the fifth QB in Pitt State history to eclipse 5,000 career passing yards.



Junior wide receiver **Lorenzo West** caught five passes for a career-high 120 yards against ESU last week. The Lawton, Okla., native has a team-leading nine grabs for 198 yards and one TD on the season, leading the MIAA in receiving yards (99.0 ypg) to date. He has made 54 receptions for 792 career yards (14.7 ypc) and six touchdowns.



Redshirt sophomore wide receiver **Brenner Clemons** has enjoyed a successful return from an injury shortened season in 2017. The Lee's Summit, Mo., native caught three passes for 76 yards and a TD against the Hornets last week. Clemons, the 2016 MIAA Freshman of the Year, has made 59 career receptions for 819 yards (13.9 ypc) and seven touchdowns.



Junior cornerback **KiAnte Hardin** continues to impress in all three facets of the game – offense, defense and special teams. Hardin, an NCAA Division I transfer from the University of Minnesota who redshirted at PSU in 2017, caught a 15-yard TD pass as a wide receiver and hauled in a fourth-quarter interception as a cornerback for the Gorillas against ESU. The Webb City, Mo., native returned a punt 59 yards for a TD in the season opener vs. UCO. He's averaging 22.5 yards per punt return on the season, leading the MIAA and ranking seventh in Division II.



Sophomore safety **Morgan Selemaea** registered a pair of quarterback sacks against ESU last week. The Harrisonville, Mo., native led the MIAA in sacks as a true freshman in 2017, posting 8.0 QB sacks in 10 games. Selemaea has made 49 career tackles with 11.0 tackles-for-loss and 10.0 QB sacks, two pass break-ups and one interception.

Sophomore quarterback **Cade Yeager** directs the NSU offense. Yeager (6-1, 210) has completed 31 of 60 passes for 299 yards (149.5 ypg) and one touchdown on the young season.

Junior wide receiver **Ryheem Brummitt** (5-11, 180) has been Yeager's favorite target, catching a team-leading 10 passes for 122 yards (12.2 ypc) and a touchdown. Redshirt freshman wide receiver **Callen Houston** (5-10, 160) also has made six grabs for 58 yards to date.

Freshman running back **Craig Davis** (5-9, 180) has carried the ball 13 times for 53 yards (4.1 ypc) and one touchdown to lead the RiverHawks' ground gainers. Sophomore **Tre'Von Overstreet** (6-1, 225) also has 18 carries for 40 yards (2.2 ypc) to date.

NSU is averaging 74.5 rushing yards and 231.0 total yards per game. The RiverHawks are scoring 8.5 points per game.

Defensively, NSU is allowing 48.0 points, 265.5 rushing yards and 494.5 total yards per game.

Junior linebacker **Lane Yoder** (6-1, 205) has made a team-leading 13 tackles (seven solo) on the season while sophomore cornerback **Ja'len Evans** (5-10, 175) has posted 12 tackles (seven solo) and one interception.

Freshman **Brady Ellsworth** (5-8, 165) has punted 16 times for a 36.7-yard average. He's also connected on his only field goal try of the season.

Davis is averaging 20.0 yards on kickoff returns, while sophomore **Jordan Price** (5-10, 180) is averaging 15.6 yards.

2018 GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

Pittsburg State 21, Central Oklahoma 7

PITTSBURG — The Pittsburg State University football team ushered in the 2018 football season with a 21-7 victory over the University of Central Oklahoma Thursday (Aug. 30) at Brandenburg Field/Carnie Smith Stadium.

The Gorillas (1-0) marched the ball 78 yards in 10 plays on the opening drive of the season to jump out to a 7-0 lead less than five minutes into the contest. Pitt State added a pair of second quarter scores to build a 21-0 margin and the Gorilla defense bottled up the Bronchos (0-1) most of the night in the debut contest.

Tyler Adkins capped the initial drive with a six-yard scoring run that gave Pitt State a 7-0 lead at the 10:37 mark of the opening stanza. John Roderique extended the lead to 14-0 on a 20-yard pass to Lorenzo West with 4:33 remaining in the second period. Following a quick three-and-out by UCO, KiAnte Hardin broke loose for a 59-yard punt return touchdown to extend the lead to 21-0 with 3:56 remaining in the first half.

UCO's Keats Calhoun tossed a 51-yard touchdown pass to L'liott Curry with 9:43 to play in the game to provide the final margin and break up the Gorillas shutout bid.

The Pitt State defense limited UCO to 234 yards of total offense in the contest. The Bronchos completed just 13 of 31 passes for 135 yards and UCO added just 99 net rushing yards on 29 carries. The Gorillas registered 4.0 quarterback sacks and eight stops behind the line of scrimmage in the contest. Pitt State defenders also broke up eight pass attempts.

Simanu'a Thomas led the Pitt State defense with seven tackles (three solo) including 3.0 tackles-for-loss and 1.5 quarterback sacks. He also registered a PBU.

Roderique completed nine of 13 passes for 104 yards and a touchdown. He also rushed for 23 yards on 11 carries. West caught four passes for 78 yards and a TD. He also carried the ball seven times for 46 yards.

Pittsburg State 34, Emporia State 13

EMPORIA, Kan. — The Pittsburg State University football team scored twice in the span of 19 seconds to break open a tie game en route to a 34-13 road victory over Emporia State University Thursday (Sept. 6) at Welch Stadium.

Quarterback John Roderique tossed a four-yard touchdown pass to tight end Jackson Krull to cap an eight-play, 98-yard drive that staked the Gorillas (2-0, 2-0 MIAA) to a 20-13 lead with 10:45 to play in the game.

KiAnte Hardin intercepted a Braxton Marstall pass on the first play of the Hornets (1-1, 1-1 MIAA) ensuing drive and Roderique delivered a 56-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Brenner Clemons immediately afterwards. The quick strike extended Pitt State's margin to 27-13 with 10:26 to go.

Roderique sealed the victory with a seven-yard touchdown scamper with 3:48 to play in the contest.

Roderique completed 11 of 22 passes for 220 yards and two touchdowns, while B.J. Bradbury also completed three of four passes including a 15-yard second-quarter touchdown pass to Hardin. Lorenzo West caught five passes for a game-high 120 yards.

Tyler Adkins led the Gorillas ground gainers, rushing 20 times for 98 yards. Pitt State compiled 221 rushing yards in the contest.

The Pitt State defense allowed the Hornets just 63 yards of total offense in the second half after ESU rushed for 152 yards in the opening two stanzas. Marstall completed just seven of 23 passes for 72 yards for the Hornets. Landon Nault rushed 22 times for 177 yards, with 16 carries for 152 yards in the first half.
