The Pittsburg State University men's basketball team will wrap up a three-game road swing Saturday (Feb. 20) when the Gorillas travel to Joplin, Mo., to face MIAA rival Missouri Southern State University. Tip-off is set for 3:30 p.m. (CST) at the Leggett & Platt Athletic Center.

The Pitt State action can be heard on ESPN 100.7 FM radio, online at <u>espn1007.</u> <u>com/</u> or through the ESPN 100.7 or KSHQ app for phones or mobile devices.

THE RECORDS

Pitt State is 10-9 and seventh in the MIAA standings with three games remaining in the regular season. The Gorillas dropped a pair of road games last week. Pitt State had its season-best five-game winning streak halted in an 87-75 road loss to No. 3 ranked Northwest Missouri State University on Feb. 11. Pitt State also dropped a heartbreaker, 82-81, on a buzzer beater shot against Missouri Western State University last Saturday (Feb. 13).

Missouri Southern is 11-8 overall and third in the MIAA standings. The Lions dropped an 83-69 road decision to Northwest Missouri in their last action last Saturday (Feb. 13).

HEAD COACH KIM ANDERSON

Pittsburg State's **Kim Anderson** is in his fourth season leading the Gorillas. He has compiled a **56-53** record in his first three-plus seasons at Pitt State.

Anderson (Missouri, '79) became the Gorillas' 15th all-time head coach on Apr. 10, 2017, after coaching the previous three seasons at his alma mater — the University of Missouri. [for complete biography, see page 3]

He has a 357-215 (.624) record in 20 seasons as a collegiate head coach, including the 2014 NCAA Division II National Championship as head coach at the University of Central Missouri as well as two more Division II Final Four appearances (2007, 2009) while compiling a 274-95 (.743) record at the school.

Anderson led UCM to seven trips to the NCAA Division II National Tournament and seven 20-win seasons. In his final season with the Mules he guided the squad to a 30-5 overall record and the D2 national title.

His Mules teams captured six MIAA regular season titles (2005, 2007, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014) and four MIAA Tournament titles (2005, 2007, 2009, 2013).

He was selected the MIAA Coach of the Year in 2005 and 2010, and the NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year in 2014.

SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's action will mark the 108th all-time meeting between Pitt State and MSSU. The Lions hold a 60-47 advantage in the series, including a 38-14 edge in games played at Joplin. MSSU has won the last eight match-ups between the two squads at the Leggett & Platt Athletic Center.

Pitt State scored and 83-67 victory over MSSU at John Lance Arena on Jan. 9. Martin Vogts scored a season high 26 points in the win for the Gorillas.

SCOUTING THE GORILLAS

The Gorillas have three players averaging in double figures on the season – junior forward **Bobby Arthur-Williams Jr.** (12.5 ppg) and junior guards **Martin Vogts** (11.7 ppg) and **Quentin Hardrict Jr.** (10.9 ppg) – and five players contributing 5.5 or more points per game – senior guard **Ryan Pippins** (8.8 ppg), senior forwards **Antonio Givens II** (7.8 ppg) and **Zach Burch** (7.5 ppg), freshman forward **Cameron Huefner** (5.9 ppg) and junior guard **Ike Moore** (5.5 ppg).

Arthur-Williams (6-7, 225) is shooting 47.5 percent from the field (67-141) on the season and averaging a team-leading 12.5 points and 6.8 rebounds per game. He ranks ninth in the MIAA in rebounding.

Arthur-Williams was named the MIAA Player of the Week on Dec. 21 after contributing 23 points and nine rebounds against MWSU on Dec. 17. He has missed the last two games due to injury (foot).

Arthur-Williams transferred to Pitt State from NCAA Division I University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. He redshirted at MKE in 2019-20, after averaging 3.0 points and 3.0 rebounds per game as a junior in 2018-19.

Arthur-Williams averaged 17.7 points and 10.7 rebounds per game as a sophomore at Redlands Community College. The Potomac, Md., native played his freshman season at Louisburg (N.C.) College.

Vogts is averaging 11.7 points, 3.8 rebounds, 1.9 assists and a team-leading 1.9 steals per game on the season. He has made a team-leading 42 3-point field goals (42-105, .400). Vogts scored a season high 26 points vs. MSSU (Jan. 9). He ranks 11th in the MIAA in 3-point field goals (2.2 pg).

Vogts came to Pitt State after two seasons at Barton Community College. The Manhattan, Kan., native averaged 10.2 points, 2.8 rebounds an 2.0 assist per game as a sophomore in 2019-20.

Vogts (6-1, 175) contributed 8.5 points and 2.3 rebounds per game as a freshman for the Cougars.

Hardrict is averaging 10.9 points, 2.6 rebounds and a team-leading 2.9 assists per game. Hardrict scored a season best 27 points vs. NWMSU (Jan. 2). Hardrict came to Pitt State from North lowa Area Community College.

The Minneapolis, Minn., native was a two-time All-lowa Community College Athletic Conference selection. Hardrict (5-10, 160) averaged 16.9 points, 3.6 rebounds and 5.6 assists per game as a sophomore in 2019-20.

He contributed 15.4 points, 2.9 rebounds and 5.4 assists per game during his freshman season.

Pippins is contributing 8.8 points, 4.3 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game. He's 35-for-39 (.897) from the free throw line on the season. Pippins scored a season high 26 points and grabbed seven rebounds vs. UCM (Feb. 4).

Pippins joined the Gorillas after four seasons at the University of Arkansas-Little Rock. Pippins (6-0, 240) redshirted during the 2019-20 while he battled back from an off season injury. He scored 15 points in his Pitt State debut against the Bronchos.

The Little Rock, Ark., native avearged 5.7 points and 2.4 rebounds per game as a junior in 2018-19.

Givens is chipping in with 7.8 points and 3.0 rebounds on the year. He is shooting 56.0 percent from the field (47-84). Givens scored a season-best 20 points vs. LU (Feb. 6) and MWSU (Feb. 13).

Givens averaged 8.2 points and 4.3 rebounds per game last year, after transferring to Pitt State from NCAA Division I Kent State University, where he redshirted in 2018-19.

Givens (6-9, 260) shot 53.6 percent from the field last year, converting 89 of 166 shots from the floor.

He averaged 3.5 points and 3.0 rebounds per game as a sophomore at Wabash Valley College in 2017-18.

Burch is averaging 7.5 points and 2.7 rebounds per game while shooting a team-best 66.3 percent from the field to date (53-80). He also has blocked 13 shots thus far (0.8 bpg). Burch scored a season high 17 points and grabbed eight rebounds vs. NSU (Jan. 28). He has missed the last two games.

Burch (6-6, 225) transferred to Pitt State from NCAA Division II member Rockhurst University. The Butler, Mo., native contributed 2.7 points and 1.6 rebounds per game during the 2018-19 season for the Hawks.

Huefner (6-7, 210) is contributing 5.9 points and 2.9 rebounds per game. The native of Adelaide, Australia is shoting 51.5 percent from the field (34-66) and has made 11 of 19 3-point field goals (.579). He scored a season best 19 points vs. RSU (Jan. 30).

Moore is averaging 5.5 points, 2.6 rebounds and 1.4 assists per game and shooting 53.4 percent from the field (39-73). He has converted 16 of 34 3-point field goals (.471). He scored a season high 16 points vs. NSU (Dec. 5).

Moore transferred to Pitt State after two seasons at Arkansas State University Mid South.

Moore (6-3, 175) averaged 16.8 points, 4.7 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game as a sophomore for the Greyhounds in 2019-20.

The Fort Smith, Ark., native averaged 9.0 points and 3.7 rebounds per game during his freshman campaign.

Two more players — redshirt sophomore guard **R.J. Lawrence** and sophomore forward **Ethan Holloway** — are scoring between 4.2 and 4.8 points per game.

Lawrence is averaging 4.8 points and 1.0 assists per game on the season. Lawrence averaged 9.3 points and 3.0 assists per game last year, before an injury cut short his sophomore campaign and forced him to exercise a medical redshirt.

The Blue Springs, Mo., native contributed 3.5 points per game as a freshman in 2018-19.

Holloway has averaged 4.2 points per game in six contests for PSU. He scored a career high 21 points vs. NWMSU (Feb. 11).

Holloway (6-8, 200), from Iola, Kan., saw action in eight games in a reserve role for the Gorillas last year.

Freshman guard **R.J. Forney Jr.** (6-3, 175) has started five games and averaged 3.6 points per game.

Sophomore guard **Drew Roelfs** also has seen action in four games for the Gorillas.

Roelfs (6-1, 180), a Pittsburg native, started three games in 2019-20, averaging 2.3 points per game.

Kim Anderson, Head Coach

Kim Anderson is in his fourth year as head basketball coach at Pittsburg State University. Anderson was hired as the 15th head coach in program history on April 10, 2017, after serving the previous three seasons as head basketball coach at his alma mater, the University of Missouri.

Anderson has compiled a 357-215 (.624) career collegiate coaching record. He guided the Gorillas to a 17-13 record in his debut season in 2017-18 — a 12-game improvement in the win column from the previous year's squad — and he has a 56-53 (.514) mark leading Pitt State.

Prior to his assignment at Mizzou, Anderson coached 12 seasons at MIAA rival University of Central Missouri, leading the Mules to the 2014 NCAA Division II National Championship as well as two additional Division II Final Four appearances (2007, 2009) while compiling a 274-95 (.743) record at the school.

Anderson led UCM to seven trips to the NCAA Division II National Tournament and seven 20-win seasons. In his final season with the Mules he guided the squad to a 30-5 overall record and the D2 national title. His Mules teams captured six MIAA regular season titles (2005, 2007, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014) and four MIAA Tournament titles (2005, 2007, 2009, 2013). He was selected the MIAA Coach of the Year in 2005 and 2010, and the NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year in 2014.

Anderson also spent three years as the Big 12 Conference's Assistant Commissioner/Men's Basketball, directing the officiating program and postseason tournament, and 17 seasons as an assistant coach at Mizzou (1983-85 & 1992-99) and Baylor (1986-91) under former Pitt State head coach Gene Iba.

A native of Sedalia, Mo., Anderson played basketball at the University of Missouri from 1973-77 under legendary coach Norm Stewart. He was a first-team All-Big Eight selection as a senior in 1977 as well as the Big Eight co-Player of the Year that season.

Following his collegiate playing career, Anderson went on to be drafted in the second round of the 1977 NBA Draft by the Portland Trailblazers, playing 21 games for the late Dr. Jack Ramsey during the 1978-79 season. He later completed his professional playing career in Italy and France until returning to assist the Tigers in 1982.

Anderson is a member of numerous Hall of Fames around the state of Missouri. He was inducted into the University of Missouri Athletics Hall of Fame in 1999 and the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame in Springfield in 2005 as a student-athlete. He was later inducted into the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame for his coaching accomplishments in 2012. In 2006 he was named to the Mizzou Basketball All-Century Team in a fan vote. Most recently, he was honored to the MIAA's Hall of Fame in 2015.

Anderson earned a bachelor's degree in education (BSed) from Mizzou in 1979 and a master's of science degree (MS) in education from the school in 1981.

Anderson and his wife of 43 years, Melissa, have two sons, Ryan, an Assistant Director of Communications at Wichita State University, and Brett, who serves as a Sports Marketing Sales Manager for Executive Hotel Management.
