Adorno and McGeary headline Conference Commissioners Association NCAA Division II All-America baseball team

MARSHALL, Minn. - Freshman pitcher Jeremy Adorno from Southern Arkansas University and junior designated hitter Haydn McGeary from Colorado Mesa University headline the 2022 NCAA Division II Conference Commissioners Association All-America baseball team, earning the Ron Lenz Pitcher and Player of the Year awards, respectively. A total of 48 student-athletes were named to either the first, second or third team All-America squad while 16 were named honorable mention.

The CCA All-America and All-Region baseball teams, which are selected by College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) members from schools playing Division II baseball, were first established in 2007. This is the seventh year in which the program is solely sponsored by the Division II Conference Commissioners Association.

Adorno, a native of Kissimmee, Fla., is 14-0 in 16 starts, while compiling an ERA of 2.98 in 105 2/3 innings with 130 strikeouts. He has walked just 40 batters while holding opponents to a .196 batting average in helping lead SAU to the NCAA Baseball Championship for the first time in program history. In the latest NCAA statistics (May 29), Adorno ranks first in victories, second in strikeouts, third in complete games (seven) and 16th in hits per nine innings (6.39).

McGeary, a native of Peoria, Ariz., earns the CCA Lenz Player of the Year award for the second straight season. He helped Colorado Mesa advance to the NCAA South Central Super Regional and finished the season leading Division II (as of May 29) in batting average (.481), hits (103), home runs (35), on-base percentage (.579), slugging percentage (1.061), and total bases (227). He ranks fourth nationally in runs scored (86) and ninth in RBIs (79). He has belted an NCAA record 75 career home runs and in 163 career games and is batting .448 with 65 doubles and 243 RBIs.

Joining Adorno and McGeary on the CCA All-America first team include John Michael Faile (C, North Greenville), Micah Morgan (1B, Spring Hill), Sam Riola (2B, St. Cloud State), Zion Pettigrew (3B, Illinois-Springfield), Braylin Marine (SS, Newberry), Justin Lee (OF, Angelo State), Brock Reller (OF, Northeastern State), Brennen van Breusegen (OF, Central Missouri), EJ Taylor (utility non-pitcher, Southern Nazarene), Baxter Halligan (utility pitcher, Point Loma), Jared Donalson (SP, Georgia Southwestern), Haden Erbe (SP, Tampa), Xavier Rivas (SP, Indianapolis) and Braydon Nelson (RP, Tampa).
