**ON THE AIR:** The next radio broadcast is Oct. 21 vs. San Diego, which is also the next Action Sports Cable Network broadcast. Andy McNamara and Greg Flakus will handle play-by-play duties on KPAM AM 860 throughout the season, with former Pilot standouts providing color commentary. All radio games are also available via internet at [www.kpam.com](http://www.kpam.com). Bob Akamamian has play-by-play duties for ASCN, with former Pilot standouts providing color commentary.

**THE OPPONENTS:** Loyola Marymount, ranked 17th in the latest Soccer America poll, dropped to 7-3-1 with a 2-2 tie Oct. 8 at CS Northridge, through the Lions are 7-0-1 after an 0-3 start. Arturo Torres leads the team with eight goals and three assists, and Andres Murriaguai adds six goals and three assists. Dan Sheridan has a 0.75 goals against average in 10 games with 31 saves and five shutouts. Portland is 11-1-1 all-time against LMU, though the Lions beat Portland 3-2 in overtime last year in Los Angeles.

San Diego, ranked 14th in the latest Soccer America poll, is 7-2-0 this season after a 2-1 loss at Santa Clara last weekend. Scott Martin scored the Toreros lone goal against the Broncos, his second of the season. Ryan Coiner leads USD with six goals and one assist, while Sy Reeves adds three goals and three assists. Justin Neerhof has a 0.78 goals against average with 38 saves and four shutouts. Portland is 7-9-2 all-time against San Diego after a 3-1 loss last year at USD.

**JAUQA AGAIN TAKES WCC HONOR:** Sophomore forward Nate Jaqua took home his second WCC Player of the Week honor - and fourth of his career - after tallying four goals and an assist in Portland's two wins last week. Jaqua had three goals in a three-minute span against Seattle, then added a goal and an assist in a 2-0 win over Saint Mary's.

## LAST WEEKEND'S RESULTS

**Portland 2, Saint Mary's 0:** Nate Jaqua had a goal and an assist Sunday, leading Portland to 1-0 West Coast Conference win over Saint Mary's.

Jaqua had a hand in both Pilot goals, assisting on Brandon Henley's first-half tally, then scoring his own goal in the second half.

The Pilots outshot Saint Mary's 16-12, and Jaqua had half of Portland's shots. Portland also had a 10-4 edge in corners. Jaqua's low centering shot toward the far post was barely flicked in by a streaking Henley at 32:21, ending 30 minutes of frustration for the Pilots.

Just 3:21 into the second half, Josh Simpson's short through ball found Jaqua alone in front of the goal, and he slotted a bullet under SMC keeper, Kellan Wilson.

Curtis Spiteri made three saves for Portland's shutout, but got help from the crossbar when Niles Almarinez' 20-yard shot clanged off the middle of the bar and bounced away.

Since opening the season 0-2-0, Portland has gone 7-2-0 and have outscored those nine opponents 27-7.

**Portland 5, Seattle 0:** Jaqua scored a trio of goals in a three-minute span Wednesday, leading Portland to a 5-0 win over Seattle University. The Pilots improved to 6-4-0 with the win, while SU dropped to 7-4-0. Brandon Henley also added a pair of goals for Portland.

Jaqua began the scoring spree at 13:51 when he took a long cross from Mario Picarelli in front of the goal, then somehow banged his shot between the near post and the Seattle

keeper. Less than two minutes later, Eric Cronkrite's corner was headed to Jaqua from Isaac Vanderburg, and Jaqua had an easy finish.

Exactly three minutes after his first goal, Jaqua ran onto a long ball from Josh Simpson, beat the keeper to the ball, and hit the empty net goal for his second career hat-trick.

Already leading 3-0, Henley and Kelly Gray connected on a nifty give-and-go goal at 30:46, then the same combination put Portland ahead 5-0 at 78:18 when Gray sent a through pass into open space, and Henley slotted a bullet past Seattle's keeper.

Portland, winners of six of their last eight games, outshot the Redhawks 20-9. Portland keepers Curtis Spiteri and Justin Carter shared the shutout, though Carter had to register only one save.

**GRAY, JAQUA CLIMBING SCORING CHARTS:** Kelly Gray has 68 career points (29 goals, 10 assists), a total which has the San Jose native climbing Portland's all-time scoring charts. Nate Jaqua, though just a sophomore, is already 20th on the all-time scoring list.

Gray is 14th in career scoring, and tied for 12th with 29 goals. He needs just six points for 10th place. Jaqua has 45 career points, and his 16 goals are tied for 19th. His 13 assists are 18th, and he's tied for 10th with five game-winning goals.

Senior defender Brandon McNeil is tied for 11th with 17 career assists, and needs just one for 10th.

Junior keeper Curtis Spiteri also ranks among Portland's all-time top goalies. He's ninth in career goals against average (1.21), ninth in goals allowed (59), sixth in saves (172), and fourth in shutouts (16.5).

**PICK A LINEUP, ANY LINEUP:** Through 11 matches this fall, Portland has used 10 different starting lineups, and 18 different players have earned starts.

Kelly Gray, Nate Jaqua, Josh Simpson, Kyle Tanner and Brandon McNeil have started all 11 games, while Curtis Spiteri has started 10 games but missed one with a red card. Brandon Henley has started 10 times, followed by Eric Cronkrite and Isaac Vanderburg with nine each.

Of the 19 players on the roster, only Brian Cotlove has not earned a starting spot.

**NOT A GOOD TREND:** Since round-robin West Coast Conference play began in 1988, Portland has a 9-4-1 record in WCC openers. A good record, but those four losses have

come in the last four seasons, this year's loss at Gonzaga.

**PILOTS ON A ROLL:** After starting the season 0-2 with home losses to Denver and Stanford, the Pilots have ripped off a 7-2 record in the last nine matches. Portland owns a 27-7 scoring advantage in those seven contests.

Of Portland's 11 opponents, Stanford has a #5 national ranking, Indiana is #6, and William & Mary is #25. In addition, Air Force is #4 in their region, and Denver is #7.

Portland's 11 opponents thus far have a combined 69-32-9 record, a 66.8% winning percentage.

**NATIONAL HONOR FOR GRAY:** Junior midfielder Kelly Gray was named to Soccer America Magazine's Team of the Week after earning NIKE Husky Classic Offensive MVP honors. Gray had three goals and an assist in Portland's 9-2 and 3-2 wins over Air Force and UNLV.

**JAQUA WAS WCC PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Sophomore forward Nate Jaqua earned the third West Coast Conference Player of the Week of his young career after taking home his second Portland adidas Invitational Outstanding Offensive Player honor. Jaqua had two goals and an assist in Portland's wins over William & Mary and Indiana.

**PILOTS KEEP PORTLAND ADIDAS INVITATIONAL TITLE:** Portland adidas Invitational Offensive MVP Nate Jaqua fed Brandon Henley for a goal in the third minute, and the Pilot defense responded with a 1-0 upset of #7 to win the tournament. Washington beat William & Mary 3-2 in the early game.

Portland's title was its seventh in 12 years of the tournament, and kept a string alive of only Washington and Portland winning trophies.

Jaqua, who also was Offensive MVP in 2000, had two goals and an assist in Portland's two games.

**GRAY, SPITERI OPEN WITH HONORS:** University of Portland juniors Kelly Gray (MF) and Curtis Spiteri (GK) were named CollegeSoccer.com preseason all-Americans.

Gray was a second-team pick by the internet site devoted to college soccer, while Spiteri was an honorable mention selection.

Both players took spring semester 2001 off to train with the U.S. U-21 national team. Gray was a starter for the team in the 2001 World Youth Championships in Argentina, while Spiteri was an alternate.

**PILOTS PICKED #3 IN WCC COACHES POLL:** Two-time West Coast Conference soccer champion, San Diego was voted as the favorite to win the WCC men's soccer title in the 2001 WCC preseason poll, as selected by the conference coaches. The Toreros were a unanimous pick for the number one slot receiving first place votes from each of the other six head coaches.

Portland was picked to finish third and will rally to replace the loss of all-WCC performer Conor Casey. Junior Kelly Gray returns at forward after leading the WCC in goals scored in conference games with five.

Collectively, Charles' men's and women's teams have won 12 conference championships (losing only 33 league games) and earned 16 NCAA playoff berths (including six Final Four appearances) in a combined 25 seasons. Charles owns four Far West Region Coach of the Year and six conference Coach of the Year awards. Twenty-five Pilots have earned All-America status during Charles' tenure.

Charles ranks 15th among active NCAA Division I men's soccer coach in all-time winning percentage (.688).

Despite losing nearly a dozen letterwinners and five starters, the Pilots were among 47 teams ranked in the poll. Southern Methodist topped the initial poll, followed by Virginia, San Diego, Creighton and Indiana.

Portland will face seven of the ranked teams this season, five of which appear in the poll's top 20. San Diego, Indiana, Stanford, William & Mary and Loyola Marymount will each make Portland appearances, while the Pilots will travel to Washington and Santa Clara.

## 2000 SEASON IN REVIEW

**JAQUA, CASEY TOP PORTLAND'S ALL-WCC PICKS:** Forwards Nate Jaqua and Conor Casey earned top all-WCC honors. Casey, a sophomore, was a repeat first-team all-West Coast Conference pick. Jaqua was the league's Freshman of the Year, joining Andrew Gregor (1994), Steve Cherundolo (1997), and Casey (1999) as Portland winners of the award.

Kelly Gray, Ben Leedy and Curtis Spiteri received honorable mention all-league honors.

**JAQUA AMONG PILOT FROSH ELITE:** Portland's leading scorer, Nate Jaqua, joined the list of outstanding freshman scoring performances. With 25 total points, Jaqua ranks seventh on the list, just four points behind Linus Rhode's 28 points.

Jaqua is also tied for seventh with nine goals. In addition, fellow frosh Jarrod Weis and Cody Hagler tied for 16th with three goals each.

**AND THE LAST TIME . . . :** Portland's 4-1 win over Washington avoided the program's first potential losing season since 1982. Prior to this year, Portland has had just two losing records - 11-12-2 in 1978, and 8-9-3 in 1982.

Portland hasn't lost four straight games since 1994.

The last time Portland gave up at least six goals in two games was also in 1997, when the Pilots lost 4-3 at Seattle Pacific, followed by a 4-2 win against Saint Mary's. Prior to the SPU loss, Portland had lost 3-0 at Clemson. You have to go back to 1994 to find the other two-game total of six games allowed (a 5-3 win over Virginia Commonwealth, followed by a 3-0 loss to William & Mary).

**PILOTS JOIN ELITE SHUTOUT LIST:** Portland's two shutouts over Indiana and Butler matched a rare record in Pilot soccer history. Prior to this season, only three teams (1999, 1995, 1989) had started the season with shutouts.

The 1989 team actually started the season with three shutouts, but the second game in that streak was a 0-0 tie with Fresno State.

**CASEY, CLIVE A HIT FOR OLYMPIANS:** Conor Casey was the only amateur athlete on the U.S. men's Olympic team and was the squad's second-youngest member. The bruising forward started all six matches and led the U.S. with 10 shots on goal, and added an assist against the Czech Republic.

Clive Charles directed the U.S. men's team to its highest-ever finish in Olympic competition, as the U.S. advanced out of pool play and into the medal round for the first time. In the quarterfinals, the U.S. beat Japan on penalty kicks, but lost to Spain in the semifinals. U.S. hopes for a bronze medal were dashed in a 2-0 loss to Chile.

Earlier in the summer, Casey was named a preseason first-team all-American by College Soccer Online.

Casey joins Yari Allnutt (1992), Kasey Keller (1992, '96), Linus Rhode (1996, Canada), and Davide Xausa (1996, Canada), as Pilot alums who have represented their country as Olympians.

## KPAM SIGNS ON TO BROADCAST PILOT SPORTS



The University of Portland athletic department and KPAM 860 have signed an agreement to broadcast Pilot soccer and men's basketball, beginning with the 2001-02 season.

This fall, eight men's soccer games and six women's games will be broadcast on KPAM, with play-by-play coming from Andy McNamara and Greg Flakus. Color commentary will be provided by an assortment of former Pilot stars.

The three-year agreement also covers all Portland basketball regular and post-season games, and will be broadcast over the internet on KPAM's website at [www.kpam.com](http://www.kpam.com). Darrell Aune, an Oregon Broadcaster of the Year winner more than 10 times, will call the play-by-play action for the Pilots. Aune is currently a morning sports commentator at KPAM.

"This agreement with KPAM gives us an opportunity to broaden our basketball marketing with an expanded pregame, a weekly coaches show, and aggressive on-air promotion of Pilot basketball," said UP athletic director, Joe Etzel.

Included in the deal is a weekly one-hour coaches show with Michael Holton during Portland's season, to be hosted by KPAM's Jeff Mitchell at Tony Roma's restaurant.

"We're thrilled to have Portland's broadcasts on KPAM," said KPAM general manager Kevin Young. "We're excited about Michael Holton and his ability to bring excitement to The Bluff. I'm looking forward to hearing the Pilots on KPAM."
