## STANFORD AWAITS PILOTS IN SECOND ROUND

**THIS WEEK:** Portland travels to Stanford for an NCAA Men's College Cup second-round game. Game time is 7 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 27. Portland is making its 10th playoff appearance, and third in the last four years.



**ABOUT STANFORD:** The Cardinal, 14-4-2, earned a first-round bye after a 5-3-2 third-place finish in the Pac-10. Stanford has allowed just 13 goals in 20 games, with 11 shutouts. Fourteen players have scored at least one point this season, with Roger Levesque leading the team with 23 points (5g-13a). Johanes Maliza is second in scoring with 19 points.

Andrew Terris and Robby Fulton have combined for 10 shutouts, including a 2-0 win over Portland earlier this season.

Stanford leads the all-time series 7-4-2 after Matt Janusz and Mike Wilson goals gave the Cardinal a 2-0 win at Stanford on Sept. 8. Last season, Stanford ended Portland's season with a 3-1 loss at Stanford.

### NCAA COLLEGE CUP, 1st round

**Portland 2, Oregon State 0:** Freshman defender Heath Pearce had a goal and an assist Saturday as #16 Portland beat Oregon State 2-0 in the first round of the 2002 NCAA Men's College Cup soccer tournament.

Pearce assisted on Nate Jaqua's goal in the 31<sup>st</sup> minute, then scored his own goal in the 36<sup>th</sup> minute on an improbable 55-yard shot.

Oregon State's season ended at 13-7-0 after their first-ever NCAA tournament appearance.

"The first 15 minutes, Oregon State put a lot of pressure on us. Once the game slowed down, we found our rhythm and got into our passing style," said Portland head coach Clive Charles.

Pearce was instrumental in not only giving the Pilots a 2-0 lead, but keeping the shutout intact. The assist on Jaqua's goal came after Pearce held the ball deep in the OSU end, then turned the ball toward the endline before sending a quick cross to Jaqua for the finish.

"Heath got the ball wide and sent it onto my left foot," said Jaqua of his game-winning goal. "It was a great ball after a great individual effort."

Pearce's goal five minutes later was hardly planned, but gave the Pilots a 2-0 lead with 55 minutes left to play. Attempting to clear the ball away just inside the midfield line, Pearce sent a high ball toward the OSU goal. OSU keeper Peter Billmeyer tracked the ball back, but the ball bounced on the goal line and into the net.

"I was just trying to get the ball behind their defense," said Pearce of his second career goal.

Collectively, Charles' men's and women's teams have won 13 conference championships (losing only 36 league games) and earned 20 NCAA playoff berths (including eight Final Four appearances) in a combined 29 seasons. Charles owns four Far West Region Coach of the Year and six conference Coach of the Year awards. Nineteen Pilots have earned All-America status during Charles' tenure.

Charles ranks third among active NCAA Division I women's soccer coach in all-time winning percentage (.798), and fourth among all women's Division I soccer coaches.

Pearce later cleared away an OSU shot off the line, after his own poor clearance left Portland keeper Curtis Spiteri stranded away from the goal. Spiteri earned his seventh shutout of the season without making a save, as the Pilot defense thwarted most Beaver scoring opportunities.

Portland outshot the Beavers 13-9, and Billmeyer made three saves, including a pair in a 10-second span after Paul Robinson and Alejandro Salazar had two crossing headers.

"We were a bit unlucky on the second goal, but Portland deserved to go forward," said OSU coach Dana Taylor. "In a tight game, we didn't finish our opportunities. They capitalized on our mistakes."

### SALAZAR IS TOP WCC FRESHMAN, CHARLES

**COACH OF THE YEAR:** Portland midfielder Alejandro Salazar was named West Coast Conference Freshman of the Year, the third Portland player in the last four years to win the award.

Head coach Clive Charles was named WCC Coach of the Year, his second such honor after receiving the award in 1988.

Salazar was also a first-team all-WCC pick, and Nate Jaqua earned his third first-team all-WCC award. Senior keeper Curtis Spiteri was a first-team pick for the first time after previously earning a second-team nod and two honorable mention awards.

Freshman defender Miguel Guante was Portland's lone second-team selection, but six Pilots were honorable mention picks: junior midfielder Eric Cronkrite, senior midfielder Matthew Domingo, senior forward Sheldin Maistry, freshman defender Heath Pearce, junior midfielder Jarrod Weis, and junior defender Kyle Tanner.

The 10 all-conference picks from Portland is a program best, two more than Portland's eight all-conference selections in 1995.

Salazar joins Andrew Gregor (1994), Steve Cherundolo (1997), Conor Casey (1999), and Jaqua (2000) as Portland's WCC Freshman of the Year honorees.

**SENIORS WRAP UP CAREERS:** Portland seniors Matthew Domingo, Sheldin Maistry and Curtis Spiteri put a cap on their Pilot careers against Gonzaga.

The senior trio has rolled up a 47-21-6 record over the past four years - Domingo redshirted last season after a knee injury and has been part of a 45-21-7 mark. The group has combined for five all-WCC awards, one all-region award, and two WCC Player of the Week honors.

**PILOTS HAVE WCC HISTORY:** Portland claimed its fifth West Coast Conference title with a win Sunday, and first since 1995. Portland owns WCC titles in 1992 (shared with San Diego), 1990 and 1989 (shared with Santa Clara), and 1988.

The Pilots earned the league's automatic berths in 1989 and 1990, and won the outright title in 1988. Portland now has 10 all-time NCAA tournament berths.

**JAQUA IS MAC/HERMANN FINALIST:** Nate Jaqua (F/Jr/Eugene) was named as a finalist for the Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy, awarded to the top players in NCAA Division I soccer.

This year's honorees will have the distinction of being the first to receive the newly-unified award. This summer's announcement of the unification of the M.A.C. Award and the Hermann Trophy completed the merging of NCAA Division I soccer's three top honors. In 1999, the M.A.C. and the NSCAA came together to create a single award recognizing the top Division I players. The winners of the M.A.C.'s Hermann Trophy will be decided by a vote of current NSCAA members at the NCAA Division I level.

Portland's Shannon MacMillan won both the Hermann Trophy and MAC Player of the Year awards in 1995. The nominations of Jaqua - and Lauren Orlandos and Christine Sinclair of the UP women's team - bring Portland's all-time total of finalists to 26.

For the Pilot men, Kasey Keller was a dual finalist (1990, 1991), Joe Leonetti was a Hermann finalist (1991), and Yari Allnutt (1992) and Chris Brown (1998) were MAC finalists.

On the women's side, MacMillan was a Hermann Trophy and MAC finalist in 1993, 1994 and 1995; Tiffey Milbrett was a Hermann finalist (1994), and MAC finalist (1991, 1992, 1994); Justi Baumgardt was a Hermann and MAC finalist (1996, 1997), and Michelle French was also a dual finalist (1998).

**AND HE'S SMART, TOO:** Jaqua was named to the Verizon Academic all-America second team, after being named a first-team Verizon Academic all-District VIII team, as voted by members of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

### PILOTS AMONG NATION'S LEADERS IN COMBINED

**SOCCER RECORDS:** Portland's 28-9-3 combined men's and women's soccer record this season is 10th in the country in terms of winning percentage.

Stanford leads the list at a combined 30-5-2 (.854), followed by UConn (34-7-2, .814) and UCLA (31-6-3, .813). The Pilots' soccer program is tied for 10th with 28 total wins.

**JAUQA MOVING UP:** Junior forward Nate Jaqua's career totals of 28 goals and 22 assists rank among the program's best-ever totals.

Jaqua is 10th in total points, is tied for 13th in goals, and is 10th in assists.

**SPITERI MAKING HIS MARK:** Senior keeper Curtis Spiteri has joined the best Pilots between the pipes.

He's third with 269 career saves, ranks sixth in career goals against average (1.08), and second in career shutouts (28.5). Spiteri is fourth all-time on the West Coast Conference shutouts lists, and #2 all-time at Portland for minutes played in goal.

**RANKINGS:** Portland's win at Saint Mary's played the Pilots back into the polls

The Pilots moved back to #18 in the Soccer America poll, are #24 in College Soccer News, and #25 in Soccer Times. The Pilots are not ranked in the NSCAA coaches poll.

In regional rankings, the Pilots are #5 (Soccer America), #6 (NSCAA, College Soccer News), and #7 (Soccer Times).

### SPITERI NAMED WCC PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Senior keeper Curtis Spiteri earned his second career WCC Player of the Week honor after posting shutouts at #15 San Diego and #7 Loyola Marymount. Spiteri made five saves in each of the shutouts, running his career total to 26, and was also named to Soccer America's Team of the Week.

Spiteri also earned a WCC P.O.W. award in 2001 after blanking LMU and USD in Portland.

**SALAZAR SPREE CONTINUES:** Freshman midfielder Alejandro Salazar hit his eighth goal of the year Sunday against Gonzaga, notching his third gamd-winner of the season.

Salazar is third on the team in scoring (8g-2a), and

scored six goals in WCC games.

**NOT A GOOD TREND:** Portland broke an unfortunate string of West Coast Conference season-opening losses with the win over Santa Clara. Since round-robin West Coast Conference play began in 1988, Portland now has a 10-4-1 record in WCC openers. A good record, but those four losses had come in the last four seasons, including last year's loss at Gonzaga.

**"3" IS THE MAGIC NUMBER:** The number "3" has special significance this season for the Pilots - Portland is 6-0-0 when scoring three goals, 1-0-0 when scoring six goals. The other Pilot wins were 1-0 decisions at Fresno State and Loyola Marymount, the 2-1 OT win over Santa Clara, a 2-0 win at USD, a 1-0 win over Gonzaga, and Sunday's win over Oregon State.

With the exception of 2-0 losses to Stanford and San Francisco, the Pilots are 0-4-1 in the remaining four matches, having scored just one goal in the five non-wins.

The moral - three goals = Pilot win (usually).

### SALAZAR NABS WCC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**HONOR:** Freshman midfielder Alejandro Salazar was named West Coast Conference Player of the Week after scoring both Portland goals in a 2-1 overtime win over Santa Clara.

Salazar followed Eric Cronkrite and Jarrod Weis as WCC Player of the Week winners this season.

### CRONKRITE NAMED WCC PLAYER OF THE WEEK, AND NATIONAL TEAM OF THE WEEK:

Junior midfielder Eric Cronkrite was named West Coast Conference co-Player of the Week, as well as to the College Soccer News Team of the Week. Cronkrite scored three goals in Portland's last two games. Cronkrite had a pair of goals in the 3-2 win over #16 Creighton, then a single goal in the 3-0 win over Cal Poly. Cronkrite also had game-winning goals against Creighton and Cal Poly.

**WEIS WAS WCC PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Jarrod Weis' four-assist effort vs. DePaul earned the junior midfielder his first-ever West Coast Conference Player of the Week honor. The four assists broke the WCC record (3, held by Nate Jaqua and Eric Cronkrite, vs. Air Force, 2001), and tied the Portland record (4, Jim Tursi, 1978).

the NIKE Portland Invitational. Portland won its second straight trophy in the tourney, while Jaqua won his third straight Most Valuable Player award. Portland senior midfielder Matt Domingo was the tourney's Outstanding Defensive Player.

In the early game, #7 Washington and DePaul played to a 1-1 double overtime tie.

**#15 PORTLAND 3, CENTRAL FLORIDA 0:** Jaqua and the Pilots scored three second-half goals, taking advantage when the Golden Knights (0-1-1) had to play the entire second half a man down after Koyondome Koyagialo was ejected with 1:20 remaining in the first half.

Jaqua ran onto Sheldin Maistry's short cross at 58:46 for Portland's first goal, ending an afternoon of frustration for the Pilots. Maistry had two headers stopped by the crossbar, and another shot deflect off the post. UCF keeper Ryan McIntosh came up with nine saves, including a lunging grab to pull a Jaqua header off the goal line.

Heath Pearce's first career goal at 83:14 put Portland up 2-0. Pearce drove the ball into the box on the left side, then rocked a bullet to the far post. Jaqua cleaned up at 89:02 when Domingo's leading pass allowed Jaqua to easily chip McIntosh from 12 yards.

The Pilots outshot UCF 23-7, and keeper Curtis Spiteri earned his 22nd career shutout and second of the season, tying the senior for second all-time in career blank sheets. The Domingo-led defense allowed only one UCF shot to get through to Spiteri.

**#7 WASHINGTON 1, DEPAUL 1 (2ot):** The Huskies and Blue Demons traded goals midway through the second half, but neither were able to cause any other serious damage. Patrick Tanner headed in a Seth Marsh corner kick at 59:06 to put Washington ahead 1-0, but Edwin Arreola answered at 67:26 with his own header off a Bob Kruse cross.

DePaul might have defender Patrick Vynke to thank for the tie, as he was responsible for a pair of outstanding plays on the goal line. In the first half, Vynke blocked a Brett Weisner shot off the line, then Vynke chested down a 22-yard Dayo Oyetuga floater after DePaul keeper Michael Timlin was caught at the top of the box.

Oyetuga had a first-half goal called back after the Washington forward was whistled for a foul in the box.

Washington outshot DePaul 20-6, but only six shots were on goal.

### NIKE PORTLAND INVITATIONAL-SATURDAY

Jarrod Weis tied a school record with four assists Saturday, leading #15 Portland to a 6-0 win over DePaul in

the NIKE Portland Invitational. In the tourney's first game, #7 Washington and Central Florida played to a 2-2 double overtime tie.

**#15 PORTLAND 6, DEPAUL 0:** Sheldin Maistry scored a pair of first-half goals for Portland, before the Pilots erupted for four second-half goals. Maistry's first goal came on an impossible angle, as the Canadian senior's bender from the end line off Eric Cronkrite's indirect free kick somehow found the net 19:02 into the match.

Weis then fed Maistry with a long through ball at 31:10, and Maistry easily chipped the DePaul keeper for his second goal. Weis collected his second assist just minutes into the second half, taking the ball deep onto the end line before zipping a short cross to Nate Jaqua. Jaqua extended completely for a diving header.

Freshman forwards Alejandro Salazar and Patrick Mooney added a pair of Pilot goals less than four minutes apart. Salazar headed in a Weis free kick at 54:47, and Mooney banged his goal off the post after Weis set him up with a through ball.

Jaqua completed the scoring at 84:28 after a nifty combination play from Josh Simpson and Ryan Domingo left the all-American forward alone in front of the goal for an easy score.

Portland outshot the Blue Demons 18-5, and Pilot keepers Curtis Spiteri (2) and Justin Carter had to make just two saves in the combined shutout.

**#7 WASHINGTON 2, CENTRAL FLORIDA 2 (2ot):** Washington lost a 2-1 halftime lead just three minutes into the second half, but held on for the tie despite having two players sent off in regulation and overtime.

Central Florida's Eric Vasquez gave the Golden Knights a 1-0 lead 9:36 into the match after beating the Washington keeper. Xavier Delgado's through ball left Vasquez in front of the Husky netminder, and Vasquez lofted a chipper into the net.

The Huskies answered at 19:32 on Seth Marsh's easy tap-in after Patrick Tanner had crossed the ball from right to left. Zac Tallman then converted a penalty kick at 26:06 after Dayo Oyetuga was dragged down in the box.

The Golden Knights knotted the score at 48:15 when Chris Beaulac drilled a rifling shot from 17 yards, after Vasquez' corner kick was deflected away from the goal.
