GAME DATA: The Pilots open their regular-season at the Top of the World Classic from Nov. 18-21 in Fairbanks, Alaska. On Friday, Nov. 19, the Pilots will face Northwestern University at 6:00 p.m. (Alaska Time). On Saturday, Nov. 20, the Pilots will face Western Michigan or New Mexico State in tournament play. Alaska-Fairbanks, Central Florida, Georgia Southern and Utah State round out the tournament field. The championship game of the Top of the World Classic will be on Sunday, Nov. 21.

WHAT'S AHEAD: Portland opens its home schedule on Saturday, Nov. 27 vs. Seattle University at 3:00 p.m. On Monday, Nov. 29, the Pilots will host the Cal Poly Mustangs at the Chiles Center for a 7:00 p.m. tip off.

A QUICK LOOK AT PORTLAND: The Pilot men's basketball team shot the lights out as they wrapped up exhibition play with a 111-83 win over the Concordia Cavaliers on Sunday, Nov. 14 at the Chiles Center. Previously, Portland recorded a 93-44 exhibition win over Trinity Western on Monday, Nov. 8 at the Chiles Center.

Possible starters for the Pilots at the Top of the World Classic are: Donald Wilson (Jr., G/F); Pooh Jeter (Jr., G); Dreshawn Vance (So., F); Karl Aaker (Sr., G/F) and Andreas Gahlmann (Sr., C).

The Pilots return three starters, seven letterwinners and add seven newcomers to this year's roster. Last year, the Pilots finished the West Coast Conference regular-season in a tie for sixth place. Portland ended its season with an 11-17 (.393) overall record and a 5-9 (.357) conference mark. The 11-17 (.393) overall record comprised the fourth-best win-loss record over the last 11 years. Portland's 5-1 start at the beginning of the 2003-04 season was the best start since Rob Chavez's 1998-99 team went 5-1 to open play. The Pilots posted a 6-6 (.500) home record, a 5-10 (.333) away record and a 0-1 (.000) neutral site record in 2003-04.

Head Coach Michael Holton is the 19th head coach in school history. In four seasons, Holton has a 28-58 (.326) career overall record and an 11-31 (.262) career WCC record. His 2003-04 team won 11 games and one more WCC win than the previous season, while posting impressive road wins at Oregon State and New Mexico.

Portland returns two players that received West Coast Conference recognition last season. Pooh Jeter took home 2004 first team all-WCC honors, a first for any Pilot sophomore since the 1977-78 season, while teammate Dreshawn Vance was a 2004 WCC all-Freshman team selection.

In a vote of the league's eight head coaches, the Pilots are picked to finish in eighth-place in this year's WCC race.

WHO'S BACK: Of the seven returnees from last season, two earned West Coast Conference honors. Junior **Pooh Jeter (G, 5-10, 175)** is currently tied for fourth on Portland's career leaders list in three-point field goal percentage (.386). Jeter ranked 18th nationally in free throw percentage (.868), leading the WCC last year. He was third in scoring (16.6) last season and also among the WCC statistical leaders in five other categories. Sophomore **Dreshawn Vance (F, 6-8, 205)** ranked third in the WCC statistical leaders in blocked shots and 30th in rebounding last season. He started in 14 games and played in all 28 games, while posting double-figure digits in four games and double-figure rebounds in one game. Vance averaged 4.5 points and 3.6 rebounds per game last year.

The Pilots' other five returnees also made significant contributions in 2003-04. Senior **Karl Aaker (G/F, 6-5, 215)**, forced to play in the paint much of last year, is a career 34.8 percent three-point shooter. He scored a career-best 20 points on 6-11 shooting from the field, 5-8 shooting from three-point range and four rebounds at Northern Arizona on Jan. 3. Aaker has started 26 of the 63 games he has played in at the collegiate level. Senior **Andreas Gahlmann (C, 6-8, 235)** started nine games and shot 61.5 percent from the field last season. For his career, Gahlmann has started in 17 games, seeing time in 38 contests, while posting a .534 field goal shooting percentage. **Donald Wilson (G/F, 6-4, 200)** was a two-time WCC Co-Player of the Week selection last season and was among the WCC statistical leaders in six categories. A 2002-03 honorable mention all-WCC selection, Wilson is an explosive offensive threat who can also bang down low and grab rebounds. Sophomore **Sean Smith (G, 6-2, 190)** saw time in 15 games last season and will utilize his perimeter shooting as another option for Portland's offensive arsenal. Last season, Smith recorded a career-best eight points in 10 minutes of play at Santa Clara. In 2003-04, Smith shot 42.1 percent from three-point range and 77.8 percent from the charity stripe. Sophomore **Chris Jackson (F/C, 6-9, 240)** saw limited time last season, making appearances in 12 games. He posted a career-high four rebounds at Duke in 12 minutes played.

WHO'S NEW: Two of the 12 players recruited as scholarship student-athletes on the 2004-05 roster will be freshmen. **Jeremiah Dominguez (G, 5-6, 150)** was named the 2004 *Oregonian* State Player of the Year after leading South Salem High School to the Class 4A basketball state championship, averaging 22.3 points and 6.0 assists in three tournament games. He was the 2004 Valley League Player of the Year for the second consecutive season after commanding the Saxons to an unblemished league record of 18-0. Dominguez averaged 21.4 points during the regular season as the Saxons compiled an overall record of 27-2. He was a two-time first team all-Valley League pick, an all-tourney selection at the Oregon State Championships and ranked fifth in the state of Oregon in scoring in 2003-04. **Marcus Lewis (F, 6-8, 235)**, from Long Beach, Calif. and Long Beach Poly High School, was a 2003-04 John Wooden Award winner, a member of the 2003-04 CIF Division IA Championship Team, was a 2003 all-CIF first team selection and the 2003 Moore League MVP. He helped lead Long Beach Poly High School to the 2003 Moore League Championship and averaged 18 points and 11 rebounds per game his junior year.

Sherrard Watson (F, 6-6, 180) from Sunset High School, will join the Pilots this season as a non-scholarship player. Watson was a 2003-04 first team all-Metro League pick, a 2003-04 honorable mention all-State selection and the *KATU* Channel 2 Player of the Month for March 2004. Watson was also a member of the 2003-04 Oregon all-Star Team and helped lead Sunset High School to the 2003-04 Metro League Co-Championship.

Sophomore **Ben Sullivan (C, 6-10, 230)** joins the Pilots after sitting out last season due to NCAA transfer rules. At Cal State Northridge, Sullivan played in 28-of-29 games in 2002-03 as a freshman, making four starts. He finished ninth on the squad in scoring at 3.6 points per game and was eighth in rebounding at 2.0 rebounds per contest. Sullivan averaged 11.3 minutes per game while shooting 38.7 percent (36-of-93) from the field and 28.3 percent (15-of-53) from three-point range. Transfer **Kevin Field (C, 6-11, 280)** will sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules. Field, a transfer from Oregon State, played in 38 games and shot 44 percent from the field for the Beavers in 2003-04. He also played in 20 games as a true-freshman in 2002-03.

Walk-on **Eric Wanless (C, 6-8, 220)** begins his career as a Pilot this season. A one-year letterwinner at Goldendale High School in Goldendale, Wash., Wanless was named the 2000 Most Improved player after his team made it to the 2000 state tournament. He will add depth to Portland's frontcourt.

QUOTING HOLTON: "Northwestern is a very well coached, deliberate half court basketball team; in contrast with our full court up-tempo approach, this game will certainly be a battle of styles and a battle to control the tempo of the game."

CHECKING OUT NORTHWESTERN: Northwestern University returns four starters, 10 letterwinners and adds three newcomers to the 2004-05 roster. Last season, the Wildcats went 14-15 overall, 8-8 for a fifth place finish in Big Ten play. Northwestern opened its exhibition season with a 59-48 win over DePauw on Nov. 11. Vedran Vukusik led all players with 18 points, 10 rebounds, three blocked shots and two steals. The 6-8 junior shot 4-of-8 from the field, 3-of-7 from three-point range and a perfect 7-of-7 from the free-throw line. Northwestern racked up 19 points from its bench and 18 points in the paint, while out rebounding DePauw 45-33.

Head Coach Bill Carmody returns for his fifth year at the helm and posts a 53-64 record with the Wildcats and a 145-89 career record.

Probable starters for the Cavaliers are: #3 TJ Parker (6-3, Jr., G); #00 Tim Doyle (6-5, So., G/F); #11 Vedran Vukusic (6-8, Jr, F); #31 Davor Duvancic (6-8, Sr., C); #24 Evan Seacat (6-2, Jr., G) or #14 Mohamed Hachad (6-4, Jr., G).

TOP OF THE WORLD CLASSIC: From its inception in 1996, the Top of the World Classic Division I Men's Basketball Tournament continues to be a premier pre-season favorite among NCAA Division I schools. It's mixture of warm Alaskan hospitality and high caliber basketball makes for a 12-game, four-day format that's hard to beat. Played in the spacious Carlson Center (4,901 capacity), the tournament displays the best in college basketball in the nation and the best in Alaskan hospitality and entertainment.

The Western Michigan Broncos finished 26-5 last season and closed out their year with a first-round loss to Vanderbilt University in the NCAA Tournament. NBA prospect Mike Williams led Western Michigan on the season with an average of 18.9 points per game and pulled down an average of seven rebounds per outing. Ben Reed helped Williams out offensively with 16.0 points per contest. Anthony Kann averaged 12.6 points a night and led the team in rebounding with an average of 7.2 caroms a game.

The Aggies of New Mexico State University closed out the season with a 13-14 overall record and a 6-9 slate in the Sun Belt Conference. With the 13 wins, legendary coach Lou Henson moved into seventh place on the NCAA all-time victories list with 775, just three short of Jerry Tarkanian (778) for the sixth spot. James Moore had the hot hand last season for the Aggies as he averaged over 15 points and six rebounds per game. He shot 53 percent from the field and was deadly from the free-throw line, nailing 83 percent of his tosses. Duane John scored 13.1 points per contest, while Kelsy Crooks averaged 8.4 points and 6.2 rebounds a game.

The University of Central Florida is coming off one of the best seasons in school history. The Golden Knights finished the year 25-6 after losing to Big East Conference powerhouse Pittsburgh in the first round of the 2004 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship. The Golden Knights punched their ticket to the Big Dance after posting three consecutive wins in the Atlantic Sun Conference Tournament thereby receiving the league's automatic bid into the postseason. For the Knights, it marked the first time in eight years since they last appeared in the NCAA Tournament. Dexter Lyons led UCF in scoring with an average of 18.3 points per game, shooting over 50 percent from the field. Roberto Morentin averaged 13.5 points and 6.9 rebounds a game, while Josh Bodden scored 10.9 points a contest and led the team in blocks with 40.

Utah State reached the first round of the 2004 National Invitation Tournament and finished the year 25-4 under head coach Stew Morrill. Utah State had three players in double figures for the season. Cardell Butler, who participated in the 2004 NCAA National Slam Dunk Contest, led the team with an average of 14.0 points per contest. He shot 48 percent from the field and 43 percent from long range. Nate Harris, who shot a blistering 67 percent from the field, averaged 11.7 points and 6.1 rebounds per game and Spencer Nelson led the team in rebounding with 7.2 caroms a contest and had an average of 11.5 points per game.

Georgia Southern finished the 2003-04 season with an impressive 21-8 overall record. Elton Nesbitt led GSU with an average of 15.8 points per game. He shot over 40 percent from the field and was a stalwart on defense, leading the team with 66 steals. Frank Bennett average 15.3 points per game, while Terry Williams chipped in with 12.1 points a contest. The Eagles, an annual contender for the Southern Conference bid to the NCAA Tournament, fell just short last year, losing to the University of Chattanooga in the conference semifinal game.

The University of Alaska Fairbanks is coming off its best season in school history, posting a 23-7 overall record and earning its second consecutive trip to the Division II National Tournament. The Nanooks, led by Great Northwest Athletic Conference Player of the Year Brad Oleson, reached the Sweet 16 of the national championship and came within four points of reaching the final eight teams. Oleson, a native of North Pole, Alaska averaged 22.9 points and 6.5 rebounds per contest. Sophomore Andrew Smith provided UAF the punch inside. Smith, a native of Anchorage, Alaska, averaged 10 points per game and pulled down an average of 5.9 rebounds per game. UAF set a couple of school records during the 2003-04 season, rewriting the record books for most victories in a season and most wins in the national tournament.

WCC AMONG THE NATION'S FINEST: The West Coast Conference emerged as a mid-major basketball power in the early 1950's and has continued the trend to present day. Currently, the WCC has two member institutions ranked or receiving votes in the national polls. Gonzaga was picked No. 25 in the *Associated Press* Preseason Poll and received 58 votes in the *USA Today/ESPN* Coaches Preseason Poll. Pepperdine received two votes in the *USA Today/ESPN* Coaches Preseason Poll. Gonzaga received a No. 1 ranking in the 2004-05 *CollegeInsider.com* Preseason Poll, while Saint Mary's was ranked No. 5 and Pepperdine came in at No. 7. West Coast Conference teams have recorded 59 NCAA Tournament appearances since 1952 and post a 56-61 (.479) combined NCAA Tournament record.

STATISTICALLY, WHAT THE PILOTS RETURN: Portland returns three starters and eight of the 14 letterwinners from last season. Here is a statistical breakdown of what the Pilots return in 2004-05.

Points: 55 percent, rebounds: 54 percent, three-point field goals: 51 percent, assists: 39 percent, steals: 55 percent, blocks: 48 percent, free-throws: 57 percent and minutes played: 49 percent.

RECAPPING CONCORDIA: The Pilot men's basketball team shot the lights out as they wrapped up exhibition play with a 111-83 win over the Concordia Cavaliers on Sunday, Nov. 14 at the Chiles Center.

Pooh Jeter posted his first double-double of his career with 28 points and 11 dimes. Jeter shot 8-of-15 from the field and 5-of-8 from beyond the arc tonight as three other Pilot players recorded double-figure scoring. Darren Cooper ended the game with 17 points, four assists and three steals, while freshman Marcus Lewis tacked on 14 points and six rebounds. Dreshawn Vance added 10 points and led the team with seven boards in the game. Portland shot 54 percent (47-78) from the floor, 46 percent (12-26) from three-point range and 63 percent (15-24) from the charity stripe.

"There were a lot of positives from tonight's game," said Pilot head coach Michael Holton. "We were unselfish and we were able to score a lot of points down low in the paint. I really like our team chemistry right now. At the same time, Concordia exposed some of our weaknesses and so we have some things to work on as we head up to Alaska."

Portland opened the scoring four seconds into the game as Vance tipped the ball to Jeter for an easy lay in and a 2-0 Pilot lead. Portland would then go on to score seven more points before the Cavaliers got on the board. At 17:28 left in the first half, a three-pointer by Jon Lee made it 9-3 Portland. At the 14 minute mark, the Pilots held a 20-5 lead, but a 10-0 run by Concordia narrowed the gap.

The Pilot crowd erupted around the nine minute mark when Donald Wilson made a steal at half court and then passed the ball to Jeter for the easy lay in. Jeter bounced the ball off the backboard and Wilson slammed it down with emphasis for a 31-18 Pilot advantage. With the clock winding down, it became a battle of the long-range shots. From the five minute mark until the end of the first half, combined, both teams recorded eight three-pointers.

The Pilots went into the lockerroom with a 57-37 halftime lead as Jeter and Cooper led Portland with 15 and 11 points. Brandon Erlandson led the Cavaliers with 16 first half points.

"I thought Concordia came out and played hard," said Jeter. "We knew it was going to be a challenge, but we wanted to set the tone early on and score big."

The Pilots came out of the locker room somewhat flat as the Cavaliers went on an early 10-4 run with 16:08 left in the game. Portland came back big, with points off the block from Lewis, Christopher Jackson and Cooper, pushing the lead back to 20 points. With nine minutes left, a Lewis spin move off the block ignited the crowd, as Portland led 76-58. With 3:24 left in the game, a Ben Sullivan free-throw gave the Pilots 100 points. Portland went on to score 11 more down the stretch for a 111-83 victory.

"We are striving everyday for excellence and are trying to go out there and play our best," said Jeter.

Erlandson led all players with 28 points and nine rebounds on 10-of-18 shooting from the field and 5-of-9 shooting from three-point range. Alex Hartman added 19 points and made 8-of-9 freebies for the Cavaliers. For the game, Concordia shot 44 percent (24-54) from the field, 42 percent (14-33) from behind the arc and 70 percent (21-30) from the charity stripe.

Portland finished with a 42-28 advantage on the boards. The Pilots cut down on their turnovers as the team combined for just 13 in the game, compared to CU's 26. On the flip side, Portland managed to gain 35 points off Concordia's mistakes. The Pilots also had 32 assists to CU's 16.

The Pilots held a huge advantage in the paint, scoring 52 points, while the Cavaliers team scored just six points down low. Portland pushed its up-tempo game, racking up 27 fast break points, compared to Concordia's three. The Pilot bench tacked on 55 points, while the Cavaliers scored 22.

RECAPPING TRINITY WESTERN: The Pilot men's basketball team made good on their promise to play an up-tempo style of basketball with an impressive 93-44 exhibition season opening win over Trinity Western on Monday night at the Chiles Center.

Four Pilots scored in double-figures as Portland shot 51 percent from the field for the game, and made 10-of-28 three-pointers overall. Senior Andreas Gahlmann and junior Pooh Jeter led the way, each tallying 13 points on the night. Gahlmann also led the Pilots with eight rebounds, while Jeter tacked on four assists and four steals. Darren Cooper recorded 12 points and six boards, while Sean Smith added 11 points.

"We've been practicing hard and we came out and played solid tonight," said Pilot head coach Michael Holton. "Everyone that played gave a good effort and that is something to build on."

Portland seamlessly handled the tip, as sophomore Dreshawn Vance got the ball into junior Jeter's hands for an easy lay-in to open the scoring. The Pilots also showed a marked improvement in rebounding as Vance's bank shot from Donald Wilson came after three offensive boards, for a 4-0 Portland lead. Trinity Western didn't even get on the board until the 18 minute mark, after the Pilots had gone on a 6-0 run.

UP turned up the quickness with a couple of easy fast-break hoops. On the first fast break, freshman Jeremiah Dominguez stole the ball from TWU's Adam Friesen and had the open court for the lay-in. Portland's tough first-half defense forced Trinity Western into taking several outside shots, as they made only one of six attempts from beyond the arc. The Pilots went on a 21-2 run to end the first half, featured by dunks from Wilson and freshman Marcus Lewis, as well as a few fast break opportunities by Dominguez.

"I thought we controlled the tempo of the game tonight and picked it up defensively," said Dominguez. "I am glad I could come in and contribute."

Portland led 40-18 at the break as Gahlmann was the only player on either team to score in double-digits (11).

"We were able to get out and run the ball early on, which allowed me to get some easy lay ins," said Gahlmann. "It was exciting for us to get out there tonight and play. We need to build on this win."

The Pilots came out of the locker room running, scoring early and easy in the second half. On one Pilot possession, Dominguez found Darren Cooper, threading a bounce pass across the lane for an easy lay in. The Pilots made the score 72-30 when freshman Sherrard Watson hit back-to-back treys, and then on the next possession, went coast-to-coast for yet another easy lay in.

Portland also stepped up the defensive intensity in the second half holding the Spartans to just 8-of-31 shooting from the field and 1-of-10 shooting from three-point range.

Adam Friesen and Logan Kitteringham combined for 23 points in the game. Kitteringham also led TWU with eight boards. For the game, the Spartans shot 27 percent (15-55) from the field, 13 percent (2-16) from behind the arc and 50 percent (12-24) from the charity stripe.

Portland finished with a 56-28 advantage on the boards. Typical of an early season game, both teams finished with 26 turnovers, but Portland managed to gain 37 points off TWU's mistakes. The Pilots also had 19 assists to Trinity Western's nine.

The Pilots held a big advantage in the paint, scoring 42 points, while the Canadian team managed just 16 points down low. Portland also capitalized on its speed, racking up 27 fast break points, compared to TWU's eight. The Pilot bench also provided assistance when called upon, with 53 points, while the Spartans scored just 10. Portland made seven of its free throws.

MEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

WCC PRESEASON POLL: The West Coast Conference released its preseason men's basketball coaches' poll on Oct. 11, 2004. The University of Portland, which received 18 votes in the poll, is picked to finish eighth. The Gonzaga University Bulldogs were picked by the WCC league coaches as the favorite to capture their fifth consecutive regular season West Coast Conference crown. The Zags tallied 60 points, receiving five first place votes to edge the Saint Mary's Gaels, who collected three first place votes and 56 points. The Pepperdine Waves are picked third in this year's poll, just behind Gonzaga and Saint Mary's with 51 points. Santa Clara is selected fourth with 36 points, followed by San Francisco (28), San Diego (20), Loyola Marymount (19), and Portland (18), respectively.

HEAD COACH MICHAEL HOLTON: Michael Holton was appointed head coach of the men's basketball program in April, 2001, becoming the 19th coach in the 77-year history of the Pilot program. Most recently, Holton received a five-year contract extension through the 2008-09 season.

Last season Holton coached Pooh Jeter to an all-WCC first team selection and developed Dreshawn Vance into an all-WCC Freshman team pick. Holton's Pilots finished the season ranked No. 17 in the nation in three-point accuracy, while Jeter finished 20th nationally, in free throw accuracy (.868, 92-of-106) in 2003-04. The 2003-04 Pilot team ended the season with a 11-17 overall record, 5-9 (T-6th) in WCC play.

Holton's 2002-03 team almost doubled the win output from the previous season, posting an 11-17 overall record, 4-10 in WCC play. No one will forget the Pilots' 72-68 wire-to-wire win over WCC rival Gonzaga in front of a sell out crowd at the Kennel in Spokane, Wash. Casey Frandsen and Donald Wilson, were 2002-03 honorable-mention all-WCC picks.

Holton's first Pilot team (2001-02) was among the nation's leaders in close losses, dropping 13 games by less than 10 points - including four overtime losses, and eight losses by less than five points. The 2001-02 season was highlighted by a 79-78 home win over Oregon - the school's first win over the Ducks in more than 30 years. Casey Frandsen was an honorable mention all-WCC pick, finishing third in scoring and among the top 50 scorers in the country (19.2 ppg).

Before he had even coached a game, Holton's first recruiting class was the Best in the WCC, according to Hoop Scoop Online, a national recruiting website. Holton returned to the campus where he began his Division I coaching career, having served the 1994-95 season under Rob Chavez. While at Portland in 1994-95 with Chavez, Holton helped direct the Pilots to a 21-8 record. At the time, it was the Pilots' most successful campaign in 37 years.

PILOTS ON THE TV/RADIO: The Portland basketball program is recognized on the national, regional and state level, by both the print and electronic media. With a national television audience looking on, or with listeners tuned to their radios and web sites throughout the state and beyond, Pilot basketball players receive the ultimate in exposure.

In recent years, Portland has appeared on several major national broadcast and cable networks. Last season, the Pilots hit the national spotlight Fox Sports Net's National ACC Sunday Night Hoops. The game was also available on most Fox Sports Net regional stations, including Fox Sports Northwest. Portland had five games televised last season and is scheduled to have at least another five in 2004-05, including games on FSN, ESPN2 and Comcast.

Follow the Pilots all season long with play-by-play man Darrell Aune on the Pilot radio Network Flagship station KKAD 1550 AM. Saturday and Sunday games will also be aired on KPAM 860 AM.

2003-04 WCC ALL-CONFERENCE TEAMS: The University of Portland men's basketball team had two players receive all-WCC honors as sophomore Pooh Jeter was a first team selection and teammate Dreshawn Vance was selected to the WCC all-Freshman squad.

Portland has had 34 all-WCC selections from 1977-present. Seven Pilot basketball players (out of 34 all-WCC selections) made the all-WCC team in their freshman and sophomore seasons. Four Portland sophomores have been selected to the all-WCC team. Jeter was the first sophomore since the 1977-78 season to become a first team all-WCC selection. Jeter ('03-'04) and Rick Ravio ('77-'78) were first team selections as sophomores, while Darwin Cook ('77-'78) was a second team pick and Dionn Holton ('95-'96) was an honorable mention selection. Three freshmen were selected to the all-WCC team with Greg Anthony ('86-'87) taking first team honors, while Ryan Jones ('99-'00) and Donald Wilson ('02-'03) were honorable mention picks.

2003-04 WCC STATISTICAL LEADERS: Portland, as a team led the WCC in three-point field goals made (7.39), was third in three-point field goal percentage (.391), free throw percentage (.720) and assist/turnover ratio (1.11). The Pilots also placed second in turnover margin (+2.25).

Individually, Portland ranked among the top in the WCC statistical leaders. Pooh Jeter led the conference in free throw percentage (.868), placed third in scoring (16.6) and was third in three-point field goal percentage (.444). He was fifth in three-pointers made (2.43), tied for seventh in steals (1.39) and 10th in both assists (3.21) and assist/turnover ratio (1.20). Donald Wilson tied for seventh in the league in steals (1.39), 11th in the league in free throw percentage (.732) and 15th in scoring (12.8). He was 16th in field goal percentage (.455) and 19th in rebounding at 4.7 per game. Adam Quick finished third in the WCC in assist/turnover ratio (2.20) and fifth in assists (4.32), eighth in three-point percentage (.400), ninth in three-pointers made (1.86) and 25th in scoring (9.8). Dustin Geddis placed seventh in rebounding (5.9) and blocked shots (0.86), eighth in defensive boards (4.21) and 28th in scoring (8.7). Freshman Dreshawn Vance ranked third in blocked shots at 1.18 per contest. Patrick Galos was 10th in rejections (0.71), while Casey Frandsen finished 10th in three-point field goals made (1.64) and 11th in three-point field goal percentage (.383).

UNIVERSITY OF PORTLAND

PILOTS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS: Last season the Pilots faced three teams ranked or receiving votes in the *Associated Press* Poll and *USA Today*/ESPN Coaches Poll.

The Pilots had their hands full in the early part of the 2003-04 season with some very tough non-conference competition. Portland's 2003-04 schedule featured eight games against six teams that were ranked or received votes in the national polls and competed in post season play in 2002-03.

The Pilots lost to then-No. 4 Duke University 84-43 at Cameron Indoor Stadium on Dec. 14, 2003. Portland fell 80-65 to then-No. 15 Gonzaga at the Chiles Center on Jan. 23, 2004 and lost, 79-69 to then-No. 6 Gonzaga Bulldogs at The Kennel on Wed., Feb. 18.

PILOTS IN THE NATIONAL STATISTICS: The Pilots finished the season ranked No. 17 in the nation in three-point accuracy. Portland shot 39.1 percent from behind the arc. Overall, the Pilots connected on 207-of-529 attempts from three-point land. Sophomore Pooh Jeter ranked 20th nationally in free throw accuracy (.868, 92-of-106).

REGULAR-SEASON PRACTICE SCHEDULE: The Pilots practice times vary on Mon.-Fri. in the Chiles Center on UP's campus. Prior notification of your intention to attend men's basketball practices is required. During men's basketball practices, the floor is closed to all media - however, members of the media are welcome to view activity from the upper level. REGULAR-SEASON WEEKLY INTERVIEWS: Michael Holton and Pilot players will be available throughout the season every Monday and Tuesday after practice (please call the SID office for practice times). The Pilots' team locker rooms and athletic training facilities will be closed to the media and public. Players are not available for interviews the day of the game (until post-game).

A member of the Portland sports information staff will gather interview requests immediately following the game. Box scores/ results will be provided and faxed upon request.
