### About The Pilots

The Pilots (6-11, 1-1 WCC) split their WCC opening road trip last weekend, defeating Pepperdine (82-78) on Saturday before falling to Loyola Marymount (73-68) on Monday. Sherrard Watson scored 22 points, Nik Raivio added 17 and Ethan Niedermeyer contributed a career-high 16 off the bench against Pepperdine. Robin Smeulders led the way with 16 points and nine rebounds in Monday's loss.

Portland is led in scoring by Raivio, a sophomore guard averaging 13.5 points per game. Raivio has reached double figures in 11 of the last 14 games, including three 20-point outings.

Watson is the only senior on the Pilots' roster and adds 11.4 points per game. Watson also averages 3.5 rebounds and is shooting 81 percent from the free throw line, up from 59 percent as a junior.

Smeulders, a sophomore forward, contributes 10.3 points per game off the bench along with 5.7 rebounds. He sat out last season after his amateur status was questioned by the NCAA because of his affiliation with a German club team. Smeulders does have international experience with the Dutch National Team. He has played with the Under-20 team at the last two European Championships and was named to the senior Dutch National Team this past summer.

Freshman F Luke Sikma is fourth in the WCC in rebounding at 8.4 per game. He also leads the Pilots in steals (19) and blocked shots (16).

Sophomore PG Taishi Ito, in addition to Watson, was voted a team captain by his peers and is coming off of an impressive freshman campaign. He led WCC freshmen in six statistical categories and started 17 games in earning WCC All-Freshman Team honors.

Despite not having a single post player with Division I game experience entering the season, Portland has a +5.6 rebounding margin to lead the WCC. The Pilots have outrebounded 13 of 17 opponents thus far this season, but Portland has struggled with turnovers (16.1 per game).

In Portland's six wins, the Pilots are limiting teams to 36 percent shooting and 26 percent from three-point range. In 11 losses, opponents are shooting 50 percent from the floor and 45 percent from long range.

Head coach Eric Reveno's roster features 10 underclassmen (including six true freshmen), one senior and two juniors. It is the eighth youngest roster in the nation according to kenpom.com. Reveno also received a signed National Letter of Intent from Toronto high school standout guard Nemanja Mitrovic (6-5, 190) during the early signing period in November.

## About San Francisco

The Dons (4-12, 0-1 WCC) and interim head coach Eddie Sutton opened West Coast Conference play with a 46-41 loss at San Diego last Saturday. Redshirt sophomore F Dior Lowhorn was the lone Dons player in double figures with 18 points and nine rebounds. USF shot 32 percent from the field, but limited the Toreros to 33 percent shooting. Sutton took over the program prior to the team's Dec. 28 game at Weber State after previous coach Jesse Evans took a leave of absence. Sutton is 0-4 since taking over and is just two wins shy of becoming the eighth coach in NCAA Division I history with 800 victories. Lowhorn leads the WCC and averages 20.7 points per game, while junior G Manny Quezada adds 15.4 to comprise the highest scoring duo in the league.

**Portland 82, Pepperdine 78:** Sophomore forward Ethan Niedermeyer came off the bench to score 16 points and help the Portland Pilots to an 82-78 victory over the Pepperdine Waves in the WCC opener for both schools on Saturday. Senior Sherrard Watson led the Pilots with a season-high 22 points. Nik Raivio added 17 points, eight rebounds and six assists.

**Loyola Marymount 73, Portland 68:** The Loyola Marymount Lions had four players score in double figures in a 73-68 victory over the Portland Pilots Monday evening. Sophomore forward Robin Smeulders led the Pilots with 16 points and nine rebounds off the bench. Portland committed 15 turnovers, including 11 in the first half, which led to a 20-5 edge in points off turnovers for the game. The Pilots gained a 37-32 edge on the boards in the loss.

### Pilots Look to Snap Losing Streak vs. USF

San Francisco has had the Pilots' number over the last four years. The Dons are on an eight game winning streak over Portland dating back to the 2003-04 season. Six of those eight games have been decided by five or few points and two have been overtime decisions.

### Conference Wide Open

With Saint Mary's and Gonzaga the only WCC schools with above-.500 records, the race for a top four finish and automatic WCC Tournament first round bye appears wide open. Portland hopes to crack the upper half of the league standings for the first time since the 1998 season, when the Pilots finished 7-7 and fourth place. Portland has not won six conference games in a year since then. Portland has had an above-.500 league record only four times in 31 years, most recently with a 10-4 mark in 1995.

### Pilots Seventh Youngest Team in the Nation

According to kenpom.com, Portland has the eighth youngest roster in the nation in terms of Division I experience among 341 teams.

### Youth Paying Early Dividends

Underclassmen have accounted for 80.0 percent of the minutes played and 76.7 percent of Portland's scoring through 17 games. The Pilots have started at least four underclassmen in every game this season, while seven underclassmen have played significant minutes already. Frosh forwards Luke Sikma and Kramer Knutson have started all 17 games in the post. Sophomore Nik Raivio has also started every game, while Taishi Ito has started all 13 games that he has been available. Freshman guard Jared Stohl started four games in place of Ito and is averaging 19.6 minutes per game. Sophomore Robin Smeulders comes off the bench to average 22.8 mpg, while sophomore forward Ethan Niedermeyer is averaging 14.1 mpg with two starts.

### Senior Leadership

Sherrard Watson is the lone senior on the roster and the team co-captain has played the lead role of late. He erupted for a season-high 22 points at Pepperdine, including numerous clutch baskets down the stretch to seal the victory. After being held scoreless in the season opener at Fresno State, Watson is averaging 11.4 points on the year. Watson, who struggled at the free throw line as a junior (.595), is shooting 81 percent at the line this season (58-for-72).

### Raivio Rises

Sophomore G Nik Raivio has settled in nicely to the role of Portland's primary scorer. He has eclipsed 20 points three times this season and leads the team in scoring at 13.5 points per game. He had a solid all-around game against Pepperdine with 17 points, eight rebounds and six assists with just one turnover in 31 minutes. Raivio set consecutive season highs, dropping 23 on Washington and 28 on Eastern Washington in mid-December. In Portland's win over Montana on Dec. 7, Raivio hit the game-winning three-pointer with 5.4 seconds remaining.

### Pilots Rev up Rebounding

Rebounding has been a focal point since head coach Eric Reveno took over the program last season and the message has been received by his players. Last year, the team had a positive rebounding margin for the first time since the 1994-95 season (+3.1), and this year the Pilots lead the WCC in rebounding margin (+5.6). Portland has outrebounded 13 of its first 17 opponents.

### Smeulders Coming on Strong

Sophomore forward Robin Smeulders led the Pilots with 16 points and nine rebounds at LMU on Monday. Smeulders previously posted a career high 22 points against Yale and followed with a solid 10-point, 9-rebound effort against Army. He is averaging 10.3 points and 5.7 rebounds per game off the bench for the Pilots. He has reached double figures 10 times through 17 games, including a 17-point effort in his collegiate debut at Fresno State. Smeulders had a frustrating freshman season when the NCAA deemed him ineligible for the entire year because he played for a German Club team prior to his arrival on The Bluff. The team paid some of his teammates to play, but Smeulders did not accept compensation from Braunschweig during his tenure with the team. The NCAA still ruled him ineligible and he was forced to practice all season without gaining game experience.

### Ito Back In Sync

Sophomore Taishi Ito missed four games earlier this season following the passing of his father after a long battle with a brain tumor. After returning to Japan to be with his family, Ito returned to the lineup against Montana and ran the show for Portland's lone road win. Last year, Ito earned All-WCC Freshman Team honors.

### Road Woes

Portland has struggled to a 2-7 record on the road thus far this season. The win over Pepperdine was the second straight over the Waves as last year's lone road win came at Pepperdine.

### Tale of Two Halves

The Pilots have outscored opponents 535-500 in the first half (+2.1 per game), but have been outscored significantly in the second period this season (701-615, -5.1 per game).

### Wins and Losses

In Portland's six wins, the Pilots are limiting teams to 36 percent shooting and 26 percent from 3-point range. In 11 losses, opponents are shooting 50 percent overall and 45 percent from long range. Portland is 0-9 this season when opponents shoot better than 45 percent.

### Sikma Among WCC Stat Leaders

Freshman forward Luke Sikma is No. 4 in the West Coast Conference in rebounding at 8.4 per game. Sikma, who has reached double-figure rebounds in six games already and has three double-doubles on the season as well. The Bellevue, Wash. native is also among the WCC leaders in a variety of categories. In addition to rebounding, Sikma leads the Pilots in blocked shots (16) and steals (19).

### Family Ties

The names Watson and Raivio were prominent on The Bluff long before current Pilots Sherrard Watson and Nik Raivio stepped foot in the Chiles Center. Their fathers, Sidney Watson and Rick Raivio, were teammates in the late 70's and early 80's. Sidney Watson played four years (1978-82) and averaged 4.0 points and 3.3 rebounds while shooting 55.3 percent from the floor throughout his 108 game career. Rick Raivio is the school's top all-time rebounder and No. 4 career scorer after playing from 1976-80. Another current Pilot has a familiar basketball name as well: Luke Sikma is the son of former NBA All-Star Jack Sikma.

### ESPN.com Lists Sikma Among Top Fresh in West

ESPN.com listed the top five freshmen from each of the four regions in late-Novemeber, highlighting five non-BCS players from the West, East, South and Midwest. Among the players getting recognition was Portland forward Luke Sikma. He was joined by Austin Daye (Gonzaga), Patrick Mills (Saint Mary's), Malcolm Thomas (Pepperdine) and Evan Washington (Air Force).

## Head Coach Eric Reveno



Eric Reveno was named head coach of the University of Portland men's basketball program on April 10, 2006, becoming the 20th coach in Pilot history. He previously served nine successful seasons as an assistant at Stanford. Reveno opened his head coaching campaign with a 9-23 record at Portland in 2007, including the program's first WCC Tournament victory in 10 years.

Reveno preaches a disciplined style of play, has a track record of player development, and respects the role of the student-athlete. A passionate recruiter, Reveno will rely heavily on a young roster of freshmen and sophomores this season. Of Portland's 13 roster players, 10 are underclassmen.

Reveno assembled an impressive first recruiting class at Portland despite coming on board late in April, 2006. He was able to land two players who were members of top 10 programs in the nation. He signed point guard Taishi Ito, a three-year starter for No. 9 Montrose Christian (Rockville, Md.), and also received a commitment from Ethan Niedermeyer, a two-year starter for No. 6 ranked De La Salle High School in Concord, Calif. Ito led WCC freshmen in six statistical categories and was named to the WCC All-Freshman Team in 2007. Niedermeyer started seven games for the Pilots and appeared in 29 contests as a freshman. Reveno went overseas for another newcomer, Robin Smeulders, a 6-9 combo forward who played club basketball in Germany and is a member of the Under-20 Dutch National Team. Smeulders sat out the 2006-07 season due to NCAA regulations, but will have three years remaining with the Pilots.

His 2007 recruiting class should also have an immediate impact on the program, as five freshmen and a sophomore will battle for playing time out of the gates. Reveno again scoured the country (and beyond) for his class, which includes 6-10 Canadian big man Jason Hannibal (25 ppg, 14 rpg); Luke Sikma, a first team all-state forward from Washington and son of former NBA star Jack Sikma; Jared Stohl, a sharpshooter and WesCo League MVP from Marysville, Wash.; Nik Raivio, a JC transfer with three years remaining and son of UP Hall of Famer Rick Raivio; B.J. Porter, an athletic guard who was named the Utah '1A' State Player of the Year; and Kramer Knutson, an energetic big man from Mesa, Arizona (13.7 ppg).

An imposing 6-foot, 8-inch figure, Reveno commands respect not with his mere presence, but with his passion for and teaching of a disciplined style of play reminiscent of his formative coaching years as an assistant under legendary coach Mike Montgomery at Stanford. He also points to the coaching philosophies of Tom Davis, the man who recruited and coached him at Stanford his first two years, and legendary coach Pete Newell as major influences on his coaching style.

Reveno served as an assistant coach under Montgomery for seven years before being promoted to associate head coach during the 2004-05 season with new head coach Trent Johnson in recognition of his contribution to the success of the program on the coaching, recruiting and managerial fronts.

A post player for the Cardinal in the late '80s under both Davis and Montgomery, Reveno helped coach his alma mater to seven 20-win seasons, three 30-win seasons, eight NCAA Tournament appearances, an NCAA Final Four in 1998, three years with a No. 1 national ranking, four Pacific-10 Conference Championships and a .768 overall winning percentage.

He has developed a reputation as one of the top post player coaches in the country. Reveno recruited and coached numerous outstanding frontline players for the Cardinal including Mark Madsen, Jarron Collins, Jason Collins, Curtis Borchardt, Tim Young, Rob Little, Justin Davis and Matt Haryasz. He has also been a prominent staff member at the nationally renowned Pete Newell Big Man Camp for six seasons. Seven players under Reveno's tutelage at Stanford went on to play in the NBA.

A Pacific-10 Conference All-Academic Team selection himself in 1989 as a senior, Reveno helped coach 14 players to 25 all-conference academic honors as an assistant, the most of any school in the Pac-10 during his nine-year tenure. In his first year at UP, senior Ben Sullivan earned league All-Academic honors as well.

On the recruiting trail Reveno's final class at Stanford was ranked in the top 10 nationally for the 2006-07 season, including two of the top 20 rated individual recruits in the nation. He was rated as a Top 25 Recruiter in 2006 by rivals.com for his efforts at Stanford and Portland.

Described as a "fierce competitor" on the court, Reveno played in 116 games during his four-year career at Stanford (1985-87, 89), including 30 games as a starter during his senior season in 1988-89. A two-time team captain and most inspirational player, Reveno averaged 9.4 points and 5.1 rebounds per game as a senior and helped lead the Cardinal to a 26-7 record, a 15-3 mark in the Pac-10, and a No. 12 national ranking. The Cardinal advanced to the NCAA Tournament, Stanford's first appearance in the tourney since the 1942 season.

After graduating from Stanford in 1989 with a degree in economics, he spent four years playing professional basketball in Japan. He returned to Stanford and obtained his masters degree in business administration in 1995. Prior to joining the Stanford coaching staff in 1997, he served as president for two years of Riekes Center in Menlo Park, a non-profit mentoring organization that works with athletes of all ages.
