GAME NOTES • WEEK 8

Friday Night Lights • This is Princeton's third straight year with a Friday night contest on ESPNU. In 2006, Princeton kept Brown out of the end zone for the only time in the Phil Estes era for a 17-3 win. Last season, Jordan Culbreath had his breakout performance in a 34-31 win over Cornell.

Call To Duty • Dave Cohen (play-by-play) and Gus Ornstein (color) will call Friday night's contest on ESPNU. The game is also available on DirecTV channel 609; however, the game will not be video-streamed on GoPrincetonTigers.com.

Triple Play • The Penn-Princeton series moves to triple digits today; this is the 100th meeting in a series Princeton leads 63-35-1. Princeton has played Penn more times than any opponent besides Yale (130) and Harvard (101).

Even Steven • Although Princeton does lead the overall series significantly, since Penn's first win over Princeton in 1892 (6-4), the series is 35-35-1.

Close Calls • From 1998 through 2003, the average margin of victory in the Penn-Princeton series was 21.5 points. In the last four games, the margin of victory has been 6.5 points, and both games played at Princeton Stadium have been decided by one point.

Pitch And A Prayer • Two years ago, Princeton defeated Penn for the first time at Princeton Stadium on the now-famous fourth-down pitchback from Rob Toresco to Jeff Terrell in the second overtime session. The play would earn SportsCenter's "Top Play" distinction on a day that featured games in Division I-A, the NBA and the NHL.

Flagged • Four years ago, Penn defeated Princeton 16-15 after missing a potential go-ahead kick in the final three minutes but getting a second opportunity after getting flagged for a dead-ball false start. The attempt was moved back five yards and Derek Zoch made the 27-yarder.

Pointless • Last year's 7-0 Penn win was the lowest-scoring game in this series since 1955, when Princeton defeated Penn 7-0. It also marked the only time Princeton has been shut out under ninth-year head coach Roger Hughes.

Head Of The Class • Princeton needs to win its final three games to end the season with a winning record, which would allow The Class of 2009 to graduate with three winning seasons in four years. The last class to graduate with that distinction was The Class of 1998, which recorded winning seasons in 1994, 1995 and 1997. In both cases, the senior class would have gone 7-3 as freshmen, won the Ivy League title as sophomore and gone 6-4 as seniors.

The First Shall Be Last • In all seven of Princeton's games this season, the team that has scored first has lost.

Working Overtime • Princeton has won five straight overtime games overall, including the double-overtime contest over Penn in 2006.

The Jordan Rules • Princeton junior Jordan Culbreath leads the Ivy League and ranks 15th nationally in rushing with 114.9 yards per game. The last Princeton player to lead the league in rushing was Keith Elias '94 (1,575 yards in 1993). At his current pace, Culbreath would finish the year with the fourth-best single-season rushing total in Princeton history, behind only Keith Elias (twice) and Judd Garrett.

Double Trouble • Besides Yale's Mike McLeod, the 2007 Ivy League rushing champion, Jordan Culbreath has more than twice as many rushing yards as any player in the league. Penn's Mike DiMaggio ranks third with 56 rushing yards per game, 58.9 yards fewer than Culbreath.

Happy Memories • Prior to Princeton's last time on ESPN, a 2007 contest against Cornell, Jordan Culbreath had nine rushes in his career. That night, he ran the ball 11 times for 145 yards and two touchdowns, including one that would be named "Top Play" on SportsCenter.

A Perfect 10 • Jordan Culbreath has scored seven of his eight touchdowns on the ground this season; the last Princeton player to rush for 10 touchdowns in a season was Cameron Atkinson, who did it in 2002.

LAST TIME: PENN 7, PRINCETON 0

A 26-yard touchdown run by Joe Sandberg was the lone scoring play in a 7-0 victory for the Penn football team over Princeton on a beautiful November afternoon at Franklin Field. The two defenses dominated the game, but it was Penn's that came up with the crucial touchdown-saving interception that ultimately saved the shutout for the Quakers.

Princeton, which was shut out for the first time since the 1999 season, fell to 3-5, 2-3 in Ivy League play. The Tigers were eliminated from title contention with the loss.

Junior linebacker Collin McCarthy recorded his second straight double-digit-tackle performance with 14 stops, including two for loss. Fellow linebacker Tim Boardman had 12 tackles, while defensive back Kevin Kelleher recorded seven. McCarthy, Doorri Song and Pete Buchignani each recorded a sack, while Dan Kopolovich recorded a team-high two pass breakups.

Following a scoreless first quarter in which Princeton never moved past midfield, the Tigers nearly scored first on Greg Mroz' only drive at quarterback. Following a fortunate special teams break, when Penn was unable to down the ball at the 1-yard-line, Mroz hit Berry on a 10-yard out. The next pass went significantly further, as Mroz found Toresco on a seam pattern down the middle of the field. Toresco got between both safeties and seemed headed for six points, but he was caught from behind by Chris Wynn. That would prove crucial, as Britton Ertman picked off a tipped 3rd-and-goal pass in the end zone and returned it to the Tiger 38-yard-line. Mroz was injured during the tackle and didn't return to the game.

Wideouts Will Thanheiser and Brendan Circle were also early injury casualties, leaving freshmen Trey Peacock and Matt Ransom to join Adam Berry in the offensive packages. Princeton did have several chances in the second half to muster a scoring drive, but the Tigers couldn't finish any of them.

About Princeton University

Princeton's main campus covers 500 acres, and its more than 160 buildings exemplify a wealth of architectural styles, ranging from colonial buildings to collegiate Gothic dormitories to modern structures by eminent architects.

Coeducational since 1969 (women comprise about 45% of an average freshman class), Princeton enrolls approximately 6,400 students (4,600 undergraduates/1,800 graduate students). Coming from all 50 states and from more than 70 foreign countries, Princeton students are an unusually talented and diverse group that represents many economic, ethnic, social, cultural and religious backgrounds. Minority students usually make up 25-30% of freshman classes.

Students are apt to choose Princeton for the strength of its academic program, its relatively small size combined with the resources of a major research university and the personal attention its undergraduates enjoy. Men and women who seek a quality education in the liberal arts, architecture, engineering or public and international affairs will discover that Princeton has much to offer.

Princeton offers an abundance of extraordinary resources, including a library system that holds almost five million books and almost 35,000 current journals and periodicals—nearly all on accessible open-stack shelving; an art museum that exhibits works from its own and other outstanding collections, complementing courses in art and archaeology; a natural history museum; a computing center and clusters of microcomputers throughout the campus; and outstanding recreational and athletic facilities.

Beyond the University's historic campus is the town of Princeton, a community of 30,000 people and the home of the Institute for Advanced Study (where Albert Einstein spent the last 22 years of his life), Princeton Theological Seminary and Westminster Choir College of Rider.

Ground Attack • Jordan Culbreath has recorded back-to-back career efforts in his last two games. Against Harvard two weeks ago, he rushed for 154 yards and two touchdowns. Last weekend, in a 31-26 victory at Cornell, he topped that mark with 169 yards rushing; that was the most yards for a Princeton back since Jon Veach ran for 205 yards at Harvard in 2003 and the fourth-most for any back in Hughes' tenure.

Playing The Percentages • In Princeton's three wins this season, senior quarterback Brian Anderson has completed 73.4 percent of his passes. In four losses, he has completed only 48.5 percent.

Will The Thrill • Senior wide receiver Will Thanheiser recorded his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the season when he caught seven passes for 108 yards and two touchdowns at Cornell last weekend. He ranks second in the Ivy League and 10th nationally with 100.4 receiving yards per game.

Third And One (Thousand) • Will Thanheiser can do something this season only two other Princeton players have done; he is on pace for 1,000 receiving yards this year, a feat only Kevin Guthrie (1982, 1983) and Derek Graham (1983) have ever accomplished.

Twice As Nice • Will Thanheiser caught two touchdown passes last weekend; the last Princeton player to have two touchdown catches in a game was Brendan Circle (Yale, 2006).

Line 'Em Up • The starters on the Princeton offensive line have combined for 78 starts heading into the weekend, including 26 for Mark Paski and 21 for J.P. Makrai.

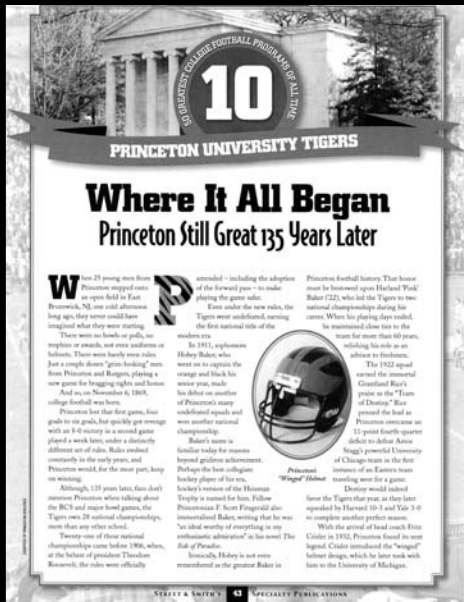
Tackling The Issue • Sophomore Steve Cody ranks fourth in the Ivy League with 9.3 tackles per game and recorded 11 last weekend at Cornell. He has recorded at least 10 tackles in five of seven games this year.

Sack Race • The Princeton defense entered last weekend averaging fewer than two sacks per game. Against Cornell, the top pass offense in the league, the Tigers managed four sacks, including 1.5 from Scott Britton.

When Street & Smith published its "50 Greatest College Football Programs Of All Time," the Top 10 was filled with the usual suspects: Notre Dame, Oklahoma, U.S.C., etc. But none of those teams have played the game as long as another Top 10 program.

Princeton cracked the Top 10 of that list because of its historical importance to the sport and the amazing list of players and coaches who have proudly represented the Orange and Black over 136 seasons of college football.

As a Division I-AA program, fans won't get the chance to watch a Princeton squad compete for the B.C.S. national championship. Of course, long before the modern system, you couldn't discuss the national title without mentioning Princeton. The Tiger football program has won 28 national titles (see chart on right side), more than any other program. Princeton claimed the Ivy League's last Heisman Trophy winner in 1951, the legendary Dick Kazmaier, and has put five coaches into the College Football Hall of Fame.

College hockey has its own version of the Heisman Trophy, the Hobey Baker Award. Baker starred as a hockey and football player at Princeton, and he helped lead the 1911 squad to an undefeated season and a national championship.

While the historic teams were the ones to produce the national titles, more recent names like Cosmo Iacavazzi, Keith Elias and 2006 graduate Jay McCareins earned All-America honors after performing at the highest level while representing one of the most respected universities in the world.

College football is a cherished institution in American culture, and the tradition at Princeton played a critical role in that development.

Go Cart • Junior defensive back Cart Kelly recorded one of Princeton's biggest defensive plays of the season last weekend when he intercepted a Nathan Ford pass in the end zone during a 31-26 win at Cornell.

Half And Half • In Princeton's three wins this season, the defense has allowed nine points per game in the second half. In four losses, it has allowed 18.5 points per game in the second half.

Classic Koch • Senior nose tackle Matt Koch had one of his best career games last weekend; he recorded seven tackles, tipped two passes at the line and forced a fumble in the win at Cornell.

Great Britton • Junior Scott Britton had 1.5 sacks and nine tackles in Princeton's win over Cornell. In Princeton's four Ivy League games this season, Britton leads the team with 10 tackles per game.

D-Plus • Senior Collin McCarthy recorded a career-best 14 tackles in last season's 7-0 loss to Penn. McCarthy shares the team lead with three sacks this season and has four tackles for loss.

Old And Newell • Senior Barry Newell made his first start at cornerback against Harvard and finished second on the team with six tackles. Newell was working his way into the rotation before suffering a knee injury early in his career, but has battled all the way back.

Re-Pete • Senior Pete Ploszek, a converted running back, has moved into the starting lineup at free safety. He recorded a career-high eight tackles in his first start against Colgate.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES • WEEK 8

Return To Sender • The top two kickoff return specialists in the Ivy League will face off tonight. Penn's Chris Winn leads the league with a 26.1-yard average, while Princeton's Meko McCray is second with a 24.7-yard average.

Just For Kicks • Sophomore Ben Bologna has handled kickoffs all season, but he moved into the starting placekicker role when Connor Loudon got injured at Colgate and has successfully made all four field goal attempts this season. Bologna's longest kick is a 35-yard extra point four weeks ago against Colgate, which followed a personal foul.

Happy Anniversary • Princeton is celebrating its 10th year at Princeton Stadium, one of the newest and finest facilities in the Division I FCS. Powers Field, a FieldTurf surface, was added in 2005 after a generous gift from alumnus William Powers '79.

The Crystal Ball • The 131st meeting between Princeton and Yale, the second-longest active rivalry in college football, will be shown on the Versus Network (DirecTV 608) Saturday, Nov. 15, at noon. Princeton's last trip to the Yale Bowl was in 2006, when the Tigers rallied from a trio of 14-point deficits to top the Bulldogs 34-31 en route to the Ivy League title. Home Sweet Home • Princeton will honor the Class of 2009 prior to its final home game on Nov. 22 against Dartmouth. Roger Hughes

**THE CHARLES W. CALDWELL JR. '25
HEAD COACH OF PRINCETON FOOTBALL
NINTH SEASON • DOANE '82**

Roger Hughes, the Charles W. Caldwell Jr. '25 Head Coach of Football at Princeton University, has guided Princeton football back into the Ivy League elite, and he has put together some historic numbers in recent years. Of course, Hughes is more interested in the present and future, and he is ready to compete for a second Ivy championship in three years during the 2008 season.

An Eddie Robinson Award finalist for Division I-AA Coach of the Year in 2006, Hughes led a Princeton squad that was picked to finish sixth in the preseason media poll to a 9-1 record and the 2006 Ivy League title. The nine wins were the most at Princeton since 1964 and the league title was the first for the Orange and Black in more than a decade.

Hughes, who has improved Princeton's winning percentage in six of the last eight seasons and is the only coach in the history of Ivy League football to improve a team by at least two wins in three straight seasons, guided Princeton to the 2006 title despite starting an entirely new offensive line and linebacking corps. His offense finished first in the Ivies in both passing yards and total yards, and his senior quarterback, Jeff Terrell, became Princeton's first Bushnell Cup winner (Ivy League Player of the Year) since 1995. Terrell became only the second Princeton quarterback to win the award; the other is longtime NFL quarterback and current Dallas Cowboys offensive coordinator Jason Garrett. Princeton rallied to win five games it trailed in the second half, four games it trailed in the fourth quarter and two games it trailed in the final five minutes.

That championship run followed a brilliant 2005 season, when the Tigers earned their first seven-win campaign since 1995. Outside of the 2003 season, when four starters, three of whom were All-Ivy picks and eventually invited to NFL mini-camps, were lost for the season, Princeton has won 33 of its last 52 games (63.5%).

Under Hughes, 24 Tigers have earned first-team All-Ivy honors, and 50 others have been named to either the second team or earned honorable mention. His highest number came in 2005, when 10 Princeton players earned All-Ivy honors. He also had a pair of All-Americans in Jay McCareins, a Buck Buchanan finalist for Defensive Player of the Year, and Colin McDonough.

He has also had significant success helping his players move to the next level; within one month after the 2006 NFL Draft, four members of the Class of 2006 (Ben Brielmaier, Jon Dekker, Jay McCareins and Justin Stull) had signed with NFL teams. One season earlier, three departing seniors were invited to mini-camps, and Zak Keasey would eventually sign

and play for the Washington Redskins. 2006 Bushnell Cup winner Jeff Terrell signed with the Kansas City Chiefs within hours of the 2006 NFL Draft.

Hughes was named head coach at Princeton in January 2000, and he took a team starting 10 freshmen and sophomores to a 3-7 record in his first season. Along the way Princeton improved its Ivy League record by two games, to 3-4, and defeated a pair of 7-3 teams, Brown and Yale. Hughes coached three players in his first season at Princeton who signed NFL contracts, including one, Ross Tucker, who started for the Dallas Cowboys in 2002 and later for the Buffalo Bills.

Hughes has coached 74 All-Ivy League players, including 24 first-team selections, and several All-America selections. He has also coached nine District II Academic All-Americans, three Roper Trophy winners for the top senior male athlete at Princeton and two of the four winners of the 2000 National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Award. During the 2002 season, running back Cameron Atkinson was one of 14 overall winners of the National Scholar-Athlete Scholarship, and he was the lone winner from the Ivy League.

Hughes, who holds a Ph.D. from the University of Nebraska, came to Princeton after nearly a decade as offensive coordinator at Dartmouth, where he led an offense that propelled the Big Green to a 22-game winning streak and two Ivy League championships. While at Dartmouth, he helped develop Jay Fiedler into an NFL quarterback.

Hughes helped the Big Green to Ivy League championships in 1992 and 1996. He coached players who set 14 of the top 15 school single-game passing and total yardage records, as well as four of the top five single-season totals. The 1996 team went 10-0, one of four teams in league history to do so.

Hughes is a product of the football-mad state of Nebraska, where he grew up in tiny Crawford, population 1,115. A three-sport athlete at Crawford High School, Hughes attended Nebraska Western Junior College on a basketball scholarship. He left after one year to attend Doane College in Crete, Neb., where he played football as a tight end and golf before graduating in 1982.

He began his coaching career at Doane as he began his graduate work at Nebraska the following year. He then moved to Lincoln as a graduate assistant, helping the Cornhuskers to the 1984 Sugar Bowl and the 1985 Fiesta Bowl while working on his doctorate. He continued his career at Doane again, as offensive coordinator in 1987, and he earned his Ph.D. in exercise physiology from Nebraska in 1987. He spent the next five years at Wisconsin-Whitewater and Cameron University.

Hughes, 48, is married to the former Laura Van Werden, a certified public accountant. The couple has a daughter, Maddison, age 12.

THE CITADEL 37, PRINCETON 24 PRINCETON 10, LEHIGH 7

CHARLESTON, S.C. - The 2008 Princeton football team came out in its season opener at The Citadel ready to rid itself of any bad taste from last year. It came out aggressive, determined and, ultimately, successful. Unfortunately, the 22nd-ranked Citadel team came out of halftime with similar feelings, and those pushed the talented Bulldog squad to a 37-24 win over the Tigers.

Trailing 17-7 at halftime, The Citadel used a blocked punt returned for a touchdown to ignite a 20-0 run that sent the Bulldogs to their second win of the season. A long punt return from Bulldog All-America receiver Andre Roberts, who scored twice in the win, also helped the home team during the decisive third quarter.

Princeton, which dealt with a raucous crowd of 13,120 at Johnson Hagood Stadium, did show several positive signs as it draws closer to the Ivy League season. The offense gained 358 yards, including 206 in the air, and Jordan Culbreath rushed for a game-high 74 yards and a touchdown. Senior quarterback Brian Anderson completed 20-of-41 passes, including two touchdowns, and threw his only interception in desperation time.

Sophomore Trey Peacock topped his entire 2007 total with seven catches for 47 yards, while both Matt Zimmerman and Adam Berry scored touchdowns.

Sophomore inside linebacker Steven Cody made his first start count, recording 11 tackles, including five solo stops. Tri-captain Matt Koch had

seven tackles, while junior Wilson Cates had six tackles and an interception. Senior Collin McCarthy added five tackles and a sack on The Citadel's first offensive play of the game.

After a successful opening drive yielded a 31-yard field goal for Connor Loudon, Princeton scored on two touchdown drives in the second quarter, including one that ended with 18 seconds remaining.

The Citadel blocked Princeton's first punt of the second half and scored on the return. That ignited a 30-0 run that pushed the Bulldogs to their second win of the season. Berry's 13-yard touchdown to end the game got Princeton to within 13 points; despite recovering an onside kick, Princeton couldn't get closer.

PRINCETON, N.J. - Two years ago, Connor Loudon suffered a leg injury that some feared would end his career. He worked tirelessly with the hopes of kicking again; Saturday night, he kicked the Princeton football team into the 2008 Ivy League season with plenty of momentum. Following a terrific defensive performance, including a 4th-and-inches stand, Loudon converted a 32-yard field goal on the final play of a 10-7 Princeton victory on Powers Field at Princeton Stadium.

With the game tied at 7 and approximately one minute remaining, the Lehigh offense stood on the Princeton 33-yard-line and needed less than a yard for a first down and the opportunity at a game-winning field goal attempt. Mountain Hawk tailback Matt McGowan, who gained 83 yards during the game, took the ball and went into the heart of the line. The heart of that line happens to be Princeton tri-captain Matt Koch, who stuffed McGowan short of the marker and handed the Princeton offense the ball with 55 seconds remaining and plenty of energy.

One play later, it also found itself in field goal range. Senior quarterback Brian Anderson, who completed 20-of-29 passes for 244 yards, rolled right and found classmate Will Thanheiser 46 yards down the field. The Tiger wideout, who caught nine balls for 120 yards, caught it inside the sideline to set up a first down at the Lehigh 21 yard line. After three runs by Jordan Culbreath, Loudon came out for his second field goal attempt of the game.

His first was blocked and nearly returned for a touchdown, but that was the furthest thing from Loudon's mind. He split the uprights to ignite a team celebration at midfield.

The kick was a fitting climax to a wild game. Offensively, Princeton moved the ball consistently, especially in the first half but only had seven points to show for it. Culbreath ran the ball 20 times for 126 yards and a touchdown. His 1-yard touchdown run was Princeton's first scoring conversion after three straight drives inside the Lehigh 2 yard line.

The rest of the game would be a battle of defenses, and Princeton's would win out. Sophomore Steve Cody recorded 10 tackles, marking consecutive games with double-digit tackles to start his career, while Jeff Jackson, starting in place of Callahan, recorded nine tackles, a sack and an interception. Scott Britton recorded nine tackles, while Wilson Cates had five stops and two tackles for loss.

PRINCETON 27, COLUMBIA 24

It was during a Friday practice when Trey Peacock made a mistake on a certain route Princeton planned to run in the following day's Ivy League opener at Columbia. After getting an earful from the coaches, Peacock made sure to fix his error. Fortunately for the Tigers, he fixed it on a 52-yard touchdown reception that helped Princeton to a league-opening 27-24 thriller over the Lions.

The game was yet another nail-biter between Princeton and Columbia at Wien Stadium. Four of the five games played here during the Roger Hughes' era have been decided by three points or fewer, including this one. Columbia looked to break that streak in the final minutes, as Lion quarterback Shane Kelly began moving his offense in the final minutes of the fourth quarter. He guided the Lions from their own 17 to the Princeton 39, where they called a wideout screen to Mike Stephens. Junior linebacker Scott Britton stripped it near the sidelines and Cart Kelly beat a trio of Lions to the ball. A first-down run by Jordan Culbreath locked up the win.

While that drive clinched the win, it was the previous one that put Princeton in position to share first place in the Ivy League with Brown, Cornell and Penn. After Jordan Davis' one-yard touchdown run with 10:35 remaining gave Columbia a 24-21 lead, Anderson took the ball back and looked for a go-ahead drive. An 18-yard pass to Will Thanheiser converted a 3rd-and-12, and two plays later, Anderson hit Peacock on a 52-yard post pattern for the go-ahead score. The extra point was blocked, ending Connor Louden's

string of 55 straight PAT conversions.

Anderson concluded another strong game by completing 14-of-19 passes for 237 yards and three touchdowns. Will Thanheiser recorded his second straight 100-yard game with seven catches for 132 yards and a touchdown. Peacock caught two passes for 86 yards and a score.

Princeton had three defenders with double-digit tackles, including senior Collin McCarthy, who recorded 11 tackles, including two for loss, and a sack. Britton had 11 tackles and sophomore Steven Cody, the No. 2 tackler in the Ivy League, finished with 10 stops. As a team, Princeton recorded seven tackles for loss and two pass breakups.

COLGATE 27, PRINCETON 24

Despite a spectacular effort from Princeton tailback Jordan Culbreath, the Colgate football team used a 33-yard field goal from Jacob Stein with two seconds remaining to pull out a 27-24 home victory over Princeton at Andy Kerr Stadium.

The game was a back-and-forth thriller that saw Colgate hold four different leads and Princeton hold three. The Tigers eliminated an eight-point deficit in the fourth quarter with a six-play, 59-yard drive that ended with a three-yard touchdown pass to Billy Mitchell, who came into the game with one career touchdown reception. A two-yard crossing pass to Will Thanheiser on the two-point conversion evened the score with 9:23 remaining.

Colgate took over and moved into Princeton territory, but a botched handoff on fourth down gave Princeton the ball with 4:42 remaining. A first-down run by Brian Anderson, who used his legs to keep the Colgate defense off balance throughout the game, gave Princeton a first down at midfield. Two short runs and an incompletion forced a punt, which was nearly downed at the 1 but was ruled a touchback. Colgate quarterback Greg Sullivan finished a brilliant day of his own with completions of 14, 21 and 10 yards on a drive that went 64 yards on seven plays in 1:08. That allowed Stein to kick the game-winning 33-yarder with two seconds left.

Culbreath, in a head-to-head showdown against NCAA rushing leader Jordan Scott, ran 18 times for 153 yards and a touchdown; it was a career high for the Tiger junior in rushing yards and the first time an opponent ran for more than 150 yards against Colgate in 17 games. Anderson added 77 yards rushing, including an impressive 24-yard touchdown run with 17 seconds left in the first half; the Princeton tri-captain ended the run by driving a trio of Colgate defenders over the final three yards and into the end zone. Will Thanheiser ended the day with three catches for 85 yards, but no other Princeton player had more than one catch.

The defense was led by Wilson Cates and Steven Cody, both of whom had 10 tackles. Cody, who has recorded four consecutive double-digit tackle games to open his career, added an 11-yard sack late in the first half that kept Colgate from potentially taking a double-digit lead. Junior Scott Britton and senior Pete Ploszek both made eight tackles.

BROWN 31, PRINCETON 10

Brown quarterback Michael Dougherty didn't post the same record-breaking numbers he had last week, but he guided a talented offense to two first-quarter touchdowns and two third-quarter touchdowns in a 31-10 victory over Princeton Saturday afternoon on Powers Field at Princeton Stadium. The win, Brown's first in six tries at Princeton Stadium, leaves Brown as one of two 2-0 teams in Ivy play, while Princeton shares second place with three other teams.

While the Brown offense has deservedly gotten much of the credit this season, it was the defense that really thwarted Princeton for much of the day. The Bears limited Princeton to a season-low 197 total offensive yards, including 76 on the ground. Junior running back Jordan Culbreath, who entered the weekend leading the Ivy League in rushing, was limited to 67 yards and held out of the end zone for the first time all season. Teammate Meko McCray, running twice on end arounds, scored Princeton's lone touchdown of the day on a 12-yard run in the second quarter.

The passing game struggled in more ways than one. Starter Brian Anderson completed 11-of-22 passes for 109 yards and threw one interception, although he suffered an upper-body injury during the second quarter. He played the first two drives of the third quarter, but he overthrew a handful of passes and had to be replaced. Head coach Roger Hughes played both Dan Koplovich (1-of-2, 10 yards) and Tommy Wornham (1-of-3, 2 yards), but neither could generate much in the second half.

The Princeton defense was led by Scott Britton, who made a game-high 11 tackles and added a sack, while both Wilson Cates and Steven Cody recorded seven tackles apiece. Carlos Roque recorded his first career interception, while Mark Ethridge recovered a fumble, marking the first time Princeton forced two turnovers in the game. Unfortunately, both came deep in Princeton territory and didn't lead to scores. Brown got a fumble recovery from Neil Rooney at the Princeton 20-yard-line in the fourth quarter, and two plays later, Buddy Farnham scored from three yards out to give Brown the three-touchdown lead.

HARVARD 24, PRINCETON 20

Despite a brilliant 154-yard rushing effort by junior Jordan Culbreath, the Princeton football team failed to capitalize on several opportunities and watched a late lead slip away in a 24-20 home loss to defending Ivy League champion Harvard Saturday on Powers Field. Gino Gordon's last touchdown run gave the Crimson its winning margin with 3:34 to go and left Princeton with a 2-4 record.

Princeton, which led by as much as 14-3 in the first half, grabbed a 20-17 lead with 7:16 remaining when Ben Bologna converted on a 28-yard field goal. The 16-play, 87-yard drive gave the Tigers a late lead, but it also gave Harvard plenty of time to score and go ahead. The Crimson converted on a 4th-and-1 midway through the drive on a short pass from Chris Pizzotti to Jason Miller, and followed it up with a 35-yard pass to Matt Luft, who got the ball to the Princeton 6. Two plays later, Gordon went up the middle for the winning points.

The Tigers' final opportunity started off well, as Meko McCray returned the kickoff 31 yards to the Princeton 42. A five-yard pass from Brian Anderson to Will Thanheiser gave Princeton 2nd-and-5, but an incompleteness and a sack left the Tigers with a tough 4th-and-18 situation. Flushed out, Anderson hit fullback Matt Zimmerman well short of the marker; Zimmerman tried to pitch the ball to Culbreath, but the two couldn't connect and Harvard took over at the Princeton 32. One first down later, Harvard was celebrating its second straight win over the Tigers.

That celebration came at the expense of another terrific performance by Culbreath, who came in as the Ivy League leader in rushing and posted his second 150-yard day of the season. The career-best total of 154 yards included touchdown runs of 1 and 10 yards, giving Culbreath six touchdowns in as many games and his second two-touchdown performance in three Ivy League games. He helped Princeton to a 177-88 advantage in team rushing and a 353-335 advantage in total offense, but the Crimson came up with another big passing day. Pizzotti completed 17 of 26 passes for 247 yards and a touchdown, and he added a 33-yard touchdown run early in the second half to give the Crimson its first lead of the day.

PRINCETON 31, CORNELL 26

Over the last decade, Cornell-Princeton games have typically been decided at the wire, and Saturday's 31-26 Princeton victory at Schoellkopf Field was no exception. Princeton avoided disaster at both the beginning and end of the game and controlled enough of the middle to end a three-game losing streak.

Despite being outgained 555-390 and allowing Cornell to score the first 13 points, Princeton rallied midway through the second quarter and eventually found itself with a 24-19 lead with less than two minutes remaining at the 20. Facing a 4th and 1 situation, everybody in Schoellkopf Field expected Ivy League leading rusher Jordan Culbreath to get the ball; after all, he had rushed for a career-high 169 yards and averaged seven yards per carry. Princeton head coach Roger Hughes had other plans and called a bootleg, which let senior quarterback Brian Anderson roll untouched to the right side of the field as Culbreath drew the other 20 guys to the left. Anderson scored easily and gave Princeton a 31-19 lead with 1:40 left.

In other rivalries, that might have been the end of the drama. In this one, it was just the beginning. Cornell's quick-strike passing attack, which gained 431 yards on the day, drove 58 yards on five plays and scored on a four-yard pass from Nathan Ford to Horat Blackman. The Big Red, which was out of timeouts, lined up for the onsides kick; the second bounce stayed low and went off Matt Wakuchik, and Cornell's Jesse Baker grabbed

it with 39 seconds remaining. All of the sudden, a mostly-disspirited crowd of 7,122 got very excited.

Ford hit a 4th and short pass to Zac Canty for nine yards, and following an incomplection, hit Canty on a 31-yard pass to the 15. A false start on a fake spike sent the Big Red back to the 20, where Ford spiked the ball with five seconds left. Canty lined up on the near side, opposite Cart Kelly, who had one of the defensive plays of the season with an interception in the end zone during the third quarter. Baker sprinted to the goal line and cut to the sideline, and Kelly stayed with him. Forced to throw into a tight area, Ford's pass was too wide and a relieved Princeton team celebrated its win.
