EYE ON THE TIGERS

Princeton has won five of its last six games, which included four wins over top-10 teams. This past weekend the Tigers swept travel partner No. 7 Quinnipiac in a home-and-home series. A pair of sophomores lead the team in scoring with Max Véronneau putting up 18 points on six goals and 12 assists. Thirteen of those points have come in the last four games, as he has led the nation in points the last two weeks. Linemate Ryan Kuffner is second on the list with a team-high seven goals and six assists for 13 points, while junior David Hallisey has 13 points as well with five goals and eight assists. Freshman Jackson Cressey has reached double figures as well with two goals and eight helpers. Junior Eric Robinson, sophomores Alex Riche and Josh Teves all have nine points apiece. Senior Colton Phinney has started in all but one game in goal, he has an .889 save percentage and a 3.60 GAA.

SCOUTING THE MINUTEMEN

UMass is 4-9-2 in its first year under head coach Greg Carvel. Though its been over a decade since these two teams have met, Carvel is no stranger to the Tigers - having coached against them with his alma mater St. Lawrence the last few seasons. The team is coming off of a 3-1 loss at UConn last Friday after splitting with Notre Dame at home on Dec. 2 & 3. The Minutemen average 2.33 goals per game and are allow one more than that on average. The power play is 13 for 96 (13.5%), while the penalty kill is 69 for 83 (83.1%). Sophomore Austin Plevy has 11 points in 15 games with a team-high five goals and six assists. Senior Steve Iacobellis has three goals and six assists, while sophomore Kurt Keats and freshman Griff Jeszka have three goals and five assists apiece. Junior Dominic Trento has the most assists on the team with seven. Freshman Ryan Wischow has earned the most starts in goal and has a .908 save percentage and a 2.55 GAA in 11 games. Sophomore Nic Renyard has appeared in five games and has an .888 save percentage and a 4.20 GAA.

THE PRINCETON/MASSACHUSETTS SERIES

Princeton has a one-game lead in the all-time series with UMass, 5-4. The school first met in 1915 and then did not meet again until 1994, when Don "Toot" Cahoon was the head coach of the Tigers. Toot later became head coach at UMass from 2000-2012 and went 3-0 against his former school. The last time the teams met was Dec. 29, 2005 in Amherst, a 4-0 Minutemen win.

IT'S JUST A NUMBER

Princeton swept to top-10 teams this season, No. 10 Bemidji and No. 7 Quinnipiac. They mark just the second and third times that Princeton had back-to-back wins over ranked teams. The first was in 2008 when the Tigers beat No. 17 Minnesota State and No. 16 Nebraska-Omaha at Hobey Baker Rink.

STREAKERS

Sophomore Ryan Kuffner has scored a goal in the last four straight games. He is the first player to accomplish that feat since Matt Arhontas did so during the 2010-11 season.

Junior David Hallisey had a nine-game point scoring streak between Nov. 11-Dec. 9, totaling 13 points in those nine games (5-8-13).

SWEEP IT UP

Princeton's sweep of Bemidji marks the program's first sweep of a non-conference team on the road since 2009 when the Tigers swept Notre Dame.

The Tigers sweep of No. 7 Quinnipiac this season marked the first time Princeton swept its ECAC travel partner since 2008.


TWO FOR ONE

Max Véronneau and Jackson Cressey were named the ECAC Hockey Player and Rookie of the Week, respectively on Dec. 5. Véronneau was also named the GoPrincetonTigers.com Athlete of the Week, presented by Coach USA and the NCAA Third Star of the Week.

Véronneau entered the weekend without a goal this season, then scored four times. Add to that three assists and he had a seven-point weekend as Princeton split with No. 18 Union and RPI. Those seven points was tops in the nation in scoring during the week, along with Minnesota State's Marc Michaelis, as both averaging 3.50 points per game. Cressey scored that game-winning goal in overtime to give Princeton its league victory of the season. The goal was his first career goal. Additionally this weekend, he had four assists with three coming during his four-point game against Rensselaer and another against No. 18 Union.

FOUR SCORE

Princeton had two players score four points against Rensselaer on Dec. 3, 2016. Both Max Véronneau and Jackson Cressey had four points. It marked the first time since Tucker Brocket had four points on Nov. 15, 2013 in a 5-4 overtime win at Dartmouth.

BEST NIGHT EVER

Five players had career nights against RPI on Dec. 3 when Princeton won 6-5 in overtime. Jackson Cressey and Max Véronneau both had their first four-point games, while Josh Teves and Ryan Kuffner had their first three-point games. David Hallisey collected his second two-point game.

EXTRA SPECIAL

Princeton recorded its first ECAC overtime win in three years, when it defeated Rensselaer on Dec. 3. The previous time the Tigers beat a league team in OT? Nov. 15, 2013 a 5-4 win over Dartmouth.

ALL HAIL HALLISEY

Junior David Hallisey was named the ECAC Hockey Player of the Week on Nov. 29, as well as the GoPrincetonTigers.com Athlete of the Week, presented by Coach USA. Hallisey led Princeton to a sweep of No. 10 Bemidji on the road this past weekend, 4-1 and 3-1, making the Tigers first wins of the season. Hallisey had his second-career two-goal game on Saturday, including the game-winning goal. His first goal made it a 1-1 game midway through the second when he shot five hole from the slot. The game winner came seven seconds into a power-play opportunity as he banged in a rebound. Hallisey also had an assist in the Tigers' 4-1 win on Friday.

HALFORD IS HOT

Junior Ben Halford made a career-high 43 saves in his first collegiate win as Princeton posted a 3-1 win over No. 10 Bemidji State. Halford got the nod, making his third career start and eighth appearance in goal, after an injury to Colton Phinney in the previous game. It marked his first appearance in goal since Feb. 13, 2016. The only goal he allowed was a penalty shot in the first period.

LEADING THE WAY

Princeton has had the lead in nine games this season and is 4-5 when having a lead in regulation. The Tigers was 0-5 when taking a lead, before going 4-0 the last four times it took the lead.

ROAD WARRIORS

Princeton began the season with seven of nine games on the road, with trips to Michigan and Minnesota. The Tigers close out the calendar year with six of seven at home.

KILLING IT

Princeton's penalty killing unit was ranked No. 1 in the nation for two weeks this season. The Tigers allowed a power-play goal on their first penalty of the season at Michigan State, before killing of 26 straight before allowing their second at Cornell on Nov. 19.

SHOTS

Princeton has recorded 50+ shots in two games this year: 50 at Colgate on Nov. 18, and 55 vs. RPI on Dec. 3. Prior to that, the last time was on Jan. 25, 2011 when Princeton had 59 in a 7-1 win over Sacred Heart.

THEY'RE BACK

Princeton returns 87 percent of its scoring from last season, that's the third most in the country, just one percent behind the leaders Mercyhurst and Western Michigan who have 88 percent each.

NEW GUYS

Princeton welcomes six freshmen as the Class of 2020, the second recruiting class of Ron Fogarty They include defender Derek Topatigh and forwards Liam Grande, Joey Fallon, Jackson Cressey, Jordan Fogarty and Jeremy Germain.

VETERANS

Princeton leads the country in the most seniors and juniors on the team with 16 - tying Quinnipiac and Vermont. Princeton has one of the largest senior classes with eight.

FAMILY TIES

Princeton will now have two Fogartys on the bench this season as head coach Ron Fogarty's son Jordan joins the team as a freshman. The Fogarty's are one of six father-son pairings in Division I college hockey this season and one of three on the same bench - along with Harvard's Donatos and Mercyhurst's Gotkins.

SAVE THIS

Colton Phinney entered the 2016-17 season with the second most saves in the nation with 2,450. He came in 91 behind Colgate's Charlie Finn.

MAN BEHIND THE MASK

Colton Phinney is a member of the 2017 Mike Richter Award Watch List it was announced in October.

He is one of 20 goalies named to the watch list, which annually honors the most outstanding goaltender in DI hockey.

As a junior, Phinney set the Princeton program record for saves in a single season with 1,058 surpassing the previous mark set by Erasmo Saltarelli by 188. He currently sits third all-time in saves at Princeton behind Ronald Dennis' 2,951 (1980-83) and All-America and Hobey Baker candidate Zane Kalemba's 2,680 (2006-10).

Phinney captured second-team All-Ivy League honors in 2015-16 when he finished the season with a .924 save percentage. During his career he has made 30+ saves in 60 games with the most being 51 in a game against Harvard in 2014-15.

IT'S ABOUT TIME

Ivy League rules mandate that men's hockey teams can play regular season games beginning on Oct. 28. That's 27 days after the first college hockey game took place this season on Oct. 1.

Head Coach Ron Fogarty



Ron Fogarty, who leads all active NCAA coaches in win percentage, was named the head men's hockey coach at Princeton in June 2014.

Fogarty spent seven seasons as head coach at NCAA Division III Adrian College (Adrian, Mich.). He began the program at Adrian and grew it into a powerhouse.

In seven years, he posted a 167-23-10 record. The Bulldogs have competed in the NCAA tournament four times in the last five years and was the national runner-up in 2010-11, losing 4-3 in the national championship game. The Bulldogs won six regular-season titles competing in the Northern College Hockey Association (formerly Midwest Collegiate Hockey Association), and won five Harris Cup playoff championships.

Fogarty led the Bulldogs to unprecedented success as they set an NCAA single-season record for wins by a first-year program at 26-3 in 2007-08. Fogarty's success at Adrian continued, as the program became the fastest hockey program to reach the NCAA tournament and 100 wins. To his credit, Fogarty was named the MCHA Coach of the Year three times and was a four-time finalist for national coach of the year. Academically, the Bulldogs had a combined team GPA of 3.00 or greater in all seven years.

A 1995 graduate of Colgate University, Fogarty is no stranger to the ECAC. As a four-year right winger on the hockey team, he was named to the 1992 ECAC All-Rookie Team, and was a member of Raiders first three seasons under Don Vaughan. As a senior captain at Colgate in 1995, he helped Vaughan to his first 20-win season while earning the Coaches Award and the Terry Slater Award. After playing in the ECAC All-Star game following the completion of his senior season, Fogarty left Colgate ranked 20th on the all-time scoring list with 141 points.

Fogarty's coaching career began shortly thereafter, staying on at Colgate as an assistant coach for three years (1996-99). In 1999, he joined the hockey staff at Clarkson and remained with the Green & Gold through the end of the 2001-02 season. From 2002-06 Fogarty was an assistant coach at Bowling Green. In all, Fogarty coached and/or recruited four Hobey Baker finalists, three All-Americans, eight conference all-stars, four all-rookie selections and nine NHL players.

His professional hockey experience started with the Toledo Storm (ECHL) in 1995 and led to a stint with the Memphis River Kings (CHL) in 1995-96.

HOW IT ENDED

Princeton finished the 2015-16 season with a 5-23-3 overall record and was 3-16-3 in the ECAC and 2-7-1 in the Ivies - a slight improvement from the previous year.

NO WHERE TO GO BUT UP

Princeton was picked to finish 12th in both the ECAC Hockey Preseason Coaches poll and the media poll. The Tigers finished 12th last year.

AHEAD BY A CENTURY

This is the 113th season of varsity hockey at Princeton. Princeton is the fourth-oldest hockey program in the country. The first game was played on Nov. 30, 1900 against the Drisler School. Princeton did not compete for one year in WWI and two years during WWII.

STAND UP

Last year, five of Princeton's 12 home games were standing-room only crowds. The Quinnipiac game on Dec. 29 proved to be the second-largest crowd on hand at Hobey Baker Rink.

FOUR STARS

Princeton alum General Mark Milley '80 is the only NCAA Division I hockey player to become a four-star general in the U.S. Army.

GETTING THE CALL

Defender Taylor Fedun was called up by the Buffalo Sabres on Nov. 17. He currently has four assists in eight games, and assisted on three of Buffalo's first six goals since he joined the team. Additionally he is on the team's top power-play unit. In 14 games with the Rochester Amerks, Fedun had two goals and 10 assists. In his NHL career Fedun has 11 points in 20 games (2-9-11).

CONDI BEAR

Mike Condon '13 was traded to the Ottawa Senators in early November, from the Pittsburgh Penguins for a 2017 fifth-round draft pick. He made his debut with the Senators on Thursday, Nov. 3, pitching a 27-save shutout against Vancouver. In 10 games with Ottawa, he has a .923 save percentage and a 2.28 GAA with a 4-3-0-1 record.

Condon was picked up on waivers by the Penguins in October and played in one game but stopped all seven shots he faced - against Nashville on Oct. 22. He spent the 2015-16 season as the starting goaltender for the Montreal Canadiens after an injury sidelines Carey Price for the season. Condon finished with a .903 save percentage and a 2.71 in 55 games played.

Historic Hobey Baker Rink



The spirit of Hobey Baker lives on in the rink bearing his name.

Some nine decades ago, in December 1921, it was announced that Princeton would build a hockey rink and name it after its greatest athletic hero, Hobart A.H. Baker '14.

Baker Rink is the second-oldest arena still in use in collegiate hockey.

There have been numerous improvements to the rink, the biggest in the 1980s that added locker rooms, equipment rooms and scoreboard. More major improvements came in the early 2000s when the lobby was upgraded at the north end to include trophy cases and photo montages to the history and tradition of hockey at Princeton. In the northwest corner of the lobby are trophy cases honoring both Hobey Baker and Patty Kazmaier. In 2010, in the southwest corner of the lobby, the Ken Scasserra Friends Room was dedicated. The room, which looks out onto the ice surface provides both teams with a place to meet and entertain perspective student-athletes and alumni.

The dasher boards at Baker Rink were replaced in the summer of 2010 and the facility has a modern ice plant and dehumidification system.

The varsity hallway lies under the east side of the building and features the Princeton locker rooms, equipment room, bike room, athletic training room, coaches rooms and a new kitchenette. Added in 2013, the kitchenette has a plus-size refrigerator, multiple blenders, microwaves and a coffee machine to keep the Tiger fueled throughout the year.

In 2015, a state-of-the-art video room and player lounge was added. With theater-style seating and a Smart board, coaches have instant access to breaking down video for the teams while the players have a quiet space to study when necessary.

An on-going renovation has seen brand new locker rooms for both the men's and women's programs with dry stall rooms and stick rooms for each program. New graphics are set to be installed inside the locker room, in the hallway and in the tunnel leading to the ice as the tradition of Princeton hockey continues to build

Did You Know?

The first game to be played at Hobey Baker Rink was Princeton vs. St. Nick's Hockey Club on Jan. 5, 1923, a 3-2 victory for the Tigers.

Hobey Baker Rink was used as a hotel during WWII for servicemen.
