Today's Top Notes

- The Tigers are in the NCAA Tournament for the 25th time in program history and the first time since 2011. Princeton last won an NCAA Tournament game in 1998, and that stood as the Ivy's last NCAA Tournament win until 2010, when Cornell won twice to make the Sweet 16. Since then. Harvard won a game each in 2013 and 2014, and Yale won a game last year.
- The Tigers got to the NCAA Tournament after earning the top seed in the inaugural Ivy League Tournament, held last weekend at The Palestra in Philadelphia, and defeating fourth-seeded Penn on the Quakers' home floor and third-seeded Yale in last Sunday's final.
- Princeton's 23 wins are the sixth-most in program history and most since Princeton went 25-7 in 2010-11, the last time it made the NCAA Tournament.
- Princeton has Indiana ties with 2017 honorable mention All-Ivy Devin Cannady from Mishawaka, Ind., right next to South Bend, and head coach Mitch Henderson, from Vincennes and an alumnus of Culver Military Academy in Culver, Ind., about 40 miles south of South Bend.
- Notre Dame was ranked 22nd in the Mar. 6 AP poll and 16th in the Mar. 6 coaches poll. Princeton last faced a team ranked that high on Dec. 29, 2015 in losing 76-64 at AP No. 13/coaches No. 15 Miami (Fla.). Princeton last beat a team ranked that high on Nov. 11, 1997 in East Rutherford, N.J., defeating AP No. 22 Texas 62-56.
- With Cornell's, Harvard's and Yale's wins since 2010, it's the most successful stretch for the Ivy League since 1978-84, when Penn and Princeton combined to win nine NCAA Tournament games. The Ivy's only NCAA Tournament wins from 1985-2009 came from Penn in 1994 and Princeton in 1996 and 1998.
- How have 14-0 lvy League teams done in the NCAA Tournament? Three of the previous 13 14-0 teams won NCAA Tournament games, including Penn's wins over Duquesne and South Carolina in 1971, Penn's win over Nebraska in 1994, and Princeton's first-round win over UNLV in 1998.
- How have 14-0 lvy League teams been seeded in the NCAA Tournament? Nine previous 14-0 seasons have occurred since seeding began in 1979. In order: 8 for Princeton in 1991, 14 for Penn in 1993, 11 for Penn in 1994, 12 for Penn in 1995, 12 for Princeton in 1997, 5 for Princeton in 1998, 13 for Penn in 2000, 11 for Penn in 2003 and 14 for Cornell in 2008.
- The last two Ivy League teams to be seeded 12th won their first-round games. Yale beat Baylor 79-75 as a No. 12 seed last year, and Harvard beat Cincinnati 61-57 as a 12 in 2014. In between, Harvard was seeded 13th in 2015 and lost just 67-65 to North Carolina in 2015.
- No Ivy League team has lost a first-round game by double digits since Cornell's 78-59 loss to Missouri in 2009. Cornell beat Temple 78-65 in 2010, Princeton lost to Kentucky 59-57 in 2011, Harvard lost to Vanderbilt 79-70 in 2012, Harvard beat New Mexico 68-62 in 2013, Harvard beat Cincinnati 61-57 in 2014, Harvard lost to New Mexico 67-65 in 2015, and Yale beat Baylor 79-75 in 2016.
- Princeton has only faced Notre Dame three times, a 35-22 road loss in 1927, an 80-66 road loss in 1974, and a 76-62 home win in 1977 in which

Notre Dame was ranked second in the nation in the AP. Princeton was unranked then but was ranked sixth when it fell 72-58 to Kentucky in the first round of the NCAAs.

- Princeton's last win over an ACC team was on Dec. 30, 2011, a 75-73, triple-overtime win at Florida State. Since then, Princeton fell at Pittsburgh 82-61 in the 2012 CBI, at Syracuse in a Nov. 21, 2012 game 73-53, at Wake Forest 80-66 on Dec. 31, 2014, and at Virginia Tech 86-81 in OT in last year's NIT opener.
- Princeton's 19-game winning streak is tied for the second-longest in program history. The Tigers won 19 in a row from Dec. 29, 1924-Mar. 10, 1925 and a program-record 20 in a row from Dec. 19, 1997 through Mar. 12, 1998.
- Mitch Henderson, at 119 wins, has passed three coaches on Princeton's all-time wins list since the start of the season to become Princeton's third-winningest coach, but the '98 Princeton grad has reached such status that it'll take him a while to pass anyone else. Franklin "Cappy" Cappon (250, 1938-43 & 46-61), for whom the men's basketball head coaching position is named, and Pete Carril (514, 1967-96), for whom Henderson played his first two seasons at Princeton, are in first and second place.
- Princeton and Vermont finished the regular season as only leagueunbeaten teams in Division I, and both won their conference tournaments. Princeton's 19-game winning streak is second only to Vermont's 21-game streak entering the tournament.
- Devin Cannady's 79 3-pointers are the fifth-most in program history, with the record at 95 (Sean Jackson '92, 1990-91) and 84, 83 and 82 as the standards in between Cannady and the top. Cannady's .938 free throw percentage would put him in line for the best clip in program history among those with at least 40 attempts, with Joe Heiser '68 at .900 (117-130) in 1967-68.
- Through Selection Sunday, Princeton stood 10th in the nation at 10 3s made per game. Only three teams have made at least 10 3s against Notre Dame this season, with Iowa, Pitt and Northwestern all making 12 3s. Notre Dame won all three of those games.
- Princeton averages 26 3s attempted per game. Only six teams have tried at least 26 3s against the Irish this season, and Notre Dame won all six of those games. The correlation between 3s and beating Notre Dame seems to be quality over quantity. Teams making at least 41 percent of their 3s are 4-1 against Notre Dame this season, and the one loss was when Northwestern went 12 of 22 and lost by four, 70-66. Princeton averages 38.3 percent from 3 this season.
- Princeton's opponents average 13 turnovers per game. Notre Dame has turned the ball over 13 times in five games this season and is 4-1 in those games. Princeton averages 10 turnovers per game, fifth-best in Division I through Selection Sunday, and Notre Dame opponents have turned it over at least 10 times in 25 of the team's 34 games this season.
- Notre Dame is 14-0 when scoring at least 81 points. Princeton's opponents have averaged 61.5 points per game this season, and the Irish have scored that few points only twice, losing to Georgia Tech (62-60, Jan. 28) and Virginia (71-54, Jan. 24). The Irish are 15-1 when holding teams to 70 points or fewer, and Princeton averages 72.1.
- West Virginia has allowed 10 3s only five times this season and is 4-1 in

- Against Bucknell this season, Princeton won 72-70 on Dec. 22 in Lewisburg despite Bucknell going 14 of 27 from 3-point range. The Bison committed 12 turnovers to eight for Princeton and the Tigers won the rebounding battle 36-30. Second-chance points were in Princeton's favor 17-1 as the Tigers had eight offensive boards.
- Junior Amir Bell enjoyed quite a bounce-back in the Ivy League season. In non-conference play, he averaged 3.8 ppg while shooting .268 from the field and .120 from 3. In Ivy play, he averaged 8.7 ppg, shooting .581 from the field and .559 from 3. Bell had Princeton's highest shooting percentages overall (among players with >3 FGA) and from 3 in Ivy League play.
- Senior Steven Cook, who has fundraised for a Sudanese hospital and interned with an anti-poverty organization in his native Chicago, in addition to being a team tri-captain this season, a two-time All-Ivy Leaguer and an Academic All-Ivy League honoree, was named to the NABC Good Works Team and a CoSIDA Academic All-District honoree. The NABC honor makes him one of five Division I players selected, and Cook will travel to the Final Four to be recognized as part of the Good Works Team. On Mar. 2, he became the program's first CoSIDA Academic All-America winner, earning third-team honors, since Steve Goodrich '98 in 1998. Earlier, he was named the program's first CoSIDA Academic All-District honoree since Justin Conway '07 in 2007.
- With Steven Cook and Spencer Weisz both as active members of the 1,000-point club, it's the first time since the last month-plus of the 2011-12 season that Princeton had two 1,000-point scorers at the same time (Douglas Davis '12 & Ian Hummer '13). Cook is the fifth player to reach 1,000 points under Mitch Henderson (Davis, Hummer, T.J. Bray '14, Weisz), putting Henderson alongside only Pete Carril as Princeton coaches who have had as many as five players reach 1,000 during their tenures. Carril had 14 during his 29-season career.
- Under Mitch Henderson, the Tigers now have a 41-35 (.539) record in the pre-New Year portion of the schedule and a 78-24 (.765) record from Jan. 1 forward.
- Through Sunday's (3/12) games, Princeton has the most wins among New Jersey's eight Division I teams since Mitch Henderson took over at Princeton prior to the 2011-12 season. Princeton's 118 wins during that time are four better than Seton Hall's 114.
- Through Sunday's (3/12) games, Princeton ranked No. 1 in the nation in fewest turnovers (289) and No. 3 in fewest fouls (468). The Tigers were also top 10 percent nationally in turnover per game (fifth, 10.0), 3s per game (10th, 10.0), scoring defense (10th, 61.5 ppg allowed), turnover margin (15th, +3.4/game), assist-to-turnover ratio (16th, 1.44), winning percentage (22nd, .793), fouls per game (25th, 16.1) and scoring margin (26th, +10.6).
- Through Sunday's (3/12) games, Princeton ranked 47th in the RPI. That was 80 spots better than the next-highest Ivy team, Harvard, at 131. Princeton has faced one ranked higher than it in the RPI, VCU (22nd). Princeton got out to a 16-0 lead in that game before VCU clawed back and pulled away late, 81-70 on Nov. 29 in Richmond. Notre Dame is 23rd in the Selection Sunday RPI.

- Senior Spencer Weisz has been close to a triple-double this season, most recently getting nine points, eight assists and seven rebounds Feb. 17 at Yale. He netted 13 assists Dec. 10 at Liberty. He got 10 points, 11 rebounds and eight assists against Saint Joseph's on Dec. 14. He had nine points, eight rebounds and seven assists Dec. 31 against Cal Poly. Princeton has never had a recorded triple-double.
- At Bucknell on Dec. 22, Weisz surpassed the 300-assist and 500-rebound mark, becoming the third player in program history to have 1,000 points along with 500 boards and 300 helpers. He's the only player in program history with 1,000 points, 500 boards, 300 helpers and 200 3-pointers. Weisz stands at 1,219 points, 596 rebounds, 371 assists and 205 3s. The other two players with 1,000/500/300 are Kit Mueller '91 (1,546 pts., 560 reb., 381 ast.) and Ian Hummer '13 (1,625 pts., 725 reb., 308 ast.).
- Princeton led the Ivy in scoring defense (61.6 ppg allowed), scoring margin (+10.6), 3FG percentage (.381), turnover margin (+3.54), assist-to-turnover ratio (+1.4), defensive rebounding percentage (.762) and 3s per game (10.0). Devin Cannady leads the lvy in free throw percentage (.934) and Steven Cook leads in steals per game at 1.6.
- In Ivy League games only, Princeton led the league in scoring defense (56.4 ppg allowed), scoring margin (+13.5), field goal percentage defense (.417), rebounding defense (31.1/game), turnover margin (+5.00), assistto-turnove ratio (+1.4), defensive rebounding percentage (.760), and 3s per game (9.6). Devin Cannady was the leading free throw shooter at .941 and leader in 3s per game at 3.1, Spencer Weisz led in steals at 2.0 and minutes at 35.4/game, and Amir Bell led in 3FG percentage at .559.
- The Tigers have been bitten by the injury bug in a big way this season, losing a pair of starting senior forwards. Hans Brase was injured (knee) during the Nov. 29 game at VCU and was declared out for the season Dec. 11, and Henry Caruso played in the Dec. 10 win at Liberty and was declared out for the season Dec. 14 (toe). Brase, who missed last season due to another right knee injury, was Princeton's leading rebounder in 2014-15 (7.5 rpg) and Caruso was Princeton's leading scorer (15.0 ppg) and a first-team All-Ivy League pick a year ago.
- Princeton traveled nearly 15,000 (approx. 14,801) miles before hosting its first Division I opponent in Saint Joseph's on Dec. 14, going to BYU, Lehigh, Lafayette, VCU, Hawaii for Cal and Hawai'i, and Liberty.
- Princeton was in the top 10 percent of the nation (top 34) in five statistical categories at the end of last season: third in fewest fouls (503), sixth in fewest turnovers (331), 14th in 3s per game (9.7), 21st in scoring margin (+10.5) ppg) and 31st in 3FG percentage (.383).
- Princeton led the Ivy League at the end of last season in scoring offense (79.1 ppg, 39th nationally) in fewest turnovers, fewest fouls, defensive rebounds per game (26.93), fewest personal fouls per game (17.3) and 3s per game. Princeton's 79.1 ppg last season was the third-highest in program history and highest since the 1971-72 season, a program-record 79.69 points per game. The 1964-65 Final Four team averaged 79.69 ppg.
- Princeton is coming off its quadrennial foreign trip. The Tigers went to Italy in late August, spending two nights each in Rome, Florence, Bologna with a side trip to Venice, Vicenza and Cernobbio on Lake Como. Princeton played three games, starting by closing a 21-point fourth-guarter deficit to defeat Fortitudo Kontatto in Bologna, a second-division Italian team, 93-87





Princeton NCAA Tournament Facts & Figures

- The Princeton record for points in an NCAA Tournament game was also the NCAA record at the time. The only player to score more than Bill Bradley (58, 1965 third-place game vs. Wichita State) is Notre Dame's Austin Carr, who had 61 in a first-round game vs. Ohio in 1970.
- The Palestra is Princeton's most-frequented venue for an NCAA Tournament game. The Tigers have played there eight times, or 19 percent of their NCAA Tournament games.
- This will be Princeton's 42nd NCAA Tournament game. The number 42 is a significant one as it has been retired across all sports at Princeton. It was worn by Bill Bradley '65 and Heisman Trophy winner Dick Kazmaier '52.

A common trend in recent years is that you don't want to see yourself draw the Ivy League champion in the first round. Yale knocked out Baylor last year. Harvard took North Carolina to the brink in 2015 after knocking out Cincinnati and New Mexico in successive years before that.

This year's **Princeton** team, which joins Vermont as the final unbeaten in conference play, has received a huge boost from the sophomore sharpshooter Cannaday, and it could look to ride his hot hand to a possible upset. The 6-foot-1 guard can get ice cold from time to time — he has five games with six points or fewer, including a goose egg at Harvard — but when he's on he can fill it up. And he has been on lately.

The Mishawaka, Ind., product has hit six or more 3-pointers in three of the Tigers' last four games, including a 7-of-8, 29-point showing against Yale. Upsets are often led by players who just can't miss, and that has certainly described Cannaday at times. The sophomore is shooting 45.1 percent from outside in Ivy League play.

Granted, **Princeton** will have to enter some uncharted waters in order to make the Big Dance. The Ivy League will have its first-ever conference tournament this year, whereas in years past it would have only needed one more win to clinch the bid. But the Tigers are unbeaten in 12 tries in-conference, which makes them a good choice to be the Ivy's representative in March.

Princeton basketball's unselfishness gives them a legit chance to win a game in the Big Dance.

With a difficult schedule that featured games against BYU, Lehigh, VCU and Cal, <u>Princeton</u> (http://bustingbrackets.com/mid-major-conferences/ivy/) began the season just 2-4. They kept all four games relatively close but were unable to pull off valuable wins that could've resulted in multiple top 50 victories for their resume.

The Tigers don't have the numbers to pull off an at-large bid but they are the heavy favorite to win the first iteration of the Ivy League Conference Tournament. And if they do win the league tournament over teams like Harvard, Yale, and Columbia, Princeton is a threat to win a game or two in March Madness.

Why? This team is legitimately good. After watching them up close in their 64-45 win over Columbia on Friday night on the Upper West Side, I can say that no four or five seed will want to play the Tigers in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Mitch Henderson's team is unselfish as they average 14.3 assists per game and move the ball around the perimeter with ease. They don't take bad shots and their defensive energy on the perimeter is impressive, limiting ball penetration and open shots.

They have four players averaging over 10 points per game, including Devin Cannady their leading scorer. Cannady is a sharp-shooter from the perimeter and a player who rarely, if ever, turns the ball over.

But the Tigers' offensive attack doesn't end there.

Spencer Weisz is the quarterback and the do-it-all floor leader, as the guard is averaging 11.0 points, 5.6 rebounds, 3.8 assists per game and 1.5 steals per game. He always plays under control and is shooting a solid 41 percent from the field and 37 percent from beyond the arc.

Beyond Weisz, Steven Cook and Myles Stephens give Princeton versatility on offense as both players are shooting the ball well from the perimeter (Cook at 44 percent and Stephens at 39) and have the ability to play both inside and out. They are also both very athletic and aggressive on the offensive glass, allowing the team to snag second chance opportunities.

Princeton is not all that deep (imagine if they still had Hans Brase and Henry Caruso who are out for the season with injuries) but they do bring a 6'4" guard, Amir Bell, off the bench and play low possession games that allow them to keep their stamina high.

With three games remaining in league play (Cornell, @ Harvard and @ Dartmouth), the Tigers could very well finish 14-0 in league play. That sets them up for what should be a nice run through the Ivy League Tournament and a spot in the grandest event of all.

The Ivy League has unfolded largely as expected this season, with preseason favorite Princeton leading the way, followed by Harvard and Yale—the latter of whom was dealt a severe blow right before the season started when star guard Makai Mason went down for the year with a foot injury.

But few likely expected things to play out the way they did, with the Tigers struggling as they started non-conference play 4–6 before reeling off 15 straight wins. Princeton hasn't lost since Dec. 20, and at 12–0 in Ivy League play, is just one win away from winning the regular-season title outright (it's already guaranteed at least a share). In past years, the Tigers would be just one win away from an automatic NCAA tournament bid, but the Ivy League will hold its first-ever conference tournament this year to determine which team goes dancing. The Ivy's top four teams will qualify for the league tournament, making the likely participants Princeton, Harvard, Yale and either Penn or Columbia.

The Tigers' success this season isn't surprising, considering they didn't lose anybody of note from last year's 22–7 squad to graduation or transfer. That team went 12–2 in Ivy League play, but without a conference tournament, fell a win shy of Yale, which went to the Big Dance for the first time in program history. This year, it's Princeton that's in the driver's seat, despite it losing last year's leading scorer, Henry Caruso, to a season-ending injury in December.

Princeton was able to absorb Caruso's injury thanks to the likes of sophomore guards Devin Cannady and Myles Stephens and senior forwards Steven Cook and Spencer Weisz. All of those players average double figures for the Tigers, with Weisz perhaps the most versatile of the bunch at 10.7 points, 5.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 1.6 steals per game. Cannady and Cook are both three-point marksmen, important assets for a team that gets a whopping 43.2% of its points from behind the arc, the fourth-highest percentage in the country, according to Kenpom.com.

Where the Tigers don't get most of their points—just 14.5%—is the free-throw line. Their free-throw rate is the second-lowest in the nation, per kenpom.com, even though they shoot fairly well as a team from the charity stripe. But they're just not a team built to win inside; Cannady and Weisz take nearly two-thirds of their shots from behind the three-point line, per hoop-

math.com, and none of the Tigers' top scorers take a majority of their shots at the rim. Defensively, the team ranks 45th in the country in efficiency.

It's Princeton's ability to beat you from the outside that could make it dangerous in a potential first-round NCAA tournament matchup, but first it needs to get there. Harvard, which brought in a top-25 recruiting class this year that included leading scorer Bryce Aiken, has had a strong season itself at 18–7 overall and 12–2 in conference play. The Tigers and Crimson have met once so far this season—a one-point Princeton road win earlier this month—and will meet again on Friday, before potentially squaring off again soon after in the Ivy League tourney.

Whether it's Princeton or Harvard, or even a surprise other team that gets the Ivy League's NCAA tournament bid, no one should take the conference lightly. The Ivy League has pulled off a first-round upset in three of the last four years, including Yale's defeat of No. 5 seed Baylor last March. The country is on notice.

Mitch Henderson makes no effort to downplay the high hopes surrounding the Princeton University men's basketball team as it starts the 2016-17 campaign.

"This is the most experienced team I think I've ever coached; we have seven seniors, six of whom have played a significant amount of minutes and five of them have started at some point in their career," said Princeton head coach Henderson, speaking last week at the program's media day.

"I'm an optimistic person. I'm bullish in general. It's hard to be remotely pessimistic with this group. It's a really fun group to be around because they want to be good. We're starting further ahead than we've ever started before because of the seniors."

before being sidelined by a knee injury last winter) and Pete Miller (6.6 points, 6.1 rebounds) along with junior star Amir Bell (9.1 points, 2.5 rebounds), sophomore standouts Devin Cannady (11.6 points, 2.5 rebounds) and Myles Stephens (5.5 points, 2.4 rebounds), distributing playing time is Henderson's biggest challenge at the outset.

"There is a structure in place and it's some of the usual suspects — Steve, Henry, Spencer, Amir, Hans, Pete, Myles, and Devin, which you know about," said Henderson.

"We have some guys that you haven't seen too much. Aaron Young (1.4 points) has been very solid in the first few weeks of practice. He's a junior. Alec Brennan (2.8 points, 2.2 rebounds) is a big sized kid who's a junior. I'm not mentioning a lot of guys. Last year, we

played up at Columbia, Khyan Rayner (1.8 points) played the entire overtime and we happened to go on an 11-0 run while he was in the game. Everybody is going to get their number called at some point, but those eight I mentioned first, that's the Princeton team right there."

Henderson, though, knows that one year older doesn't necessarily mean one year better.

"The team is one year older, we haven't lost anybody; but what I told them is just because you have everyone back doesn't mean it's going to be the same thing," said Henderson, whose team opens its 2016-17 campaign by playing at BYU on November 14.

"Going to the NIT, we were ranked in the top 50 towards the end of the season. That's why we're where we are now. I told them they should be excited about that, but other than the people in the gym now I don't think too many people care about it. In two weeks, we're going to find out when everybody starts to put together a body of work, and we're not different, who gets the rebounds, we have some people who have done that and we're welcoming back eight rebounds a game with Hans. Who's going to make shots when they're open? We have a lot of guys that have done that. Who's going to take care of the ball?"

For co-captain Weisz, the team's journey to Italy this summer helped answer some of those questions.

"The Italy trip really helped us out a lot, to have a few practices and games under our belt against very good competition over there,"

said Weisz.

"It's a work in progress and we're just striving to get where we need to be and every day in practice is a challenge and we're looking forward to the challenge ahead."

Like Henderson, Weisz believes that the Tigers can't rest on their laurels.

"As much as we're the same team, we're a completely new team with Hans and the freshmen back," said Weisz.

"We're looking forward to this year's challenge and keeping last year in mind, but at the same time only looking forward and understanding we have a big task ahead of us this year. We're looking to get after it."

In the view of junior point guard Bell, the Princeton players are going after it on a daily basis.

"As a group, as a collective whole, we've been pushing each other to get better," said Bell. "We all have this one goal in mind and we just want to be the best team we can be.

Co-captain Cook believes that the Tigers can be a formidable team this year.

"We know we have the experience, we have the people to win games," said Cook. "I think we feel like that internally."

Facing BYU in the opener will give Princeton some good experience right off the bat.

"It's definitely a big challenge," said Cook. "They were a great offensive team last year so it'll be a great way to see where we're at defensively. They have a lot of scorers, they shoot a lot of 3s. They play a lot like us. I think we'll be ready for the challenge when it comes up. It's fun to play a game like that in front of a lot of people on ESPN."

Henderson, for his part, believes the Tigers should have fun with a tough non-conference slate.

"I've got a screw loose playing a schedule like that, but this is the team to do it with," said Henderson, whose team is looking to be sharp when its starts play in the Ivy League, which should have a different feel this year as the league will hold its first-ever postseason tournament with the top four teams in the eight-team conference making the competition.

"BYU is a real hard game and they come back here next year. St. Joe's here. On the road, nationally people don't know this, but Monmouth, Bucknell, Lehigh, Lafayette, they're really hard road games. Playing Cal at a neutral site, playing Hawaii at a neutral site, at VCU, we're going to get challenged every possible way, which I love. The sheen is off of all that stuff. They like that they're playing in some big games. What I like is that they've been there before."

If things go as planned, PU figures to be in a lot of big games this year.

Town Topics (Princeton): Senior Star Cook Enjoys Milestone Weekend As Princeton Men's Hoops Tops Cornell, Columbia (Author: Bill Alden)

As Columbia's Jake Killingsworth lofted a three-pointer with seconds remaining in regulation and the Princeton University men's basketball team clinging to a 61-59 lead over the Lions, the crowd at Jadwin Gym held its breath as the ball flew to the hoop.

The shot clanged off the rim and Princeton senior star Steven Cook cradled the rebound in his arms with a smile of relief spreading across his face as the Tigers held on for the win before a crowd of 2.803.

"I was mainly focused on my guy; I was just following our process of staying attached and just trying to make that as difficult as possible," said Cook.

"We were able to foul at the end there and whittle the clock down a little bit. We were just trying to make it as difficult as possible for them."

In winning its 11th-straight game and improving to 15-6 overall and 8-0 lvy League, things got difficult for the Tigers after they built a 46-26 lead early in the second half.

"We find ways to win, we had a 20 point lead and they whittled it down," said Cook, who had 19 points and eight rebounds in the win. "Good teams find a way to win at the end of the game."

With Princeton's game against Columbia making its fifth game in nine days, Cook and his teammates were ready for that grind.

"I thought body-wise we were feeling OK," said Cook. "It is a tough stretch, five games in nine days but we took it game by game and tried to take care of our bodies, coming in with the right mindset with a little bit less preparation. I thought we could have been sharper but this next week at practice will be big for us to prepare for the next weekend."

A day earlier, Cook enjoyed a big moment as he passed the 1,000-point mark in his Princeton career when he tallied nine points in a 69-60 win over Cornell.

"It is definitely an accomplishment you look forward to when you come to Princeton but at the same time it is just another bucket, it is just another point," said Cook, a 6'5, 200-pound native of Winnetka, Ill. who is averaging 13.6 points and 5.5 rebounds this season and now has 1,027 points in his career.

"I just want to win a championship this year and that is the only goal I really care about at the end of the day."

Princeton head coach Mitch Henderson believes that his team has been showing the heart of a champion in recent play.

"I think the guys are figuring out our different ways to win and I really think this is going to help us going forward," said Henderson.

"It was not pretty but I thought last night we weren't sharp and I think we were very fortunate to win. I think that is a really good Columbia team and I am happy to get the win."

While Henderson wasn't happy to see his team get outscored 33-15 by Columbia down the stretch in the contest, he has no problems winning ugly.

"It is a really confident group and they are super aggressive; some of those shots we were getting were good shots, they just didn't go down for us," said Henderson.

"I like that we are getting into these situations. I don't like that it takes years off of my life but I like that we are getting into these situations and we can get better."

For Henderson, getting to work with Cook has been a great situation

"I would tell you he cares less about that than he does about making the team win and doing whatever he can to make it get better," said Henderson.

"I am counting down the days that I get a chance to be with him. He has just been such a joy to coach and this whole senior class is a really special group."

In reflecting on Princeton's winning streak, the longest for the program since an 11-game run in the 1998-99 season, Henderson credited his seniors with being catalysts of that surge.

"First, the growth of the seniors leading us and secondly Myles Stephens and Devin Cannady emerging as really good players," said Henderson, whose team will look to keep rolling as it plays at Yale on February 17 and at Brown on February 18.

"I think the key to being good is having consistency. In the last weekend, you have seen Richmond (Aririguzoh) playing a little more. We are going to need sharpness from a lot of different people going forward. There is a lot of basketball left. We are at Yale on Friday, that is going to be a tough one."

Cook, for his part, believes the toughness that Princeton displayed over the weekend bodes well for the future.

"It is a big stretch for us," said Cook. "It feels good to be 8-0 in the league with three weekends left. It wasn't always pretty but we got it done."

Town Topics (Princeton): With Seniors Brase, Caruso Sidelined for the Season, Stephens, Cannady Stepping up for Princeton Men's Hoops (Author: Bill Alden)

Myles Stephens was in the starting lineup for the first time in his career and Devin Cannady was making his fourth-ever start as Princeton University men's basketball team welcomed Saint Joseph's to Jadwin Gym last Wednesday.

The two sophomores acquitted themselves well as Stephens, a former Pennington School standout, contributed 12 points and six rebounds in 38 minutes while Cannady tallied a team-high 17 points in 35 minutes.

Their efforts, though, weren't enough as the Tigers saw a late rally fall short in a 76-68 loss to Hawks before a crowd of 2,360 that dropped Princeton to 4-5.

Princeton head coach coach Mitch Henderson liked what he got from Stephens and Cannady.

"I was really pleased with Myles's effort on (Shavar) Newkirk in the second half; I thought he did a great job on a very difficult player to guard," said Henderson.

"He provides an element for us defensively that changes things. I like what Devin is doing. He can score; he needs to know and understand defensively where he needs to be; he knows this. We had five turnovers and he had four of them so he has got to take care of the ball. He knows that and he will do that going forward."

Going forward, the pair of Stephens and Cannady figure to play increasingly key roles for the Tigers as the program announced after the game that senior star Henry Caruso recently suffered a toe injury that will sideline him for the rest of the season, joining fellow senior Hans Brase on the shelf as his college career was ended after injuring his knee in late November.

"We are adjusting," said Henderson, reflecting on the absence of Brase and Caruso.

"I still love the team. This is a tough loss tonight but we learned a lot about what we are going to be like going forward. I have confidence in the group; maybe we were thinking a little bit too much about who wasn't here to start. It is a basketball game and they have to play. St Joe's played really well. I thought they were just way faster to the ball tonight."

Stephens didn't have much trouble adjusting to being in the starting lineup.

"Nothing really changed, I just wanted to come in and play how I usually play, provide offense and defense for the team," said Stephens. "Step into the role, just doing what I can to help the team win."

Getting outrebounded 58-34 by St. Joe's played a major part in keeping Princeton from winning against the Hawks.

"We just have to be tougher, we know we are undersized," said Stephens. "We have had trouble rebounding in the past so we just have to be tougher, box out, and go get them."

Cannady, for his part, is looking to be mentally tougher in his new role.

"Being the starting point guard now, I think I need to work on being an extension of coach on the court and finding my looks within the offense and helping the team get the best shots," said Cannady.

"Most importantly, this season, what we are focusing on is being solid defensively. For me, I am in the game four minutes earlier. I am just trying to give a good start to the team and that is the mentality going forward."

When Princeton went on a 13-2 run to forge ahead of the Hawks 62-61 with 6:33 remaining in regulation, Cannady was sensing a big finish for the Tigers.

"That was the first time you heard the fans get into it the whole game and when that happens, the momentum is in our favor," said Cannady.

"I thought at that moment if we had some defensive stops and got some rebounds, made more shots, it could have went our way, but it didn't and so we will just have to figure that out moving forward."

Henderson, for his part, knows that he has some things to figure out as the shorthanded Tigers move forward.

"We made a nice run and got up 64-61 but we couldn't muster the engine tonight," lamented Henderson, whose team is slated to play at Monmouth on December 20 and at Bucknell on December 22.

"We have some nice looks but they killed us on the boards. They got to the free throw line and made their free throws. We have been struggling from the line a little bit. We have got a lot of work to do."

Town Topics (Princeton): With Stephens Enjoying Breakout Weekend, Princeton Men's Hoops Sweeps Brown, Yale (Author: Bill Alden)

Myles Stephens established himself as a defensive stopper from the minute he stepped on the court for the Princeton University men's basketball team last winter in his freshman campaign.

The former Pennington School standout accumulated 69 rebounds, 13 blocks, and 12 steals in 29 appearances off the bench during his debut campaign. It took him longer to get into the flow at the offensive end as he averaged 5.5 points a contest.

Last weekend, Stephens produced a breakout weekend as a scorer, tallying a career-high 18 points on 7-of-8 shooting in a 97-66 rout of visiting Brown on Friday. A day later, he bettered that output, scoring 19 points to help Princeton rally for a 66-58 win over defending lvy League champion Yale before 2,262 at Jadwin Gym. Stephens was later named lvy Player of the Week for his outburst.

Princeton head coach Mitch Henderson was not surprised by Stephens' offensive prowess.

"You are seeing right before your eyes the maturation of what I think he can be," said Henderson, whose team improved to 10-6 overall and 3-0 lvy with the win over Yale.

"He is an absolute assassin and the kid is just scratching the surface. He is very hard to guard and now he has developed into an outside shooter. That was the main thing that we really wanted to work on with him."

Stephens, for his part, hasn't lost his focus on defense. "Defensively, I try to approach the game the same way whoever I am guarding," said the 6'5, 205-pound Stephens, a native of nearby Lawrenceville. "I try to stay in front, my teammates have my back on the defensive end."

In reflecting on his play at the offensive end, Stephens is feeling a greater comfort level.

"On offense, the confidence is growing and they have confidence in me," said Stephens, who is now averaging 9.5 points and 4.0 rebounds a game. "I just try the best I can on both ends of the court."

In Henderson's view, the win over Yale was a confidence builder, particularly as the Tigers head into a 20-day hiatus for exams.

"Yale is a really good team; that was a hell of a game; the win feels really good because I thought it was very, very hard fought," said Henderson.

"They are a very good team. We are pleased to be hitting our little break here with a win."

Trailing 40-35 with 12:17 remaining in regulation, Princeton stepped up at both ends of the floor, going on a 10-0 run to regain momentum.

"I thought there was some carry over from the first half, we were getting such terrific shots but there was a little bit of tension and that is what tends to happen," said Henderson, whose team went just 1-of-15 from 3-point range in the first half but then made 6-of-9 attempts from beyond the arc over the last 20 minutes of the contest.

"I thought we did a good job of going to the basket and we were able to get some stops in that run."

After Yale responded with a run of its own to go up 53-52, Princeton took control down the stretch with junior guard Amir Bell coming through with a key 3-pointer to give Princeton a 58-53 lead and the Tigers never looked back.

Bell ended the evening with 17 points in 22 minutes of action off the bench, earning the praise of Henderson.

"He is coming to the gym early and leaving late and eventually he is going to break through, "said Henderson. "I am glad for Amir, he really put us on his back tonight."

With Princeton pouring in 12 3-pointers in a 97-66 win over Brown on Friday and then finding the range in the second half against Yale, Henderson has no problem with his players continuing to fire away from the perimeter.

"We can shoot at all positions so I think that makes us very difficult to guard so we can't change too much based on what the other team is doing," said Henderson.

As Princeton heads into its exam break, Henderson sees no reason to change much.

"It is two weeks straight of exams, it is a funny time but we are used to it," said Henderson, whose team returns to action with a game at Dartmouth on February 3.

"We will work hard on us, just staying in shape and use the break to take exams and get a clear head and next we are in Hanover."

Noting that it was a lot easier to deal with finals in the wake of the weekend sweep, Stephens hopes to keep up the good work when the Tigers hit the floor in February.

"I am just trying to get my shots; my teammates are definitely finding me in the places that I like to score," said Stephens.

"I think defense leads to offense a lot of times and that helps me get going on the offensive end."

Ivy League plays a basketball tournament, and it's almost worth the 60-year wait

PHILADELPHIA — Mitch Henderson is about as Princeton as a Princeton man can be. He was an excellent basketball player for the Tigers under the legendary Pete Carril and the almost-legendary Bill Carmody. He was co-captain of the 1998 team that went undefeated in the Ivy League en route to a No. 5 seed in the NCAA tournament and a 27-2 record. He even looks exactly the way a Princeton coach should look: perfectly tailored suit, white shirt, Princeton orange-and-black tie. He rarely lets anyone see him sweat.

Except there he was Saturday afternoon, in the midst of the cauldron that was the Palestra, turning to the Princeton fans and madly waving his arms — demanding all the noise they could muster with Penn and Princeton locked in a tie with less than five minutes to play.

Welcome to the Ivy League tournament.

It only took the league 60 years to get around to playing a postseason tournament, and — even in doing so — only the top four men's and women's teams made it to the Palestra for a semifinal quadruple-header Saturday and the finals Sunday.

"Best win I ever had," Henderson said after his top-seeded team <u>survived in overtime</u>, 72-64, despite not leading for a second in regulation. "Penn was terrific. I told Coach [Steve] Donahue that. There was no way to prepare for this. I think it's great for the players to have a chance to play in a tournament like this. I hope I would say that if we had lost."

Princeton came in here with every reason to be upset that the eight Ivy League presidents decided this finally was the year to hold a tournament. Not only had the Tigers gone 14-0 — the program's first undefeated league campaign since Henderson was a senior — and won the regular season title by four games, they had to play fourth-seeded Penn on the Quakers' home court.

And even though Princeton had almost as many fans in the building as Penn did and the Ivy League covered all of Penn's logos on the floor with its own, there was no getting around that the game was played in West Philadelphia in the cathedral of

college basketball — an iconic part of the Penn campus.

"Actually, my major concern was getting my guys to understand that playoff basketball is just different," Henderson said. "It's far more physical. We took about 10 haymakers from them. Fortunately, this is a very tough group."

Donahue, who came back to Penn two years ago to rebuild the Quakers from the deep dive they had been in, also used boxing analogies to describe the game. Asked how he felt with a 44-34 lead early in the second half, he said, "I knew we were going to have to take another punch."

Haymakers? Punches? Coaches waving their arms as fans were losing their minds on just about every possession?

You bet, this is the Ivy League circa 2017. There is nothing genteel about it. All four men's teams in Saturday's semifinal doubleheader — Yale beat Harvard, 73-71, in the just-as-intense second game — played tough, fight-through-every-screen defense. Every rebound was fought for. Every pass was challenged.

The league is committed to playing a tournament for at least three years but is only locked in to the Palestra for this season.

After Saturday, home-court advantage or not, there should be no doubt about where the tournament is held in all future years.

"Another great game in a wonderful building," Yale Coach James Jones said. He smiled. "Glad to win one in here."

The first basket in tournament history was scored by Ryan Betley, a baby-faced Penn freshman who played his high school ball 38 miles from here at Downingtown West. He finished with 18 points and 12 rebounds as Penn, which got here only by hitting a buzzer-beater to beat Harvard on March 4, made the game every bit as physical as Henderson had anticipated.

When senior Matt Howard hit a baby jumper in the lane that hit the rim at least three times to give Penn a 59-57 lead with 43 seconds left, then grabbed a rebound on Princeton's ensuing possession and was fouled with 12 seconds left, it looked like a major upset might happen.

But Howard missed the front end of the one-and-one. The Tigers' Amir Bell took the ball to the basket — and missed. Myles Stephens promptly grabbed the rebound and tied the game with five seconds left.

"I knew the ball might come off, and it came right into my hands, and I was able to put it in," said Stephens, who finished with 21 points and 10 rebounds. "I was in the right place at the right time."

Donahue, who was an assistant coach at Penn for 10 years before going on to lead Cornell to three Ivy League titles, thought that was a perfect description of the game: "One play," he said. "That's what the game ultimately came down to. And Stephens made that play."

Stephens's putback was eerily similar to Josh Hart's game-winning rebound basket for Villanova in Friday's Big East semifinal game against Seton Hall. "All our guys saw that," Henderson said. "I told them before the game this might come down to a

play like that. This game was almost exactly what I thought it would be."

Once the game went into overtime, Princeton dominated, with Stephens scoring the first two baskets to start a 9-0 run that decided the outcome.

"Jeez, they didn't lead in regulation?" Donahue said, clearly stunned when someone brought it up after the game. "That's amazing."

In truth, the day was amazing — everything the Ivy League could have hoped for.

"Took the Super Bowl 51 years to have an overtime game. Took us one," Robin Harris, the league's executive director, said with a Cheshire-cat grin.

For years, the Ivy League resisted calls to play a tournament if only because the eight school presidents are always trying to prove they're different and above the fray of money-chasing big-time sports. But when Harvard and Yale played here two years ago in a one-game playoff for the league title, the old gym was almost full, the atmosphere was electric, and the game, won by Harvard, was superb.

Everyone took notice. What's more, this is no longer a league that consists of Penn and Princeton and six other schools. Harvard, under Tommy Amaker, not only won or shared five straight titles, it upset a No. 3 seed and a No. 5 seed in back-to-back seasons in the NCAA tournament. A year ago, under James Jones, Yale won its first conference title since 1962, upset Baylor in the first round of the NCAAs and then put a scare into Duke.

"This is a very good basketball league," Donahue said. "We're a young team. Princeton is a young team. So are Harvard and Yale."

In fact, going into the season's final weekend, all eight teams had a mathematical chance to play here. Which is why conference tournaments make sense: They give every player hope.

"I'll only get to play in this once," Princeton senior Spencer Weisz said. "Going forward, though, this is going to be great thing for everyone who plays in this league."

Princeton and Yale will meet in the final Sunday at high noon. The game will, no doubt, be a donnybrook. That sort of game is now an Ivy League tournament tradition.

Princeton men win Ivy championship, punch ticket to Big Dance

PHILADELPHIA -- Winning breeds confidence, so when you win 19 straight basketball games you don't expect to lose.

That's what happened over the weekend for the Princeton University men's basketball team as the Tigers won the inaugural lvy League Tournament at the Palestra.

After coming back from 10 down to beat Penn on Saturday, Princeton went out against Yale on Sunday, fell behind right away by five points and was down by a point at the beginning of the second half. From there, the Tigers took charge and went on to win 71-59.

Next up, the NCAA Tournament.

No. 12-seeded Princeton will meet fifth-seeded Notre Dame on Thursday in Buffalo. The time is undetermined.

"This experience has made us a lot better team," coach Mitch Henderson said, sitting at a press table in the interview room alongside three players. All wore freshly distributed orange T-shirts announcing their championship.

"The way we're playing now, it's hard to stop us," senior tri-captain Steven Cook said. "It will be hard to stop us if we keep playing consistent; whoever we end up playing we can be trouble."

"We're battle-tested," added senior tri-captain Spencer Weisz. "These two games give you that feeling of sudden death."

Princeton put together a couple of runs to keep the game close in the opening half. After trailing 7-2, the Tigers went on a 9-2 run to take an 11-9 lead. Yale responded by going up seven at 21-14, but Princeton closed the half on a 17-8 tear.

Yale opened the second half with a 3-pointer to go up 32-31, but the Bulldogs never led again.

Sophomore Myles Stephens, named Tournament MVP, hit a pair of free throws, scored underneath, and after Cook buried a three from the left corner, Yale coach James Jones signaled for time as his team trailed, 38-32.

Now 19-11, Yale would get no closer than five points the rest of the way.

The Connecticut squad could not stop Stephens (23 points, 8 rebounds, a block, two steals and two assists), especially in the second half.

The Tigers outscored Yale in that half 40-30 by shooting 52 percent overall and 50 percent on 3-pointers (7 of 14). They also turned the ball over just twice; just seven times in the game.

Cook, who made first team all-tournament, added 15 points while making all four free throws. Sophomore Devin Cannady (perfect from the free throw line this weekend at 14 for 14), hit four of four freebees and had 13 points.

Yale was held to 37.7 percent shooting and made only 6 of 20 from deep.

It was 3-pointers that separated the teams down the stretch.

With Princeton up 44-39, Stephens hit a three, Weisz drove for a bucket, Cannady hit a three, and as Yale kept it close at 52-45, Cook and Will Gladson swished from deep and suddenly it was a 58-45 game - and visions of sugar plums dancing in Princeton's head.

Weisz, Ivy League Player of the Year, continued to struggle offensively. He was 6-for-24 the two days, but Sunday did have eight assists.

"I try to be an extension of the coach and stay even-keeled," Weisz said about contributing in other ways. "We won it, so I really don't care what I shot."

What they care about is the NCAA Tournament, and they aren't happy to just be there.

"I'm really fired up with the opportunity we have," Henderson said. "It can end really quickly, and the guys know that. (But) we're playing with a fearlessness that I think you need going into a tournament."

That's what happens when you're on a 19-game winning streak.

The Tigers' 19th straight victory came Sunday afternoon, and it was historic: They captured the first Ivy League Tournament title with a 71-59 dispatching of Yale. It came one day after Princeton nearly fell off the tightrope,

PHILADELPHIA — As you scan that NCAA Tournament bracket pool for a first-round upset pick, perhaps even

rallying past Penn in overtime of Saturday's semifinal.

That wobble is precisely why Princeton is poised to advance in the Big Dance for the first time since 1998. For the Tigers, who received a No. 12 seed and open against Notre Dame Thursday in Buffalo (12:15 p.m. CBS), the jitters are out.

For a variety of reasons, the inaugural Ivy League Tournament was stacked against Princeton, which went 14-0 through the league's regular season. The lure of the Palestra — with its rich history, 8,700-seat capacity and central location — made the Cathedral a logical site. But it submitted Princeton to a real acid test.

"This experience this weekend made us a lot better team, so I'm really fired up about one opportunity we have," said Princeton coach Mitch Henderson, who won two NCAA Tournament games as a Tigers star in the 1990s. "It can end really quickly and these guys know that, but they're playing with the fearlessness that I think you're going to need."

If you've watched March Madness over the years, then you know the three ingredients all Davids must possess to fell Goliath: experience, tenacity and the ability to drain threes.

Let's go over those qualities.

Marksmanship? Princeton shoots a collective 38 percent from 3-point range. And here's the thing: that's spread out over five players. Steven Cook, Myles Stephens and Devin Cannady are above .400, with Amir Bell and Weisz close behind. So one guy having an off day won't derail the train.

Toughness? During the non-conference schedule Princeton lost two injured starters for the season, guard Henry Caruso and big man Hans Brase. They dusted off, adjusted and haven't lost since Dec. 20 at Monmouth.

Experience? Three seniors start. Two of them, Weisz and Cook, are heart-and-soul pillars who spent four years building to this point. Cook is a finalist for the national Senior Class Award, which recognizes excellence on and off the court. Weisz is finishing up a 75-page thesis on changing cultural attitudes during the 1970s. These guys have their act together.

All those traits came together to push Princeton through Ivy Madness.

Against Penn the Tigers couldn't hit the side of a barn and trailed by 10 in the second half, yet won a game they never led in regulation. And did it thanks to the quintessential toughness play — an offensive rebound.

Against Yale five different players combined to hit 11 3-pointers at an impressive 42 percent clip from deep. In the second half Princeton's offense reached a gear that few teams possess: precision spacing, ball-sharing and shooting, with everyone getting in on the action.

Yale coach James Jones, whose program knocked off Baylor in last year's first round, knows these Tigers have what it takes.

"They have a veteran crew, and that experience helped them win all the close games," Jones said. "They won all of them. That's hard to do. It's almost impossible, how they won some games, like (against Penn). How did they win that?

People around the country will be asking that question later this week. Get a jump on that now, when you fill out the bracket. You can thank me later.

College basketball: Cannady adds depth to game at Princeton

Two years ago, Devin Cannady was hoping to get the chance to play basketball at any of the top schools in Indiana.

Now the sophomore is looking to lead his Princeton University team to the inaugural lvy League tournament championship — and its automatic bid in the NCAA tournament.

Cannady starred on the court at Marian High School, finishing second on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,475 points.

The 6-foot-1 point guard has only continued to excel at Princeton, playing in all 29 games last season and averaging 11.6 points per game — third on the team.

This year he's upped his average to 13.7, second-best on the team,

while starting 21 consecutive games for a team that went 21-6 overall, including 14-0 in Ivy League play.

"(Cannady) has a gift for putting the ball in the basket," Princeton head coach Mitch Henderson said Tuesday. "But we asked him at the beginning of the season to take on more of a leadership role and a stronger role defensively, and he's embraced both of those."

"The coaches challenged me to lead the younger guys, and also 'lead up' and not be afraid to have my voice be heard with the seniors and juniors," Cannady said.
"One of our focuses at the beginning of the year was being team-defense oriented and guarding our men as a team."

The defense-first approach has paid off: as of Tuesday, Princeton was ranked ninth in the country in scoring defense, allowing just 61.5 points per game, on its way to a regular-season conference crown.

That would have punched the team's ticket to the Big Dance in prior years, but this year the Ivy League's bid will go to the winner of the conference's first postseason tournament.

"There's feelings on both sides of the sword," Cannady said. "Any other year, we'd be punched into the NCAA tournament, and on ESPN (tournament bid tracker), where it says 'Ivy League' it would now say 'Princeton.'

"But honestly, what some might see as unfair, I see as an opportunity to continue to get better and play."

Cannady and the top-seeded Tigers meet fourth-seeded Penn, which also serves as the tournament host, on Saturday at 1:30 p.m. in Philadelphia. The winner of that semifinal takes on the winner of the Harvard-Yale semifinal Sunday.

"It's going to be a great atmosphere," Cannady said. "I remember the first couple times I played there, it reminded me of playing back home in Indiana, whether it's Hinkle (Fieldhouse at Butler) or really any high school gym that sells out."

His head coach understands that Indiana basketball atmosphere about as well as Cannady: Henderson attended Culver Military Academy and was the last person from Indiana to play at Princeton before Cannady.

"I could talk about where the Steak-n-Shake was on Route 31," Henderson said.

"(Henderson) was able to sway me with some connections," Cannady said of his recruitment. "Really putting our family first, but also leaving home and showing me how, down the road, I could still help my family succeed by being at Princeton."

A self-professed "family guy," Cannady said not having them at most of his games has been one of the hardest parts about playing at an Ivy League school in New Jersey. He added that family members plan to make the trek to Philadelphia this weekend, though.

And maybe somewhere else in March.

"I'm not looking past Penn and seeing who'd we play on Sunday in the championship," Cannady said. "But it's been my dream to play in March Madness, and when you hear that 'One Shining Moment' song, it gives you chills every time."
