How Did We Get Here?

The Cornell Big Red defeated the Princeton Football Team, 20-17, at Schoelkopf Field on last Saturday.

Cornell scored 13 unanswered points in the second half to take the win.

Princeton was forced to punt and Cornell ran off 6:21 of game time before a tackle for loss from Stephen Ordille on 3rd down allowed head coach Bob Surace's unit one more opportunity. The Tigers got to the Cornell 37-yard line but could not get any closer.

Roman Laurio had a career-high 97 yards receiving while Clark had 113 all-purpose yards. Nasir Hill paced the Tigers with 11 tackles while Haynie rang the bell twice, adding a pick in the loss.

Dartmouth is 5-2 this season and 2-2 in the Ivy League. DJ Crowther paces the Big Green's offense with 596 yards rushing and seven touchdowns. Zylon Freer-Brown has 62 tackles to lead the defense.

Are You Joshing Me?

Josh Robinson was named to the Stats Perform 2025 Jerry Rice Award Watch List.

The freshman is one of 22 players that have been nominated to the watch list which honors the FCS freshman player of the year in college football's Division I subdivision.

For the fourth time this season, Robinson was selected as the Ivy League Rookie of the Week following his performance against Cornell, adding 44 yards on three catches including a touchdown.

His 27-yard touchdown was an impressive athletic display worthy of being No. 10 on Sportscenter's Top 10 Plays of the Day.

Robinson now has 26 catches for 318 yards and two touchdowns to pace the Tigers. He is on the doorstep of breaking the program's freshman records for single-season receptions (29) and single-season receiving yards (341), set by Matt Costello '15 in 2011.

His four Rookie of the Week honors are the third most in Princeton history, trailing Chuck Dibilio's six in 2011.

He was the first Ivy athlete to earn three consecutive Ivy Rookie of the Week honors since Penn's Malachi Hosley in 2023. The last Princeton player to earn that milestone was Ryan Butler in 2022.

After recording two catches in the first two weeks, Robinson has brought in 24 receptions for 292 yards over his last five contests.

Fun Numbers That We Enjoy

5: Chase Christopher, after recording only one tackle in 2023, has posted at least five stops in 15 of his last 17 games including his career high (14) at Lafayette.

73: Robinson's 73 yards receiving vs. Columbia were the first time a true freshman had over 70 yards since Matt Costello '15 had 79 yards vs. Harvard in 2011.

84: Charles W. Caldwell Jr. '25 Head Coach of Football Bob Surace registered his 84th victory against Brown. He sits with an 84-63 mark at Princeton while also going 18-3 at Western Connecticut, good for a .607 winning percentage.

Double Athletes

Jackson Green also plays for the lacrosse team. He made his way into the rotation towards the end of the year, playing in 11 games including the 2025 NCAA Tournament. Following his touchdown vs. Lafayette, Green became the first Princeton Tiger to score a touchdown and a lacrosse goal since Rob Bordley '70.

Paul Kuhner and Kavon Miller are members of the Men's Track and Field team. Miller was part of the 4x400 relay team that set an Ivy League record with a 3:02.62 to reach NCAA nationals. Clayton Gary and Anthony Liakhnovich will also be members of the track and field team this year.

Jay Mentink plays baseball at Princeton and has seen time in 37 games. Freshmen Christian Clarke will also play baseball.

Jalen Travis '24 was selected in the fourth round of the 2025 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts (127th overall) and is the 18th Tiger picked overall. Travis is the highest selection of a Princeton football player in the modern NFL Draft era surpassing Seth DeValve was picked by the Cleveland Browns in the fourth round of the 2016 draft (138th overall).

The former Tiger did his graduate season at Iowa State. The Cyclones won 11 games including a 42-41 thriller over No. 15 Miami in the Pop-Tarts Bowl. Travis finished with All-Big 12 honorable mention accolades.

Travis was a two-time Second-Team All-Ivy selection at Princeton and earned the Coach Wooden Citizenship Cup in 2024. In his three playing seasons at tackle, he helped the Tigers to two top-two scoring offenses in the Ivy League.

Andrei Iosivas was selected in the sixth round of the NFL Draft by the Cincinnati Bengals in April of 2023 becoming the 17th Tiger ever selected in the draft. He was the first Princeton player to be selected in the NFL Draft since DeValve in 2016.

For his career, the former Tiger has 67 catches for 831 yards and 11 touchdowns for the Bengals. He posted five catches for 66 yards and his first touchdown of the season in the Bengals' loss to the Chicago Bears last Sunday. His 11 touchdowns and 67 catches are the most by any Princeton skill player in NFL history as he just passed Seth DeValve (60) in receptions. Iosivas is one of just 14 players in Ivy history to record at least 10 touchdowns (non-QB passes). Calvin Hill of Yale is the leader with 65.

The former Tiger will go down as not only one of the all-time great Princeton wide receivers, but one of the all-time great Princeton athletes. Iosivas was also a 2022 NCAA All-American in the heptathlon at the indoor championships highlighted by the fastest 60m time (6.71). He was also a three-time Ivy champion in the heptathlon.

The football senior captain collected four All-American honors following his 2022 season after leading the Ivy League in receptions (66), receiving yards (943) and touchdown catches (seven) while being ranked ninth in the FCS in receiving yards and 14th in receptions per game (6.6).

Iosivas ended his Princeton career with two All-Ivy selections and ranked sixth all-time in receiving yards (1,909), 12th in receptions (125), and third in touchdown catches (16).

Stephen Carlson '17 was named to the Chicago Bears' practice squad. The former Tiger has played in 28 games, making six catches for 62 yards, adding a touchdown.

Carlson was a two-time All-Ivy wideout at Princeton and ended his career ranked third all-time in TD catches (16), eighth in receiving yards (1,632), and 10th in receptions (125).

Henry Byrd '23 is on the Minnesota Vikings' active roster, having seen action in three games this season. Byrd was a Stats Perform FCS All-American in 2022 after helping Princeton post the Ivy's No. 1 passing offense and the No. 2 scoring offense. During his career, Byrd was a three-time All-Ivy selection including two first-team accolades in 2021 and 2022.

Jeremiah Tyler '22 finished his third season with the Houston franchise of the USFL. He has been remarkable consistent with the Houston Gamblers, recording 54 tackles in 2023, 51 in 2024 and 53 in 2025.

Tyler collected three All-Ivy selections as a Princeton Tiger including two first-team honors. He was finalist for Ivy Defensive Player of the Year in 2019 and won the award in 2021. During his senior campaign in 2021, Tyler nabbed Second-Team Stats Perform FCS All-America, Phil Steele FCS Fourth Team All-America, was a Stats Perform FCS Buck Buchanan Award Finalist in addition to his Bushnell Cup.

Princeton Against The Top 25

Since the Associated Press started doing weekly College Football polls in 1936, the Princeton Tigers have faced off against 70 ranked opponents, going 15-55 after losing to No.14/17 Harvard.

Princeton's contest vs. No. 7 Mercer last season was the highest ranked opponent for the program since battling No. 3 Lehigh in 2002, a 31-24 loss. The Tigers have two top 10 wins, defeating No. 3 Penn, 17-14, in 1946 and No. 10 Cornell, 27-0, in 1950.

During Surace's tenure as head coach, Princeton is 6-11 against ranked opponents with four of the wins coming against Harvard. The Tigers have won three of the last five games against ranked foes. Surace's only non-conference ranked victory was against No. 25 Monmouth in 2021.

Pop Culture News

The Tigers' 17-10 victory over Columbia occurred on the same day that Taylor Swift released The Life of a Showgirl. Princeton also won on the same day that Swift released Midnights on Oct. 21, 2022, taking down Harvard, 37-10. Andrei Iosivas had nine catches for 176 yards and a touchdown in the victory.

Princeton has won one Ivy League title in years that Swift has released an album (2006).

BOB SURACE '90 - 15TH SEASON THE CHARLES W. CALDWELL JR. '25 HEAD COACH OF FOOTBALL

Bob Surace '90, a four-time finalist for the Eddie Robinson Jr. National Head Coach of the Year award, has built Princeton football into a model FCS program as head coach, complete with four Ivy League championships, multiple NFL draft picks and players, Bushnell Cup winners and finalists and the program's first national first-team Academic All-America in more than 20 years.

Surace has a record of 84-63, including a record of 82-43 after a 2-20 start. He has led the Tigers to six seasons of at least eight wins; Princeton had five eight-win seasons in the 44 years prior to when he became head coach.

He has placed 182 players on the All-Ivy League teams throughout his tenure, and he has coached a Bushnell Cup recipient in eight of the last 12 seasons, the most for any coach in the Ivy League. He has seen a quarterback win the Offensive Player of the Year honors four times — Quinn Epperly in 2013, Lovett in 2016/2018, and Chad Kanoff in 2017 – and had four Defensive Players of the Year – Mike Catapano in 2012, Mike Zeuli in 2014, Jeremiah Tyler in 2021 and Liam Johnson in 2022.

The Tigers had 10 All-Ivy honorees in 2024 including four second-team selections in Tommy Matheson, Nasir Hill, Marco Scarano and Jack DelGarbino. Jalen Travis '24 was selected in the fourth round of the 2025 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts.

Travis (127th overall) is the highest selection of a Princeton football player in the modern NFL Draft era surpassing Seth DeValve who was picked 138th overall in the fourth round of the 2016 draft by the Cleveland Browns.

Princeton recorded 10 All-Ivy selections in 2023 with Ozzie Nicholas and Liam Nicholas earning First-Team accolades. Travis, in addition to second-team All-Ivy honors, collected the 2024 Coach Wooden Citizenship Cup and won the Princeton University Art Lane '34 Cup. Nicholas was named a Pro Football Focus All-American and was selected a Stats Perform FCS All-American Third Team honoree.

The 2022 season saw Princeton go 8-2 and be in contention for the Ivy League title into the final week of the regular season. The Tigers had 16 All-Ivy selections tied for second-most at Princeton since 2013 while Liam Johnson was named the Bushnell Cup winner for Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year. Andrei Iosivas was later selected in the sixth round of the 2023 NFL Draft by the Cincinnati Bengals.

The 2021 season saw the Tigers go 9-1, securing the program's third Ivy League title in five seasons. Princeton had 16 All-Ivy selections including 10 first-team honorees, a program record. Surace's offense ranked first in the conference in scoring, second in passing offense and passing efficiency and third in total offense. The Tigers' defensive unit was one of the best in the NCAA FCS as it allowed the second fewest first downs, third in rushing defense, eighth in team sacks per game and ninth in total defense. Tyler was named Second-Team Stats Perform FCS All-America and the Bushnell Cup winner as the Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year.

Princeton had one of the greatest seasons in program and Ivy history, recording a perfect 10-0 record, the first perfect year for a Tiger football team since 1964. Princeton was ranked as high as No. 8 in the AFCA Coaches Poll in 2018, the highest it has been ranked since the Division I-AA/FCS level began in 1978. Princeton set an Ivy League record for total points (470) in a season and produced a defense that limited seven of 10 opponents to 10 points or fewer.

Previously, Surace led Princeton to both the 2013 and 2016 Ivy League championships. He was named a National Coach of the Year finalist after all three championship seasons, as well as a 2012 season that saw the Tigers break through from a 1-9 campaign to one where they were in the Ivy race until the final day of the season. Surace was first named the Ivy League Head Coach of the Year in 2016 after leading Princeton to the Ivy League championship. His team led the Ivy League in scoring, total and rushing offense, as well as scoring, total and rushing defense. Princeton had two All-America honorees, the Ivy League Offensive Player of the Year, a finalist for Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year, and 18 All-Ivy League players. He won the award again after the perfect 2018 season, when 18 Tigers earned All-Ivy honors, and Princeton had both Offensive Player of the Year finalists in Jesper Horsted and eventual winner John Lovett.

That championship performance came three seasons after the memorable 2013 Ivy championship season, when Princeton set Ivy League records in both total offense and scoring offense. Princeton, which averaged 43.7 points per game, saw quarterback Quinn Epperly earn the Bushnell Cup as the league's Top Offensive Player.

A 1990 Princeton grad, Surace was a center for the Tigers, helping the team to the 1989 Ivy League title while winning first-team All-Ivy honors. He is one of two people to win an Ivy League championship as a player and a head coach. Surace's wife, Lisa, was a four-time letterwinner in women's soccer at Princeton and is a member of the Class of 1992. She holds a Ph.D. in psychology and is now the Lower School Head at Princeton Day School. They have a daughter, Alison, and a son, A.J., both of whom are athletes themselves.
