LEONARDO - Last Game Info.

•The Princeton Women's Basketball Team's Class of 2025 shined on their Senior Night combining for 42 points in a 71-42 takedown of the Yale Bulldogs at Jadwin Gym on Saturday.

•Prior to the game, the team honored Adaora Nwokeji, Paige Morton, Parker Hill, Amelia Osgood and Katie Thiers for their contributions to the program. The quintet has won 92 wins, gone 48-4 in Ivy action and corralled three Ivy titles, three Ivy Tournament titles and two NCAA Tournament wins.

•Head coach Carla Berube started all five together and boy, did they take advantage. The group recorded the first 12 points of the game and helped the home squad sport a 22-9 lead after 10 minutes. Princeton shot 9-of-14 from the floor (64.3 percent) during that stretch.

•The Tigers led by as many as 19 in the second frame before taking a 33-16 lead into halftime.

•Princeton's senior class once again stood out, jumping out to a 23-point lead (44-21) out of the break, forcing a Yale timeout with 5:29 to go in the third quarter. The Tigers expanded their advantage to 29 and was never threatened the rest of the way.

•The Class of 2025 was subbed out of the game for the final time with 1:09 to go as it outscored Yale by 22 when all five players were on the floor together.

•Each player played a vital part as Osgood (13) and Nwokeji (10) set new career highs while Morton contributed eight points and eight rebounds. Thiers added seven points and five rebounds while Hill dished out five dimes in the victory.

RAPHAEL - NCAA Rankings

•The Tigers rank 24th in field goal percentage (46.4), 28th in scoring defense (56.1), 38th in field goal percentage defense (37.3) and rebound margin (+9.0), 53rd in three-point field goal percentage (34.7), 62nd in assists per game (15.5), 65th in blocks per game (4.0), 67th in assist/turnover ratio (1.05) and scoring margin (+10.8).

•Princeton has a NCAA Net Ranking of 50, third in the Ivy League behind Harvard (34) and Columbia (42). Charlie Creme's ESPN's Bracketology has the Tigers as one of the first teams out of the field while Harvard is one of the last four teams in.

•The Tigers and Lions are tied at the top of the Ivy League standings at 9-1. Harvard is third at 8-2 with losses to both teams. If Princeton or Columbia wins out, that will clinch the outright Ivy League title. Should there be a three-way tie, Harvard will earn the No. 1 seed in the Ivy League Tournament.

•Parker Hill is second in the Ivy League in blocks per game (.91).

•Ashley Chea sits second among conference foes in three-point field goal percentage (36.8) and third in threes per game (2.1).

DONATELLO - Berube Stats

•Carla Berube has been named to the 2025 Kathy Delaney-Smith Mid-Major Coach of the Year Award Midseason Watch List presented by Her Hoop Stats.

•In four playing seasons played under Berube, the Tigers have won four Ivy League championships, posting a 62-4 record against Ivy opponents during the regular season.

•Overall, the Tigers are 118-22 (.843) during Berube's tenure as head coach at Princeton with three Ivy League Tournament Championships and two NCAA Tournament victories.

MICHELANGELO- Top Returners

•The top returning starter was Madison St. Rose. St. Rose, who was Second-Team All-Ivy last season, as she was second on the squad in scoring at 14.8 points per game.

•This season, the junior was leading the team in scoring at 17.0 points and rebounding at 7.3 caroms per game before a knee injury ended her season.

•Skye Belker became only the fifth freshmen in program history to start every game last season. She averaged 8.5 points, 1.9 rebounds and 1.5 assists while earning three Ivy Rookie of the Week honors.

•Belker is averaging 12.2 points, 3.3 assists and 2.0 rebounds in 2024-25. She set a new career high with 24 points on 8-of-9 shooting at Utah.

•Another returner that has moved into the starting lineup is Ashley Chea. The sophomore played in every game last year and produced 6.0 points, 1.4 rebounds and 1.2 assists per contest.

•Chea is averaging 12.7 points, 3.5 assists, 3.3 rebounds for Princeton this year. She earned Ivy Player of the Week for her performance vs. Penn, the second of her career.

•Tabitha Amanze appeared in 15 games as a sophomore, averaging 2.7 points, 1.5 rebounds. This season, the junior is putting up 6.8 points and 4.5 rebounds per contest.

•After seeing action in 15 games last season, Fadima Tall has started 22 games this year and is corralling 9.3 points, 6.2 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.3 steals per contest.

•Parker Hill was regular in last year's rotation, averaging almost 12 minutes per contest. This season, Hill has started every game, collecting 7.0 points on 65.0 percent shooting, 4.7 rebounds and 2.0 assists, all career highs.

•Olivia Hutcherson saw action in nine games in her freshman season, but averages 18.7 minutes per contest this season and has started almost every game since St. Rose's injury. She has snagged 3.7 points and 4.3 rebounds per game.

FOOT CLAN - Analytical Info. for 2024-25

•Head coach Carla Berube's unit is currently No. 44 in the Her Hoop Stats' Simple RPI (58.7) which treats all games equally (25% Team Win %, 50% Average Opponent Win %, 50% Average Opponent's Average Opponent Win %).

•It is different from the NCAA RPI because the NCAA RPI values home wins as 0.6 wins, home losses as 1.4 losses, away wins as 1.4 wins, and away losses as 0.6 losses.

SPLINTER - The Class of 2024

- A three-time Ivy League Tournament Most Outstanding Player, Kaitlyn Chen, who graduated in May, was the gold standard during the best stretch of Princeton Women's Basketball history.
- In just three playing seasons, Chen led the Tigers to three Ivy League titles, three Ivy League Tournament crowns and three NCAA Tournament appearances.
- The true definition of a student-athlete, Chen was named a College Sports Communicators Second Team Academic All-American as a senior, the program's first since 2016, after finishing her Tiger career with 1,276 points and 359 assists.
- Chen is averaging 6.6 points, 3.5 assists and 1.7 rebounds for the UConn Huskies this season.
- Chet Nweke had a career season in her senior campaign, averaging 6.1 points, 4.8 rebounds per contest. She finished her Princeton career with three Ivy titles and three Ivy League Tournament championships.

• Nweke is doing a graduate season at Georgetown, joining coach Bella Alarie '20, but tore her ACL in the first game.

• Ellie Mitchell graduated as the program's all-time leader in rebounding (1,125) as she recorded the three highest rebounding totals ever by a Tiger (338 in 2022-23, 311 in 2021-22 and 306 in 2023-24).

• Mitchell had 54 games with at least 10 rebounds or more. She recorded six as a freshman, 16 as a sophomore, 17 as a junior and 16 in 2023-24. She finished her career with 15 caroms including eight offensive boards in the NCAA Tournament game vs. West Virginia.

• The former captain was a three-time Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year as she was the foundation piece for a defense that ranked No. 20 in scoring defense (56.2) in 2023-24, sixth in 2022-23 (53.2) and fourth in 2021-22 (51.5).

THE SHREDDER - National Ranked Games

• After three ranked games in 2023-24, Princeton is 4-32 all-time against nationally ranked teams, defeating No. 20 Oklahoma 77-63 on Thanksgiving in 2023 two days before a 72-63 loss to No. 19 Indiana, both in Fort Myers, Fla. Just six days before the Oklahoma game, Princeton lost 77-74 at No. 3 UCLA.

• Before the 2021-22 season, the Tigers had one program victory over a top-25 team, coming on Jan. 5, 1978, 70-57 over No. 18 Rutgers, when coach Carla Berube was two years old. Princeton proceeded to collect two during that 2021-22 campaign.

• Princeton took down No. 15 Kentucky in the first round of the 2022 NCAA Tournament. In December of 2021, the Tigers defeated No. 22 Florida Gulf Coast, 58-55, the program's first top-25 victory in 43 years.

- After the Rutgers game in 1978, the Tigers did not face another top-25 opponent for 24 years until battling No. 7 Stanford on Nov. 29, 2002.

- Princeton went on to face 24 more top-25 squads and went 0-25, until the 2021 game against FGCU.

APRIL O'NEIL - NCAA Tournament Info.

- Last season was the fifth straight NCAA Tournament that Princeton has participated in. The Tigers fell to No. 8 seeded West Virginia, 63-53, in the first round.

- The Tigers reach the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year in 2023 after defeating NC State 64-63 on a game-winning three by Grace Stone with 4.7 seconds to go.

- During the 2021-22 season, head coach Carla Berube's unit defeated No. 6 seeded Kentucky, the SEC Champion, 69-62, in the first round, the program's second-ever NCAA victory.

- Princeton would then take No. 3 Indiana to the limit in the Second Round, falling to the hosts at Assembly Hall, 56-55.

- Before the 2021-22 campaign, the Tigers last appeared in the NCAA Tournament in 2019, dropping an 82-77 decision to No. 17 Kentucky.

- The program has been seeded as low as No. 12 and as high as No. 8. The Tigers' No. 8 seed in 2015 is the highest seed ever by an Ivy school in the NCAA.

- The Tigers' first NCAA Tournament win was an 80-70 decision over No. 9 seeded Green Bay in 2015.

- It was the second Ivy League victory (Harvard in 1998 over Stanford) in the NCAA Tournament. Princeton finished that season at 31-1 overall.

- Despite finishing second in the conference, Princeton became the first Ivy school to earn an NCAA at-large bid in 2016. The Tigers lost a 74-65 contest to No. 6 seed West Virginia.

CASEY JONES - Ivy League Tourn. Info.

- The Tigers have reached the Ivy League Tournament Championship game each year it has been played (2017, 2018, 2019, 2022, 2023, 2024), winning five times while losing in 2017 to Penn.

- Bella Alarie (twice) and Kaitlyn Chen (three times) have won the last five Tournament Most Outstanding Player awards.

- Princeton has had 15 All-Tournament selections in Alarie (three), Abby Meyers (twice) Leslie Robinson (twice), Chen (three), Gabrielle Rush, Carlie Littlefield, Julia Cunningham, Ellie Mitchell and Madison St. Rose.

MASTER TATSU - Interesting Nuggets

- Ellie Mitchell, Julia Cunningham, Maggie Connolly, Lexi Weger, Kira Emsbo, and Grace Stone have each won four Ivy regular season titles during the past two years with Princeton Women's Basketball.

- Here are the other players in Princeton history to earn four Ivy regular season titles - Jackie Jackson '78, Maggie Meier '78, Meg Bowen '13, Kate Miller '13, Lauren Polansky '13, Niveen Rasheed '13.

- Princeton has a 30-game home winning streak which is the longest such streak in the country after UConn defeated South Carolina last week (thank you Kaitlyn Chen!).

- Princeton's 15-point comeback at Rutgers in 2022-23 was the largest of the Carla Berube era.

- After winning 20 games just three times prior to the 2009-10 season, the Tigers have won at least 20 games in all but one campaign since.

- Ashley Chea's buzzer beater vs. Harvard earlier this season and Grace Stone's buzzer beater over Rhode Island (Dec. of 2022) are the first buzzer beaters for Princeton since Eileen Powers' putback with one-second remaining in overtime lifted the Tigers past Southwest Texas State, 82-81, at the Ferrell Center in Waco, Texas on Nov. 23, 2002.

- Princeton finishes each shootaround on the day of a game with a half-court shot. Amelia Osgood, Paige Morton and Ashley Chea lead the team with three, followed by Skye Belker, Olivia Hutcherson and Katie Thiers with two each. Others who have hit a shot include Taylor Charles, Emily Eadie, Mari Bickley and Parker Hill.

CHARLES PENNINGTON - #PrincetonPros

- Abby Meyers' 22 signed with the London Lions of the Women's British Basketball League in the summer of 2023. She averaged 14.3 points, 4.5 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 1.2 steals leading to her being named Eurobasket.com All-British WBL Sixth Player of the Year. Meyers is currently with Maccabi Bnot Ashdod in Israel.

- Meyers got some playing time in the WNBA with the Washington Mystics and Dallas Wings. She was drafted in the first round of the 2023 WNBA Draft by the Wings.

- Meyers was the fifth Ivy League player to be selected in the WNBA Draft, the third Princeton Tiger (Bella Alarie, Leslie Robinson) and the third Ivy athlete to be picked in the first round (Alarie and Allison Feaster '98 Harvard).

- Bella Alarie '20, one of the greatest players in program history, is the director of player development and experience with the Georgetown.

- She was selected in the first round of the 2020 WNBA Draft by the Wings. She played in two seasons, totaling 53 games along with 2.6 points and 3.1 rebounds per game before retiring.

- Alarie was first in program history in Ivy Player of the Week awards (20), blocks (249), double-doubles (40) and points (1,703).

- She was also in the top 10 in rebounds, field goal attempts, rebounding average, field goals, scoring average, free throws, free-throw attempts and free throw percentage.

- Grace Stone '23 is playing for Tapiolan Honka in Finland. Last season she played with the Anagennisi Gerasogeias of Cyprus and also saw action in Australia.

- Stone graduated from Princeton third all-time in games played (118) and fifth in free throw percentage (.802). She recorded 807 points, 405 rebounds, 138 steals and 55 blocks during her time with the Tigers.

- Carlie Littlefield '21 is playing for the Hapoel Rishon Le-Zion of Israel now. She has appeared in leagues in Slovakia and Belgium. Littlefield recorded 1,021 points in 87 games for the Tigers, adding 358 rebounds, 255 assists and 135 steals.

- Littlefield '21 and Blake Dietrick '15 led the U.S. 3x3 team to a series victory in Pristina, Kosovo in July of 2023. The tournament win is the third-ever in the Women's Series for the United States (2022 - Quebec City, 2021 - Klaipeda).

- Dietrick helped the United States 3x3 women's team earn gold at the 2023 Pan American Games in October of 2023. The United States dropped Colombia, 21-14, in the gold medal game to secure its second straight gold at the Pan American Games.

- During her senior campaign, Dietrick helped the Tigers to one of the greatest seasons in Ivy League history. The Tigers had an unblemished 30-0 regular season, won its fifth Ivy League title in six years, and won the program's first ever NCAA Tournament game in 2015.

STERNS - Breakfast Rankings

- Katie Thiers ranked each road trip's breakfast last year taking over for Maggie Connolly who did it for two seasons. Thiers ranked Yale at 9.2, DePaul 8.8, Utah 7.8, Quinnipiac 7.5, Brown 6.5, Duquesne 5.72 and Portland at 5.0. Fort Myers and Harvard - 9.4 are the top two rankings over the past three seasons.

CARLA BERUBE HEAD COACH • 6TH YEAR • CONNECTICUT '97

In four seasons under Berube, the Tigers have won four Ivy League championships, three Ivy Tournament titles, while adding two undefeated conference regular seasons. Berube has amassed a record of 62-4 in the Ivy action and 118-22 (.843) overall during her tenure as head coach at Princeton.

The 2023-24 season saw the Tigers win their fifth consecutive Ivy League Tournament title, nabbing a No. 9 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Princeton finished with a Net Ranking of 35 overall and had one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the country, taking on No. 3 UCLA on the road in addition to No. 20 Oklahoma and No. 19 Indiana on a neutral floor. The Tigers' victory over Oklahoma was the fourth top-25 win in program history.

The 2022-23 season had Women's Basketball go 24-6, advancing to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year becoming the first Ivy team to do that since Harvard men's team in 2013 and 2014. After starting the Ivy campaign 0-2, the Tigers ripped off 12 straight before sweeping both games at home in the Ivy Tournament for their second straight crown and earning a bid to the NCAAs. With the team's victory over NC State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, it marked the first time an Ivy League school has had its men's and women's teams both win in the NCAA in the same year.

The 2021-22 season saw Princeton finish with a 25-5 record, advancing to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament for just the second time in program history. After a second consecutive undefeated regular season championship in the Ivy League, the Tigers swept both games of the Ivy League Tournament to claim Berube's first Ivy Tournament title and earn an automatic bid to NCAAs.

Seeded No. 11, the Tigers knocked off No. 6 Kentucky -- the SEC Tournament champion -- in the First Round, 69-62. Princeton would then take No. 3 Indiana to the limit in the Second Round, falling to the hosts at Assembly Hall, 56-55.

Berube was named Ivy League Coach of the Year for the second season in a row, and again coached the Ivy League Player of the Year in unanimous selection Abby Meyers who was also named unanimous first-team All-Ivy. Ellie Mitchell was named Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year, while Julia Cunningham (first team) and Grace Stone (honorable mention) also garnered All-Ivy honors.

The Tigers went 26-1 overall in 2019-20 and finished with a 22-game winning streak. The Tigers' streak was the second longest in the country behind No. 1 South Carolina. The unit wrapped up the campaign with a RPI of No. 9, the best mark in Ivy history and went undefeated in conference play before the postseason was cancelled due to the Coronavirus. Berube was named the Ivy League Coach of the Year. Bella Alarie was one of three players to be named All-Ivy as she was honored with her third straight Ivy Player of the Year award. Charlie Littlefield was first-team All-Ivy for the second consecutive season while Julia Cunningham was honored with honorable mention accolades.

Berube was named the head coach of women's basketball at Princeton University in May of 2019 after spending the previous 17 years at Tufts University. Berube has also coached internationally with USA Basketball, leading the U.S. Under-16 national team to a gold medal at the FIBA Americas and the Under-17 national team to a gold medal at the World Championships.

Berube brings a long history of success as both a player and coach to Princeton. She won exactly 80 percent of her games with the Jumbos, going 384-96 in 17 seasons while reaching the NCAA Division III final twice, the Final Four four times and the Sweet 16 nine times, including each of the last eight. In her last seven seasons at Tufts, her record was 197-24, with a winning percentage of .891 during those years.

Berube was the 2015 Pat Summitt Trophy winner as the Division III National Coach of the Year and a three-time regional coach of the year.

Berube is a 1997 UConn grad with a degree in sociology. She scored 1,381 points during her career, and the Huskies were an astonishing 132-8 in her four years, for a winning percentage of .942.

The highlight of her career was the 1995 NCAA championship, which capped a perfect 35-0 season. She played in two Final Fours and also was part of four Big East championships.

After playing professionally in the American Basketball League, Berube began her coaching career as an assistant coach at Providence College before becoming the head coach at Tufts in 2002. During her time there, she coached three NESCAC Players of the Year, three Rookies of the Year, six Defensive Players of the Year and three CoSIDA Academic All-Americans.

She also has coached seven All-Americans in the last eight years.

Under Berube's leadership, Tufts reached the Division III championship game in 2016 and 2017. Her final Tufts team went 28-3, won the NESCAC championship and reached the Elite Eight of the NCAA tournament in 2019.

She is a member of the Connecticut Women's Basketball Hall of Fame and the New England Basketball Hall of Fame. In addition to the 2015 national Coach of the Year honor, Berube is also a three-time regional Coach of the Year, a four-time NESCAC Coach of the Year and a two-time USA Basketball Development Coach of the Year.

Her players have also been active in the community. The Tufts women's basketball team adopted two Team IMPACT teammates -- a 12-year-old with leukemia and a 5-year-old with sickle cell anemia -- partnering with the non-profit organization that works to improve kids' quality of life and help them experience the camaraderie of collegiate sports. Many of her players have also been Big Sisters to local children.

Carla and her wife, Meghan, are the parents of two sons, Parker and Caden, along with a daughter, Brogan.

Berube has registered 13 10+ game winning streaks in her coaching career including five that have been 20 or more.

LAUREN BATTISTA - ASSISTANT COACH

Lauren Battista is in her sixth year with Princeton in 2024-25.

In four playing seasons with Battista on the staff, Princeton has won four Ivy League championships, posting a 62-4 record against Ivy opponents during the regular season. Overall, the Tigers are 118-22 (.843) during Battista's tenure as a coach with Princeton with three Ivy League Tournament Championships and two NCAA Tournament victories.

The 2023-24 season saw the Tigers win their fifth consecutive Ivy League Tournament title, nabbing a No. 9 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Princeton finished with a Net Ranking of 35 overall and had one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the country, taking on No. 3 UCLA on the road in addition to No. 20 Oklahoma and No. 19 Indiana on a neutral floor. The Tigers' victory over Oklahoma was the fourth top-25 win in program history.

Prior to her time at Tufts, Battista was a graduate assistant at Boston College while securing her master's degree in Leadership and Administration. Before BC, Battista was at the NCAA office in a postgraduate internship program, helping the women's basketball staff with the NCAA Tournament and Final Four.

Battista graduated from Bentley University in 2014. She was a 4-year starter, 3-time All-American, and 2-year team captain for the nationally ranked Falcons. Her senior year was spectacular as she led the team to the Division II national title with an undefeated 35-0 season. She earned national recognition as the WBCA Division II National Player of the Year, the Capital One Academic All-American of the Year, CWSA/Honda Division II Athlete of the Year, and an NCAA Today's Top 10 Award honoree. She graduated as the all-time leading scorer in Bentley history, scoring over 2,100 points. Battista graduated summa cum laude with a degree in marketing and minor in finance.



LAUREN DILLON - ASSISTANT COACH

Lauren Dillon is in sixth year with Princeton in 2024-25.

In four playing seasons with Dillon on the staff, Princeton has won four Ivy League championships, posting a 62-4 record against Ivy opponents during the regular season. Overall, the Tigers are 118-22 (.843) during Dillon's tenure as a coach with Princeton with three Ivy League Tournament Championships and two NCAA Tournament victories.

Dillon came from Tufts where she spent a season as a coach after graduating from the school in 2018. She helped lead her squad team to a NESCAC championship her freshmen year, and one Elite Eight, one Final Four, and two National Championship game appearances throughout her career.

A two-year captain, Dillon was the NESCAC Defensive Player of the Year as a sophomore, earned a First-Team All-League honor as a senior and graduated as the program's all-time record in career steals and assists.

She earned her masters' degree in Child Study and Human Development at Tufts in 2021.

Previously, Edwards played for three seasons at High Point, helping the Panthers to its first NCAA Tournament in 2021. Edwards averaged 7.1 points, 4.2 assists and 3.1 rebounds per game in 87 contests. She also saw action in 61 contests at Niagara before transferring to High Point.

Lilly Paro is in her fourth season with Princeton in 2024-25.

In almost three seasons played under Paro, the Tigers have won two Ivy League championships, posting a 47-3 record against Ivy opponents during the regular season. Overall, the Tigers are 92-20 (.821) during Paro's tenure at Princeton.

Paro graduated from Tufts in 2020 where she was coached by Berube for two of her three seasons. She saw action in 78 games, averaging 2.7 points and adding 63 three-pointers. The Jumbos went to the Division III Sweet 16 all four years she was at Tufts.

After graduating with a degree in Psychology, Paro was a learning specialist at the Connelly School of the Holy Child in Potomac, Md. While there, she coached basketball and lacrosse and was a volunteer assistant at Smith College.

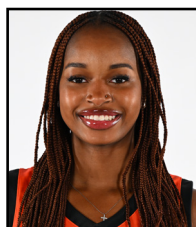
