JACK FROST - BASIC INFORMATION

- The Princeton Women's Basketball Team improved to No. 19 in the Associated Press and the WBCA Coaches' Poll.
- The Tigers are 17-1 overall and currently on a 15-game winning streak. It's the highest ranking in the AP poll for the program since the end of the 2014-15 season. It's also the third week that the Tigers are in the WBCA poll.
- Princeton has a Net Ranking of 40 highlighted by a quad 1 victory at Villanova and three more quad two decisions along with a non-conference strength of schedule of 20.
- Head coach Carla Berube's squad is also No. 1 in the College Insider Women's Mid-Major Top 25 poll for the eighth consecutive week.
- Berube was named to the 2026 Kathy Delaney-Smith Mid-Major Coach of the Year Award Midseason Watch List this week.
- The Tigers have five players that average at least 11.0 points per game in Madison St. Rose (16.5), Fadima Tall (13.6), Skye Belker (12.9), Ashley Chea (11.7) and Olivia Hutcherson (11.4). All but St. Rose have won Ivy Player of the Week.
- Princeton is the only team in the country to have five players start at least 12 games and average at least 11.0 points per contest.
- The Tigers' starting five averages 66.1 points per game, sixth best in the nation behind Murray St., South Carolina, Oklahoma, UCLA and Notre Dame.
- The two teams directly behind Princeton are Iowa State (65.5) and Vanderbilt (65.2).

- St. Rose leads the Tigers in scoring at 16.5 points, while averaging 5.1 rebounds per game. The senior captain has four 20+ point games along with two double-doubles. She has scored in double figures in all but two games this season.
- She recently surpassed 1,000 career points (1,054), becoming the 29th Tiger to join that milestone. She is 27th on the program's all-time scoring list, four points shy of Allison Cahill '03 (1,058). The next closest Tiger to 1,000 career points is Belker at 850 points.
- If St. Rose keeps up her current pace, she will finish with over 1,200 points. The Old Bridge, N.J. native has also been named to the Wooden Watch List and Becky Hammon Mid-Major Player of the Year Watch List.
- Princeton is on a 15-game winning streak, the fourth time its recorded a 15+ game winning streak under Berube. The Tigers have nabbed five 10+ game winning streaks with Berube as coach. Berube has corralled 14 such streaks in her coaching career.
- Belker (45.6 percent overall and 41.4 percent from three), Tall (39.3 percent from three), Hutcherson (53.5 percent overall) and St. Rose (46.2 percent overall) are all shooting career highs.
- Four Tigers have earned Ivy Player of the Week in Chea (Jan. 20), Hutcherson (Jan. 5), Tall (Dec. 15, Nov. 17) and Belker (Nov. 27). Tall also nabbed Ann Meyers Drysdale USBWA National Player of the Week twice (Dec. 16, Nov. 11).
- The Tigers have an overall strength of schedule that is the 29th best in the country (.581) according to warrenolan.com. Princeton's opponents are 192-133 overall (.591).

- Before the 2021-22 season, the Tigers had one program victory over a top-25 team, coming on Jan. 5, 1978, a 70-57 decision over No. 18 Rutgers, when coach Carla Berube was two years old.

- Princeton proceeded to collect two during that 2021-22 campaign. Berube's crew took down No. 15 Kentucky in the first round of the 2022 NCAA Tournament.

- In December of 2021, the Tigers defeated No. 22 Florida Gulf Coast, 58-55, the program's first top-25 victory in 43 years.

- After the Rutgers game in 1978, the Tigers did not face another top-25 opponent for 24 years until battling No. 7 Stanford on Nov. 29, 2002. Princeton went on to face 24 more top-25 squads and went 0-24, until the 2021 game against FGCU.

CHILLY THE SNOWMAN - NCAA TOURN. INFO

- Last season was the Tigers' sixth straight NCAA Tournament as they fell to Iowa State in one of the NCAA First Four contests.

- The Ivy League earned three bids in the NCAA Tournament last season. Princeton was a No. 10 seed as one of the last four teams in. Columbia was selected as a No. 11 seed while Harvard earned the automatic qualifier and a No. 10 seed. Columbia defeated Washington in one of the First Four games.

- In 2024, the Tigers fell to No. 8 seeded West Virginia, 63-53, in the first round.

- The Tigers reach the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year in 2023 after defeating NC State 64-63 on a game-winning three by Grace Stone with 4.7 seconds to go. Princeton fell in the second round to No. 8 nationally ranked Utah, 63-56, finishing 24-6 overall.

- During the 2021-22 season, Berube's unit defeated No. 6 seeded Kentucky, the SEC Champion, 69-62, in the first round, the program's second-ever NCAA victory. Princeton would then take No. 3 Indiana to the limit in the second round, falling to the hosts at Assembly Hall, 56-55.

- Before the 2021-22 campaign, the Tigers last appeared in the NCAA Tournament in 2019, dropping an 82-77 decision to No. 17 Kentucky.

- The Tigers' first NCAA Tournament win was an 80-70 decision over No. 9 seeded Green Bay in 2015. It was the second Ivy League victory (Harvard in 1998 over Stanford) in the NCAA Tournament. Princeton finished that season at 31-1 overall.

- The program has been seeded as low as No. 12 and as high as No. 8. The Tigers' No. 8 seed in 2015 is the highest seed ever by an Ivy school in the NCAAs.

- Despite finishing second in the conference, Princeton became the first Ivy school to earn an NCAA at-large bid in 2016. The Tigers lost a 74-65 contest to No. 6 seed West Virginia. Columbia became the second Ivy squad in 2024.

- Princeton has gone 18-5 in the month of March during the Carla Berube era. Four of the team's five losses have been in the NCAA Tournament.

BEWARE, THE SNOWMAN - CLASS OF 2024

- The Class of 2024 featuring Kaitlyn Chen, Ellie Mitchell and Chet Nweke made a monumental impact on the program.

- A three-time Ivy League Tournament Most Outstanding Player, Chen, who graduated in May of 2024, was the gold standard during the best stretch of Princeton Women's Basketball history. In just three playing seasons, Chen led the Tigers to three Ivy League titles, three Ivy League Tournament crowns and three NCAA Tournament appearances.

- The true definition of a student-athlete, Chen was named a College Sports Communicators Second Team Academic All-American as a senior, the program's first since 2016, after finishing her Tiger career with 1,276 points and 359 assists.

- Chen started every game for the 2025 National Champion UConn Huskies, averaging 7.1 points, 3.2 assists and 1.8 rebounds per game.

- The former Tiger would later be drafted by the Golden State Valkyries in the 2025 WNBA Draft. She became the ninth Ivy League player overall and fourth Princeton alumnae (Abby Meyers, Bella Alarie and Leslie Robinson) to be picked in the WNBA draft.

- After being cut by the Valkyries, she would later come back and play in 24 games for the team, helping them reach the playoffs.

- Mitchell graduated as the program's all-time leader in rebounding (1,125) as she recorded the three highest rebounding totals ever by a Tiger (338 in 2022-23, 311 in 2021-22 and 306 in 2023-24).

- Mitchell had 54 games with at least 10 rebounds or more. She recorded six as a freshman, 16 as a sophomore, 17 as a junior and 16 in 2023-24.

- She finished her career with 15 caroms including eight offensive boards in the NCAA Tournament game vs. West Virginia.

- The former captain was a three-time Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year as she was the foundation piece for a defense that ranked No. 20 in scoring defense (56.2) in 2023-24, sixth in 2022-23 (53.2) and fourth in 2021-22 (51.5). She is currently doing commercial real estate in her post Princeton career.

- Nweke had a career season in her senior campaign with the Tigers, averaging 6.1 points, 4.8 rebounds per contest. She finished her Princeton career with three Ivy titles and three Ivy League Tournament championships.

- Nweke is doing a graduate season at Georgetown. She tore her ACL in her first game in 2024 and is now doing her final campaign.

- The Tigers have reached the Ivy League Tournament Championship game in six of the seven years the tournament has been played (2017, 2018, 2019, 2022, 2023, 2024), winning five times while losing in 2017 to Penn. The Tigers lost to the eventual champion, Harvard, in the 2025 Ivy Semifinal.

- Princeton has had 16 All-Tournament selections in Alarie (three), Abby Meyers (twice) Leslie Robinson (twice), Chen (three), Gabrielle Rush, Carlie Littlefield, Julia Cunningham, Ellie Mitchell, Madison St. Rose and Skye Belker.

DARMANITAN'S ZEN MODE - NUGGETS

- Princeton's 15-point comeback at Rutgers in 2022-23 was the largest of the Carla Berube era.

- Princeton's overtime victory on the road at George Mason on Dec. 20, 2025 was the first time the Tigers have won in overtime on the road since a 92-83 decision at Harvard on Feb. 7, 2016.

- Ashley Chea's buzzer beater vs. Harvard in 2025 and Grace Stone's buzzer beater over Rhode Island (Dec. of 2022) are the first buzzer beaters for Princeton since Eileen Powers' putback with one-second remaining in overtime lifted the Tigers past Southwest Texas State, 82-81, on Nov. 23, 2002.

- Princeton finishes each shootaround on the day of a game with a half-court shot. Last season, Ashley Chea led the team with four. Taylor Charles leads the team with four while Skye Belker and Madison St. Rose each have three. Grace O'Sullivan has two. Toby Nweke, Sarah Lessig and Emily Eadie have also hit one.

- Winning happens a lot at Princeton. Here are all the players in Princeton history to earn four Ivy regular season titles - Jackie Jackson '78, Maggie Meier '78, Meg Bowen '13, Kate Miller '13, Lauren Polansky '13, Niveen Rasheed '13, Julia Cunningham '23, Maggie Connolly '23, Lexi Weger '23, Kira Embso '23, Grace Stone '23 and Ellie Mitchell '24. Each alumna in this group from 2013 on has appeared in four consecutive NCAA Tournaments while four of the teams in the Ivy League have two NCAA appearances or less.

SAM THE SNOWMAN - #PRINCETONPROS

- Parker Hill '25 signed a professional contract with Helios Basket of the SB Women's League in Switzerland in the summer.

- She was the sixth Princeton alumnae to play professionally this season, joining Blake Dietrick Seifert '15 (3XBA), Carlie Littlefield Friberg '21 (3XBA), Abby Meyers '22 (Maccabi Bnot Ashdod), Grace Stone '23 (Perry Lakes Hawks) and Kaitlyn Chen '24 (Golden State Valkyries).

- Chen '24 will play in the Athletes' Unlimited League in February.

- Meyers is currently with Maccabi Bnot Ashdod in Israel and Perfumerias Avenida in Spain. Meyers got some playing time in the WNBA with the Washington Mystics and Dallas Wings. She was drafted in the first round of the 2023 WNBA Draft by the Wings.

- Grace Stone '23 is playing for the Perry Lake Hawks in Australia. She has also seen action in Finland and Cyprus.

- Friberg '21 is playing in the 3XBA League while Seifert '15 just retired from professional basketball in November. Last season, Friberg appeared in leagues in Slovakia and Belgium as well.

CARLA BERUBE HEAD COACH • 7TH YEAR • CONNECTICUT '97

In six+ playing seasons played under Berube, the Tigers have won four Ivy League championships, posting a 70-5 record against Ivy opponents during the regular season. Overall, the Tigers are 138-26 (.841) during Berube's tenure as head coach at Princeton with three Ivy League Tournament Championships and two NCAA Tournament victories.

Princeton went 21-8 in 2024-25 and collected a Net Ranking of 46, adding four combined quad 1/2 victories. The Tigers placed second in the Ivy League and received an at-large bid in the NCAA Tournament. Princeton had four earn All-Ivy selections highlighted by Ashley Chea's unanimous First-Team honor.

The 2023-24 season saw the Tigers win their fifth consecutive Ivy League Tournament title, nabbing a No. 9 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Princeton finished with a Net Ranking of 35 overall and had one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the country, taking on No. 3 UCLA on the road in addition to No. 20 Oklahoma and No. 19 Indiana on a neutral floor. The Tigers' victory over Oklahoma was the fourth top-25 win in program history

The 2022-23 season had Women's Basketball go 24-6, advancing to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year becoming the first Ivy team to do that since Harvard men's team in 2013 and 2014. After starting the Ivy campaign 0-2, the Tigers ripped off 12 straight before sweeping both games at home in the Ivy Tournament for their second straight crown and earning a bid to the NCAAs. With the team's victory over NC State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, it marked the first time an Ivy League school has had its men's and women's teams both win in the NCAA in the same year.

The 2021-22 season saw Princeton finish with a 25-5 record, advancing to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament for just the second time in program history. After a second consecutive undefeated regular season championship in the Ivy League, the Tigers swept both games of the Ivy League Tournament to claim Berube's first Ivy Tournament title and earn an automatic bid to NCAAs.

Seeded No. 11, the Tigers knocked off No. 6 Kentucky -- the SEC Tournament champion -- in the First Round, 69-62. Princeton would then take No. 3 Indiana to the limit in the Second Round, falling to the hosts at Assembly Hall, 56-55.

Berube was named Ivy League Coach of the Year for the second season in a row, and again coached the Ivy League Player of the Year in unanimous selection Abby Meyers who was also named unanimous first-team All-Ivy. Ellie Mitchell was named Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year, while Julia Cunningham (first team) and Grace Stone (honorable mention) also garnered All-Ivy honors.

The Tigers went 26-1 overall in 2019-20 and finished with a 22-game winning streak. The Tigers' streak was the second longest in the country behind No. 1 South Carolina. The unit wrapped up the campaign with a RPI of No. 9, the best mark in Ivy history and went undefeated in conference play before the postseason was cancelled due to the Coronavirus. Berube was named the Ivy League Coach of the Year. Bella Alarie was one of three players to be named All-Ivy as she was honored with her third straight Ivy Player of the Year award. Carlie Littlefield was first-team All-Ivy for the second consecutive season while Julia Cunningham was honored with honorable mention accolades.

Berube was named the head coach of women's basketball at Princeton University in May of 2019 after spending the previous 17 years at Tufts University. Berube has also coached internationally with USA Basketball, leading the U.S. Under-16 national team to a gold medal at the FIBA Americas and the Under-17 national team to a gold medal at the World Championships.

Berube brings a long history of success as both a player and coach to Princeton. She won exactly 80 percent of her games with the Jumbos, going 384-96 in 17 seasons while reaching the NCAA Division III final twice, the Final Four four times and the Sweet 16 nine times, including each of the last eight. In her last seven seasons at Tufts, her record was 197-24, with a winning percentage of .891 during those years.

Berube was the 2015 Pat Summitt Trophy winner as the Division III National Coach of the Year and a three-time regional coach of the year.

Berube is a 1997 UConn grad with a degree in sociology. She scored 1,381 points during her career, and the Huskies were an astonishing 132-8 in her four years, for a winning percentage of .942. The highlight of her career was the 1995 NCAA championship, which capped a perfect 35-0 season. She played in two Final Fours and also was part of four Big East championships.

After playing professionally in the American Basketball League, Berube began her coaching career as an assistant coach at Providence College before becoming the head coach at Tufts in 2002. During her time there, she coached three NESCAC Players of the Year, three Rookies of the Year, six Defensive Players of the Year and three CoSIDA Academic All-Americans. She also has coached seven All-Americans in the last eight years.

Under Berube's leadership, Tufts reached the Division III championship game in 2016 and 2017. Her final Tufts team went 28-3, won the NESCAC championship and reached the Elite Eight of the NCAA tournament in 2019.


She is a member of the Connecticut Women's Basketball Hall of Fame and the New England Basketball Hall of Fame. In addition to the 2015 national Coach of the Year honor, Berube is also a three-time regional Coach of the Year, a four-time NESCAC Coach of the Year and a two-time USA Basketball Development Coach of the Year.

Her players have also been active in the community. The Tufts women's basketball team adopted two Team IMPACT teammates - a 12-year-old with leukemia and a 15-year-old with sickle cell anemia - partnering with the non-profit organization that works to improve kids' quality of life and help them experience the camaraderie of collegiate sports. Many of her players have also been Big Sisters to local children.

Carla and her wife, Meghan, are the parents of two sons, Parker and Caden, along with a daughter, Brogan.

LAUREN GOSSELIN - ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

Lauren (Battista) Gosselin is in her seventh year with Princeton in 2025-26.

In six+ playing seasons with Gosselin on the staff, Princeton has won four Ivy League championships, posting a 70-5 record against Ivy opponents during the regular season. Overall, the Tigers are 138-26 (.841) during Gosselin's tenure as a coach with Princeton with three Ivy League Tournament Championships and two NCAA Tournament victories.

Princeton went 21-8 in 2024-25 and collected a Net Ranking of 46, adding four combined quad 1/2 victories. The Tigers placed second in the Ivy League and received an at-large bid in the NCAA Tournament. Princeton had four earn All-Ivy selections highlighted by Ashley Chea's unanimous First-Team honor.

The 2023-24 season saw the Tigers win their fifth consecutive Ivy League Tournament title, nabbing a No. 9 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Princeton finished with a Net Ranking of 35 overall and had one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the country, taking on No. 3 UCLA on the road in addition to No. 20 Oklahoma and No. 19 Indiana on a neutral floor. The Tigers' victory over Oklahoma was the fourth top-25 win in program history.

Prior to her time at Tufts, Battista was a graduate assistant at Boston College while securing her master's degree in Leadership and Administration. Before BC, Battista was at the NCAA office in a postgraduate internship program, helping the women's basketball staff with the NCAA Tournament and Final Four.

Battista graduated from Bentley University in 2014. She was a 4-year starter, 3-time All-American, and 2-year team captain for the nationally ranked Falcons. Her senior year was spectacular as she led the team to the Division II national title with an undefeated 35-0 season. She earned national recognition as the WBCA Division II National Player of the Year, the Capital One Academic All-American of the Year, CWSA/Honda Division II Athlete of the Year, and an NCAA Today's Top 10 Award honoree. She graduated as the all-time leading scorer in Bentley history, scoring over 2,100 points. Battista graduated summa cum laude with a degree in marketing and minor in finance.



LAUREN DILLON - ASSISTANT COACH/ RECRUITING COORDINATOR

Lauren Dillon is in her seventh year with Princeton in 2025-26.

In six+ playing seasons with Dillon on the staff, Princeton has won four Ivy League championships, posting a 70-5 record against Ivy opponents during the regular season. Overall, the Tigers are 138-26 (.841) during Dillon's tenure as a coach with Princeton with three Ivy League Tournament Championships and two NCAA Tournament victories.

Princeton went 21-8 in 2024-25 and collected a Net Ranking of 46, adding four combined quad 1/2 victories. The Tigers placed second in the Ivy League and received an at-large bid in the NCAA Tournament. Princeton had four earn All-Ivy selections highlighted by Ashley Chea's unanimous First-Team honor.

Dillon came from Tufts where she spent a season as a coach after graduating from the school in 2018. She helped lead her squad team to a NESCAC championship her freshmen year, and one Elite Eight, one Final Four, and two National Championship game appearances throughout her career.

A two-year captain, Dillon was the NESCAC Defensive Player of the Year as a sophomore, earned a First-Team All-League honor as a senior and graduated as the program's all-time record in career steals and assists.

She earned her masters' degree in Child Study and Human Development at Tufts in 2021.



JORDAN EDWARDS - ASSISTANT COACH

Jordan Edwards is in her second season with Princeton Women's Basketball in 2025-26.

Princeton went 21-8 in 2024-25 and collected a Net Ranking of 46, adding four combined quad 1/2 victories. The Tigers placed second in the Ivy League and received an at-large bid in the NCAA Tournament. Princeton had four earn All-Ivy selections highlighted by Ashley Chea's unanimous First-Team honor.

Edwards comes from High Point where she spent the previous season as an assistant coach/Director of Operations. The Panthers won 20 games and reached the WBIT in 2023-24.

Previously, Edwards played for three seasons at High Point, helping the Panthers to its first NCAA Tournament in 2021. Edwards averaged 7.1 points, 4.2 assists and 3.1 rebounds per game in 87 contests. She also saw action in 61 contests at Niagara before transferring to High Point.



LILLY PARO - DIRECTOR OF BASKETBALL OPERATIONS

The Tigers placed second in the Ivy League and received an at-large bid in the NCAA Tournament. Princeton had four earn All-Ivy selections highlighted by Ashley Chea's unanimous First-Team honor.

The 2023-24 season saw the Tigers win their fifth consecutive Ivy League Tournament title, nabbing a No. 9 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Princeton finished with a Net Ranking of 35 overall and had one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the country, taking on No. 3 UCLA on the road in addition to No. 20 Oklahoma and No. 19 Indiana on a neutral floor. The Tigers' victory over Oklahoma was the fourth top-25 win in program history.

The 2022-23 season had Women's Basketball go 24-6, advancing to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year becoming the first Ivy team to do that since Harvard men's team in 2013 and 2014. After starting the Ivy campaign 0-2, the Tigers ripped off 12 straight before sweeping both games at home in the Ivy Tournament for their second straight crown and earning a bid to the NAAs. With the team's victory over NC State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, it marked the first time an Ivy League school has had its men's and women's teams both win in the NCAA in the same year.

The 2021-22 season saw Princeton finish with a 25-5 record, advancing to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament for just the second time in program history. After a second consecutive undefeated regular season championship in the Ivy League, the Tigers swept both games of the Ivy League Tournament to claim the Ivy Tournament title and earn an automatic bid to NAAs.

Seeded No. 11, the Tigers knocked off No. 6 Kentucky -- the SEC Tournament champion -- in the First Round, 69-62. Princeton would then take No. 3 Indiana to the limit in the Second Round, falling to the hosts at Assembly Hall, 56-55.

The win over Kentucky was one of two Princeton victories over Top-25 opponents during the 2021-22 season. In addition to the win over the Wildcats, who were ranked No. 15 in AP Poll at the time, Paro and the Tigers knocked off No. 22 Florida Gulf Coast on the road, 58-55, for the program's first win over a Top-25 opponent in 43 years.

During the 2021-22 season, Paro was on staff as Princeton had the Ivy League Player of the Year in unanimous selection Abby Meyers who was also named unanimous first-team All-Ivy. Ellie Mitchell was named Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year, while Julia Cunningham (first team) and Grace Stone (honorable mention) also garnered All-Ivy honors.

Paro graduated from Tufts in 2020 where she was coached by Berube for two of her three seasons. She saw action in 78 games, averaging 2.7 points and adding 63 three-pointers. The Jumbos went to the Division III Sweet 16 all four years she was at Tufts.

After graduating with a degree in Psychology, Paro was a learning specialist at the Connelly School of the Holy Child in Potomac, Md. While there, she coached basketball and lacrosse and was a volunteer assistant at Smith College.


