

Cathy Wright-EgerHead Coach – 19th Season

Hometown: Lafayette, Ind. College: Ball State, 1982 Family: Rob, Husband; Tyler (17), Tory (11)

Entering her 19th season as head coach of the Boilermakers, Cathy-Wright Eger has established a reputation of producing outstanding student-athletes.

Since coming to Purdue in 1987, Wright-Eger has coached some of the best female swimmers in the Big Ten and the nation, including four Big Ten champions (Darlene Warta-Renie 1988 and 1990, Susan Wolfle 1991, Kim Fritsch 1993 and 1994, Lindsay Lange 2003).

Wright-Eger also has coached several All-Americans. Both Kim Fritsch and Warta-Renie achieved All-America status during their time at Purdue, and 13 other Boilermakers have been named to honorable mention status. Tracy Duchac, Susan Hentschel, Christine Leupold, Katie Seleskie and Lauren Willis all earned this honor in 2005.

The veteran head coach also has coached several Purdue swimmers to success internationally. Former Purdue swimmer Gyongyver Lakos represented her native Hungary as an Olympian in both Atlanta and Sydney, as well as in the 2001 World University Games. Other Boilermakers coached by Wright-Eger who went on to international competition include Kim Fritsch, Marisa Watts and Karina Bolanos. Wright-Eger also has coached seven United States Olympic Trial qualifiers during her tenure at Purdue. Lange competed in the 100 and 200 breaststroke at the 2004 trials in Long Beach, Calif.

Wright-Eger, who has guided swimmers to the NCAA championships 17 out of the last 18 years, owns an impressive dual-meet record of 135-78-2 (.633).

2004-05: Rising To The Surface

The 2004-05 campaign was a success on many levels for coach Wright-Eger. Her team resumed its climb up the Big Ten standings, placing fifth with 399 points, and later scored a program-best 17th-place showing (59 pts.) in front of its hometown crowd at the NCAA Championships. Tracy Duchac, Susan Hentschel, Christine Leupold, Katie Seleskie and Lauren Willis earned honorable mention All-America honors in both the 200 and 400 freestyle relays, while Carrie McCambridge copped three All-America citations for her performances in the 1-meter, 3-meter and platform competitions.

Hentschel established herself as a major player on the conference and national level. At Big Tens, Hentschel recorded two individual varsity records, and swam the anchor leg for three varsity record-breaking freestyle relay teams. She also posted NCAA automatic qualifying times in the 50 and 100 free.

Wright-Eger received a tremendous output from team captain Leupold, who posted lifetime bests in nearly every event this season en route to making her debut at the NCAA Championships. Leupold left the program holding school records in the 50 free (22.83), 200, 400 and 800 freestyle relays.

The freshman class, which was not going to be relied on much, responded well to a no-pressure approach. Jennifer Lavers set a new freshman record in the 200 breaststroke and qualified for NCAAs with a provisional time of 1:03.00 in the 100 breast.

Academic Excellence

Holding an overall program grade-point average of 3.5, Wright-Eger's teams consistently place well in the classroom in addition to the pool. Since her arrival, 185 swimmers and divers have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, an average of over 10 student-athletes per season. In addition, 17 Purdue women have been named Academic All-America, and 46 have received honorable mention honors. The team also has ranked consistently or near the top among Purdue's varsity teams in terms of GPA. In fact, Wright-Eger's teams have been the recipients of Purdue's President's Cup award (presented to intercollegiate athletics teams with the highest GPA) four times in the last six years.

For the spring 2005 semester, four Boilermakers – Carrie McCambridge, Christine Leupold, Jennifer Lavers and Carlene Takaki – were recognized by the College Swim Coaches Association of America as Academic All-Americans after all posted GPAs over 3.5 and qualified for the national championships. CSCAA Honorable Mention Academic All-America certificates were given to Erica Chandler, Jenn Merte, Kimbre Vogel and Katharine Telfer. Chandler, Merte and Vogel all posted perfect semester GPAs of 4.0, while Telfer's GPA was above 3.75.

COACHING STAFF PURDUE SWIMMING & DIVING 2005/2006

During the 2003-04 season, 11 women were named Academic All-Big Ten, and the team's combined GPA of 3.5 was not only the best at Purdue and in the Big Ten, but was seventh-best in the nation. Couple this with the team's strong finish in the Big Ten and NCAA, and the argument can be made that the 2003-04 Boilermakers were one of the best all-around teams in the nation.

Well-Deserved Recognition

Wright-Eger is no stranger to personal honors and recognition. Since coming to Purdue, she has been selected as the Big Ten Women's Swimming Coach of the Year (1990), the Boilermaker Coach of the Year by the Purdue Club of Chicago (1993), and was handed the 1996 Salute to Women Award, given annually by the local YWCA. In 2001, Wright-Eger was featured as one of three coaches in Sports Illustrated for Women, in an article focusing on being a mother and coach at the same time.

In August of 2005, Wright-Eger was accorded the honor of joining the U.S. Women's Swim Team as its manager for the World University Games in Izmir, Turkey. This was her second time on a World University Games staff, as she also served in this position in 2003, when the games were held in Daegu, South Korea. Last October, Wright-Eger represented United States Swimming at the third-annual Women in Coaching Summit, which took place in Colorado Springs, Colo.

Hometown Girl

A native of West Lafayette, Ind., Wright-Eger has been involved in the sport of swimming her entire life. Graduating from Lafayette Jefferson High School, she was a part of the school's 1975 state championship women's swimming and diving team. After graduation, she attended Ball State University and earned a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1982.

From 1983 to 1985, Wright-Eger was a school teacher at her alma mater, Lafayette Jefferson. In addition to her duties in the classroom, she also served as the school's head swimming coach, an experience that led her to a career in coaching.

Wright-Eger left Lafayette for a brief period (1985-1987) to be an assistant coach at the University of Iowa before returning to take the reins of the Boilermaker program in 1987.

Wright-Eger and her husband, Rob, reside in West Lafayette with their sons, Tyler, 17, and Tory, 11.

SEASON OUTLOOK O.A. PURDUE SWIMMING & DIVING 2005/2006



Cathy Wright-Eger is entering her 19th year as the Boilermakers' head coach. Last season was the most exciting in Purdue history, as the Boilermakers finished 17th at the NCAA Championships in front of their hometown crowd at the Boilermaker Aquatic Center. The challenge now for Purdue is to capitalize on that excitement and finish higher at both the national and conference level.

Wright-Eger again has high expectations for her team, which returns a number of NCAA qualifiers, including Susan Hentschel and three-time All-American diver Carrie McCambridge. Also providing a boost to this year's team is diving coach Adam Soldati and transfers Stacie Lesneski and Nicole Weatherman.

How are you able to maintain last year's momentum heading into this season?

The team is keeping the momentum alive. They've been emailing each other through the summer, listing their goals and making sure each of their teammates is accountable to themselves and the team.

I tried to stay in touch with every single student-athlete over the summer. It's tough to try and keep track of over 40 people, but every single one of them made the commitment to report back to me. I think they made a big statement, because they all followed through on the promise they made to me in the spring.

I like that the team is heavily involved. We've had two meetings since the start of this year, and it feels as if we have not skipped a beat. Even with all the newcomers involved, both freshmen and transfers, you would have thought we all had known each other from last spring. I love this feeling. The coaches also have noticed that the transition has been smoother than in years past.

We've lost a lot of great seniors from last year, but the momentum has somehow gained, and it's now higher than it was in spring.

How was Purdue able to acquire Stacie Lesneski and Nicole Weatherman?

It all goes back to our primary recruiting philosophy of first, recruit the person, then recruit the swimmer or diver within them. We are very sincere in our recruiting. Both of these women were very interested in Purdue, but ultimately decided to choose another school. After they regretted their initial choice for whatever reasons, Purdue quickly popped back into both of their minds, thinking maybe this was the school they should have picked first.

Luckily, most of the ground work was already laid with both transfers – the importance of academics, being a good person, acting responsibly and utilizing your resources. Other schools might emphasize all the same things we do, but we mean what we say, and they came back to us.

All the hard work involved with recruiting is there for a reason. After receiving commitments from these two transfers, I know that I have to stick to what I believe in. I may lose a few recruits out of high school, but you never know when they might want to come back.

Are the newcomers ready to score at Big Ten's?

Elyse (Dudar) in the distance freestyle events will be very solid; she is going to score a lot of points for us in the dual-meet season. I feel the same way about Christine Shehorn, because both these girls come from solid programs and are confident swimmers. They will be a great asset for us.

We'll have to wait and see what they're able to accomplish during February's championship season. Do they and the other freshmen have the potential? Yes.

Are we going to have to put the pressure on them? Absolutely not.

I'm treating our transfers a bit differently. The expectations I have for them are in between the expectations I would normally have for either a freshman or sophomore. Since both Nicole and Stacie have a year of college underneath them, and have competed at the SEC and ACC Championships, respectively, we are going to rely on their talents and expect that they'll score at the Big Ten meet.

Since your sophomores had excellent seasons as freshmen, do you anticipate a dropoff?

I don't believe that will happen because none of them really swam out of their minds as freshmen; everyone stayed within their abilities, so I think there is a lot left in them. No, I don't expect a dropoff, whether it's one individual, class or place at either Big Tens or NCAAs.

We have a strong sophomore class. I expect nothing short of them coming back and dominating our team; I'm certain they will score the most points. The team momentum is fantastic and the expectations are high, but the energy within that class alone is unbelievable. They have big goals and aren't afraid to share them. The coaching staff noticed their confidence last year, and they're even more confident this year. Shannon Grace, Lauren Willis, Jen Lavers and Jenae Gill come to mind when I think of the sophomores who will lead this team.

Do you have higher expectations for Susan Hentschel this year?


Susan knows that she's good, but she also realizes that she can be better, and that it takes time and experience to reach the next level. She has remained patient, even though it's clear she wants to achieve greater goals after scoring at last year's NCAAs.

Susan has matured as a leader on our team, and has become a great role model and first-class recruiter in the process. It's also a compliment to her swim club (Washington Township), that she's able to go home and train just as hard as the student-athletes who train in West Lafayette. She evolved as a swimmer from her freshman to her sophomore year, so I foresee the same thing happening between last spring and this fall.

Carlene Takaki also made the commitment to big-time training, when she made the decision to stay here and train with Boilermaker Aquatics. Her ankle is healthy, and I strongly believe the training she received this past summer was the missing piece to the puzzle – I have no doubt this is her year.



SEASON OUTLOOK Q&A PURDUE SWIMMING & DIVING 2005/2006



What has (diving coach) Adam Soldati brought to this club in his first few months on the job?

This is such a remarkable story because this past winter we were weeping that we had lost Wenbo (Chen) to USA Diving. We were very happy for him, but sad for our program; however, just a few months later, we're back sitting on top of the world. Adam brings so much energy and excitement to recruiting and to our coaching staff and student-athletes. I definitely feel we got the best coach out there – there is no doubt in my mind.

Adam and his wife, Kimiko, are a great team. I've always believed that if you want to retain someone, you have to keep the spouse happy too. We have a great team in place with the two of them. The program wants to be successful, but we also want values, and it's easy to see that they share a lot of the same values as the rest of the staff.

Adam was anxious to start recruiting, but I told him that he'd have to pass the NCAA compliance exam before he could even think about speaking to a recruit. The rule book is over 600 pages, but he understood that he couldn't do much of anything until he passed the test. He passed after taking it for the first time, which makes a statement about how serious he takes this job. There are a lot of coaches who have to take that test more than once.

From what I've seen so far, I'm very impressed by the way Adam has represented this university. He's going about everything the right way, which is to first follow the rules and then put time and energy into the program. We make it a point to recruit athletes who also want to do it the right way.

Would you be disappointed to finish fifth again at the Big Ten Championships?

I would be more disappointed if we finished fifth there and then finished out of the top 15 at NCAAs. We all want to place in the top three at the Big Ten Championship; everyone on the team wants that.

When you look closely at our conference, you'll see that it had five teams finish in the top 17 at the national championships. So, if we finish fifth again at Big Tens, I'm not going to beat myself up. I will constantly try to get this team to place higher, but it doesn't make us a failure if we don't reach fourth or better. The Big Ten is one of the most challenging swimming and diving leagues in the

nation, and I feel fortunate to be part of this world-class conference. Personally, I wouldn't want to be in any other conference.

I think if we have a weakness at Big Tens it will be in the sprint freestyle – the 50, 100, plus all the relays. This was one of our strengths last season, but do we have enough people to step up and accept this challenge? A lot of our success in the sprints will rely on Kimbre Vogel; she is one who can really make a difference. In fact, last season, she was swimming just as fast as our seniors Tracy (Duchac), Christine (Leupold) and Katie (Seleskie).

Erica Chandler stayed and swam over the summer, making a huge commitment to herself and to the team. She is great sprinter, but we didn't have to use her as much last year, because we had so many sprinters. If Erica and Kimbre step right into and accept the positions we assign for them, they will be a determining factor of where we place in the Big Ten Championships.

What meets on this year's schedule are you most excited about?

I look forward most to the Big Ten and NCAA Championships, but my second favorite would be our Purdue Invitational in November. I'm excited about this meet because we'll be shaving down, so we'll be capable of recording some ultrafast times within our own pool; our confidence level is very high when we're swimming at home.

I'm also looking forward to taking the team out to California for the UC-Irvine Invitational and our dual meet with UCLA. We have several student-athletes, like Rachel (Murphy), Carlene (Takaki) and Lainey (Eaton), who are from California, so they'll get a chance to compete in front of their families and friends. And since we've really been recruiting California very hard, we'll also be able to showcase our talents to the state's top recruits. We've never competed against UCLA in a straight-up dual, but we did outscore them at last season's NCAAs; the Bruins are a top-15 program, maybe even a top 10.

How does your affiliation with Team USA help the Purdue student athlete?

It's hard to put into words how proud I was when I was chosen to represent the whole country under one governing body. It's just an amazing feeling to put on the Team USA apparel and going into a different country with everybody thinking that the United States dominates everything. I was representing the best swimmers and divers at the World University Games, just like Tiger Woods with golf or even Michael Jordan in basketball. I will never forget it, and I feel so blessed to be a part of the national swimming scene.

I worked really hard to help Team USA be the best they could be. I would do anything possible in order to give the athletes whatever they needed. I also tried to help them perform to the best of their ability and adjust to life in a new country.

I can bring this back to our team, by giving them the goal of trying to make the national team, and to see the world and represent your country in the sport you love. I made so many good friends and connections in other countries, which will help me with recruiting. Not only am I representing the USA, but I am also representing Purdue University. Outside Indiana, many people still do not know much about Purdue other than Gene Keady, or even where the school is located. It's kind of a burden, but at the same time I get to toot Purdue's horn whenever I travel around the country or go overseas.

Do enough of your student-athletes have the desire to compete beyond the NCAA level?

I think they have to get to a higher level at NCAAs, in order to see themselves competing for a spot on a national team. The dedication is there, as are the necessary resources. But a lot of them just don't have the confidence. As the student-athletes come to Purdue as freshmen, they give us their heart and soul, but don't possess the confidence necessary to succeed. Amanda (Miller) and Susan (Hentschel) have scored at a national meet, but even they'll tell you, it can't be done without confidence.

Adam Soldati Diving Coach – 1st Season

It wasn't easy to replace Wenbo Chen, but the Purdue swimming and diving program has found the ideal successor in Adam Soldati. Soldati's hiring concluded an exhaustive search, which began in December after Chen announced he was leaving West Lafayette for USA Diving.

"We had unprecedented interest in the position, and we thank Wenbo for elevating the position by his hard work the past four seasons," said men's head coach Dan Ross. "Adam's energy, relationship with U.S. Diving, along with his experience with collegiate recruiting, administration and camps while at Indiana University made him our top choice."

Soldati, who began work on June 6, comes to Purdue from the prestigious Woodlands Athletic Club and Training Center, where he had served as head coach for the Woodlands Diving National team since 2002. Last year, Soldati guided three divers, J.J. Kinzbach, Harrison Jones and Jessica Livingston, to the finals of Olympic Trials and five divers (Kinzbach, Jones, Drew Livingston, Jessica Livingston and Whitney Wielgus) to Senior Nationals. Kinzbach also qualified for the U.S. National Team. Soldati finished the summer taking Kinzbach and Jones to the Junior World Championships.

Following his graduation from Indiana University in 1997, Soldati founded Indiana Diving and Youth Development while serving as the Hoosiers' assistant coach and diving events director. Both programs succeeded at the highest levels with his involvement.

From June 1997 to January 2000, Soldati's club program advanced six athletes to the U.S. Senior National Diving Championships, plus four finalists and eight athletes to the U.S. Junior National Championships and earned one national championship. At the same time, he was helping his Hoosiers win three-consecutive national diving titles from 1998 to 2000.

Soldati's abilities to organize and develop talent emerged while as a student at Indiana, spending two years (1998-99) as the Indiana Diving Academy's summer camp director. Soldati's time as a student-athlete in Bloomington also included a

two-year tenure as team captain, a spot on the Academic All-Big Ten team and trips to U.S. Nationals. A multiple Big Ten finalist, Soldati was an Alpha Beta honorary member from 1995 to 1997.

Soldati, 30, is married to Kimiko Hirai Soldati, who was a member of 2004 U.S. Olympic Diving Team. The couple is expecting their first child next year.

Darlene Renie is in her ninth year as the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the Purdue program.

As the main recruiter for the Purdue women's program, Renie has been and continues to be responsible for all aspects of both on- and off-campus recruiting.

Since joining the Purdue staff, Renie has used her expertise, personal example and excellent recruiting skills to help take Purdue from the basement of the Big Ten Conference to a respectable fifth-place showing in 2005.


Many of Renie's recruits continued to excel for the Boilermakers in 2004-05, including Tracy Duchac, Susan Hentschel, Jennifer Lavers, Jenae Gill and Christine Leupold.

Under Renie's watch, Duchac qualified for her third-straight NCAA Championships, the longest active streak of anyone on the team. Duchac qualified as a member of the 200 freestyle relay team, which posted the eighth-fastest time in the nation of 1:31.09. Hentschel and Leupold, along with freshman Lauren Willis also were part of this team and all achieved honorable mention All-America recognition.

Duchac has also succeeded in the classroom, being selected as a 2004 CSCAA Academic All-American.

Hentschel debunked any myths surrounding a sophomore jinx by producing one of the best all-around seasons in Boilermaker history. Hentschel recorded an individual varsity record in the 100 free (49.68), and was part of three school record-breaking relays (200, 400, 800 free) at the Big Ten Championships.

Gill and Lavers shined in their rookie seasons, breaking freshman records in the 100 back (55.85) and 200 breast (2:17.07). Gill's time in the back is the second fastest in school history and Lavers' mark is the third fastest in the 200 breast, behind Heidi Reynolds and Lindsay Lange.



Leupold responded to the challenge of being team captain and produced the best season of her four-year career. A native of Richwood, N.J., Leupold posted lifetime bests in nearly every event (50, 100, 200 free, 200 IM) en route to making her debut at the NCAA Championships.

Renie, formerly Darlene Warta, was an outstanding swimmer and studentathlete at Purdue from 1987 to 1990. A two-time team captain, Renie became Purdue's first female swimmer to be selected as an All-American after she placed fifth in the 200-yard butterfly at the 1989 NCAA Championships. In 1990, Renie earned All-America honors again in the 200 fly and honorable mention recognition as a member of the 400 medley relay team. Renie also captured two Big Ten titles under the guidance of head coach Cathy Wright-Eger, by winning the conference's 200 butterfly in 1988 and 1990.

A four-year letterwinner, she was a Senior Nationals consolation champion, a Junior Nationals qualifier, a four-time NCAA qualifier, and the first woman in Purdue history to score individually at the NCAAs. She was named Purdue's Outstanding Senior Athlete by Mortar Board, and the John Purdue Club's Chicago Athlete of the Year her senior year. By the time she finished her illustrious career, she held school records in the 100 and 200 fly, 800 free and 400 medley relays.

A native of Chicago, Renie and her husband, Jeff, live in Lafayette. Jeff, also a Purdue swimming alumnus, was a member of the 1986-87 Boilermaker squad under current head coach Dan Ross.

The Renies have three children: Jessica (12), Jake (9) and Joshua (5).




