Series Notes: Purdue has beaten Penn State just once in nine previous meetings. That lone victory was secured at home in 2003 as the Boilermakers went on to place third in the conference. Purdue came close to beating the Nittany Lions in their own den last season, but allowed the decisive goal just inside the 80th minute and lost 1-0.

The Golden Boot Match

The Golden Boot is on the line each time the Purdue and Indiana women's soccer teams meet. The Boilermakers currently hold a 7-1-1 advantage in their regular-season series with the Hoosiers.

After each victory, the winning team takes the trophy home and adds a letter to the chain attached to the gold-dipped soccer shoe. The first letter on the chain is an 'I', marking Indiana's overtime win in the inaugural meeting between intrastate rivals in 1999. The next five letters are 'P's, denoting Purdue's five subsequent victories. On each letter is engraved the date and score of the match it represents. In 2005, the teams battled to a 1-1 tie, keeping the Golden Boot Trophy in West Lafayette for a sixth consecutive year. Purdue successfully defended its rights to the trophy the past two seasons by scores of 2-1 and 7-0.

The concept for the creation of a trophy to match football's Old Oaken Bucket originally was discussed in 1998. But it was not until 2002, when former Purdue assistant Ian Rickerby joined Indiana coach Mick Lyon on the Hoosier staff, that the Golden Boot came to fruition. Purdue head coach Rob Klatte and Lyon agreed that a traveling rivalry trophy would increase the significance of each meeting between the traditional rivals. Both coaching staffs pursued its design, which was completed in fall 2002.


